INTRODUCTION

The Commonwealth's county prison system is just as diverse as the political and cultural make-up of the counties themselves. However, one characteristic binds them together-the recent increase in the county prison population. This report will enable the reader to comprehend the increasing demands placed upon these county facilities, especially when they are reviewed in terms of increasing populations during recent years.

Purpose

The purpose of this annual statistical report is to provide summary data on county prison inmate populations.

Explanatory Notes

Committing county - Where indicated, several tables in this report were compiled by the 'committing' county instead of the reporting county. The committing county represents the actual county where the defendant was sentenced and not the receiving county prison or jail.

Conditional releases - This term identifies those parolees who are released under the supervision of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole (PBPP) or who are paroled directly by the Court of Record (often referred to as "county parole"). Unless otherwise specified, these two groups will be combined in this report.

County prisons and jails - Generally, first through fifth class counties have "prisons" and sixth through eighth class counties have "jails", though local terminology may vary (e.g., Allegheny County Jail). Generally, the county prisons are administered by a prison board and an appointed warden; county jails are usually administered by an elected sheriff. In recent years the county prisons and jails have primarily received only the short-term sentenced prisoners and pre-trial detentioners.

Court sentences - This term identifies those county prisoners committed by a Court of Record to serve sentences for felony and misdemeanor offenses.

Detentioners received¹ - This term identifies those individuals detained prior to trial as well as other prisoners not sentenced directly to the local prisons where they are contained. Detentioners include those individuals who were: (1) held for trial, further hearing, or as a material witness, (2) held for various federal, state or other police authorities, and (3) held for mental examination or observation.

Detentioners released - This term identifies those individuals released by the following methods: (1) bail, (2) holding authority (i.e., court, minor judiciary, coroner, etc.), (3) sentenced to local county prison, (4) sentenced to state correctional institutions, (5) sentenced to state regional correctional facilities, (6) by various federal, state, and police authorities, and (7) mental patients released.

Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) - The Office of Management and Budget (Federal) has announced the designation of 257 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA's), 23 Consolidated Metropolitan Statistical Areas (CMSA's), and 78 Primary Metropolitan Statistical Areas (PMSA's). An area qualifies as an MSA if there is a city with a population of at least 50,000 or an urbanized area of at least 50,000 with a total population of at least 100,000. If an area has more than one million population and

meets certain criteria, that area is classified as a CMSA and its components are considered as PMSA's. MSA's and PMSA's are classified by size as follows:

- Level A - Areas of 1,000,000 or more
- Level B - Areas of 250,000 to 1,000,000
- Level C - Areas of 100,000 to 250,000
- Level D - Areas of less than 100,000

Minor judiciary sentences - This term identifies those individuals who receive sentences by the minor judiciary (district magistrates, justices, etc.) for county prison commitment. (Note: The municipal court in Philadelphia County handles this type of case.)

Part I offenses - In general, Part I crimes are those serious offenses that are reported to law enforcement agencies and are commonly referred to as crime index offenses. Part I offenses consist of murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft-larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

Part II offenses - Part II offenses are made up of all other crimes not classified as a Part I crime.

Rate per 100,000 civilian population - This term represents the ratio of a prison population with respect to the civilian population of the county.

Sentenced prisoners - In this report, sentenced prisoners include both defendants sentenced by a Court of Record and the Minor Judiciary (district magistrates, justices and etc.) to serve a sentence in a local county prison or jail.

Unconditional releases - This term identifies those sentenced county prisoners who were given a final discharge and are no longer under any type of supervision after their release from county prison. Unconditional releases include the following: (1) expiration of maximum sentence, (2) by court order, (3) by minor judiciary order, and (4) by payment of fines and costs.

Yearly average daily population - This term represents the cumulative daily inmate population count as of midnight, divided by the number of days in the calendar year.

Source of Information

Information found in this report is based entirely upon monthly and quarterly population statistical reports submitted by county prisons and jails to the Department's Records and Statistics Section, organized under the Finance, Planning and Research Division. The data is then edited, corrected, and summarized for input into this report.

Comment

Populations may not represent physically present counts because several county prisons are including prisoners who were transferred to other county prisons due to crowding and prisoners transferred to other facilities such as mental hospitals, halfway houses, and etc.

