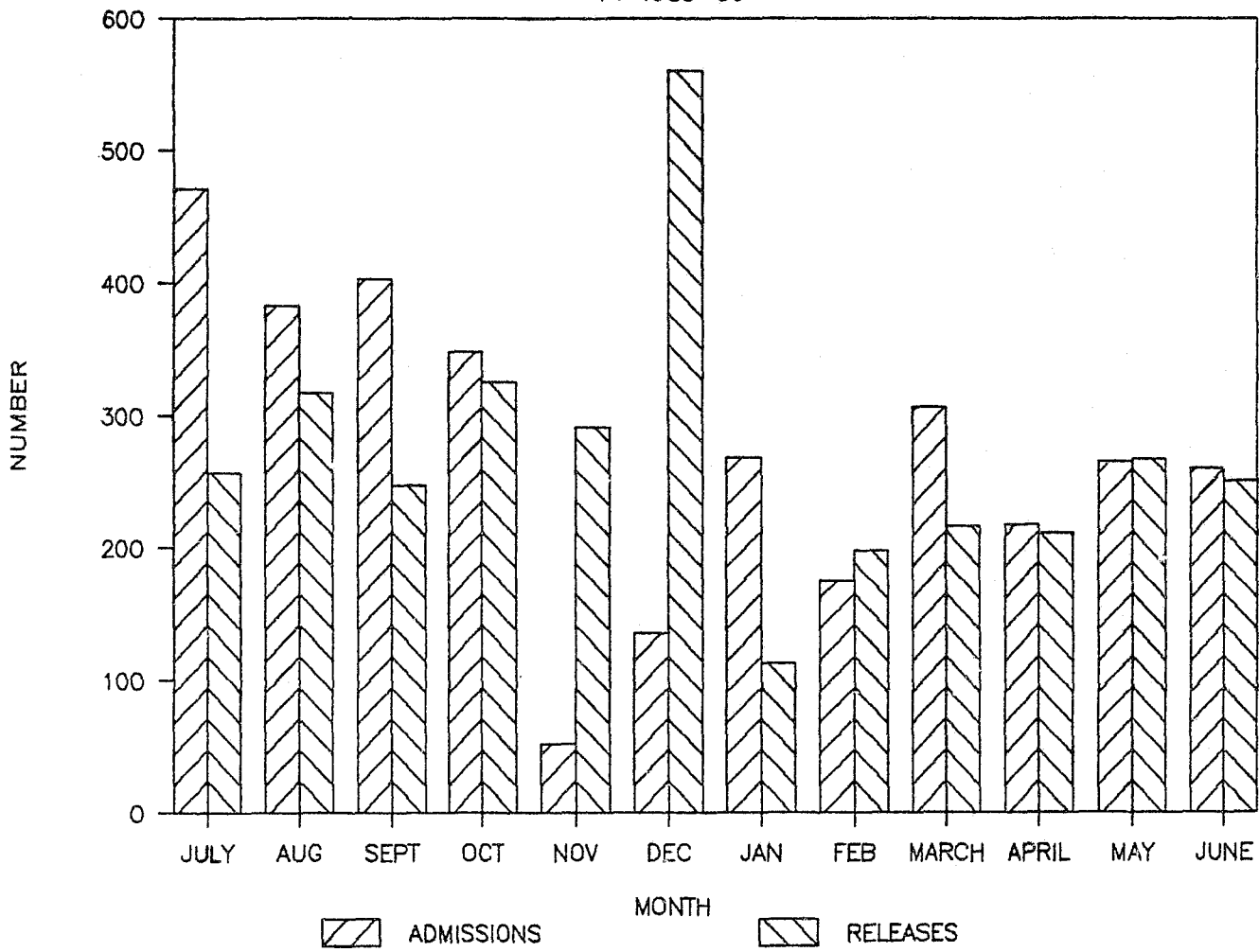

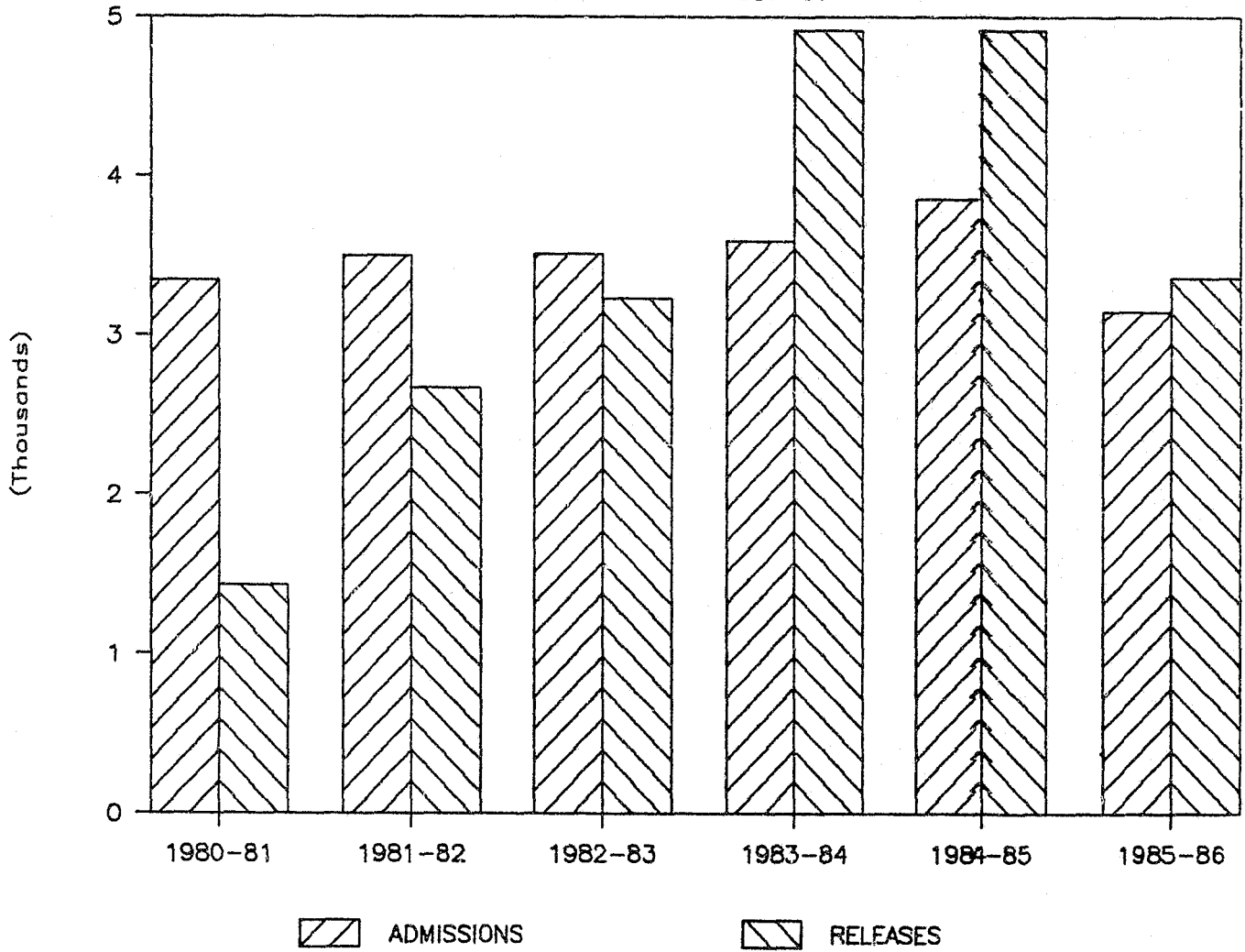

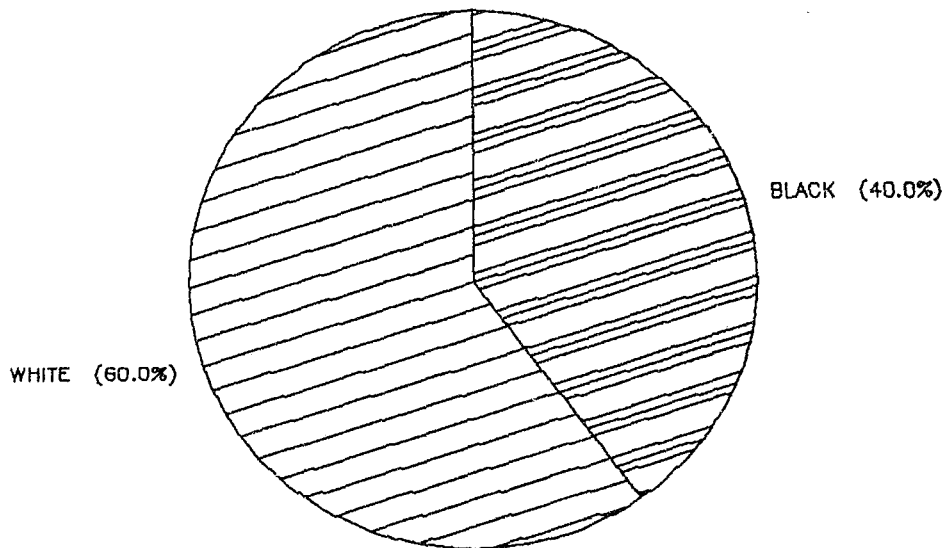
AVERAGE MAXIMUM SENTENCE GIVEN (DAYS)

