



With this issue of "Crime In Connecticut", the Department of Public Safety marks its tenth year of participation in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program. The cooperation and participation of the law enforcement agencies within the state have made the publication of this report possible.

"Crime In Connecticut" summarizes criminal activity that has taken place in the state during the past year. Crime data, submitted on a monthly basis by law enforcement agencies, includes the total number of offenses and clearances of index crimes as well as arrests which have occurred in each jurisdiction. State law enforcement agencies also provide reports on each incident of family violence resulting in arrest.

The tables and graphs present comparisons with the past year as well as trends over a five year period. Monthly totals for 1987 are compared to the monthly totals of 1986. Annual totals are compared over a five year time span to illustrate trends.

These statistics have proven to be an invaluable source of accurate data. They serve a strategic purpose in evaluating existing programs and planning options to address crime problems.

# FACTS AT A GLANCE

## CRIME CLOCK

- \* IN 1987, AN INDEX CRIME OCCURRED ON THE AVERAGE OF ONE EVERY 3.3 MINUTES, A VIOLENT CRIME EVERY 39.1 MINUTES, AND PROPERTY CRIME EVERY 3.6 MINUTES.

## INDEX CRIME

- \* THERE WERE 159,922 INDEX OFFENSES REPORTED IN 1987, AN INCREASE OF 5,932 OVER THE 1986 TOTAL. THIS IS THE THIRD CONSECUTIVE YEAR SHOWING AN INCREASE IN CRIME.

## CRIME RATE

- \* THE CRIME RATE FOR THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT WAS DETERMINED TO BE 4,980.4 INDEX OFFENSES FOR EVERY 100,000 RESIDENTS. THE 1987 POPULATION IS ESTIMATED AT 3,211,000 PERSONS.
- \* THE RATE OF VIOLENT CRIME DECREASED FROM 425.87 PER 100,000 RESIDENTS IN 1986 TO 418.28 PER 100,000 RESIDENTS IN 1987, A DECREASE OF 1.78%.
- \* THE RATE OF PROPERTY CRIME INCREASED FROM 4,402.9 OFFENSES PER 100,000 RESIDENTS TO 4,562.2 OFFENSES PER 100,000 RESIDENTS WHICH IS AN INCREASE OF 3.62%.

## VIOLENT CRIME

- \* THE CRIMES OF MURDER, RAPE, ROBBERY, AND AGGRAVATED ASSAULT MAKE UP THE VIOLENT CRIME CATEGORY. COLLECTIVELY, VIOLENT CRIMES DECREASED BY 150 OFFENSES, A 1.1% DECREASE.
- \* THE CRIMES OF MURDER AND RAPE INCREASED BY 5.4% AND 5% RESPECTIVELY AND AGGRAVATED ASSAULT BY 3.4%. HOWEVER, ROBBERY DECREASED BY 6.8%.

## PROPERTY CRIME

- \* PROPERTY CRIME CONSISTS OF BURGLARY, LARCENY, AND MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT. IN 1987 PROPERTY CRIME INCREASED BY 4.3% OR 6,082 OFFENSES.
- \* THE MOST DRAMATIC INCREASE IN PROPERTY CRIME WAS IN MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT WHICH INCREASED 18.8% SINCE 1986.

## CLEARANCE RATE

- \* LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES CLEARED 21.4% OF ALL INDEX OFFENSES. THIS IS THE HIGHEST CLEARANCE RATE SINCE THE STATE PROGRAM BEGAN IN 1977.

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# THE UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING SYSTEM

## PURPOSE

THE UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM PERIODICALLY MEASURES CRIME IN THE UNITED STATES BY COUNTING THOSE OFFENSES BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES. THE PROGRAM'S OBJECTIVE IS TO PRODUCE RELIABLE CRIMINAL STATISTICS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION, OPERATION, AND MANAGEMENT. CRIMINAL JUSTICE PROFESSIONALS, LEGISLATORS, SCHOLARS, AND OTHERS CONCERNED WITH CRIME PROBLEMS MAKE FREQUENT USE OF UCR-GENERATED STATISTICS.

