ACQUISITIONS

In accordance with the provisions of Section 351-70, Hawaii Revised Statutes, we respectfully submit the Annual Report of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission for Calendar Year 1986. This is the Nineteenth Report and covers activities of the Commission for the period December 16, 1985 through December 15, 1986.

INTRODUCTION

A 43 year old man was shot to death as the result of an argument. The Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission awarded the widow \$10,000 for medical expenses and funeral-burial expenses.

While no monetary award can erase the physical and emotional suffering and painful memories these people and others like them experience, monetary compensation can help ease financial burdens thrust upon them and their families as a result of the crime committed against them. Even minor medical expenses can cause enormous hardship to victims unable to afford medical insurance. One day of work missed may mean the difference for some families between heating their homes and feeding their children. The death of a family's main or partial supporter can leave many families helpless. And, of course the astronomical cost of extensive medical treatment required by severely injured victims can strap the wealthiest of people.

Victims of crime have long been forgotten and ignored by the criminal justice system. While the judicial system goes to great expense to protect the rights of defendants by providing legal counsel, personal protection, housing and food, up until recently little had been done to insure - or even recognize - the rights of victims. Fortunately, many states have responded to this concern for justice by enacting victim compensation statutes. These laws provide a means for victims of crime to receive funds from the government for payment of medical expenses, compensation for lost wages, and in the case of deceased victims, aid to their dependents. The government payment of victims' expenses distinguishes these victim compensation programs from restitution programs which involve offender payments to victims.

Regardless of the reasons offered for their existence, forty five states, three U.S. possessions, and the District of Columbia have enacted legislation providing for compensation of victims of violent crimes under specified circumstances. Payment does not depend upon the arrest and conviction of the offender and there is no need for the claimant to secure a civil judgment.

Besides Hawaii, the following American jurisdictions and U.S. possessions have crime victims compensation program: ALABAMA, ALASKA, ARIZONA, CALIFORNIA, COLORADO, CONNECTICUT, DELAWARE, FLORIDA, GEORGIA, IDAHO, ILLINOIS, INDIANA, IOWA, KANSAS, KENTUCKY, LOUISIANA, MARYLAND, MASSACHUSETTS, MICHIGAN, MINNESOTA, MISSOURI, MONTANA, NEBRASKA, NEVADA, NEW JERSEY, NEW MEXICO, NEW YORK, NORTH CAROLINA, NORTH DAKOTA, OHIO, OKLAHOMA, OREGON, PENNSYLVANIA, RHODE ISLAND, SOUTH CAROLINA, TENNESSEE, TEXAS, UTAH, VERMONT, VIRGINIA, WASHINGTON, WEST VIRGINIA, WISCONSIN, WYOMING, GUAM PUERTO RICO, VIRGIN ISLANDS, AND WASHINGTON, D.C.

The statutes vary according to the legislative philosophy behind their enactment. Several are based on a social welfare policy, with financial hardship as the prime requisite to recovery, while others are formulated on the "out of right" principle, open to all who have been injured by criminal acts. A few allow recovery for property damage in addition to physical injury, while the rest provide for recovery only to the extent of physical violence. The ceiling in recovery also differs greatly, as do the monetary prerequisites to eligibility. All of the plans, however, have one basic and overriding principle in common - a concentration on the victim and his plight as a result of criminal acts.

Crime victims compensation programs cover a wide variety of expenditures relating to criminal injuries. Most programs provide for medical costs, loss of earnings, payments for loss of support for dependents of deceased victims, and funeral and burial costs.

In addition to these basic benefits, some programs offer reimbursement for rehabilitation training, reimbursement for the cost of replacing the services which the victim would normally provide to the family free of charge, replacement of certain medical devices such as hearing aids, eyeglasses, artificial limbs, attorney's fees, costs of psychiatric treatment necessitated by the crime, compensation for disability or disfigurement and, in some rare cases, awards for pain and suffering.

Although crime victims compensation programs are justified on humanitarian grounds, they also demonstrate the State's concern for the victim of violent crime; reduce the financial impact of criminal injuries; increase victim cooperation; and improve victim services throughout the State.

THE HAWAII PROGRAM

The workload of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission continues to increase. Besides the many claims accepted and/or received in the Commission office, there are literally hundred of letters and telephone calls inquiring about benefits under the statutes. Also, the Commission receives many inquiries and requests for information from persons in other jurisdictions. The requests for copies of our statute, annual reports, and other documents have often placed a strain upon the Commission's budget. Yet, the advantages of a cooperative interchange of ideas and materials far outweighs the financial inconvenience.

During the period December 16, 1985 through December 15, 1986, the Commission received 633 new applications. 346 claims were carried over from the previous year. Orders awarding compensation were issued in 509 cases, 96 applications were denied and 7 applications were withdrawn prior to formal hearings. Notwithstanding our efforts to process and complete more cases each year, the number of applications that must be carried forward for consideration in succeeding years continues to increase. As of December 16, 1986, there were 367 claims still pending. Details of the number of applications and orders are summarized in Table 1 of this part, and detailed in Appendixes A, B and C of this report.

