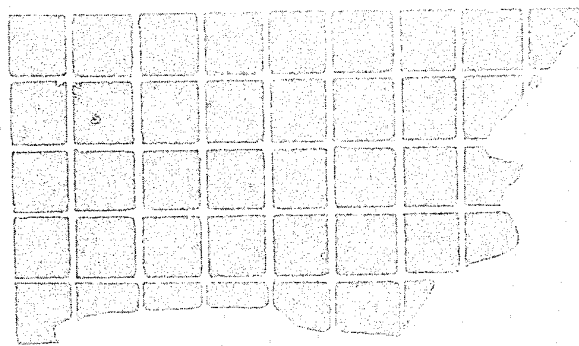




## FOREWORD

## STATUTORY AUTHORITY

The collection, analysis and dissemination of criminal justice data in New York State is authorized by Sections 837, 837-a and 837-b of the Executive Law, to wit:

### "§ 837. Functions, powers and duties of division

The division shall have the following functions, powers and duties:

... 4. In cooperation with the state administrator of the unified court system as well as any other public or private agency,

... (c) collect and analyze statistical and other information and data with respect to the number of crimes reported or known to police or peace officers, the number of persons arrested for the commission of offense, the offense for which the person was arrested, the county within which the arrest was made and the accusatory instrument filed, the disposition of the accusatory instrument including, but not limited to, as the case may be, dismissal, acquittal, the offense to which the defendant pled guilty, the offense the defendant was convicted of after trial, and the sentence."

### "§ 837-a. Additional functions, powers and duties of the division

In addition to the functions, powers and duties otherwise provided by this article, the division shall:

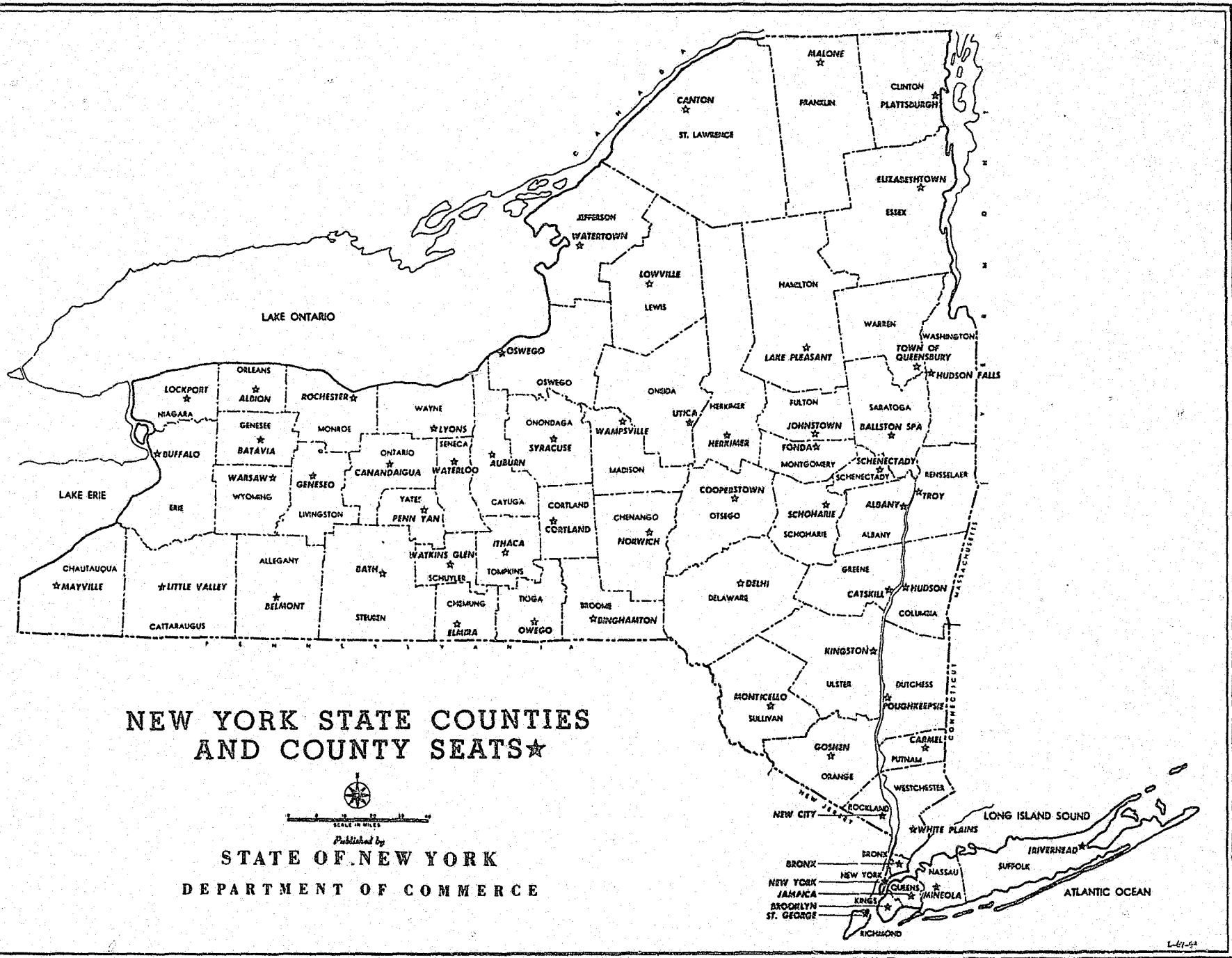
1. Collect and analyze statistical and other information and data with respect to the number of persons charged with the commission of a felony by indictment or the filing of a superior court information, the felony with which the person was charged therein, the county within which the indictment or superior court information was filed, the disposition thereof including, but not limited to, as the case may be, dismissal, acquittal, the offense to which the defendant pleaded guilty, the offense the defendant was convicted of after trial, and the sentence."

### "§ 837-b. Duties of courts and peace officers

1. It is hereby made the duty of the state administrator of the unified court system; and of every sheriff, county or city commissioner of correction and head of every police department, state, county or local, and also railroad, steamship, park, aqueduct and tunnel police and town constables, of every district attorney, of every probation agency; and of head of every institution or department, state, county, and local, dealing with criminals and of every other officer, person or agency, dealing with crimes or criminals or with delinquency or delinquents, to transmit to the commissioner not later than the fifteenth day of each calendar month, or at such times as provided in the rules and regulations adopted by the commissioner, such information as may be necessary to enable him to comply with subdivision four of section eight hundred thirty-seven. Such reports shall be made upon forms which shall be supplied by the commissioner.

2. Such officers and agencies shall install and maintain records needed for reporting data required by the commissioner and shall give him or his accredited agents access to records for the purpose of inspection.

3. For every neglect to comply with the requirements of this section, the commissioner may apply to the supreme court for an order directed to such persons responsible requiring compliance. Upon such application the court may issue such order as may be just, and a failure to comply with the order of the court shall be a contempt of court and punishable as such."



## INTRODUCTION

The New York State Division Of Criminal Justice Services was assigned the responsibility for the collection of data concerning crimes and arrests in New York State, effective January 1975, pursuant to Sections 837, 837-a and 837-b of the Executive Law. In assuming that responsibility, the Division was also committed to providing relevant data to the National Uniform Crime Reporting Program administered by the Federal Bureau Of Investigation and to disseminating this information to the New York State criminal justice community.

This publication is the eleventh annual report produced in discharge of that responsibility.

Uniform Crime Reports submitted monthly by police agencies in New York State are the basis for much of the material contained in this report. These reports include information on Part I Offenses, Part II Offenses, location and time of the Offense, value of property stolen, Part I arrests, Part II arrests, Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted and Number of Law Enforcement Employees.

- o In 1985, all 590 enforcement agencies participated in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program and agencies with multi-county jurisdictions reported separately for each county within their jurisdiction.
- o Police agencies also submit supplementary reports on homicide and arson offenses. These detailed reports allow for a more in-depth analysis of these serious crimes.

In addition to the Uniform Crime Reporting data contained in this report, we have provided data on felony arrests, felony drug arrests and felony indictments and dispositions.

- o The arrest material is derived from the Computerized Criminal History (CCH), which is based on the arrest fingerprint cards submitted to the Division of Criminal Justice Services in compliance with Section 160.20 of the Criminal Procedure Law.

Adult felony and misdemeanor arrests are presented for each county from 1981 through 1985.

The felony indictment and disposition material is reported by District Attorneys and Special Prosecutors throughout the State pursuant to Section 837-a of the Executive Law. This material includes data on felony indictments, felony drug indictments, felony dispositions and median time from indictment through disposition.

- o Information from other criminal justice agencies is included in this report to present, in one volume, as much information as possible about the criminal justice system.

For many reasons, not all offenses come to the attention of the police. Victims may feel too embarrassed to report a crime or that the loss sustained was too small to report or believe that there is nothing the police can do.

Victimization studies have confirmed that many offenses are never reported. When an offense is cleared, it is usually done by one or more arrests.

However, there are exceptional circumstances when an offense may be cleared without an arrest. Exceptional clearances result when the police know who and where the offender is and have enough evidence to support an arrest, but are prevented from doing so because of some reason outside of their control.

The UCR data included in this report are divided into seven main segments:

The arrest reports reflect the number of persons arrested for Part I and Part II Offenses, as described above.

- Note: The FBI/UCR Program treats persons under 18 as juveniles, and requires that they be so reported. This Report, however, is compiled in accordance with New York State Law which classifies juveniles as those persons under 16 and adults as those 16 and over.

- LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED

Statistics are provided on the number of New York State Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted. A description of the conditions under which the officers were assaulted is also provided.

- HOMICIDE ANALYSIS

Detail on homicides committed in New York State, including characteristics of victims and circumstances under which such homicides occurred are provided.

To combat crime effectively, it must be known when and where crime is occurring. The county, as a crime location, is not sufficiently definitive. Therefore, we have instituted direct reporting to the State program from every Police Chief and Sheriff in New York State in accordance with State Law.

It is important to note that without the collaboration of the Law Enforcement Agencies and cooperation of other criminal justice agencies, this Report would not be possible.

#### POPULATION DATA SOURCE

Population data used for calculating crime rates for the 1985 Crime And Justice Annual Report are based on 1980 census data and updates provided by the United States Department of Commerce - Bureau of Census and the New York State Department of Commerce.

- ARSON ANALYSIS

This report provides additional detail concerning arson. The analysis describes the types of structures involved, distribution of activity and clearance rates.

- DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Statistics are presented relating to the incidence of Domestic Violence in New York State. The statistics are presented by geographic locations of New York City, Suburban Counties and Upstate Counties.

# OFFENSES

For over 50 years certain criminal offenses have been used as a crime index to assess the level of criminal activity within an area. The index offenses were selected because of their seriousness or frequency of occurrence.

The index offenses are murder & non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft.

Comparisons of crime rates between police agencies or counties should be made with extreme caution. The crime rates published in this report are based solely on offenses reported or known to the police and the size of the resident population. Additional factors which may influence crime rates are density of population, geographic location, social attitudes, economic conditions, number of law enforcement officers, seasonal and transient populations, and rural or urban environments.

## INDEX OFFENSES

- Index offenses increased 0.4% in New York State from 1984 to 1985.
- The 989,507 index offenses reported marks the second consecutive year below the million mark in New York State.

## VIOLENT OFFENSES

- Violent offenses (murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault) showed an increase of 1.9% from 1984 to 1985.
- Violent offenses accounted for 16.5% of the index total.

## MURDER

- Murder and non-negligent manslaughter dropped 5.0%, down from 1,777 in 1984 to 1,688 in 1985.
- New York City reported 82.0% of the murder offenses in New York State.

## FORCIBLE RAPE

- Forcible rape offenses increased from 5,571 in 1984 to 5,674 in 1985, a rise of 1.8%.
- New York City reported 68.3% of the forcible rape offenses.

## ROBBERY

- Robbery offenses decreased 0.3%, from 89,917 offenses in 1984 to 89,603 in 1985.
- New York City reported 88.9% of the robberies in New York State.

## AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

- Aggravated assault offenses increased 5.2% from 1984 to 1985.
- New York City reported 74.1% of the aggravated assaults in New York State.

NON-VIOLENT OFFENSES

- Non-violent offenses (burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft) increased a slight 0.1% from 1984 to 1985.
- Non-violent offenses constituted 83.3% of the index total.

BURGLARY

- Burglary offenses dropped 1.7% from 1984 to 1985.
- The 218,884 Burglary offenses were the fewest reported since 1975 when the Division of Criminal Justice Services began collecting data on burglary offenses.
- New York City reported 57.2% of the burglary offenses in New York State.

LARCENY

- Larceny offenses increased 2.7% from 1984 to 1985.
- The 499,237 larceny offenses included larcenies of any amount, and accounted for 50.5% of the index offenses.
- Larceny offenses were divided almost equally between New York City and the rest of the state.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

- Motor vehicle theft declined in New York State from 1984 to 1985.
- The 106,281 motor vehicle thefts reported in New York State in 1985 were the fewest reported in the last six years.
- New York City reported 74.7% of the motor vehicle thefts in New York State.

PART II OFFENSES

- A total of 1,474,859 Part II Offenses were reported in 1985, a 4.9% increase over 1984.
- Part II Offenses comprise all offenses not included in Part I Offenses and range in seriousness from kidnapping to disorderly conduct.

PROPERTY STOLEN

- In New York State, the value of property stolen during the commission of index offenses was \$1,170,969,029 in 1985, a 2.6% increase from the 1984 total of \$1,140,890,744.
- Stolen vehicles accounted for 45.7% of the value of property stolen in 1984.

## HOMICIDE

### The Offenses<sup>1</sup>

Table 1 presents data on homicides by month and area for New York State from 1981 through 1985. There were 1,690 homicides during 1985.<sup>2</sup> The downturn in homicides noted in 1983 and 1984 continued during 1985. There were 98 fewer homicides in 1985 than in 1984, a decline of 5.5 percent. In 1985, New York State's homicide rate of 9.5 per 100,000 inhabitants was the twelfth highest among the fifty states.<sup>3</sup> The year 1985 ended with the fewest number of homicides since 1975 when the Crime and Justice Annual Report first published this information.

Not all areas of the State benefited equally from the decline in homicides.<sup>4</sup> New York City experienced a 4.9 percent decrease from the previous year. The six MPA counties experienced an overall decline of 4.6 percent. The number of homicides for the remainder of the State decreased by 14.9 percent.

The total number of homicides per month throughout 1985 was relatively sporadic. For example, there were 81 more homicides committed during December than during the previous month. The fewest number of homicides for the year occurred during May with 104 (6.2%) and the largest number occurred during December with 200 (11.8%) (Table 1).

Homicide was largely a New York City problem. While New York City contained approximately 40 percent of the State's population<sup>5</sup>, it accounted for the bulk of the homicides (82 percent). The remaining homicides were distributed throughout the MPAs (12.1 percent) and the Other Areas (5.7 percent). The distribution of homicides among these three areas has remained essentially unchanged for the last five years (Table 1).

Table 2 presents data for the last five years on characteristics of the homicide event including: victim-offender relationship, circumstances,<sup>6</sup> number of victims and offenders, location,<sup>7</sup> and weapon use. Reporting agencies were able to discern the victim-offender relationship in 42.5 percent of the homicides. Of these, 70.7 percent were committed by offenders who were considered to be non-strangers. The number of homicides committed by non-strangers decreased from the previous year by .6 percent.<sup>8</sup> Homicides usually did not occur in conjunction with another felony, but as the result of an altercation or other circumstance (70.5 percent). Approximately 30 percent of the homicides were related to another felony, and in such cases, the related felony was usually a robbery (56.8 percent).

The vast majority of homicide events resulted in the death of a single victim. Of these single victim offenses, 48.5 percent were killed by a single offender; 10.1 percent were killed by two or more offenders; and 41.3 percent

were killed by an unknown number of offenders. For homicides where the number of offenders was known, 78.0 percent consisted of a single victim and a single offender. Of all homicides, 10.9 percent resulted from the action of two or more offenders (Table 2).

Homicides were as likely to occur inside as outside. A firearm was the most common weapon (54.4 percent). When a firearm was used, it was almost always a handgun. Next in frequency of use were cutting or stabbing instruments (23.5 percent), followed by personal weapons such as hands and feet (16.0 percent) (Table 2).

Table 3 shows that in addition to contributing disproportionately to the number of homicide cases in the State, New York City's homicides were consistently different from the homicides in the MPAs and the Other Areas. New York City homicides were: more likely to involve multiple offenders; more likely to involve a firearm; more likely to occur as part of a robbery; and more likely to occur inside. New York City homicide victims were on the average almost two years younger than victims outside of New York City. New York City homicide victims were also more likely to be male. New York City offenders were on the average three years younger than their counterparts outside New York City. They were also more likely to be male.

### The Victims

More than one-half of all homicide victims were 20 to 39 years old. Most were male. Of homicide victims, 51.6 percent were in the white racial category and 46.8 percent were black. The percentages for age and sex were relatively constant during the five year period ending in 1985. Since 1981, hispanics have been coded as white, black, or other<sup>9</sup> (Table 5).

Victim Sex. Both males and females were usually killed by a single offender, although this percentage was higher for females than for males. Males were usually killed with a firearm and, similar to the previous year, usually by a non-stranger. Females were also usually killed by a non-stranger. The weapons used to kill female victims were more evenly distributed than they were for males: firearms (32.4%); cutting, stabbing, and bludgeoning instruments (25.4%); and personal weapons (33.9%). Homicides involving female victims suggested a stronger relationship to domestic violence than did homicides in which the victim was a male (Table 9).

Victim Race. There was little relationship between the race of the victim and the weapon used. Slightly over one-half of both blacks and whites were killed with a firearm. There was a stronger relationship between victim race and the victim offender relationship. Black victims were just as likely to be killed by a non-stranger (72.1%) as were white victims (70.1%). In terms of circumstances of the homicide, the killings of white victims were related to another felony in 31.2 percent of the cases compared to 26.6 percent for black victims (Table 10).

Age Interactions. The distribution of homicide victims among the sex and race categories differed by victim age. While the overall percentage of female victims was 20.3 percent, the percentage of females was substantially higher in the extreme age groups: 55.9 percent among victims under ten years of age and 41.1 percent among victims sixty years of age or older (Table 7). Thus, in the under ten and over sixty age groups combined, for every 100 female victims there were 118 male victims. For the 10 to 19 age group, for every 100 female victims there were 420 male victims.

The distribution of homicides among racial categories also differed by victim age.<sup>10</sup> Overall, there were 111 white victims for every 100 black victims. This represents an average ratio for all age groups (Table 7).

The characteristics surrounding the killing of very young victims suggested that they usually died in familial settings. The very young were almost always killed by a single offender, a non-stranger, inside and under circumstances unrelated to a felony. They usually died as the result of a beating (Table 8).

The killing of persons 10 years of age and older proved to be more difficult to characterize. These victims were similar in that they were usually slain by a single offender 81.9 percent of the time. While persons in the 10 to 59 age group were usually killed with a firearm, the weapons used to kill elderly victims were distributed among: firearms (27.9%); cutting, stabbing, bludgeoning instruments (29.5%); and personal weapons (38.0%). Persons in both age groups were equally likely to be killed by strangers. The 10 to 59 age group and the 60 and over age group differed with respect to the circumstances and location of the homicide. The 10-59 age group was similar to the very young in being most likely to be killed during altercations and other circumstances, while the elderly were most likely to be killed in connection with another felony. The deaths in the 10-59 age group were evenly divided between inside and outside locations. However, the elderly, like the very young, were most likely to be killed at an inside location. These similarities and differences in the characteristics of the homicides for these three age groups may be a result of the effect age has on how, where and when persons spend their time.<sup>11</sup>

The very young and the elderly spend more of their time indoors than the 10-59 age group. While both spend a great deal of time indoors, only the elderly are logical targets of felony related homicides, such as robbery (Table 8).

### The Offenders<sup>12</sup>

As was true for victims, the vast majority of homicide offenders were males. Offenders were as likely to be black as white. Offenders, on the average, were younger than victims. These patterns have been fairly consistent for the past five years (Table 11).

The propensity for homicide to be a group activity was greatest among offenders under twenty years of age and declined sharply with age. This was also true for the percentage of homicides which were felony connected. Weapon use did not appear to be strongly related to offender age. Homicides by those over 60 years of age were strongly suggestive of "indoor" rather than "street" violence: only one occurred in connection with another felony; all were by a single offender; most offenders knew their victims; and most occurred inside (Table 14).

A higher percentage of female offenders were black (60.6) than they were white (38.5) (Table 15).

Males were more likely than females to have killed using a firearm; more often to have killed a stranger; more often to have killed in connection with another felony; and at an outside location. The victims of female offenders were predominantly non-strangers (90.8%) (Table 16).

The percentages on the characteristics of homicide offenders were based only on those cases where offender characteristics were known and reported. The total number of offenders is a minimum estimate, because of the assumption that all victims killed by an unknown offender were killed by a single offender. There are more reported offenders than victims because several offenders sometimes participated in the killing of a single victim.

There were very few differences between black and white offenders with respect to the number of offenders involved or the type of weapon used. For both racial groups, killings usually grew out of altercations and other circumstances (Table 17).

In the aggregate, it appeared that homicide offenders clearly victimized members of their own race. Approximately 85 percent of the white offenders killed white victims, while approximately 79 percent of the black offenders killed black victims (Table 18).

Overall, there was a tendency for offenders to victimize persons of a similar age to themselves (Table 19).

### Summary

These data on 1985 homicides showed strong similarities with data from prior years: the vast majority of homicides occurred in New York City; males predominated both as offenders and as victims; and there were relatively few interracial killings. A majority involved the use of firearms, especially handguns.

Victim age had a strong relationship to the type of homicide. The very young, being physically vulnerable and largely confined to the home, were primarily victims of their parent's violence. Victims 10 through 59 years of age were more subject to slayings at outside locations and during altercations and other circumstances. The elderly were most likely to be killed at an inside location during the commission of another felony, such as a robbery.

When viewed over the last several years, there is some indication that yearly homicide totals may be on the decline. The probability of becoming a homicide victim for inhabitants of New York State has decreased slightly from 10.0 percent in 1984 to 9.5 percent in 1985.<sup>13</sup> New York State's homicide rate ranks twelfth among the 50 states, based on 1985 national data.