ADMISSIONS FROM FY 1980-81 - FY 1985-86



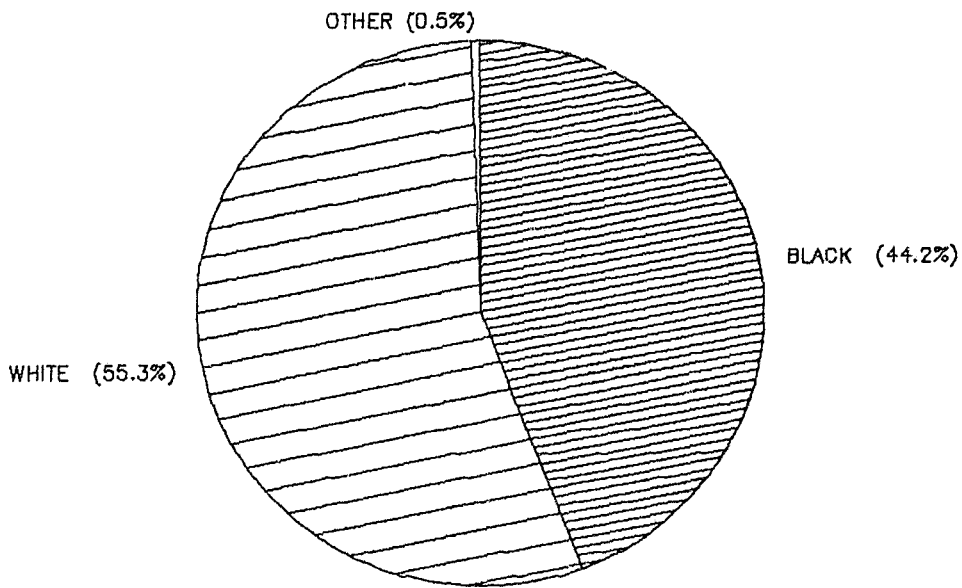
FEMALE RELEASES BY RACE

FY 1984-85



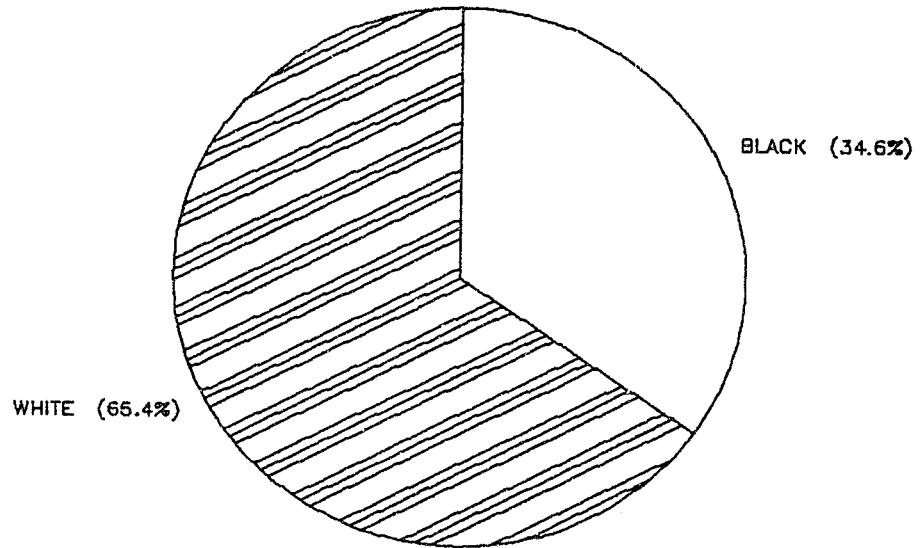
MALE RELEASES BY RACE

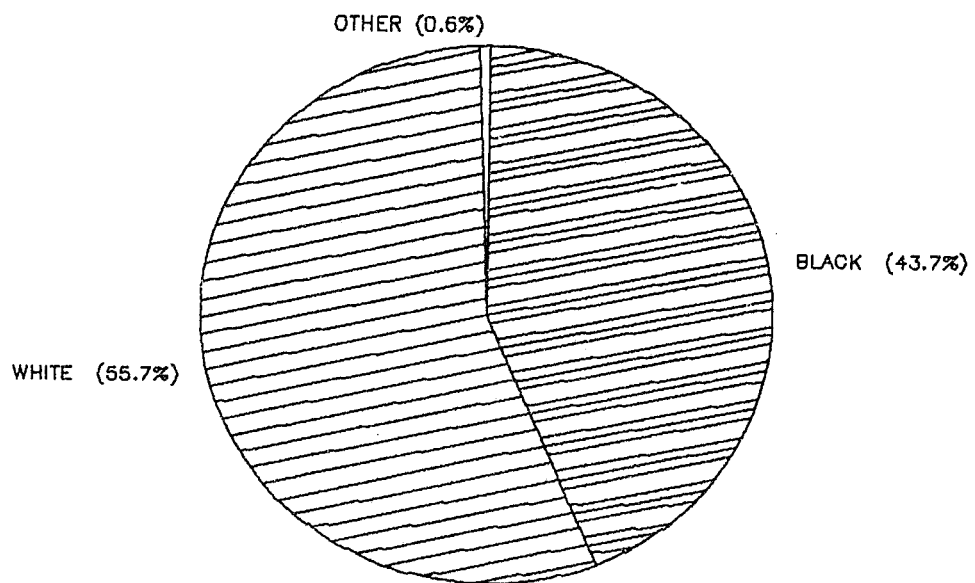

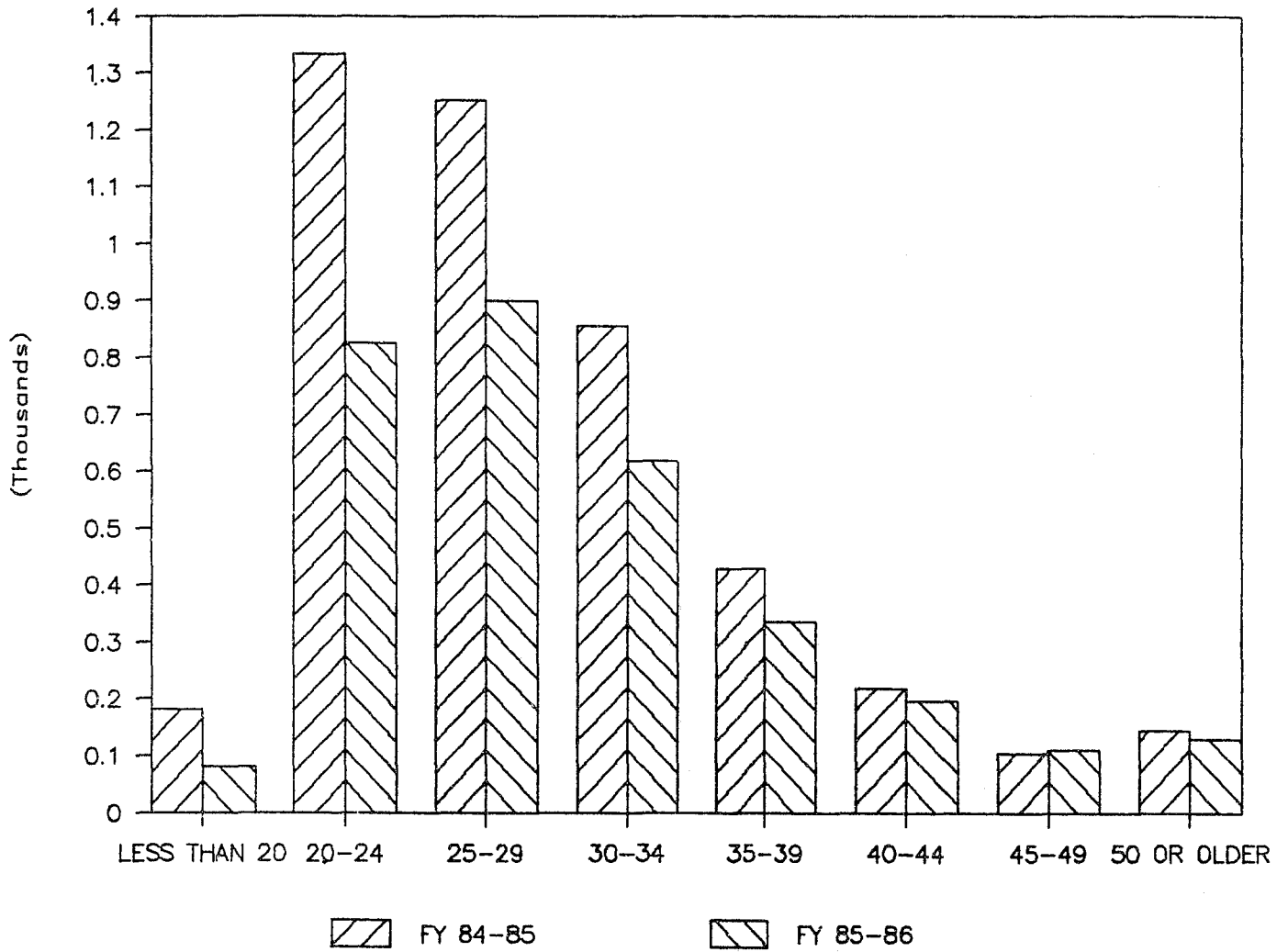

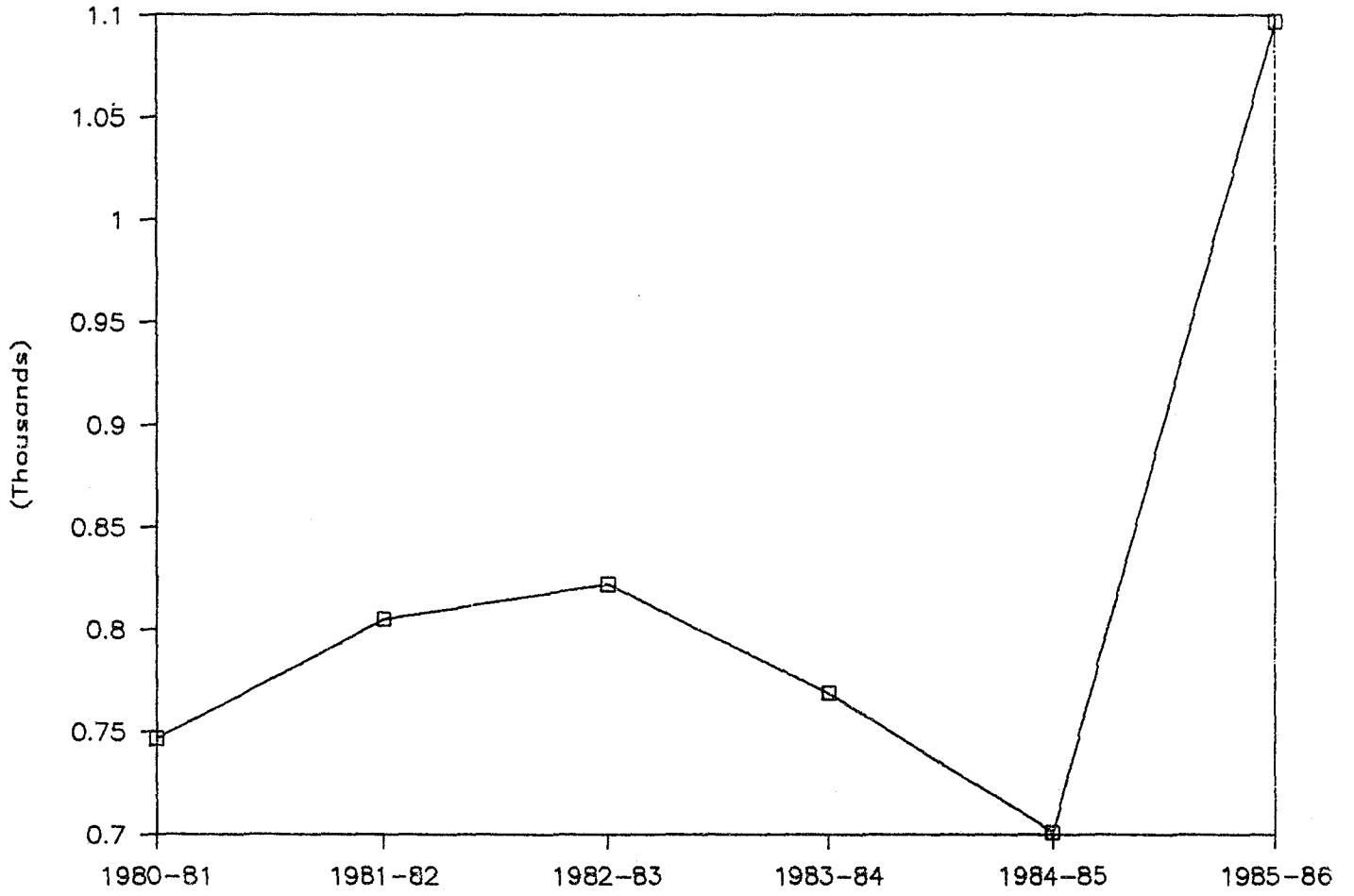

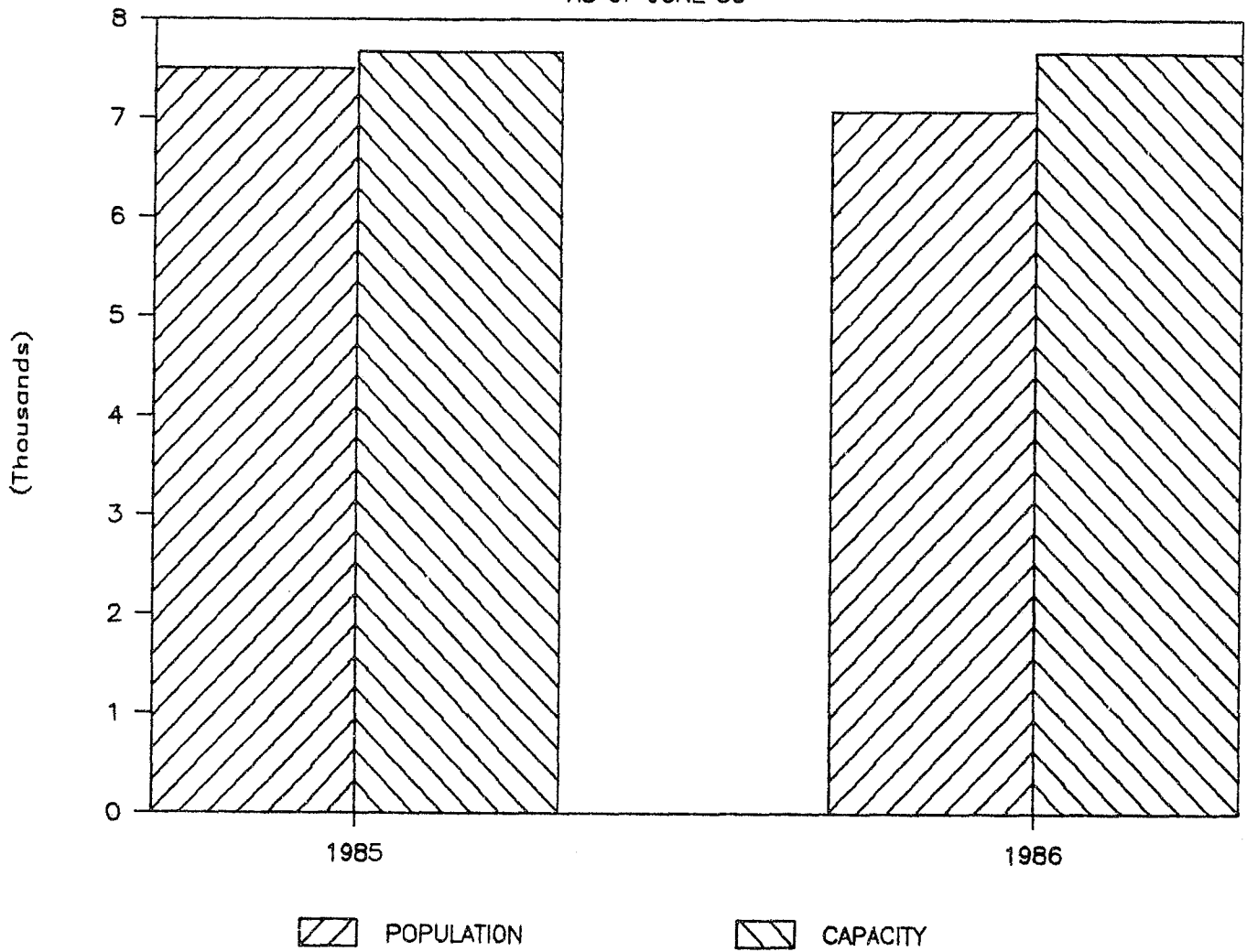

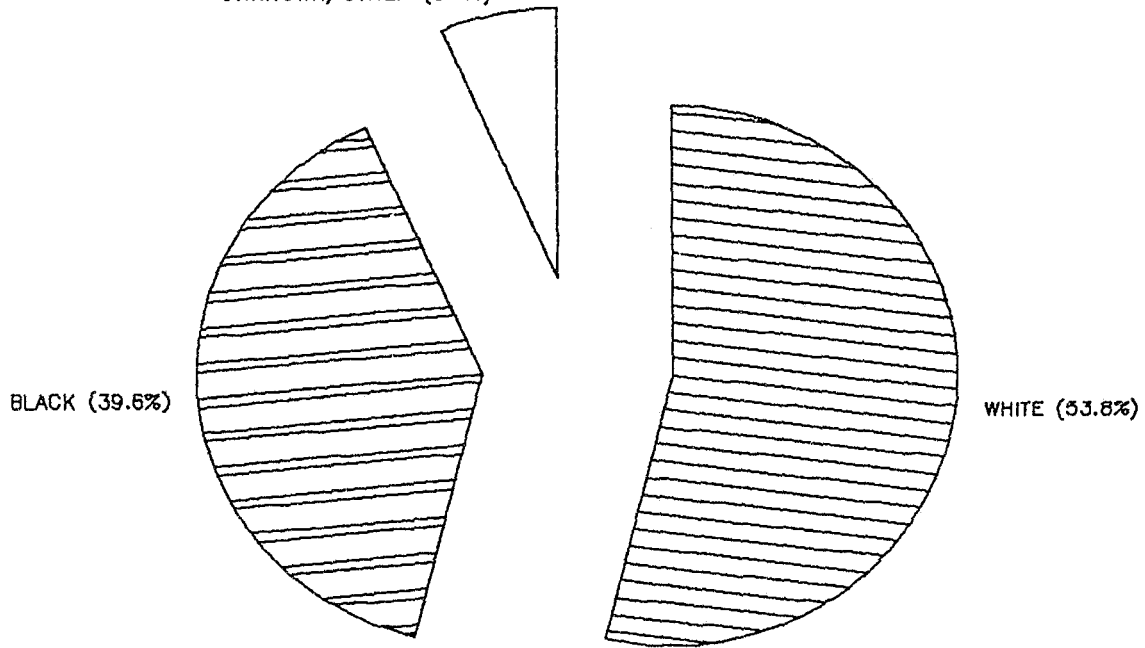

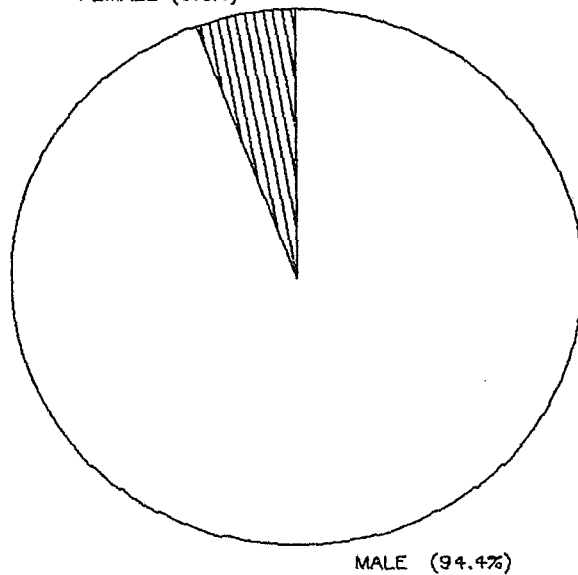

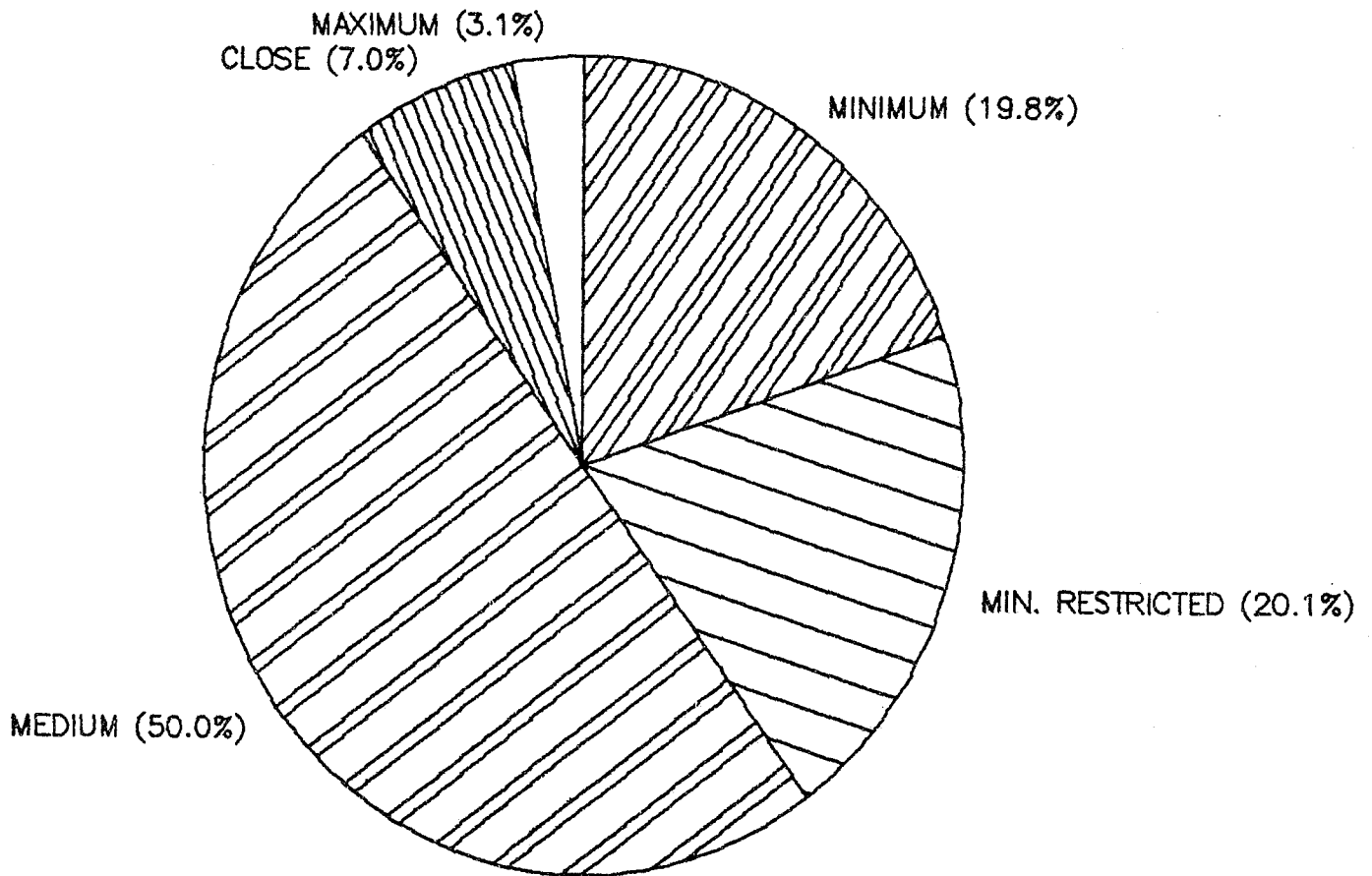

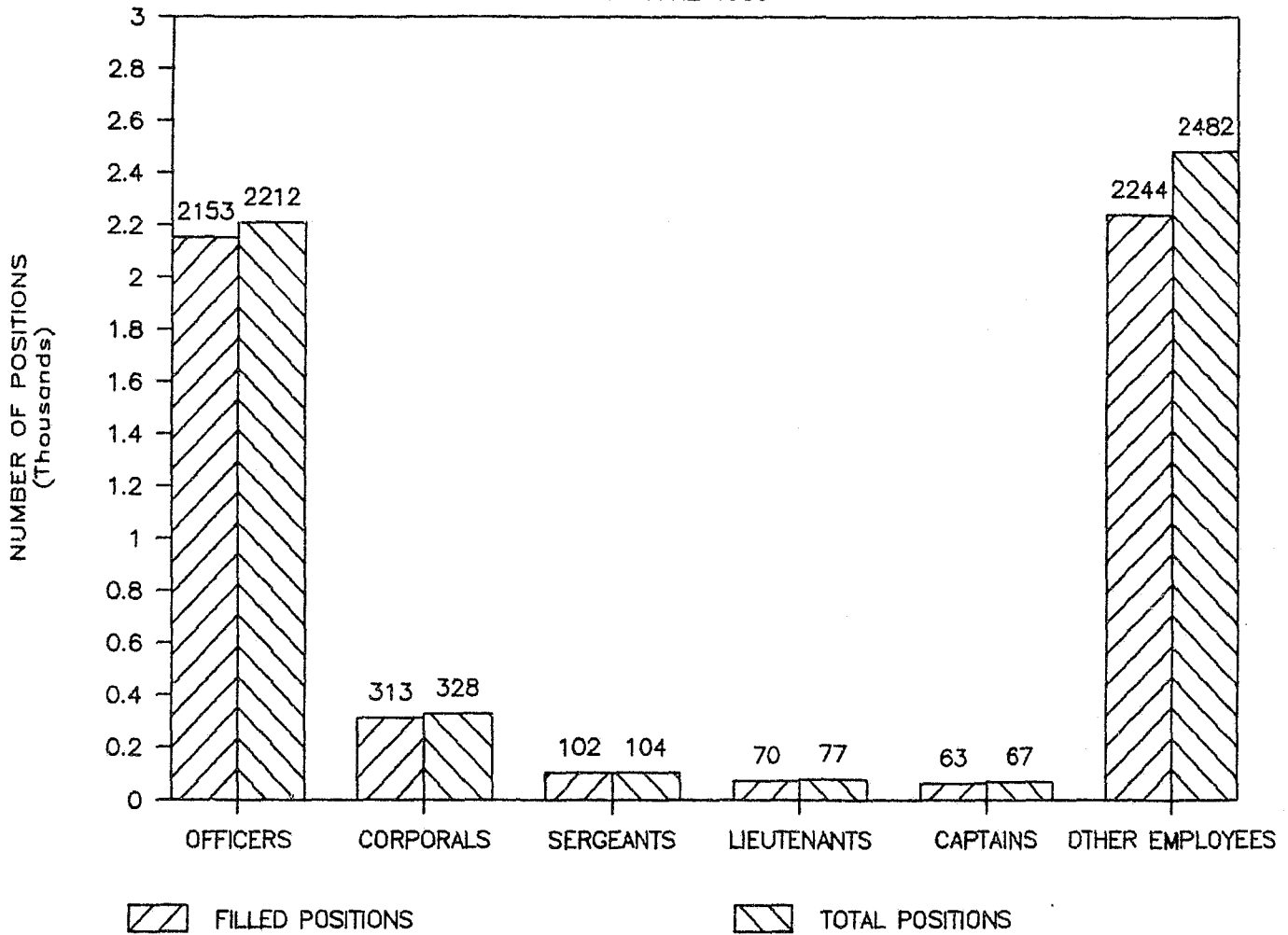
INMATE POPULATION BY SECURITY LEVEL