Data on sentenced prisoners received and released are not verified for complete accuracy and subsequently, should be used with caution. Since some sentencing orders

are received after prisoners are released, some defendants who are sentenced to 'time served' and released (paroled) immediately are reported as detentioners instead. We have no way of knowing how many defendants are actually sentenced to county prisons and jails by Common Pleas Courts and District Magistrates.

SELECTIVE NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Population Trends

Since 1978, populations in Pennsylvania county prisons and jails increased substantially in excess of 65%. During 1983 and 1984, populations in county prisons increased approximately 4%. The yearly average population for 1984 was 10,571, up from 10,146 in 1983, an increase of 4.2%. The county prisons population on December 31, 1984 was 10,156, up from 9,780 in 1983, an increase of 3.8%. While populations appear to be leveling off in recent years, it should be mentioned that the two largest contributing counties, Philadelphia and Allegheny, are under court order to reduce their prison populations.

Characteristics of Inmate Population

A review of the statewide county prison inmate population on December 31, 1984 revealed the following:

1. 52.7% were white; 47.3% were non-white;
2. 95.2% were males; 4.8% were females;
3. 34.4% were sentenced; 65.6% were detentioners (unsentenced);
4. 39.7% were confined in Philadelphia (34.4%) and Allegheny (5.3%) Counties; and
5. There were 85.4 county prisoners per 100,000 civilian population.

Admissions

During 1984, defendants sentenced by a Court of Record to serve time in local county prisons increased 34.9%; defendants sentenced by district magistrates decreased 0.3%; and detentioners (unsentenced) received increased 5.8%. The average maximum sentence was 396.6 days and their average age was 29.8 years. One-third or 33.2% were sentenced to serve time for drunken driving and 24.7% for serious offenses (Part I).

Releases

During 1984, 62.8% of all sentenced prisoners released from county prisons were placed under supervision of state and county paroling authorities. Sentenced prisoners released served an average of 90.4 days, down from 107.1 days in 1983. 40.7% of all sentenced prisoners released in 1984 served from one to fifteen days.

The Largest County Prisons

Twenty-one counties had a yearly average daily population exceeding 100 inmates, which accounted for 84.1% of the Commonwealth's total yearly average daily population. County prisons averaging over 300 inmates were Philadelphia (3,680), Allegheny (535), Delaware (506), Chester (409), Montgomery (391), Dauphin (322), and Berks (316).

Driving Under The Influence

Defendants sentenced to local county prisons and jails for driving under the influence (drunken driving) increased by 3,399 or 117.7% from 2,887 in 1983 to 6,286 in 1984. During 1980, only 635 sentenced prisoners were received for this offense. Sentenced prisoners released during 1984 for this offense served an average of 19.5 days; 68% of these served one to fifteen days.