## NATIONAL PROGRAM

UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING WAS INITIATED IN 1929 WHEN THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE (I.A.C.P.) STANDARDIZED PROCEDURES FOR CRIME DATA COLLECTION. ON JUNE 11, 1930, CONGRESS ENACTED LEGISLATION AUTHORIZING THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION TO COLLECT NATIONWIDE CRIME COUNTS AND TO SERVE AS THE CLEARINGHOUSE FOR SUCH DATA. THE COMMITTEE ON UNIFORM CRIME RECORDS OF THE I.A.C.P. CONTINUES TO ADVISE THE F.B.I. IN THE OPERATION OF THE UCR PROGRAM AND OFFERS THEM A VALUABLE LINK TO LOCAL POLICE DEPARTMENTS.

## STATE PROGRAM

IN JULY, 1977, CONNECTICUT BEGAN ITS OWN UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM. BY AUGUST OF THE SAME YEAR, DATA COLLECTION BEGAN WITH THE RECRUITMENT AND TRAINING OF 70 AGENCIES. TODAY, CONNECTICUT HAS 101 FULL-TIME POLICE DEPARTMENTS PARTICIPATING IN ITS UCR PROGRAM.

THE STATE PROGRAM ENSURES QUALITY CONTROL AND UNIFORMITY OF THE CRIME AND ARREST REPORTS SUBMITTED. THE CENTRALIZED STATE COLLECTION AGENCY STREAMLINES THE TIME-CONSUMING PROCESS OF RESOLVING QUESTIONS BETWEEN CONTRIBUTORS AND VERIFIERS. UPON COMPLETION OF THE QUALITY CONTROL PROCESS, THE RETURNS ARE FORWARDED TO THE F.B.I.

## TYPES OF DATA COLLECTED

EVERY MONTH LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES THROUGHOUT THE STATE SUBMIT UCR DATA. THEY INDICATE THE NUMBER OF OFFENSES BROUGHT TO THEIR ATTENTION THROUGH SUCH SOURCES AS VICTIM, POLICE, OR WITNESS REPORTS. THE UCR PROGRAM DEFINES CRIME INDEX OFFENSES AS THE FOLLOWING: MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER, FORCIBLE RAPE, ROBBERY, AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, BURGLARY, LARCENY-THEFT, MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT, AND ARSON.

AFTER COUNTING CRIME INDEX OFFENSES REPORTED, MINUS ANY UNFOUNDED COMPLAINTS, CONTRIBUTORS PROVIDE THE NUMBER OF "ACTUAL OFFENSES", AND THE NUMBER OF CRIMES CLEARED. FOR A CRIMINAL OFFENSE TO BE "CLEARED", EITHER OF THE TWO SITUATIONS MUST PREVAIL: (1) AT LEAST ONE PERSON IS ARRESTED, CHARGED, AND TURNED OVER TO THE COURT FOR PROSECUTION; OR (2) SOME ELEMENT BEYOND POLICE CONTROL PRECLUDES THE PHYSICAL ARREST OF THE OFFENDER, RESULTING IN THE OFFENSE BEING CLEARED BY "EXCEPTIONAL MEANS". CONTRIBUTING AGENCIES ALSO INCLUDE DATA ON THE VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED IN CONNECTION WITH THE AFOREMENTIONED OFFENSES, PLUS SPECIFIC INFORMATION REGARDING HOMICIDES AND ARSON.

UCR ARREST DATA IS COLLECTED FOR ALL CRIMES EXCEPT TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS. THE AGE, SEX, AND RACE OF ARRESTEES ARE REPORTED FOR ALL CRIME CATEGORIES.

## REPORTING PROCEDURE

CONTRIBUTING AGENCIES ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR SUBMITTING THEIR OWN CRIME REPORTS TO THE STATE UCR PROGRAM. A FULL-TIME FIELD REPRESENTATIVE OFFERS TRAINING IN UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROCEDURES TO ENSURE QUALITY AND UNIFORMITY IN THE DATA SUBMITTED TO THE STATE PROGRAM. CONTRIBUTORS ALSO RECEIVE THE UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING HANDBOOK WHICH PROVIDES A DETAILED OUTLINE OF OFFENSE CLASSIFYING AND SCORING PROCEDURES.

