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RESIDENTS IN WISCONSIN JUVENILE CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS ON DECEMBER 31, 1985 WITH FIVE-YEAR TRENDS FOR 1981-1985

Wisconsin's Division of Corrections is responsible for the operation of two correctional institutions for juvenile offenders: Ethan Allen School, which houses boys, and Lincoln Hills School, a coeducational facility. A total of 569 youths, 339 boys at Ethan Allen and 186 boys and 44 girls at Lincoln Hills, were in residence on December 31, 1985; an increase of 9.9 percent over the previous year when 518 juveniles including 45 girls were present. These children were institutionalized under provisions of Wisconsin's Children's Code which states that a child who has been found to be delinquent may be committed to a state-operated juvenile correctional institution if (1) he or she has been found guilty of an offense which would have resulted in a sentence of at least six months if committed by an adult and (2) if he or she is also found to be in need of treatment in a secure custodial setting because of potential danger either to themselves or to society. Tables 1 through 11 contain a variety of information about those in residence on December 31, 1985 while trend data for the years 1981-1985 may be found in Appendix Tables A and B. Illustrations of the geographic distribution of the resident population by sex and county of commitment appear in Maps A and B.

Five hundred and twenty-five boys, 339 at Ethan Allen and 186 at Lincoln Hills were in residence on December 31, 1985; an increase of 11.0 percent over the 473 reported the previous year. Four-fifths (83.0 percent) of the boys in residence on December 31, 1985 were classified as new commitments while those who had been returned following the revocation of some type of aftercare supervision made up less than one-fifth (14.3 percent) of the population. The remainder (2.7 percent) were boys who had been institutionalized pending the outcome of aftercare revocation hearings. Milwaukee County had committed just over one-half (52.8 percent) of the residents while somewhat less than one-fifth (17.2 percent) were committed by Dane (28 cases), Racine (26 cases), Rock (19 cases) and Kenosha (17 cases) counties. It is interesting to note that three-fourths (74.7 percent) of the resident population was committed to the institution from counties located to the south of the heavy line drawn on Map A. Ethan Allen serves, in most instances, as the reception center for boys

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committed from this area while those institutionalized from counties north of the line usually undergo the reception process at Lincoln Hills. Boys may be transferred between facilities as individual circumstances and needs dictate. Boys from White or Black racial backgrounds including those from families also reported to have a Hispanic ethnic heritage were equally represented (46.3 percent, 46.5 percent) in the resident population. The average (median) age for the total population was found to be 16.9 years. However, when average (median) age was computed for each institution the boys at Ethan Allen were found to be slightly older (17.0 years) than those at Lincoln Hills (16.8 years). Armed robbery (23.2 percent), battery (18.5 percent), and theft (14.5 percent) were the major delinquent acts most often committed prior to admission by boys in residence at Ethan Allen on December 31, 1985 while those at Lincoln Hills had been most often adjudicated delinquent for the acts of unarmed burglary (29.0 percent), auto theft (13.4 percent), and battery (9.8 percent).

Children who are institutionalized at Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools are evaluated in an effort to determine individual abilities, strengths, weaknesses, and problem areas. Information obtained during the evaluation process is used in the development of treatment plans which are designed to assist the children in finding ways to cope with or overcome problems as well as to further develop strengths and abilities. Just under one-fifth (17.9 percent) of the boys in residence on December 31, 1985 were without problems relating to assaultiveness, sexual behavior, or the use of drugs and/or alcohol. Somewhat over one-fourth (28.5 percent) were reported to have difficulties with the use of drugs and/or alcohol either singly or in combination with other problems. Assaultiveness, or assaultiveness along with problems relating to sexual behavior or misuse of drugs and/or alcohol, was noted as being an area of difficulty for about three-fifths (61.3 percent) of the resident population. Sexual behavior, either alone or in combination with drug and/or alcohol usage or assaultiveness, was found to be an area of concern for just over one-tenth (12.8 percent) of the residents.

Lincoln Hills School, Wisconsin's only coeducational correctional institution, housed 44 girls on December 31, 1985; one less than reported in residence the previous December. Nine out of 10 (90.9 percent) were reported to be new commitments, three were classified as returns to the institution following revocation of aftercare supervision, and one girl was being supervised for a

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jurisdiction other than Wisconsin. Over seven-tenths (72.7 percent) of the girls had been sent to the institution from seven counties, Milwaukee, Kenosha, Racine, Dane, Columbia, Ozaukee, and Waukesha, all of which are located in the southern one-third of the state. Fifty-six of the state's 72 counties (77.8 percent) had no representation in the December 31, 1985 resident population. (See Map B and Table 3). Slightly more than one-half (54.5 percent) of the girls were reported to be White while about one-third (31.8 percent) were Black. The remainder, including one girl from a Hispanic ethnic background, came from Native American families. The average (median) age for girls in residence on December 31, 1985 was 16.6 years.

Theft (25.0 percent), battery (18.1 percent), unarmed burglary (11.4 percent), and commercialized vice/prostitution (11.4 percent) were the major delinquent acts most often committed just prior to admission by girls in residence on December 31, 1985. One-half (50.0 percent) of the girls were found to have difficulty with assaultive behavior alone or in combination with problems relating to drug and/or alcohol usage or sexual misconduct. Problems with sexual behavior in itself or in conjunction with other problem areas was noted for somewhat over one-half (52.2 percent) of the residents while just under three-fifths (59.0 percent) were reported to have difficulties that related to the use of drugs and/or alcohol either singly or in conjunction with problems relating to sexual conduct or assaultiveness.
