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
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Residents in Wisconsin Juvenile Correctional Institutions on June 30, 1985 With Five-Year Trends for 1981-1985

Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools, operated by the Division of Corrections, are Wisconsin's correctional facilities for juvenile offenders. Ethan Allen School, located in southeastern Wisconsin (Waukesha County), provides residential care and treatment for boys, while Lincoln Hills School, located in the northern part of the state (Lincoln County), is the only state-operated coeducational correctional facility. Youths found to be delinquent may be sent to these facilities under provisions of the Children's Code which was revised in November, 1978. The Code states that children who are found to be delinquent and in need of treatment and supervision may be committed to a state-operated correctional institution only if (1) they have been found guilty of an offense which would have resulted in a sentence of at least six months had it been committed by an adult and (2) are deemed to be in need of treatment in a secure custodial setting because of the potential for danger to themselves and/or society. Five hundred and sixty youths who met the criteria noted above were in residence on June 30, 1985; 346 boys at Ethan Allen and 176 boys and 38 girls at Lincoln Hills. These figures represent an increase (18.9 percent) over June 30, 1984 when 471 juveniles, 312 at Ethan Allen and 159 at Lincoln Hills, were in residence. Tables 1 through 11 provide some basic information, including age, race and ethnicity, and major delinquent act prior to admission, about the juveniles in residence on June 30, 1985. Five-year trend data for 1981-1985 can be found in Appendix Tables A and B while Maps A and B display the June 30, 1985 resident population by sex and county of commitment.

Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools housed a total of 522 juvenile boys on June 30, 1985; an increase of 20.3 percent over the previous year when 434 boys were in residence. Two-thirds (66.3 percent) were at Ethan Allen with the remaining one-third (33.7 percent) located at Lincoln Hills. Residents classified as new commitments made up slightly more than three-fourths (78.6 percent) of the population at Ethan Allen and just under nine-tenths (89.2 percent) at Lincoln Hills. Boys who returned to the institutions following revocation of some type of aftercare supervision made up slightly less than one-fifth (18.2 percent) and almost one-tenth (9.6 percent) of the June 30, 1985

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
populations at Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools. Thirteen boys, 11 at Ethan Allen and 2 at Lincoln Hills, were awaiting the outcome of aftercare supervision revocation hearings. Lincoln Hills generally receives boys committed from the 53 counties north of the line drawn across the state on Map A while boys from the 19 counties south of the line are usually received at Ethan Allen. It should be noted that boys may be transferred between these two facilities as case needs dictate. Slightly over one-half (52.5 percent) of the boys in residence on June 30, 1985 had been committed to the institutions from Milwaukee County. Seven counties, Dane (31), Racine (25), Outagamie (17), Rock (13), Waukesha (13), Kenosha (11), and Marathon (11), had committed just under one-fourth (23.2 percent) of the boys. Twenty-five out of Wisconsin's 72 counties were not represented in the resident population. (See Map A and Table 3.) Just under one-half (48.8 percent) of the boys were reported to be White, while Blacks and Native Americans made up respectively over two-fifths (45.4 percent) and less than one-tenth (4.3 percent) of the residents. Thirtyfive boys (6.7 percent) came from families with a Hispanic ethnic and cultural background. The average (mean) age for boys at Ethan Allen was 16.2 years; at Lincoln Hills, 16.1 years.

The major delinquent acts most often committed prior to admission by boys in residence at Ethan Allen were found to be armed robbery (21.7 percent), battery (17.6 percent), and theft (17.3 percent). Those in residence at Lincoln Hills had most often committed unarmed burglary (26.2 percent), auto theft (18.2 percent), and battery (9.1 percent) just prior to being admitted. Just under one-fifth (19.7 percent) of the boys at Ethan Allen, as contrasted with less than one-tenth (8.5 percent) of those at Lincoln Hills, were reported to be without any problems relating to assaultiveness, sexual behavior, or drug and/or alcohol usage. Assaultiveness, either alone or in combination with problems relating to sexual behavior or drugs and/or alcohol, was noted among slightly more than three-fifths (62.4 percent) of the boys in residence on June 30, 1985. Difficulties in dealing with sexual behavior was found to be a problem for just over one-tenth (13.5 percent) while drug and/or alcohol problems were found to be present in almost three-tenths (28.0 percent) of the residents.

Thirty-eight girls, 32 (84.2 percent) of whom were categorized as new admissions, were in residence at Lincoln Hills on June 30, 1985. Three of the residents had been reinstitutionalized following revocation of some type of

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aftercare supervision, 2 were being supervised for jurisdictions other than Wisconsin, and one was being held pending the completion of an aftercare supervision revocation hearing. Five counties in the southern third of the state, Milwaukee (14), Racine (4), Rock (3), Dane (2), and Waukesha (1), committed just under two-thirds (63.2 percent) of the girls in residence on June 30, 1985. It is interesting to note that only 13 of the state's 72 counties (18.1 percent) had representation in the resident population. (See Map B and Table 3). Exactly one-half (50.0 percent) of the girls were reported to be White while just under one-third (31.6 percent) were Black. The remainder, including one girl from a Hispanic ethnic and cultural background, were Native Americans. The average (mean) age for girls in residence on June 30, 1985 was found to be 15.9 years.

The major delinquent acts most often committed just prior to admission by girls in residence on June 30, 1985 were theft (23.8 percent), battery (15.8 percent), and unarmed burglary (15.8 percent). Less than one-tenth (7.9 percent) of the girls were found to be without problems relating to assaultiveness, drug and/or alcohol usage, and sexual behavior. Just under two-fifths (39.6 percent) were found to have difficulties with assaultiveness while slightly over one-third (34.4 percent) had problems relating to sexual behavior. Drug and/or alcohol related problems, either alone or in combination with assaultive or sexual problems, were noted for more than one-half (55.4 percent) of the residents.