ADULT SECURITY POSITIONS

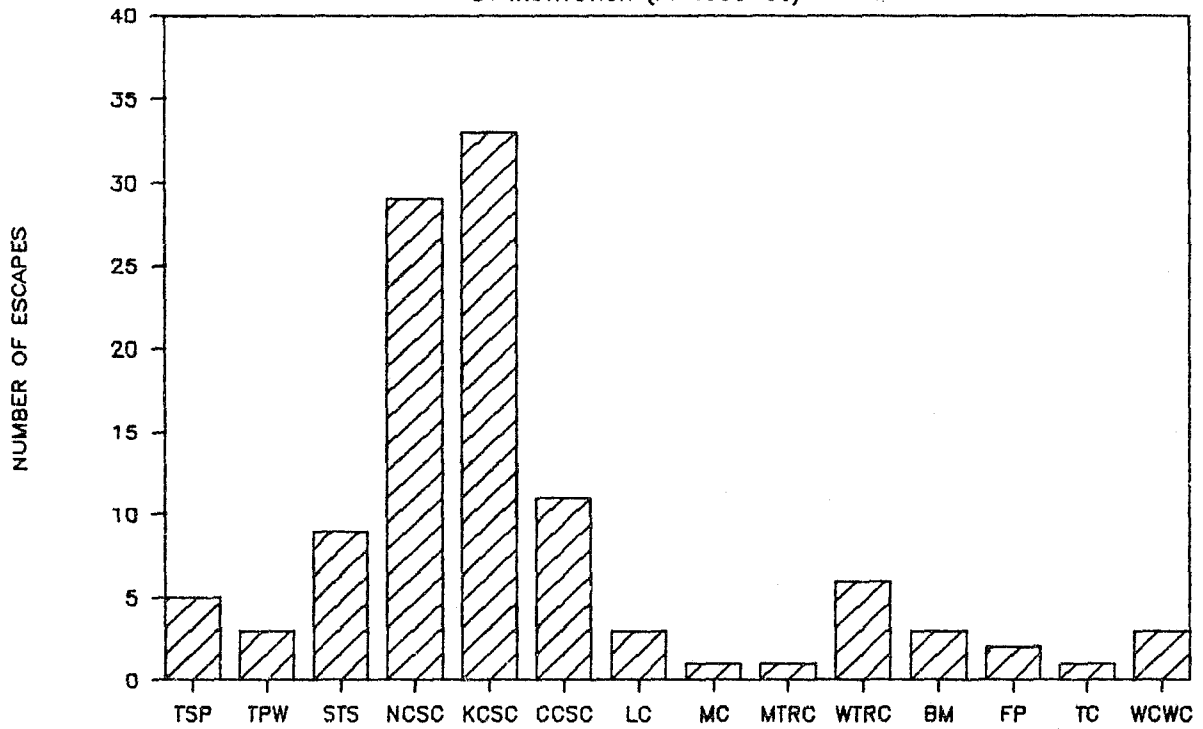

ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS

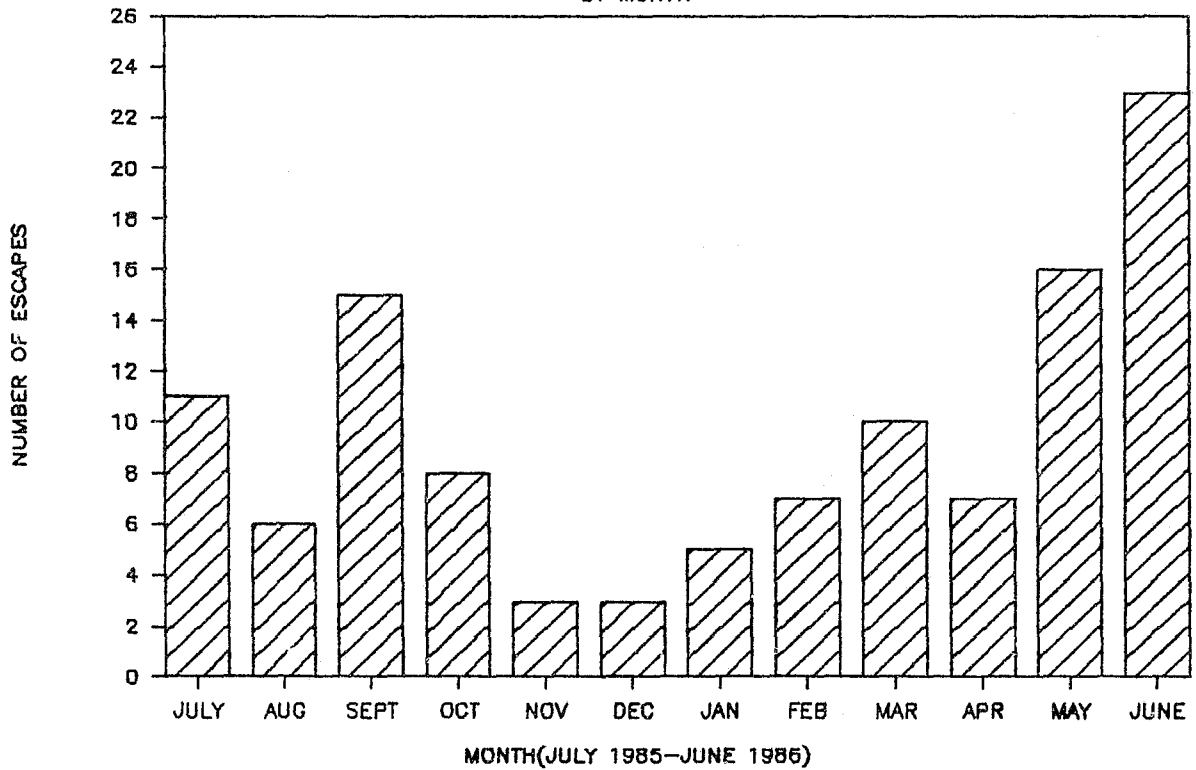
BY INSTITUTION (FY 1985-86)

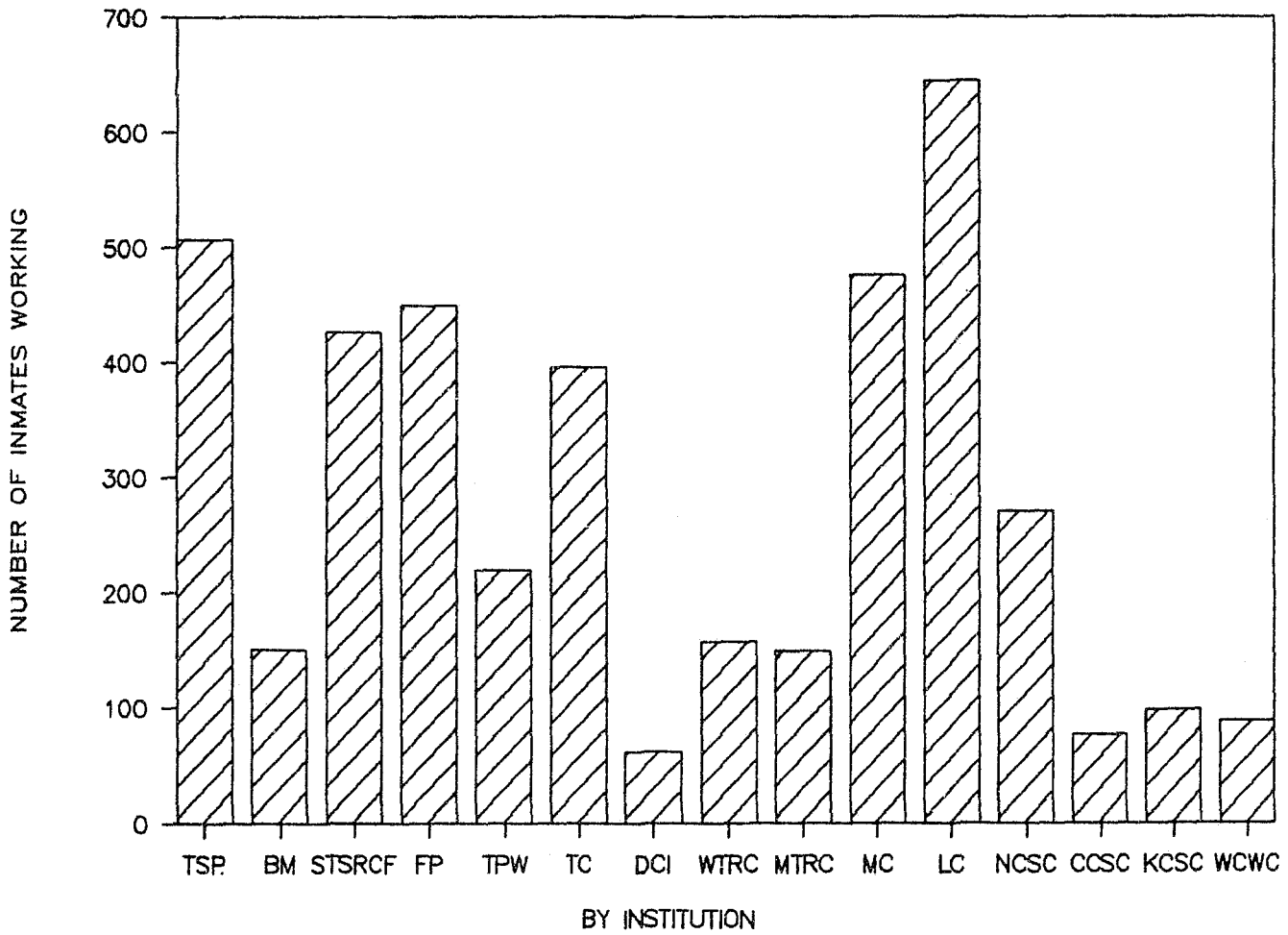
ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS

MONTHLY AVERAGE - FY 1985-86

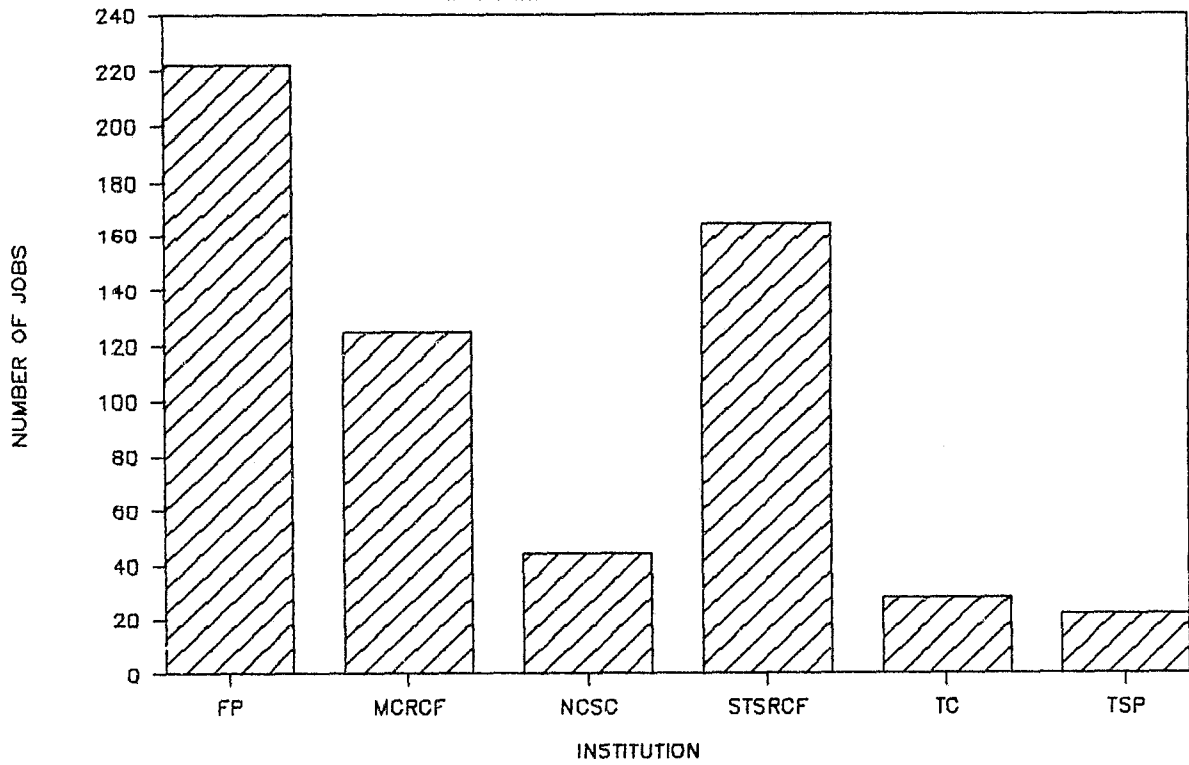

INMATE JOBS (FARMS/WORKLINES)

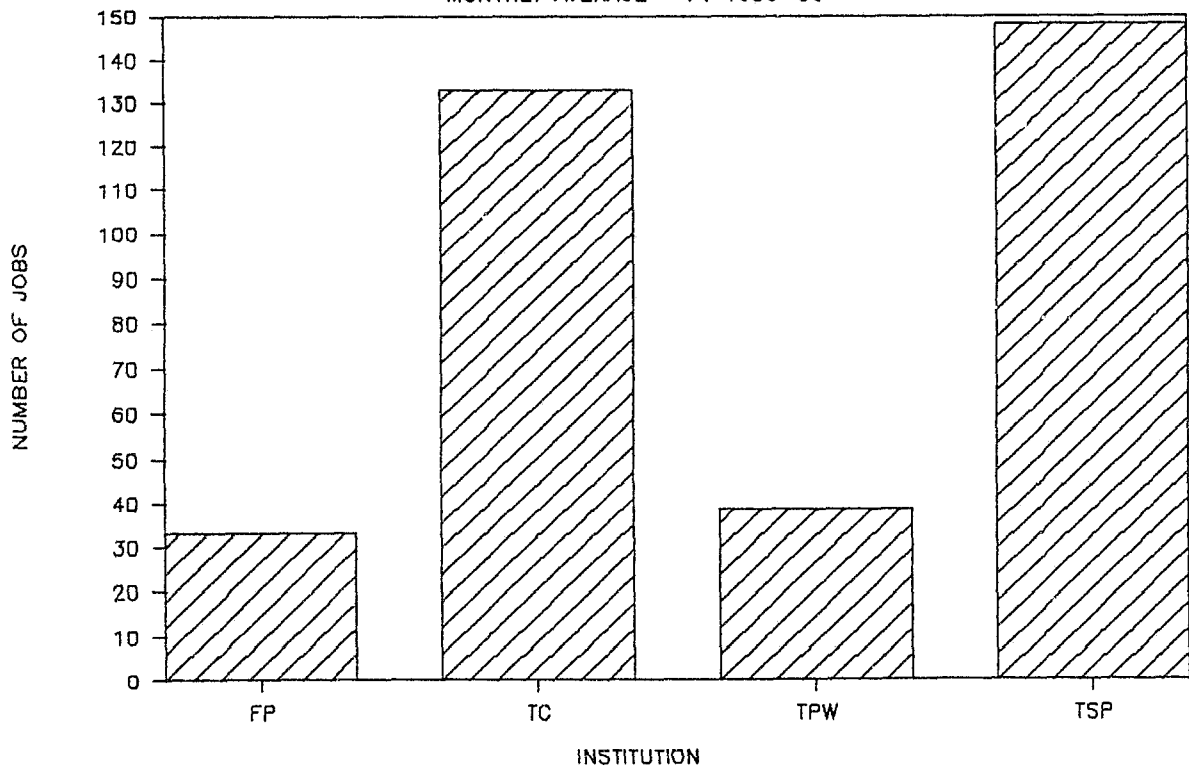
MONTHLY AVERAGE - FY 1985-86

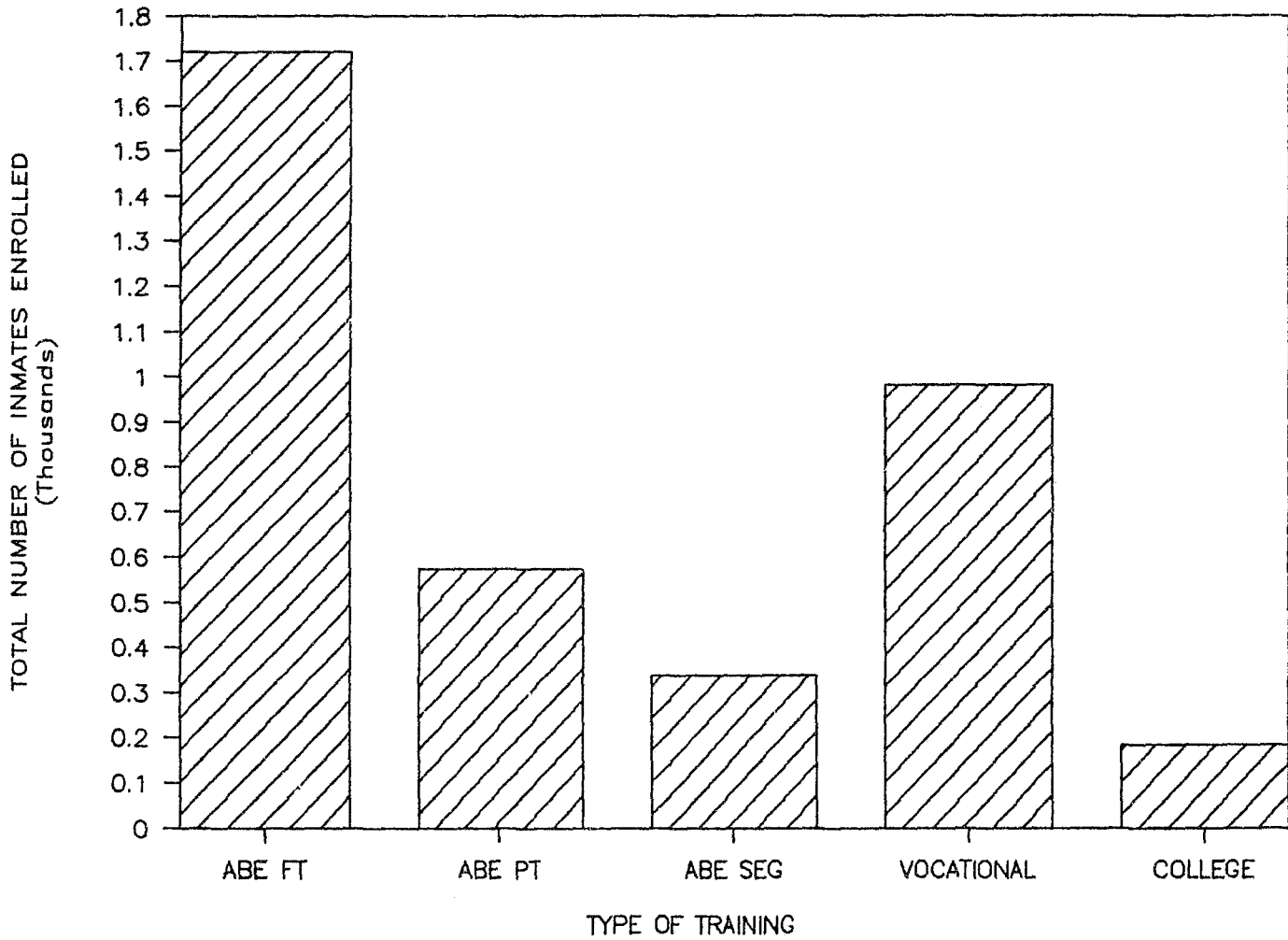
INMATE JOBS (INDUSTRIES)