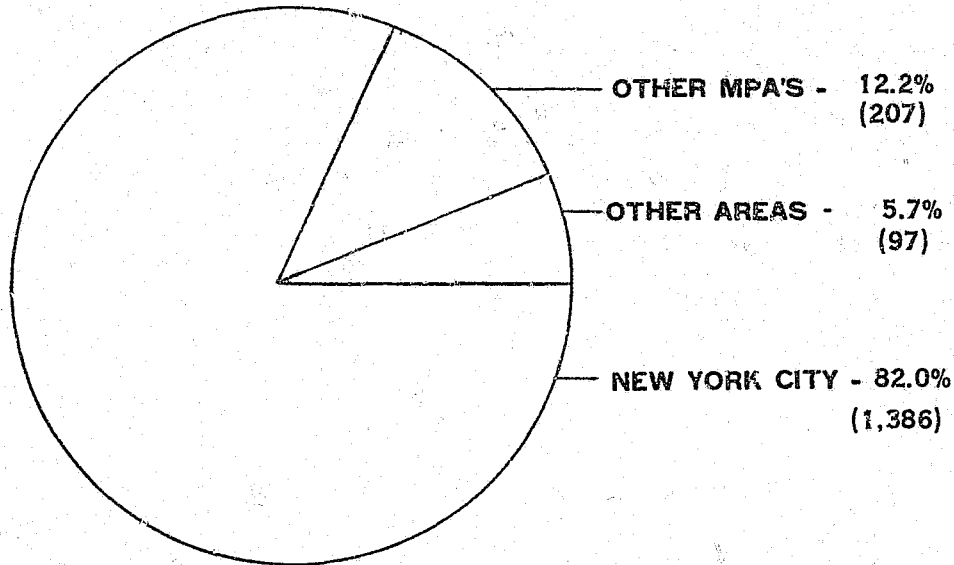

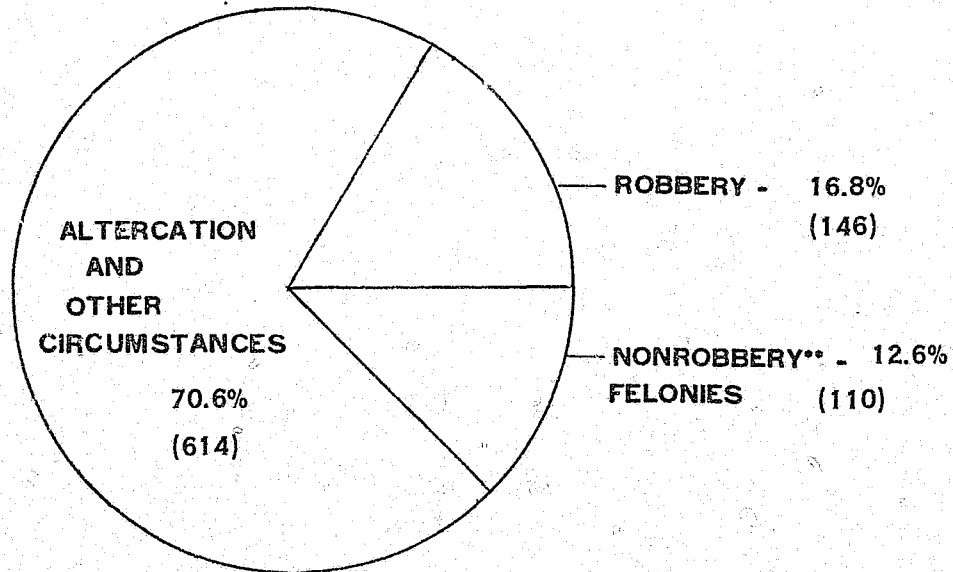

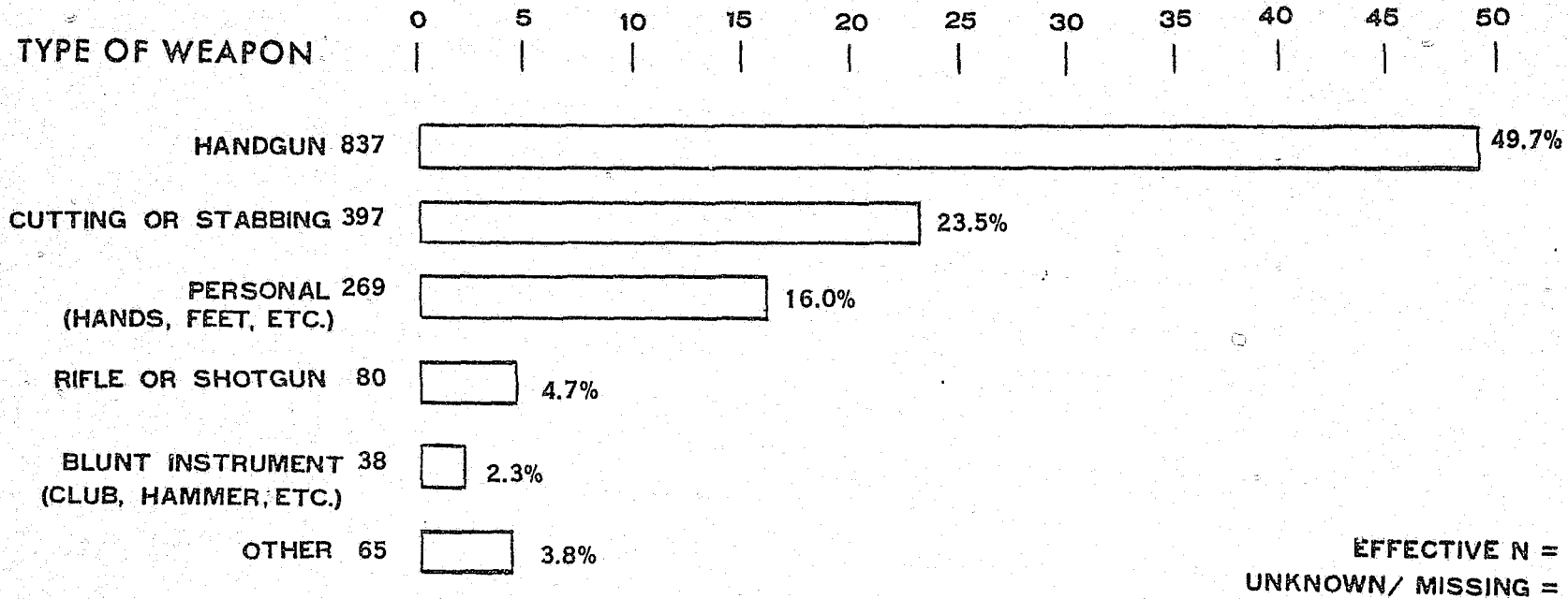

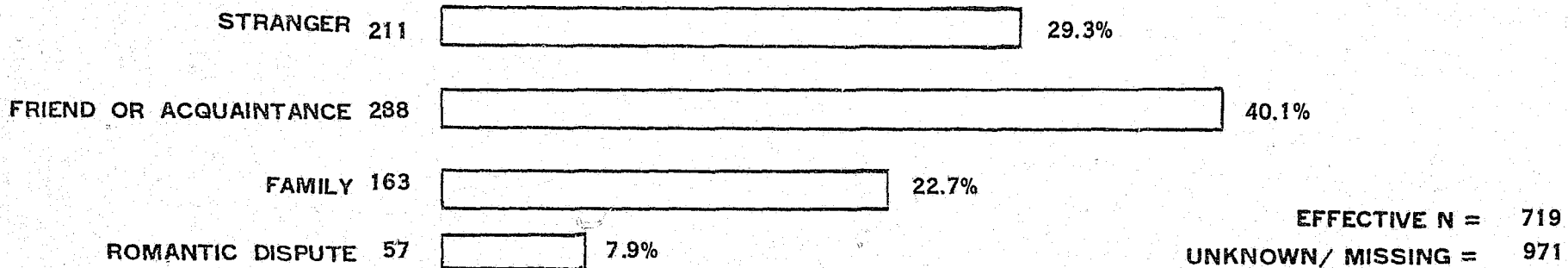
## TYPE OF WEAPON USED AND VICTIM-OFFENDER RELATIONSHIP

### VICTIM-OFFENDER RELATIONSHIP

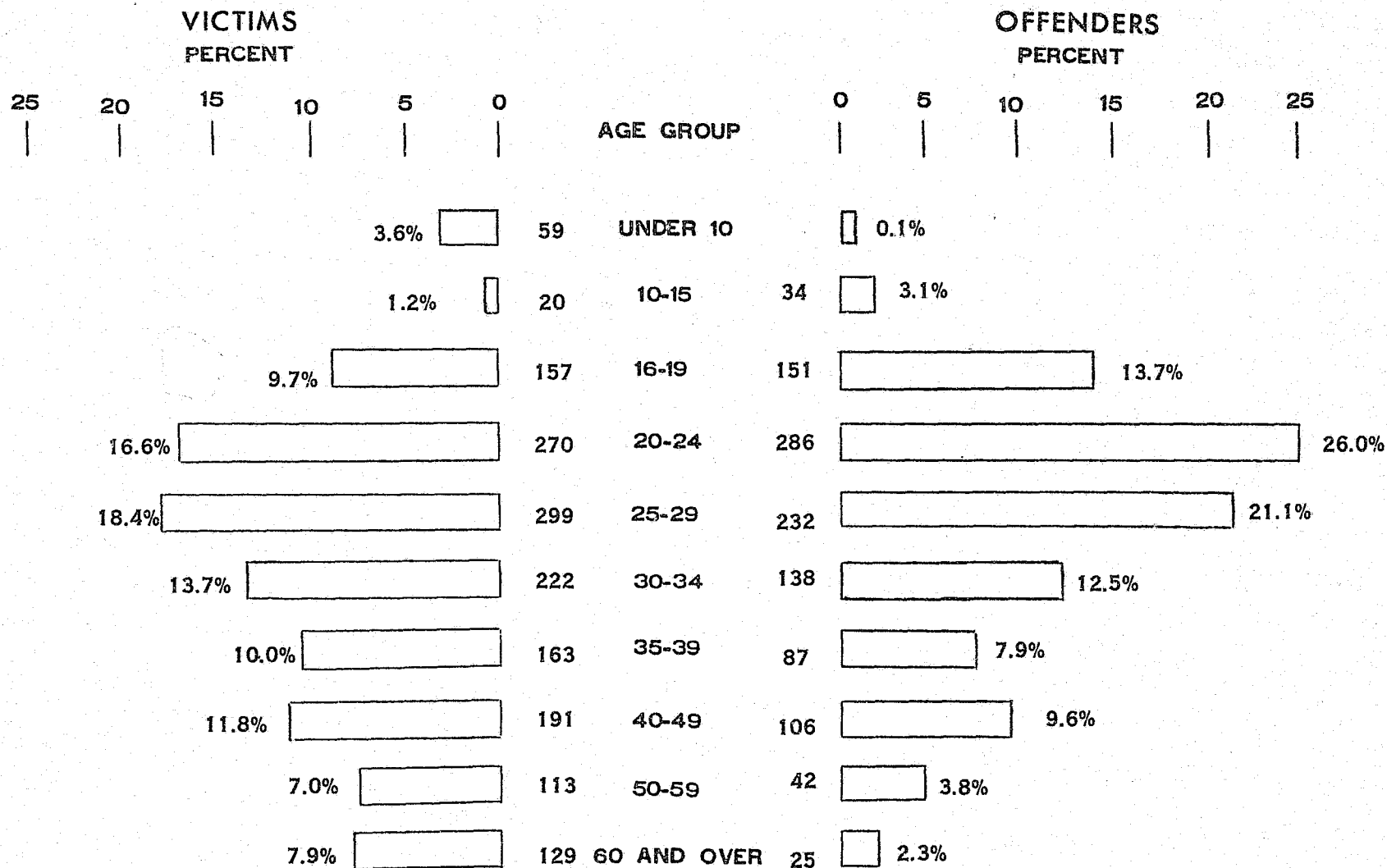

## ARSON

This is the seventh analysis of arsons in New York State to be presented in the Crime and Justice Annual Report. The data for these analyses are derived from a supplementary arson data collection program begun in 1979 under the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) System.

Arson is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting Program as a "willful or malicious burning, or attempted burning, of a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle, aircraft, or personal property of another." Only fires determined through investigation to have been willfully or maliciously set are classified as arsons. A "cleared" arson incident is defined as an offense for which a perpetrator has been taken into custody or is otherwise known by police to have committed the crime, but for reasons outside police control cannot be taken into custody.

Arsons reported under Part II of the UCR program and shown elsewhere in this volume are reported under the "hierarchy rule," whereby an offense is counted only if it is the most serious in an incident. Under this program, an arson offense is reported regardless of whether it occurred in conjunction with a more serious offense. This analysis, therefore, shows more arson offenses than are shown for arson offenses in the UCR Part II offense presentations.

Type of property is divided into three categories: structural (residential, commercial, public/community, and other); mobile (motor vehicle and other); and other property. The definitions of property type are as follows:

- a. Single Occupancy Residential - includes houses, townhouses and duplexes.
- b. Other Residential - includes apartments, tenements, flats, hotels, motels, inns, dormitories and boarding houses.
- c. Storage - includes warehouses, garages and barns.
- d. Industrial/Manufacturing - includes factories and all other manufacturing facilities.
- e. Other Commercial - includes stores, restaurants and offices.
- f. Public/Community - includes churches, jails, schools, colleges and hospitals.
- g. All Other Structures - includes out-buildings, monuments and structures under construction.
- h. Motor Vehicles - includes automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, motor scooters and snowmobiles.
- i. Other Mobile - includes airplanes, boats, trailers, and recreational vehicles.
- j. Other Property - includes crops, timber, fences and signs.



Estimated values of property damaged are included in the report. They are included in order to provide an estimate of the absolute minimum dollar value. Because many police departments have little or no access to dollar amounts for arson, the monetary values for many arson cases are not reported.

### Arsons Reported

There were 11,927 arson incidents reported in New York State in 1985, a 9.3% increase over 1984. Of these incidents, 64.5% occurred in New York City, with the other 35.5% occurring in the counties outside New York City.

Arsons of structures accounted for 70.0% of all arson incidents in New York State. Of these, 48.9% were residential arsons. In New York City, structural arsons accounted for 74.2% of all arsons reported, while Upstate structural fires accounted for 62.5% of all arsons.

Consistent with data from previous years, residential structure arsons remained the most common type of structural arson throughout the State. Examination of these residential structure arsons shows that 88.1% of all "other residential" arsons took place in New York City. Of the "single occupancy" arsons, 77.7% took place outside New York City, and constituted approximately 21.2% of the total arsons Upstate.

Commercial structure arsons accounted for 14.5% of all arsons in New York State. A regional comparison shows that Upstate had a higher proportion of commercial structure arsons (19.3%) than New York City (11.9%). "Other commercial" arsons, the most frequent form of commercial arson in New York State, accounted for 9.6% of the arsons statewide.

In the mobile arson category, the 3,111 "motor vehicle" arsons reported in New York State accounted for 26.1% of all arsons, while "other mobile" arsons accounted for only .9% of all arsons. Almost 54% of the "motor vehicle" arsons occurred in New York City.

### Abandoned Structure Arsons

The 2,164 arsons that occurred in abandoned structures accounted for 18.2% of all arsons in New York State. In New York City, 20.3% of all arsons involved abandoned structures; such arsons accounted for 14.1% of Upstate arsons.

Statewide, residential structures were the most common form of abandoned structures to be targets for arson, with the likelihood greater in New York City than in the rest of the State. Almost all arsons in the "other residential" category of abandoned structures (95.2%) occurred in New York City, while 35.0% of the arsons of "single occupancy" abandoned structures occurred there.

### Arsons Cleared

In 1985, 1,249 arson incidents were cleared in New York State. Of these, 79.6% were structure arsons, of which 49.5% were residential and 17.5% were commercial. In New York City, clearances of residential arsons accounted for 64.0% of the total arsons cleared. Upstate clearances of residential arsons accounted for 43.1% of cleared arsons.

### Arson Clearance Rates

The 1985 clearance rate<sup>1</sup> for all arsons in New York State was 10.5%. The New York City clearance rate was 4.9% and the rate Upstate was 20.5%. This relatively low clearance rate seems to reflect the extreme difficulty in solving a crime in which most of the physical evidence is destroyed.

Arson rates vary by the type of property involved. In 1985, statewide clearance rates for the "public/community" structural category had the highest clearance rate (21.6%). Motor vehicle arson had the lowest clearance rate, 6.4%.

### Arsons Cleared Involving Persons Under Age 18

Four hundred three of the arson clearances involved persons under age 18. Persons in this age group accounted for 32.3% of all arson clearances in the State; this represents an increase from 1984, when they accounted for 28.4% of the arson clearances. In New York City, 14.4% of the clearances involved persons "under 18", while Upstate it was 40.1%.

### Summary

There were 11,927 arson incidents reported in New York State in 1985. Arsons in New York City accounted for 64.5% of these incidents. Statewide, 70.0% of the reported arsons were structure arsons; 49.0% were residential arsons; and 18.1% were arsons of abandoned structures. Clearance rates for arson incidents statewide averaged 10.4%. The clearance rates were 4.9% in New York City and 20.5% Upstate.

<sup>1</sup>The clearance rate is the ratio of clearances to the net number of arsons reported, expressed as a percent. Because a 1985 clearance does not necessarily reflect clearance of an offense reported in 1985, the clearance rate should be considered only as a general indicator of processing efficiency.

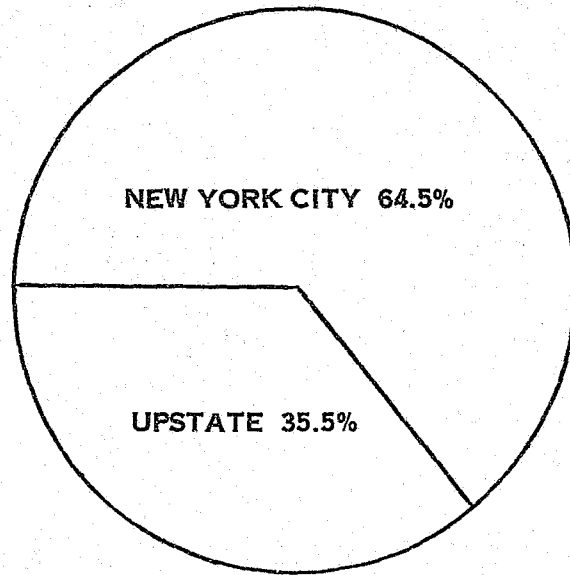

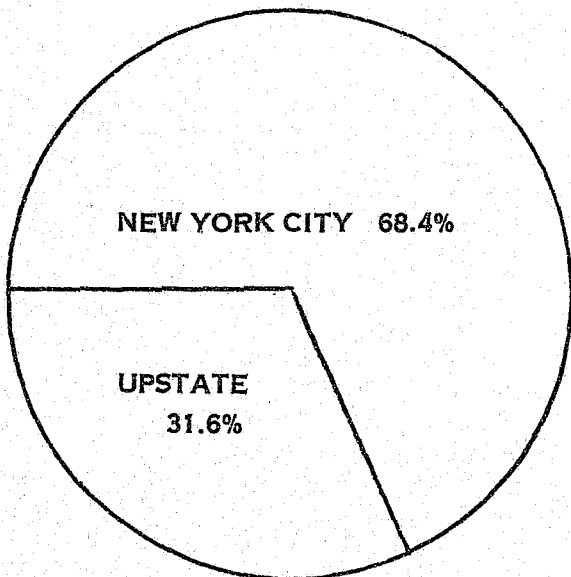

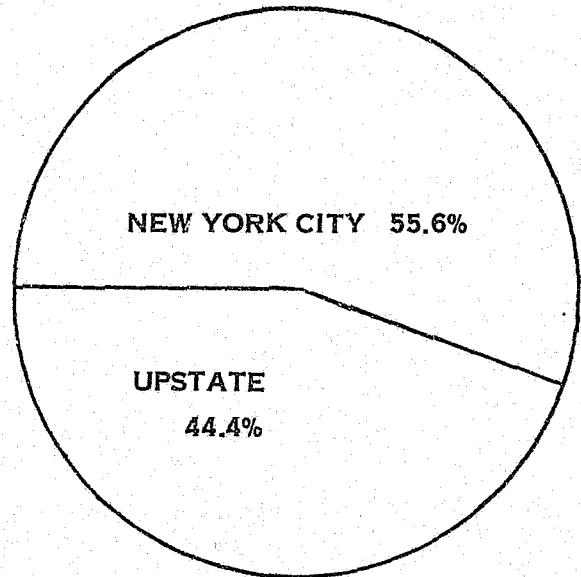

- o FOR NEW YORK CITY, THE 23,131 OFFENSES REPORTED IN 1985 IS A 14.2% INCREASE OVER THE 20,254 REPORTED IN 1984, WHILE THE UPSTATE COUNTIES INCREASED 8.3%.
- o STATEWIDE, DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OFFENSES REPORTED, INCREASED. A TOTAL OF 46,337 OFFENSES WERE REPORTED IN 1985 AS OPPOSED TO 41,688 REPORTED IN 1984, AN INCREASE OF 11.2% AS IN PREVIOUS YEARS, THIS INCREASE IS LARGELY DUE TO IMPROVED REPORTING BY THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES ACROSS THE STATE.

## ARRESTS

Arrests in New York State during 1985 totaled 1,156,943, a 5.8 percent increase from the 1,093,113 arrests in 1984. Males accounted for 85.3 percent of those arrested and females, 14.7 percent.

Arrests for index offenses -- murder, non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft -- dropped from 171,420 in 1984 to 169,850, down 0.9 percent. In 1985, arrests for index offenses accounted for 14.7 percent of the New York State arrest total.

ADULT ARRESTS<sup>1</sup>

- A total of 1,071,729 adult arrests were reported in New York State in 1985.
- Adults sixteen through twenty-nine accounted for 69.0 percent of the adult arrest total and adults twenty-one and under made up 34.1 percent of the arrest total.

NOTE: Arrests include summonses for violation of local ordinances.

JUVENILE ARRESTS

- New York State reported a total of 85,214 juvenile arrests in 1985, 9.8 percent above the 77,587 reported in 1984.
- Males represented 82.4 percent of the juveniles arrested and females, 17.6 percent.
- Arrests for fifteen year olds accounted for 39.2 percent of the juveniles arrested and fourteen year olds represented an additional 27.9 percent.

NEW YORK CITY

- New York City reported 70.0 percent of all the arrests in New York State for 1985.
- The 49,838 juvenile arrests reported by New York City accounted for 58.5 percent of the state total.

DRUG ARRESTS

- Combined adult and juvenile drug arrests increased from 83,606 in 1984 to 93,182 in 1985, an increase of 11.5 percent.
- Arrests for marijuana accounted for 52.2 percent of the New York State drug arrests.
- Arrests for opium, cocaine and derivatives represented 38.0 percent of the drug arrests and showed a 29.6 percent increase from 1984 to 1985.

RACE AND ETHNIC ORIGIN

- Data on race and ethnic origin were estimated for 512,428 summonses reported from New York City.
- Existing forms do not provide for the reporting of racial and ethnic data for New York City summonses.
- Arrest categories that include these estimates are : marijuana use, criminal mischief, other gambling, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, loitering and "all other offenses" category.

ADULT FELONY AND MISDEMEANOR ARRESTS

- A total of 151,227 felony adult arrests were reported in New York State in 1985, 1.3 percent above the 149,329 reported in 1984.
- New York City reported 69.8 percent of the total adult felony arrests in 1985 compared to 70.9 percent in 1984.
- New York State reported 270,241 adult misdemeanor arrests in 1985, a 6.2 percent increase over the 254,416 reported in 1984.
- New York City showed a 12.0 percent increase in adult misdemeanor arrests from 1984 to 1985 and represented 47.1 percent of the state total in 1985.

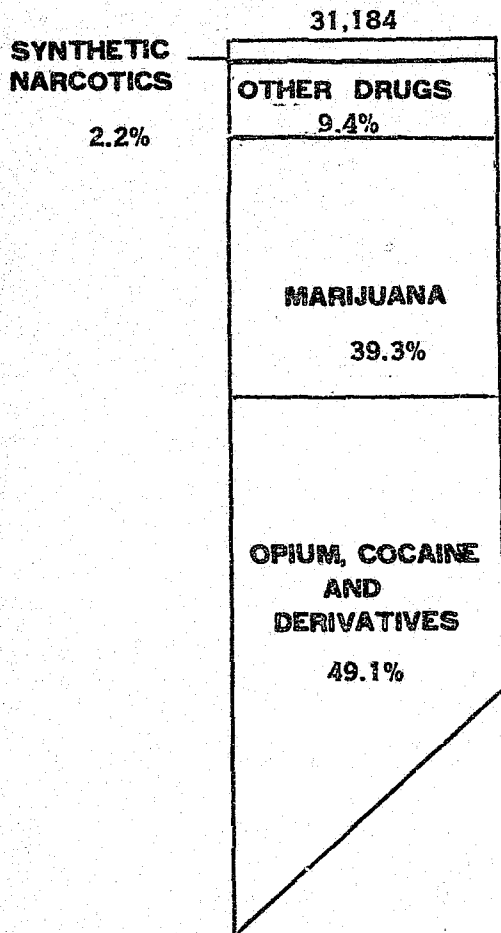

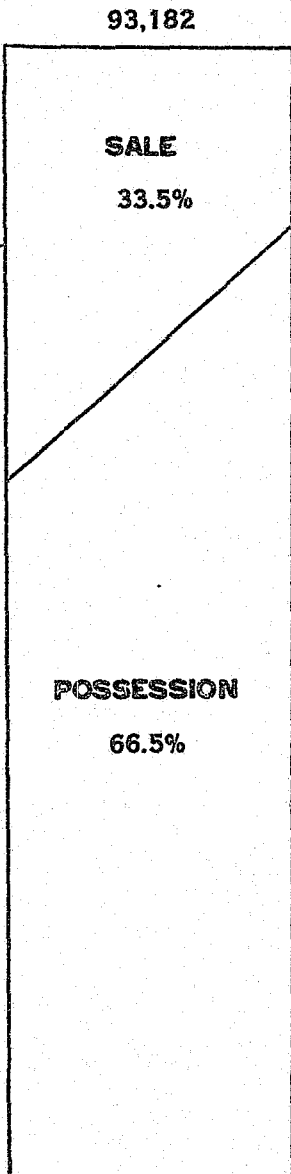
PERCENT DISTRIBUTION BY SALE AND POSSESSION

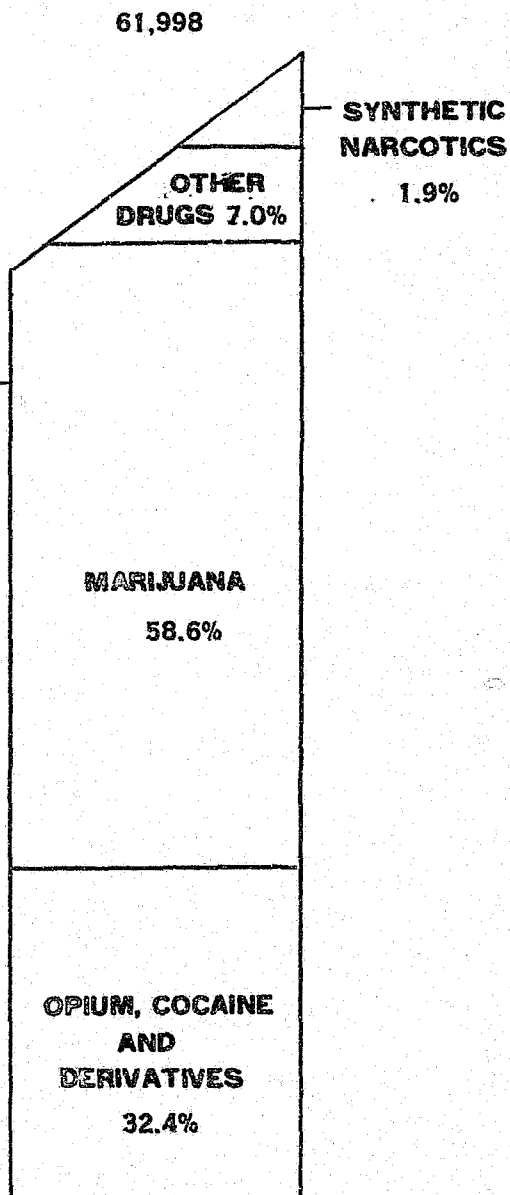
### DRUG SALE ARRESTS

This information is obtained from a statistical reporting system based on individual reports of each indictment and each disposition submitted by district attorneys and special prosecutors throughout the state. The unit count in this reporting system is the defendant/indictment; that is:

- When several defendants are named in one proceeding or indictment, each defendant is counted separately; and
- When one defendant is named in multiple proceedings or indictments, each indictment is counted separately.

The use of offender-based statistics and the tracking of each defendant from time of indictment until final disposition makes possible the measuring of elapsed time between various stages in processing. The median time is obtained by ranking all the values in a specific category (for example, time from indictment to disposition) and choosing the middle number - that is, the number with an equal amount of values above and below it. As a result, the median values are not influenced by very large or very small numbers which can affect averages.

