COUNTY DETENTION FACILITIES DAILY PRISONER POPULATION DATA ANNUAL REPORT 1987

I Executive Summary

Over the past two years the Department of Corrections has been involved in the process of collecting data by category on all of the prisoners housed in each long term county detention facility in Florida.

In 1986 the county detention system held an average of 21,036 prisoners on a daily basis. In 1987 the average was at 24,602 prisoners, representing an increase of 3,566 prisoners, or 16.4 percent over 1986. Although the daily average increased, the actual monthly rate of increase for 1987 was 9.8 percent less than was reported for 1986. The county prisoner population peaked in October for both 1986 and 1987 at 23,459 and 25,948 prisoners, respectively.

Categorically, prisoners awaiting felony trial constituted the bulk of the county prisoner population for both 1986 and 1987. In 1987 this particular category increased by 17.0 percent over 1986; while all other categories combined, increased by only 15.6 percent. This would suggest that on a state-wide basis, counties not only are holding prisoners charged with more serious crimes compared to 1986, but also housing them at an increased rate.

In terms of county detention facility prisoner incarceration rates per/1,000 general county population, the state-wide rate for all counties was at 1.923 for 1986. In 1987 the rate was at 2.073 prisoners, representing a 7.8 percent increase over the incarceration rate for 1986.

Since January, 1986 the addition of 4,938 new beds to the county detention system has had some positive impact on the problem of overcrowding, at least on a state-wide basis. However, in December of 1987, a daily average of 3,712 prisoners were reported to be housed beyond the rated capacity of forty-three long term county detention facilities.

Currently, twenty-three counties, fourteen of which have one or

more detention facilities rated over capacity, are involved in various stages of new construction or renovation of existing facilities. Completion of these projects will result in the addition of approximately 6,546 new beds to the system over the next three years.

Seven counties, five of which have one or more detention facilities over capacity, are now involved in the planning process. Should these plans eventually come to fruition, an additional 3,053 new beds will come on line over the next three years. Reportedly, at the present time, there remain seven counties with one or more facilities housing prisoners beyond rated capacity, that are not involved in either the construction stage or planning process.

In the event the 1987 average prisoner growth rate of 16.4 percent over 1986 increases at a relatively constant rate over the next three years, even with the above mentioned added 9,599 beds, counties will need approximately 4,000 more beds by the end of 1990 which are not now being planned for or under construction. Because of the aspect of unforeseen variables that may influence the statewide county detention population, considerable caution should be exercised when reviewing the above speculative bed projection. Many factors, such as, a number of the aforementioned additional beds in construction or planning may only be replacements; the duration of sentences; pretrial intervention; use of alternatives to sentencing; intervention by the courts; crime statistics, demographic influences; new legislation; and overcrowding in itself, may significantly impact the county prisoner population in either direction in the months to come.

II Introduction

Pursuant to Chapter 951.23 (2), Florida Statutes, the Department of Corrections developed the process for the collection of prisoner data from the administrators of all long term county detention facilities. Beginning in January of 1986 all sixty-seven counties were providing the required data on a monthly basis throughout 1986 and 1987.

The County Detention Facilities Monthly Report requires that each long term county detention facility maintain daily population figures for specified prisoner categories and to calculate the daily averages after the last day of each month prior to submission to the Department of Corrections for processing. Currently, these categories are as follows:

- The number of sentenced adult male and female <u>felons</u> housed per day to cumulative sentences of (365) days or more.
- The number of sentenced adult male and female <u>felons</u> housed per day to cumulative sentences of (364) days or less.
- 3. The number of unsentenced adult male and female prisoners housed per day who are-awaiting trial on at least one state felony charge.
- 4. The number of convicted adult male and female <u>felons</u> housed per day who are awaiting sentencing.
- 5. The number of unsentenced adult male and female <u>technical felony probation violators</u> housed per day pending disposition. Prisoners are only placed in this category if no other charges are pending. Once a probation is revoked and a sentence is imposed, the prisoner is credited in the appropriate sentenced felon category.
- The number of sentenced adult male and female <u>misde-</u> <u>meanants</u> housed per day to cumulative sentences of (365) days or more.
- 7. The number of sentenced adult male and female mis-

<u>demeanants</u> housed per day to cumulative sentences of (364) days or less. <u>Civil contempt and National Guard</u> AWOL cases are also placed in this category.