The work of the Commission was accomplished at 65 formal meetings. Ten full days of hearings were held on the neighbor islands, and one hearing was held at the Oahu Community Correctional Center (State Prison) to accommodate three inmates who had filed claims with the Commission.

Awards in 1986 totaled \$512,561.58. While Appendix "A" of this report sets forth in greater detail a financial analysis of each award, Table 3 indicates the "average" of the awards. Statistical data for the period 1968-1986 may be found under Appendix "D".

An analysis of the 612 applications disposed of in 1986, by types of crimes, is set out in Table 4 below. As in past years, the assault cases far outnumbered all other crimes combined.

Section 351-63, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires the Commission to reduce the amount of compensation to the extent the applicant received any recovery from collateral sources. During the course of our hearings, the Commission reviews all payments received by the applicant from medical insurance, Workers' Compensation programs, Social Security, Veterans Administration assistance, Public Welfare assistance, etc. During the past year, recovery from such collateral sources amounted to \$575,485.05 and, accordingly, the Orders for Compensation were reduced by that amount. Table 5 identifies the various collateral sources considered by the Commission.

The Hawaii statute empowers the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission to determine reasonable legal fees. Whenever, an award is made to a claimant who is represented by an attorney, the Commission approves a fee commensurate with the services rendered and have due regard for the financial status of the claimant. In no case is the fee based solely on the amount of the award. Attorneys' fees cannot exceed fifteen percent (15%) and is paid out of the award.

In 1986, twelve (12) applicants were represented by attorneys. One attorney was paid \$200.00 while eleven (11) attorneys received no compensation because the claims were either denied or the Commission was unable to order an award for compensation.

The Commission still believes that lawyers are not needed in crime victims compensation proceedings. Frequently, all that is required is the filing of an application.

VICTIM BEHAVIOR (PROVOCATION)

In addition to determining financial need, the assessment of whether and to what extent victims' conduct contributes to their victimization is one of the most difficult aspects of determining eligibility for compensation. The intention of all victim compensation programs is to make reparations to innocent victims of violent crimes. Unfortunately, the situations in which many crimes occur involve alcohol, drugs and questionable behavior on the part of the victim. A large number of claims in a wide range of programs are reported to arise out of bar fights. In addition, a large proportion of claims seems to result from assault situations, where provocation is indicated.

Over one-third of the existing programs deny a claim outright when there is evidence of contributory misconduct. Those programs which do not deny the claim outright attempt to determine to what extent the victim contributed and then reduce the award accordingly.

Section 351-31(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides: "In determining whether to make an order under this section, the commission may consider any circumstances it determines to be relevant, and the commission shall consider the behavior of the victim, and whether, because of provocation or otherwise, the victim bears any share of responsibility for the crime that caused his injury or death and the commission shall reduce the amount of compensation in proportion to the amount of responsibility for the crime which caused the victim's injury or death; provided that if such proportion is greater than the responsibility of the person who committed the act or omission or in the case of more than one person, the aggregate responsibility of such persons because of whom compensation is sought, the commission shall not award any compensation to such victim."

This year, there were nineteen cases in which the Commission determined that the victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his or her injury or death. In thirteen of those cases, the Commission denied the applications entirely. In six cases, the Commission reduced the awards by various percentages.

JUDICIAL REVIEW

If a victim is dissatisfied with the disposition of a claim, either because it was denied or reduced to a lower benefit level, most programs allow for at least one appeal of that decision. Typically, the first level of appeal available to a dissatisfied claimant is reconsideration by the deciding authority, whether that was a Commission or an Administrator. In several states only reconsideration is allowed on appeal. In many states there are additional avenues of appeal available to the victim, if he or she is still dissatisfied after reconsideration. The procedure for appeal vary widely from state to state.

Section 351-17(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, reads: "(a) The criminal injuries compensation commission may, at any time, on its own motion or on the application of any person aggrieved by an order or decision of the commission, reconsider the order or decision and revoke, confirm, or vary the order or decision, based upon the findings of the commission."

Section 351-17(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides: "(b) Any person aggrieved by an order or decision of the criminal injuries compensation commission on the sole ground that the order or decision was in excess of the commission's authority or jurisdiction, shall have a right of appeal to the supreme court, provided that the appeal is filed within thirty days after service of an original or a certified copy of such order or decision. Except as otherwise provided in this section, orders and decisions of the commission shall be conclusive and not subject to judicial review."

During the year, eighteen requests for reconsideration were received by the Commission. Of the total, thirteen were given favorable consideration by the Commission while five requests were denied.

PERSONNEL

The Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission is composed of three (3) members appointed by the Governor with the consent of the State Senate. One (1) member of the Commission must be an attorney licensed to practice in the State of Hawaii.

In July, Governor George R. Ariyoshi appointed Mrs. Naomi Correa to fill a vacancy. Her term expires June 30, 1990.