It should be noted that the disposition data reported in these tables pertain to cases handled during the specified year by the superior courts. These dispositions may be for indictments in the same or previous years.

#### Defendants - Indictments

- Felony indictments totaled 49,511 in New York State in 1985. 3.4% above the number reported in 1984.
- For the second consecutive year indictments were at record levels.
- Since 1974, the first year of this program, felony indictments have shown a pattern of increase with only a few small declines from year to year.
- New York City reported a 3.1% increase in felony indictments and upstate was up 7.0%.
- The suburban area of New York City (Nassau, Rockland, Suffolk and Westchester counties) registered a 0.6% decrease in felony indictments.
- In New York State, felony indictments for drug offenses rose 21.7% from 1984 to 1985. New York City recorded a 24.8% increase and Upstate was up 21.0%.
- The Suburban area of New York City registered a slight drop of 0.3% in drug indictments.
- In 1985, 19.7% of all indictments were for felony drugs compared to 16.7% in 1984.
- In New York City, the proportion of felony drug indictments increased from 20.7% in 1984 to 25.1% of the total in 1985.
- Indictments for Class A drug offenses increased by 23.5% in New York State and were up 31.1% in New York City and 41.2% Upstate.
- In the Suburban area of New York City, Class A drug indictments declined 13.1%.

<sup>1</sup>The indictment data also include superior court information data. These informations are waivers of indictment with the same force and effect as an indictment.

### Dispositions

- Dispositions include felony indictments for which judicial proceedings were completed by dismissal, acquittal, other court action, or by conviction and sentence.
- A total of 45,837 dispositions were reported in New York State in 1985, 1.7% above the 1984 total.
- New York City showed a decline in dispositions of 0.6% while the suburban area of New York City increased 6.0% and Upstate rose 4.7%.
- Statewide, dismissals decreased from 6.7% of the disposition total in 1984 to 5.5%.
- New York City reported a 1.7% drop in the dismissal rate, and the Suburban area of New York City and Upstate recorded small decreases in the dismissal rate.
- Trials, both acquittals and convictions, accounted for 9.8% of the dispositions in New York State in 1985, down slightly from the 10.0% they accounted for in 1984.
- In New York City, trials represented 10.9% of the disposition total compared to 8.0% in the Suburban area of New York City and 8.2% Upstate.
- The conviction rate in New York State increased from 86.2% in 1984 to 88.2% in 1985.
- In 1985, pleas accounted for 92.0% of the convictions, jury trials 6.7% and non-jury trials 1.3%. While the percentage of convictions by plea was only slightly higher than 1984, the percent convicted by jury trial decreased and the percent convicted by non-jury trial increased.

### Drug Dispositions

- A record 7,823 drug dispositions were reported in New York State in 1985, 16.7% above the 1984 total.
- Drug dispositions accounted for 17.1% of the total dispositions in New York State.
- New York City reported a 17.9% increase in drug dispositions and accounted for 73.3% of the drug dispositions in New York State.
- The Suburban area of New York City represented 12.7% of the drug dispositions in New York State and this area reported a 7.8% increase in such dispositions from 1984 to 1985.
- Drug dispositions from the Upstate area accounted for 14.0% of the New York State total and this area reported an increase of 19.2% from 1984 to 1985.
- Statewide, the conviction rate for drug dispositions increased from 87.6% in 1984 to 89.8% in 1985.
- State prison sentences resulted from 38.4% of the drug convictions, and sentences to local institutions made up an additional 14.2%.
- Dispositions of Class A indictments in New York State accounted for 11.9% of the total drug dispositions in 1985, compared to 14.0% in 1984.

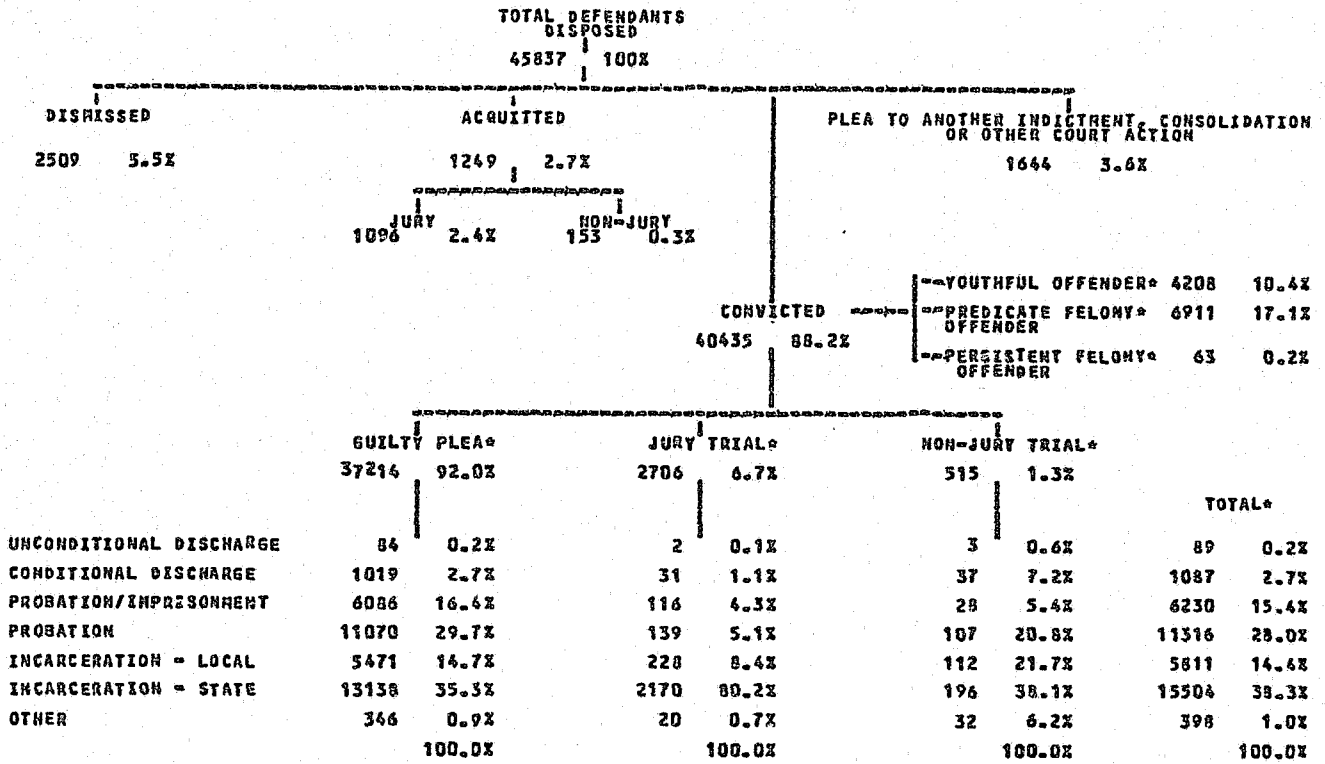

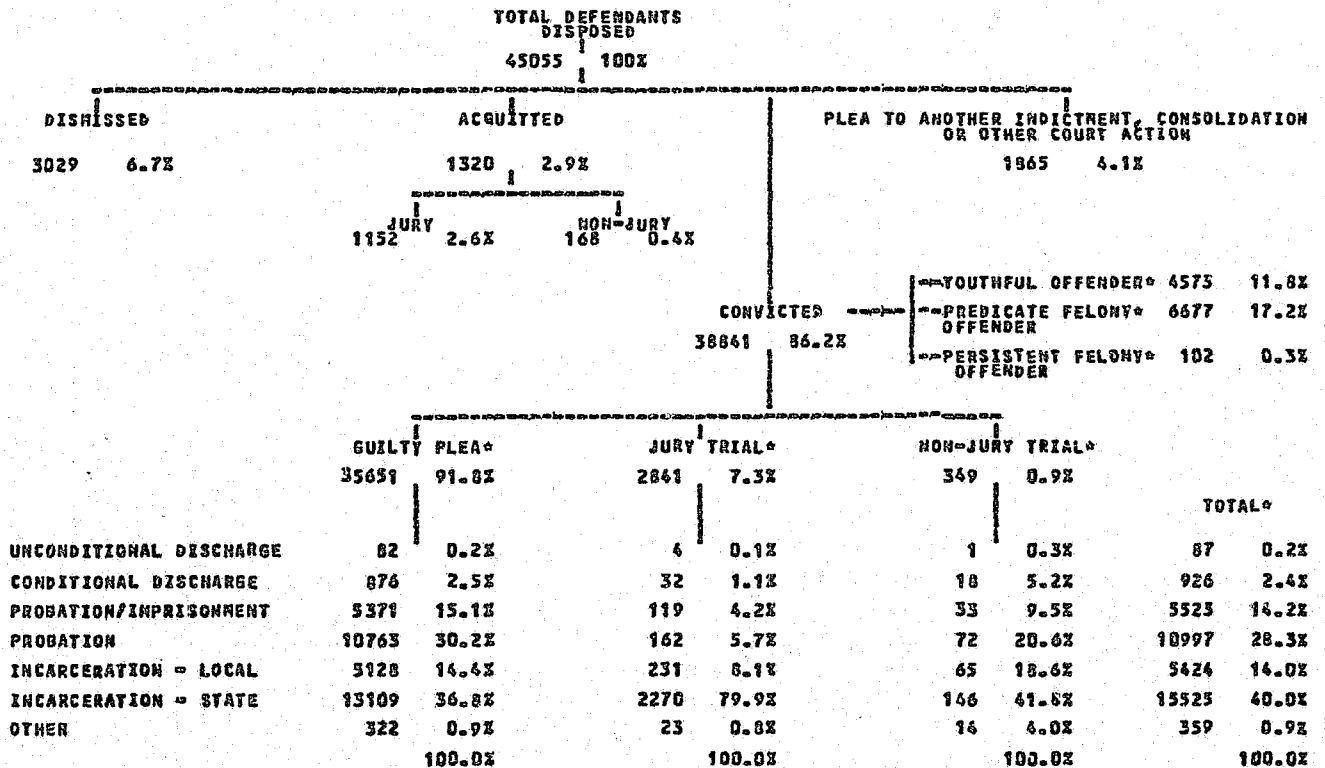

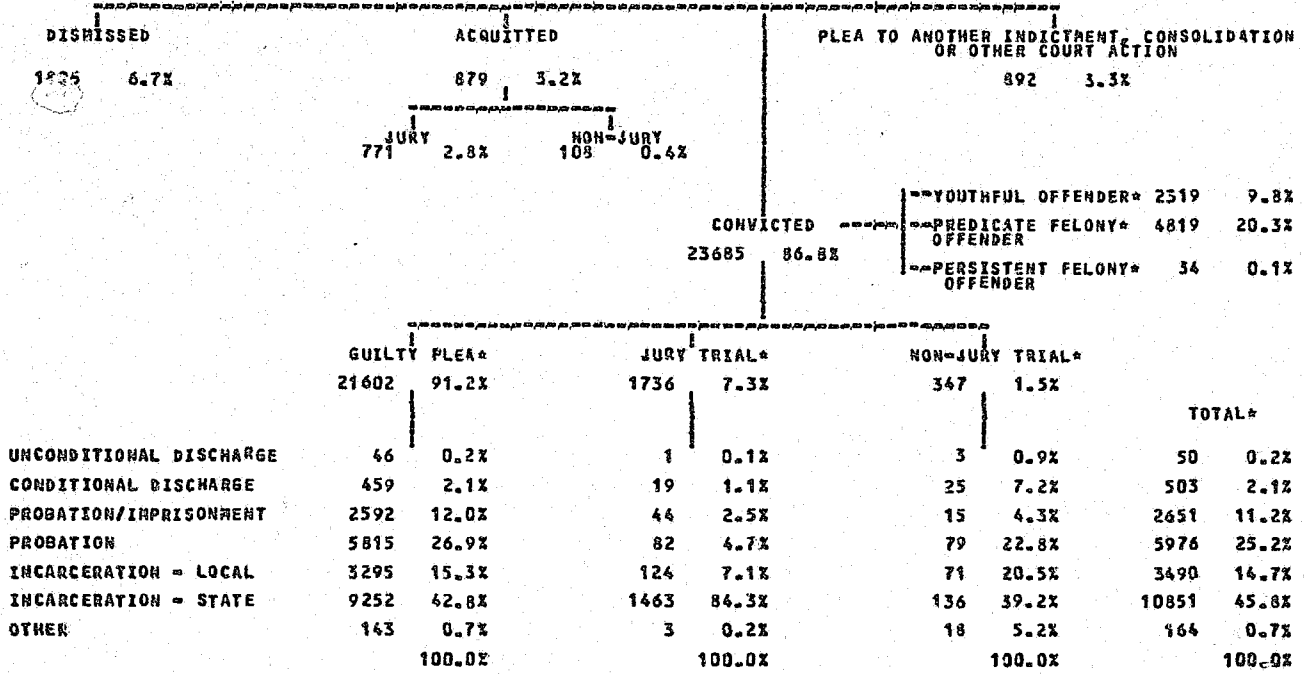
FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

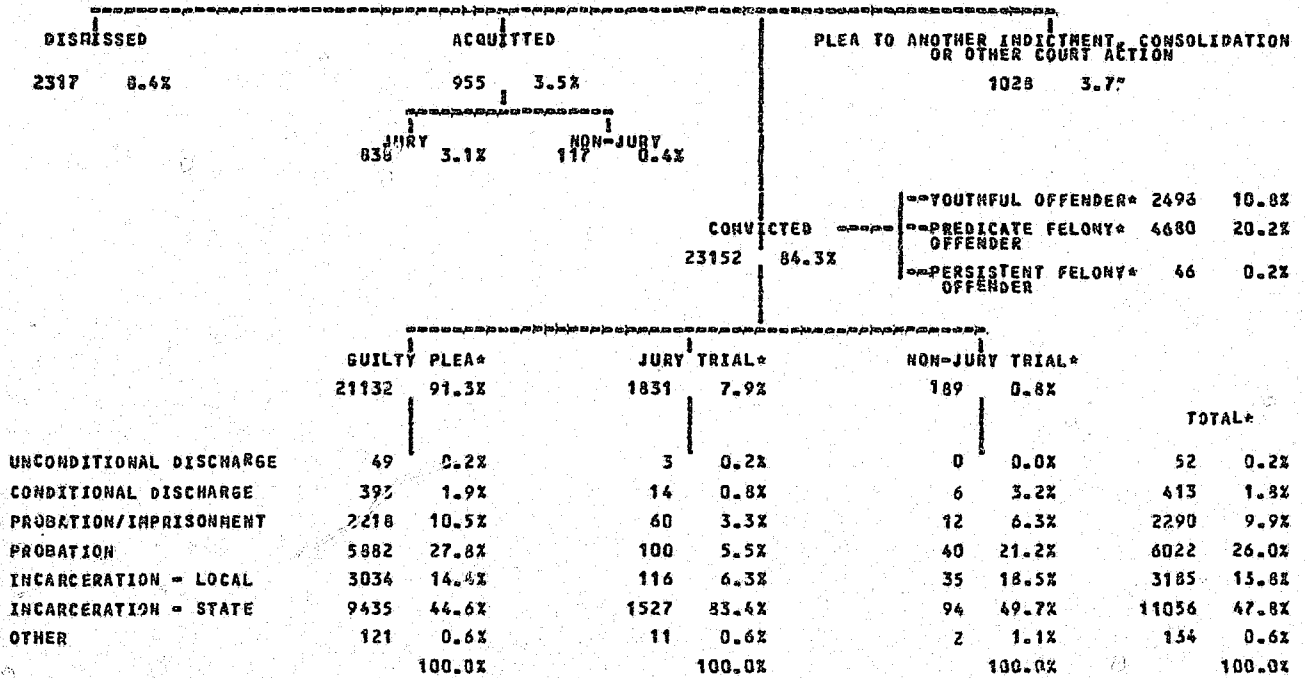
FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

