STATISTICAL NOTES:

1. The majority of the tables presented in this report are based on a total homicide count of 1628 for New York City in 1983. However, in several instances, to insure comparability with Nationwide U.C.R. statistics, "INDEX HOMICIDES", as tabulated by the F.B.I. uniform crime reporting system, is the statistic chosen for comparison. Since 1978 the F.B.I. has excluded Non-negligent homicides committed by intoxicated drivers from the U.C.R. statistics. N.Y.C. recorded six (6) of these cases in 1983 giving a U.C.R. homicide count of 1622. These cases are classified as homicides under the N.Y.S. Penal Law. Tables using "Index homicides" therefore present total cases of 1622 while all other tables present N.Y.S. Penal Law homicides, a total of 1628.

2. In addition to the information sources previously noted, data for the 1983 homicide analysis were gathered during interviews with each detective squad commander regarding the homicides within his precinct. This more rigorous data collection method, which had first been used for the 1980 homicide analysis, has been continued for the 1983 cases given the increased accuracy and thoroughness of the data supplied through this method.

3. It should be noted that an "unknown" characterization is a mix of investigative and administrative unknowns.

4. Homicide cases are tabulated by victim rather than by incident (e.g. one incident involving 3 victims results in three separate homicide cases in this analysis). The analysis of perpetrator data may therefore involve the same perpetrator several times.

Additionally, statistics comparing perpetrator and other case characteristics involve only the first perpetrator on that case. Tabulations of perpetrators ONLY data, present data on all perpetrators.

5. Perpetrator data is not limited to those perpetrators who were arrested, but rather represents all instances of suspect characteristics known to the police at the time of this analysis.

6. Arrest data is tabulated by location. The precinct of arrest is however not necessarily the precinct of commission. Thus it would be possible to have precincts with more than 100 arrests per 100 complaints (Map 3).

7. Since the number of cases where information is unavailable varies between 1983 and 1982 and between different case characteristics within each year, some tables in this report deal with tabulations of only those cases where information is available. Any tables with a total case count less than 1628 for 1983 or 1675 for 1982 have excluded cases with unavailable information.

8. An examination of the number of times victims of homicides had been arrested is not limited to those of a serious nature, i.e. robbery, assault. Included are any arrest, even of a 'minor' nature i.e. disorderly conduct, harrassment.

9. Statistics for 1982 circumstances, within the 1983 homicide analysis differ slightly from those appearing in the 1982 homicide analysis as a result of updated data.

1. Reading down each cell; the first figure is the number of cases, the second is the row percentage (are totaled across table), the third is the column percentage (are totaled reading down the table) and the last is the percentage relative to all the cases in the matrix.

GENERAL COMMENTS

1. There were 1,628 Homicides in New York City in 1983. This is 2.8% less than the 1982 total of 1,675. (Table 1).
2. Of the ten largest cities, New York ranked 6th in the rate of homicides per 100,000 population. New York City had 22.8 homicides per 100,000 population. (Table 103).
3. Brooklyn had the greatest number of homicides (514) followed by Manhattan with 513. Manhattan was the borough with the highest rate per 100,000 residents (35.8). (Table 1.)
4. Queens had the largest increase in homicides (+21) and the borough of The Bronx had the largest decrease (-79) comparing 1983 and 1982. (Table 1).
5. The 34th Precinct in Manhattan recorded the most homicides for 1983. (83). The 44th Precinct accounted for the most homicide arrests (58). (Tables 3 and 4).
6. There were 1,295 homicide arrests in 1983, a decrease of 1.4% when compared to 1982. 76.7% of these arrests were made by Precinct Detective Unit Personnel. (Table 5)
7. The month of December recorded the greatest number of homicides (189). February had the lowest count (99). (Table 6).
8. Homicides occurred most often on Saturday and the least frequent on Sunday. (Table 7).
9. Disputes continue to be the most frequent homicide circumstance, (42.1%) in 1983. Drug related homicides accounted for 24.3%. (Table 8).
10. Handguns continue to be the most frequently used homicide weapon. Handguns were used in 56.6% of the 1983 homicide cases recorded. (Table 10).
11. Most homicides occurred in open areas (43.4%) or in a residence (38.4%). (Table 12).