Chairman Nobuki Kamida resigned in October to devote more time to his law practice.

Mr. Thomas Blondin, who was appointed by the Governor in November 1985, is the third Commissioner. His term of office ends on June 30, 1989.

The Commission is staffed by three persons: The Program Administrator, one Investigator, and a Secretary.

In January, the Commission will lose the services of Wilfred S. Pang, the Program Administrator. Mr. Pang has announced his retirement effective January 1, 1987. He has headed the Commission office since 1968 when the program was first established. During the nineteen years that he has been with the Commission, Mr. Pang has played a key role in the development and success of the Hawaii program. He has helped many states and Congressional Committees with crime victims legislation, and helped organize both the National and International Association of Crime Victims Compensation Boards and served as an officer of both organizations.

BUDGET

The Operating Budget for the Commission for FY 1986-87 totals \$104,392.00. The amount covers salaries for three employees, per diem for three Commissioners who serve on a fee basis, office rental, travel, materials and supplies, and maintenance costs.

RESTITUTION

Restitution is the act of repayment by a wrongdoer to his victim or the victim's heirs. The theory is that the criminal should do whatever it takes to restore the victim to the position that he or she would have been in if the criminal act had never occurred.

Restitution is based on the idea that a criminal act is primarily an offense against the individual victim or victims. The indirect harm to the State is of secondary importance. Therefore, the criminal has a debt to a specific victim, not a "debt to society".

Pure restitution, however, is at odds with the way the legal system currently views crime. Most of the restitution programs that are in existence today are a compromise between the ideal of having the criminal make his victim "whole" and the fact that the law still views the victim of crime primarily as evidence in the prosecution of the criminal.

Both restitution and victim compensation programs are aimed at helping the victim recover losses due to crime. But there are significant differences between the two remedies. Victim compensation programs operate independently of the criminal justice system. No arrest, prosecution, or conviction of the criminal is necessary in order for the victim of a crime to obtain compensation. The compensation for the victim comes from tax revenues and/or court fines. There are statutory limits to both the size of the award and to the types of losses that may be compensated.

Restitution programs, on the other hand, operate as a part of the criminal justice system. Restitution is possible only if the offender has been apprehended because restitution must come directly from the offender. Restitution programs are administered by the various components of the criminal justice system, including the courts, prosecuting attorneys' offices, and the departments of corrections, probation, and parole. There are no fixed limits on the amount of money that may be repaid through restitution, and restitution may be used to compensate victims for both property loss and loss due to injury.

The victim's role in obtaining restitution is not as clearly defined as it is in State compensation programs. In the State compensation programs, the victim takes the initiative in making the application, appearing at the hearing if there is one, and proving the extent of the losses that resulted from the crime.

In restitution programs, especially those which are operated as a condition of the criminal's probation, the victim is often at the mercy of the court. The victim is often not invited to comment upon the proceedings or to give his or her opinion of an appropriate form of restitution.

In order to arrange for restitution, a victim must devote a considerable amount of energy to encouraging prosecutors, probation officers, and judges to consider restitution as an alternative or an addition to imprisonment. The final decision will be up to the criminal justice officials involved, but a victim who makes his desire for restitution clear to these officials can be very influential.

The Hawaii Restitution Law was enacted in 1975. Since then, \$34,811.63 has been recovered by the Commission as a result of restitution by offenders.

CIVIL REMEDIES

A civil action brought by a victim has some advantages over both victim compensation programs and court-ordered restitution. The principal advantage is that the amount of money which the victim may be awarded in a civil action is generally much greater than the amount granted by either of the other two programs.

There are other significant advantages to a civil action against the offender. Victim compensation boards typically grant awards only for medical expenses that result from the victim's personal injuries. Certain other expenses are also covered, but property damage or loss is generally not compensated. No compensation is given for the physical or emotional suffering that the victim endured as a result of the crime and the total amount of compensation is limited to an amount which may be far less than the actual losses suffered by the victim.

Restitution orders, on the other hand, will cover property loss or damage as well as the medical expenses of the victim. However, restitution is not guaranteed in any particular case, and the amount ordered depends upon the judge's perception of how restitution will affect the rehabilitation of the criminal offender. A court will rarely order restitution if it would place financial hardship on the offender or his family, and even when it is ordered, the restitution may be only partial or nominal. Only actual losses are eligible for restitution. The pain and suffering of the victim is not a factor in determining the appropriate amount of restitution or a compensation award.

In a lawsuit against the offender, the victims may present evidence of all medical and property losses that were a consequence of the offender's actions. The fact that the offender may have to sell some of his property or otherwise undergo financial hardship to repay a victim is no defense in a civil proceeding. There is no maximum amount of recovery possible other than the amount of loss that the judge or jury believes was actually caused by the offender. Not only may the offender be liable for all injury and property losses, but also for the pain and suffering of the victim. In a civil lawsuit, the pain and suffering component may be the largest portion of the damages awarded.

