
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

This year's publication of "Crime In Connecticut" is the ninth Annual Report issued by the Department of Public Safety. Crime statistics provided are based on reports submitted to the Connecticut Uniform Crime Reporting Program by every Connecticut law enforcement agency for the year 1986.

"Crime in Connecticut" provides summary information on offenses, arrests, and clearances; and offers comparisons between 1985 and 1986 data. Pursuant to the enactment of new legislation, statistics are included which pertain to family violence arrests occurring during the last quarter of 1986.

Accurate crime statistics are invaluable benchmarks for evaluating the effectiveness of ongoing programs and for developing new crime reduction strategies. Law enforcement administrators, policy-makers, and the general public utilize this information to address crime related issues at both the local and state levels.

The integrity of this publication is a tribute to the commitment of all Connecticut law enforcement agencies.

FACTS AT A GLANCE

CRIME CLOCK	IN 1986, AN INDEX CRIME OCCURRED ON THE AVERAGE OF ONE EVERY 3.4 MINUTES, A VIOLENT CRIME EVERY 39 MINUTES, AND PROPERTY CRIME EVERY 4 MINUTES.
INDEX CRIME	THERE WERE 153,990 INDEX OFFENSES REPORTED IN 1986, AN INCREASE OF 4,707 OVER THE 1985 TOTAL. THIS IS THE SECOND YEAR IN A ROW THAT CRIME HAS SHOWN AN INCREASE.
CRIME RATE	THE CRIME RATE FOR THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT WAS ESTABLISHED AT 4,828.7 OFFENSES FOR EVERY 100,000 RESIDENTS. THE 1986 POPULATION IS ESTIMATED AT 3,189,000 PERSONS.

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THE UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING SYSTEM

PURPOSE

THE UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM PERIODICALLY MEASURES CRIME IN THE UNITED STATES BY COUNTING THOSE OFFENSES BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES. THE PROGRAM'S OBJECTIVE IS TO PRODUCE RELIABLE CRIMINAL STATISTICS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION, OPERATION, AND MANAGEMENT. CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROFESSIONALS, LEGISLATORS, SCHOLARS, AND OTHERS CONCERNED WITH CRIME PROBLEMS MAKE FREQUENT USE OF UCR-GENERATED STATISTICS.

NATIONAL PROGRAM

UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING WAS INITIATED IN 1929 WHEN THE INTER-NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE (I.A.C.P.) STANDARDIZED PROCEDURES FOR CRIME DATA COLLECTION. ON JUNE 11, 1930, CONGRESS ENACTED LEGISLATION AUTHORIZING THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION TO COLLECT NATIONWIDE CRIME COUNTS AND TO SERVE AS THE CLEARINGHOUSE FOR SUCH DATA. THE COMMITTEE ON UNIFORM CRIME RECORDS OF THE I.A.C.P. CONTINUES TO ADVISE THE F.B.I. IN THE OPERATION OF THE UCR PROGRAM AND OFFERS THEM A VALUABLE LINK TO LOCAL POLICE DEPARTMENTS.

STATE PROGRAM

IN JULY, 1977, CONNECTICUT BEGAN ITS OWN UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM. BY AUGUST OF THE SAME YEAR, DATA COLLECTION BEGAN WITH THE RECRUITMENT AND TRAINING OF 70 AGENCIES. TODAY, CONNECTICUT HAS 101 FULL-TIME POLICE DEPARTMENTS PARTICIPATING IN ITS UCR PROGRAM.

THE STATE PROGRAM ENSURES QUALITY CONTROL AND UNIFORMITY OF THE CRIME AND ARREST REPORTS SUBMITTED. THE CENTRALIZED STATE COLLECTION AGENCY STREAMLINES THE TIME-CONSUMING PROCESS OF RESOLVING QUESTIONS BETWEEN CONTRIBUTORS AND VERIFIERS. UPON COMPLETION OF THE QUALITY CONTROL PROCESS, THE RETURNS ARE FORWARDED TO THE F.B.I.