MONTHLY AVERAGE - FY 1985-86



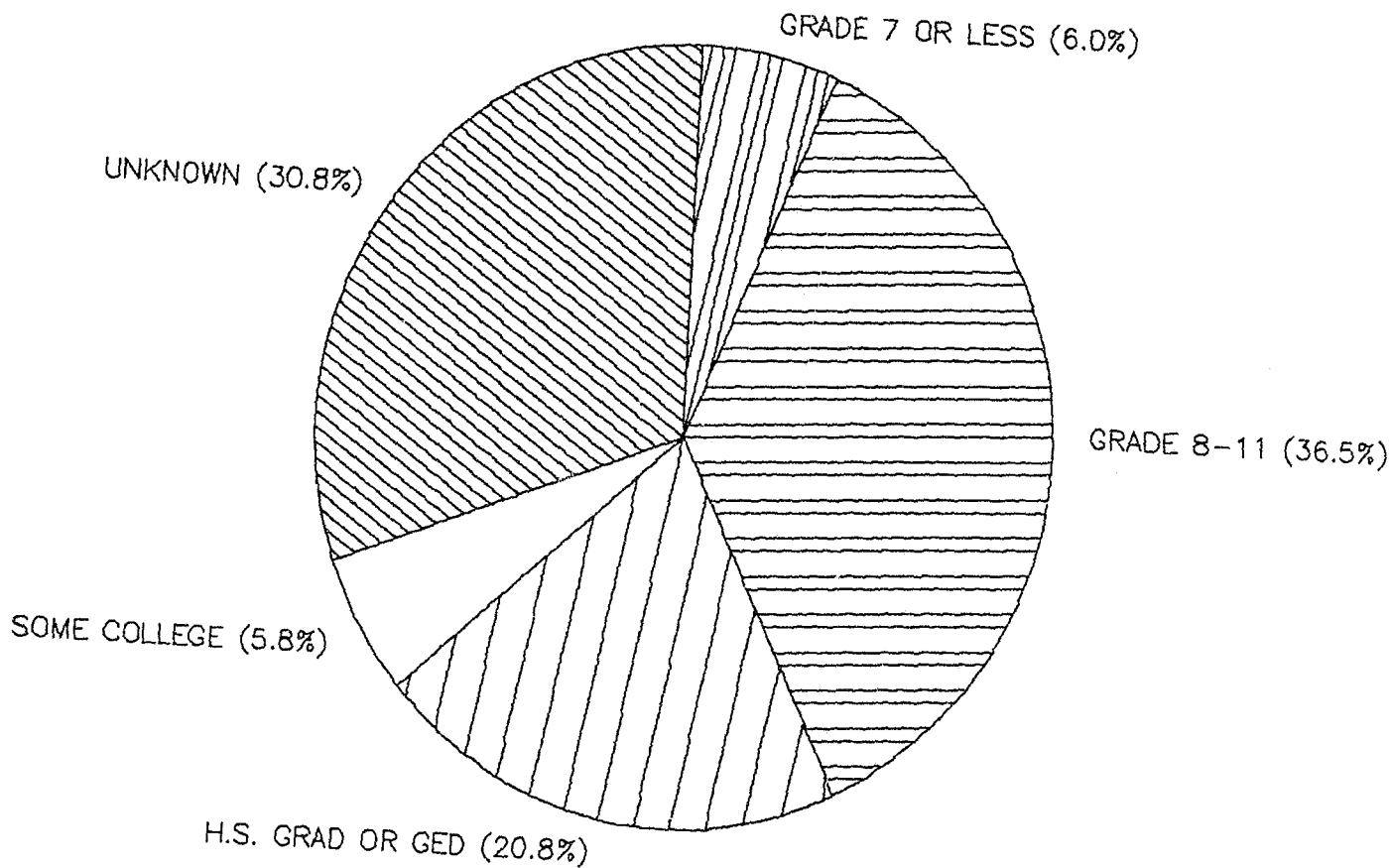
PARTICIPATION IN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

ADULT INSTITUTIONS - FY 1985-86



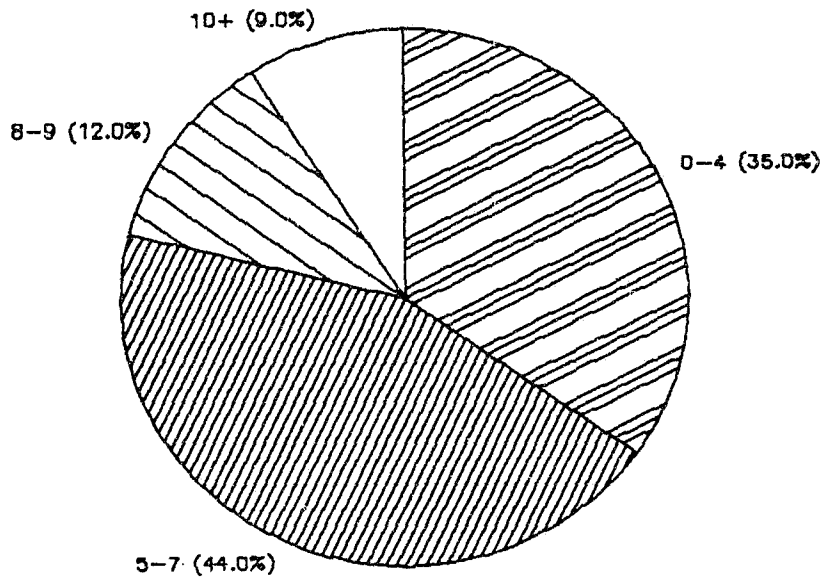

FOR FY 85-86 ADMISSIONS



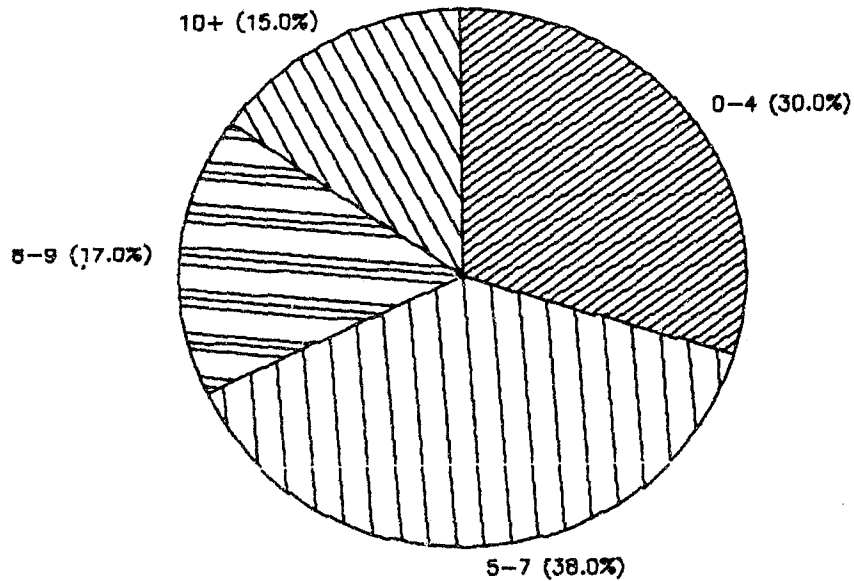
ADULT MATH SKILLS (BY GRADE LEVEL)

AS INDICATED BY TEST SCORES

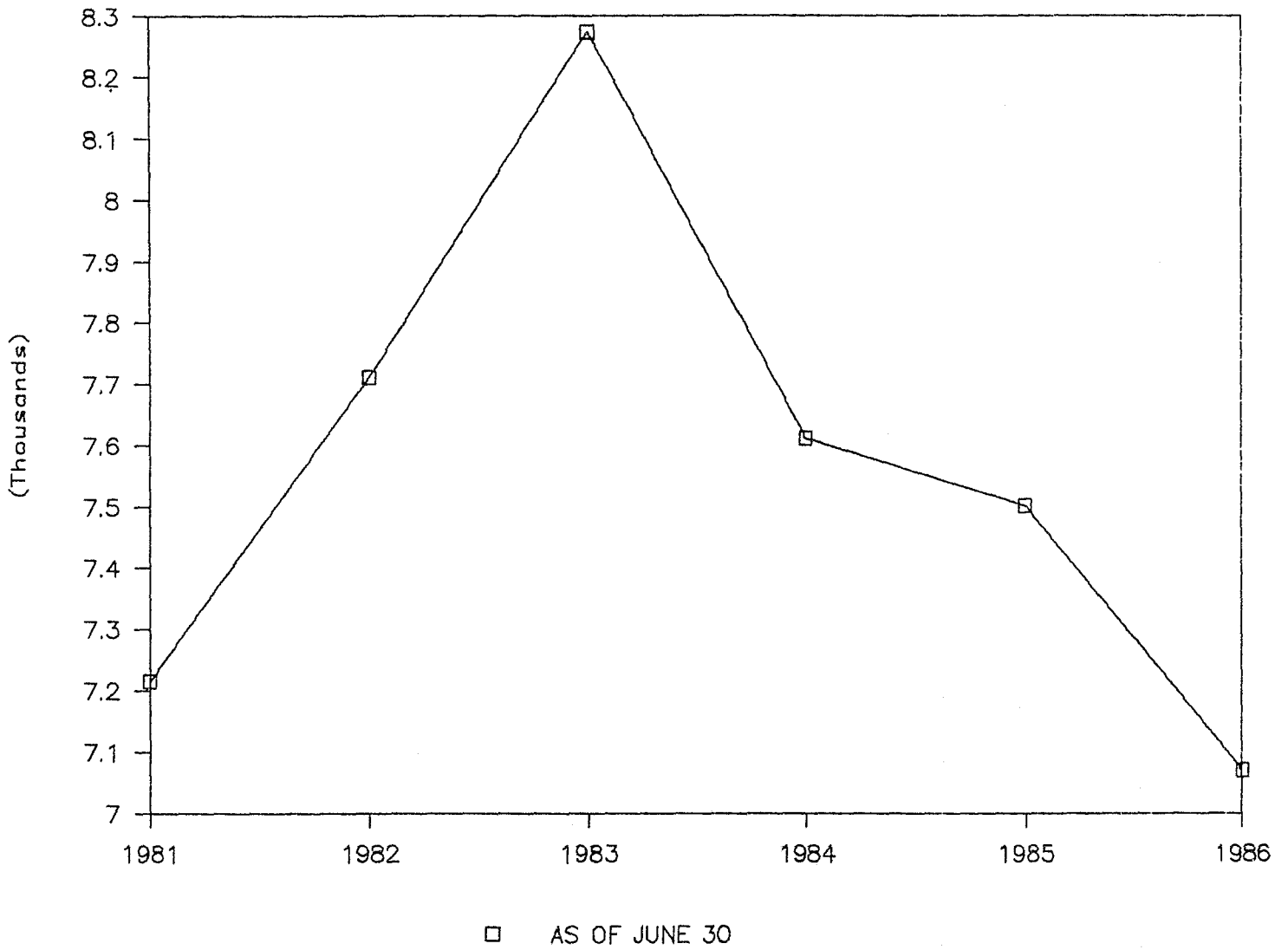


ADULT READING SKILLS (BY GRADE LEVEL)

