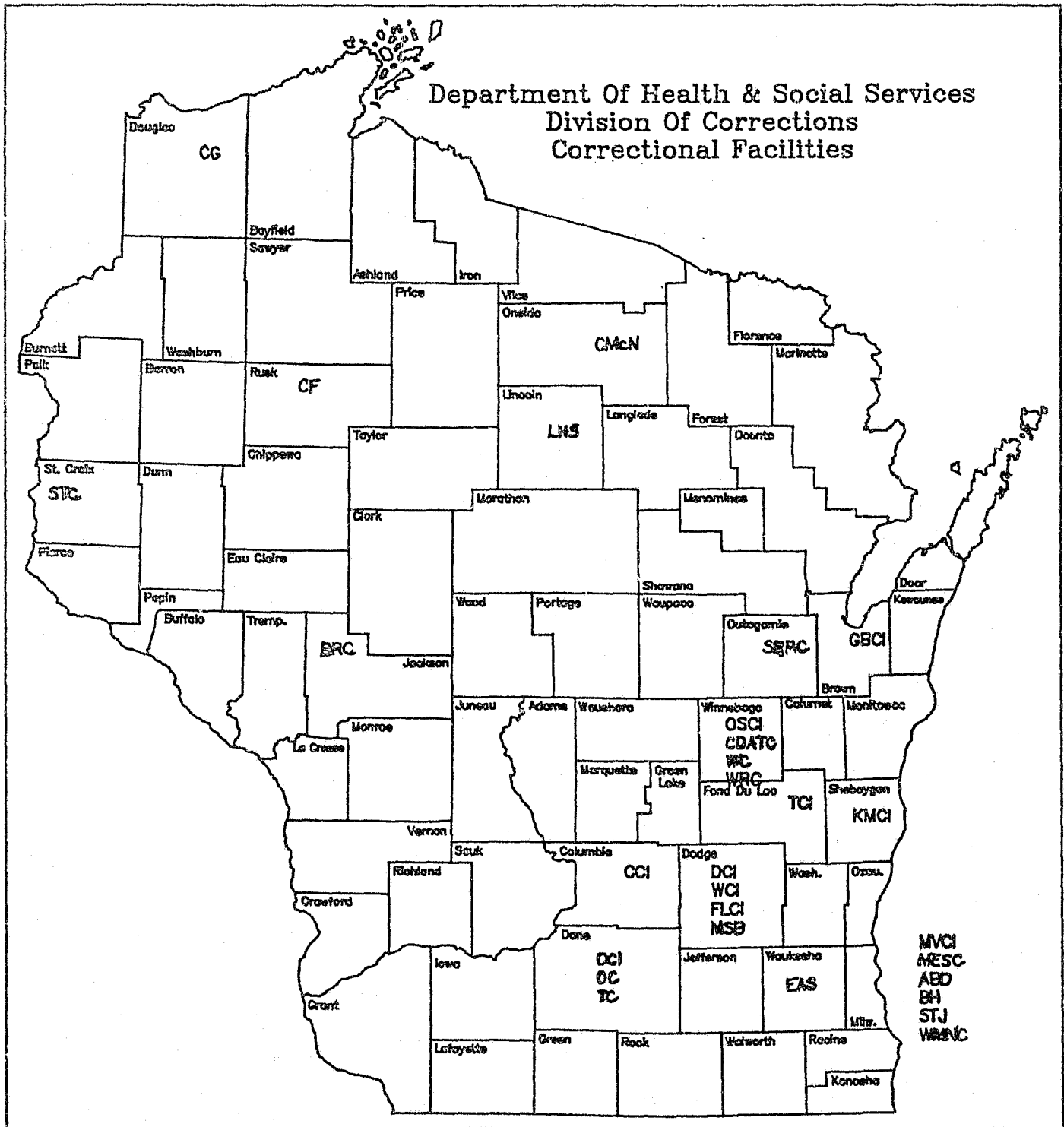

Residents in Wisconsin
Adult Correctional Facilities
on June 30, 1984
With Five-Year Trends for 1980-1984

