

PREFACE

California Prisoners and Civil Narcotic Addicts 1983, 1984 and 1985 presents statistical data on felons and civilly committed narcotic addicts under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections. Statistical data on felons have been published since 1950 when the first issue of California Prisoners, covering the years 1945 through 1949, was released. Statistical data on civilly committed narcotic addicts have been published since 1967 when the first issue of Summary Statistics, Civil Commitment Program for Narcotic Addicts, covering the years 1961 through 1966, was published. Beginning in 1980, these two publications were combined into one and now contains data on felon and civil addict characteristics and population movements for calendar years 1973, 1983, 1984 and 1985.

The first chapter is a summary of the total institution population, admissions, and releases from institutions. Chapters 2, 3, 5, 6, and 7 cover felons only. Chapters 4 and 6 cover both felons and civil narcotic addicts, and

Chapter 8 covers civil narcotic addicts only.

The Director of Corrections has jurisdiction over other populations besides felons and civil narcotic addicts. The largest group are individuals sent to the Department of Corrections for diagnostic study under Penal Code Section 1203.03 where a sentencing recommendation is prepared by the department for the court's use in sentencing. Also, a few California Youth Authority commitments, federal prisoners, and prisoners from other states are housed in the institutions.

Chapter 1 Institution Population, Admissions and Releases

There were 21,660 individuals in prison on December 31, 1960. The prison population increased to a high of 28,462 individuals on December 31, 1968, then decreased to a low of 19,623 on December 31, 1977 (Table 1). Since then the population has increased to 43,328 on December 31, 1984 and 50,111 on December 31, 1985. The institution population in 1985 is the largest ever experienced by the Department of Corrections.

The rate of prisoners per 100,000 of the population of California has increased from a low of 89.9 in 1977 to a high of 188.1 in 1985. Prison population has been increasing more rapidly than the population of California since 1977. The civil narcotic addict institution population had steadily been declining since 1976, but since 1983 the number of civil

addicts has increased slightly.

The types of commitments in the institution population are categorized into felon, Youth Authority, civil narcotic addicts, and other (Table 3). The "other" category includes federal prisoners, prisoners from other state prison systems, safekeepers, and felons sent by the courts to the reception centers for diagnostic study under Penal Code Section 1203.03.

Civil narcotic addicts are individuals committed, under Welfare and Institutions Code Section 3000 et seq., to the Department of Corrections for placement in the California Rehabilitation Center Program.

Most of the institution population is located in the Department of Cor-

rections' twelve major institutions (Table 3).

While releases from institutions have been increasing they have not increased as much as the new commitments from courts entering institutions and the parole violators (PV-RTC and PV-WNT) returning to the institutions have increased (Table 4).

In addition to the institutions, the Department of Corrections maintains camps which house inmates who perform forestry work and fight forest fires. These camps are located in the more remote areas of California. The community re-entry facilities are located throughout the state and primarily house work furloughees.

CHART I INSTITUTION POPULATION December 31, 1960 through 1985



Chapter 2 Felons Newly Received From Court

The felon new admission rate per 100,000 California State population was 24.8 in 1973 and 77.1 in 1985 (Table 5). The rate of male felon new commitments has increased substantially for both violent and property type offenses since 1973. The rate for drug offenses increased slightly between 1973 and 1984 (Table 6A). The Department of Corrections received 18,401 new felons from the courts during 1983, 17,602 during 1984 and 20,543 in 1985. The felons newly received from court in 1983 include 17,155 men and 1,246 women (Tables 6A and 6B). In 1985, the felons newly received from court included 18,860 men and 1,683 women.

The proportion of the male felon new admissions with violent commitment offenses decreased between 1973 and 1984 (Table 7A). The proportion with property commitment offenses increased and the proportion with drug commitment offenses decreased in both years. The female felon new admissions experienced similar changes in types of commitment of-

fenses (Table 7B).

Two major urban counties (San Francisco and Los Angeles) tended to have the highest rates of male new commitments per 100,000 county population (Tables 8A and 8B). The other counties in the San Francisco Bay and Southern California areas tended to have the lower rates of new commitments to prison.

Male felon new admissions have been getting younger. Their median age has declined from 29.1 years old in 1960 to 27 in 1985 (Table 10A). Female felons decreased from 30.8 years old in 1960 to 29 years old in 1985 (Table 10B).

The percentage of the male felon new admissions who were White declined from 49.1 in 1973 to 33.1 in 1985 (Table 12). The percentage of Mexican-Americans and Blacks increased from 1973 to 1985, with Mexican-Americans showing a larger percentage increase than Blacks.

Male felon new admission information on prior commitment record, prior California prison record, time in state before offense, educational achievement, and illegal drug use history was obtained from samples of the male felon new admissions in 1983 and 1984. The 1983 and 1984 information was collected on a 25 percent random sample and extrapolated to the rest of the male felon new admissions in both years. Data was collected on 100 percent of the female felon new admissions in 1983 and 1984.