HOMICIDE VICTIMS AND PERPETRATORS

12. Homicides continue to be committed by someone known to the victim (80.9%). The category "Friends -Acquaintance" comprised (65.4%) of all homicide cases in which a relationship could be determined. (Table 15).
13. Perpetrators of homicides in 1983 were primarily male (92.3%) and primarily either black (49.8%) or Hispanic (37.7%) (Tables 18 and 19).
14. Victims of homicides in 1983 were primarily male (84.7%) and primarily either Black (45.0%) or Hispanic (35.4%). (Tables 22 and 23).
15. Almost half (48.9%) of the homicide perpetrators (where an age was known) were between the ages of 16 and 25. (Table 26).
16. More than one-third (35.2%) of the homicide victims were between the ages of 21 and 30. (Table 28).
17. A male Black between the ages of 21 and 25 was the most frequent homicide victim. (Table 30).
18. A male Black between the ages of 16 and 20 was the most frequent homicide perpetrator. (Table 34).
19. The average number of arrests recorded for those victims who had a prior record of arrest (816 of 1628; 50.1%) was five (5). The most frequent number of arrests recorded for these victims was 1, followed closely by nine or more arrests. (Table 40).
20. Blacks were victimized by Blacks in 84.3% of the cases, Hispanics were victimized by Hispanics in 80.0% of the cases and Whites were victimized by Whites in 58.2% of the cases. (Table 42).
21. Proportionately, Whites were more often killed by strangers (30.7%) than were Blacks or Hispanics. Numerically however, both Black and hispanic victims were involved in more stranger homicides. A victim of any race was most likely to have been killed by a friend or acquaintance. (Table 44).

22. A Cutting Instrument was the most frequently used weapon in common-law homicides, Physical Force in other intra-family homicides. Handguns were the weapons most often used in all other victim/perpetrator relationships. (Table 52).
23. A victim with prior arrest would most often (77.0%) be a homicide victim of a friend or acquaintance. (Table 54)

CIRCUMSTANCES OF HOMICIDES

24. Elderly Homicide victims were murdered most often during Robbery. (Table 56).
25. Blacks Whites and Hispanics were most often murdered in Disputes. A victim of a drug related homicide would most often be Black or Hispanic. (Table 58).
26. Males were more likely than females to be murdered in Robbery or Drug related incidents. Females were more likely murdered in disputes or sex crimes. (Table 60).
27. Friends and Acquaintances were most often murdered during disputes and drug related transactions. (Table 62).
28. A Handgun was the weapon most often used in all homicide categories other than Burglary and Sex crimes. Physical force followed by Cutting Instruments were most often utilized in Burglaries. Physical force was the weapon most often used in sex crimes. (Table 64).
29. Disputes and Drug Related homicides occurred most often in open areas. Burglary, Robbery and sex crime homicides occurred most often in a residence. (Table 66).
30. A victim of a homicide with a prior history of arrests was most often murdered during a dispute or drug related transaction. (Table 90).

HOMICIDE-MEANS EMPLOYED

31. Blacks and Hispanics were more likely than Whites to be murdered with a handgun. (Table 92).
32. Handguns were the means most often used in all victims age categories, other than the very young and the very old. Those over 60 or very young were most often murdered through the use of Physical Force. (Table 96).

HOMICIDE HISTORICAL DATA

33. New York City continued to evidence a decrease in Homicides, although at a rate less than nationwide. (Figure 1 - Table 100)
34. A trend in homicide circumstances for the last 20 years has been a marked increase in both the number of "crime related homicides" (Robbery, Drug Related etc.) and their percentage of the total. Both dispute and family related homicide have generally decreased in terms of their percentage of the total homicides. (Figure 2 - Table 101).
35. The most significant trend over the last 20 years in terms of the Means Employed in Homicides has been the increase in handguns. This is evident in both the number of handgun homicides and their percentage of the total cases recorded. (Figure 3 - Table 102).