## VERIFICATION PROCEDURE

UCR REPORTS ARE SET UP WITH NUMEROUS INTERNAL CROSS-CHECKS TO ACHIEVE REPORTING ACCURACY OF THE DATA. IT IS STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE TO EXAMINE EACH INCOMING REPORT FOR ARITHMETICAL ACCURACY. REPORTS ARE THEN SUBJECTED TO LOGICAL TESTS OF REASONABLENESS, WHICH ARE OF KEY IMPORTANCE TO CONFIRMING VALIDITY. LOGICAL ERRORS RESULTING FROM MISINTERPRETATIONS OF WHAT IS TO BE MEASURED CAN THEN BE CORRECTED. UCR PERSONNEL CORRECT MINOR ERRORS WITHOUT CONTACTING CONTRIBUTORS, BUT NECESSARY ARITHMETICAL ADJUSTMENTS OR UNUSUAL VARIATIONS ARE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE SUBMITTING AGENCY.

## UCR LIMITATIONS

THERE ARE INHERENT LIMITATIONS IN CURRENT CRIME REPORTING PRACTICES. OF PRIMARY IMPORTANCE IS THE QUESTION OF HOW MUCH CRIME IS BEING REPORTED. THE DEGREE TO WHICH CRIMES ARE BEING REPORTED VARIES FROM AREA TO AREA. A CONSIDERABLE VOLUME OF CRIME IS NOT REPORTED TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES BECAUSE THE VICTIMS CONSIDER THE OFFENSES AGAINST THEM TO BE OF VERY LITTLE CONSEQUENCE OR THE LIKELIHOOD OF APPREHENDING THE SUSPECT IS SMALL. THEY MAY ALSO FEAR RETALIATION FROM OFFENDERS, OR ARE RELUCTANT TO REVEAL THEIR OWN INVOLVEMENT IN THE OFFENSE OR IN OTHER CRIMES. CONSEQUENTLY, INFORMATION CONCERNING SOME OFFENSES IS NEVER ENTERED INTO THE REPORTING SYSTEM.

EVEN WITH THESE GIVEN LIMITATIONS, THE UCR PROGRAM PROVIDES THE BEST NETWORK OF STATE AND NATIONAL CRIME FIGURES CURRENTLY AVAILABLE.

## CRIME FACTORS

BECAUSE NOT ALL FACTORS THAT HAVE AN IMPACT ON CRIME PROBLEMS ARE MEASURED OR CONSIDERED BY THE UCR PROGRAM, SUPERFICIAL CONCLUSIONS ARE SOMETIMES DRAWN FROM ITS CRIME AND ARREST DATA, PARTICULARLY WHEN ATTEMPTS ARE MADE TO MAKE COMPARISONS BETWEEN JURISDICTIONS. LOCAL ORDINANCES AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE ADMINISTRATIVE POLICIES, RECORD-KEEPING PRACTICES, AND THE DEGREE TO ADHERENCE TO UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING STANDARDS ALL AFFECT THE NUMBER OF CRIMES AND ARRESTS REPORTED. ADDITIONALLY, SOCIO-ECONOMIC CONDITIONS AND THE CHARACTERISTICS AND ATTITUDES OF THE LOCAL POPULATION INFLUENCE THE EXTENT AND NATURE OF CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR IN A COMMUNITY. THE FOLLOWING FACTORS MUST BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION BEFORE AN INFORMED ASSESSMENT OF CRIME DATA CAN BE MADE:

- \* DENSITY AND SIZE OF THE COMMUNITY POPULATION AND ITS SURROUNDING AREA.
- \* VARIATIONS IN THE COMPOSITION OF THE POPULATION, PARTICULARLY ITS AGE, SEX, AND RACE COMPOSITION.

- \* STABILITY OF POPULATION WITH RESPECT TO SUCH FACTORS AS COMMUTERS, SEASONAL RESIDENTS, AND OTHER TRANSIENT TYPES.
- \* ECONOMIC CONDITIONS, INCLUDING UNEMPLOYMENT.
- \* CULTURAL CONDITIONS, SUCH AS EDUCATIONAL, RECREATIONAL, AND RELIGIOUS CHARACTERISTICS.
- \* CLIMATE.
- \* EFFECTIVE STRENGTH OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES.
- \* ADMINISTRATIVE AND INVESTIGATIVE EFFICIENCY OF THE LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY.
- \* POLICIES OF OTHER COMPONENTS OF THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM, SUCH AS PROSECUTORIAL, JUDICIAL, CORRECTIONAL, AND PROBATIONAL.
- \* ATTITUDES OF CITIZENS TOWARD CRIME.
- \* CRIME REPORTING PRACTICE OF CITIZENS.