TYPES OF DATA COLLECTED

EVERY MONTH LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES THROUGHOUT THE STATE SUBMIT UCR DATA. THEY INDICATE THE NUMBER OF OFFENSES BROUGHT TO THEIR ATTENTION THROUGH SUCH SOURCES AS VICTIM, POLICE, OR WITNESS REPORTS. THE UCR PROGRAM DEFINES CRIME INDEX OFFENSES AS THE FOLLOWING: MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER, FORCIBLE RAPE, ROBBERY, AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, BURGLARY, LARCENY-THEFT, MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT, AND ARSON.

AFTER COUNTING CRIME INDEX OFFENSES REPORTED, MINUS ANY UNFOUNDED COMPLAINTS, CONTRIBUTORS PROVIDE THE NUMBER OF "ACTUAL OFFENSES", AND THE NUMBER OF CRIMES CLEARED. FOR A CRIMINAL OFFENSE TO BE "CLEARED", EITHER OF THE TWO SITUATIONS MUST PREVAIL: (1) AT LEAST ONE PERSON IS ARRESTED, CHARGED, AND TURNED OVER TO THE COURT FOR PROSECUTION; OR (2) SOME ELEMENT BEYOND POLICE CONTROL PRECLUDES THE PHYSICAL ARREST OF THE OFFENDER, RESULTING IN THE OFFENSE BEING CLEARED BY "EXCEPTIONAL MEANS". CONTRIBUTING AGENCIES ALSO INCLUDE DATA ON THE VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED IN CONNECTION WITH THE AFOREMENTIONED OFFENSES, PLUS SPECIFIC INFORMATION REGARDING HOMICIDES AND ARSON.

UCR ARREST DATA IS COLLECTED FOR <u>ALL</u> CRIMES EXCEPT TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS. THE AGE, SEX, RACE, AND ETHNIC ORIGINS OF ARRESTEES ARE REPORTED FOR ALL CRIME CATEGORIES.

REPORTING PROCEDURE

CONTRIBUTING AGENCIES ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR SUBMITTING THEIR OWN CRIME REPORTS TO THE STATE UCR PROGRAM. A FULL-TIME FIELD REPRESENTATIVE OFFERS TRAINING IN UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROCEDURES TO ENSURE QUALITY AND UNIFORMITY IN THE DATA SUBMITTED TO THE STATE PROGRAM. CONTRIBUTORS ALSO RECEIVE THE UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING HANDBOOK WHICH PROVIDES A DETAILED OUTLINE OF OFFENSE CLASSIFYING AND SCORING PROCEDURES.

VERIFICATION PROCEDURE

UCR REPORTS ARE SET UP WITH NUMEROUS INTERNAL CROSS-CHECKS TO ACHIEVE REPORTING ACCURACY OF THE DATA. IT IS STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE TO EXAMINE EACH INCOMING REPORT FOR ARITHMETICAL ACCURACY. REPORTS ARE THEN SUBJECTED TO LOGICAL TESTS OF REASONABLENESS, WHICH ARE OF KEY IMPORTANCE TO CONFIRMING VALIDITY. LOGICAL ERRORS RESULTING FROM MISINTERPRETATIONS OF WHAT IS TO BE MEASURED CAN THEN BE CORRECTED. UCR PERSONNEL CORRECT MINOR ERRORS WITHOUT CONTACTING CONTRIBUTORS, BUT NECESSARY ARITHMETICAL ADJUSTMENTS OR UNUSUAL VARIATIONS ARE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE SUBMITTING AGENCY.

UCR LIMITATIONS

THERE ARE INHERENT LIMITATIONS IN CURRENT CRIME REPORTING PRACTICES. OF PRIMARY IMPORTANCE IS THE QUESTION OF HOW MUCH CRIME IS BEING REPORTED. THE DEGREE TO WHICH CRIMES ARE BEING REPORTED VARIES FROM AREA TO AREA. A CONSIDERABLE VOLUME OF CRIME IS NOT REPORTED TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES BECAUSE THE VICTIMS CONSIDER THE OFFENSES AGAINST THEM TO BE OF VERY LITTLE CONSEQUENCE OR THE LIKELIHOOD OF APPREHENDING THE SUSPECT IS SMALL. THEY MAY ALSO FEAR RETALIATION FROM OFFENDERS, OR ARE RELUCTANT TO REVEAL THEIR OWN INVOLVEMENT IN THE OFFENSE OR IN OTHER CRIMES. CONSEQUENTLY, INFORMATION CONCERNING SOME OFFENSES IS NEVER ENTERED INTO THE REPORTING SYSTEM.