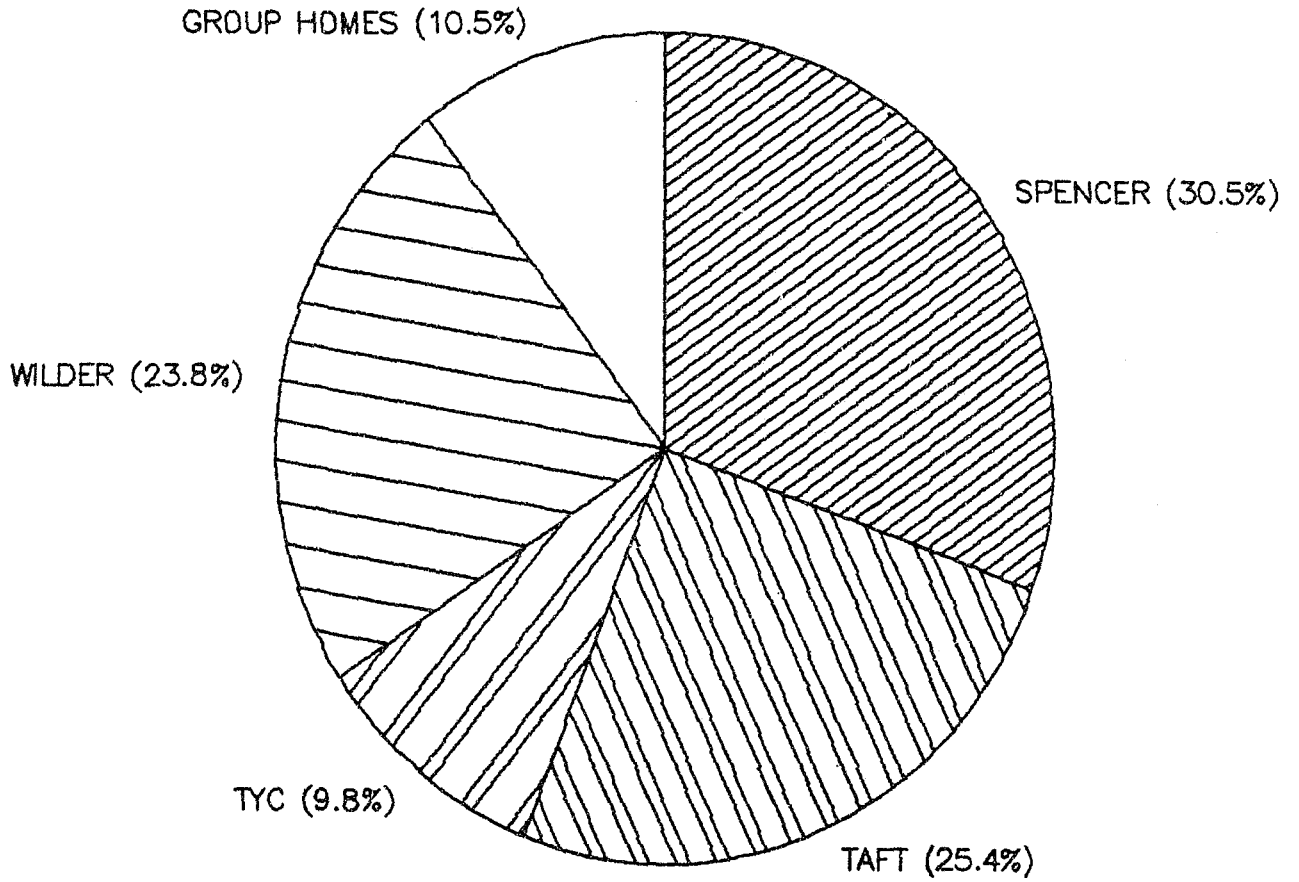

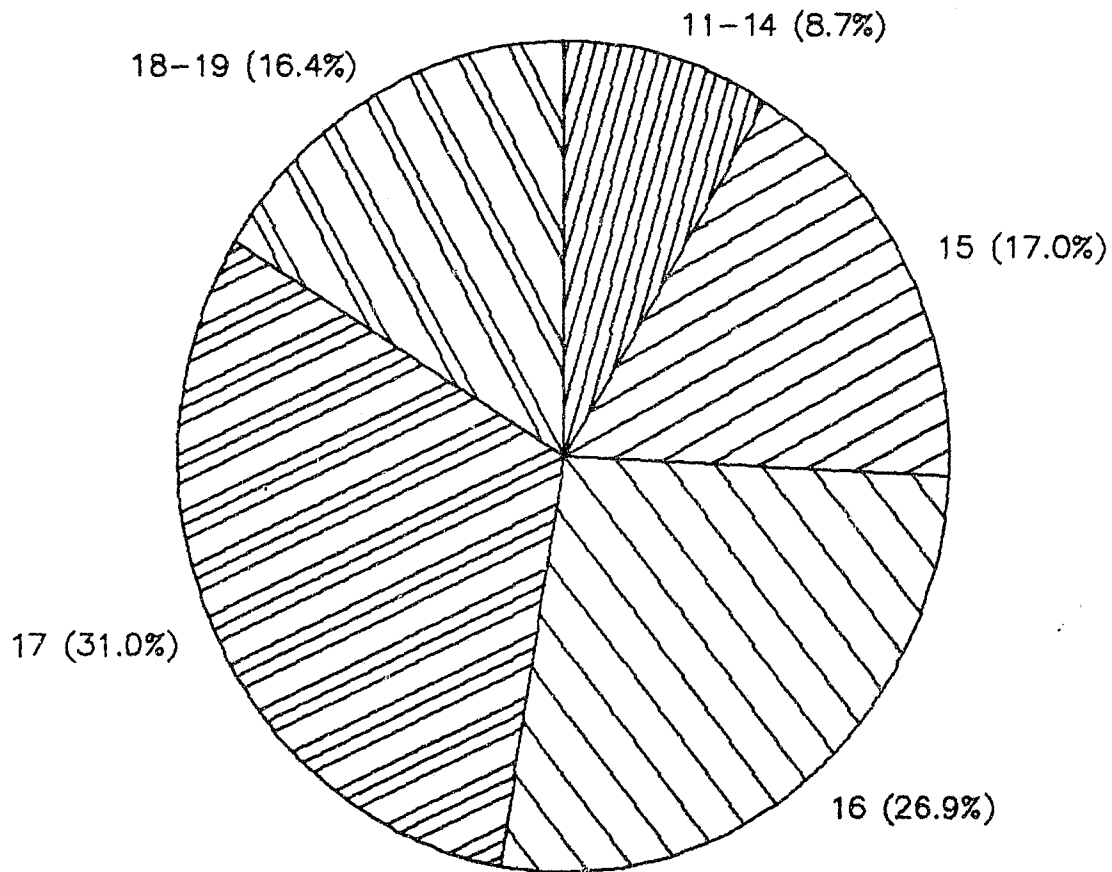
JUVENILE POPULATION

AS OF JUNE 30, 1986



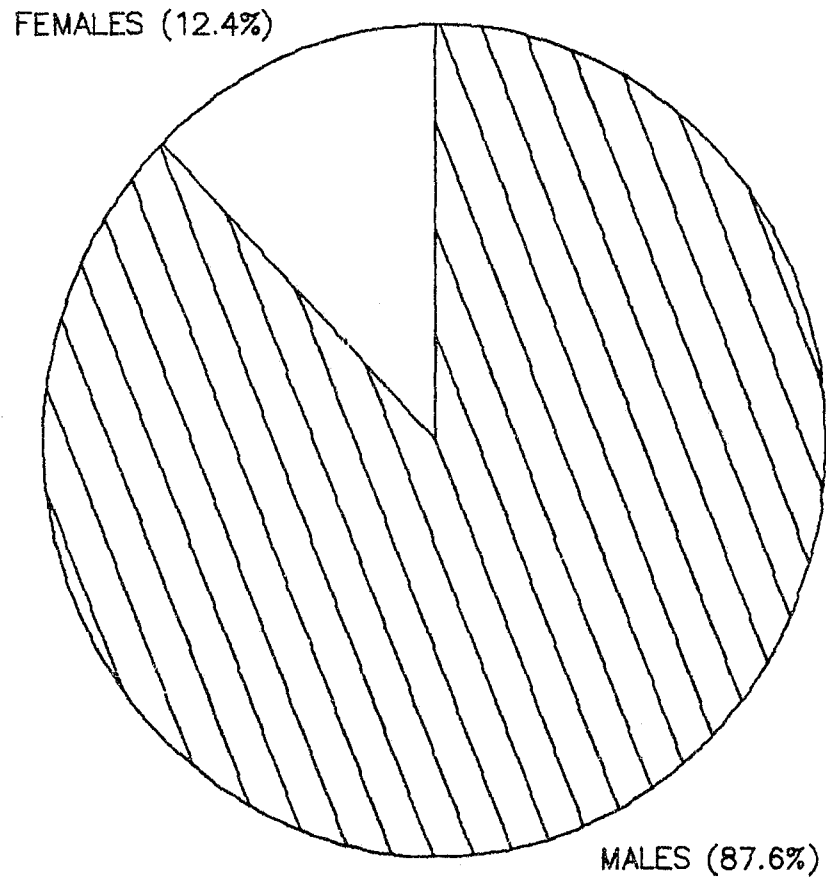
JUVENILE POPULATION BY AGE

AS OF JUNE 30, 1986

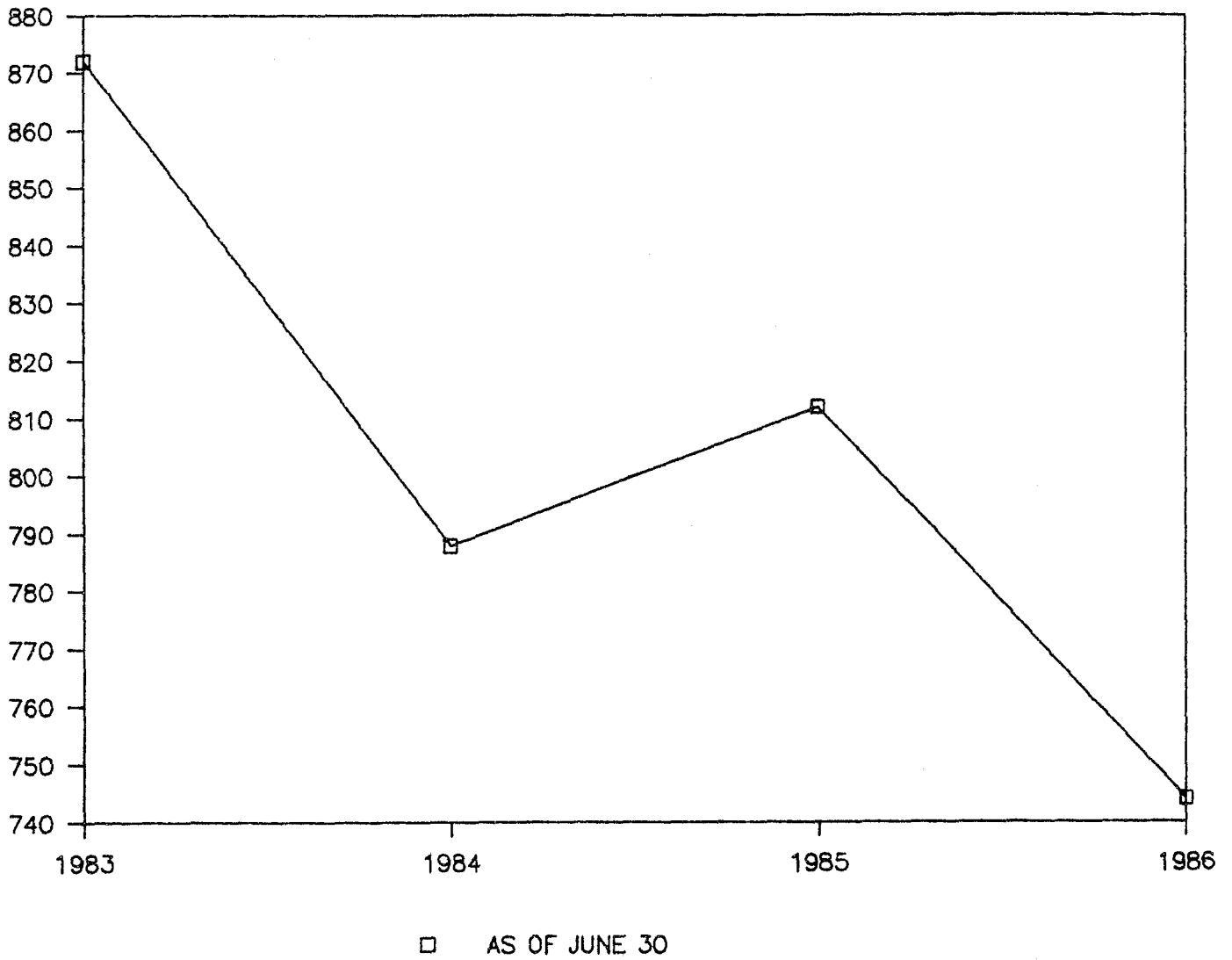


JUVENILE POPULATION BY SEX

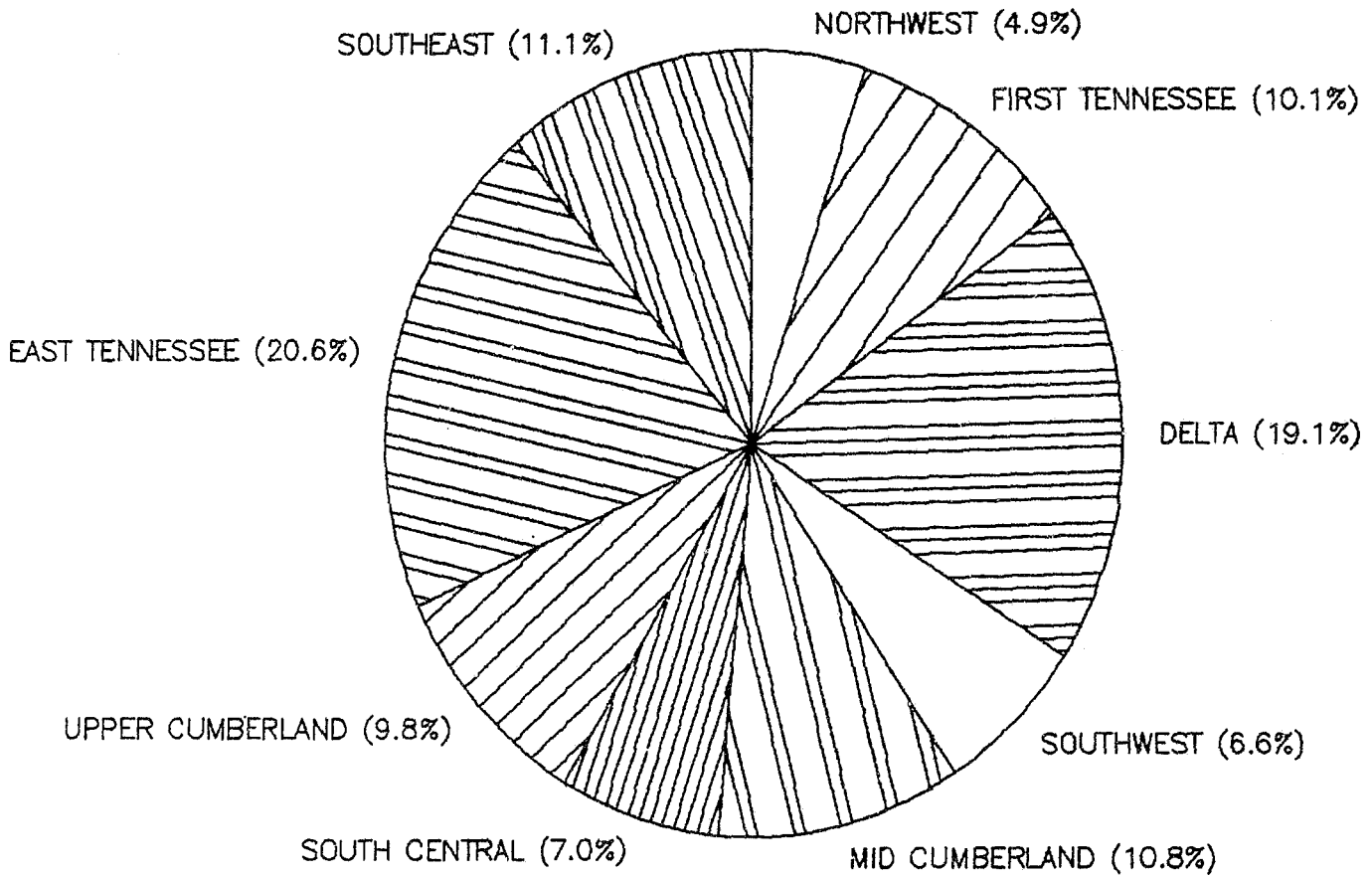

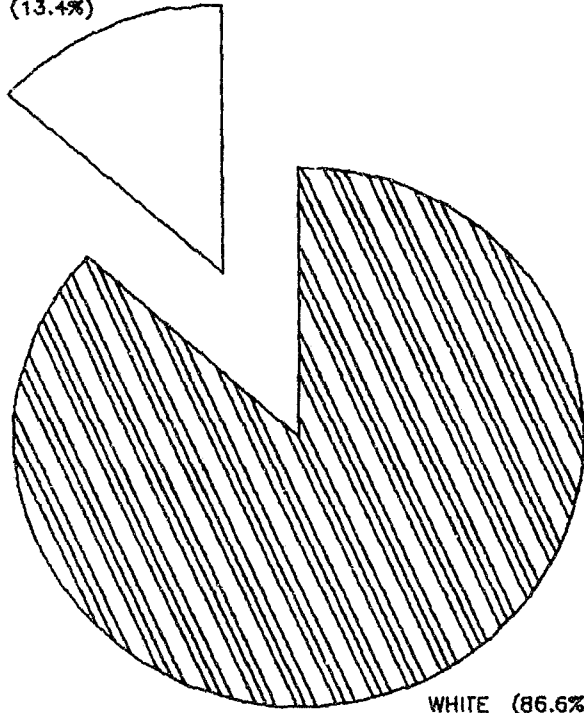

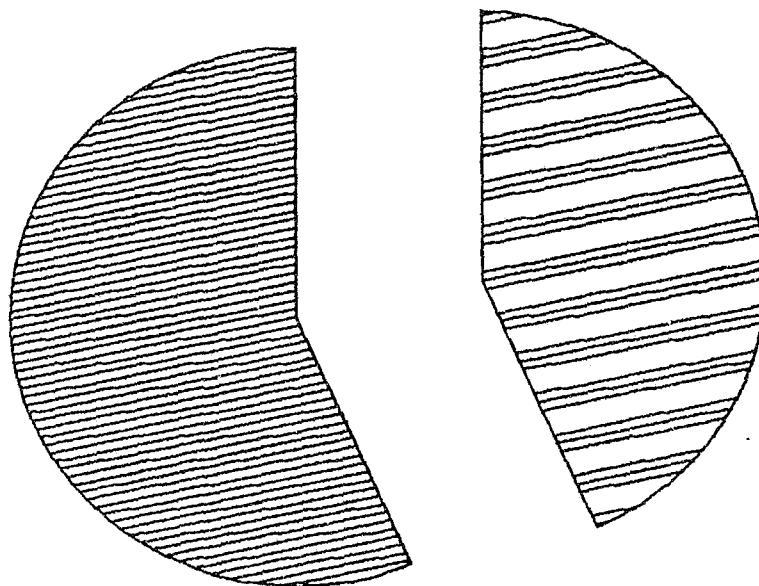

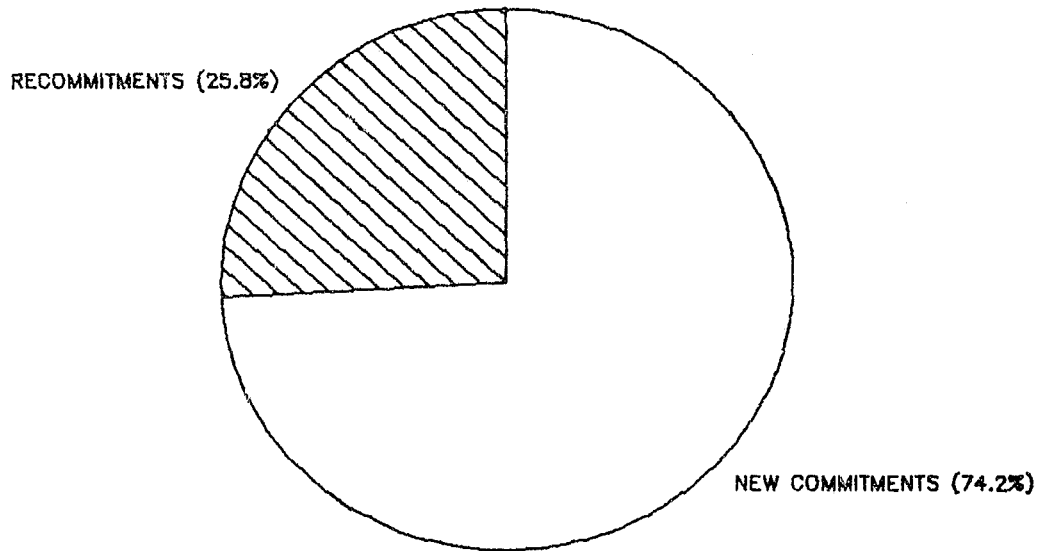

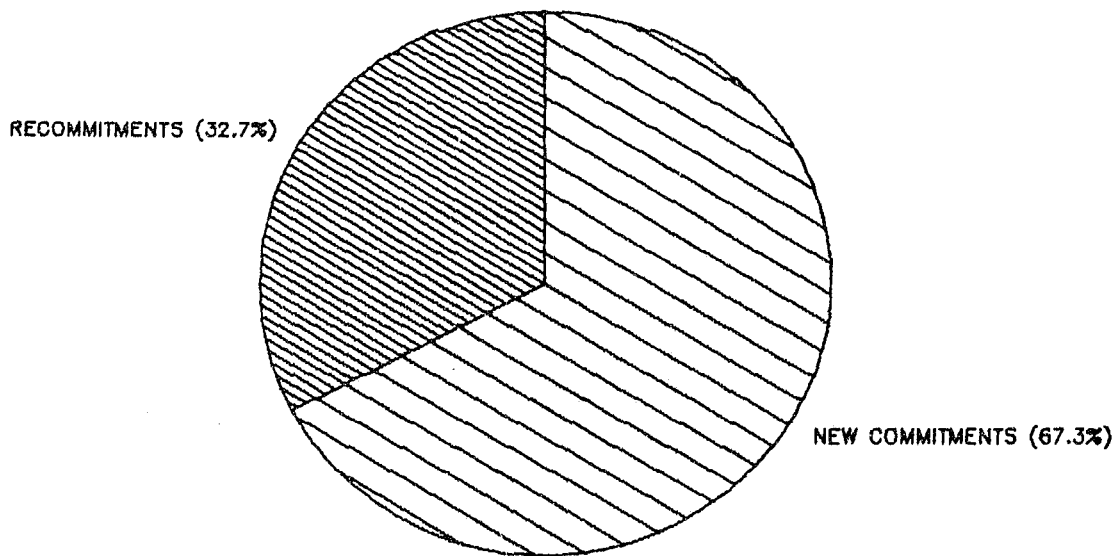