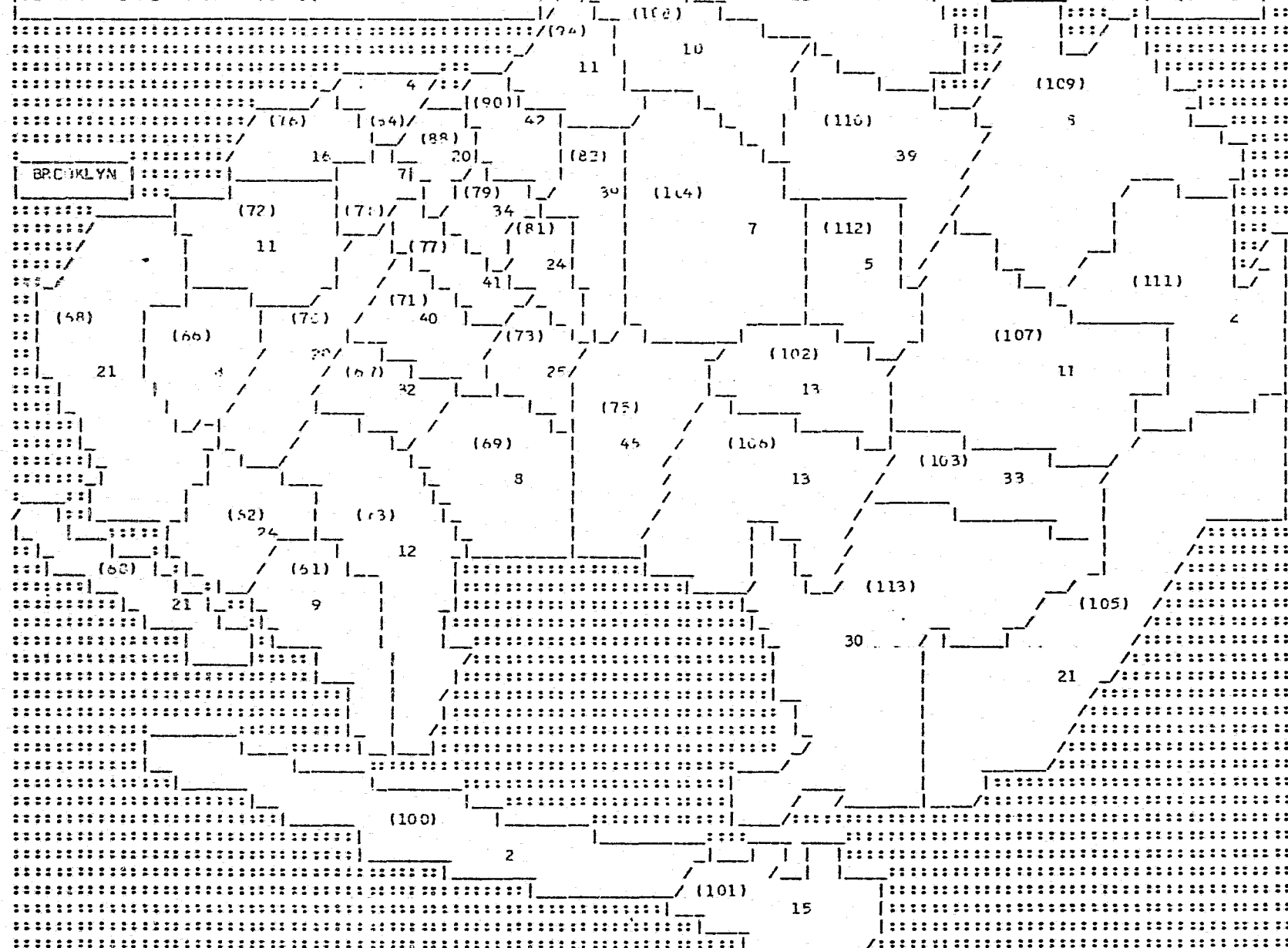

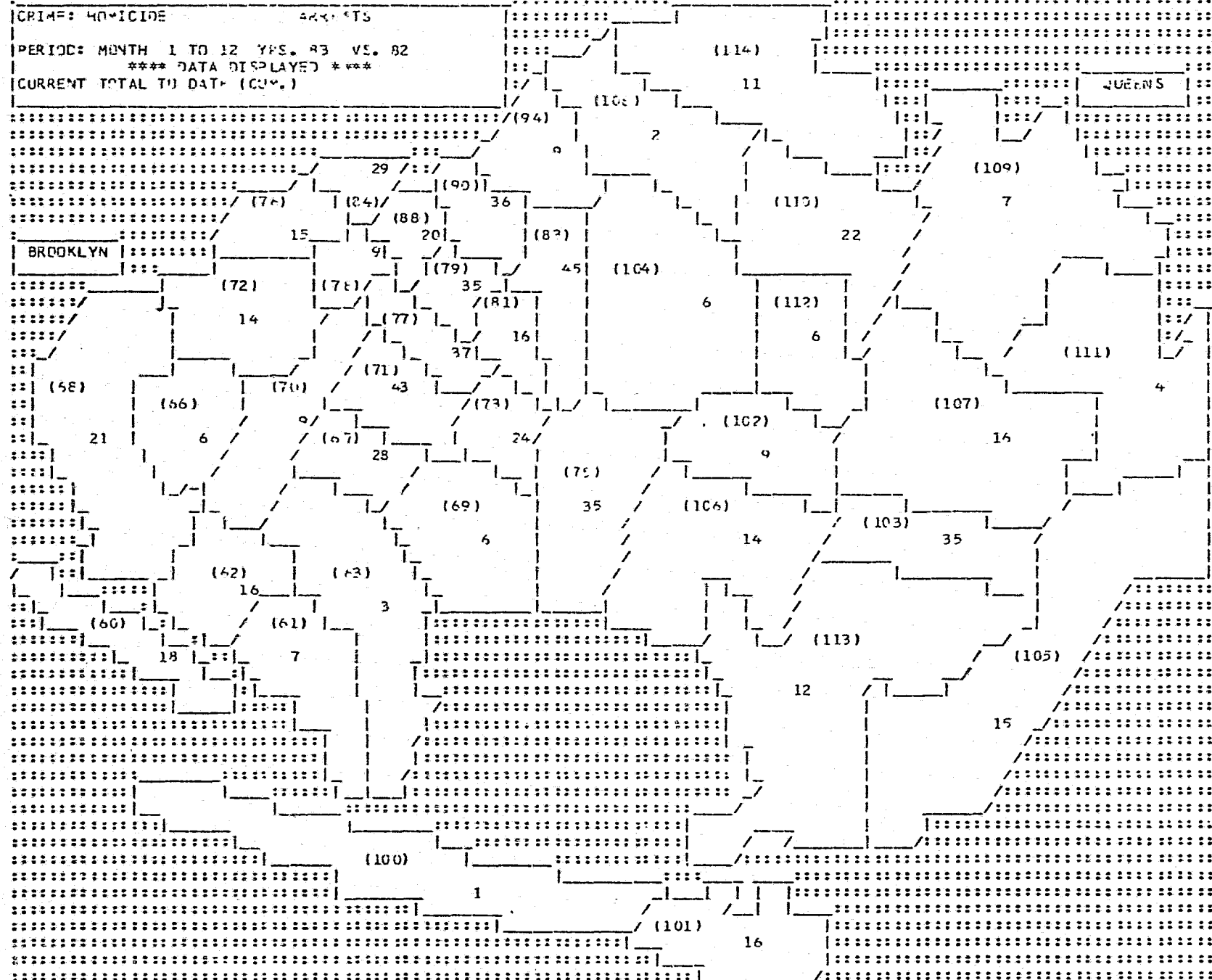
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PRECINCT RANKING BY HOMICIDE ARRESTS