#### FUTURE OF THE UCR PROGRAM

IN JUNE, 1985, A TASK FORCE OF THE F.B.I. AND THE BUREAU OF JUSTICE STATISTICS RELEASED THE FINDINGS OF A THREE-YEAR STUDY OF THE UCR PROGRAM. STUDY FINDINGS EMPHASIZED THE DEVELOPMENT OF MEANS TO PRESENT MORE DETAILED CRIME STATISTICS. THE STUDY RECOMMENDED THAT MORE INFORMATIONAL ELEMENTS BE COLLECTED, SUCH AS THE TIME AND LOCATION OF CRIMINAL INCIDENTS, THE NATURE AND EXTENT OF INJURY OR LOSS, AND VICTIM AND OFFENDER CHARACTERISTICS. BY COLLECTING SUCH INFORMATION ON A CASE-BY-CASE BASIS, DETAILED ANALYSIS OF CRIME STATISTICS COULD BE ACHIEVED.

SINCE 1985, THE F.B.I WITH THE COOPERATION AND SUPPORT OF THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE (I.A.C.P.), THE NATIONAL SHERIFFS ASSOCIATION (N.S.A.), ASSOCIATED STATE UCR PROGRAMS (ASUCRP) AND LAW ENFORCEMENT IN GENERAL HAVE MOLDED THE STUDY INTO AN ALL BUT FINISHED PRODUCT, "THE REDESIGNED UCR PROGRAM".

THE F.B.I. IS PRESENTLY DESIGNING FINAL DATA SPECIFICATIONS THAT WILL PROVIDE A STANDARD FOR FUTURE UCR REPORTING. THE CONNECTICUT CHIEFS OF POLICE ASSOCIATION AND THE STATE POLICE ARE WORKING IN A JOINT EFFORT TO IMPLEMENT THE REDESIGNED UCR IN CONNECTICUT.

# INDEX CRIME


THE TABULATIONS PRESENTED IN THE GRAPHS AND CHARTS IN THIS PUBLICATION INDICATE THE VOLUME, FLUCTUATION, AND DISTRIBUTION OF CRIME IN CONNECTICUT ON THE BASIS OF A CRIME INDEX. THE INDEX IS COMPOSED OF THOSE CRIMES CONSIDERED TO REPRESENT THE MOST SERIOUS BY NATURE OR BY THE VOLUME IN WHICH THEY OCCUR.

CRIME CLASSIFICATIONS USED IN THE CRIME INDEX ARE: MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER, FORCIBLE RAPE, ROBBERY, AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, BURGLARY, LARCENY, AND MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT.

# MURDER


MURDER IS DEFINED IN THE UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM AS THE WILLFUL (NON-NEGLIGENT) KILLING OF ONE HUMAN BEING BY ANOTHER. ANY DEATH DUE TO A FIGHT, ARGUMENT, QUARREL, ASSAULT, OR COMMISSION OF A CRIME IS INCLUDED. ATTEMPTS TO KILL AND ASSAULTS TO KILL ARE COUNTED UNDER AGGRAVATED ASSAULT. SUICIDES, ACCIDENTAL DEATHS, AND JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDES ARE NOT COUNTED IN THIS CATEGORY.

TRAFFIC DEATHS CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF SOMEONE OTHER THAN THE VICTIM ARE COUNTED UNDER ARRESTS FOR MANSLAUGHTER BY NEGLIGENCE ACCORDING TO AGE, SEX, AND RACE.







## WEAPONS DISTRIBUTION







## AGGRAVATED ASSAULT BY MONTH





# ARSON

ARSON IS DEFINED BY THE UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM TO INCLUDE ANY WILLFUL OR MALICIOUS BURNING, OR ATTEMPT TO BURN WITH OR WITHOUT INTENT TO DEFRAUD, A DWELLING HOUSE, PUBLIC BUILDING, MOTOR VEHICLE OR AIRCRAFT, PERSONAL PROPERTY OF ANOTHER, ETC. ONLY FIRES DETERMINED THROUGH INVESTIGATION TO HAVE BEEN WILLINGLY OR MALICIOUSLY SET ARE CLASSIFIED AS ARSONS. FIRES OF SUSPICIOUS OR UNKNOWN ORIGIN ARE EXCLUDED.