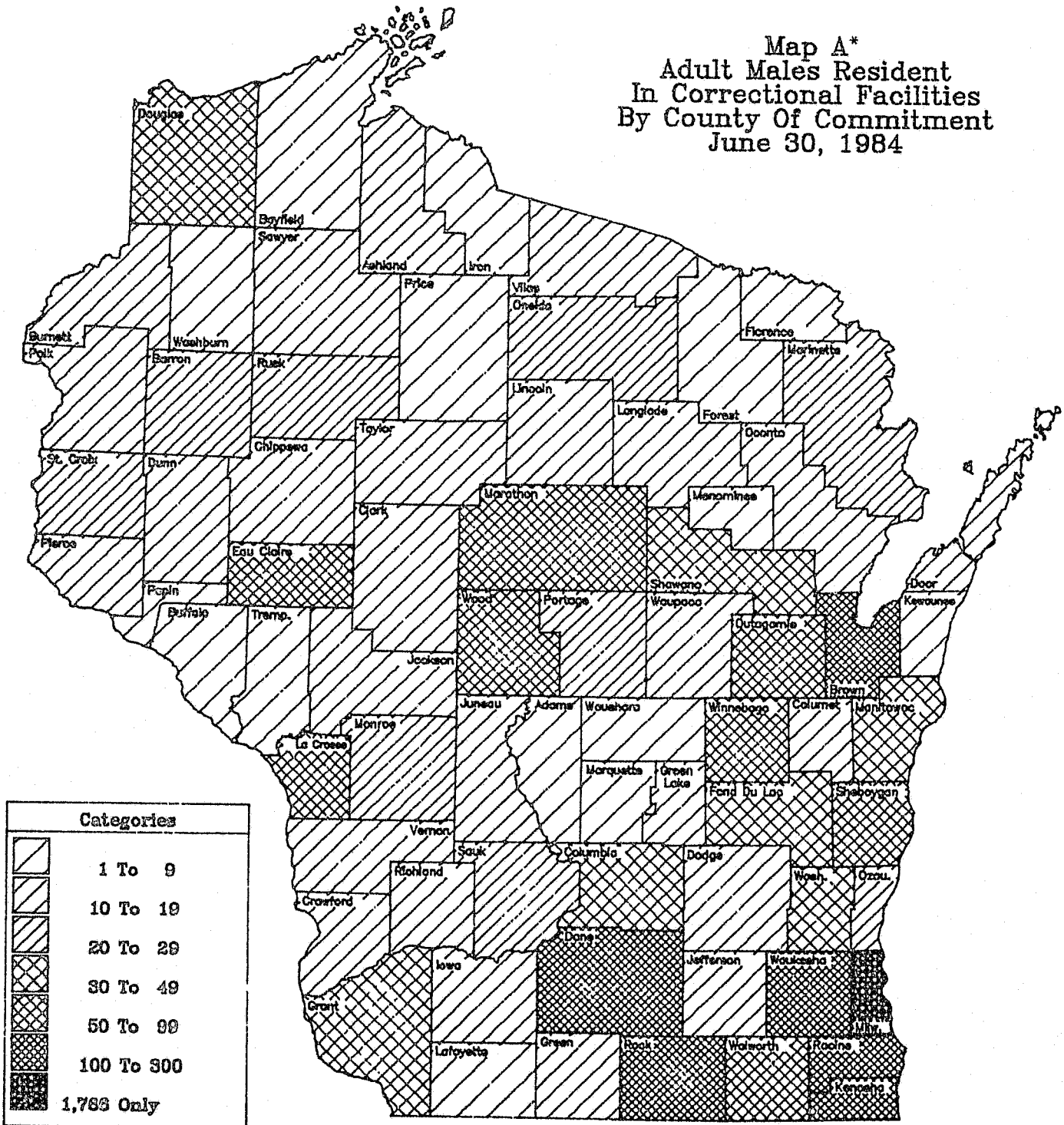
Wisconsin's Division of Corrections was responsible for a resident population of 4,779 adult offenders, 4,576 males and 203 females, on June 30, 1984; a slight increase (1.6 percent) over the 4,706 residents reported on June 30, 1983. The greater proportion (92 percent) were resident in facilities operated by the Division of Corrections, two percent were confined at the Wisconsin Resource Center operated by the Division of Care and Treatment Facilities, while the remaining residents (6 percent) were housed under contractual agreements with the Milwaukee County House of Corrections, other county jails in Wisconsin, federal correctional facilities, and correctional institutions operated by the state of Minnesota. (See state map preceding this text for geographic location and security level of facilities operated by the Division of Corrections.)