The percentage of male felon new admissions with no prior criminal commitments decreased between 1983 and 1984 (Table 13A). Also, since 1973 a slightly increasing proportion of the male felon new admissions have been in a California prison in the past (Table 14). Over three-fourths of new admissions had been in the State of California 10 years or longer at the time they committed their offense (Tables 15A and 15B). The median tested educational achievement level for the men was the eighth grade for all three years (Table 16). The proportion of men with a history

of illegal drug use increased between 1973 and 1984 (Table 17A). This increase is concentrated in the men who only report a history of marijuana use. The percentage with a history of dangerous drugs declined between 1973 and 1984, while the percentage with a history of heroin use has increased.

Tables 18A through 20B portray the commitment offense of male and female new admissions in 1973, 1983, and 1984 by county or area of commitment, age at admission, and racial-ethnic group.

1973, 1983 and 1984




CHART II B

1973, 1983 and 1984



1973, 1983, 1984 and 1985



1973, 1983, 1984 and 1985



1973, 1983, 1984 and 1985



1973, 1983, 1984 and 1985



Chapter 3 Characteristics of Felons in Prison

This chapter presents selected characteristics of felons who were in prison on December 31, 1973, 1983, 1984 and 1985. The characteristics covered are commitment offense, age, racial-ethnic group, prior commitment record, and parole violation status. The percentage of male and female felons in prison for violent offenses increased between 1973 and 1983 then decreased in 1984 and 1985. The percentage in prison for property offenses has increased since 1973. The percentage of male and female felons in prison for drug offenses decreased sharply between 1973 and 1983, then increased slightly in 1984 and 1985 (Tables 21A and 21B). While the median age of male and female felons in prison has steadily decreased since 1960, there was a slight increase between 1984 and 1985 (Tables 22A) and 22B). The racial-ethnic distribution of the felon institution population changed proportionately between 1973 and 1984. The percentage of White felons decreased while the percentage of Mexican-Americans and Blacks increased, with Mexican-Americans showing the larger increase (Tables 24A and 24B). The percentage of male felons with no prior commitments or prior prison commitments increased between 1973 and 1984. while the percentage with only prior jail or juvenile commitments decreased (Table 25A). The percentage of parole violators in prison decreased between 1973 and 1983, then increased in 1984 (Tables 26A and 26B).

December 31, 1973 through 1985



CHART V B OFFENSE GROUPS Percentage Distribution of Female Felons in Prison December 31, 1973 through 1985



December 31, 1973, 1983, 1984 and 1985




CHART VI B AGE GROUP Percentage Distribution of Female Felons in Prison December 31, 1973, 1983, 1984 and 1985



December 31, 1973 through 1984



DECEMBER 31, 1973 THROUGH 1984



Chapter 4.

Behavior of Felons and Civil Narcotic Addicts in Institutions

The inmate behavior covered in this chapter includes inmate incidents, escapes, and good time credit losses resulting from inmate violations of the Rules and Regulations of the Director of Corrections. The incidents include inmate misbehavior that could be referred for prosecution as a felony.

The number of incidents reported on inmate misconduct by male and female felons and civil narcotic addicts increased from 366 in 1970 to 5,221 in 1985. The rate of incidents per 100 average daily institution population increased from 1.36 in 1970 to 12.73 in 1984 and then slightly decreased to 11.49 in 1985. Inmate assaults on staff increased from 59 in 1970 to 738 in 1985 (Table 28). The number of fatalities resulting from inmate assaults and escape attempts, which increased from 13 in 1970 to a high of 36 in 1972, decreased to 16 in 1985 (Table 29).

The number of escapes from institutions and camps increased from 134 in 1961 to 477 in 1972. Escapes then declined to 81 in 1985. The rate of escapes for men per 100 average daily institution population increased from 0.61 in 1961 to 2.38 in 1972. After 1972 the escape rate for men declined to 0.18 in 1985 (Table 30).

The number of escapes by male and female felons from community based facilities, which primarily house inmates in work furlough programs, and temporary community releases from institutions reached a high of 586 in 1971 (Table 31). Escapes then declined to 40 in 1979. Since 1979, however, escapes have again increased reaching 829 in 1984.

Between 1980 and 1985 the number of time credit losses for male felons increased from 5,192 to 22,926 (Table 32). The average time credit loss per report for male felons increased from 13.5 days in 1980 to 56.8 days in 1985. The large increase in mean credits lost per report between 1982 and 1983 reflects, in part, legislation implemented January 1, 1983 which increased the maximum number of credits that could be lost for one offense from 45 to 180 days.

1970 THROUGH 1985



Chapter 5 Felons Released From Prison

Most felons are released to parole when they leave prison (Tables 33A and 33B). They are required to comply with a set of parole conditions and report regularly to a parole agent. Failure to comply with the conditions may result in a felon parolee being returned to custody. Parolees can be returned to custody (PV-RTC) for up to twelve months per return. Also, some parolees are returned to prison by the courts following their conviction on a new felony offense (PV-WNT). Most parolees who comply with the parole conditions for one year are discharged from parole.