SINCE ARSON OFFENSES FREQUENTLY OCCUR IN CONJUNCTION WITH OTHER INDEX CRIMES; E.G., BURGLARY, THE HIERARCHY RULE HAS BEEN MODIFIED SPECIFICALLY FOR ARSON. ARSON, REGARDLESS OF ITS OCCURRENCE IN CONJUNCTION WITH ANOTHER CRIME AGAINST PERSON OR PROPERTY HAS TO BE REPORTED.





ALTHOUGH CONNECTICUT LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES RECOVERED APPROXIMATELY 46% OF THE PROPERTY STOLEN, THE NET LOSS WAS OVER \$74 MILLION DOLLARS.

THE READER SHOULD TAKE NOTE THAT THESE VALUES RELATE ONLY TO INDEX CRIME. PROPERTY LOST OR DAMAGED AS A RESULT OF CRIMES SUCH AS FRAUD, VANDALISM, ETC., ARE NOT INCLUDED IN THESE TOTALS.

# ARREST DATA

THE CONNECTICUT UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM REQUIRES THE SUBMISSION OF MONTHLY REPORTS OF DATA CONCERNING PERSONS ARRESTED IN THE STATE. A RECORD OF TOTAL ARREST ACTIVITY FOR CRIMINAL ACTS IN BOTH PART 1 AND PART 2 CRIME CLASSES IS RECEIVED FROM UCR PARTICIPANTS ACCORDING TO THE AGE, SEX AND RACE OF PERSONS ARRESTED. TRAFFIC ARRESTS, EXCEPT DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE, ARE NOT REPORTED.

THE AGE, SEX AND RACE OF PERSONS ARRESTED FORMS ARE DESIGNED TO COLLECT DATA ON THE NUMBER OF PERSONS ARRESTED AND NOT THE NUMBER OF CHARGES LODGED. FOR EXAMPLE, A PERSON MAY BE ARRESTED ON SEVERAL CHARGES AT ONE TIME; ONLY ONE ARREST WOULD BE SCORED. FOR UCR PURPOSES, A JUVENILE IS COUNTED AS "ARRESTED" WHEN THE CIRCUMSTANCES ARE SUCH THAT IF HE OR SHE WERE AN ADULT, AN ARREST WOULD RESULT.

16. PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE - SEX OFFENSES OF A COMMERCIALIZED NATURE, SUCH AS: PROSTITUTION, KEEPING A DISORDERLY HOUSE, PANDERING, AND ALL ATTEMPTS TO COMMIT THE ABOVE.
17. SEX OFFENSES - (EXCEPT FORCIBLE RAPE, PROSTITUTION, AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE) OFFENSES AGAINST CHASTITY, COMMON DECENCY, MORALS, AND THE LIKE. ATTEMPTS ARE INCLUDED.
18. NARCOTIC DRUG LAWS - NARCOTIC DRUG LAW ARRESTS ON THE BASIS OF THE NARCOTICS USE. INCLUDES ARRESTS FOR VIOLATION OF STATE AND LOCAL ORDINANCES, SPECIFICALLY THOSE RELATING TO THE UNLAWFUL POSSESSION, SALE, USE, GROWING, MANUFACTURING AND MAKING OF NARCOTIC DRUGS.
19. GAMBLING - CHARGES WHICH RELATE TO PROMOTING, PERMITTING OR ENGAGING IN GAMBLING.
20. OFFENSES AGAINST THE FAMILY AND CHILDREN - INCLUDES ALL CHARGES OF NON-SUPPORT AND NEGLECT OR ABUSE OF FAMILY AND CHILDREN.
21. DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE - LIMITED TO THE DRIVING OR OPERATING OF ANY VEHICLE WHILE DRUNK OR UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF LIQUOR OR NARCOTIC DRUG.
22. LIQUOR LAWS - WITH THE EXCEPTION OF "DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE", LIQUOR LAW VIOLATIONS, STATE OR LOCAL, ARE PLACED IN THIS CLASS. INCLUDES: MANUFACTURING, SALE, TRANSPORTING, FURNISHING, POSSESSING, ETC.