JUVENILE COMMITMENTS/RECOMMITMENTS

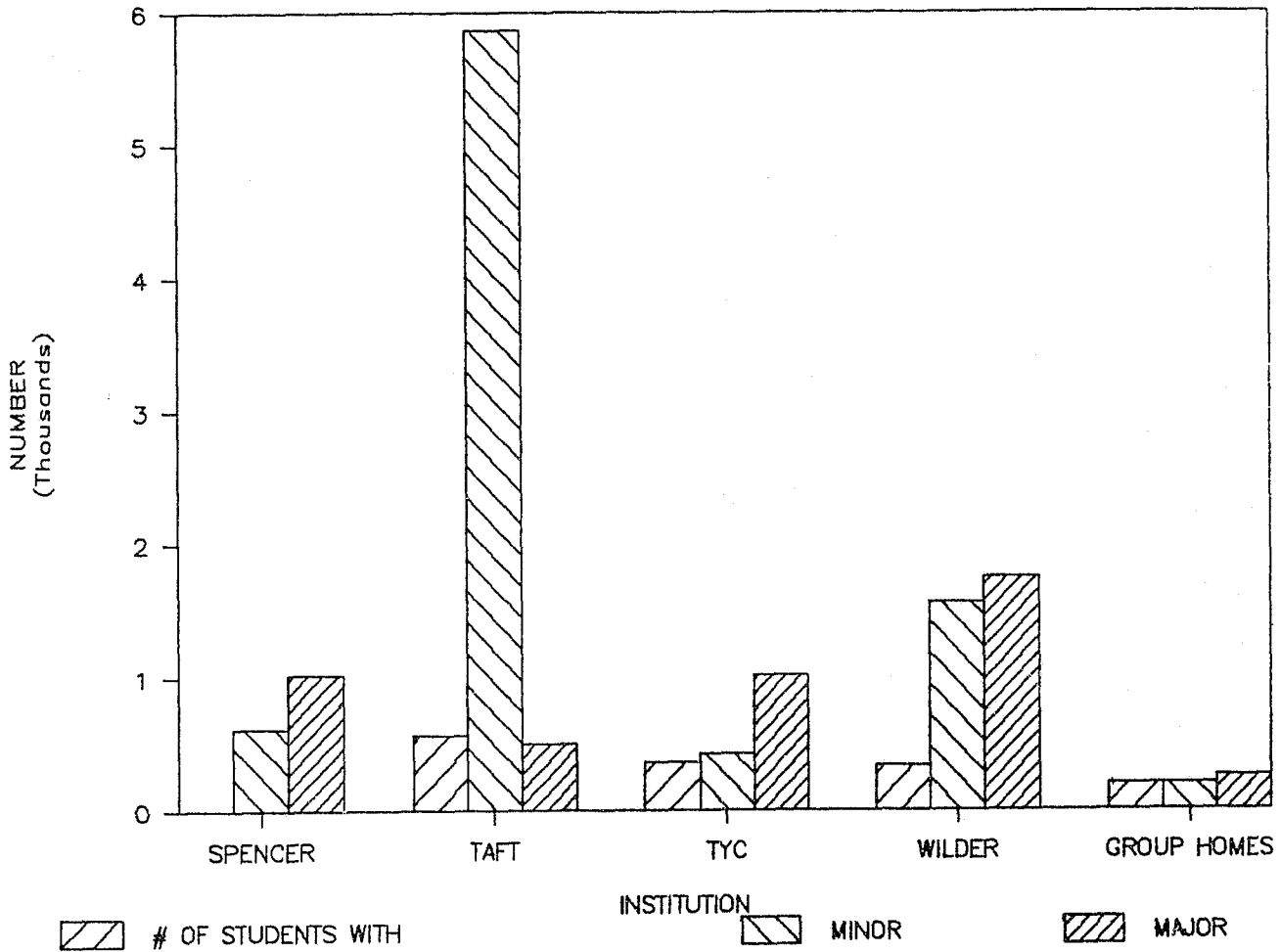

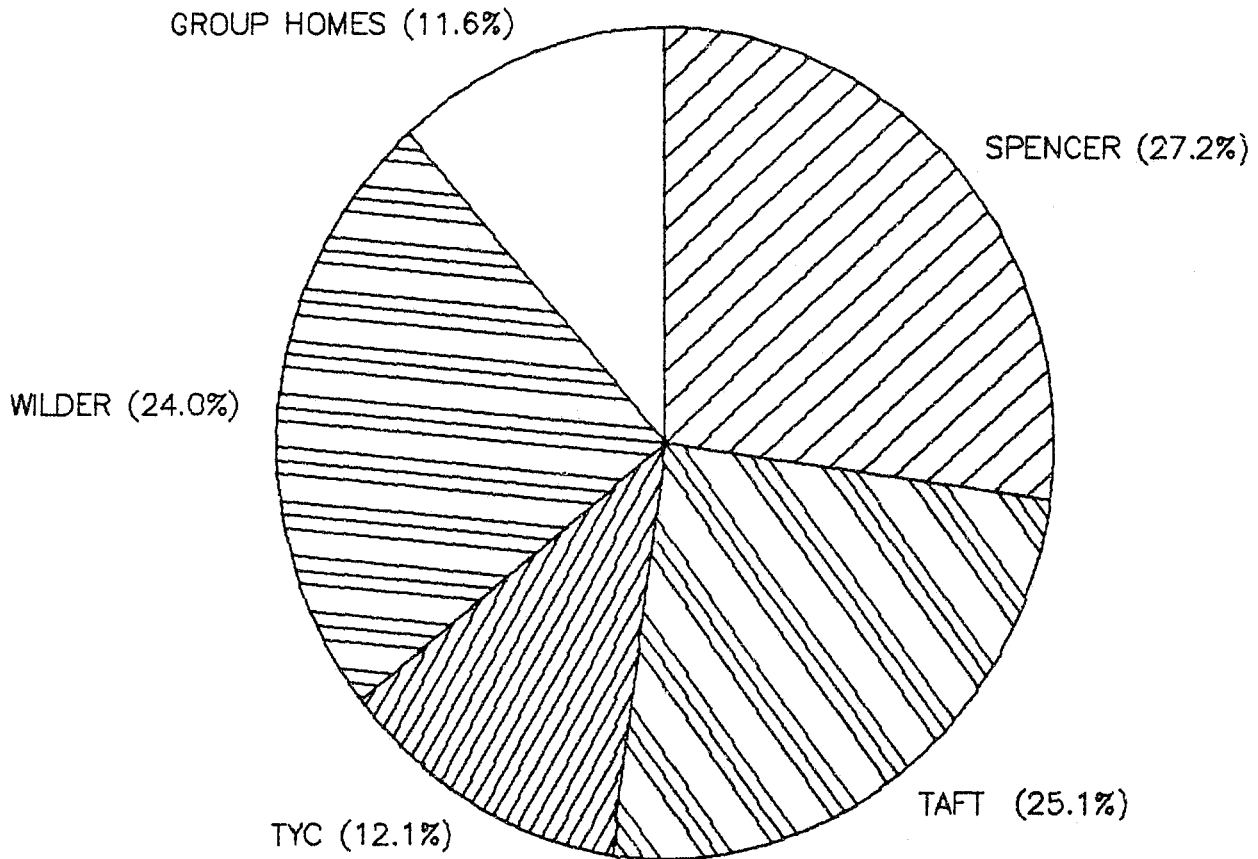

AS OF JUNE 30, 1986



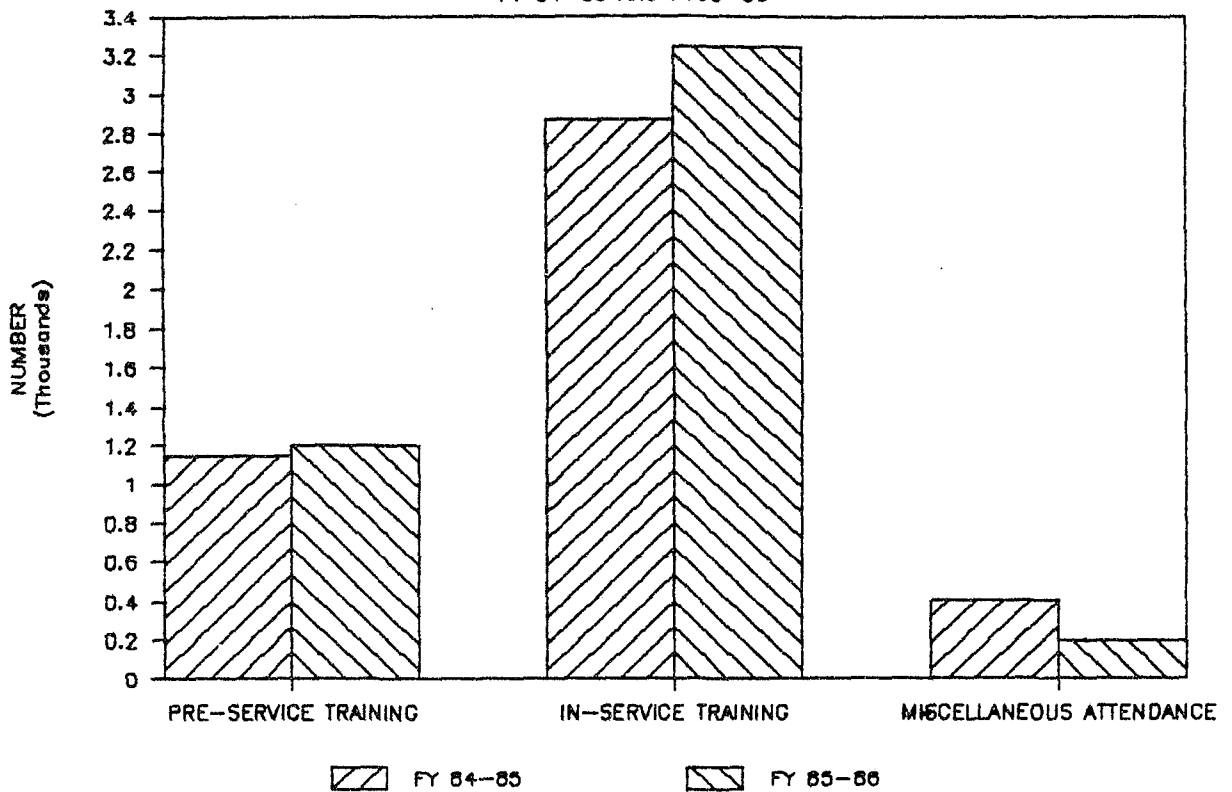

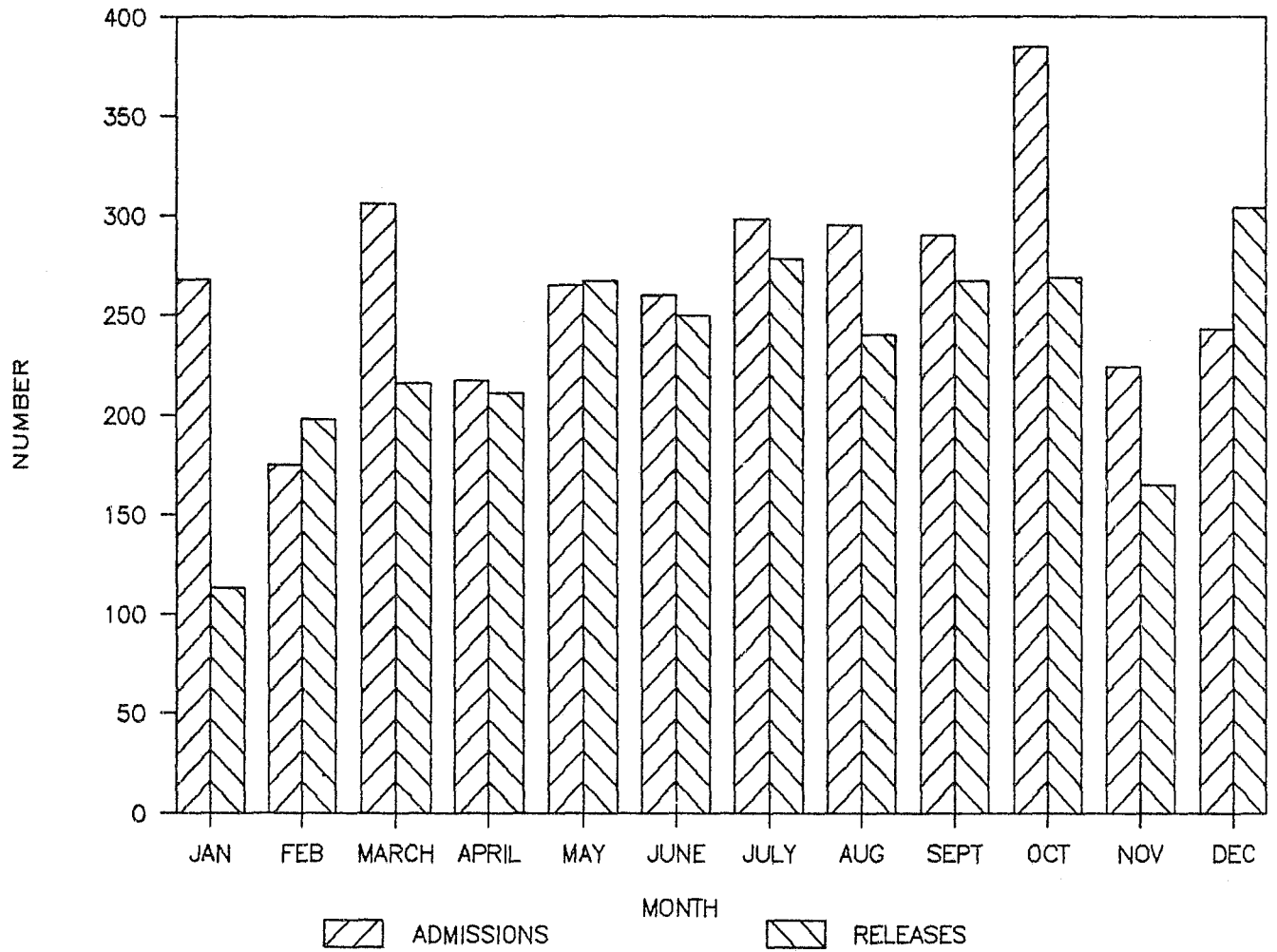

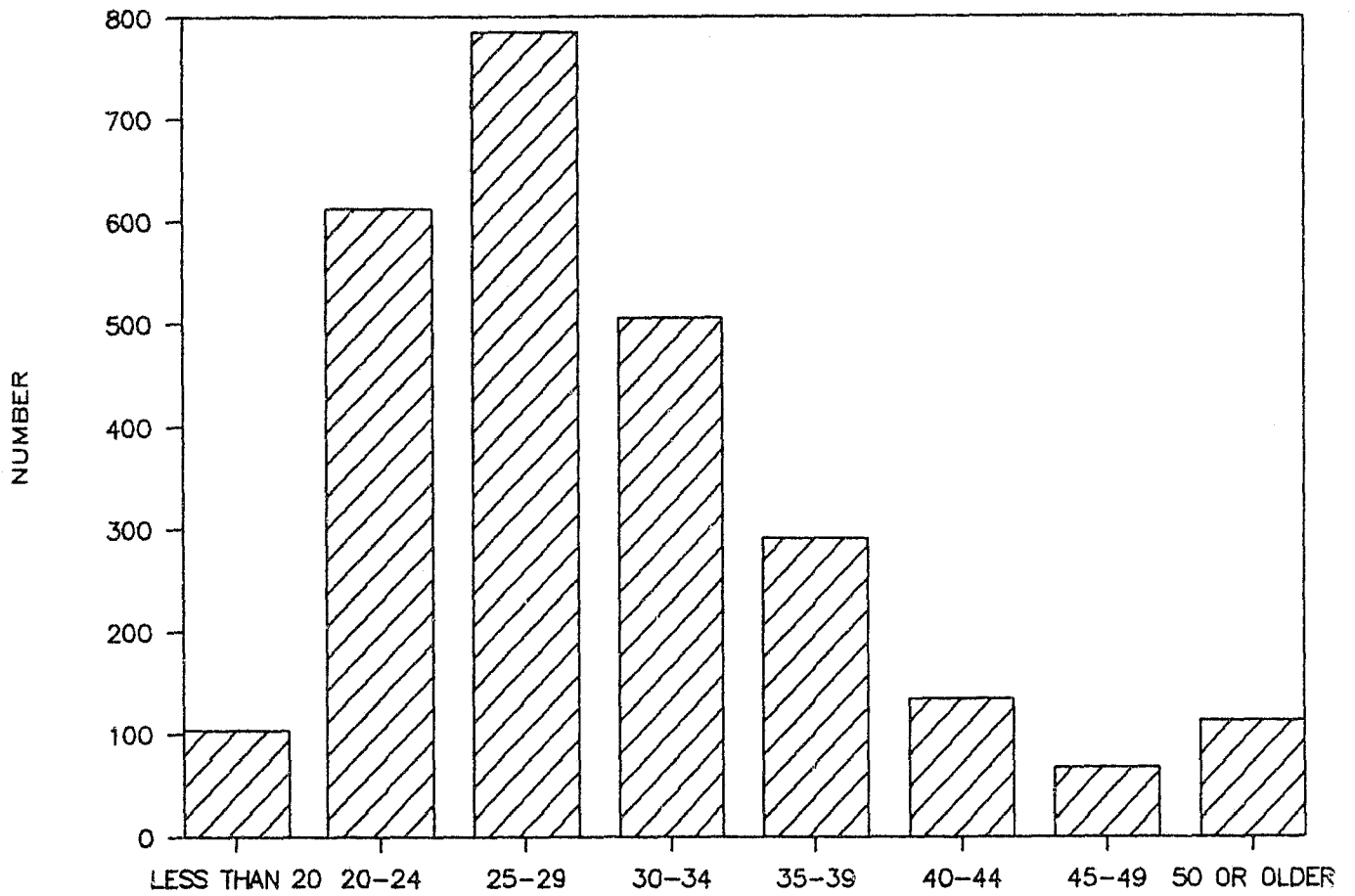

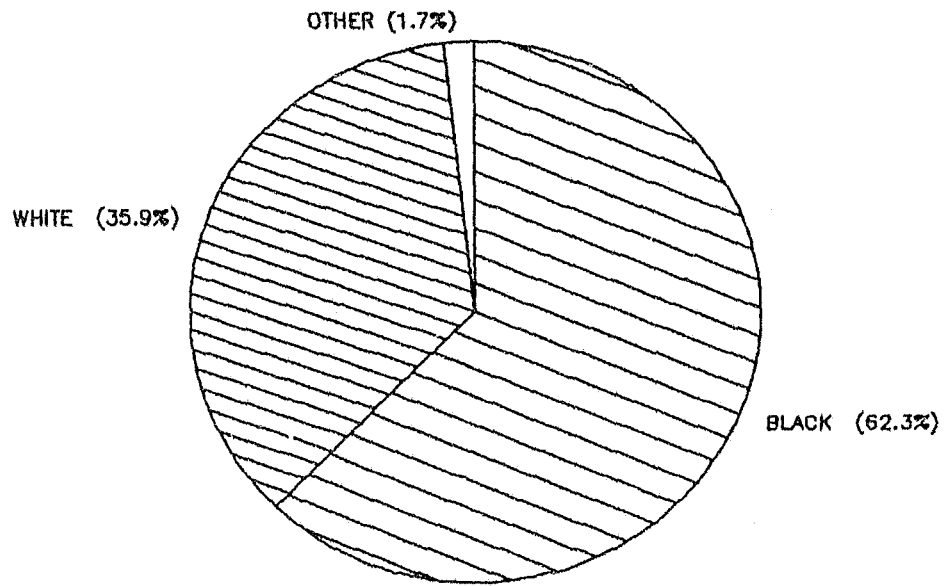

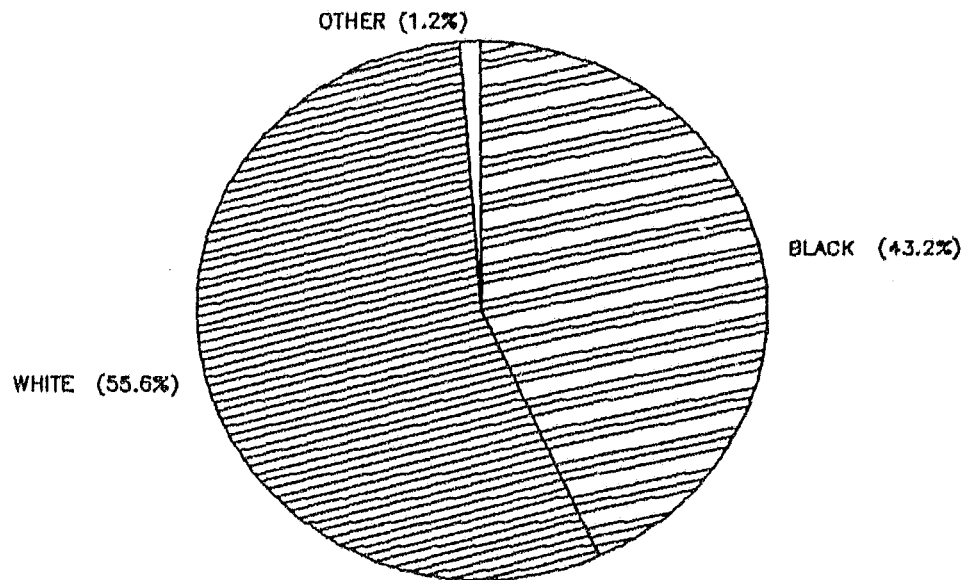
FEMALE RELEASES BY RACE

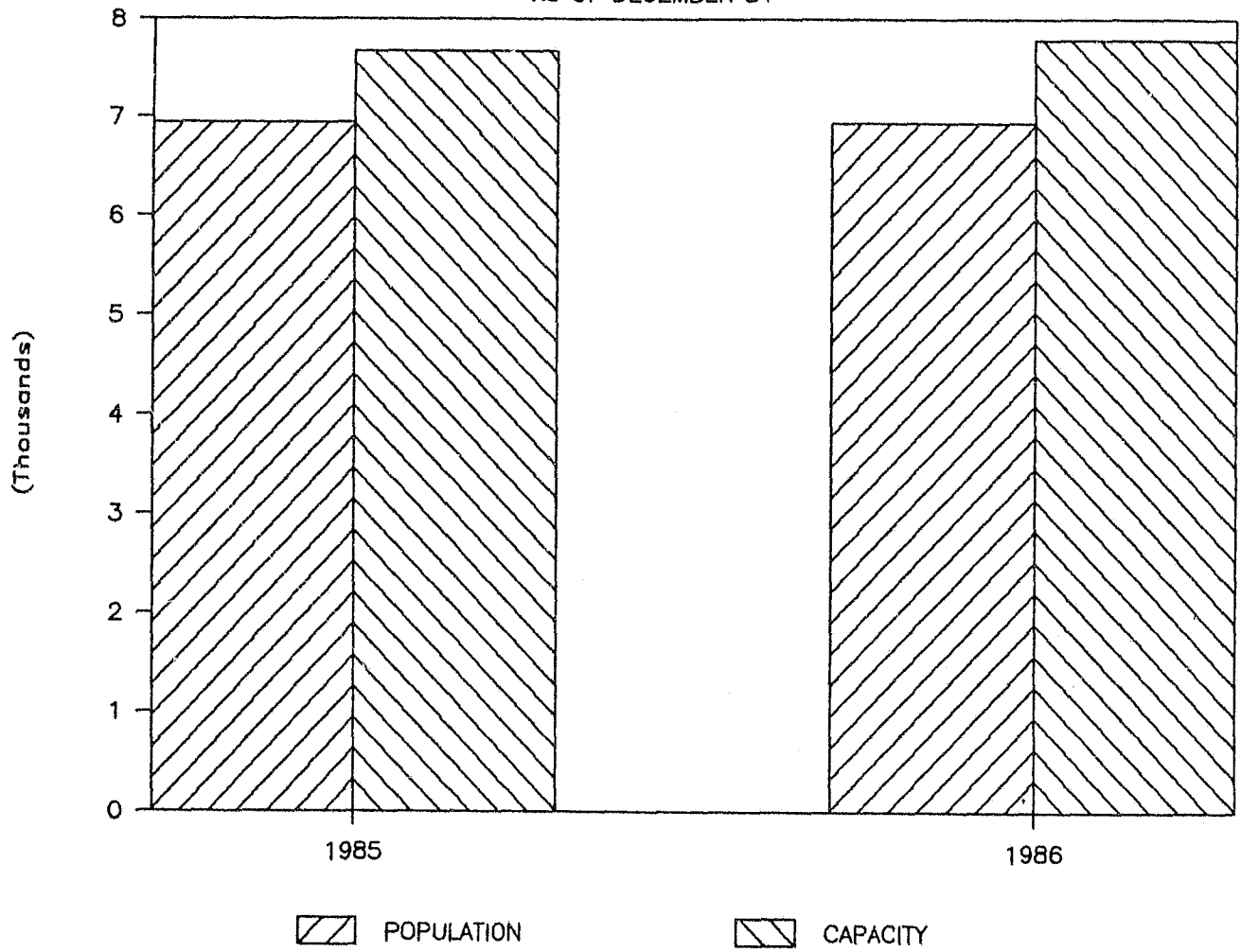

INMATE POPULATION VS. CAPACITY

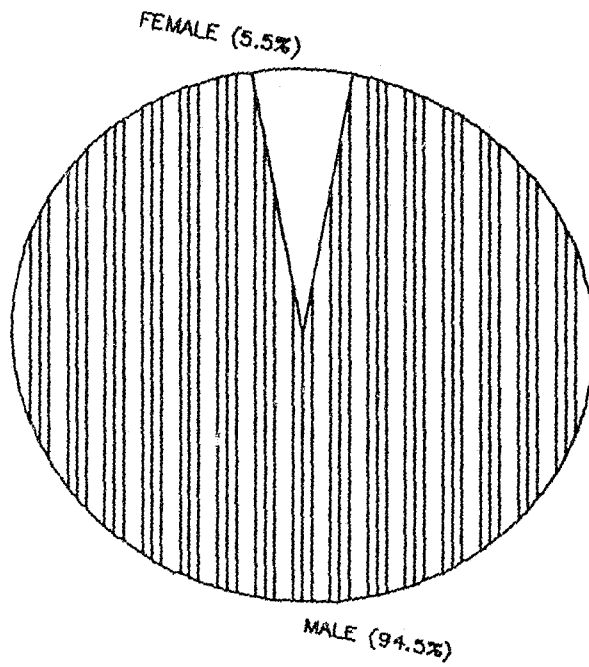

