



Residents in Wisconsin
Juvenile Correctional Institutions
on December 31, 1986
With Five-Year Trends for 1982-1986

Wisconsin's Children's Code provides that a child who has been adjudicated delinquent may be sent to a juvenile institution operated by the Division of Corrections if (1) the child has been found guilty of an offense which would have resulted in a sentence of at least six months had it been committed by an adult and (2) the court determines that, because of the potential for danger to the child and/or society, treatment in a secure and custodial setting is necessary. Four hundred and ninety-two children, 460 males and 32 females, who met these criteria, were in residence at Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools, Wisconsin's correctional institutions for juvenile offenders, on December 31, 1986. These figures represent a decrease of 13.5 percent from the 569 youths, 525 boys and 44 girls, in residence on December 31, 1985. Information including such items as race and ethnicity, major delinquent act, and county of commitment about youths in residence on December 31, 1986 can be found in Tables 1 through These tables are arranged so that comparisons can be made between institutions as well as between the sexes. Trend data for males and females in residence on December 31 in the years 1982 through 1986 can be found in Appendix Tables A and B.

Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools reported a total of 460 boys in residence on December 31, 1986; an overall decrease of 12.4 percent from the 525 residents reported on December 31, 1985. In terms of the individual institutions the resident population at Ethan Allen, which stood at 339 on December 31, 1985 dropped to 276, an 18.5 percent decrease, while the resident population at Lincoln Hills remained relatively stable at 184 boys, down two from the 186 residents reported on December 31, 1985. Eight out of 10 (79.0 percent) of the boys at Ethan Allen and 9 out of 10 (91.4 percent) of those at Lincoln Hills were found to be new commitments to the institution. Boys returned to institution supervision following the revocation of some type of aftercare supervision in the community made up somewhat more than one-tenth (13.4 percent) of the resident population at Ethan Allen and somewhat less than one-tenth (6.5 percent) at Lincoln The remainder of the boys in residence on December 31, 1986 were, with the exception of one youth at Lincoln Hills who was being supervised for a non-Wisconsin jurisdiction, individuals institutionalized pending the outcome of some type of aftercare supervision revocation hearing.

Ethan Allen serves, in most cases, as the reception facility for boys committed from counties located in the southern one-third of Wisconsin while Lincoln Hills generally provides such services for the remainder of the state. Transfers between the institutions may be made as dictated by individual case needs. Just under one-half (46.7 percent) of the boys in residence on December 31, 1986 were committed to the institution by Milwaukee County courts while almost one-fifth (18.7 percent) were committed by Racine (26 cases), Rock (22 cases), Dane (21 cases), and Kenosha (17 cases) counties. Twenty-two of the state's 72 counties (30.6 percent) were without representation in the December 31, 1986 resident population.

In terms of racial and ethnic background, the December 31, 1986 resident population was fairly evenly divided between boys from White and White-Hispanic (47.3 percent) and Black and Black-Hispanic (48.0 percent) families. Native Americans, including those with a Hispanic ethnic heir-itage made up only 4.1 percent of the population while one boy was reported to be of Asian ancestry. The average (median) age for all boys in residence was found to be 16.7 years. Residents at Ethan Allen were found to have an average (median) age of 16.7 years while those at Lincoln Hills were slightly younger (16.5 years). Boys in residence at Ethan Allen had most often committed theft (15.5 percent), unarmed burglary (14.8 percent), and battery (13.7 percent) just prior to admission while those at Lincoln Hills had most often been involved in unarmed burglary (31.0 percent), theft (12.5 percent), and auto theft (12.5 percent).

Each child who is sent to Ethan Allen or Lincoln Hills School is evaluated in an effort to assess his abilities, strengths, weaknesses, and problem areas. Information found during this evaluation process is then used to assist in the development of a treatment plan designed to assist the child to further develop his abilities and strengths as well as overcome or cope with his problems or weaknesses. Boys who were without problems relating to assaultiveness, sexual behavior, or the usage of alcohol and/or other drugs made up just over one-tenth (12.8 percent) of those in residence on December 31, 1986. One-third (33.3 percent) were reported to have difficulties with the use of alcohol and/or other drugs either singly or in conjunction with other problems. Almost three-fifths (58.3 percent) were found to have difficulties with assaultiveness either alone or in combination with sexual behavior problems and/or problems arising from the usage of alcohol and/or other drugs. Sexual behavior, either alone or in combination with assaultiveness or the abuse of alcohol and/or other drugs was found to be a problem area for almost one-tenth (9.8 percent) of the residents.

Thirty-two girls were in residence at Lincoln Hills School, Wisconsin's only coeducational correctional institution, on December 31, 1986; a decrease of 27.3 percent from the previous December 31 when a resident population of 44 girls was reported. Nine out of 10 (90.6 percent) were classified as new commitments, two girls had been reinstitutionalized following revocation of state aftercare supervision, and one girl was awaiting the outcome of a state aftercare supervision revocation hearing. Girls committed from four counties, Milwaukee (13 cases), Brown (4 cases), Rock (3 cases), and Winnebago (2 cases) made up over one-half (56.3 percent) of the December 31, 1986 resident population. Fifty-nine of the state's 72 counties (81.9 percent) had no representation in the resident population. Girls from White and Black family backgrounds were equally represented in the resident population with each accounting for somewhat more than twofifths (43.7 percent) of the group. Native Americans made up the remainder (12.6 percent) of those in residence. None of the girls were reported to be from a Hispanic ethnic background. The average (median) age for girls in residence on December 31, 1986 was found to be 16.3 years.

Battery, unarmed burglary, theft, and auto theft were each found to have been the major delinquent act committed just prior to admission by 15.6 percent of the girls. Just over two-fifths (43.7 percent) of the girls were found to have problems with assaultive behavior either singly or in some type of combination with difficulties in regard to sexual behavior or the misuse of alcohol and/or other drugs. Just under two-fifths (37.5 percent) were reported to have difficulties relating to sexual behavior either singly or in conjunction with other types of problems while usage of alcohol and/or other drugs either alone or in unison with other areas of difficulty was noted for one-third (32.9 percent) of the girls.