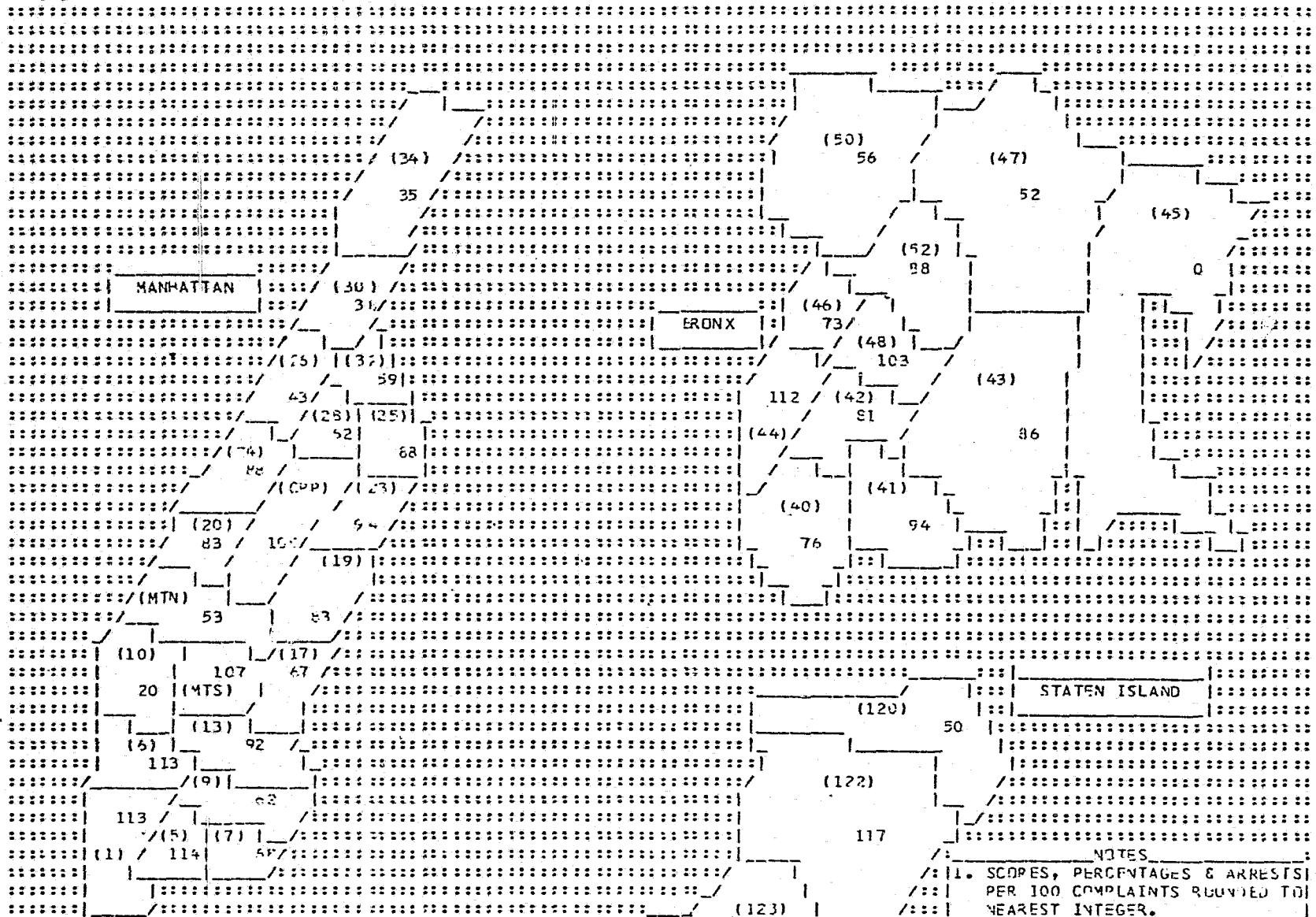