POPULATIONS IN COUNTY PRISONS AND JAILS 1975 TO 1984

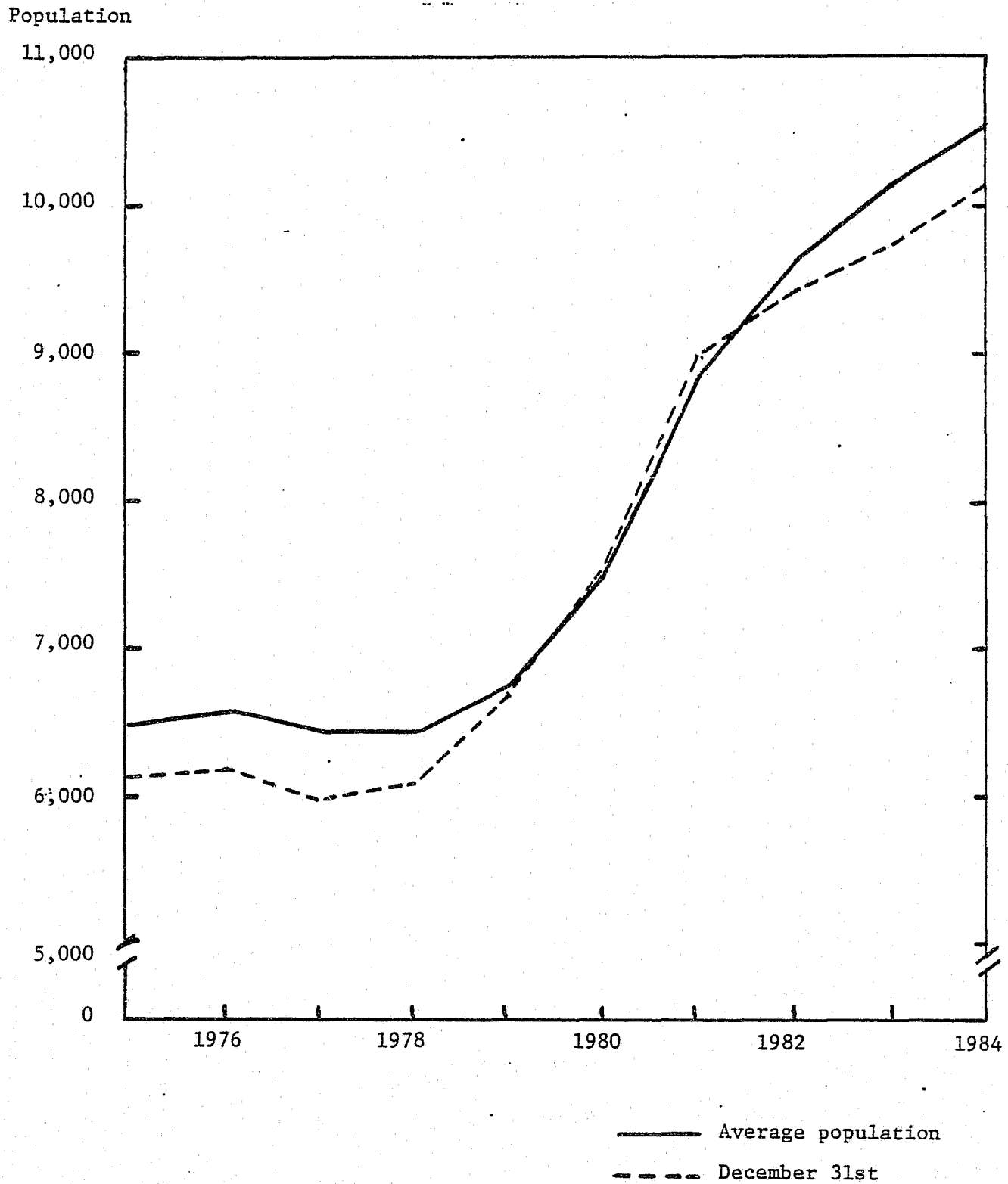

