- 2. Success of efforts here by no means unprecedented -- Indeed, much that has been tried here came from initiatives in numerous cities across U.S. -- know of success of such initiatives, both from experience as police official and as Director of NIJ.
 - O OAKLAND: POLICE DEPARTMENT PROGRAM IN DOWNTOWN AREA -COOPERATIVE EFFORTS BETWEEN POLICE, COMMUNITY AND
 BUSINESS INTERESTS.
 - Houston and Newark: NIJ experiments to reduce fear and crime employing measures similar to those used in this program.

- 3. Success of Downtown Security Program in Brooklyn, Queens and Bronx grew out of recognition that problems were severe -- and that police could not bear burden alone.
 - BUT THE IMPORTANT RECOGNITION WAS THAT WORDS ARE NOT

 ENOUGH -- VITAL TO TAKE ACTION TO IMPROVE SITUATION -
 AND THAT BY MOBILIZING PRIVATE SECTOR RESOURCES, REAL

 IMPROVEMENTS COULD BE ACCOMPLISHED.
- 4. PROGRAM DEVELOPED SERIES OF RECOMMENDATIONS WHICH FORM A "PACKAGE" OF MEASURES DESIGNED TO PRODUCE BOTH SHORT AND LONG-TERM BENEFITS TO DOWNTOWN AREAS.
 - O DENSE DEVELOPMENT
 - O HOUSING AND MIXED-USE DEVELOPMENT
 - O PROMOTING EVENING ACTIVITIES

- O MAJOR DOWNTOWN EVENTS
- DEVELOPING POLICE ROLE FOOT PATROLS -- LIAISON BETWEEN

 POLICE AND COMMUNITY -- ATTACKING "SIGNS OF CRIME"
- USE OF PRIVATE SECURITY FOR SPECIFIC TASKS
- O DOWNTOWN COUNCILS AND ASSOCIATIONS
- O SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICTS -- GENERATING ADDITIONAL FUNDS FOR SECURITY
- O PRIVATE ORGANIZATION EFFORTS TO IMPROVE SECURITY
- CLOSE WORKING TIES BETWEEN POLICE, BUSINESS AND POLICY
 MAKERS.
- 5. Success of these efforts to revitalize downtown areas speak for themselves -- but true test is to maintain effort -- consolidate on progress already made -- ensure ground gained is not lost in future.

WE KNOW IT CAN WORK -- VITAL NOW TO MAINTAIN MOMENTUM SO DOWNTOWN AREAS NEVER AGAIN BECOME "GHOST TOWNS" PERVADED BY CRIME AND FEAR.