Another advantage to a civil lawsuit is the victim's right to appeal a court's decision that the victim believes to be wrong. The victim may also appeal a judgment thought to be insufficient. When the victim sues the offender, both are true parties to the proceedings, so both have an equal right to appeal the decision.

Many victim compensation boards do not grant any right of appeal, and some of those which do have appeal procedures allow only a rehearing by the same board that made the initial decision. Orders of restitution given by criminal courts cannot be appealed by the victim because the victim is not a true party to the prosecution. The victim must sue in a civil action for additional compensation if dissatisfied with the amount of restitution ordered.

The Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission is subrogated to all the rights of any person to whom any payment is made under the Criminal Injuries Compensation Act to recover damages by civil proceedings. Since the inception of the program in 1967, \$32,072.71 has been recovered by the Commission as a result of subrogation.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR (1986)

LEGISLATION

Several bills affecting the Commission were proposed during the last session of the State Legislature. A significant action taken was the passage of S.B. No. 592. The Bill limits Commercial Exploitation of Crime. Many states have a provision in their statutes which requires any person who profits from the commercial exploitation of a crime which occurred in the state to pay to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Board or other agency responsible any money owed to the offender or to the offender's representative.

People love to read stories about the most horrifying and grisly crimes and there is currently a market for books about them. A good writer can make a fortune on such a book and there is nothing wrong with this - the public has a right to know about such things. However, there is something very wrong if the perpetrator of the crime is allowed to profit through royalties paid to him for his story, or for books written by him.

New York has enacted such an anti-profit law, and other states have envinced an interest in them. Familiarly known as the "Son of Sam" law because its passage was fueled by media speculation over the profits that might be reaped by David Berkowitz, the "Son of Sam" killer who murdered seven people, the New York law requires that all royalties and other emoluments received by a convicted criminal as a result of telling his story shall be put into escrow and shall inure to the benefit of the victim or his or her survivors.

Since 1977, at least seventeen (17) other states have enacted such so-called "Son of Sam" legislation. A similar provision is contained in the federal law.

Although the intent of the law is to prevent the offender from profiting from the crime, this law has not resulted in any substantial payments to victims in those states which have this provision. In New York, for example, since this law was passed in 1977, only one escrow account has been established.

FEDERAL PROGRAM

The Omnibus Crime package, signed by President Reagan on October 12, 1984, as an amendment to the spending measure continuing the operation of many federal agencies, established a Crime Victims Fund in the U.S. Treasury to be administered by the Attorney General.

The Victims of Crime Act of 1984, which is Chapter XIV of the Omnibus Crime Package, authorizes funding for State victim compensation and victim assistance programs from the Crime Victims Fund. Money for the fund comes from federal criminal fines, new penalty assessment fees, forfeited appearance bonds, collateral security posted by federal criminal defendants, and special forfeitures of collateral profits of crime. A \$100 million cap is placed on the amount collected that may be directed to the fund, with the excess to go to the U.S. Treasury. Approximately, \$70 million was generated in FY 85.

Fifty percent of the amount collected in the Crime Victims Fund in each fiscal year will be allocated to victims compensation programs in the states. The remaining 50 percent will be directed to victim assistance programs. Of the 50 percent earmarked for victim compensation, 35 percent will be used as match on the states' prior year compensation payouts, with the excess over the 35 percent added to the victim assistance allocation. The amounts not spent by a state or program in two fiscal years reverts to the fund. Compensation funds are earmarked for existing programs. The fund will sunset on September 30, 1988.

A state's eligibility for victims assistance funds is based on the Governor's certification that programs to assist victims of sexual assault and domestic violence are a state priority and that federal funds will not be used to supplant available state and local funds.

Hawaii received \$150,000 in 1986 under the Victims of Crime Act. The money was used by the Commission to pay 150 persons who were awarded compensation in 1986. Hawaii will receive \$165,000 in 1987.

* * * * *

In another move, on December 12, 1985, exactly fourteen months after he signed into law the Victims of Crime Act and Justice Assistance Act, President Reagan signed a federal budget measure that required the elimination of the

federal deficit within five years. The new law, commonly known by the names of its principal co-sponsors - Phil Gramm, Warren B. Rudman, and Ernest F. Hollings - threatens the continuation of any federal support for victim services.

There are published reports that the Victims of Crime Act is on some budget-cutters' priority list for reduction if not total elimination.

The Victims of Crime Act of 1984 is one of many federal programs targeted for drastic budget cuts by the White House Office of Management and Budget. In response to the Gramm-Rudman-Hollings Deficit Control Act, federal policy makers are deliberately attempting to sacrifice small programs to avoid automatic, across-the-board cuts to billion dollar defense and domestic programs. If Congress supports the President's proposal, the Victims of Crime Act will be crippled just as it is beginning to be implemented in the states.

Specifically, the Office of Management and Budget proposes to reduce Crime Victims Fund expenditures for Fiscal 1985 from \$100 million to \$65 million and to cap the Fund at \$35 million for Fiscal 1986 and Fiscal 1987. The program is slated for Congressional review in 1988.