- The number of unsentenced adult male and female prisoners housed per day who are awaiting trial on <u>misdemeanor</u> charges only.
- 9. The number of convicted adult male and female <u>misde-</u> <u>meants</u> housed per day who are held awaiting sentencing.
- 10. The number of unsentenced adult male and female <u>techni-</u> <u>cal misdemeanor probation violators</u> housed per day pending disposition. Prisoners are only placed in this category if no other charges are pending. Once a probation is revoked and a sentence is imposed, the prisoner in the appropriate sentenced misdemeanor category.
- 11. The number of adult male and female <u>technical parole</u> <u>violators</u> housed per day pending disposition. If the prisoner is sentenced, awaiting trial, or awaiting sentencing on new charges, he or she is only included in other categories as appropriate.
- 12. The number of adult male and female persons housed per day pursuant to Part I of Chapter 394, "The Florida Mental Health Act", (Baker Act).
- 13. The number of adult male and female persons housed per day pursuant to Chapter 396, "The Comprehensive Alcoholism Prevention, Control and Treatment Act", (Myers Act).
- 14. The number of adult male and female <u>state inmates</u> that are housed per day who were transferred from a state correctional facility, as defined in S. 944.02. This category only includes prisoners from a Florida Department of Corrections Correctional Facility, who are in the County Detention Facility under contract or those who are temporarily in custody for any other purpose, and who will eventually be returned to serve the balance of an active state sentence. <u>Not included</u> <u>in this category are convicted and sentenced prisoners</u> not originating from a State of Florida Correctional

Facility who are awaiting transportation to a state correctional facility as new admissions. These cases are to be credited in the (365) days or more sentenced felon category.

- 15. The number of undocumented adult male and female aliens housed per day.
- 16. The number of adult male and female prisoners housed per day for jurisdictions other than the State of Florida, Florida Counties and Florida Municipalities. Included in this category are U. S. Marshal prisoners, U. S. Military prisoners and all prisoners held for other states.
- 17. The number of juvenile male and female prisoners housed per day after conviction as an adult on at least one <u>felony</u> charge (Chapter 39) who are sentenced to cumulative sentences of (365) days or more.
- 18. The number of juvenile male and female prisoners housed per day after conviction as an adult on at least one <u>felony</u> charge (Chapter 39) who are sentenced to cumulative sentences of (364) days or less.
- 19. The number of unsentenced juvenile male and female prisoners housed per day in pretrial status, charged as an adul* on at least one <u>felony</u> (Chapter 39).
- 20. The number of convicted juvenile male and female <u>felons</u> housed per day awaiting sentencing (Chapter 39).
- 21. The number of juvenile male and female prisoners housed per day after conviction as an adult on <u>misdemeanor</u> charges only (Chapter 39), who are sentenced to cumulative sentences of (365) days or more.
- 22. The number of juvenile male and female prisoners housed per day after conviction as an adult on <u>misdemeanor</u> charges only (Chapter 39), who are sentenced to cumulative sentences of (364) days or less.
- 23. The number of unsentenced juvenile male and female prisoners housed per day in pretrial status, charged as

an adult on at least one <u>misdemeanor</u> charge (Chapter 39).

- 24. The number of convicted juvenile male and female <u>misdemeanants</u> housed per day awaiting sentencing (Chapter 39).
- 25. The number of juvenile male and female prisoners housed per day as <u>HRS minors beyond the control of</u> <u>staff</u>.

In addition to requiring county detention facilities to breakdown the aforementioned categories by sex in the monthly report, administrators are instructed to only place a prisoner in <u>one</u> category. Prisoners with mixed multiple charges or those that may appear to fall into several categories are to be placed in the category representing the highest degree of severity. For example, a felony case also charged with a misdemeanor would be placed in a felony category.

This report will provide a brief analysis of the state-wide county detention facility prisoner population growth trends and will also offer comparisons between the reported county prisoner data for 1986 and 1987. It will also provide a brief analysis and comparisons of the state-wide categorical trends and the incarceration rates for both years. In addition, the report will address the problem of overcrowding, individual county prisoner population data and the prisoner capacity status for all long term county detention facilities as of December 31, 1987.

III <u>A Comparison of Daily Prisoner Average Growth Trends for 1986</u> and 1987

The three following trend charts provide comparisons between the monthly growth patterns for all county prisoners as well as a breakdown for male and female prisoners for 1986 and 1987. Of interest, the reported daily population averages for all county prisoners peaked in both years during the month of October and then declined during the months of November and December for both years. Although the average prisoner population increased by 16.4 percent in 1987 over 1986, the monthly growth rate was 9.8 percent less in 1987 compared to the rate in 1986. The average monthly

growth rate in 1986 reflects an increase of 347 prisoners per month while in 1987 the monthly rate increased by only 316 prisoners per month.