# POLICE EMPLOYEE DATA

AS OF OCTOBER 31, 1987, 100 AGENCIES COVERING 3,211,000 CONNECTICUT RESIDENTS REPORTED A TOTAL OF 7,180 FULL-TIME LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS. WHEN FULL-TIME CIVILIANS ARE INCLUDED, THE TOTAL AMOUNT IS 8,696 LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES.

BEFORE MAKING COMPARISONS IN POLICE STRENGTH FROM ONE MUNICIPALITY TO ANOTHER, SERIOUS CONSIDERATION SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE MANY FACTORS THAT AFFECT THE NEED FOR POLICE SERVICE. FOR EXAMPLE, THE NEED FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICE IN SEASONAL OR HIGHLY MOBILE COMMUNITY DIFFERS FROM A LOCALE WHOSE POPULATION IS STABLE. OTHER FACTORS THAT AFFECT POLICE SERVICE ARE GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION, DENSITY OF POPULATION, NEARBY URBAN AREAS, AND COMMUNITY INTEREST IN LAW ENFORCEMENT.

## 1987 SUMMARY ANALYSIS

LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN THE STATE REPORTED A TOTAL OF 8,696 FULL-TIME POLICE EMPLOYEES FOR 1987.

THERE WERE 7,180 SWORN POLICE OFFICERS EMPLOYED BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, 82.6% OF THE TOTAL LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES.

FULL-TIME CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES WERE REPORTED AT 1,516; 17.4% OF TOTAL LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES.

94.7% OF ALL FULL-TIME LAW OFFICERS WERE MALE, 5.3% WERE FEMALE.

66.6% OF ALL FULL-TIME CIVILIANS WERE FEMALE, 33.4% WERE MALE.

OF THE 7,180 FULL-TIME SWORN POLICE OFFICERS, 83.8% WERE MUNICIPAL AND 16.2% WERE STATE POLICE.

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
# STATISTICAL SUMMARY

## 1987 FAMILY VIOLENCE ARREST CASES

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- ✓ There were 20,695 incidents of family violence in which at least one person was arrested during 1987.
- ✓ Nearly nine in ten cases involved an arrest for assault, breach of peace or disorderly conduct. In 43.4% of cases, the most serious offense for which an arrest was made was assault. Breach of peace was the most serious offense in 23.8% of cases and disorderly conduct was the most serious offense in 20.7% of cases.
- ✓ 83.5% of victims were female and 89.5% of offenders were male.
- ✓ In four out of five incidents the closest relationship between participants was that of spouse (31.2%), former spouse (3.4%) or live-in partner (44.0%).
- ✓ More than half (58.6%) of the participants were between the ages of twenty-one and thirty-five.
- ✓ 85.6% of cases involved a weapon (gun, knife, hands, fists, feet, teeth or other dangerous weapon). Seven in ten offenses involved personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.).
- ✓ One in ten (10.3%) cases involved prior court orders.
- ✓ Two-thirds of incidents resulted in physical injury (64.2% minor, 2.9% serious).
- ✓ Liquor/drugs were involved in half of the incidents (49.0%).
- ✓ 36.2% of incidents occurred on Saturday (18.9%) or Sunday (17.3%).
- ✓ 44.2% of incidents occurred during the six hour period between 6:01 p.m. and midnight.
- ✓ Children were involved in 45.4% of incidents. Specifically, children were involved in 10.3% of cases and present in 35.1% of cases.

# TYPE OF OFFENSE 1987








# SEX OF PARTICIPANTS 1987







# RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES 1987 VICTIM TO OFFENDER AND BOTH ARRESTEES









# EXTENT OF INJURY AND PRIOR ORDERS 1987





## DEFINITIONS

**ARREST INCIDENT:** An occurrence of family violence in which at least one arrest has been made. One arrest incident is counted for each Family Violence Offense Report submitted, regardless of the number of parties arrested.

**BREACH OF PEACE AND DISORDERLY CONDUCT:** Crimes of Threatening, Harassment and Reckless Endangerment may be reported under either Breach of Peace or Disorderly Conduct.

**BOTH ARRESTED:** An individual is assigned the status of BOTH when involved in a family violence incident in which all parties were arrested. Each participant who has been coded as BOTH has committed an offense involving family violence, and therefore cannot be considered a "pure" victim. However, an individual classified as BOTH cannot be classified as a "pure" offender either, since s/he has also been the target of a violent domestic crime.