CONCLUSION

The primary function of a government is to ensure that its citizens can live safely in their communities. Yet each year millions face the reality of violent crime and their lives are forever changed by these acts. Many are afraid to leave their homes after dark. Others are barricaded inside with multiple locks on their doors and steel bars on their windows.

The strength of our justice system depends, in large part, on the willingness of the innocent victims of crime to cooperate with it. Unless victims participate in the judicial process, society cannot punish criminals and prevent them from committing more crimes. While we need the help of innocent victims, they in turn deserve our support. They do not ask for pity. They ask only for our support as they recover from an unexpected, unwanted, and undeserved trauma.

We may reduce the frequency of violent crime, but we will never eliminate it. Every year millions of our fellow citizens will face it for the first time.

Fighting crime is primarily a matter for state and local authorities. But, federal funds and other aid can be an important help.

The Hawaii Criminal Injuries Compensation Act, enacted in 1967, is considered to be one of the finest and most interesting in the United States. First, Hawaii does not disqualify nonresidents. Second, there is no "serious financial hardship" or "need" provision in the law. Lastly, Hawaii is the only state that permits awards to be made for "pain and suffering" to all victims.

The stated purpose of the Hawaii Act is to aid victims of criminal acts by providing compensation for victims of certain crimes or dependents of deceased victims, and for indemnification of private citizens (good samaritans) for personal injury or property damage suffered in the prevention of crime or apprehension of a criminal.

The Act proposes compensation awards, not as a benevolent grant of funds to victims because of mercy or sympathy, but because of recognition of the fact that the government has a duty to protect its people from the consequence of criminal acts.

Since the inception of the program in 1967, the Hawaii Commission has made 4,330 awards totaling \$5,052,198.67, denied 1,398 claims and had 55 applications withdrawn prior to formal hearings.

Applicant is a 43 year old male who was assaulted by his employer. He sustained injuries to his head, arms back and neck. Because Workers' Compensation covered all of his expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

83-403 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 35 year old police officer who was shot in the right arm and stomach by a burglar. Because Workers' Compensation covered all of his expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

83-462

Applicant is a 54 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted by a police officer. However, the more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was asked by a policeman to return some personal belongings to another person and, when he refused, he was detained by the police officer. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of any of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

84-173

Applicant is a 25 year old male who alleges that he was the victim of an assault. However, there is insufficient evidence to support his claim. Applicant was injured in a fight. Because of insufficient evidence, the claim is denied.

84-290

Applicant is a 25 year old male who was injured but does not know how it happened because he was inebriated. Due to lack of evidence, the claim is denied.

84-332

Applicant is a 44 year old male who was shot in the head and chest while in the act of apprehending a criminal. Because Workers' Compensation covered all of his expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

84-336

Applicant is a 25 year old male who was shot in the left elbow while in the act of apprehending a criminal. Because Workers' Compensation covered all of his expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

84-367

Victim is a 3 year old girl who alleges that she was sexually abused by her baby sitter sometime in 1983. However, the incident was not reported to the police until a year later. Because the alleged crime was not reported to the police within a reasonable period of time, the claim is denied.

84-424

Applicant is a 31 year old male who was stabbed in the left forearm and chest while working at the McInerny Store at Ala Moana Shopping Center. Because Workers' Compensation covered all his expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

84-498

Victim is a 35 year old male who was found dead at the place where he worked. He sustained head injuries. Medical expenses and funeral and burial expenses were paid by victim's employer. There is no evidence to indicate dependency. Because Applicant, father of the deceased victim, did not have any out-of-pocket medical or funeral-burial expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

85-59 (Hilo)

Victim is a 21 year old male who was beaten to death. His body was discovered in the back of a truck abandoned by the suspect. Medical expenses were paid by the victim's mother. There is insufficient evidence to indicate dependency. Funeral and burial expenses were also paid by the victim's mother. Because Applicant, widow of the deceased victim, was not dependent upon victim for support and did not have any out-of-pocket expenses, the claim is denied.

85-66

Victim is a 20 year old male who was stabbed in the lower back by a customer in one of the ABC Stores. Because Workers' Compensation covered all of his expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

85-71

Victim is a 64 year old male who was assaulted at his place of work. He was struck in the head and sustained a skull fracture. Because Workers' Compensation covered all of his expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

85-106

Victim is a 53 year old male whose body was found near the Wilson Tunnel. He was hacked to death. There are no medical bills. Victim was employed by United Airlines at the time of his death. As a result of victim's death, Applicant, wife of the deceased victim, is now receiving a pension. Because collateral benefits received or to be received by Applicant exceeded the amount she would have received from the Commission, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

85-271

Applicant is a 19 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted by an unidentified assailant. However, he does not have any recollection of the incident. He merely thinks that the suspect punched him. Because there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of any of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

85-278

Applicant is a 37 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted. However, there is no evidence to support his claim. Applicant had an argument with a man and a fight ensued. Medical expenses totaled \$46 of which \$25.54 was paid by Medicare and \$8.06 adjusted by Medicare. Applicant is unemployed. Due to lack of evidence, the claim is denied.