The daily average for male prisoners peaked in November of 1987 at 23,425 and then slightly decreased the following month. In contrast, the daily average for male prisoners in 1986 peaked at 21,353 in October, then declined slightly in November and decreased rather significantly to 20,293 in December of that year. Although the 1987 average male prisoner population increased by 15.4 percent over 1986, the monthly rate of growth was 21.7 less in 1987 compared to the rate in 1986. The average growth rate in 1986 reflected an increase of 297 male prisoners per month, while in 1987 the monthly rate increased by 244 male prisoners per month.

The daily average for female prisoners peaked in October of 1987 at 2,106 and then slightly decreased in November and dropped considerably to 1,939 female prisoners in December. A similar decrease in the growth pattern was reflected for these last three months in 1986. Although the 1987 average female population increased by 27.1 percent over 1986, the monthly growth rate was 11.1 percent less in 1987 compared to the rate in 1986. The average growth rate in 1986 reflected an increase of 50 female prisoners, while in 1987 the monthly rate increased by 45 female prisoners per month.

In summary, the data reported on a state-wide basis would suggest that since January 1, 1986 through December 31, 1987, long term county

detention facility population daily average for all prisoners has increased by 40.1 percent. Male prisoner figures increased by 37.3 percent and those for female prisoners increased by 75.2 percent during this two year period.

IV <u>Categorical County Detention Facility Prisoner Population</u> Trends for 1986 and 1987

The data in the above table reflects that the bulk of the county detention facility prisoners were held awaiting felony trial during both 1986 and 1987. For this particular category, up over 1986 were adult males by 16.1 percent; adult females up by 24.3 percent; juvenile males held as adults were up by 26.2 percent; and juvenile females held as adults were up 8.3 percent.

The housing of probation violators is also up considerably over 1986, with adult males up by 28.3 percent and adult females up by 42.4 percent.

Although it would appear that the category for adult males

housed as state inmates is up by 25.2 percent over 1986, this, for the most part can be attributed to the practice of the Department of Corrections housing 75 to 100 inmates in the county system under contract over the past year.

In addition to providing the previous information, the data in the foregoing table now offers a breakdown of technical probation violators by felony and misdemeanor for adult males and adult females. It also provides a breakdown for all adult and juvenile male and female misdemeanants serving cumulative sentences of (365) days or more and those serving cumulative sentences of (364) days or less. In addition, it now breakdowns juvenile prisoners sentenced for felonies, as adults, to cumulative sentences of (365) days or more and (364) days or less. Of particular interest, the data reflects that for the three month period the combined daily averages for felony technical probation violators was at 1,170, representing 4.5 percent of the total prisoner population. As for misdemeanor technical probation violators, the combined daily average was 628 prisoner, representing only 2,4 percent of the total.

Also of interest, the three month daily average for male and female prisoners serving cumulative misdemeanor sentences of (365) days or more was at 65 prisoners. This figure only represents 0.25 percent of the total prisoner population average.

During 1986 the state-wide incarceration rate was at 1.923 prisoners per/1,000 general population. In 1987 this rate has increased to 2.073, representing a 7.8 percent increase in rate.

Currently, eight counties exceed an incarceration rate of 3.000. It should be noted that the data reflects an extremely high incarceration rate for Hamilton County. This should not be concluded as alarming as it results from the housing of a number of prisoners under contract with the Florida Department of Corrections and the U. S. Marshals Service. There are several other counties experiencing an increased rate due to contracting bed space, but not to the extent of Hamilton County.

The above data reflects that even with the impact of 14.1 percent increase in the average county prisoner population from January thru December of 1987, the average number of prisoners housed beyond the capacity of overcrowded county detention facilities decreased by 0.9 percent. This was due to the addition of 2,090 new beds to the system and undoubtedly further impacted by such measures as pretrial intervention programs and the use of sentencing alternatives.

In 1986 the increase from January thru December in the average prisoner population was much greater (20.8%) and only 2,029 new beds were added to the system. This resulted in a 135.7 percent increase in the average number of prisoners housed beyond the capacity of overcrowded county detention facilities.

A total of 4,938 new beds were added to the system during 1986 and 1987.

The following twenty-three counties were involved in various stages of new construction or renovations of existing facilities as of December 31, 1987.

Upon completion of current construction and facility renovations and should planning come to fruition, it is anticipated that at least 4,631 new beds will come on line in 1988; 810 in 1989; and 4,158 new beds in 1990. However, some caution should be considered as some of the beds may only be replacements.