Table 1 presents information about the admission status (new adult sentence, return from adult parole, etc.) of those persons in residence on June 30, 1984. Thirty-five males and one female were being held pending the completion of probation, parole, mandatory release, and special action early release revocation hearings while an additional 29 persons including one female were institutionalized on alternative to revocation contracts. These 63 males and two females have been excluded from the descriptive information such as race and ethnicity, length of sentence, current age, etc. which is presented in Tables 2 through 15. The maps, A and B, depict the resident population by region and county of commitment. For those interested in trends, selected data for the years 1980 through 1984 is included in Tables A and B.

June 30, 1984



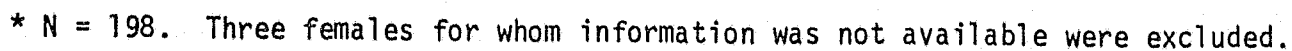

The number of males in residence increased slightly (1.7 percent) from 4,499 on June 30, 1983, to 4,576 on June 30, 1984. Although the resident population has increased steadily during the five-year period, the percentage of the increase has been decreasing since the 11.4 percent rise noted between June 30, 1981, and June 30, 1982. Just over four-fifths (82.4 percent) of the males in residence on June 30, 1984, as was true during each of the four previous years, were classified as new admissions. This group includes males who received new sentences from the court, probation violators admitted with or without a new sentence, and juvenile aftercare and youthful offender parole violators who entered the institution with new adult sentences. An average (median) age of 27.0 years was recorded for males in residence on June 30, 1984; a high for the five-year period. The proportion of males from non-White backgrounds continued to decrease reaching a five-year low of 40.5 percent on June 30, 1984. Map A, which depicts commitments by county and region of the state, shows that males committed from only 19 out of 72 (26.4 percent) of the state's counties; i.e., the Southern, Southeastern, and Milwaukee Regions, accounted for slightly less than three-fourths (72.8 percent) of all commitments in residence on June 30, 1984.

Residents who were not regarded as assaultive, sex, or drug offenders made somewhat less than two-fifths (38.8 percent) of the population on June 30, 1984; a slight increase over the 38.5 percent recorded on June 30, 1983. The proportion of males incarcerated exclusively for drug offenses rose to a five-year high of 4.8 percent on June 30, 1984, while males sentenced solely for sex offenses continued to make up less than one percent of the resident population. Males convicted exclusively of assaultive crimes accounted for just under two-fifths (39.8 percent) of those in residence on June 30, 1984; an increase over the five-year low of one-third (33.9 percent) recorded on the same date in 1983. The proportion of residents convicted of both assaultive and sex offenses decreased from the five-year high of one-fifth (19.9 percent) in 1983 to 15.0 percent on June 30, 1984.

On June 30, 1984, a total of 203 females were in residence; a slight decrease (1.9 percent) from the five-year high reported on June 30, 1983, and the first decreased reported during the five-year period. Females from non-White backgrounds made up just over two-fifths (43.8 percent) of the population in residence on June 30, 1984; a low for the five-year period. The average (median) length of sentence was 4.7 years, an increase of almost a full year over the average (median) reported for those in residence on June 30, 1983. Map B indicates that females committed from 41 of Wisconsin's 72 counties were in residence in correctional facilities for adult offenders on June 30, 1984. Seven out of ten females in residence on that date were committed from counties in the southern third of the state; i.e., the Milwaukee, Southern, and Southeastern Regions. Milwaukee County, which committed over one-half (55.7 percent) of the females in residence on June 30, 1980, committed one-third of those resident on June 30, 1984; a low for the five-year period.

Females sentenced for offenses not considered to be assaultive, drug or sex crimes made up somewhat less than one-half (46.8 percent) of the June 30, 1984 resident population; the lowest proportion during the five-year period. Interestingly, the proportion of females confined exclusively for assaultive crimes rose to a five-year high of over two-fifths (44.7 percent) on June 30, 1984.