85-286 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 17 year old female who alleges that she was sexually abused. However, there is no police report to substantiate her claim. Also, Applicant did not seek medical treatment. Because Applicant did not report the crime to police as required by law, the claim is denied.

85-305

Applicant is a 32 year old prison inmate who alleges that he had a fight with another inmate and was punched in the jaw. Lacking the name of the alleged assailant, prison officials were unable to determine the facts of the incident. Because there is insufficient evidence as to whether Applicant was the victim of an assault as claimed, the claim is denied.

85-350

Victim is a 5 year old girl who was raped by her babysitter in 1982. Because of late filing, the claim is denied.

85-352

Applicant alleges that she was raped by a man she met in Waikiki. Shortly after the alleged incident, she met another male in a restaurant and invited him to her apartment where they had sexual intercourse. Because there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

85-390

Applicant is a 40 year old female who was threatened. Because "terroristic threatening" is not one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

85-399

Applicant is a 21 year old female who alleges that she was raped. However, there is insufficient evidence to support her claim. Applicant did not cooperate with the detective assigned to her case. She was scheduled to take a polygraph examination and failed to show up. Because of insufficient evidence, the claim is denied.

85-401

Applicant is a 23 year old female who alleges that she was assaulted by another woman. The evidence indicates that Applicant had a fight with the accused as the result of an argument. Because there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

85-406 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 33 year old female who was assaulted by her estranged husband. She sustained a laceration on her throat area. There are no medical bills. Because Applicant is a relative of the offender and did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

85-420

Victim is a 42 year old female who was assaulted by one of her students. She is a teacher employed by the Department of Education, State of Hawaii. Because Workers' Compensation covered all of her expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

85-426

Applicant is a 34 year old male who was injured when he disregarded a pedestrian control signal and walked into a bus. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

85-432 (Maui)

Applicant is an 18 year old male who alleges that he was punched in the jaw in a scuffle. Applicant was intoxicated. Because there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

85-469

Applicant is a 42 year old female who alleges that she was raped. However, there is no evidence to support her claim. There are no medical bills, and Applicant is unemployed. Because of insufficient evidence, the claim is denied.

85-474

Applicant is a 30 year old female who alleges that she was raped by a cab driver. However, there is insufficient evidence to support her claim. Because of insufficient evidence, the claim is denied.

85-479 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 17 year old male who alleges that he was sodomized. However, there is no credible evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Applicant was not examined by a doctor. Because of insufficient evidence, the claim is denied.

85-508

Applicant is a 21 year old female who was stabbed in the neck in a robbery attempt. She was on duty at one of the McDonald Restaurants. Because Workers' Compensation covered all of her expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

85-513

Applicant is a 30 year old male who was injured when he fell from the second floor of an abandoned building. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

85-522

Victim is a 14 year old girl who alleges that she was raped. However, there is insufficient evidence to support her claim. Because of insufficient evidence, the claim is denied.

85-530 (Hilo)

Victim is a 16 year old girl who was raped by a counselor in a foster home. However, the crime was not reported to the police within a reasonable period of time. Because victim did not report the crime to the police without undue delay, the claim is denied.

85-533

Applicant is a 41 year old male who was involved in a fist fight. Both Applicant and the suspect were part-time Community College Instructors. Because there is insufficient evidence to support Applicant's claim that he is a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

85-534

Applicant is a 41 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. The evidence indicates that Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury. Applicant was intoxicated. Because Applicant provoked the fight, the claim is denied.

85-535

Applicant is a 21 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. However, he filed a claim beyond the 18 months statute of limitations. Because of late filing, the claim is denied.

85-559

Applicant is a 24 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted in a nightclub. The evidence indicates that he and his companion were heckling the performers in the nightclub, and when told to leave refused to do so and was removed physically by one of the entertainer's brother. Because Applicant provoked the act that caused his removal from the nightclub, the claim is denied.

85-562

Applicant is a 26 year old male who was assaulted as the result of an argument. However, he did not report the crime to the police within 18 months from the date of injury. Because of late reporting, the claim is denied.

85-564 (Hilo)

Victim is a 14 year old boy who was sodomized. However, he did not report the crime to police within 18 months from date of injury. Because of late reporting, the claim is denied.

85-584

Applicant is a 25 year old male who alleges that he was hit by a bottle thrown by another male. The evidence indicates that Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury when he picked up a stick and chased the suspect. Because Applicant provoked the fight, the claim is denied.

85-597 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 37 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted. However, the Commission has been advised by the Prosecuting Attorney, County of Hawaii, that Applicant is not the victim but is the suspect for whom a warrant has been issued for his arrest. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

85-602 (Kauai)

Applicant is an 18 year old female who was sexually abused by her stepfather. There are no medical bills, and victim is unemployed. Because Applicant is a relative of the offender and did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the claim is denied.