1984

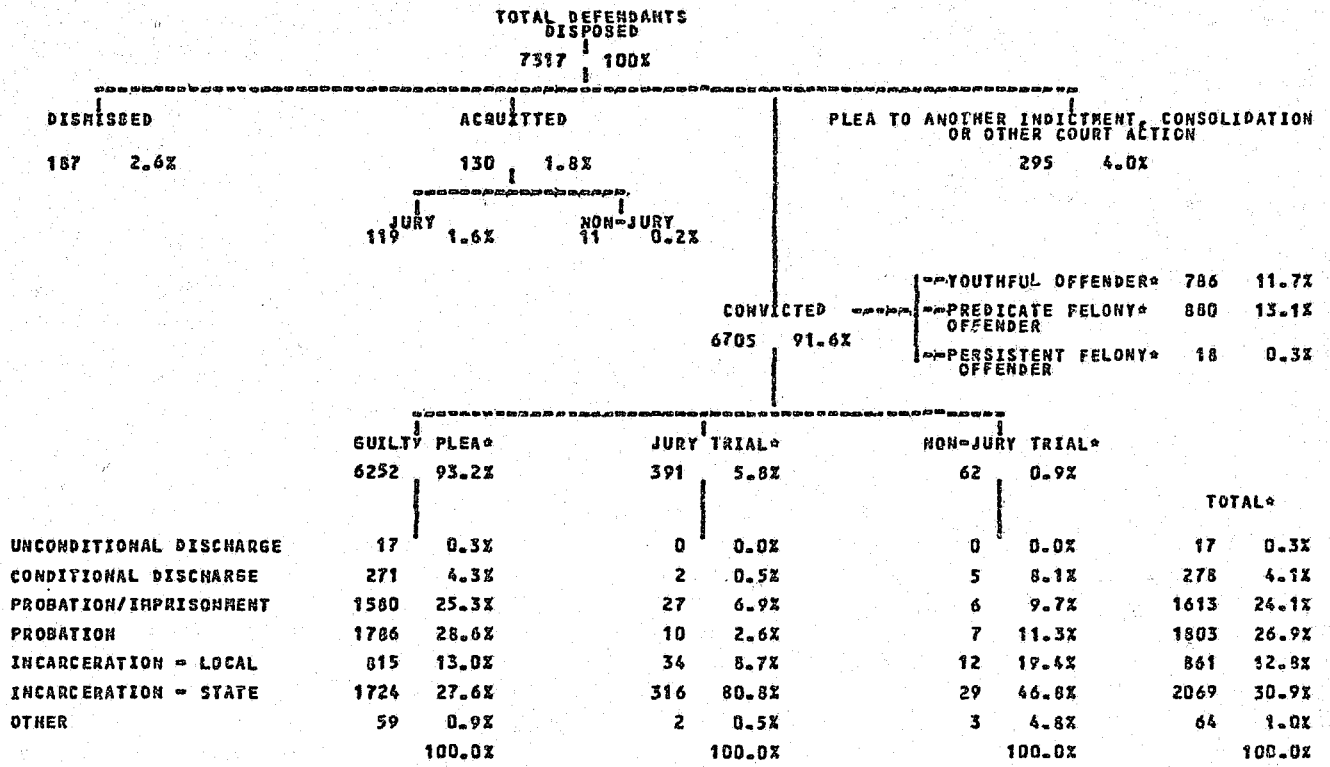

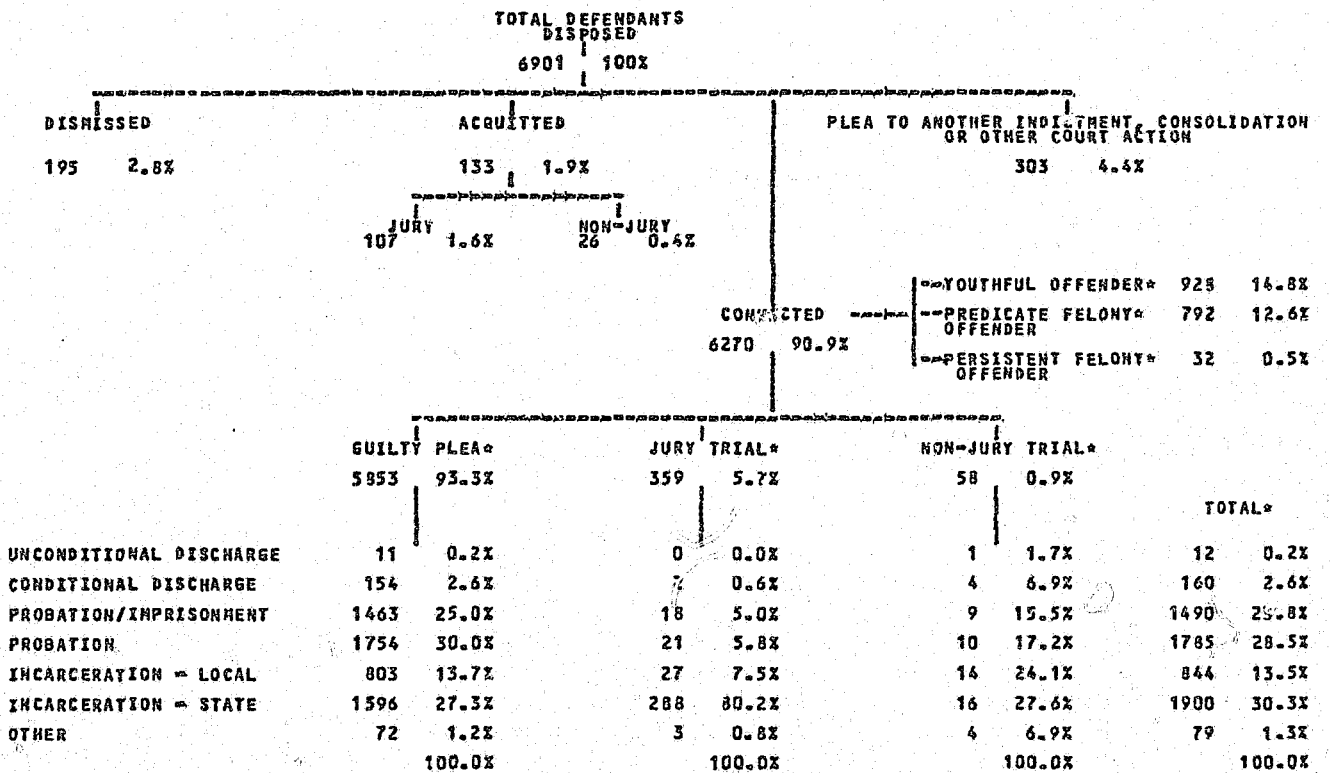

1985

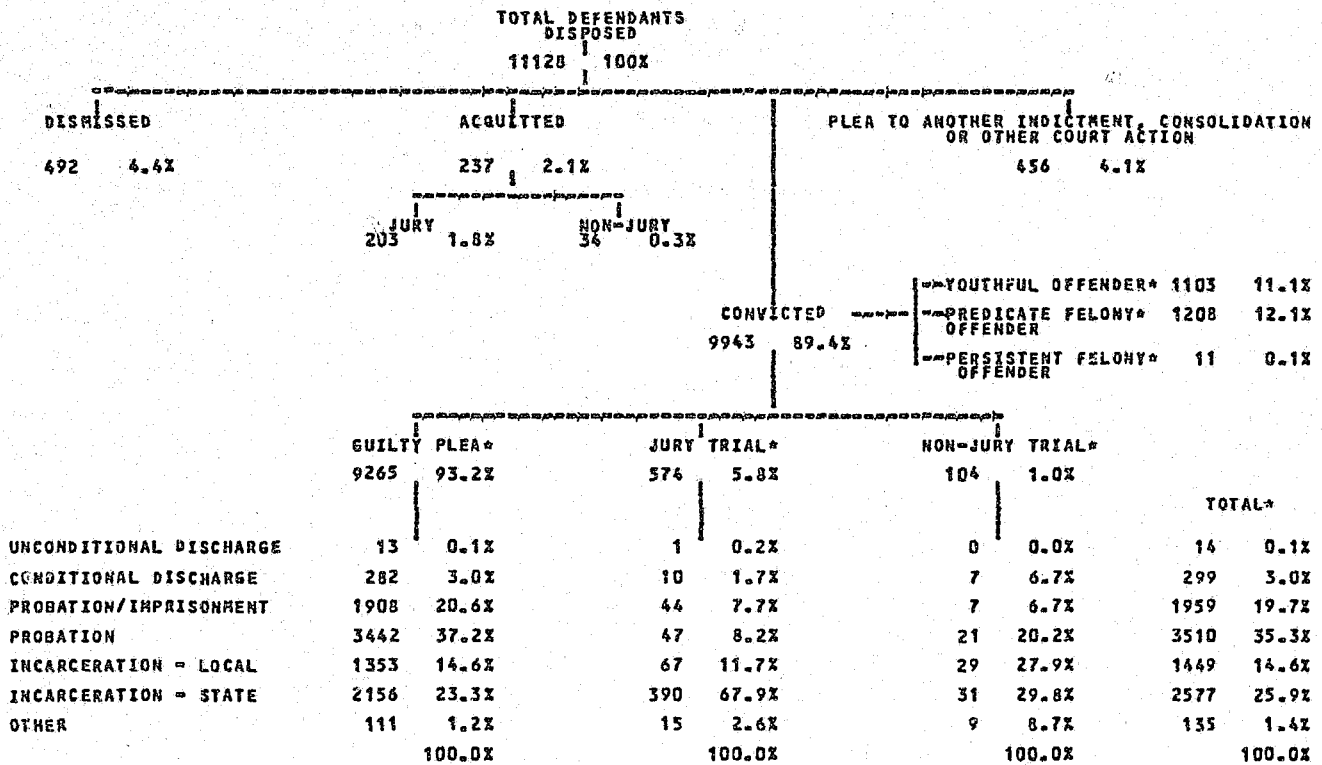


FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

1984

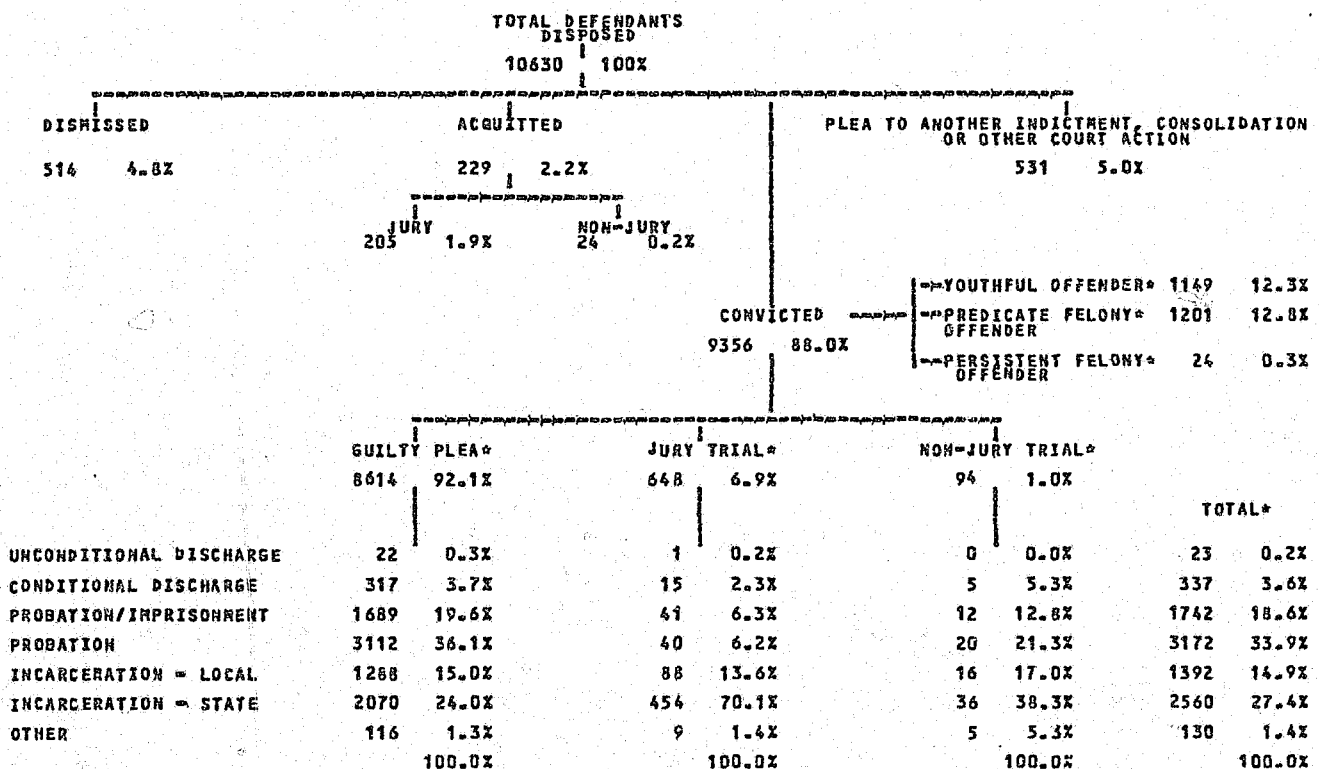

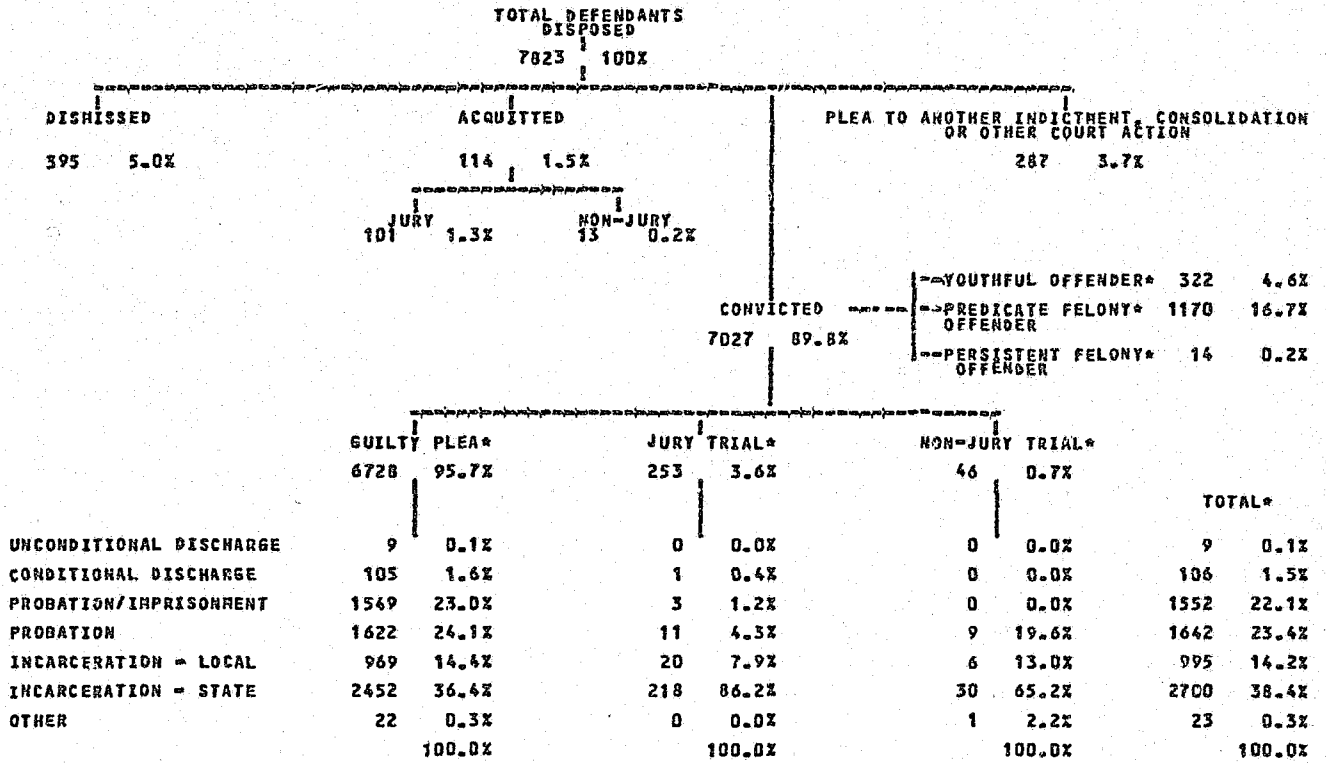


FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

1984

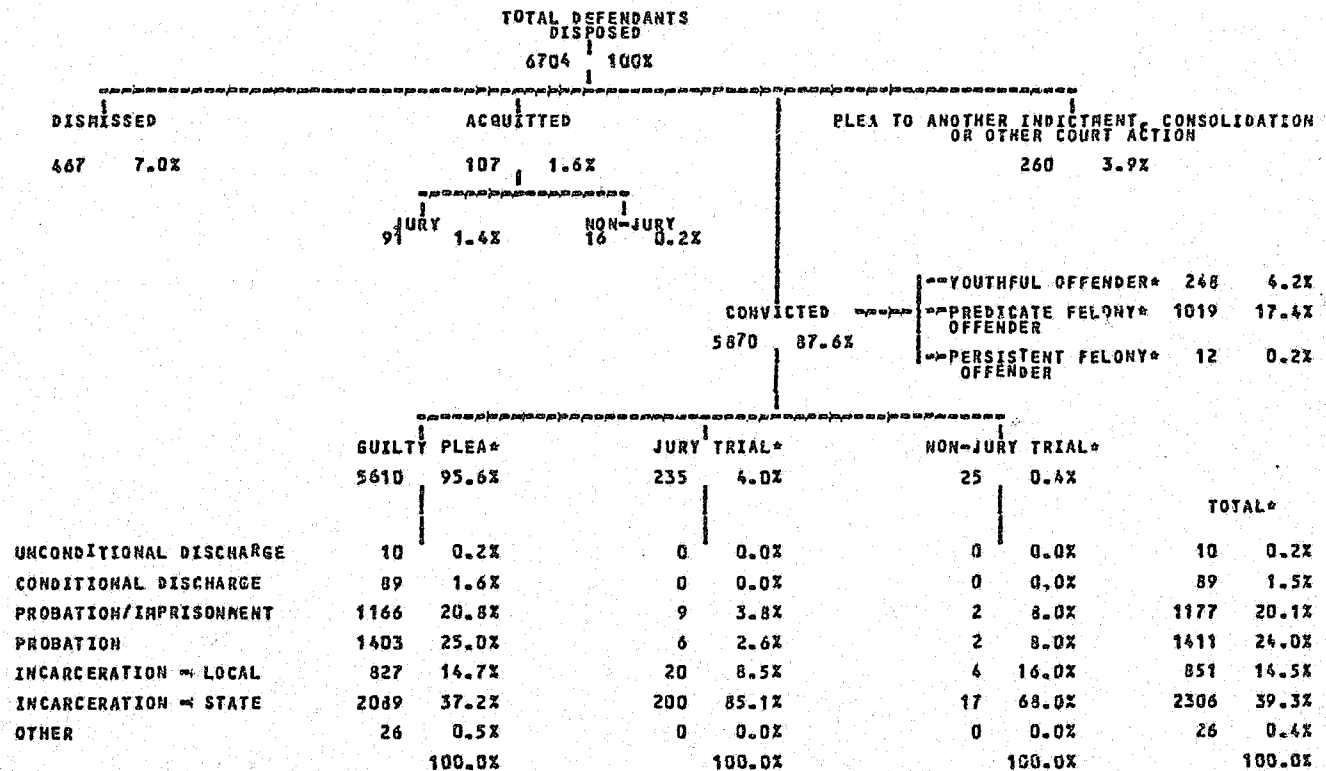

1985

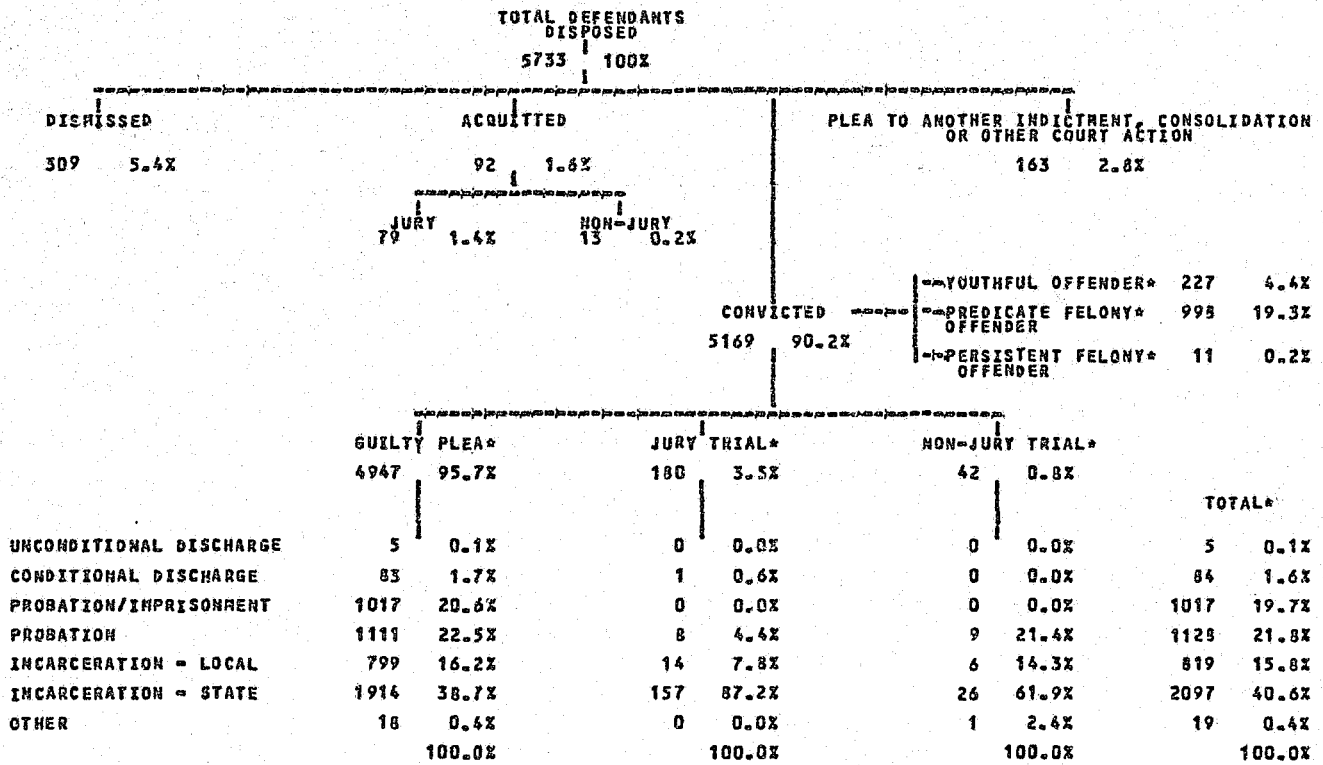


NEW YORK STATE

1984

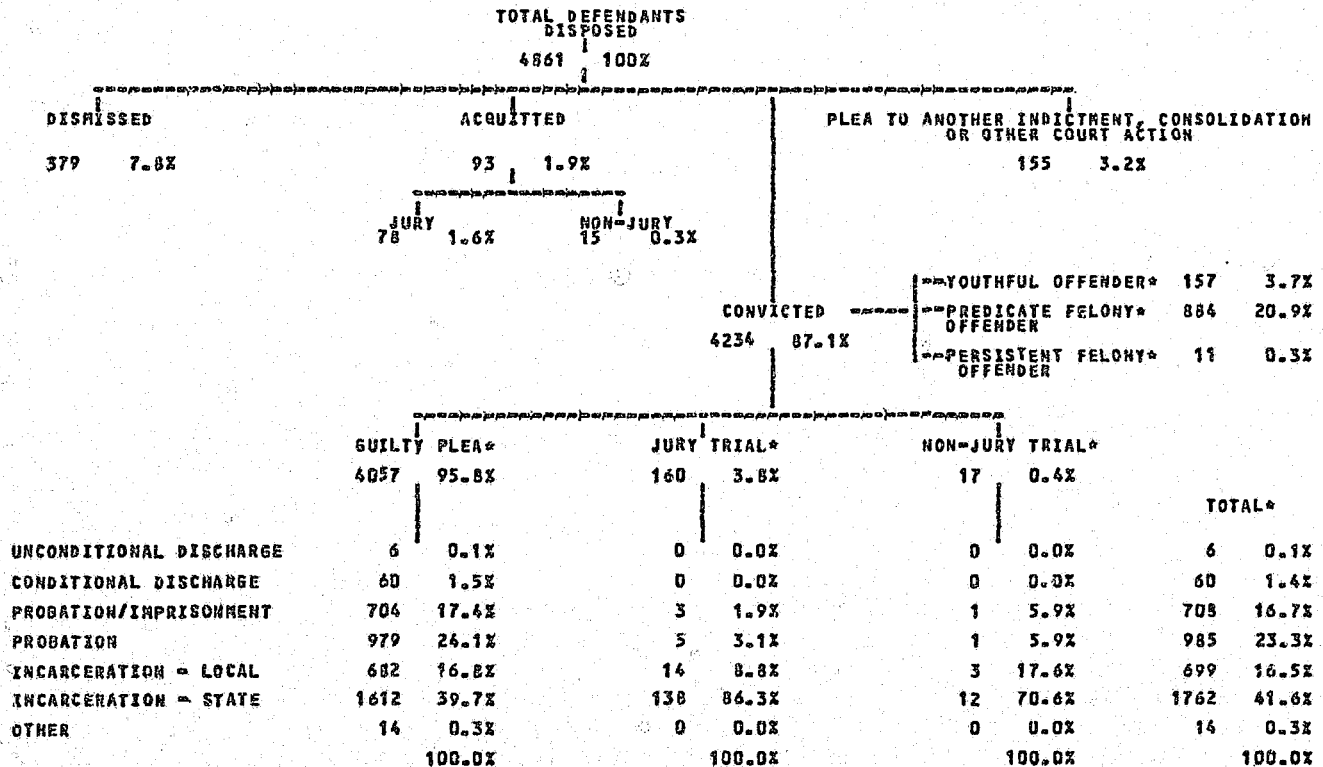

1985

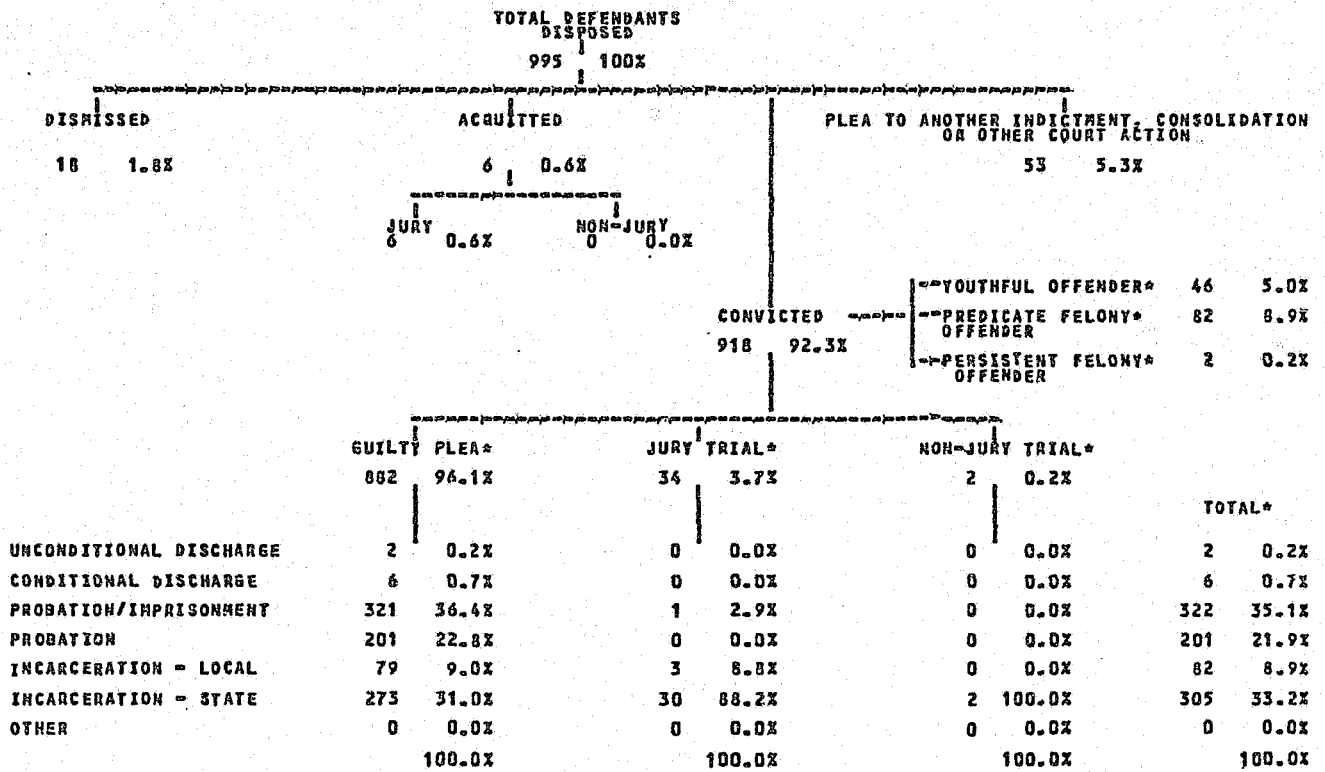


FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

1984

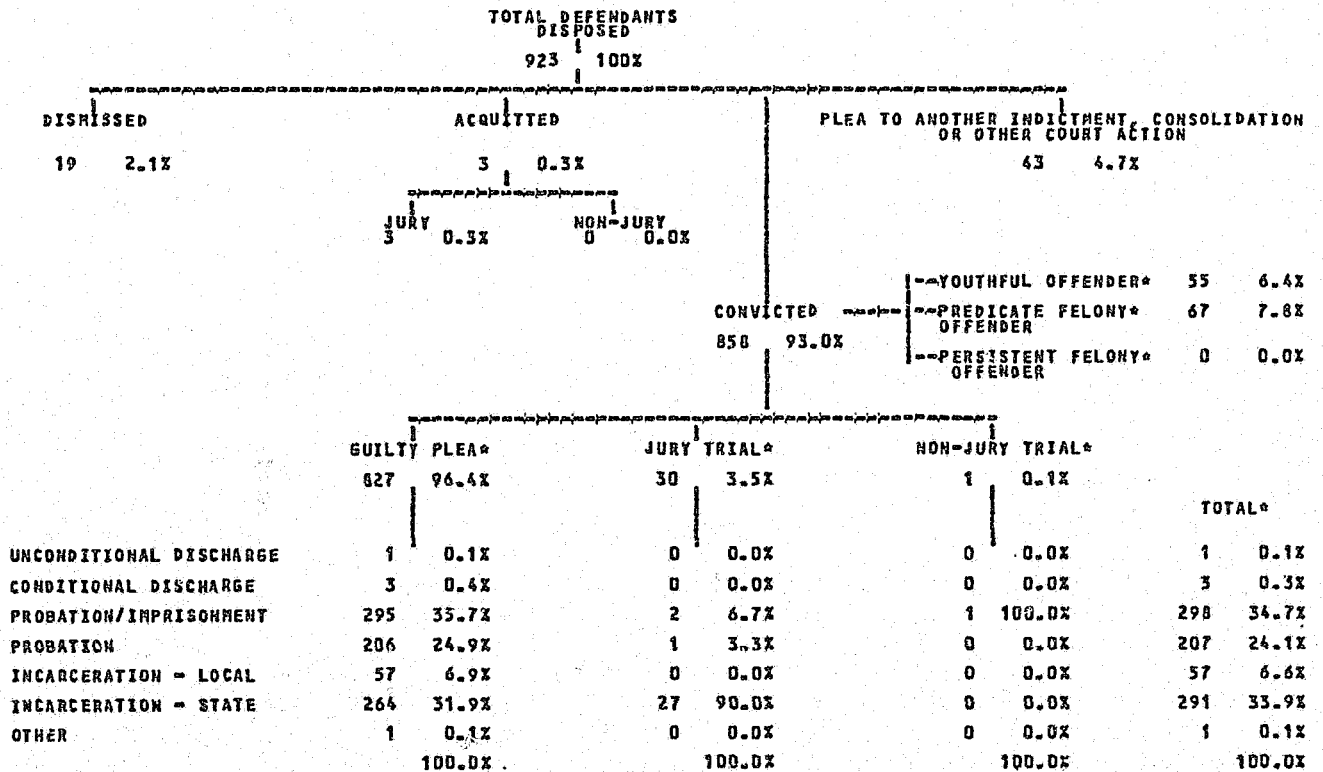

1985

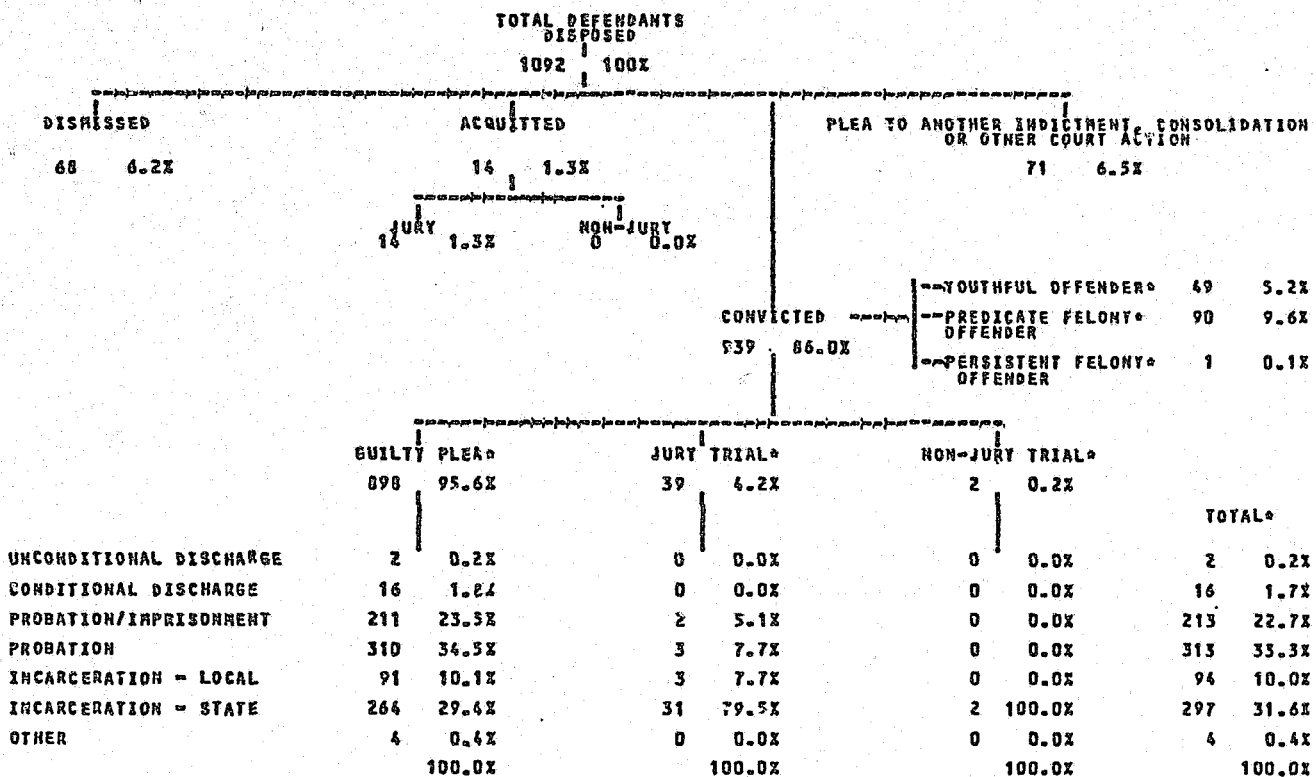


FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

1984

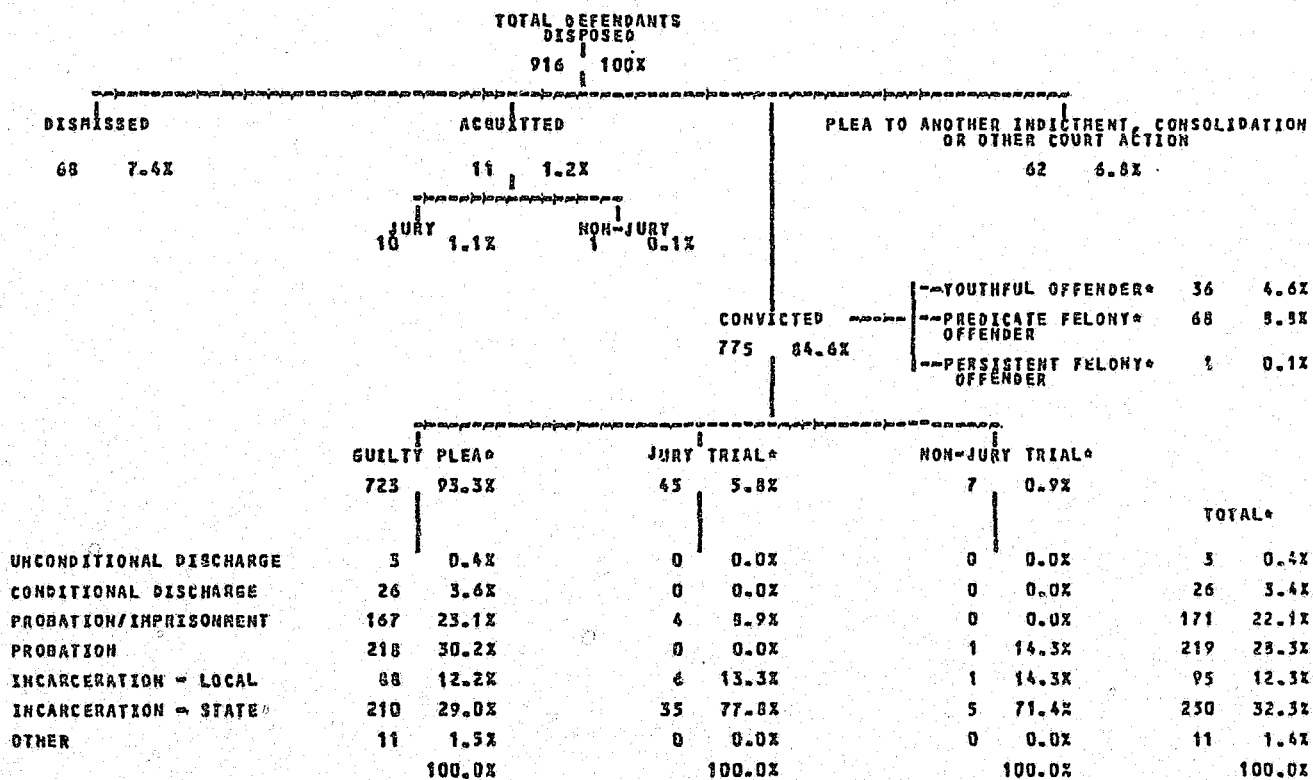

1985

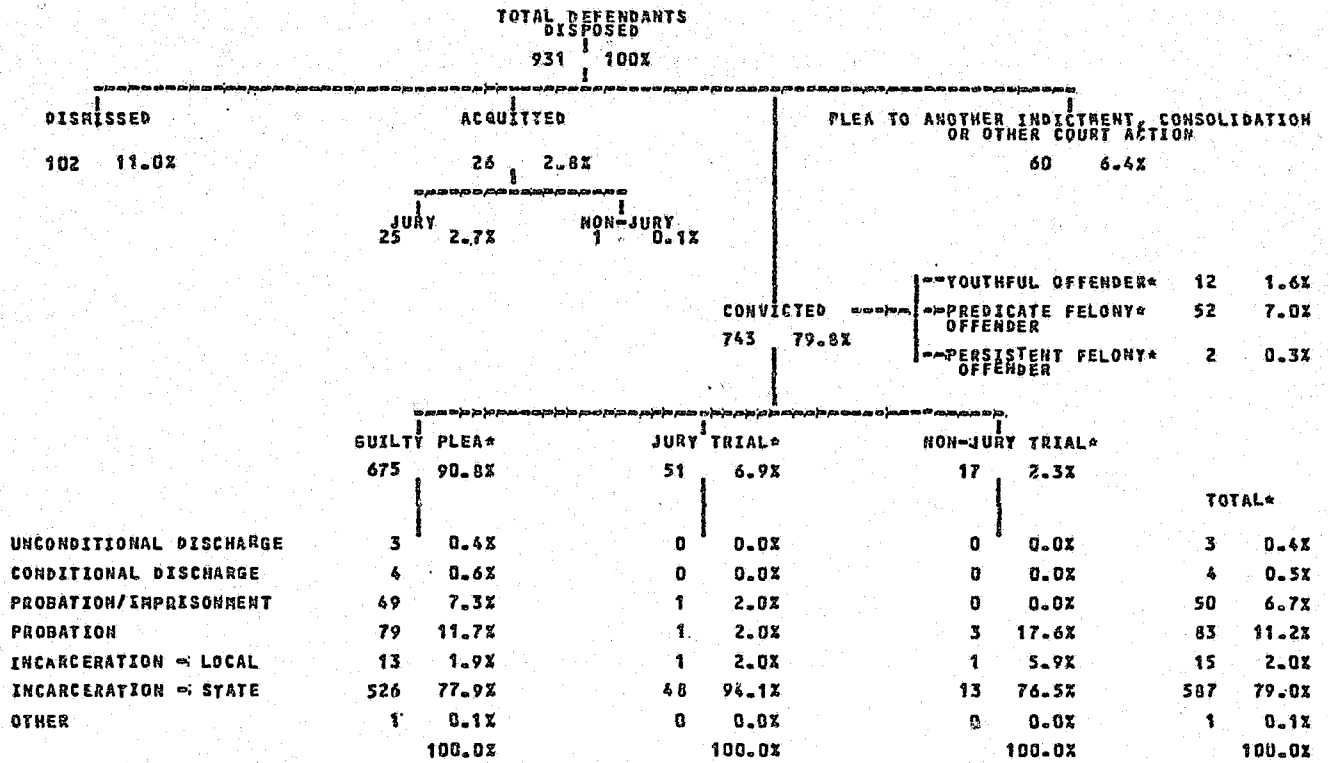


FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

1984

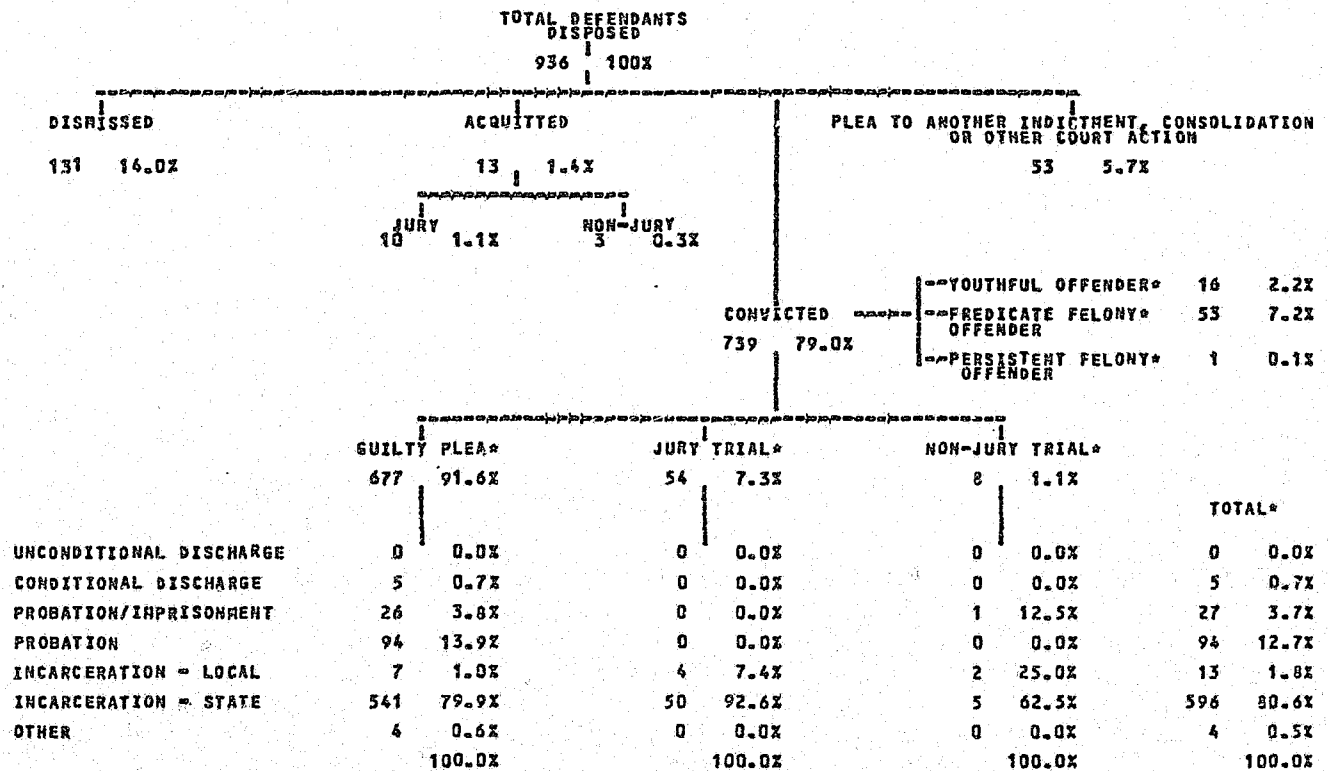

1985



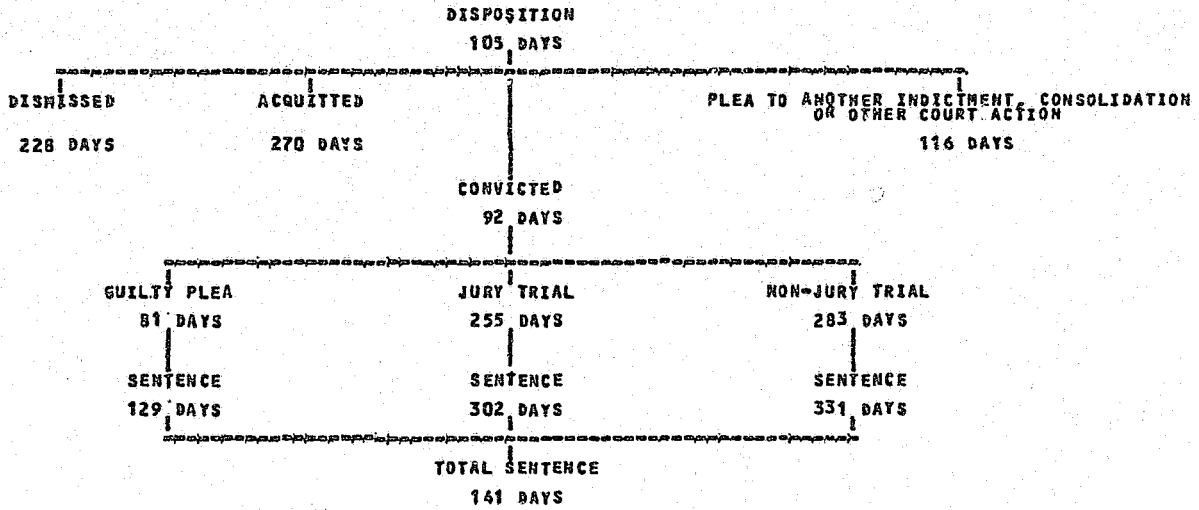
FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

## SENTENCES FOR SELECTED FELONY OFFENSES

In New York State in 1985, there were 18,844 Superior Court Convictions for the offenses of murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, and larceny.<sup>1</sup>

### CONVICTION CHARGE

- o In 1985, convictions for violent offenses (murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault) accounted for 63.5 percent of the state prison sentences.
- o The 2,073 convictions for robbery 1st degree constituted the largest conviction category in 1985.

### SENTENCE

- o Sentence for these selected offenses include youthful offender adjudications and second and persistent felony sentences which may mitigate or exacerbate these sentences.
- o For these convictions, which range in seriousness from Class A to Class E, 50.8 percent received sentences to state prison.
- o There were 415 life sentences, and 72 of these were for persistent felony convictions.
- o More than half of the state prison sentences had maximum sentences exceeding five years.

## PROCESSING TRENDS FOR FELONY OFFENSES AND FELONY DRUG OFFENSES

Data shown for these offenses were obtained from several sources. The felony arrest data were obtained from fingerprint cards submitted to the Division in accordance with Section 160.20 of the Criminal Procedure Law. Data on indictment through sentence were provided on individual reports by District Attorneys and Special Prosecutors in New York State.

Indictments, convictions and sentences to State prison may result from felony arrests in the same year or previous years. Convictions may be for indictments in the same or previous years and are included in the year in which the defendant was sentenced.

### Felony Offenses

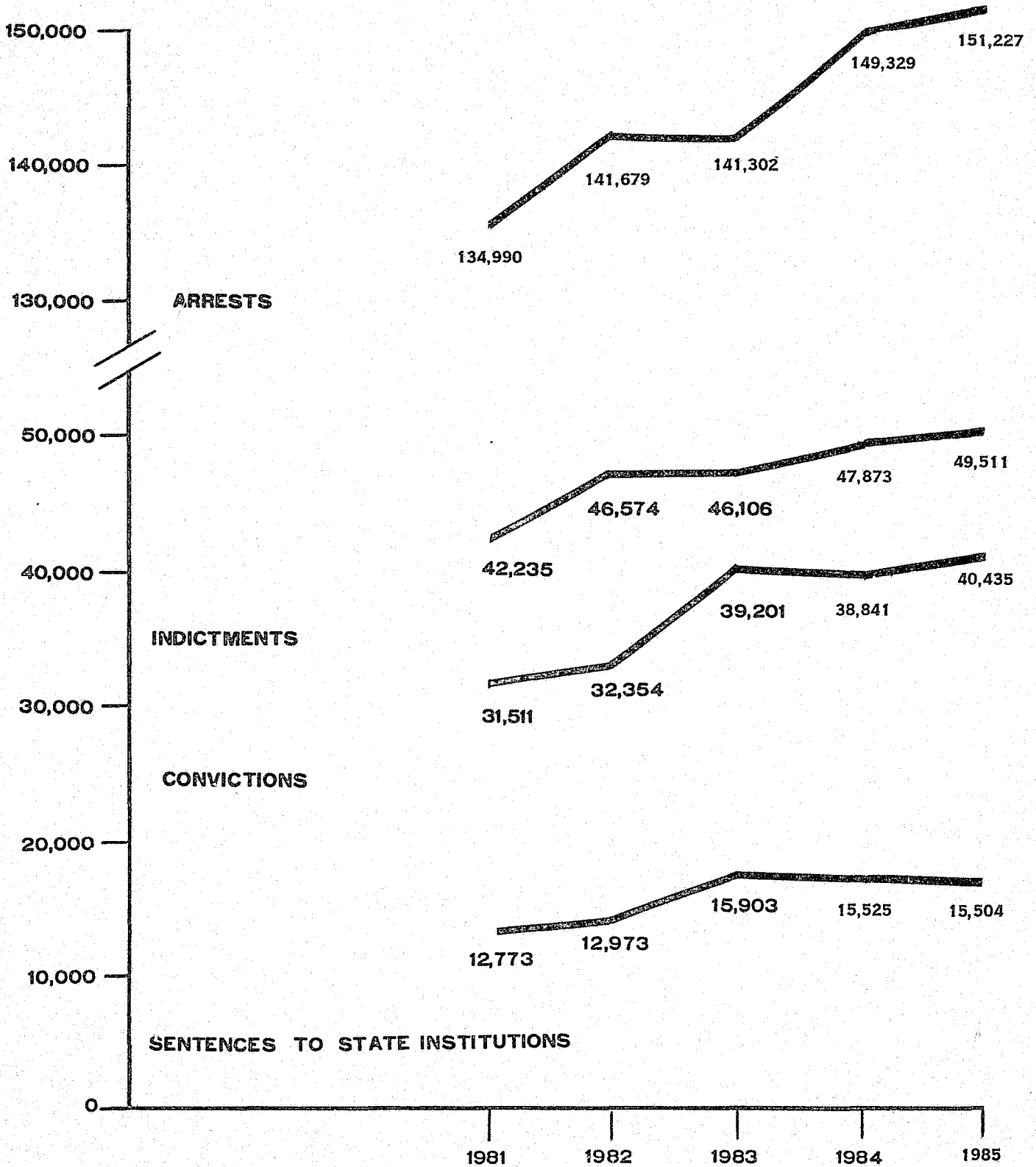
From 1981 through 1985 felony arrests increased 12.0%, while felony indictments rose 17.2%, convictions 28.3%, and State prison sentences 21.4%. Felony arrests and felony indictments increased from 1984 to 1985. State prison sentences decreased 0.1%, although convictions increased 4.1%.

### Felony Drug Offenses

Felony drug arrests, indictments, dispositions, convictions and sentences to state institutions increased each year from 1981 through 1985. Felony arrests were up 5.1% from 1984 to 1985 while indictments rose 21.7%, dispositions 16.7%, convictions 19.7%, and State prison sentences 17.0%.

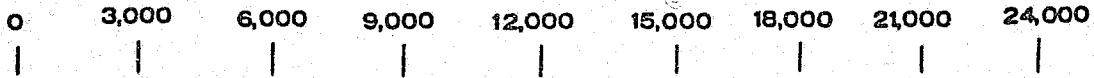


NEW YORK STATE

**1981 - 1985**

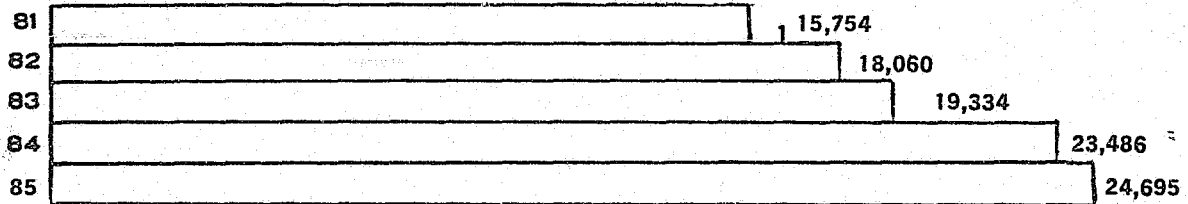


NEW YORK STATE

AT SELECTED PROCESSING POINTS IN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM

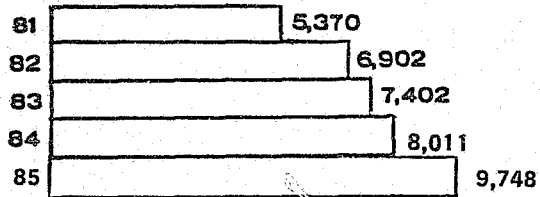

## NEW YORK STATE

**LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED  
1985**

During 1985, one law enforcement officer was feloniously slain in the line of duty in New York State. Two other officers accidentally lost their lives while performing law enforcement duties.

There were 6,312 officers assaulted while performing law enforcement functions, a decrease of 0.3% from the 6,333 officers assaulted in 1984. In 1985, 88.6% of the assaults resulted in personal injury to the officer.

**WEAPON**

Physical force, as in prior years, was the most common method of assault; 80.1% of the officers were assaulted in this manner. 'Other dangerous weapons' were the next most frequently used weapons in assaults (9.9%) followed by handguns at 5.8%, knives at 3.5% and lastly, other firearms at 0.6%.

**ACTIVITY**

As in previous years, assaults occurred most frequently when officers were attempting arrests, accounting for 33.2% of the assaults. The next highest number of assaults took place during disturbance calls, accounting for 21.4% of the assaults. The fewest number of assaults, 0.3%, occurred during ambushes.

**ASSIGNMENT**

Officers assigned to two-man vehicles experienced the most assaults, 48.8%. These assaults increased 6.0% over 1984. In contrast, only 10.1% of the assaults were experienced by officers assigned to one-man vehicles. The 640 cases represent a 13.0% decrease from the previous year.

