#### Documentation Package for Directory Survey of Law Enforcement Agencies

#### I. Purpose and Background

The purpose for conducting the Directory Survey of Law Enforcement Agencies was twofold: to update the law enforcement sector of the Justice Agency List and to provide a universe from which a sample of law enforcement agencies could be selected based on number of sworn officers. In the fall of 1985, Census Bureau staff reviewed the existing list of law enforcement agencies, which was last updated in 1977. Using the 1985 National Directory of Law Enforcement Administrators and other secondary sources, they updated addresses, identified and added new agencies, and deleted inactive or abolished law enforcement agencies. They also checked the list against the 1982 Census of Governments Employment File to ensure that all local governments reporting police employment had an agency on the list.

Immediately following the update, a questionnaire (CJ-38) was mailed out to all agencies except coroners for the Directory Survey of Law Enforcement Agencies. The questionnaire was designed to obtain data on type of agency, whether or not they administer a jail or lockup, geographic jurisdiction of the agency and the total number of employees, broken down by sworn and nonsworn. It was also used to verify agency names, addresses and telephone numbers. The information received as to whether or not a law enforcement agency administered a jail was used to update the Directory of Local Jails.

The Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Street Act of 1968 as amended (42 U.S.C. 3732) authorized the collection of this information. This request for information was in accordance with the clearance requirement of Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980 as amended (31 U.S.C. 3507). The number of sworn police data will be used as the basis for drawing a sample of law enforcement agencies for an ongoing series of data collection on the workload and resources of the Nation's law enforcement agencies.

#### II. Methodology

#### Survey period

Employment data were collected on the total number of employees and the number of sworn police with arrest powers for the pay period including March 12, 1986. Those agencies unable to give statistics for the designated period reported for the most recent pay period for which data was available.

#### Data Collection

A total of 17,761 questionnaires were mailed from Jeffersonville to individual law enforcement agencies. The survey included state police, sheriffs, county, municipal and township police; and special police at the state and local level. Coroners were excluded. Two mailouts were made to the agencies followed by telephone followup of nonrespondents. During the survey, 694 agencies were found to be no longer in operation and 444 agencies were deleted because they contracted to other agencies for police protection. We also added 84 constables to the state of Texas that were missing from our files. The final count of agencies after the survey was 16,707.

Questionnaires were checked-in, edited and keyed by Census Bureau staff in Jeffersonville, Indiana. A computer edit was run and tables were programmed as requested by BJS. A data tape was sent to the Criminal Justice Archives at the University of Michigan. Core data items were taken from the data file and incorporated into the Law Enforcement Sector of the Justice Agency List. These data items included type of agency, total number of employees and total number of sworn police.

#### Time period for Data Collection

The first mailout went out in June 1986 with a second mailout in July 1986. Jeffersonville conducted a nonresponse telephone followup during the latter part of September and early October. We closed out data collection in late October with a 100% response rate.

#### Limitations

Data for the Directory Survey of Law Enforcement Agencies was obtained through mail canvass. As with any statistical survey, the survey results are subject to certain limitations. Errors in data could result from estimations of data, the use of different reference dates and misunderstanding of definitions. (One common misunderstanding involved lockups: a number of agencies reported that they administered a lock-up when in fact they only had a cell in their jail assigned for holding or lock-up instead of a physically separate facility).