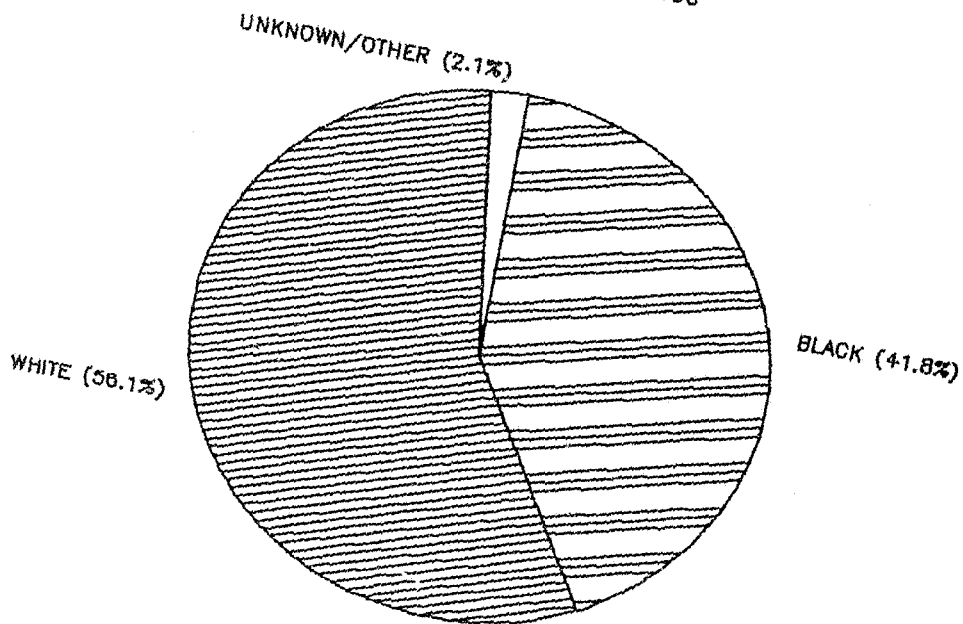

AS OF DECEMBER 31, 1986

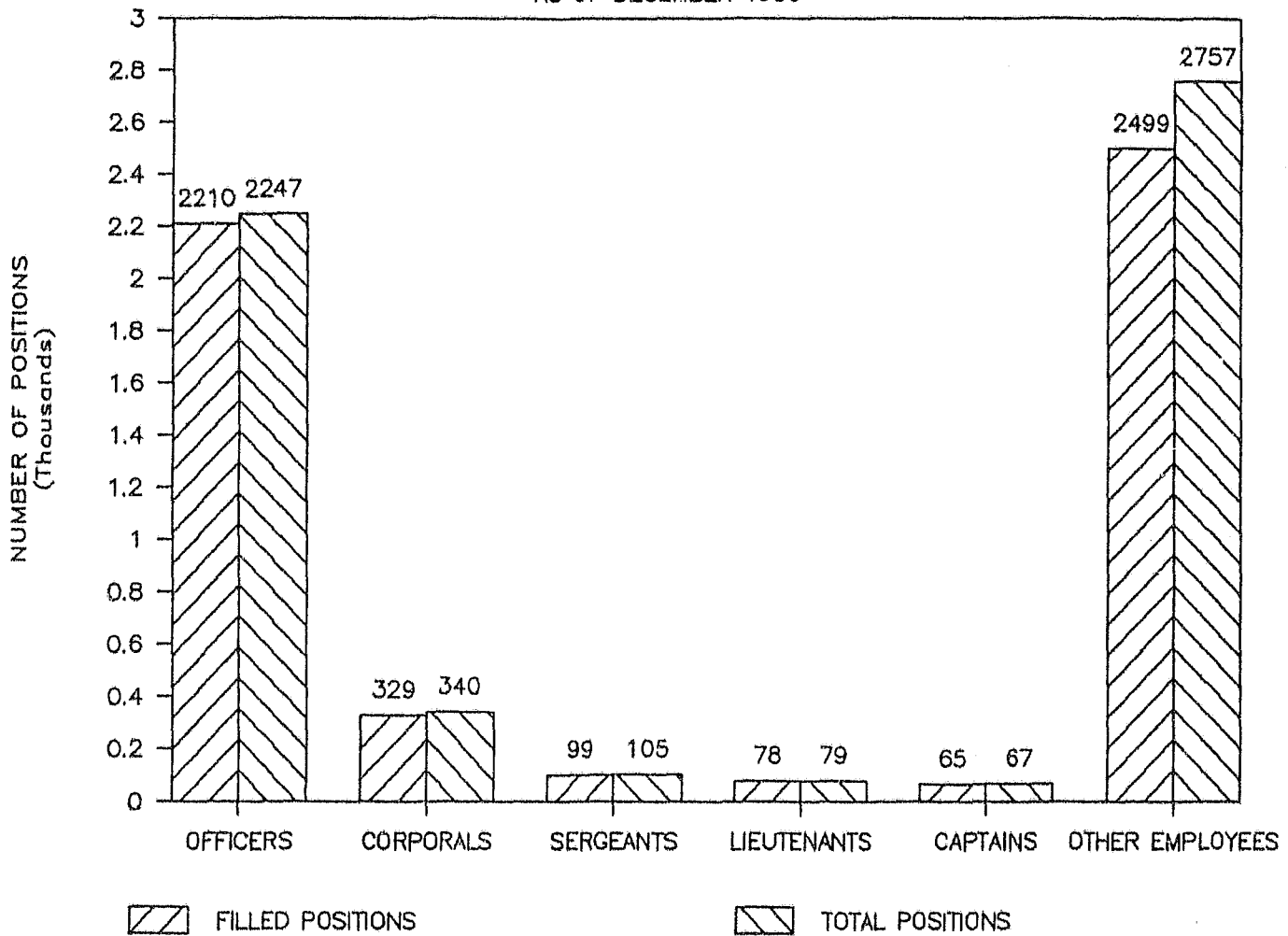


INMATE POPULATION BY RACE

ADULT SECURITY POSITIONS

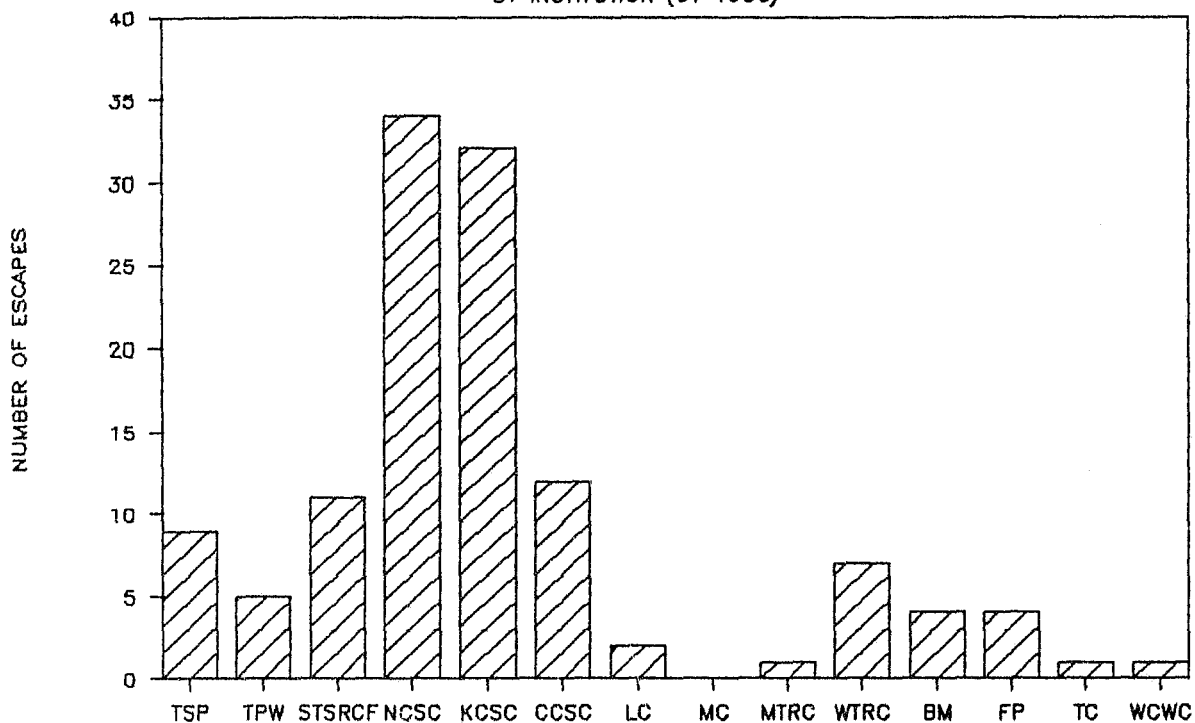

ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS

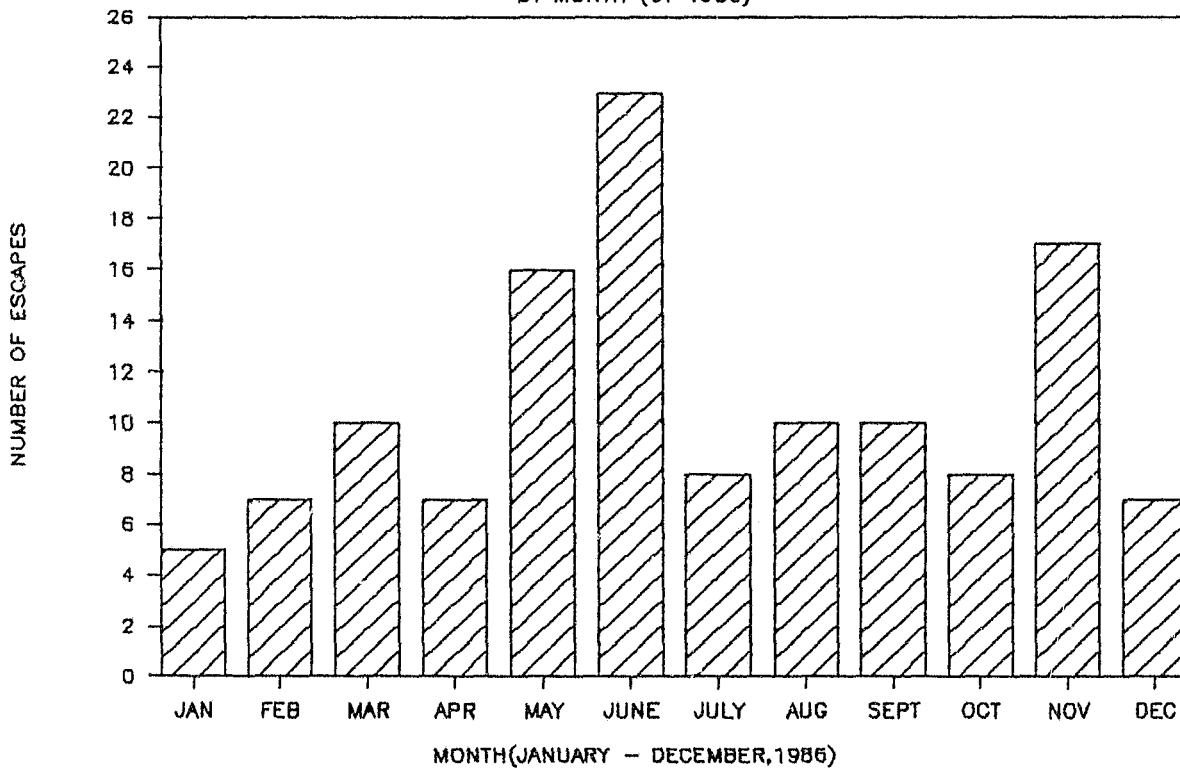
BY INSTITUTION (CY 1986)

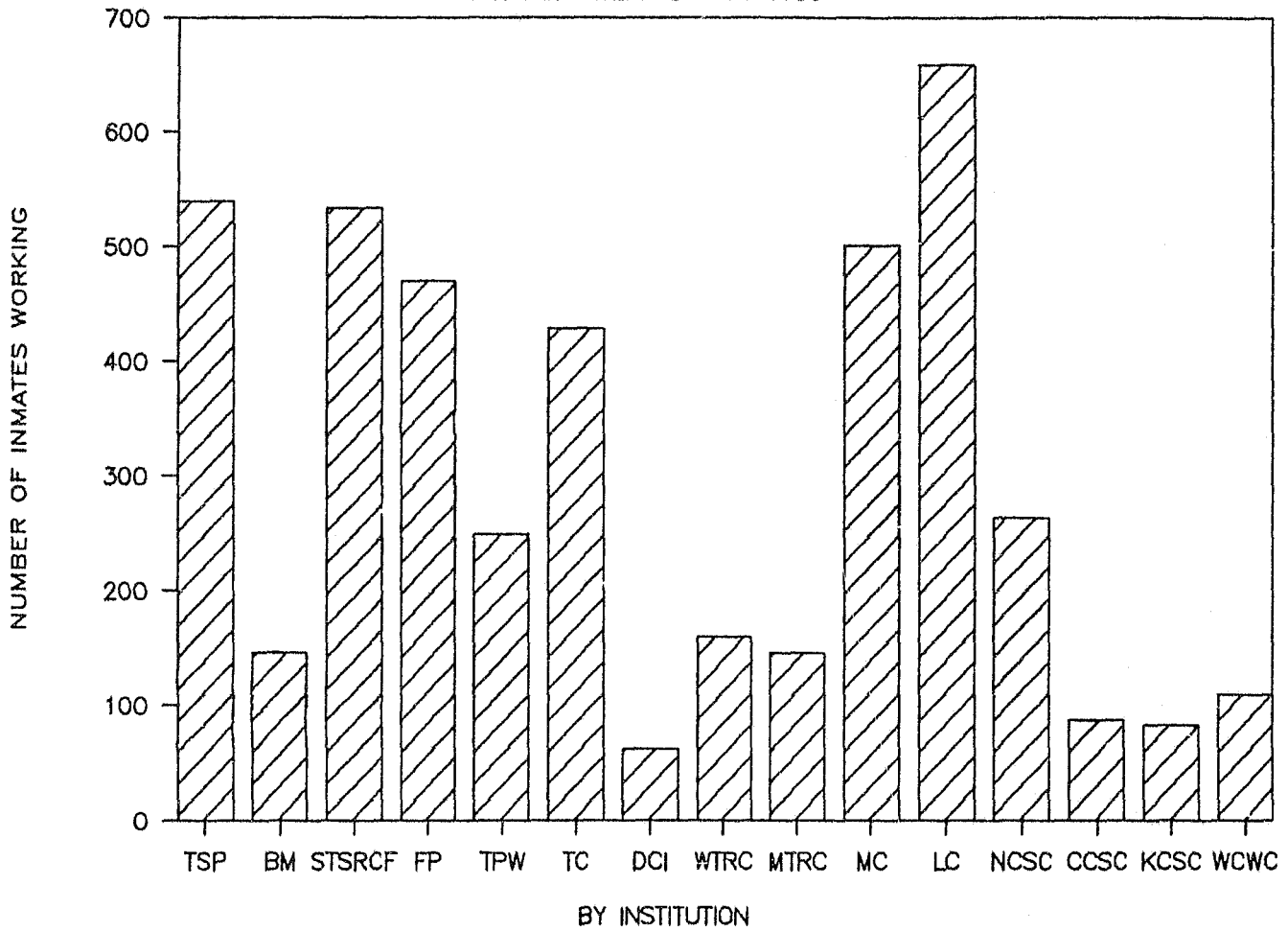
ESCAPES FROM ADULT INSTITUTIONS

MONTHLY AVERAGE - CY 1986

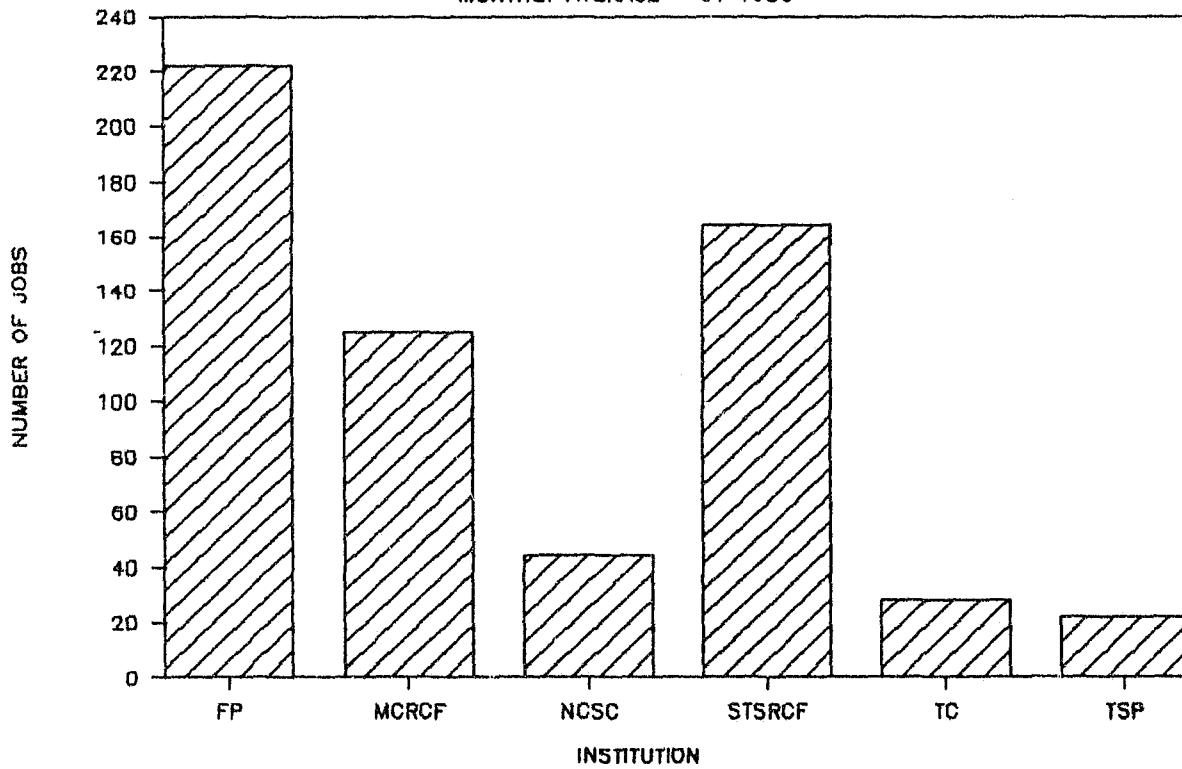

INMATE JOBS (FARMS)