85-603

Applicant is a 53 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted and sustained a fractured right forearm. According to several persons who witnessed the incident, Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury. He was assaulted after he punched the suspect in the jaw. Because Applicant provoked the fight, the claim is denied.

85-608

Applicant is a 29 year old female who was assaulted by her brother. She sustained lacerations of the scalp. Medical expenses totaling \$139.36 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, DSSH, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant was injured by a relative and did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the claim is denied.

85-614 (Hilo)

Applicant alleges that she was assaulted by several men. However, there is no evidence to support her claim. She was drinking in a Bar and was loud and abusive. When asked to quiet down, she continued to be boisterous and obnoxious and was physically removed from the Bar. Applicant was intoxicated. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

85-618

Applicant is a 37 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted. He was found intoxicated on the roof top of a Shopping Center. There is no police report covering the alleged incident. Because Applicant did not report the alleged crime to police as required by law, the claim is denied.

85-621

Applicant is a 51 year old male who was injured when a car brushed against his bicycle causing him to fall to the ground. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

85-631

Applicant is a 25 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted by a Bouncer at the Jazz Cellar and sustained injuries to his eye. However, the alleged crime was not reported to the police as required by law. Because Applicant did not report the crime to the police as required by law, the claim is denied.

85-642

Applicant is a 43 year old female who was assaulted by her husband. She sustained injuries of the right thumb and index finger. There are no medical bills, and Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant is a relative of the Offender and did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

86-9 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 39 year old male who was assaulted and sustained a broken nose. However, he did not report the crime to the police until four months later. Because Applicant did not report the crime to the police without undue delay, the claim is denied.

86-18

Applicant is a 27 year old male who alleges that he was cut in the left forearm with a knife. However, there are no medical reports to support his claim. Applicant was intoxicated and refused to tell the police what really happened. Because there is insufficient evidence to support Applicant's claim that he is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

86-23

Applicant is a 23 year old male who was hit on the head by an acquaintance. He had been drinking at a party at a public beach park. When Applicant arrived at Castle Medical Center, he was boisterous and disorderly. Applicant was so intoxicated that he could not recall what happened. Because Applicant had been engaging in an illegal activity at the time of the alleged assault, the claim is denied.

86-30

Applicant is a 20 year old male who was injured when he was apprehended by police officers. The evidence indicates that Applicant was driving at high speed in a stolen car. Police Officers gave chase, apprehended him and placed him under arrest for auto theft and refusing to stop. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

86-66 (Kauai)

Applicant is a 42 year old male who alleges that he was beaten by 3 men. Applicant was found unconscious outside a Bar. He had been drinking in the Bar and was intoxicated. There is insufficient evidence to support Applicant's claim that he is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Because of insufficient evidence, the claim is denied.

86-77

Applicant is a 25 year old male who was assaulted by a co-worker at his place of work. He sustained contusions and abrasions of the forehead and neck. The evidence indicates that Applicant was assaulted because he fondled the suspect's genitals and tried to kiss the suspect while he was asleep. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is gainfully employed. Because Applicant provoked the act that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

86-79

Applicant is a 20 year old male who was assaulted. The evidence indicates that Applicant had an argument and fight with the owner of a store because he trespassed on private property. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

86-83

Victim is a 33 year old soldier who was murdered. Medical and funeral-burial expenses were covered by the U.S. Army. There is no evidence to indicate "dependency". Because Applicant (brother of the deceased victim) is not a proper applicant, the claim is denied.

86-100

Applicant is a 29 year old female who was injured when her roommate tried to rape her. She sustained contusions of the lips. No medical bills were submitted. Applicant is a Registered Nurse. Because Applicant was living with the offender and did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

86-105

Applicant is a 31 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted. However, there is insufficient evidence to indicate that he is a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Because of insufficient evidence, the claim is denied.

86-132 (Hilo)

Victim is an 8 year old boy who was sodomized. However, the crime was not reported to the police until months later. Because of late reporting, the claim is denied.

86-133

Applicant is a 24 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted. The evidence indicates that Applicant participated in a drug deal that went sour. Medical expenses totaled \$5,691.25 of which \$3,869.80 was paid by insurance. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant was involved in criminal activity and shared in the responsibility for the crime that resulted in his injury, the claim is denied.

86-172

Applicant is a 28 year old Adult Correctional Officer who was assaulted by an inmate at the State Prison. He sustained a laceration on his left wrist. Because Workers' Compensation covered all of his expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

86-177

Applicant is a 27 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. The evidence indicates that Applicant had a fight with one of the men he was drinking with. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

86-193 (Hilo)

Applicant is an 18 year old male who was injured in a fight. He sustained a contusion on his left leg. The evidence indicates that Applicant was hit in the leg with the same rock he had thrown at the suspect. He also tried to hit the suspect in the head with a wooden box. Because Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

86-209

Applicant is a 59 year old male who was assaulted by his neighbor as the result of an argument arising out of personal property borrowed. Applicant provoked the argument and fight. Because Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

86-220

Applicant is a 46 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. However, there is no evidence to indicate that he is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. There are no medical bills, and Applicant is unemployed. Due to lack of evidence, the claim is denied.