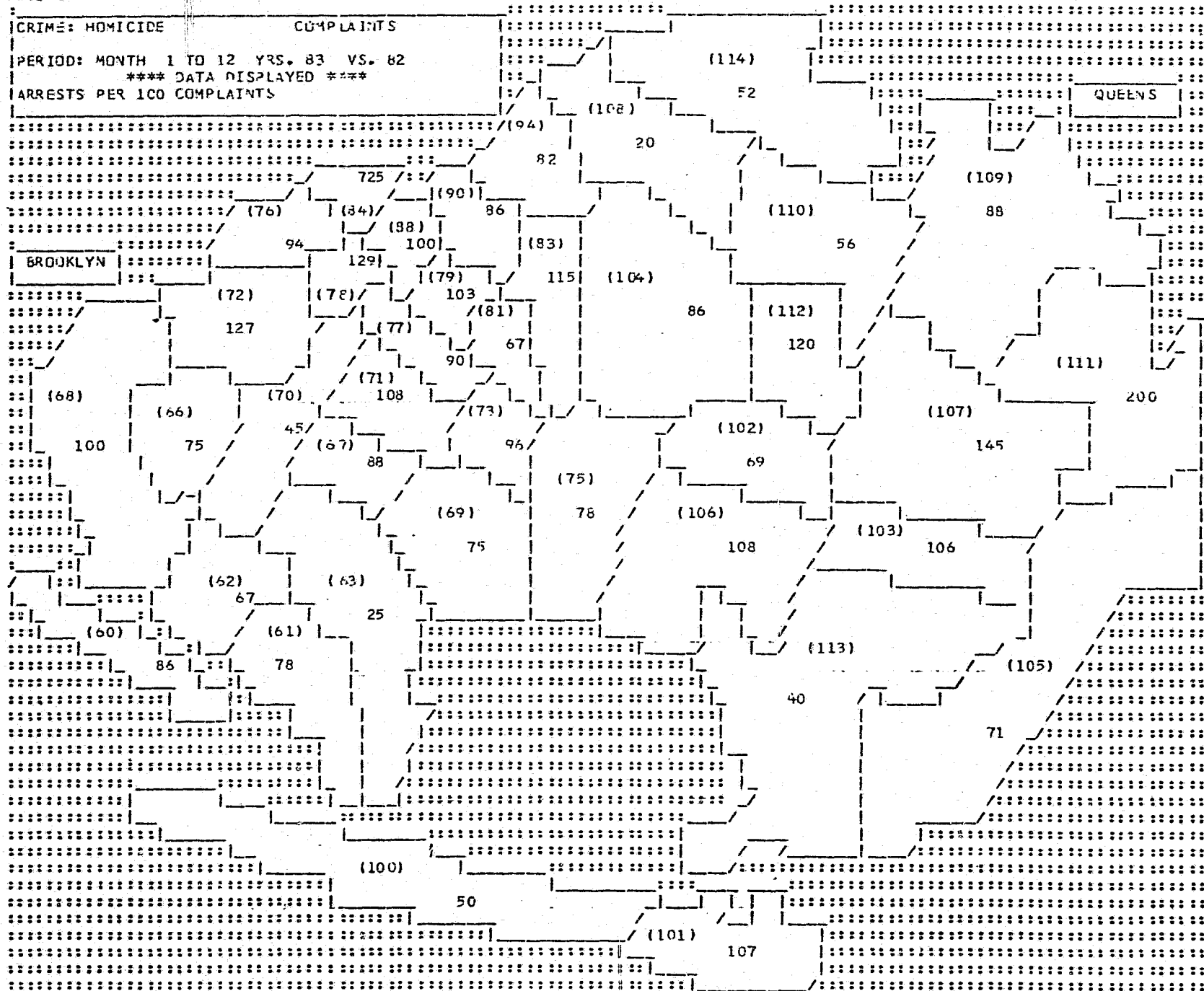

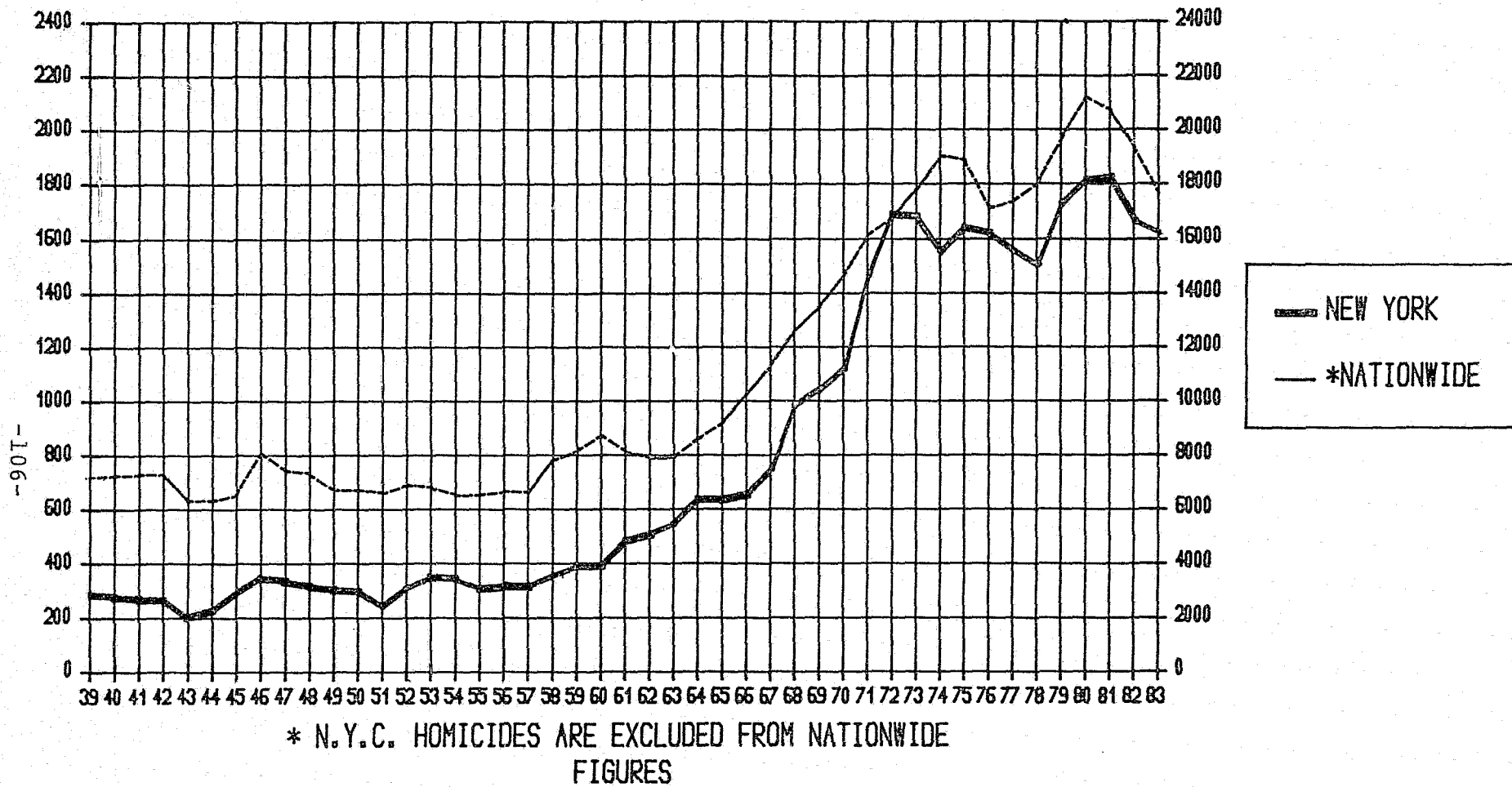