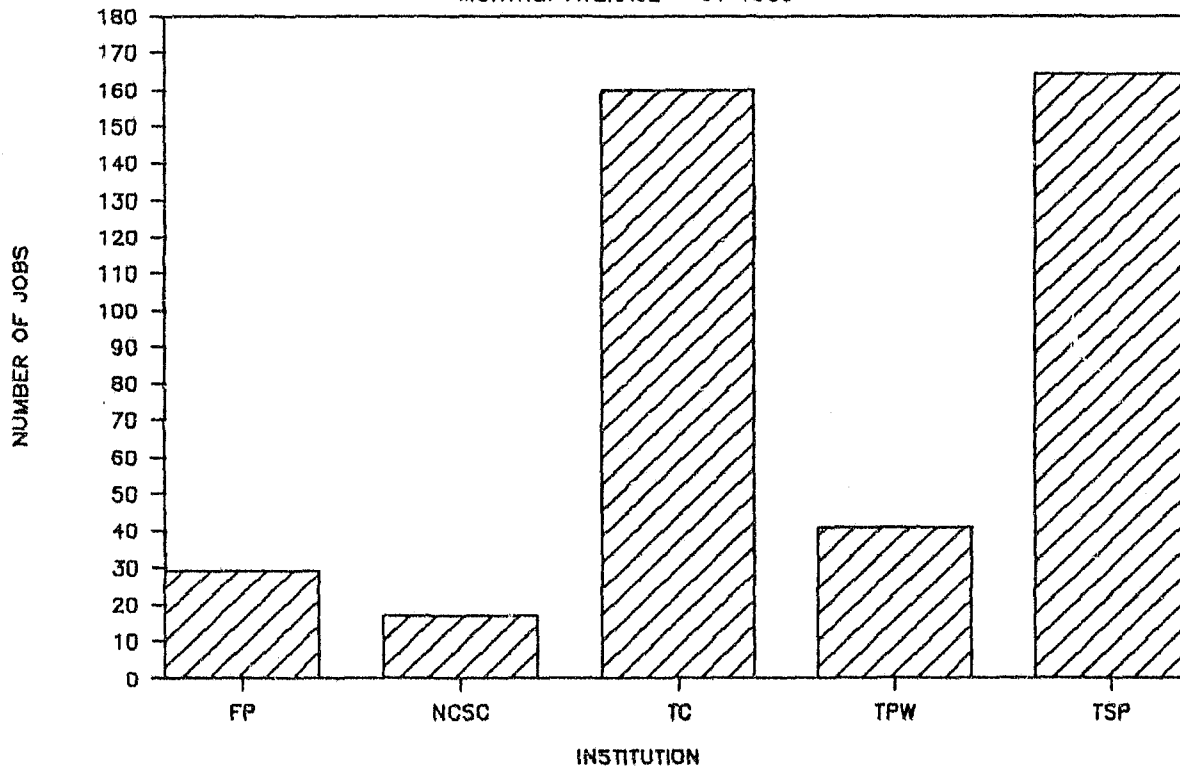
MONTHLY AVERAGE - CY 1986

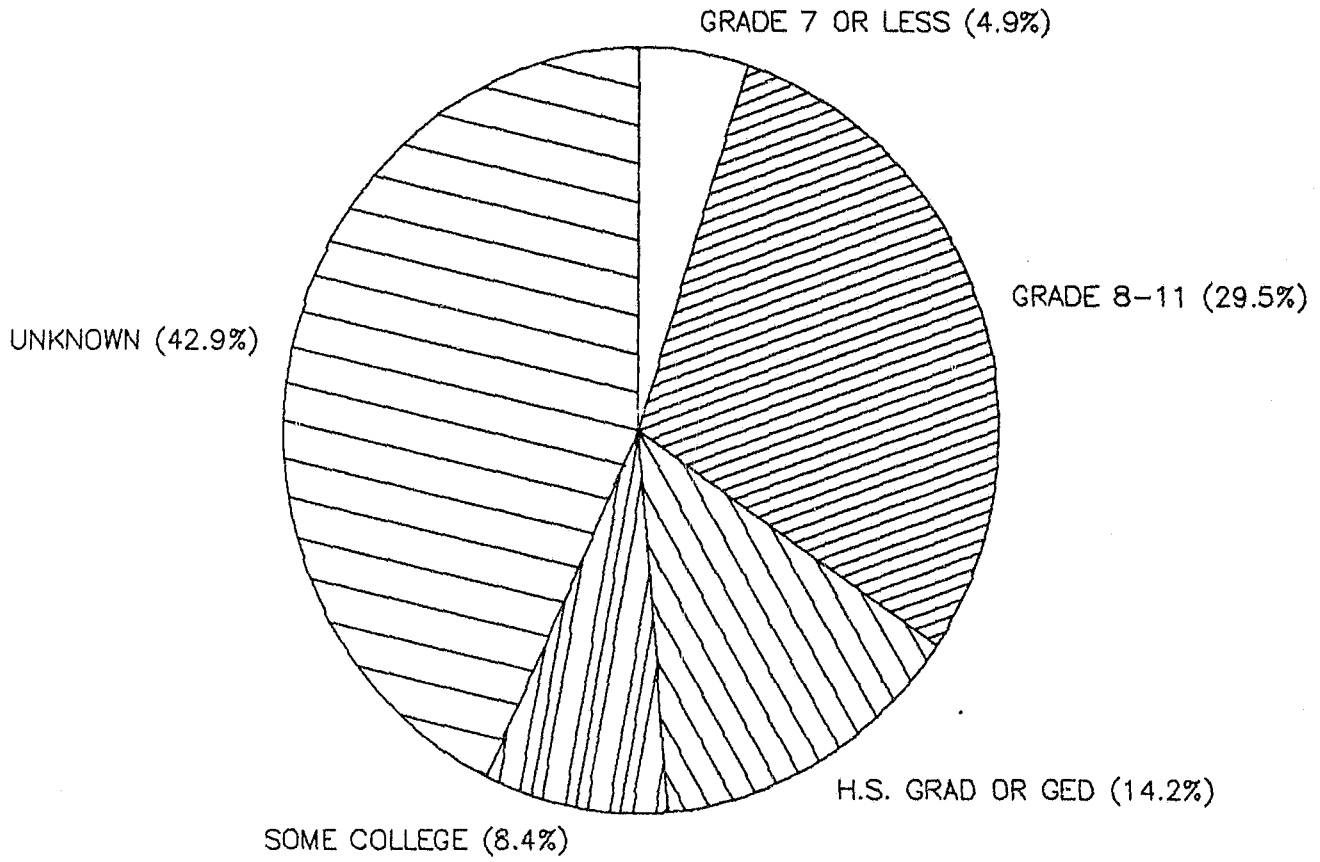
INMATE JOBS (INDUSTRIES)

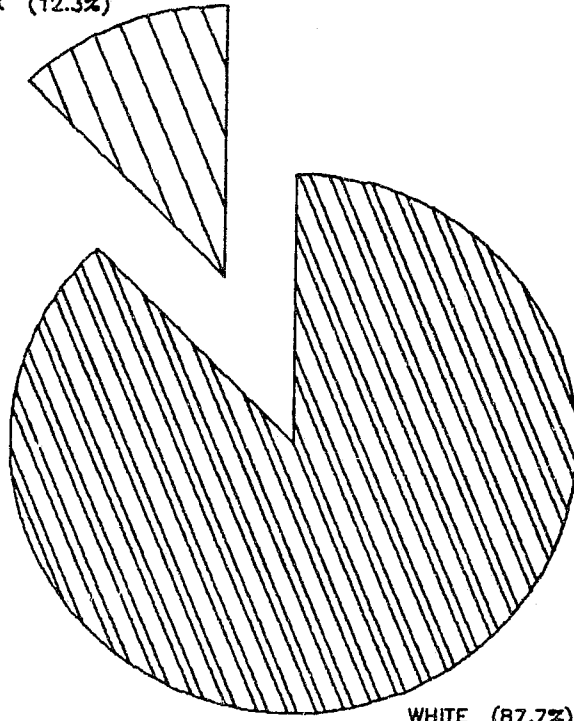

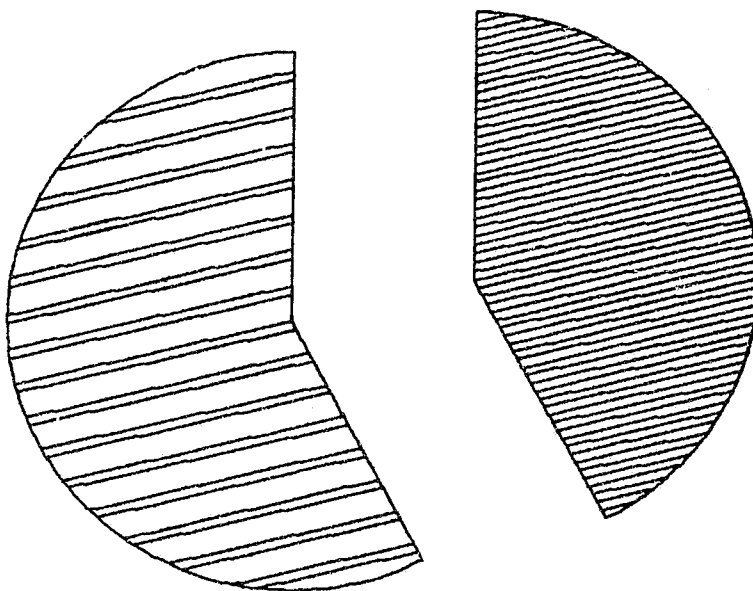

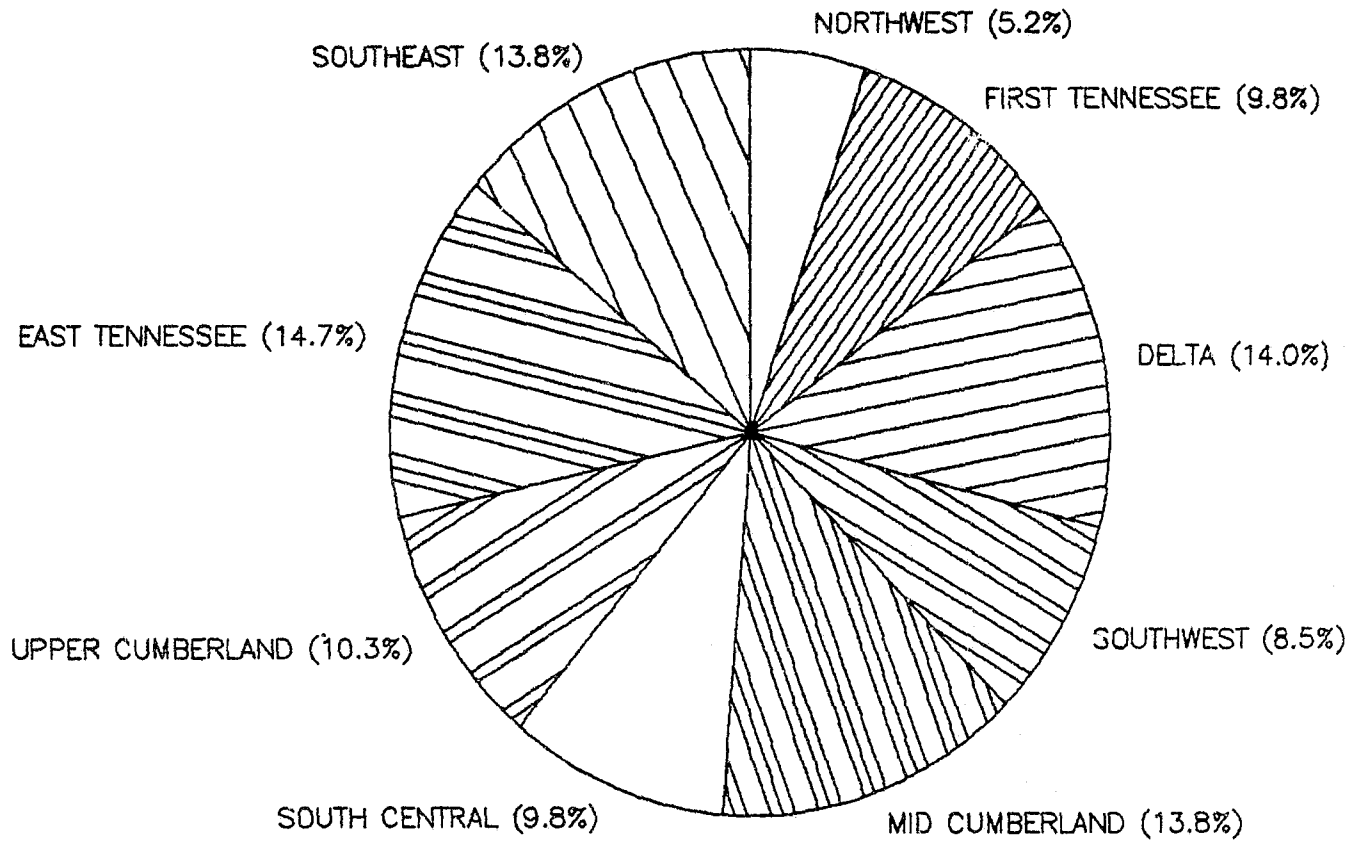

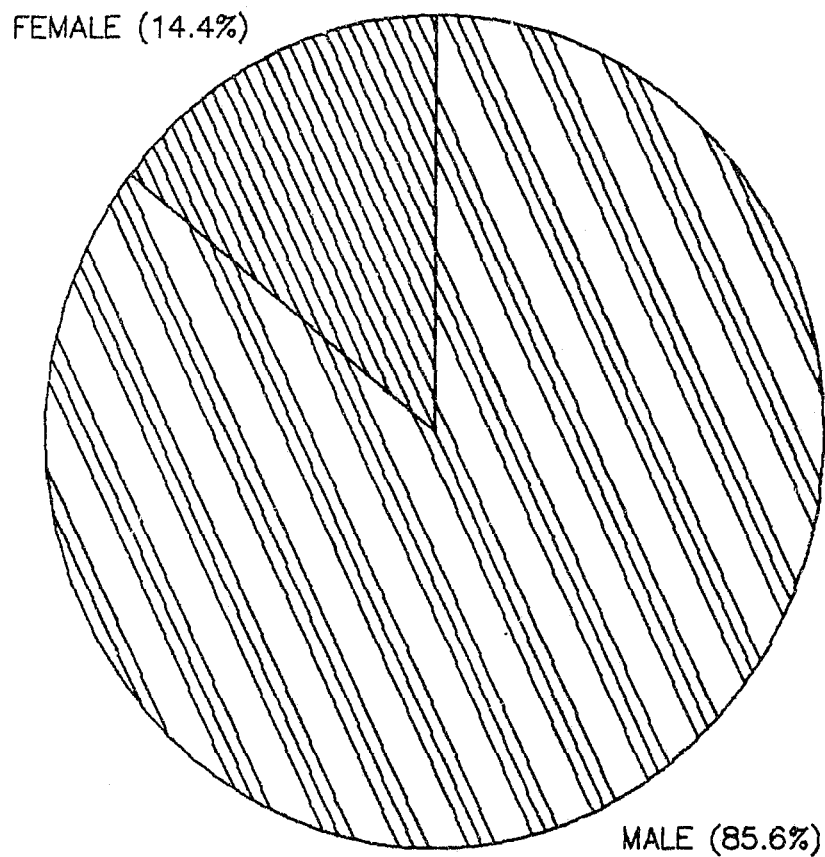

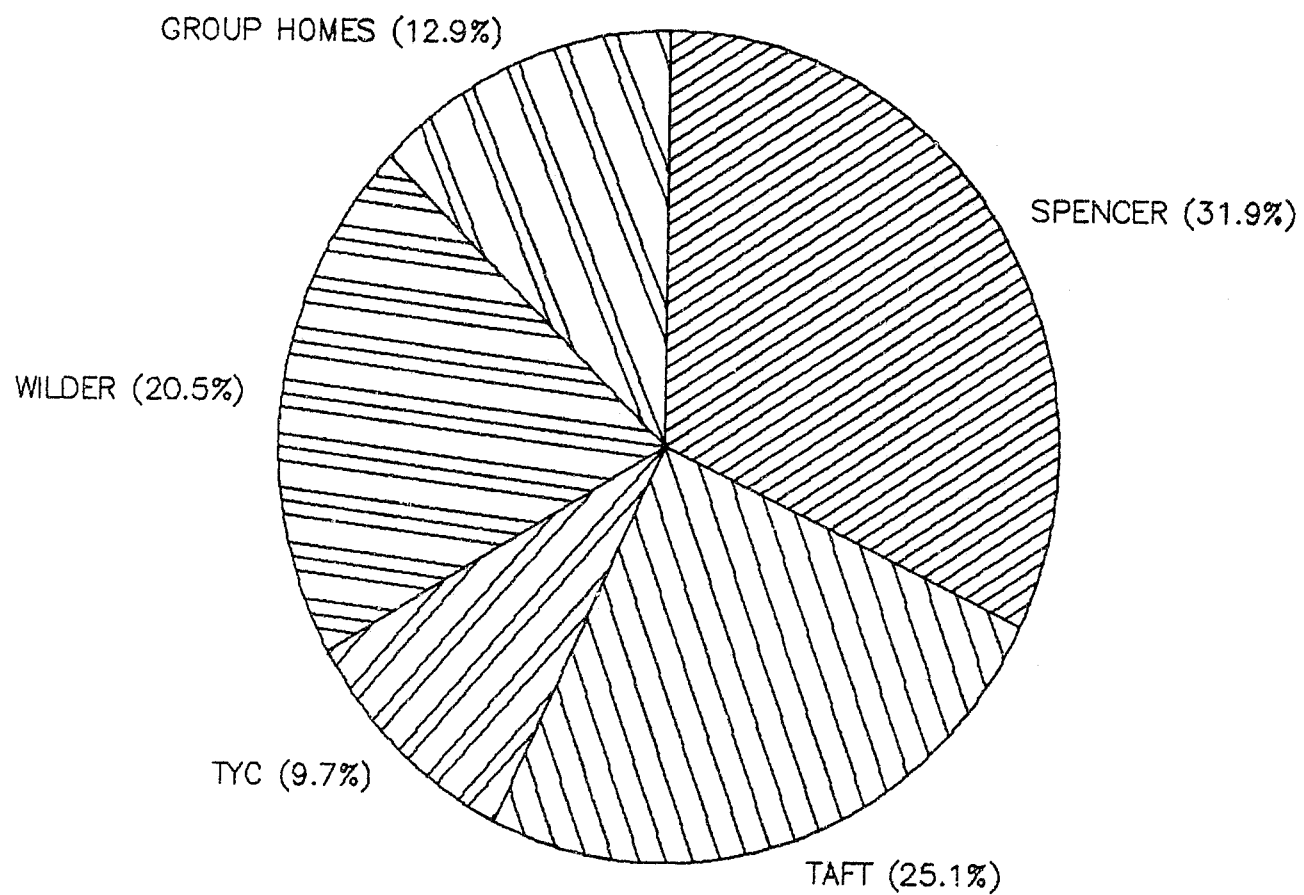
JUVENILE POPULATION BY SEX