**TIME**

The likelihood that a law enforcement officer would be assaulted was greatest between 10:00 PM and 12:00 PM, the hours when 893 (14.1%) of the assaults took place. An assault was least likely to occur between 6:00 AM and 8:00 AM, the hours when only 179 (2.8%) of the assaults took place.

Forty-nine percent (49.4%) of all assaults occurred between 4:00 PM and midnight, the hours when police are usually their busiest. The hours of 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM recorded the lowest number of assaults, 24.2%.

Killed in a collision with another vehicle while responding to a burglary in progress.

**THOMAS F. HUDSON ..... NEW YORK STATE POLICE**

Killed by a moving tractor trailer which collided with a stopped one in a traffic investigation.

**GARY R. STYMILOSKI ..... WESTCHESTER COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY**

Shot with a .380 automatic pistol while making a routine traffic stop.

## LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

### EMPLOYEES

- A Total Of 70,995 Persons Were Employed By Law Enforcement Agencies In New York State In 1985.<sup>1</sup> This Figure Includes Both Uniformed And Civilian Personnel And Those Working Full Or Part-Time As Well.
- The 1985 Figure Represents A Decrease Of 0.3% Over The Figure Reported In 1984.
- The Largest Department Was The New York City Police Department With 32,328 Employees.
- The Next Largest Departments, In Order Of Size, Were The New York State Police With 4,469, The NYC Transit Authority With 3,955, Nassau County Police With 3,636 And The Suffolk County Police With 3,072 Employees.
- Statewide, 83.2% Of The Employees Were Uniformed Personnel.
- The Number Of Uniformed Personnel Increased 2.2% Between 1984 and 1985.
- Ninety-Six Percent (96.3%) Of The Uniformed Personnel Were Employed Full Time.
- Females Accounted For 6.2% Of The Uniformed Personnel; The Number Of Females Employed Rose 20.6% Over The Number Employed In 1984.
- Municipal Police Agencies Employed 86.4% Of The Uniformed Personnel In New York State; Special Or Multiple Jurisdiction Agencies (Parks, Railroads, University Campuses, Etc.) Employed 8.8% And Sheriffs Employed The Remaining 4.8%.

### EXPENDITURES

- The State's Law Enforcement Agencies Submitted Estimates Of Operating Expenditures For FY 1985 That Amounted To \$2,535,513,488, And Increase Of 7.3% Over FY 1984 Operating Expenditures. The 1985 Expenditures Were Distributed Across Law Enforcement Jurisdictions As Follows:

INTRODUCTION

There were 2,979,201 filings in the trial courts of the Unified Court System during 1985, including 486,807 parking tickets.<sup>1,2,3</sup> Of the 2,492,394 remaining cases, 46% (1,156,894) were filed in criminal courts, 33% (825,929) in civil courts, 16% (391,322) in the Family Courts, and 5% (118,249) in the Surrogates' Courts.

Dispositions in the trial courts during 1985 totaled 3,026,455. Excluding parking tickets, there were 2,539,648 dispositions as follows: criminal courts--45%, civil courts--33%, Family Courts--15%, Surrogates' Courts--7%.

Table 1 shows a breakdown of filings and dispositions in the trial courts by type of court.

Criminal cases are processed in the trial courts as follows. Felony indictments and superior court informations are processed in the Criminal Term of the Supreme Court in New York City and in the County Courts outside of New York City. In several counties outside of New York City, a portion of the felony caseload is processed in the Supreme Court as well. The courts of limited jurisdiction--Criminal Court of the City of New York; District Courts of Nassau and Suffolk; and City, Town, and Village Courts outside of New York City--have original jurisdiction over felonies and complete jurisdiction over misdemeanors, violations, and infractions.

1. Criminal Term of Supreme and County Courts

Filings: Statewide, 51,034 felony cases were filed in Supreme and County Courts during 1985.<sup>4</sup> This level of filings was an increase of 4% from the 49,191 filings in 1984. Sixty percent (30,728) of 1985 filings occurred in New York City.

Table 2 shows a breakdown of 1985 filings by judicial district. The greatest rates of increase were in the 12th (Bronx) and 7th (Monroe and surrounding counties) JDs. Filings in the 12th JD rose 34% from 5,014 in 1984 to 6,700 in 1985. Filings in the 7th JD rose 16% from 2,119 to 2,450. All other district changes were moderate by comparison.

Table 3 focuses on individual counties, ranking the fifteen counties with 400 or more felony-case filings. These fifteen of the sixty-two counties accounted for 87% of all filings. New York County had the highest volume, with 10,041 filings. Kings, Bronx, and Queens followed.

Dispositions: Statewide, 50,790 cases reached disposition (guilty plea, trial verdict, dismissal, or other) in 1985, a slight increase from the 50,354 dispositions in 1984. Fifty-nine percent (30,004) of the statewide dispositions were in New York City.

Table 2 shows 1985 dispositions by judicial district. Dispositions in the 12th JD (Bronx) increased 11% from 5,482 in 1984 to 6,070 in 1985. Dispositions in the 3rd JD (Albany and surrounding counties) increased 9% to 1,379 in 1985 from 1,267 in 1984.