86-225

Applicant is a 17 year old male who claims he was injured in a motor vehicle incident. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

86-229 (Hilo)

Victim is a 10 year old girl who was raped by her landlord. She was living in the Offender's household at the time of the incident. There are no medical expenses. Because victim was living in the Offender's household at the time of the incident and did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

86-248 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 33 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted. The evidence indicates that he had a confrontation with another male and a fight ensued after Applicant grabbed the man's shirt and pushed him against a wall. Because there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

86-253

Applicant is the mother of a 9 year old girl who alleged that her daughter was sexually abused. The girl was hugged and kissed by her apartment building maintenanceman in a friendly gesture. However, there is no evidence to indicate that the girl is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

86-257

Applicant is the mother of a 6 year old girl who alleged that her daughter was sexually abused. The girl was hugged and kissed by her apartment building main-tenanceman in a friendly gesture. However, there is no evidence to indicate that the girl is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

86-281 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 55 year old male who was injured in a fight. He sustained head injuries. Three witnesses said Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury. Medical expenses totaled \$485.71. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

86-286 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 56 year old male who was assaulted by his nephew who was living with him. He sustained contusions of the left eye. Medical expenses were paid by the Public Welfare Division, DSSH, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant was assaulted by his nephew who was living with him at the time of the incident and because Applicant did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

86-295

Applicant is a 14 year old boy who alleges that he was assaulted. However, there is insufficient evidence to indicate that he is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Applicant did not seek medical treatment and there are no medical bills. Because of insufficient evidence, the claim is denied.

86-300 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 24 year old male who was assaulted. The evidence indicates that Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury. Because Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

86-304

Applicant is a 63 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted and robbed. However, there is insufficient evidence to indicate that he is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Because of insufficient evidence, the claim is denied.

86-306

Applicant is a 24 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted. However, there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Because there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the crimes enumerated under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

86-312

Applicant is a 38 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. However, there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. There are no medical bills, and Applicant is unemployed. Due to lack of evidence, the claim is denied.

86-327

Applicant is a 19 year old male who was injured in an affray. He sustained contusions of the left forehead and abrasions of the right hand. Because "affray" is not one of the enumerated crimes under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

86-328 (Kauai)

Victim is a 12 year old girl who was raped by her stepfather. There are no medical expenses, and victim is unemployed. Because victim is a relative of the Offender and did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

86-329

Applicant is a 20 year old male who was shot in the head and left thigh because he provoked a fight. Because Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

86-333

Applicant is a 34 year old female who alleges that she was raped by her former boyfriend. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Applicant had sexual relations with the suspect previously and there is no corroborating evidence to support her charge. Due to lack of evidence, the claim is denied.

86-336

Applicant is a 28 year old female who alleges that she was raped in a downtown parking structure. However, there is no evidence to support Applicant's claim. There are no medical bills, and Applicant is unemployed. Due to lack of evidence, the claim is denied.

86-338 (Hilo)

Victim is a 35 year old male who was shot to death. He sustained gunshot wounds to the head. There are no medical bills, and victim was unemployed. Funeral and burial expenses totaling \$250 were paid by the Offender. There is no evidence to indicate "dependency". Because Applicant, wife of the deceased victim, did not have any out-of-pocket expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

86-344

Applicant is a 33 year old female who was assaulted by her roommate as the result of an argument. She sustained a fractured jaw. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is gainfully employed. Because Applicant was living with the Offender and did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the Commission is unable to order and award for compensation.

86-346

Applicant is a 38 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted in a robbery attempt. However, there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant sustained physical injury. There are no medical bills, and Applicant is unemployed. Due to lack of evidence, the claim is denied.

86-357 (Kauai)

Applicant is a 29 year old female who was raped by her estranged husband. There are no medical bills, and there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant is a relative of the offender and did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

86-366

Applicant is a 35 year old female who was injured by two men who tried to rape her at her place of work. She was employed as a Custodian by Jim Slemons Volvo. Applicant received \$50,000 as a compromise settlement under the Workers' Compensation program. Because collateral source benefits received by Applicant under the Workers' Compensation program exceeded the amount she would have received from the Commission, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

86-393

Victim is a 28 year old female who was murdered by her live-in boyfriend. Applicant is a girl who witnessed the murder of her mother. There is no evidence showing that she is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes under Section 351-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the claim is denied.

86-400 (Kauai)

Applicant is a 29 year old male who was stabbed. He provoked the fight that caused his injury because he punched the suspect in the face. Because Applicant provoked the fight that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

86-403 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 31 year old male who was stabbed in the heart and leg by his brother. Medical expenses were paid by the Public Welfare Division, DSSH, State of Hawaii. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is gainfully employed. Because Applicant was stabbed by a relative (brother) and did not have any out-of-pocket medical expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.