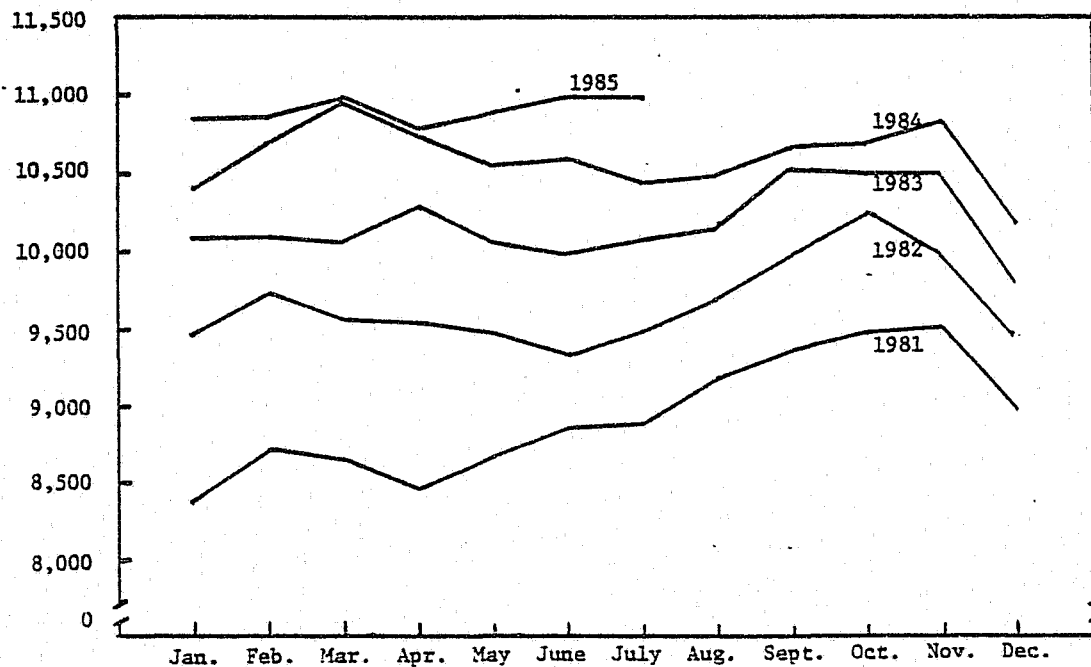

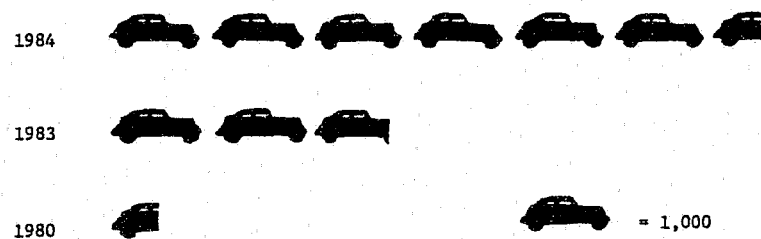

NUMBER OF SENTENCED PRISONERS RECEIVED