Table 3 shows that sixteen counties with over 400 dispositions accounted for 87% of all felony-case dispositions. Eleven counties with over 40 trials commenced accounted for 89% of felony trials commenced statewide in 1985. Of the total of 5,184 felony trials commenced, 4,362 (84%) were jury trials.

Figure 1 shows felony-case dispositions by type. There were 40,260 guilty pleas (79%), 4,989 dismissals (10%), 4,697 trial verdicts (9%), and 844 other dispositions (2%). This breakdown is similar to that of previous years.

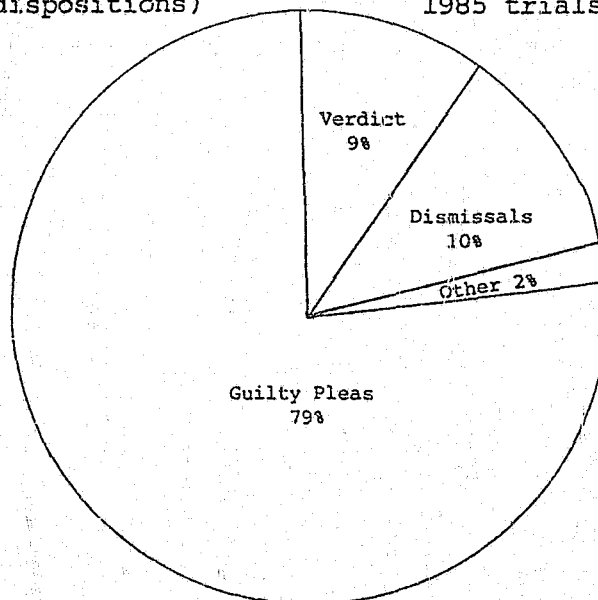

## 2. Criminal Courts of Limited Jurisdiction

Criminal Court of the City of New York: There were 274,894 arrest-case dockets filed in the Criminal Court of the City of New York in 1985. There were 266,590 dispositions in this period. These figures were increases of 6% in filings and 9% in dispositions compared with 1984.

Of the dispositions, 52% were by guilty plea, 29% by dismissal, 12% by referral to grand jury or transfers to Supreme Court for waiver of indictment, one-half of 1% by verdict, and 6% were other dispositions. This distribution is nearly identical to that of 1984.

There were 157,314 summonses added to the calendar. (In addition, 461,843 summonses were filed to which defendants did not respond.) There were 163,698 dispositions. Both intake and disposition figures include a small number of summonses handled by mail.<sup>5</sup>

City and District Courts outside New York City: Criminal-case intake in the City Courts and the District Courts (Nassau and Suffolk) was 233,366 in 1985. The courts reported 224,989 dispositions. Of the dispositions, 54% were by guilty plea, 34% by dismissal, 4% by referral to grand jury, 2% by trial verdict, and 6% by other means.

There were 268,129 noncriminal (violations and infractions) Uniform Traffic Tickets disposed by judges in these courts. Slightly over half (144,457) were guilty pleas and 3% (8,386) were trial verdicts. The balance were dismissed. In addition, the clerks' offices disposed of 172,157 tickets. These consisted primarily of fines paid (by personal appearance and mail) and bail forfeitures. In cities without Parking Violations Bureaus, the City and District Courts process parking tickets. There were 486,807 dispositions.

Figure 2 shows criminal caseload activity in the courts of limited jurisdiction.

## DIVISION OF PROBATION AND CORRECTIONAL ALTERNATIVES

The New York State Division of Probation and Correctional Alternatives collects data from local probation departments each month and compiles this data on probation services delivery annually. Adult supervision data is taken from the Probation Registrant System. The probation services include: intake for family court, investigations conducted for family and criminal courts, pre-disposition supervision and probation supervision.

### HIGHLIGHTS OF 1985 BASED ON REPORTS OF WORKLOAD IN PROBATION DEPARTMENTS

#### INTAKE SERVICES

Cases opened for intake services decreased from 150,221 in 1984 to 149,574 in 1985. The 38,154 cases opened in New York City represented 26% of the statewide total, compared to 31% in 1984. (chart 1)

#### INVESTIGATIONS

Probation departments conducted 89,690 regular investigations (pre-sentence, pre-plea, JD, and PINS), and 59,830 other investigations. This 149,520 total is a 4% increase over the 144,435 investigations conducted in 1984. (Table 1)

#### PRE-DISPOSITION SUPERVISION

There were 16,883 cases received for supervision prior to court disposition. This was an 11% increase from the 15,152 received in 1984. (chart 2)

#### PROBATION SUPERVISION

During 1985, there were 45,732 probation supervision cases received. This was a 6% increase over 1984, when 42,981 cases were received.

At the end of 1985, there were 108,014 cases under supervision, an increase of 12% over the 96,729 being supervised on 12/31/84. (Table 2, charts 3 and 4)

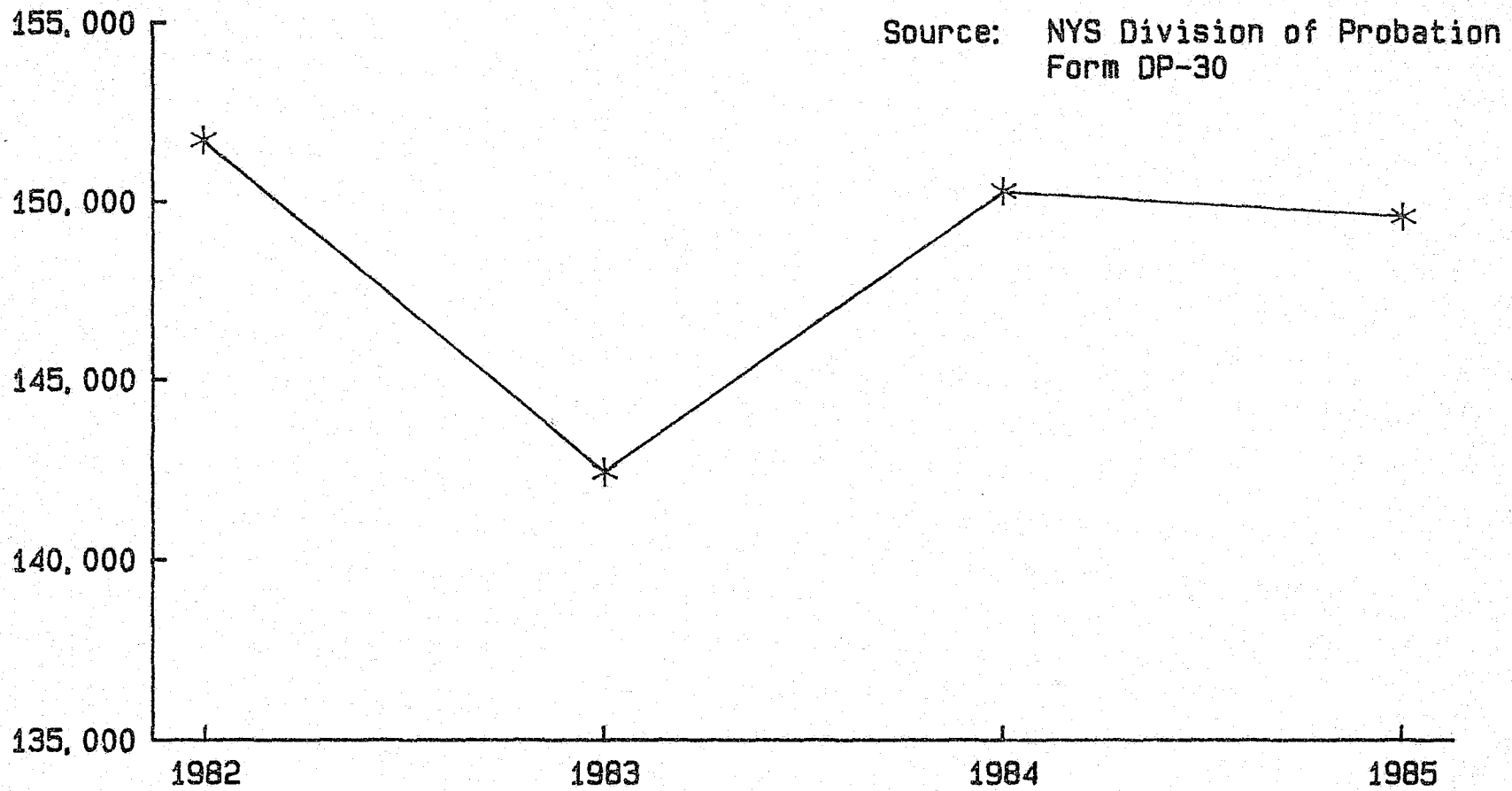

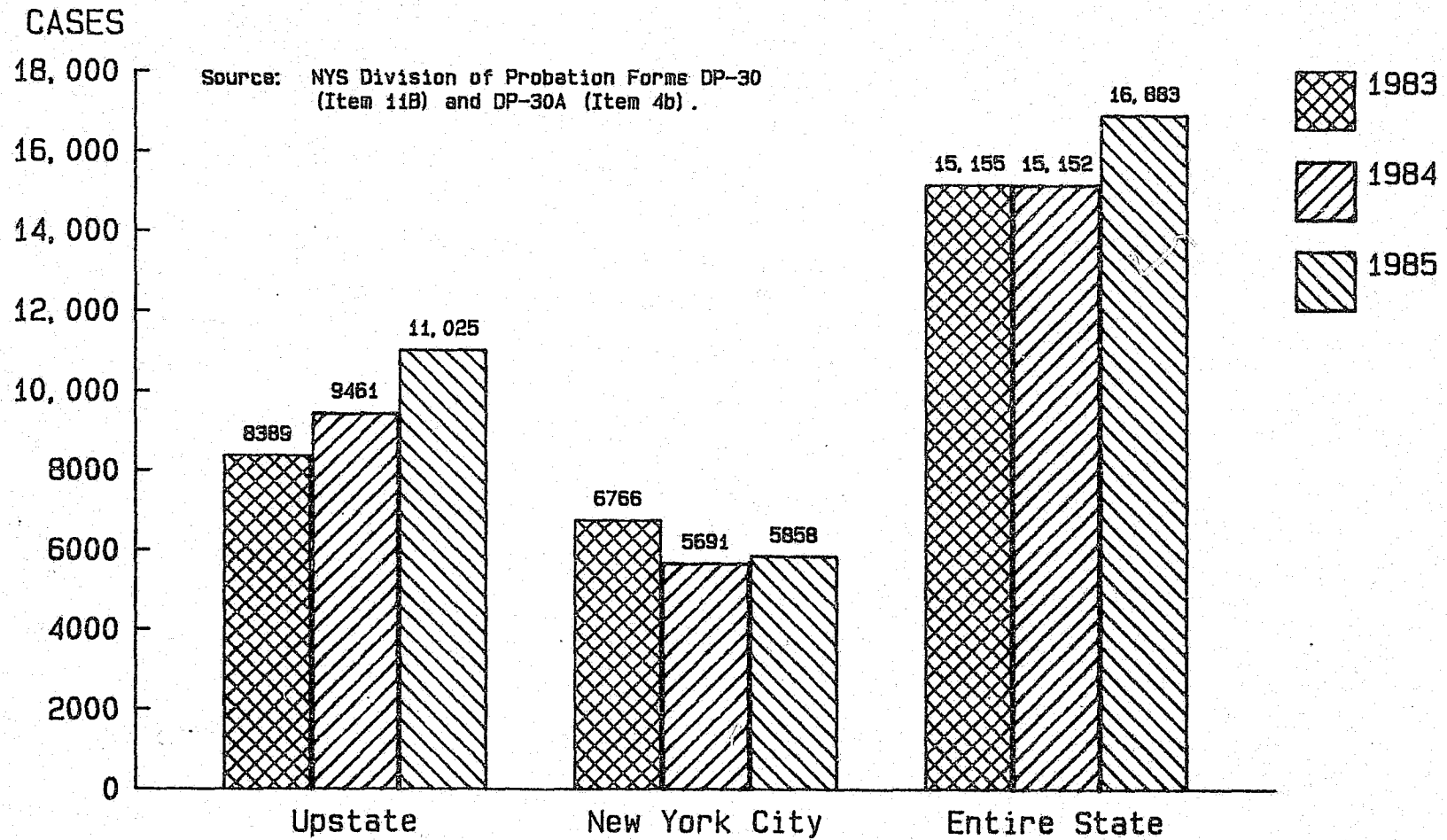
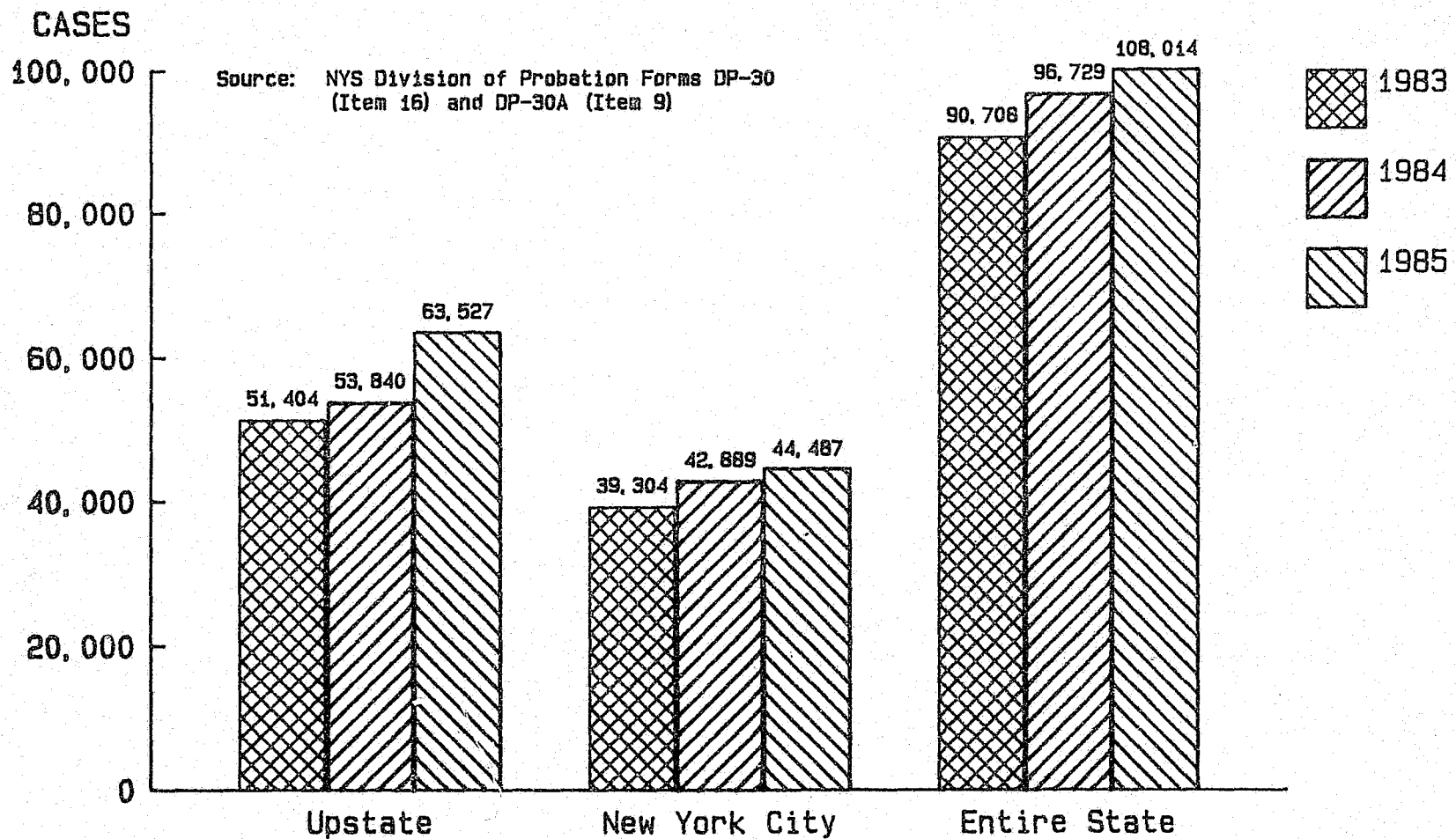

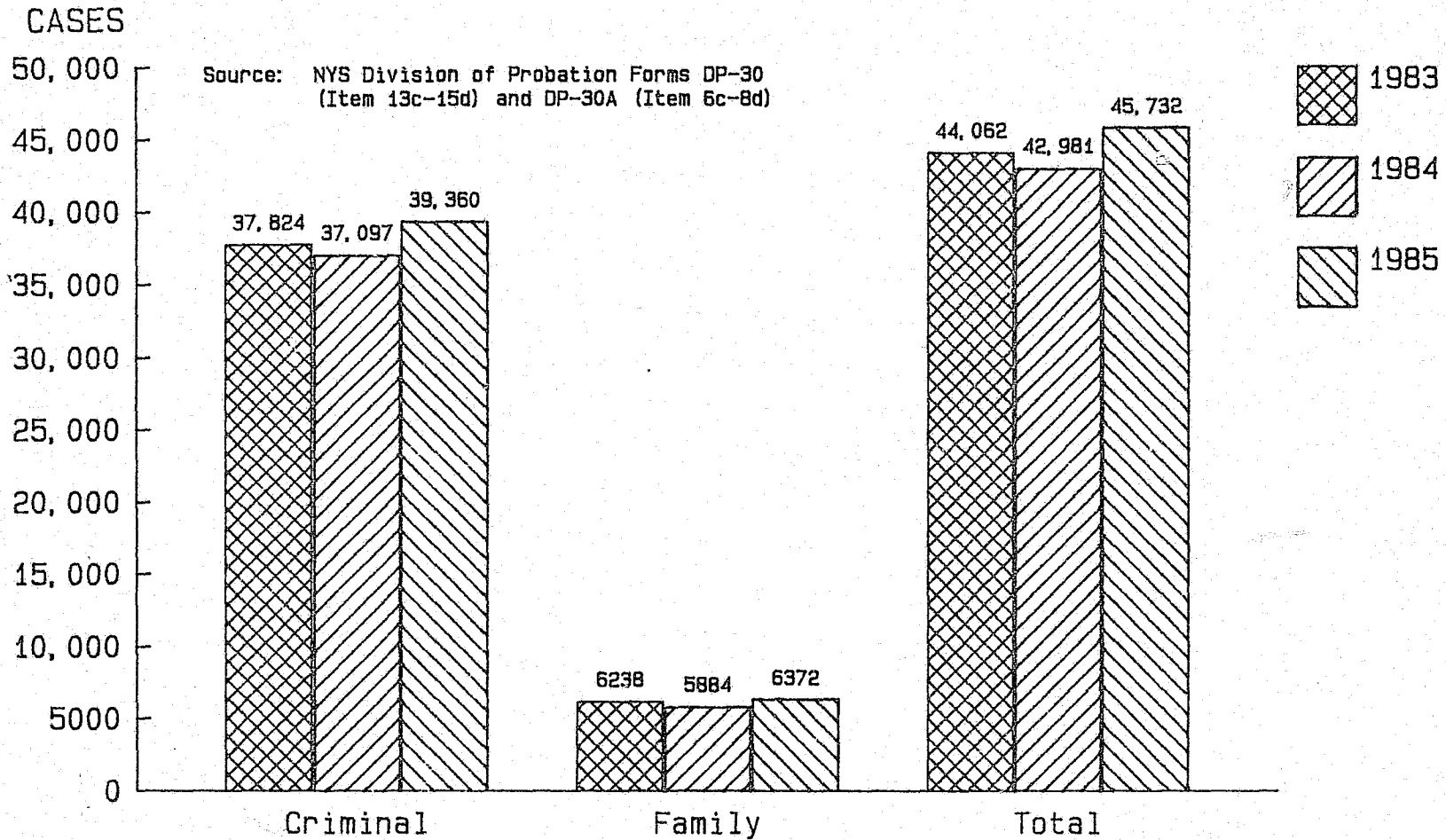
# Cases on Probation at the End of the Year

## CORRECTIONAL SERVICES

### Under Custody Population (Exhibit 1 and 2)

The number of inmates under custody declined from 12,525 at the end of calendar year 1971 to a low of 12,444 at the close of 1972. This decline began in 1964 and continued over a nine year period. Contributing to this decline was the Baxtrom decision which led to the release from Department custody of all criminally insane inmates held beyond their maximum expiration dates along with related decisions which ended the practice of holding under custody dangerously mentally incapacitated persons for long periods of time. These decisions, coupled with other factors including a revised Penal Law which became effective in September of 1967, changes in sentencing procedures, and the development of major institutional programs for drug addicts by the state's drug control agency, resulted in an annual net loss in the under custody population which continued through 1971. This situation was reversed in 1973 when admissions exceeded releases for the first time since 1963. This rise in the under custody population has continued every year through 1985, when the under custody population rose to 35,373 (including 634 detained parolees), an increase of 184.3 percent over a fourteen year period. Reasons for this increase are discussed in the section on admissions.



