National Institute of Justice Releases Video on Violence Against American Indian and Alaska Native Women and Men

WASHINGTON – The Office of Justice Programs' (OJP) National Institute of Justice (NIJ), today released a video summarizing the results of a recently released NIJ report, *Violence against American Indian and Alaska Native Women and Men: 2010 Findings from the National Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence Survey*. The video is one of a number of products examining data from the report, reviewing issues such as psychological aggression, intimate partner violence, sexual violence, and stalking.