FOR DRUNKEN DRIVING IN 1984

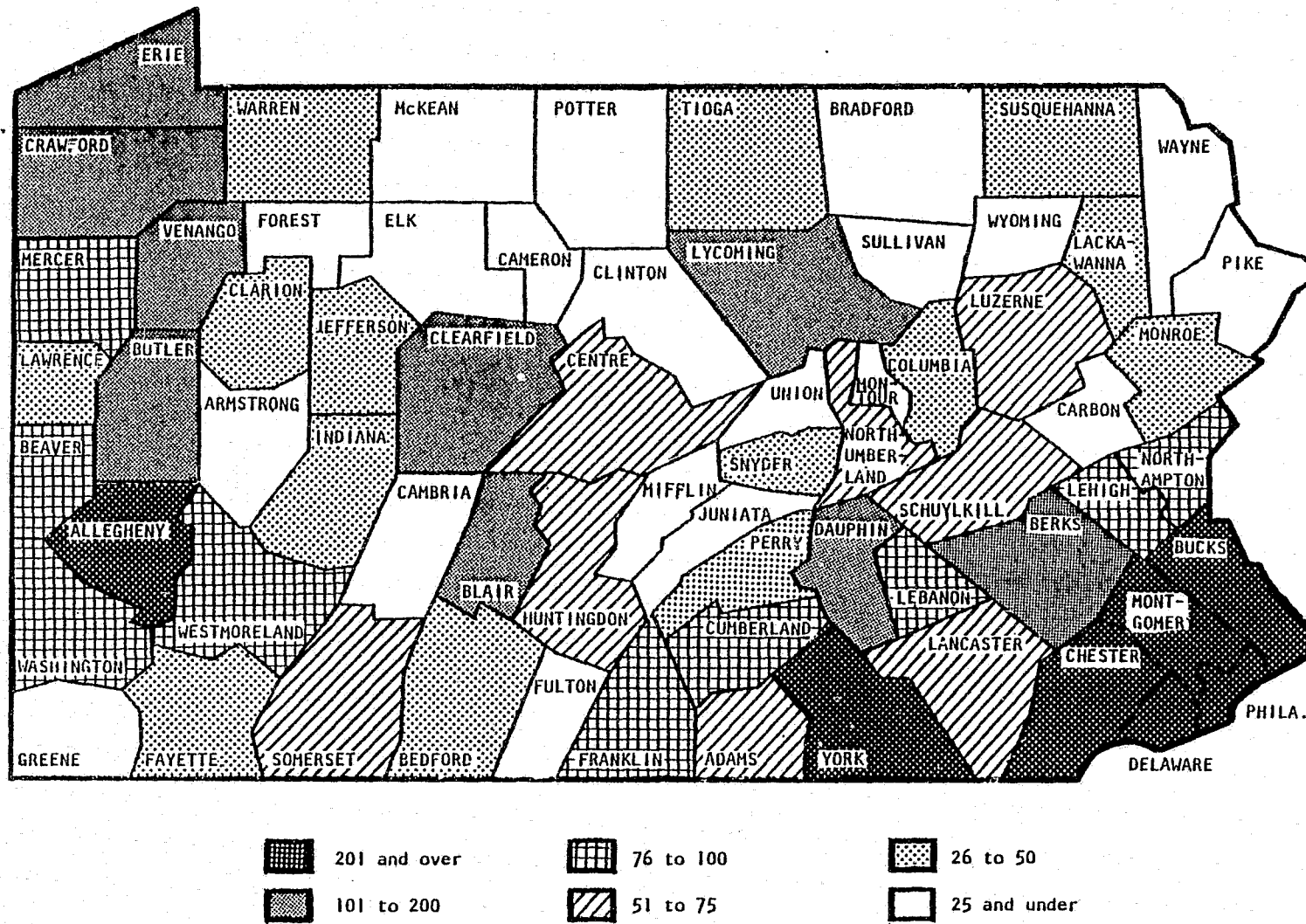

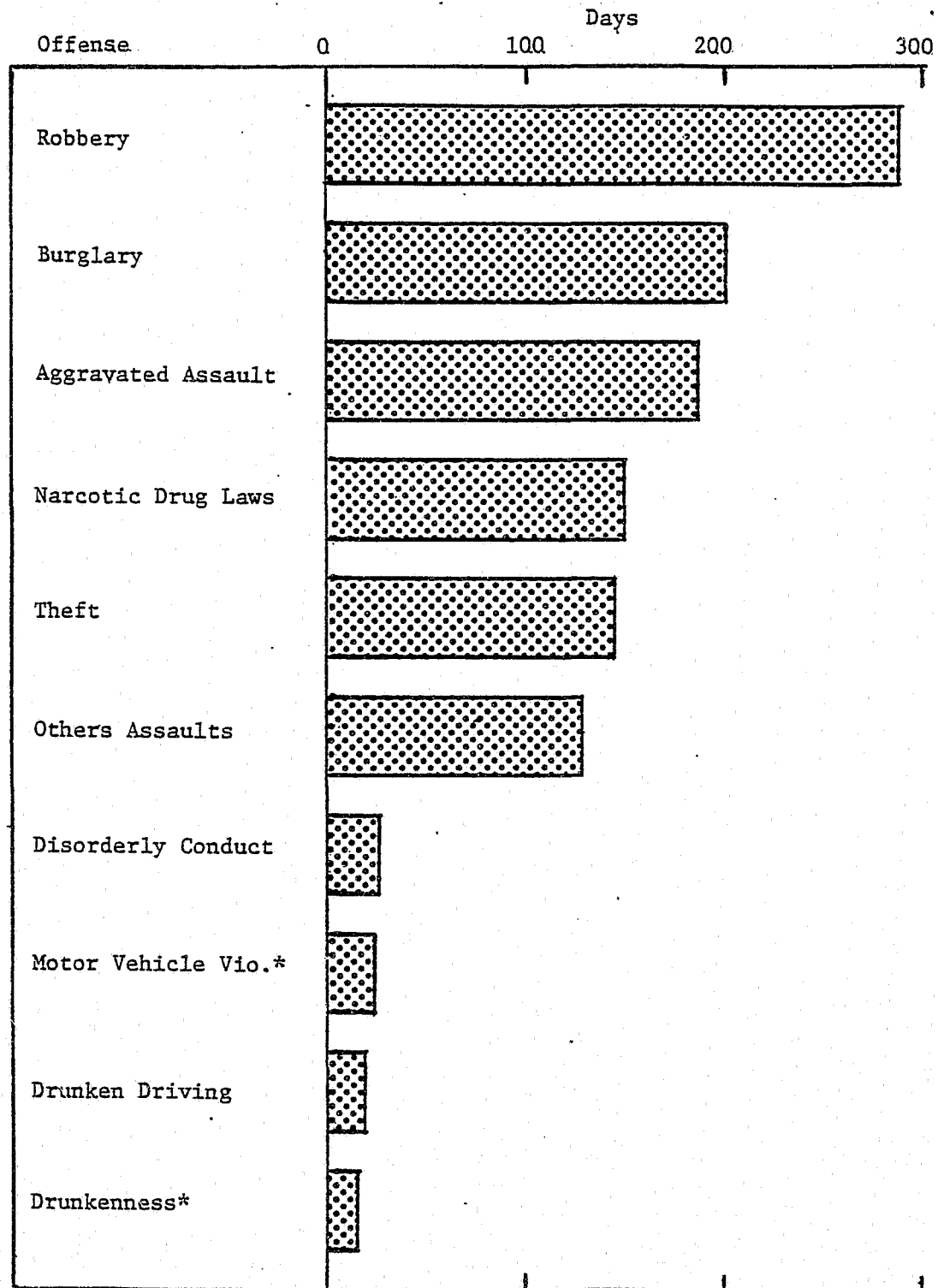
