

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1987 Calendar Year Summary of
Population Movement

Information about the volume and movement of persons supervised by Wisconsin's Division of Corrections during calendar year 1987 in facilities for adult or juvenile offenders and in the community on probation, parole, mandatory release, special action early release, or juvenile aftercare status is summarized in this publication. Table 1 provides data about the types (new adult sentence, first release to adult parole, etc.) and volume of movements into and out of correctional facilities for adult offenders. Offenders housed under contractual agreements in federal correctional facilities, correctional institutions operated by the State of Minnesota, and in the Ferris Center, Dane County's Huber Law facility, are included in this table in the columns labeled "Contr Facil." The table also includes men resident at the Wisconsin Resource Center (WRC), an institution operated by the Division of Care and Treatment Facilities. Information about movements into and out of Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools, Wisconsin's two Division of Corrections-operated juvenile institutions, can be found in Table 2 while data about youth aids appears in Table 2-A. Community Services, i.e., probation and parole, information is displayed in Table 3 while 1987 absconder information is included in Table 4. Average daily populations for institution and community services cases for the years 1983-1987 can be found in Table A.

On December 31, 1987, the Division of Corrections was responsible for the supervision of 36,895 offenders including:

- ° 5,968 (16.2 percent) in correctional facilities for adults,
- ° 540 (1.5 percent) in juvenile correctional institutions,
- ° 26,576 (72.0 percent) under some type of supervision in the community, and
- ° 3,811 (10.3 percent) individuals on absconder status.

These figures represent an increase of 6.0 percent over January 1, 1987, when a total of 34,825 offenders were under supervision.

The total number of persons incarcerated in facilities for adult offenders rose from 5,552 at the start to 5,968 at the end of calendar year 1987; an increase of 7.5 percent. The population confined in facilities for adult males increased 7.9 percent from 5,281 at the beginning to 5,675 at the end of 1987 while facilities for adult female offenders reported an increase of 8.1 percent from 271 to 293 during the same time period. Juvenile institution resident populations rose from 492 at the start to 540 at the end of 1987; an increase of 9.8 percent. Community Services, probation and parole, caseloads increased 4.3 percent from 25,483 on January 1 to 26,576 on December 31, 1987. During the same time period the absconder population rose from 3,296 to 3,811; an increase of 15.6 percent.

Table A presents average daily populations for Community Services and institutions for the calendar years 1983-1987. Information about absconder populations for the years 1983-1987 has been excluded from this table. Average daily populations were arrived at by computing averages for each month of the year, totaling the results, and dividing by twelve to arrive at calendar year figures.

The average daily population of offenders under the supervision of the Division of Corrections in either a field or institutional setting rose to a five-year high of 32,055 in 1987; an increase of 5.1 percent over 1986 when an average daily population of 30,501 was recorded and an increase of almost one-fifth (18.1 percent) over the low of 27,150 reported during calendar year 1983. The largest increase during the five-year period, 5.2 percent, occurred between 1983 and 1984 while the smallest, 3.3 percent, was noted between 1984 and 1985. Four-fifths (80.2 percent) of the offenders supervised by the Division of Corrections were in a field as opposed to institutional setting; a fact that held true during the five-year period.

Community supervision cases average daily populations rose steadily from 21,968 during calendar year 1983 to 25,718 during 1987; an increase of 17.1 percent. The average daily population for persons under some type of probation supervision, which was 18,680 in 1983, increased 17.8 percent to 22,008 in calendar year 1987. Parole average daily populations, which remained at about the same level in calendar years 1984 (3,525 cases) and 1985 (3,516 cases), increased 4.9 percent to 3,688 cases in 1986, and remained at about that level (3,710 cases) in 1987. The absence of juvenile probation cases after 1984 and the decrease in youthful offender cases on both probation and parole are due to. 1) the 1978 revision of the Children's Code and a Department of Health and Social Services policy decision to no longer accept juvenile probation cases for supervision and 2) the repeal of the Youthful Offender Statute, effective July 1, 1978.

The overall institution average daily populations rose steadily reaching a five-year high of 6,337 in calendar year 1987; an increase of 22.3 percent over calendar year 1983 when an average daily population of 5,182 was reported. The smallest increase, 1.8 percent, occurred between 1983 and 1984; the largest, 8.2 percent, between 1986 and 1987. The average daily population of offenders incarcerated in facilities for adults rose from 4,716 in 1983 to 5,822 in 1987; an increase of 23.5 percent. The largest increase, 8.9 percent was noted between 1986 and 1987 while the smallest, 1.7 percent, took place between 1983-1984. Juvenile institution average daily populations reached a high of 531 in calendar year 1985, decreased (3.8 percent) to 511 in 1986 and remained at that level, 515 in 1987.