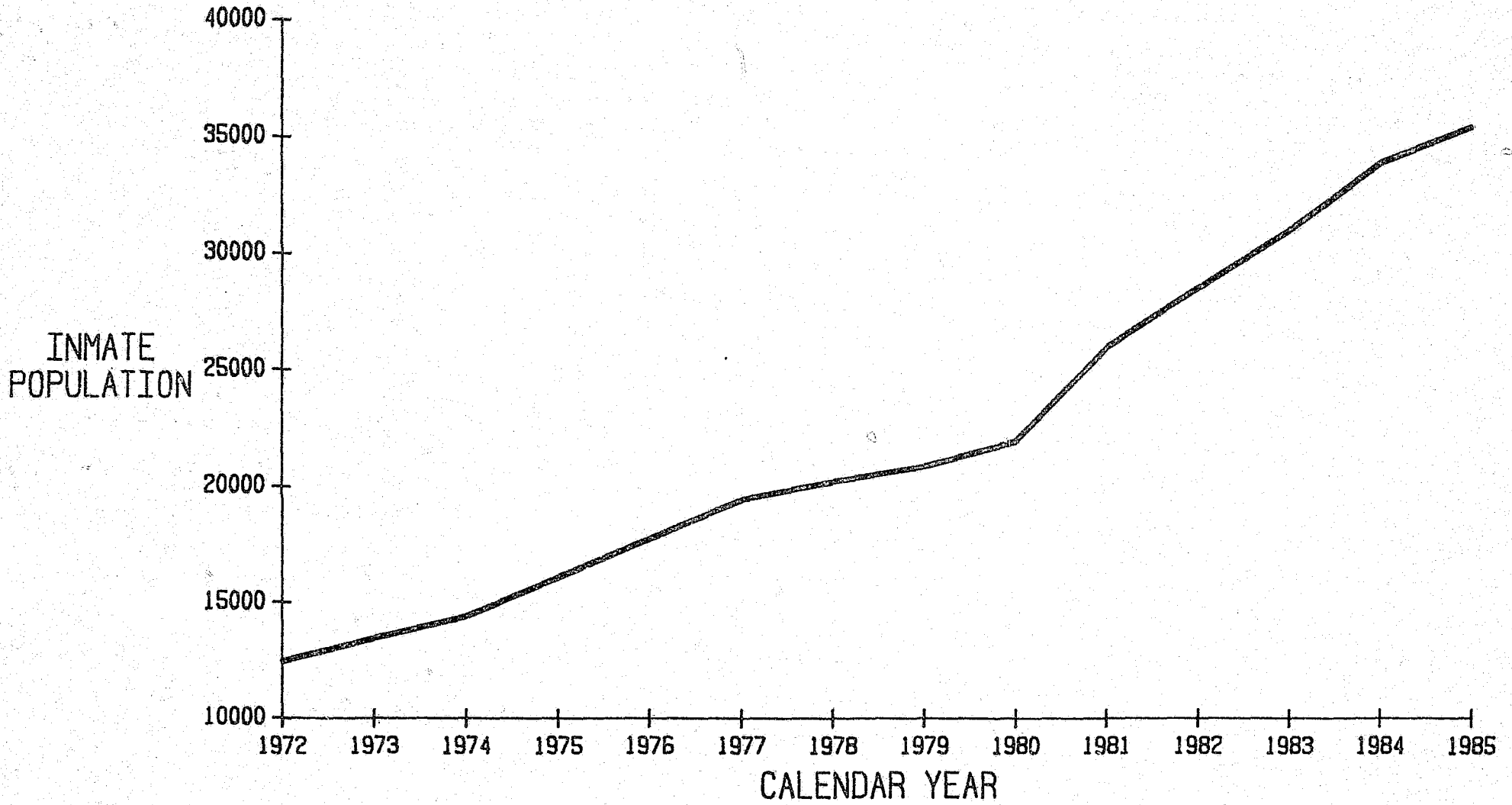

AT CALENDAR YEAR END: 1972 - 1985



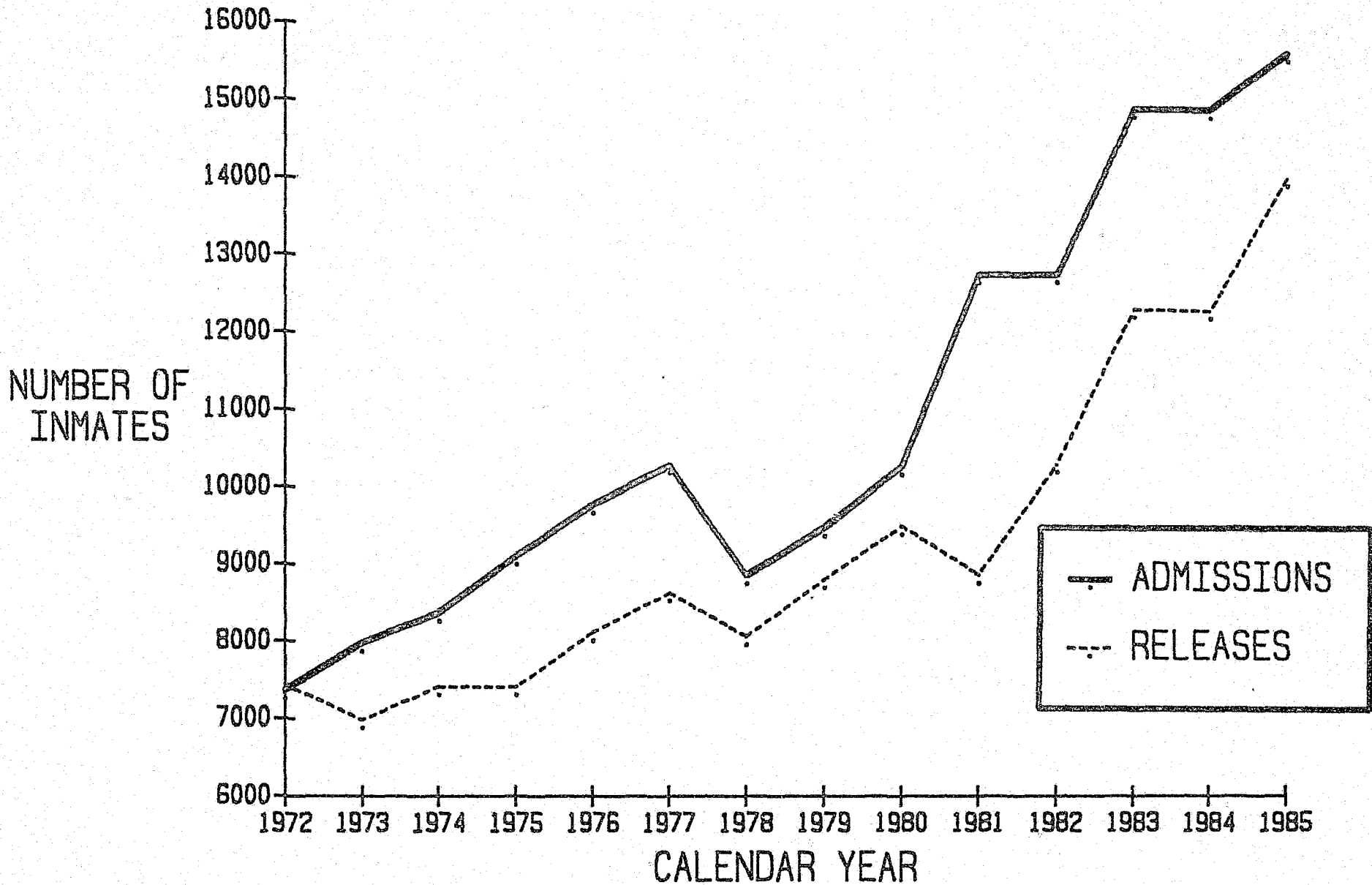
### Admissions to Department Custody

Admissions registered a steady rise from an annual total of 7,242 in 1971 to 10,272 in 1977. The number of admissions fell to 8,837 in 1978 but resumed an upward trend in 1979 reaching an all time high of 15,569 in 1985. The high number of 1976 and 1977 admissions reflected efforts by the Office of Court Administration to reduce a large backlog of felony cases pending before the Supreme Court which resulted in a temporary acceleration of the already high and rising rate of court commitments. Similar efforts in 1981 and 1983 have contributed to a continued rise in commitments which reach an all time high of 12,536 in 1983. Court commitments account for eight of ten admissions and trends in this category largely shape the flow of offenders into State prisons. Court commitments declined to 4,250 in 1970. From this 1970 low, commitments have risen to the high of 12,536 in 1983, an increase of 195.0 percent. This volume of commitments remained relatively unchanged in 1984 and 1985. Beginning in 1971, felony commitments rose rapidly, offsetting declines in other types of commitments. Contributing to this trend has been a rise in felony arrests, indictments and court dispositions and an increasing tendency of the courts to commit convicted felons to state correctional facilities. Several more stringent laws enacted in 1973 and subsequent years have added to this increase in commitments. These include the Second Felony Offender Law, which has imposed mandatory indeterminate sentences on such offenders; a drug law which has imposed harsher penalties on drug offenders; and the law imposing mandatory indeterminate terms for all Class B felonies and for certain Class C and D felonies. The trend toward a high level of court commitments has continued through 1985 reflecting also the impact of the violent felony offender legislation which became effective in September 1978.

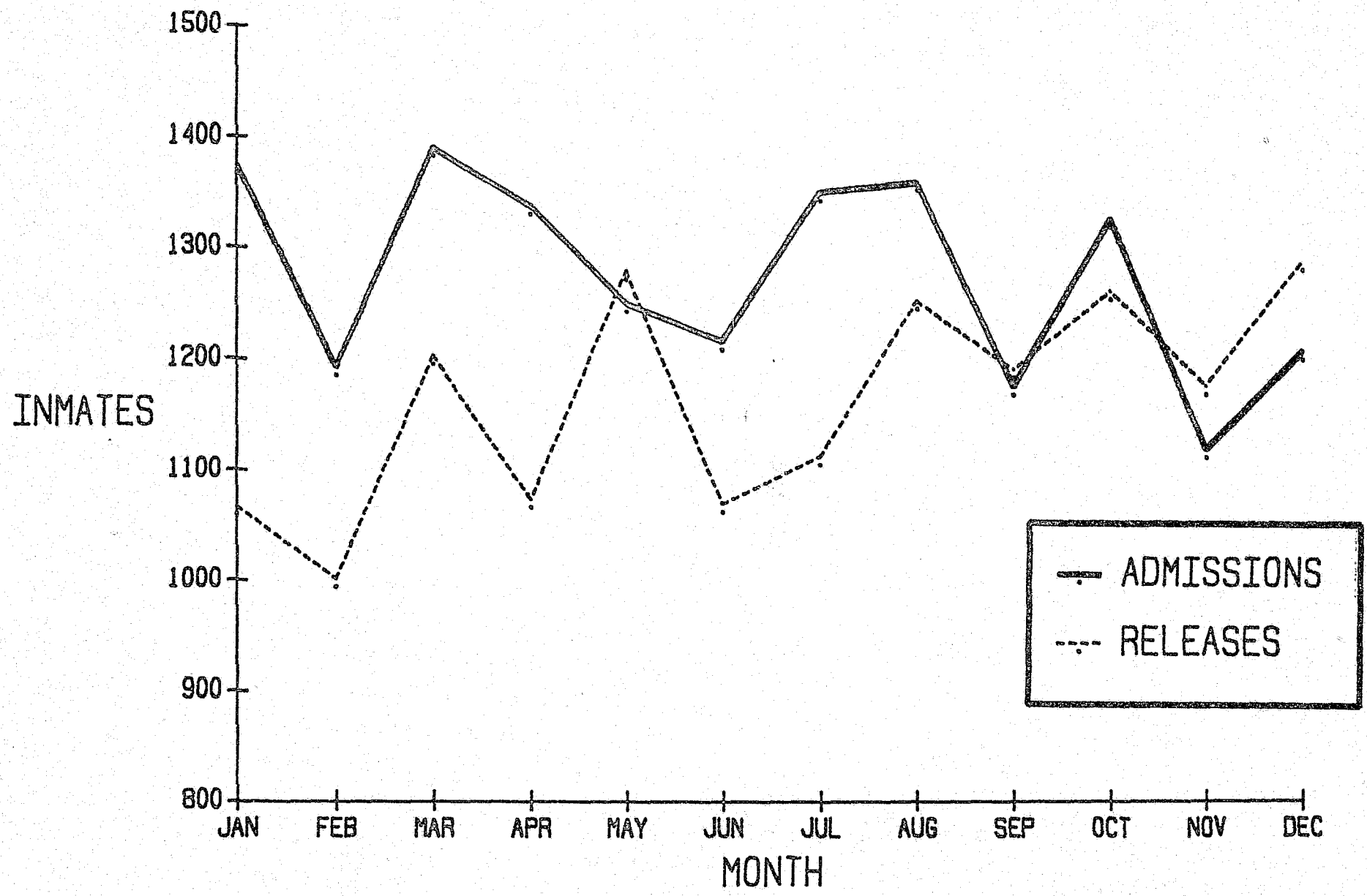
### Releases from Department Custody (Exhibit 3)

Releases from DOCS custody remained relatively stable during the five year period, 1971-1975, averaging 7,285 annually. In 1976 a sharp rise in releases is observed, up 10% over the previous year. This substantial rise reflected a growth in the pool of parole eligible inmates in the burgeoning inmate population who were subsequently released to parole supervision. 1978 saw a temporary drop in releases which reflected longer minimum periods of incarceration being set by the Board of Parole and a modest shift toward longer sentences on the part of the courts, both of which lessened the number of paroles. Releases for 1979 and 1980 resumed an upward trend, including all time high volumes of parole and conditional releases. A decline in 1981 releases reflects both sentencing changes under the Violent Felony Offender Law as well as change in the manner in which the minimum period of incarceration was determined for a considerable portion of the inmate population. Releases resumed their upward trend in 1982 and 1983, leveling off in 1984, and reaching an all time high of 13,966 in 1985.

### Reason for Commitment

Of the 12,410 offenders committed during 1985 to custody of the Department of Correctional Services, 44.9% (5,576) were sentenced as second or persistent felony offenders. A small portion of the commitments, 275 or 2.2% were sentenced as Youthful Offenders.

The majority (53.9% or 6,993) of the 1985 commitments had been convicted of crimes designated in the penal law as Violent Felony Offenses (VFO). Of these VFO commitments, 39.6% (2,770) had been sentenced as second felony offenders. Commitments for robbery led the VFO group followed by crimes of burglary, dangerous weapons, homicide, assault, and sex crimes.

Among commitments for other felonies, 54.6% (2,806) had been sentenced as second felony offenders. Of these 5,142 other felonies, there were 659 commitments for offenses involving violence or coercion. The largest single category in this group was robbery 3rd, which accounted for 306 commitments of whom 65.4% (200) were second felony offenders.

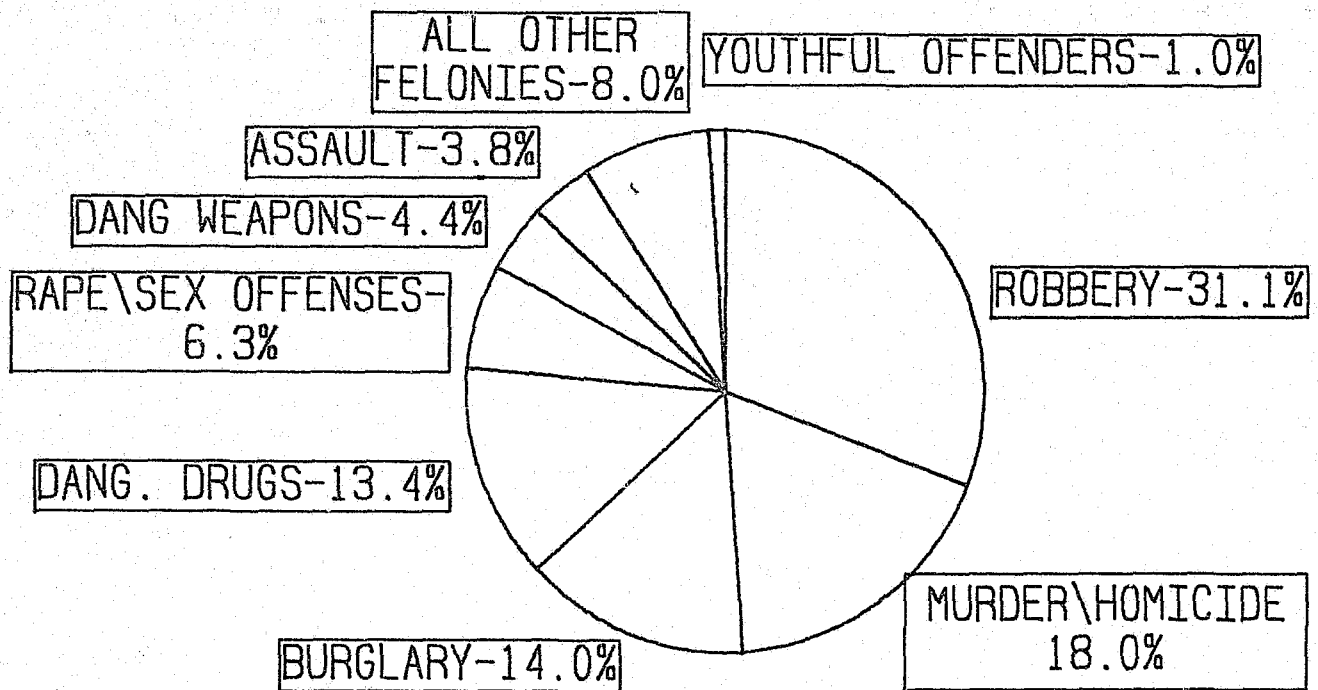
The remaining 4,483 other felony offenders had been committed for various property, drug and other crimes. Drug felonies was the largest category in this group with 2,218 commitments (17.9% of all commitments). The proportion of second felony offenders among drug commitments was 43.8% (972) while the proportion among the 2,192 property offenders (burglary 3rd, grand larceny, forgery, stolen property and other) was 66.1% (1,498).

