



Residents in Wisconsin
Juvenile Correctional Institutions
on June 30, 1986
With Five-Year Trends for 1982-1986

Wisconsin's Division of Corrections is responsible for the operation of two correctional institutions for juvenile offenders. Ethan Allen School, which opened on April 1, 1959 and is located in Waukesha County in the southeastern part of the state, provides supervision and treatment for boys. Lincoln Hills School which is in the northern section of the state in Lincoln County opened as an institution for boys on August 12, 1970 and became a coeducational institution on June 1, 1972. Boys and girls are committed to these institutions under provisions of the Children's Code which states that children adjudicated delinquent may be committed to institutions operated by the Division of Corrections if it is determined that (1) they are guilty of an offense which would result in a sentence of at least six months if committed by an adult and (2) it is felt that they require treatment in a secure and custodial setting because circumstances indicate that they may be potentially dangerous to themselves and/or to society. On June 30, 1986 a total of 526 children were in residence; 287 boys at Ethan Allen and 203 boys and 36 girls at Lincoln Hills. These figures represent a decrease (6.1 percent) from the 560 residents, 522 boys and 38 girls, reported on June 30, 1985. Tables 1 through 11 are designed to provide some descriptive data about the boys and girls in residence on June 30, 1986 while Appendix Tables A and B provide selected trend data for the years 1982-1986.

Four hundred and ninety boys were in residence on June 30, 1986; a decrease of 6.1 percent from the 522 residents reported on June 30, 1985. About three-fifths (58.6 percent) were at Ethan Allen; the remainder (41.1 percent), at Lincoln Hills. It is interesting to note that while the overall male juvenile institution resident population decreased, the resident population at Lincoln Hill increased from 176 to 203 boys between June 30, 1985 and June 30, 1986. During the same time period the Ethan Allen population decreased from 346 to 287. Eight out of 10 (79.1 percent) of the boys at Ethan Allen and 9 out of 10 (93.6 percent) of those at Lincoln Hills at the end of June, 1986 were classified as new commitments. Those who returned to the institutions following revocation of some type of aftercare supervision made up somewhat more than one-tenth (13.2 percent) of the population at Ethan Allen and about one-twentieth (4.9 percent) at Lincoln Hills. The remaining boys in residence at either facility on June 30, 1986 were being held pending the outcome of aftercare supervision revocation hearings.

Ethan Allen School is usually designated as the reception institution for boys from the southern part of the state with Lincoln Hills serving in the same capacity for the central and northern sections. Transfers may be made between the institutions as case needs and circumstances dictate. Slightly more than three-fifths (63.4 percent) of the residents at Ethan Allen on June 30, 1986 were committed from Milwaukee County. In fact, 9 out of 10 residents at that institution (92.0 percent) were committed from

the counties making up the southern, southeastern, and Milwaukee Regions. One-fourth (25.6 percent) of those in residence at Lincoln Hills had also been committed from Milwaukee County while more than one-half (53.7 percent) had been committed from counties in the eastern, northern, and western regions. It should be noted that when the resident population is viewed as a whole 7 out of 10 (72.7 percent) were committed from counties in the southern one-third of the state. An average (median) age of 16.7 years was computed for the total group with boys at Ethan Allen being somewhat older (16.8 years) than those at Lincoln Hills (16.5 years). One-half (50.2 percent) of those in residence on June 30, 1986 were from White or White-Hispanic family backgrounds while somewhat less than one-half (45.3 percent) were from Black and Black-Hispanic families. Native Americans made up 3.6 percent of the resident population with the majority being in residence at Lincoln Hills.

Boys who were in residence at Ethan Allen School had most often committed, as major delinquent acts just prior to admission, armed robbery (15.6 percent), battery (12.5 percent), and theft (12.1 percent). Lincoln Hills residents had most often committed unarmed burglary (25.0 percent), battery (11.7 percent), and theft (10.8 percent) just prior to commitment. Less than one-tenth (7.3 percent) of the Ethan Allen residents and just over one-tenth (12.8 percent) of those at Lincoln Hills were found to be free from problems relating to assaultiveness, sexual behaviors, or mis-use of alcohol and/or other drugs. Almost two-thirds (64.1 percent) of the resident population at Ethan Allen was considered to have problems relating to assaultiveness as did about three-fifths (59.2 percent) of those at Lincoln Hills. Froblems with alcohol and/or other drugs were found to affect about three-tenths (31.3 percent) of the boys at Ethan Allen and over two-fifths (44.9 percent) of those at Lincoln Hills. Problems with sexual behavior were noted for about one-tenth (9.4 percent) of the residents at Ethan Allen , a fact which was also true for somewhat less than one-fifth (16.8 percent) of the boys at Lincoln Hills.

Thirty six girls, two less than the previous June, were in residence at Lincoln Hills on June 30, 1986. The majority (86.1 percent) were classified as new commitments while the remainder had been returned to the institution following revocation of state aftercare (11.1 percent) or TRY program (2.8 percent) supervision. Thirteen of the state's 72 counties were represented in the June 30, 1986 resident population. About two-fifths (41.7 percent) were committed to the institution from Milwaukee county, one-third (33.3 percent) from Racine, Rock, and Portage counties, and the remainder, one girl each, from Clark, Dane, Fond du Lac, Kenosha, LaCrosse, Langlade, Marathon, Outagamie, and Shawano counties. The average (median) age was found to be 16.7 years. Exactly one-half (50.0 percent) of the residents were found to be White, somewhat over two-fifths (44.4 percent) were from Black family backgrounds, and the remainder (5.6 percent) were of Native American heiritage. None were reported to be from Hispanic ethnic backgrounds.

The major delinquent acts most often committed by girls just prior to commitment to a juvenile institution were theft (30.5 percent) and battery (16.6 percent). Assaultive behavior was discovered to be a problem for about two-fifths (41.6 percent) of the girls while three-fifths (61.1 percent) were found to have problems relating to the use of alcohol and/or other drugs. Problems in the area of sexual behavior were noted for 4 out of 10 (44.3 percent) of the girls. Less than one-tenth (5.6 percent) of the girls in residence on June 30, 1986 were found to be free of problems relating to assaultiveness, sexual misbehavior, or misuse of alcohol and/or other drugs.
