Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) is a strategy used to prevent crime through designing a physical environment that positively influences human behavior. You will be introduced to CPTED's four principles -- access control, natural surveillance, territoriality, and maintenance. Learn how these four principles can help create a climate of safety on your campus including outdoor public areas, stadiums and parking garages, and resident housing. Also hear a few best practices from around the country of campuses who have successfully incorporated CPTED and how this has reduced the opportunity of crime and improved the campuses' bottom line.