EVEN WITH THESE GIVEN LIMITATIONS, THE UCR PROGRAM PROVIDES THE BEST NETWORK OF STATE AND NATIONAL CRIME FIGURES CURRENTLY AVAILABLE.

CRIME FACTORS

BECAUSE NOT ALL FACTORS THAT HAVE AN IMPACT ON CRIME PROBLEMS ARE MEASURED OR CONSIDERED BY THE UCR PROGRAM, SUPERFICIAL CONCLUSIONS ARE SOMETIMES DRAWN FROM ITS CRIME AND ARREST DATA, PARTICULARLY WHEN ATTEMPTS ARE MADE TO MAKE COMPARISONS BETWEEN JURISDICTIONS. LOCAL ORDINANCES AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE ADMINISTRATIVE POLICIES, RECORD-KEEPING PRACTICES, AND THE DEGREE TO ADHERENCE TO UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING STANDARDS ALL AFFECT THE NUMBER OF CRIMES AND ARRESTS REPORTED. ADDITIONALLY, SOCIO-ECONOMIC CONDITIONS AND THE CHARACTERISTICS AND ATTITUDES OF THE LOCAL POPULATION INFLUENCE THE EXTENT AND NATURE OF CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR IN A COMMUNITY. THE FOLLOWING FACTORS MUST BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION BEFORE AN INFORMED ASSESSMENT OF CRIME DATA CAN BE MADE:

- DENSITY AND SIZE OF THE COMMUNITY POPULATION AND ITS SURROUNDING AREA.
- VARIATIONS IN THE COMPOSITION OF THE POPULATION, PARTICULARLY ITS AGE, SEX, AND RACE COMPOSITION.

- STABILITY OF POPULATION WITH RESPECT TO SUCH FACTORS AS COMMUTERS, SEASONAL RESIDENTS, AND OTHER TRANSIENT TYPES.
- ECONOMIC CONDITIONS, INCLUDING UNEMPLOYMENT.
- " CULTURAL CONDITIONS, SUCH AS EDUCATIONAL, RECREATIONAL, AND RELIGIOUS CHARACTERISTICS.
- " CLIMATE.
- # EFFECTIVE STRENGTH OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES.
- ADMINISTRATIVE AND INVESTIGATIVE EFFICIENCY OF THE LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY.
- POLICIES OF OTHER COMPONENTS OF THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM, SUCH AS PROSECUTORIAL, JUDICIAL, CORRECTIONAL, AND PROBATIONAL.
- ATTITUDES OF CITIZENS TOWARD CRIME.
- CRIME REPORTING PRACTICE OF CITIZENS.

FUTURE OF THE UCR PROGRAM

IN JUNE, 1985, A TASK FORCE OF THE F.B.I. AND THE BUREAU OF JUSTICE STATISTICS RELEASED THE FINDINGS OF A THREE-YEAR STUDY OF THE UCR PROGRAM. STUDY FINDINGS EMPHASIZED THE DEVELOPMENT OF MEANS TO PRESENT MORE DETAILED CRIME STATISTICS. THE STUDY RECOMMENDED THAT MORE INFORMATIONAL ELEMENTS BE COLLECTED, SUCH AS THE TIME AND LOCATION OF CRIMINAL INCIDENTS, THE NATURE AND EXTENT OF INJURY OR LOSS, AND VICTIM AND OFFENDER CHARACTERISTICS. BY COLLECTING SUCH INFORMATION ON A CASE-BY-CASE BASIS, DETAILED ANALYSIS OF CRIME STATISTICS COULD BE ACHIEVED.

CHANGES IN DATA COLLECTION TECHNIQUES AND RELATED COMPUTER PROGRAMMING MUST OCCUR PRIOR TO IMPLEMENTATION OF STUDY RECOMMENDATIONS ON A NATIONAL LEVEL. AS OF 1987, A PILOT PROGRAM HAS BEEN INSTALLED IN SOUTH CAROLINA TO TEST THE NEW REPORTING AND COLLECTION SYSTEM. THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM WILL BE EVALUATED AT THE NATIONAL UCR CONFERENCE IN EARLY 1988.