BREAKDOWN BY CIRCUMSTANCE FOR HOMICIDES 1960-1983

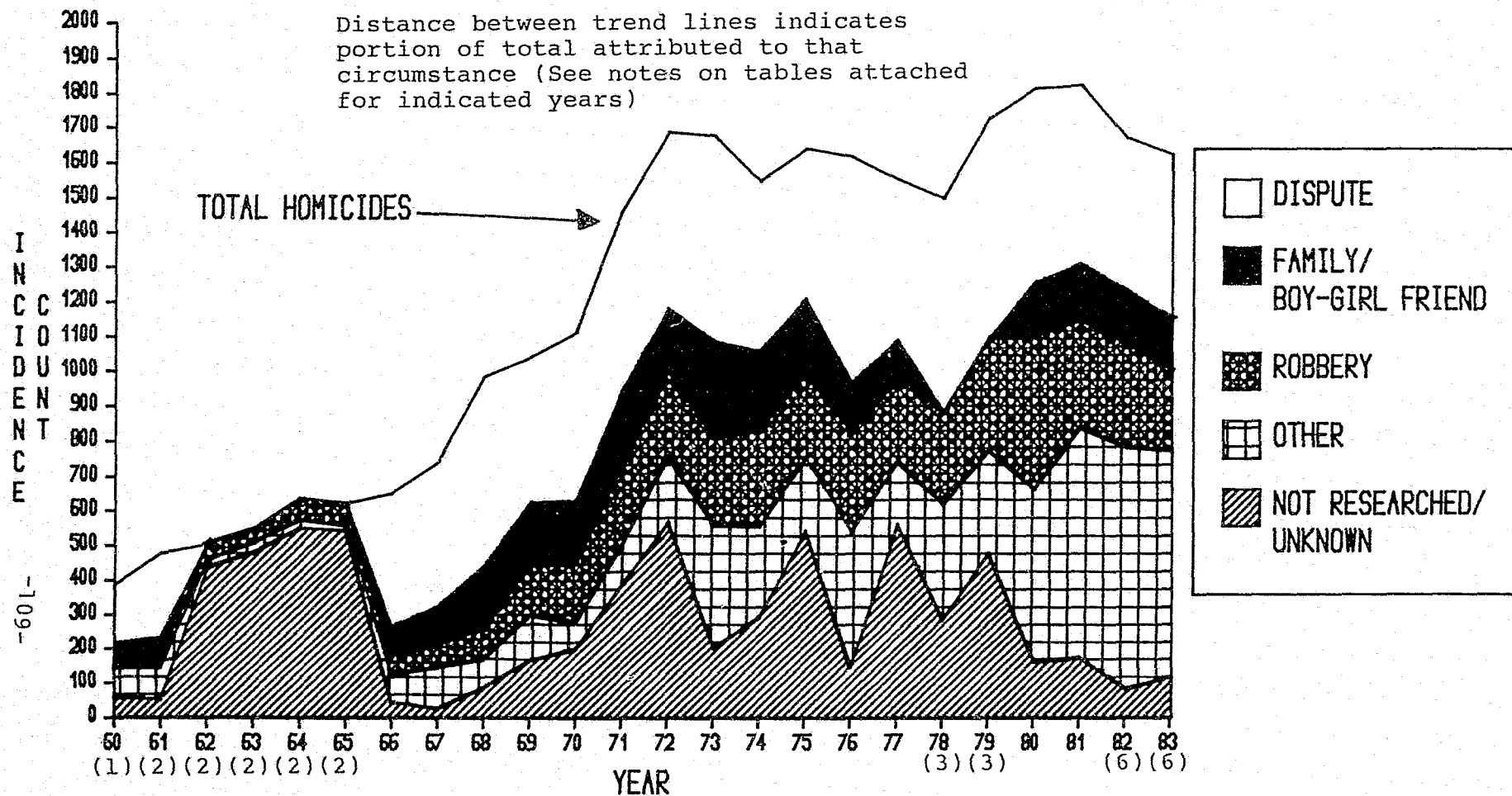

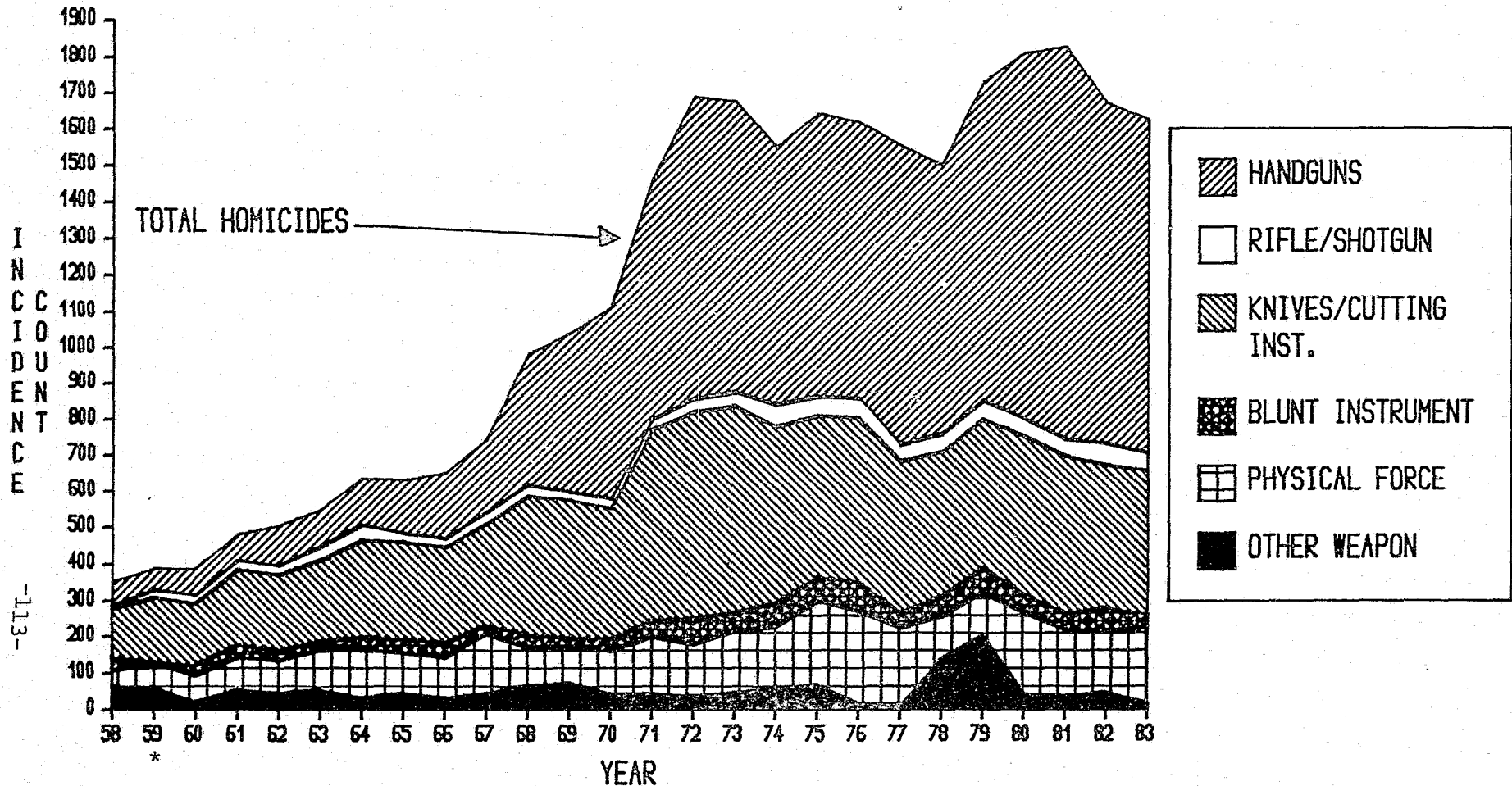

