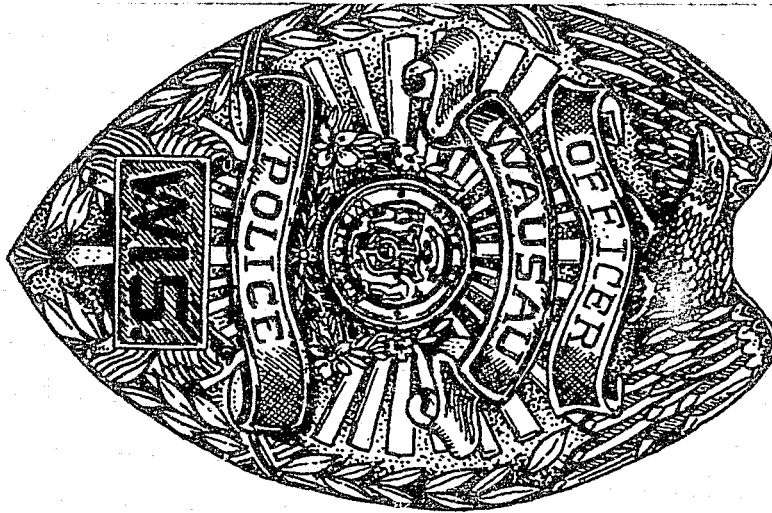

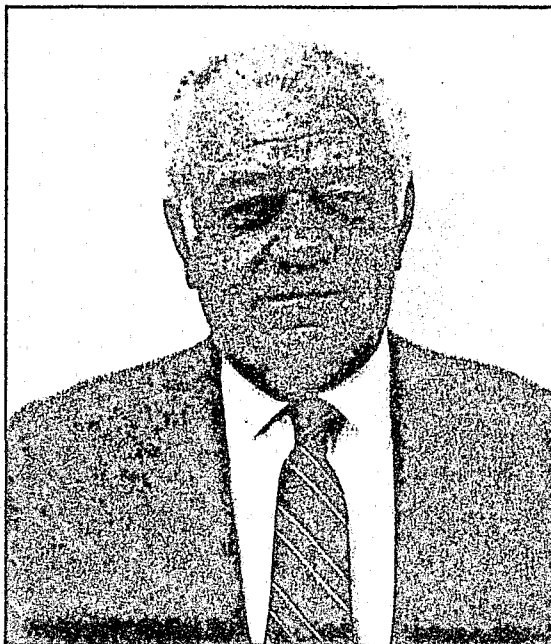


Mayor, Ladies and Gentlemen:

As I am about to retire after forty-six years of service, I want again to thank everyone for making my career successful on the Police Department of Wausau, Wisconsin.

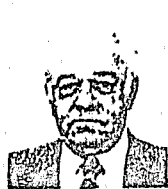


The 1987 calendar year records show a notable increase in the number of burglaries reported to and investigated by our department. The number of burglaries committed increased from 373 in 1986 to 434 in 1987. Of these burglaries, 133 cases are cleared for an approximate clearance rate of 31%. Aggravated assault cases increased from 116 in 1986 to 136 in 1987. The clearance rate of aggravated assault cases was approximately 67%.

Compared to 1986, forcible rape cases, miscellaneous theft, and motor vehicle theft cases showed a significant decrease in 1987.

Officers of the Wausau Police Department again participated in specialized training and inservice training during the past year. Some of the subjects for training include RISC training, defensive driving, and firearms training.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of the Detective Bureau, Youth Aid Bureau, Patrol Division, and other departments who assisted us in 1987. Their continuing cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Police traffic services once again highlight the many activities that the Traffic Bureau was involved in the year 1987. Traffic accident investigation, traffic law enforcement, and traffic direction and control account for 80-85% of the activities of the uniformed patrol division.

A revised Wisconsin motor vehicle accident report form was implemented in 1987. This report form was used to investigate and report 1,713 motor vehicle accidents in the City of Wausau. Of this total, 1,387 accidents occurred on city streets with 326 happening on parking lots and private property. Two accidents resulted in the deaths of two persons. 301 injury accidents resulted in 407 injuries being reported. Violations of the traffic laws resulted in a 68% citation enforcement rate in these reported accidents. Statistical data concerning motor vehicle accidents are included in this report.

The Traffic Bureau, once again in 1987, coordinated the patrol activities of a special DWI enforcement program funded through the Wisconsin Office for Highway Safety and through the National Highway Transportation System Administration. I am pleased to state that the Wausau Police Department was ranked number "one" among the eleven police and sheriff's agencies who are involved in this program throughout the State of Wisconsin.

Road construction played a large roll in the summer activities of the Bureau. The "Bridge Street" major construction project, although inconveniencing motorists and businesses, proved to be very worthwhile in the improved control and flow of vehicular travel. The Sign Department of the Department of Public Works once again did an excellent job of restriping streets, setting up detour routes and preparing the streets for special activities.


The Traffic Bureau, along with the Traffic Commission, made several changes in traffic and parking regulations throughout the year. A noticeable reduction in traffic accidents and congestion can be attributed to these changes.

I would like to give special praise to Safety Officer Gerald Kittel for the fine work that he has done throughout the year. His innovation has shown in the development of numerous new programs aimed at the safety and well-being of our youth.


We of the Emergency Police are here to back up and be at the command


Sir:

Statistics compiled disclose an accurate and complete account of the apprehensions and dispositions of juvenile offenders (both delinquent acts and traffic) in the City of Wausau throughout the past year.

We would again like to emphasize the importance of recognizing and reporting suspected child abuse and neglect cases. As mentioned in my report last year, there are an overwhelming number of kids that are being abused both physically and sexually everyday. An exciting new program has been introduced into the Safety Program. This year we have "Officer Friendly" working in the schools and making appearances throughout the community. Thanks to the Sears Roebuck Foundation, I have been able to distribute Officer Friendly safety coloring books to many youngsters. The program has had an added plus, thanks to Rosemurgy Ford, Officer Friendly has been able to promote his program with a sporty EXP Escort.

The "Just Say No" Club has been developed in the School District in conjunction with the Police Department. This program has been put together with the support of the Wausau Optimists Club and the Elks Lodge. The goal of the program is for prevention and intervention of drugs and is directed toward the 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students.

Another additon to the Safety Program was McGruff. He is the "Take a Bite out of Crime" dog, who is used to help in crime prevention. We worked together in October before Halloween distributing over 10,000 trick or treat bags which were donated by M & I First American National Bank, the supporter of the McGruff Program.

The summer "Safety City" program was again a success. With the help of St. Michael's and St. Anne's 6th graders, pre-school, kindergarten, and 1st grade children were instructed on safety both in the classroom and on the bicycle course.


I am pleased to report an injury/accident free year while my safety patrollers were on duty. The patrollers have done a super job and were rewarded with the trips to Wisconsin Dells and Washington, D.C. and a recognition program at Wausau West High School. The trips for the patrollers were made possible through the financial support of organizations in Wausau.

Fifteen adult crossing guards are posted at busy intersections throughout the city to protect the school children. Previous to the start of the school year, an inservice training was conducted for the crossing guards. They were also certified in first aid and CPR. The crossing guards have been an important part of our safety program.

Our Film Library has been updated with materials in regarding drugs, alcohol, child abuse, saying no to strangers, bus and bicycle safety and "McGruff" crime prevention. These films were made available through private foundations and other community organizations.

Upon completion of my first year as Safety Officer, I am able to look back on it as a busy, successful, and very satisfying year.