INDEX CRIME



THE INDEX IS COMPOSED OF THOSE CRIMES CONSIDERED TO REPRESENT THE MOST SERIOUS BY NATURE OR BY THE VOLUME IN WHICH THEY OCCUR.

CRIME CLASSIFICATIONS USED IN THE CRIME INDEX ARE: MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER, FORCIBLE RAPE, ROBBERY, AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, BURGLARY, LARCENY, AND MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT.



MURDER

MURDER IS DEFINED IN THE UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM AS THE WILLFUL (NON-NEGLIGENT) KILLING OF ONE HUMAN BEING BY ANOTHER. ANY DEATH DUE TO A FIGHT, ARGUMENT, QUARREL, ASSAULT, OR COMMISSION OF A CRIME IS INCLUDED. ATTEMPTS TO KILL AND ASSAULTS TO KILL ARE COUNTED UNDER AGGRAVATED ASSAULT. SUICIDES, ACCIDENTAL DEATHS, AND JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDES ARE NOT COUNTED IN THIS CATEGORY.

TRAFFIC DEATHS CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF SOMEONE OTHER THAN THE VICTIM ARE COUNTED UNDER ARRESTS FOR MANSLAUGHTER BY NEGLIGENCE ACCORDING TO AGE, SEX, AND RACE.



VICTIM/OFFENDER RELATIONSHIP






WEAPONS DISTRIBUTION









TRAFFIC ARRESTS, EXCEPT DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE, ARE NOT REPORTED.

THE AGE, SEX, RACE AND ETHNIC ORIGIN OF PERSONS ARRESTED FORMS ARE DESIGNED TO COLLECT DATA ON THE NUMBER OF PERSONS ARRESTED AND NOT THE NUMBER OF CHARGES LODGED. FOR EXAMPLE, A PERSON MAY BE ARRESTED ON SEVERAL CHARGES AT ONE TIME; ONLY ONE ARREST WOULD BE SCORED. FOR UCR PURPOSES, A JUVENILE IS COUNTED AS "ARRESTED" WHEN THE CIRCUMSTANCES ARE SUCH THAT IF HE OR SHE WERE AN ADULT, AN ARREST WOULD RESULT.



POLICE EMPLOYEE DATA

AS OF OCTOBER 31, 1986, 101 AGENCIES COVERING 3,189,000 CONNECTICUT RESIDENTS REPORTED A TOTAL OF 6,780 FULL-TIME LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS. WHEN FULL-TIME CIVILIANS ARE INCLUDED, THE TOTAL COUNT IS 8,273 LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES.

BEFORE MAKING COMPARISONS IN POLICE STRENGTH FROM ONE MUNICIPALITY
TO ANOTHER, SERIOUS CONSIDERATION SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE MANY FACTORS
THAT AFFECT THE NEED FOR POLICE SERVICE. FOR EXAMPLE, THE NEED
FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICE IN SEASONAL OR HIGHLY MOBILE COMMUNITY
DIFFERS FROM A LOCALE WHOSE POPULATION IS STABLE. OTHER FACTORS
THAT AFFECT POLICE SERVICE ARE GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION, DENSITY OF
POPULATION, NEARBY URBAN AREAS, AND COMMUNITY INTEREST IN LAW ENFORCEMENT.

1986 SUMMARY ANALYSIS

LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN THE STATE REPORTED A TOTAL OF 8,273 FULL-TIME POLICE EMPLOYEES FOR 1986.

THERE WERE 6,780 SWORN POLICE OFFICERS EMPLOYED BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, 82.0% OF THE TOTAL LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES.

FULL-TIME CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES WERE REPORTED AT 1,493; 18.0% OF TOTAL LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES.

95.0% OF ALL FULL-TIME LAW OFFICERS WERE MALE, 5.0% WERE FEMALE.

63.6% OF ALL FULL-TIME CIVILIANS WERE FEMALE, 36.4% WERE MALE.