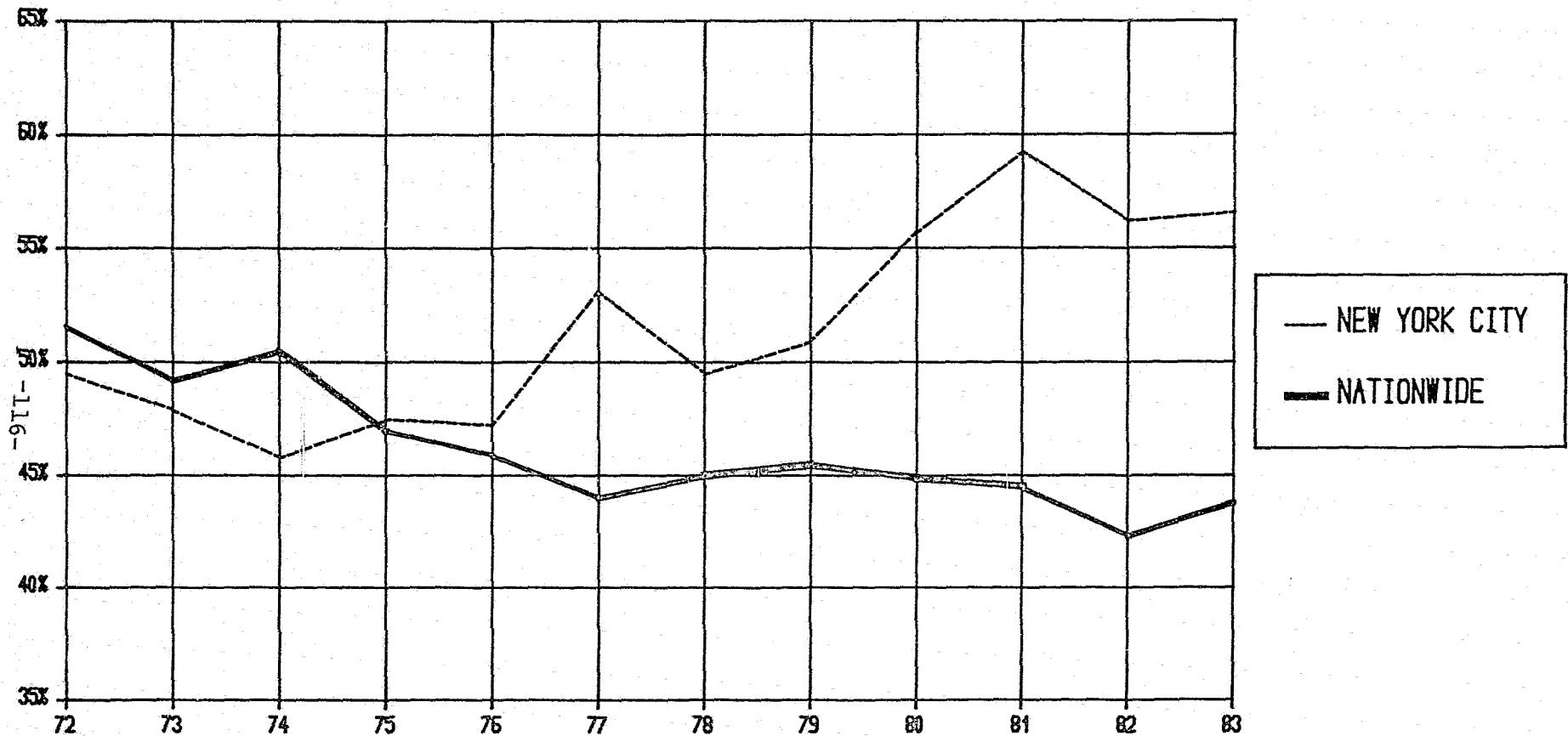