The number of male felons paroled per year increased from 4,871 in 1960 to 23,109 in 1984 (Table 34A). The median number of months served in prison by first releases to parole increased from 24 months in 1960 to 39 months in 1975. The median then decreased to 23 months in 1984.

Median time served by offense for the years 1983 and 1984 is presented in Tables 35A and 35B. Median time served for male and female felons discharged directly from prison is presented in Tables 36A and 36B.

On December 31, 1984 there were 172 inmates under the death sentence in California prisons (Table 37). This is an increase of 147 over the 25 inmates under death sentence in California prisons on December 31, 1978.

1960 THROUGH 1984








Chapter 6 Felon Parole and Civil Narcotic Addict Outpatient Population and Movement

The number of male and female felons and civil narcotic addicts under parole supervision increased from 9,303 on December 31, 1960 to 21,159 on December 31, 1971 (Table 38). Subsequently, the parole and outpatient population decreased to 12,281 on December 31, 1981. By December 31, 1985 the population increased to 29,676. Table 38 also contains the rate of parolees and outpatients per 100,000 of the total population of California. The number of felons and civil narcotic addicts who were received and removed from parole supervision in 1983 and 1984 is contained in Tables 39 and 40. Information on the characteristics of the male and female felon parole populations on December 31, 1973, 1983, 1984 and 1985 is contained in Tables 41A through 45B. The characteristics covered are offense, median age, number of times on parole, length of time on parole, and location of parole supervision. Tables 43A, 43B, 45A and 45B do not contain data for 1985.

Tables 46A, 46B, 47 and 48 contain information on the percentage of parolees suspended each year after release and the rate of parolees in suspended status who are reinstated.

The percentage of male felon parolees who were returned to custody during the calendar year in which they were released to parole increased from 2.5 percent in 1975 to 15.3 percent in 1984 (Table 49A). Tables 50A through 52B contain return to custody rates for parolees by ethnic group.

The median length of time spent under parole supervision by male felon first releases to parole has declined from 24 months in 1960 to 13 months in 1984 (Table 53A). The median time served in prison and time spent under parole supervision by first releases to parole for the years 1960 through 1984 is presented in Tables 54A and 54B.



DECEMBER 31, 1960 THROUGH 1985





CHART XI B OFFENSE GROUPS Percentage Distribution of Female Felons on Parole December 31, 1973, 1983, 1984 and 1985



Chapter 7 Community Based Programs

The work furlough program was initiated in 1966 to assist felons in adjusting from an abrupt transition from living in institutions to living in the community. Program facilities were located on prison grounds, in county jails, and in community correctional centers which were located in the community and operated by Department of Corrections staff. In the early 1970's the Department closed the prison based programs. In recent years the Department has contracted with private outside agencies and groups for operating work furlough programs. In addition, parolees who are returned to custody by the Board of Prison Terms and spend their time in jail are included in community based programs.

The community based population grew from 150 on January 1, 1973 to

1,122 on December 31, 1985 (Tables 55A and 55B).

Information on escapes from community based programs is contained in Table 31 and is discussed in the chapter on the Behavior of Felons and Civil Addicts in Institutions.

Chapter 8 CIVIL NARCOTIC ADDICTS

This chapter presents tables showing characteristics of the Civil Narcotic Addict Program established in 1961 for the control and treatment of narcotic addicts. This program, placed under the Department of Corrections jurisdiction and a separate institution, the California Rehabilitation Center at Norco, was opened in 1962 to house civil narcotic addicts. Most individuals committed to this program have been addicted to heroin or other dangerous drugs and convicted of a non-violent felony offense. Following the felony conviction, criminal sentencing is suspended and the individuals are examined by a physician to determine whether they are addicted to a dangerous drug. If found to be addicted, these individuals can receive a civil commitment to the Civil Narcotic Addict Program.

The number of individuals in the civil addict program had declined sharply from 1973 to 1982. On December 31, 1961, the year the program began, there were 235 individuals in the program. This figure increased to a high of 3,132 in 1969 then decreased to 689 in 1982. However, since 1983, the civil addict program has grown and on December 31, 1985, there

were 1,362 individuals in the program.

The selected characteristics of civil narcotic addicts newly received from court are presented in Tables 56A through 60; selected characteristics of civil addicts in the institution program as of December 31 are presented in Tables 61 through 65. The characteristics covered are offense groups, area of commitment, racial-ethnic group, age, and outpatients returned to the civil addict program.

Information on releases to outpatient status, median time spent in an institution and characteristics of the outpatient population can be found in Tables 66 through 70. Information on previous releases to outpatient status, length of time spent on outpatient status and disposition of civil addicts in outpatient status can be found in Tables 71 through 72B.

December 31, 1973, 1983 and 1984



CHART XII B OFFENSE GROUPS Female Civil Narcotic Addicts Newly Received From Court December 31, 1973, 1983 and 1984



1973, 1983 and 1984




CHART XIII B

1973, 1983 and 1984



1973, 1983 and 1984



1973, 1983 and 1984