COMMITMENT OFFENSE: DECEMBER 31, 1985



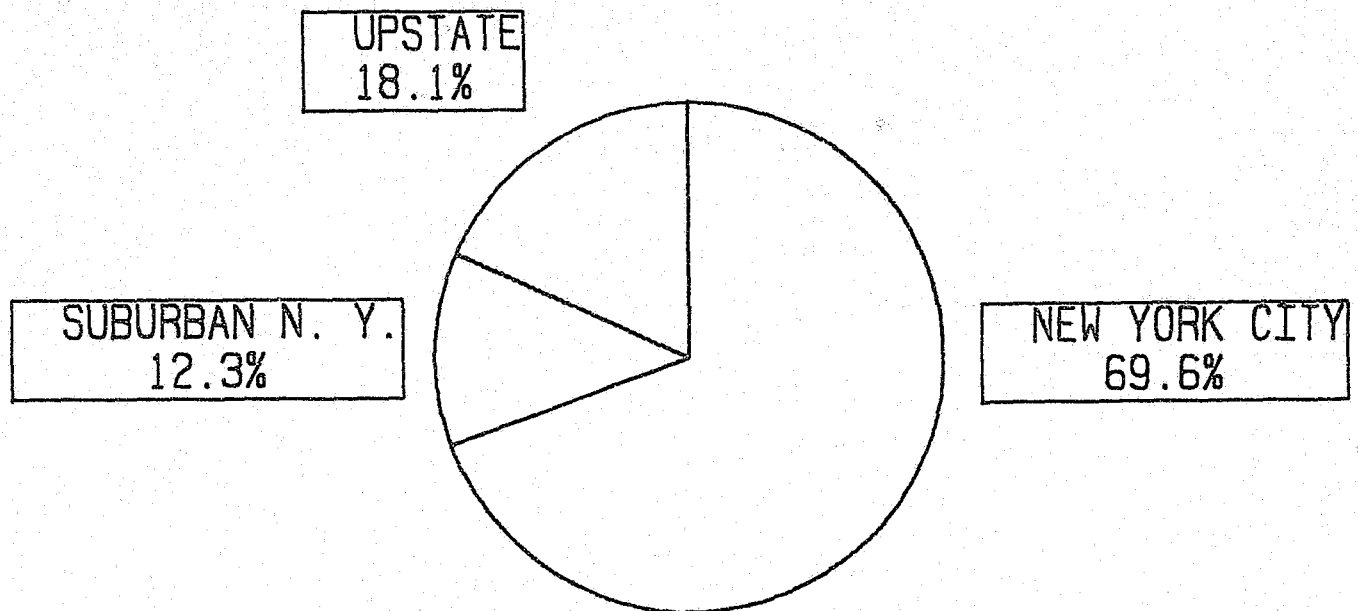

GEOGRAPHIC AREA OF COMMITMENT: DECEMBER 31, 1985

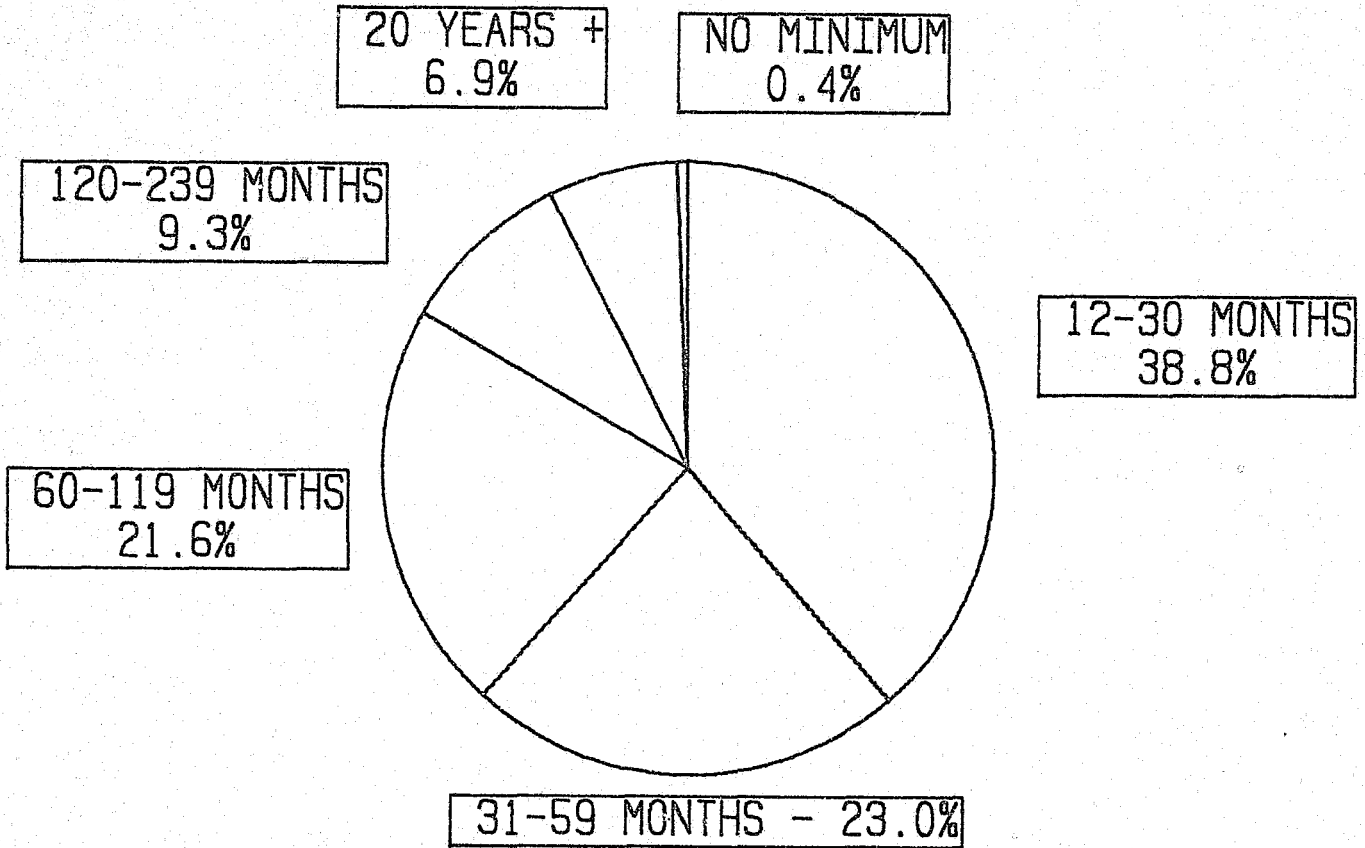

MINIMUM SENTENCE: DECEMBER 31, 1985

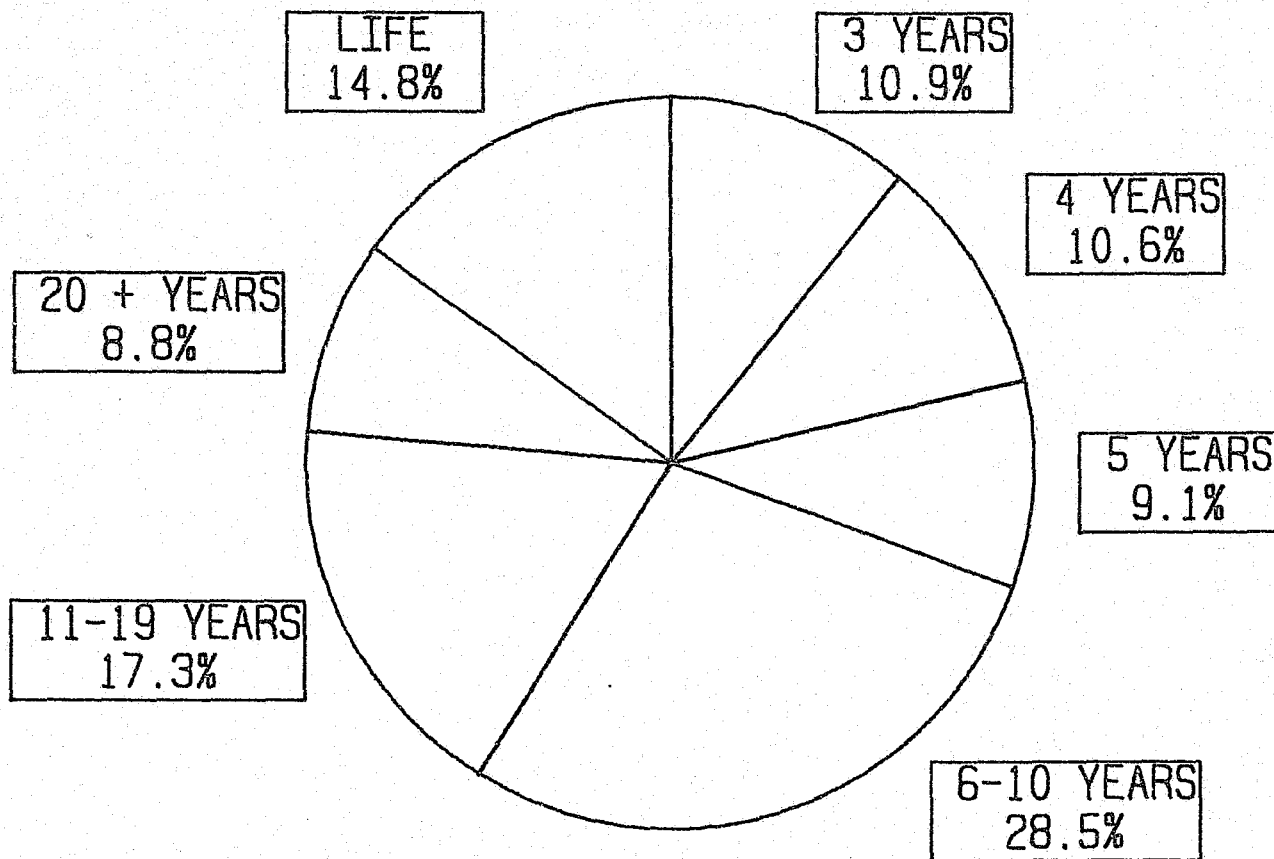

 MAXIMUM SENTENCE: DECEMBER 31, 1985

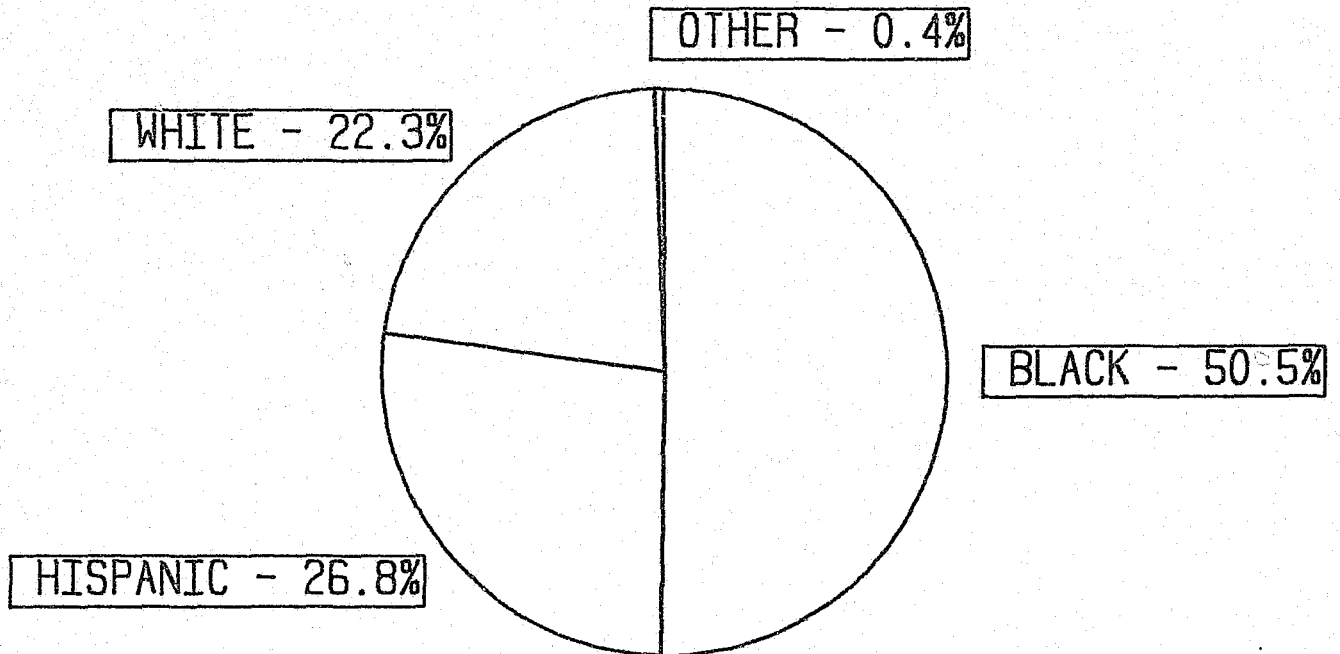

ETHNIC GROUP: DECEMBER 31, 1985

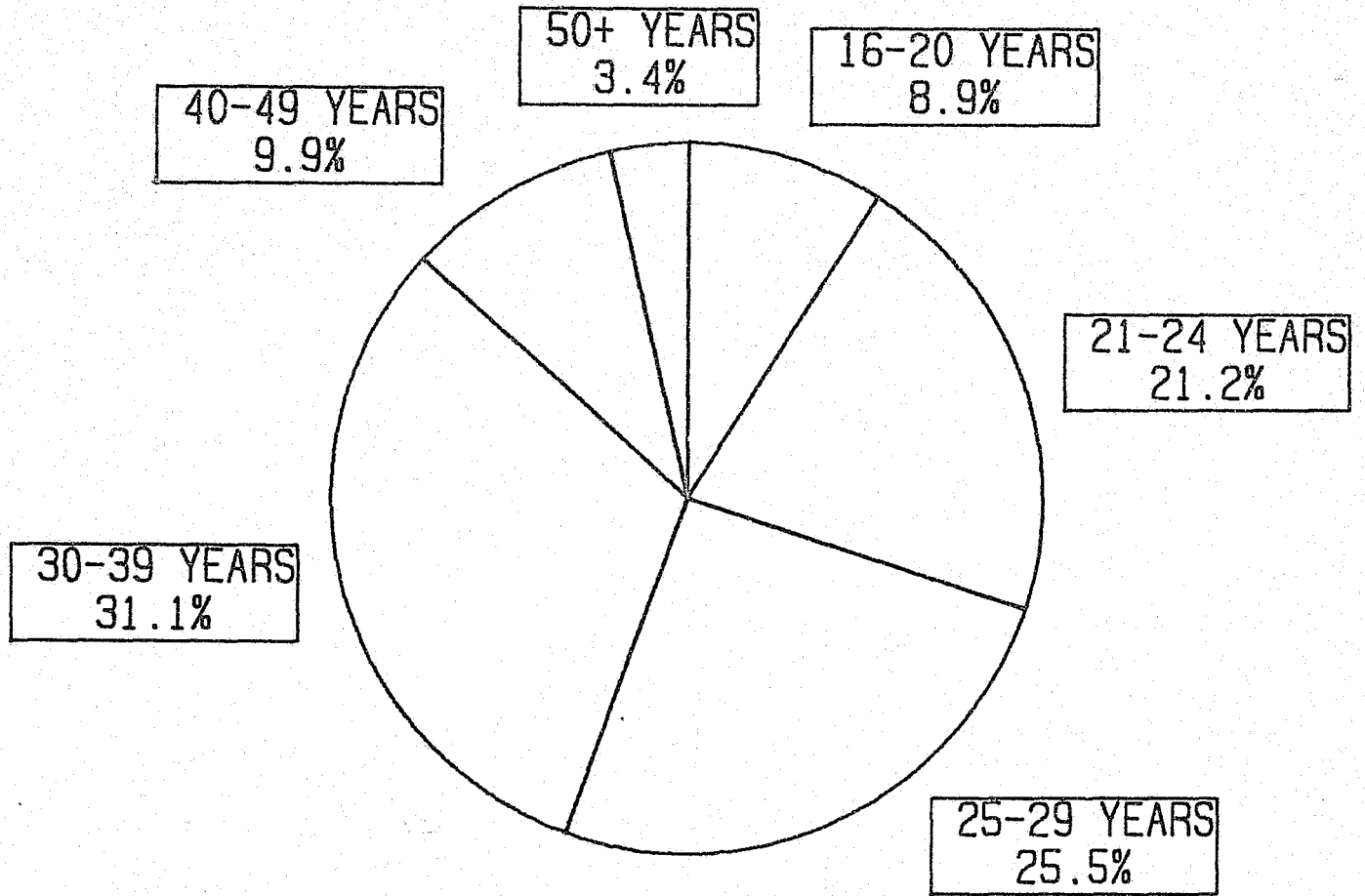

AGE: DECEMBER 31, 1985

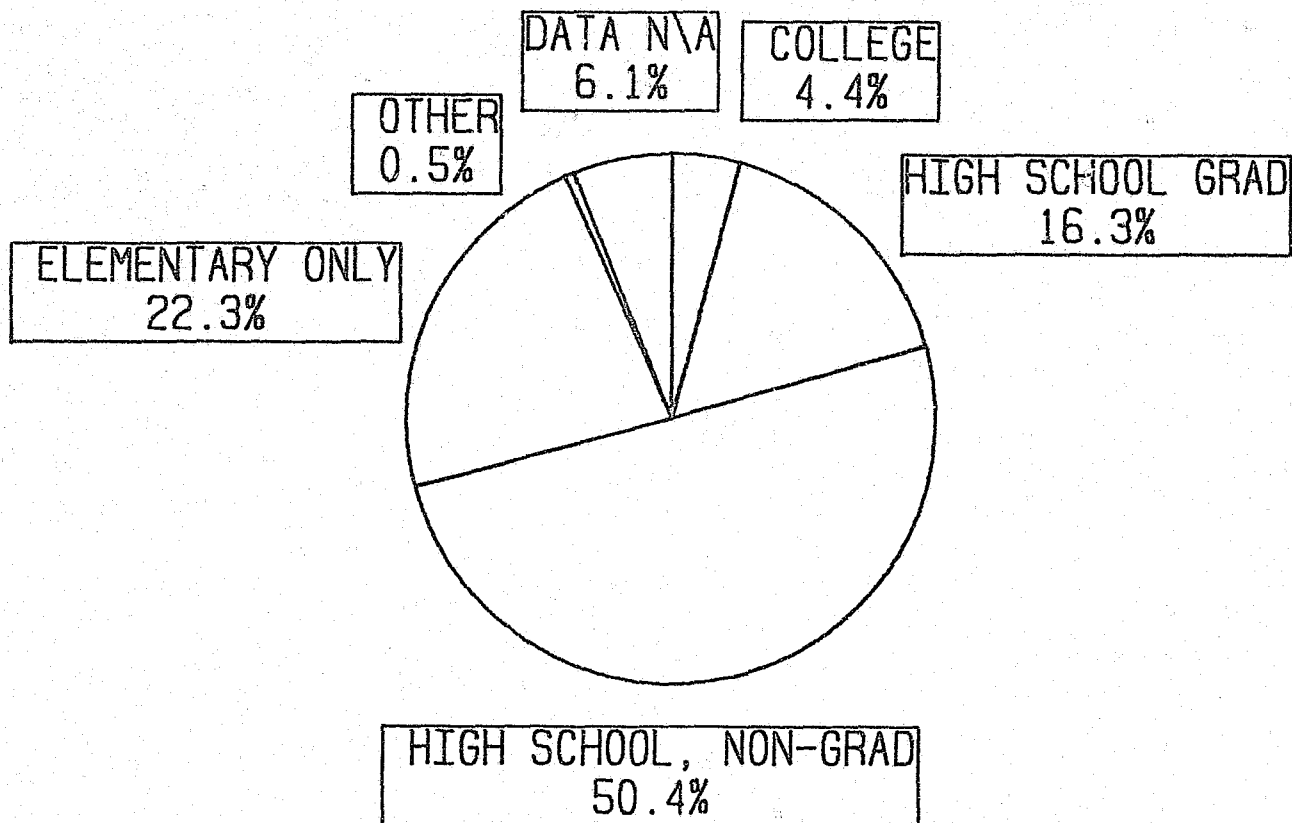

## NEW YORK STATE COMMISSION OF CORRECTION

The State Commission of Correction is charged in its legislative mandate, under Article 3 of the Correction Law, with general oversight responsibilities for the prisons, jails, and local police department lockups in the State of New York. The aim of this mandate is the improvement of correctional facility administration and thus, the improvement of conditions which affect the lives, safety, and security of inmates and staff within these facilities.

To fulfill its mandate, the Commission has identified four major goals toward which its oversight activities are directed. These goals are to:

1. Guarantee the just and humane treatment of all persons confined in correctional facilities.
2. Promote a safe and secure correctional environment for inmates and staff.
3. Improve the administration, operations, and programs of facilities and provide direction to the State and local correctional system.
4. Guarantee that the State Commission of Correction carries out its mandate through monitoring, facility development, advocacy, and the formulation of policy.

The Commission of Correction is part of the Executive Department of State Government. It consists of three members, appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate for specific terms of office. The Governor designates one Commissioner to serve as Chairman. The other two Commissioners serve respectively as Chairman of the Medical Review Board and Chairman of the Citizens' Policy and Complaint Review Council. The Chairman is the Executive Officer of the Commission, the Board, and the Council.

The Commission of Correction is legislatively mandated to investigate, review, amend and enforce standards for safe, sanitary, and orderly settings in all correctional facilities in the State of New York (State, Counties, Villages, Towns, New York City, and other Cities), for both staff and inmates. To assist in this effort, the Commission offers technical assistance to facilities and agency administrators through the provision of basic and in-service training for correctional personnel. The Commission approves, and when appropriate, assists in the development of proposed new construction and serves as a central repository for information on the correctional system in New York State.

STATISTICAL PROFILES OF NEW YORK STATE CORRECTIONAL POPULATIONS  
1980-1985

In April of 1980, the Commission of Correction began to record the inmate population in correctional facilities operated by the counties, the State Department of Correctional Services, and the New York City Department of Correction. At the time of this first survey, the total incarcerated population was 33,433. Of this number 5,403 were in county facilities, 7,060 were in New York City facilities and 20,970 were in State facilities.

A similar census was undertaken in November 1980 by the Commission's Program and Policy Analysis Unit, the agency's predecessor to OPPA. According to this census, the State's inmate population had swelled in seven (7) months time to 36,361 with the greatest rate of growth (19.9%) shown in New York City facilities. The counties experienced a 13.7% increase, and the State a 3.9% increase.

During 1981, the populations at nearly all correctional facilities continued to expand. The State and New York City increased their general housing areas through renovation, new construction, and use of temporary facilities. The State Department of Correctional Services reported an increase in general housing of over 3,000 and New York City reported space for an additional 2,000 inmates. County correctional facilities showed only a marginal increase in their capacities.

In November of 1981, each county in the State was contacted again by the staff of Program and Policy Analysis. Information, together with material from the State and New York City facilities, indicated that there were over 5,000 more persons incarcerated in November of 1981 than in November of the previous year. The largest contributing factor was the increase in the State facilities (16.6%) versus those for local (4.6%) and New York City (13.1%).

These increases in population have been consistent across local, State and New York City Correctional Facilities for the years 1982-1985 as well.



Table I depicts the extent of change that has occurred on a two (2) year basis for the years, 1980-1982, 1982-1984, and 1985.

As indicated in this table, State correctional facilities experienced the greatest rate of increase over these five (5) years, with their population rising from 21,748 in 1980 to 35,639 in 1985 or a 64% increase. Local correctional facilities showed the smallest rate of increase (24%) as their populations expanded from 6,146 in 1980 to 7,650 in 1985. New York City Correctional Facilities showed an increase in their daily prisoner population of 3,565 from November 1980 to November 1985, a 42% increase over these years.

### ADMISSIONS TO JAILS AND PENITENTIARIES

There were 121,297 admissions to local correctional facilities during 1985. The following table provides a comparison of reported total admissions for the past seven years.

From 1979 to 1985 total reported annual admissions to jails and penitentiaries rose an absolute 16%.

This increase in prisoner populations has had an adverse effect on the spatial and operational logistics of county correctional facilities. Extensive use of substitute jails to house prisoners another county jail cannot accommodate, and conversion of some program/services space for housing space, are examples of logistical problems created by the increase populations.

#### COMPLAINTS FROM DOCS INMATES

A total of 1,650 complaints were received by the Commission from inmates in State correctional facilities in 1985. This number of complaints represented a decrease of 6% over the 1,757 received in 1984. A large number of complaints focused on alleged harassment and misconduct of staff toward inmates. Other concerns which were frequently the subject of complaint letters were facility transfers, disciplinary action, packages, property and correspondence.

In 1985, the Commission adopted a policy statement which calls for the Commission to direct DOCS inmates to utilize existing administrative remedies for their problems and concerns rather than requesting the Commission to investigate these matters. It is the Commission's position that the Commission should support the operation of existing administrative remedies rather than serve as an apparent option to these programs. The Commission, notwithstanding, reserves the right to investigate any complaint or concern in which it deems that its action may be warranted.

It is further the policy of the Commission to review and analyze all inmate complaints in order to identify any trends or patterns which suggest faulty or systemic problems which would warrant action by the Commission. In 1985, Commission staff conducted special follow-up action into approximately 5% of all complaints and took whatever action was deemed appropriate.

#### COMPLAINTS FROM INMATES IN LOCAL CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES

In 1985 a total of 1,068 complaints were received by the Commission from inmates in local correctional facilities. This figure represented an increase of 9% over the 976 received in 1984.

The largest single number of complaints concerned alleged staff misconduct. Other major areas of concern were disciplinary action, housing conditions and recreation.

It is the policy of the Commission to direct inmates to utilize existing administrative remedies to resolve their problems before bringing matters to the attention of the Commission. Where local facilities have no formal complaint procedure the Commission will take the necessary steps to investigate inmate concerns.

In 1985, Commission staff conducted other than routine follow-up action into approximately 25% of all complaints filed and took whatever action was deemed appropriate.

#### GRIEVANCE APPEALS RECEIVED FROM DOCS INMATES

In 1985, the Commission received 1,672 grievance appeals from DOCS inmates. This figure reflected a 23% increase over the 1,271 received in 1984. Since 1982, the number of grievance appeals received has grown from 488, a cumulative increase of 343%.

The most commonly grieved subject concerned inmate property and package room practices. Other major categories included staff conduct, job assignments, pay grades, security and supervision, correspondence and discipline.

Staff analysis also found that the Attica Correctional Facility and the Clinton Correctional Facility account for approximately 60% of all grievance appeals received by the Commission. Staff's review of the grievance appeal workload at the Commission over the last few years was a major factor in the Commission's decision to conduct a special audit of the Inmate Grievance Program in 1985.

Commission staff review each grievance appeal and, according to law, issue a recommendation that the appeal be accepted or rejected. The Commission's recommendation is then forwarded to the DOCS Commissioner for final action.

#### GRIEVANCE APPEALS RECEIVED FROM INMATES IN LOCAL CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES

In 1985, the Commission received 130 grievance appeals from inmates in county correctional facilities which operate formal complaint/grievance programs. (Minimum standards do not require county correctional facilities to operate formal complaint/grievance programs, although they are strongly encouraged to do so). The number received in 1985 reflects a 9% increase over the 113 received in 1984.

Major areas of concern expressed by inmates regarded staff conduct, personal property, discipline and correspondence.

Commission staff examine each appeal and prepare a recommendation as to its disposition. Staff recommendations are forwarded to the Commission's Citizens' Policy and Complaint Review Council for action. A final action is then taken by the Commission.

## DOCS UNUSUAL INCIDENT REPORTS

The DOCS provides the Commission with summaries of Unusual Incident Reports which are called in by facilities to the DOCS Communications Control Center. In 1985, nearly 1,000 Unusual Incident summary reports were forwarded to the Commission for review and possible action. Commission staff reviewed all summary reports to identify particular trends or patterns in the occurrence of highly unusual incidents. Upon review and analysis of all such incidents, staff take whatever action may be deemed appropriate.

## UNUSUAL INCIDENT REPORTS FROM LOCAL CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES

In 1985, the Commission received 588 Unusual Incident Reports from local correctional facilities. This accounted for a 24% increase in reported Unusual Incidents over the 471 reported in 1984. According to Commission minimum standards, local correctional administrators are required to notify the Commission when an Unusual Incident occurs as defined in the standard. Major categories of incidents included attempted suicides, inmate assaults, use of force by staff and self-inflicted injuries.

Staff reviews all incident reports and conducts necessary follow-up activities. Such activities run the gamut from administrative close-outs to advisory letters to the conducting of special investigations and issuance of investigation reports.

## MORTALITY REVIEW

In 1985, 237 deaths were reported, which represented a 25 percent increase in occurrences over 1984. When deaths attributed to the AIDS outbreak are factored out, a 12 percent increase over 1984 is seen. Table IV illustrates the 1976-1985 trend in mortality rates for all correctional facilities in the State.

Of the 237 deaths in 1985, 163 were in State correctional facilities, 17 in county jails, 11 in local police departments, 42 in the New York City Correctional System and four in New York City Police Department Precincts. Thirty-five were ruled suicides, 26 percent of all non-AIDS deaths.

The suicide rate for all facilities decreased six percent from 1984 to 1985, with state facilities posting a net increase of one, from five to six occurrences. The suicide rate for county jails decreased 33 percent, while police department detention facilities showed a 29 percent decrease.

Table V illustrates the trend in suicides in upstate county jails and police detention units for the years 1976-1985. This table also presents the same information for those facilities maintained by the New York State Department of Correctional Services, New York City Department of Correction, and New York City Police Department.

AIDS deaths continued to increase in correctional facilities in 1985. A total of 102 AIDS deaths were reported in 1985, a 50 percent increase over 1984. Table VI illustrates a trend in AIDS deaths in State correctional facilities for the year 1981, when the first AIDS death in a correctional facility was reported, to 1985.

## DIVISION FOR YOUTH

During 1985, 2,424 individuals were admitted to residential facilities operated by the New York State Division for Youth. Of these, 2,008 were first admissions having had no prior contact with Division programs; 286 were readmissions from aftercare; and 130 had experienced previous placements with the Division (Table VI).

For those youths adjudicated Juvenile Delinquents, Restrictive Juvenile Delinquents or Juvenile Offenders, the offenses of burglary, robbery, larceny and other thefts accounted for 69.4% of the admissions. Assaults and homicides were responsible for an additional 11.7% of the admissions for this group (Table I).

Among the 2,424 admissions, 12.2% were placed in secure facilities and an additional 18.6% in limited secure facilities. The largest category among admissions was cooperative/voluntary which accounted for 25.2% of the admissions (Table II).

Juvenile Delinquent adjudications accounted for 67.1% of the admissions and Juvenile Offender adjudications an additional 10.9%. Persons In Need of Supervision were responsible for 15.4% of the 1986 admissions (Table III).

Males made up 83.0% of the admissions and females the remaining 17.0% (Table IV). Table V which lists admissions by ethnicity, shows Blacks accounting for 47.2% of the admissions, followed by Whites at 36.5%, and Hispanics at 15.7%.

THE BOARD OF PAROLE

During the 1983-84 and 1984-85 fiscal years, the Parole Board conducted approximately 34,000 interviews and/or hearings in State correctional facilities to determine parole eligibility dates for certain inmates, the release readiness of eligible inmates to parole supervision and the re-release of parole violators, as well as other types of administrative hearings.

The number of release interviews conducted by the Parole Board increased from 16,274 in 1983-1984 to 17,464 in 1984-1985, a 7% increase.

The Parole Board granted release to 17,938 inmates during the last two fiscal years with a substantial increase in 1984-85. Release decisions were granted to 8,402 initial applicants during the two year period (inmates who became eligible for parole release after serving their minimum sentence from April 1, 1983 through March 31, 1985). Reappearance interviews resulted in 7,681 release decisions for inmates who were previously eligible for parole release, but were denied release and became eligible again. Re-release interviews for violators resulted in 1,829 inmates released to the community. Other release interviews resulted in 26 inmates being granted parole. The decisions rendered at the various release interviews are summarized in Table 1 below.

The community protection efforts of the Parole Board are reflected in a comparison of some of the characteristics of inmates granted and denied release at initial interviews. The comparison reveals that inmates who were denied release were more likely to have committed crimes involving the use of a weapon or the occurrence of an injury. Further, those who were denied release had more extensive prior records than inmates granted release. The effectiveness of the Parole Board's screening is demonstrated in greater detail in the table to follow:

## PAROLE OPERATIONS

---

### Institutional Parole

The Institutional Parole Officer plays a critical role in the inmate's transition from institutional to community life. The IPO serves in a bridging capacity between the inmate and the community, the inmate and the field parole officer, and the inmate and the Parole Board.

The role of the Institutional Parole Officer includes an assessment of the needs of each inmate and encourages their participation in programming, during incarceration, which meets these needs. Institutional Parole Officers conduct inmate group counseling sessions and Parole orientation classes for inmates. Additionally, they interview inmates, in advance of their Board release interviews, to gather information which is presented to the Board in summary reports together with recommendations as regards the granting or denial of parole release and the possible conditions of release.

After a parolee has been granted release, the Institutional Parole Officer continues to participate in Parole Board release planning through the Community Preparation Program. The Institutional Parole Officer provides the link between the institution and the community both through pre-release interviews conducted with inmates and through ongoing communication with the Field Area Office to which the parolee is to be released. These services are provided to both inmates who are released by decision of the Parole Board and to those conditionally released.

Finally, Institutional Parole Officers continue to participate on correctional temporary release committees which grant temporary work release, furloughs and other leaves of absence for good cause to inmates. The Institutional staff is involved in committees within the state's correctional facilities that give support and advice to drug and alcohol programs.

### Community Supervision of Parolees

Community supervision is at the heart of the Division's community protection mission. The Field Parole Officer is located in the community supervising offenders released from state correctional facilities. Community protection requires that Field Parole Officers adhere to strict supervision standards. Additionally, it is essential to ensure that parolees comply with the terms and conditions of release. When the conditions of release are violated, the Field Parole Officer must take appropriate action.

Presence in the community allows the Field Parole Officer to become familiar with the services and resources which the neighborhood contains. Through their familiarity with the surrounding community, the officer can expedite the reintegration of the offender by linking offenders with particular needs to relevant services.

There were 31,098 individuals under community parole supervision during fiscal year 1984-85, as reflected in Table 3 on the following page. This represented an increase of 3% over the previous year's figure of 30,309. Parole Board releases

from state correctional facilities increased from 8,967 during fiscal 1983-84 to 9,005 during fiscal 1984-85. Parole Board release practices, as reflected by the median time-served statistics, have remained very consistent over the years, and this year's figures continue to reflect that pattern.

Release interviews are done two months in advance, so that the number of actual releases is usually less than the number of inmates granted release by the end of a year. Moreover, inmates granted release in March, which is the close of the fiscal year, would be counted as releasees in the new fiscal year.

### Outcome of Parole Supervision

The primary goals of the Division of Parole are to assist offenders released from correctional institutions to adjust to community life, and to provide community protection by preventing these individuals from re-engaging in criminal behaviors.

Parole Officers carry out these goals by supervising parolees in the community, coordinating the delivery of available social services, and helping to motivate and guide the parolees towards a more positive lifestyle. However, one must realize that not all persons will abide by their conditions of release. The Division must, therefore, fulfill the goal of community protection by returning a violator to prison.

A violation of parole occurs when an individual under supervision violates the conditions of parole in an important respect. These conditions are agreed to in writing by an inmate upon release from prison to community parole supervision. They stipulate, for example, that if the releasee absconds from supervision or re-engages in criminal activity, his/her parole is subject to revocation. The individual may consequently be returned to prison following a series of due process hearings.

In the 1984-85 period, 12% of all parolees under supervision during the year were returned to prison by the courts for committing new crimes or by the Parole Board for violating the rules of parole (e.g., absconding, or illegal use of drugs). Table 4 provides a more detailed analysis of the parole success rate.

In view of the data in Table 4, the parole success rate can be measured in several different ways.

In terms of total number of parolees not returned to prison, the success rate was 91% in 1983-84 and 88% 1984-85. This result is an indication of the Division's overall performance in deterring parolee crime and reincarceration.

From the point of view of enforcing the rules of parole, parolees returned to prison for rule violations cannot really be considered "failures" in the same sense as those who were returned for new criminal convictions. For example, absconding from supervision is less serious than committing a violent offense. But, more importantly, a prison return based on a rule violation decreases the chances of a parolee being a threat to community safety. Given this, the success rate was actually 98% for fiscal year 1983-84 and 96% for fiscal year 1984-85.

Using the most rigorous definition of success, those parolees in an active reporting status, the success for 1983-84 was 75%; in 1984-85 it was 76%. This measure excludes parolees in either an incarcerative or absconder status. It is important to note that not all of these incarcerated or absconder parolees will have their parole revoked or even enter the violation process.

## CRIME VICTIMS BOARD

The Crime Victims Board (CVB), established August 1, 1966, compensates eligible victims who have: suffered a financial difficulty, been physically injured, reported the crime promptly to the police, and been adjudged as being an innocent victim.

The CVB is designated as the "payer of last resort". Compensation that the CVB is able to provide includes awards for: unlimited unreimbursed medical expenses; unreimbursed loss of earnings up to \$400.00 per week until a maximum amount of \$30,000 is reached; unreimbursed funeral expenses up to a maximum of \$2,500; the cost to repair/replace items of essential personal property up to \$500; and lastly, up to \$3,000 for vocational rehabilitation. As of August 2, 1985, Chapter 688 of the Laws of 1985 enabled domestic violence victims to receive awards for the cost of residing at or utilizing the services at a battered women's shelter. Also allowed under this new legislation is the payment of reasonable attorney's fees up to \$1,000 relative to the victim's claim before the board.

For fiscal year 1985-86 the CVB received 14,157 claims and expended \$7,813,274 exclusively for crime victims.

All New York State law enforcement agencies and officials who have direct contact with crime victims have claim forms and information brochures on hand to give out relating to the availability of compensation from the CVB. As public awareness of the CVB is heightened, it is anticipated that there will be similar increases in claimants during the next fiscal year.