OF THE 6,780 FULL-TIME SWORN POLICE OFFICERS, 86.2% WERE MUNICIPAL AND 13.8% WERE STATE POLICE.

FAMILY VIOLENCE REPORT

INTRODUCTION

In 1986, the Connecticut General Assembly enacted Title 46b of the Connecticut General Statutes (CGS). The statutes create a number of responsibilities for law enforcement officers when dealing with family violence. Police officers are required to effect arrests for family violence crimes whenever there is probable cause that a crime occurred. Arrest is mandated regardless of the relationship of the victim to the offender and is not to be based on either the consent or solely on the request of the victim.

The mandatory arrest requirement has two purposes. First, the legislature intends to demonstrate to offenders that family violence will be duly punished as are other serious crimes in this state. Second, arrest for family violence crimes is increasingly accepted as a proven means of deterring future violent episodes. The new laws aim to break the cycle of domestic violence.

Police are now also required to provide victim services at the crime scene. Victims must be assisted in obtaining medical treatment, advised of their right to file an affidavit for an arrest and informed of their right to benefits from the Criminal Injuries Compensation Board.

Each law enforcement agency has developed and implemented operational guidelines for family violence arrest practices to conform with CGS 46b-38B(f). The Municipal Police Training Council has also established a training program for officers, supervisors and state's attorneys on handling family violence incidents pursuant to the new statutes.

In order to obtain an indication of the prevalence of family violence as well as to monitor the implementation and effectiveness of the new mandates, statistics are compiled by the Department of Public Safety's Crimes Analysis Unit.

Law enforcement officers are required to submit a report on each family violence crime arrest. Data collected include the names of parties involved, their sex, date of birth and relationship. Information on the town, date and time of the incident is also required. The type of offense, extent of victim injury, whether drugs, children or prior court orders were involved and number and type of weapons used are also reported.

Following is a summary of data submitted by law enforcement agencies as of June 24, 1987 concerning family violence crime arrests for the October 1 through December 31, 1986 period.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Without the support and cooperation of the law enforcement community, this report would not have been possible. Response to the family violence mandates has been very impressive. All of the agencies have been very cooperative in submitting arrest reports as well as verifying data and resubmitting reports when needed. By December 1986, 100% of Connecticut police agencies were in full compliance with reporting requirements.

DEFINITIONS

BOTH ARRESTED: When both/all parties involved in a family violence offense are arrested, they are classified into the "Both" arrested status. When all participants are arrested, they are considered victims as well as offenders. This unique class is at times counted with the offender group in total arrests and with the victim group in total victimizations. Whenever a victimization resulting in arrest occurs, relationship data is collected.

BREACH OF PEACE AND DISURDERLY CONDUCT: Crimes of Threatening, Harrassment and Reckless Endangerment may be reported under either Breach of Peace or Disorderly Conduct.

HIERARCHY OF OFFENSES: The Family Violence Reporting Program follows a hierarchy of offenses classification system similar to that employed by the Uniform Crime Reporting Program. Although multiple offenses are frequently reported, only one offense code is accepted into the computer system. When there are multiple offenses, the offense code highest in the following list (in descending order) is accepted: Homicide, Assault, Kidnapping, Sexual Assault, Criminal Mischief, Risk of Injury to Minor, Breach of Peace, Disorderly Conduct and "Other".

PRIOR COURT ORDERS: Temporary Restraining Orders and Protective Orders.

RELATIONSHIP: Relationship of VICTIM to offender. If there is more than one offender in an incident, the code which describes the closest relationship of victim to offender is counted.

WEAPONS INVOLVED: The most serious weapon used is counted.



- ☼ Drugs/Alcohol were involved in over half (50.8%) of offenses.
- 36.9% of family violence offenses occurred on Saturday (20.0%) or Sunday (16.8%).
- 43.7% of offenses occurred in the six hour period between 6:00 p.m. and midnight.
- Children were involved or present in 45.6% of arrest incidents. Specifically, children were involved 9.3% of the time and present 36.2% of the time.



Males who were only victims were most often (48.6%) relatives residing in the same home with the offender.


AGE OF PARTICIPANTS


