Residents in Wisconsin
Juvenile Correctional Institutions
on June 30, 1987
With Five-Year Trends for 1983-1987

Five hundred and fifteen children, 480 boys and 35 girls, were in residence at Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools, Wisconsin's institutions for juvenile offenders, on June 30, 1987. These figures represent a slight decrease (2.1 percent) from the 526 residents, 490 boys and 36 girls, reported on June 30, 1986. Boys and girls are committed to these institutions under provisions of the state's Children's Code which states that following an adjudication of delinquency a child may be committed to a facility operated by the Division of Corrections if (1) he or she has been found quilty of an act which would result in a sentence of at least six months if committed by an adult and (2) that circumstances indicate that treatment should be carried out in a secure, restrictive setting because of the potential for danger to the child and/or the community. Descriptive data about the boys and girls in residence on June 30, 1987 can be found in Tables 1 through 11, while Appendix Tables A and B present selected trend data for those in residence on June 30 in the years 1983 through 1987.

The number of boys in residence, which stood at 490 on June 30, 1986, dipped slightly (2.0 percent) to 480 on June 30, 1987. Just over three-fifths (61.1 percent) were at Ethan Allen School while the remainder (38.9 percent) were housed at Lincoln Hills School. Although the overall male juvenile resident population showed a slight decrease, the population at Ethan Allen School increased from 287 to 293 boys between June 30, 1986 and June 30, 1987, while the number in residence at Lincoln Hills dropped from 203 to 187 during the same time period; a decrease for that facility of 7.9 percent. Boys classified as new commitments made up about four-fifths (79.1 percent) of the population at Ethan Allen and almost nine-tenths (85.6 percent) at Lincoln Hills. Somewhat less than one-fifth (16.1 percent) of the residents at Ethan Allen and just over one-tenth (11.2 percent) of those at Lincoln Hills had been reinstitutionalized following the revocation of some type of supervision in the community; i.e., state or county aftercare supervision or TRY or WMHI program The remainder of the boys in both facilities had been supervision. returned to the institution to await the outcome of aftercare supervision revocation hearings.

Seven out of 10 (69.6 percent) of the boys in residence at Ethan Allen School on June 30, 1987 were committed from Milwaukee County, while an additional one-fourth (24.6 percent) were sent to the institutions from counties in the southern one-third of the state. The preponderance of boys from these areas of the state in the Ethan Allen resident population is largely due to the fact that this facility serves as the reception center for that area of the state, while Lincoln Hills School provides the same services for the central and northern sections of Wisconsin. Transfers between the two institutions may occur, as case needs and circumstances dictate. Just over three-fifths (61.0 percent) of the residents at Lincoln Hills were from counties in the upper two-thirds of the state, while about

one-fourth (26.2 percent) had been committed from Milwaukee County. The average (median) age for all boys in residence on June 30, 1987 was 16.7 years, with boys at Ethan Allen being somewhat older (16.9 years) than those at Lincoln Hills, where the average (median) age was found to be 16.5 years. Just under one-half (47.9 percent) of the boys in residence were from Black family backgrounds, while those from White or White-Hispanic families made up somewhat more than two-fifths (45.2 percent) of the population. American Indians, including those with a Hispanic ethnic and cultural background, made up less than one-tenth (6.3 percent) of the population.

The major delinquent acts most often committed just prior to admission by boys in residence at Ethan Allen on June 30, 1987 were found to be theft percent), battery (15.4 percent), and unarmed burglary Lincoln Hills residents had most often committed unarmed burglary (28.9 percent), auto theft (13.9 percent), and battery (10.3 percent) just prior to institutionalization. Evaluations carried out during the reception process indicate that a little more than one-tenth (13.9 percent) of the boys at Lincoln Hills and only 4.1 percent of those at Ethan Allen were free from problems relating to assaultiveness, sexual behavior, or the use of alcohol and/or other drugs. Almost three-fourths (73.8 percent) of the boys in residence at Ethan Allen and about three-fifths (59.3 percent) of those at Lincoln Hills were found to have problems with some type of assaultive behavior. Problems in dealing with sexual behavior were noted for almost one-fifth (19.7 percent) of the boys in residence at Lincoln Hills and just over one-tenth (11.6 percent) of those at Ethan Allen. The use of alcohol and/or other drugs was found to be a problem for slightly more than one-half (54.6 percent) of the boys at Ethan Allen and for slightly less than one-half (48.1 percent) of those at Lincoln Hills on June 30, 1987.

Hills School, the only coeducational facility operated by Lincoln Wisconsin's Division of Corrections, reported 35 girls in residence on June 30, 1987, one less than reported on the previous June 30. Eight out of 10 (80.0 percent) girls in residence on June 30, 1987 were classified as new commitments, 5 girls (14.2 percent) had been reinstitutionalized following the revocation of state juvenile aftercare supervision, and the remainder (5.8 percent) of the residents were girls who were returned to Lincoln Hills pending the outcome of some type of aftercare supervision revocation hearing. Girls from 16 of the state's 72 counties (22.2 percent) made up the resident population with slightly less than two-fifths (37.2 percent) having been committed from Milwaukee County. Commitments from four counties, Rock (3 cases) and Kenosha, Marinette, and Winnebago (2 cases) made up one-fourth (25.7 percent) of the population. It is interesting to note that the western and northern regions of the state, which contain exactly one-half of the state's 72 counties, were represented by only three girls, one each from LaCrosse, Douglas, and Oneida counties, in the June 30, 1987 resident population. White or White-Hispanic girls made up somewhat less than one-half (45.7 percent) of the population, four out of 10 (40.0 percent) were Black, and the remainder (14.3 percent) were classified as Native Americans. The average (median) age was found to be 16.3 years; the mean, 15.8 years.

Theft (20.0 percent), battery (17.1 percent), and armed robbery (11.3 percent) were the major delinquent acts most frequently committed just prior to admission by the girls in residence on June 30, 1987. Girls found to be free of problems relating to assaultiveness, the misuse of alcohol and/or other drugs, and sexual misbehaviors made up less than one-tenth (5.7 percent) of the population. About two-thirds (65.8 percent) of the residents were found to have problems with assaultive behavior, while sexual misbehavior was noted as an area of difficulty for just over one-third (34.3 percent) of the population. Seven out of 10 (68.6 percent) of the residents were found to have problems relating to the use of alcohol and/or other drugs.