**FAMILY VIOLENCE:** Defined as an incident resulting in physical harm, bodily injury or assault, or an act of threatened violence that causes fear of imminent physical harm, bodily injury or assault between or among family or household members. After June 30, 1987, verbal abuse or argument does not constitute family violence unless there is present danger and the likelihood that physical violence will occur.

**FAMILY OR HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS:** From October 1, 1986 through June 30, 1987 defined as: Spouses, former spouses, parents, persons sixteen years of age or older related by blood or marriage, persons presently residing together or who have resided together in the recent past, and persons who have a child in common regardless of whether they are or have been married or have lived together at any time. After June 30, 1987, family or household members are defined as: Spouses, former spouses, parents and their children, persons eighteen years of age or older related by blood or marriage, persons sixteen years of age or older other than those related by blood or marriage who are presently residing together or who have resided together in the recent past, and persons who have a child in common regardless of whether they are or have been married or have lived together at any time.

**FAMILY VIOLENCE CRIME:** From October 1, 1986 through June 30, 1987 defined as: A crime as defined in section 53a-24 of the Connecticut General Statutes which also constitutes family violence and shall include, but not be limited to: Assault, Kidnapping and Unlawful Restraint, Risk of Injury to a Minor, Sexual Assault, and Criminal Mischief. The Family Violence Reporting Program collects information on Homicide and other crimes which, in addition to their other elements, contain an act of violence against a family or household member. Beginning July 1, 1987, defined as: A crime as defined in section 53a-24 of the Connecticut General Statutes which, in addition to its other elements, contains as an element thereof an act of violence to a family or household member and shall not include acts by parents or guardians disciplining minor children unless such acts constitute abuse.

**HIERARCHY OF OFFENSES:** The Family Violence Reporting Program follows a hierarchy of offenses classification system similar to that employed by the Uniform Crime Reporting Program. Although multiple offenses are frequently reported, particularly for Both arrested incidents, only one offense code is accepted into the computer system. When there are multiple offenses, the offense code highest in the following list is accepted: Homicide, Assault, Kidnapping, Sexual Assault, Criminal Mischief, Risk of Injury to a Minor, Breach of Peace, Disorderly Conduct and Other.

**LIVE-IN COMPANION:** Persons presently residing together or who have resided together in the recent past, and persons who share a child in common.

**"OTHER" CRIME:** Offenses included under the classification of "OTHER" include all family violence crimes which are not covered by the offense types listed. "OTHER" crimes include, but are not limited to: Robbery, Burglary, Arson and Criminal Trespass.

**RELATIVE (SAME HOME/DIFFERENT HOME):** Includes parents and children, brothers, sisters, aunts, uncles, in-laws, cousins, etcetera.


## INTRODUCTION

The following summarizes cases of family violence homicide which occurred during 1987. Homicides were chosen for rigorous analysis because the small number of incidents allowed examination of each piece of descriptive information available concerning the act and the parties involved. Such close scrutiny would not be possible for other types of family violence offenses such as assault due to the great number of offenses and the character of data available.

Family violence homicides which occurred during 1987 resulted in either the arrest or suicide of the offender. Information on arrest cases was taken from Family Violence Offense Reports submitted to the Family Violence Reporting Program (FVRP) and verified as homicides through the reporting agency, and/or Uniform Crime Reporting Program (UCR) records. Murder-Suicide data was taken from UCR records. Homicides taken from UCR were classed as family violence when the relationship between the parties could be verified as conforming to the definition of "Family or Household Member" as set forth in the Connecticut General Statutes (46b-38a(2)).

Of the 156 homicides reported to the UCR Program during 1987, twenty-seven (17%) were identified as family violence.<sup>1</sup> Two thirds of the victims were female, while 83% of the twenty-four offenders were male. More than half (59%) of the victims were the spouse, former spouse or live-in partner of the offender. Guns or knives accounted for more than three-quarters (81%) of weapons used.



#### MURDER-SUICIDE

In eight of the homicides, the offender committed suicide, accounting for 30% of the 1987 family violence homicides. Seven of the eight victims were female, while all seven of the offenders were male (one incident involved two victims).

Half of the victims were females over the age of 56 and half of the offenders were over sixty-five. Seventy-five percent of the murder-suicide victims were the partners of the offender; spouse (50%); former spouse (12.5%); or live-in (12.5%).

### ARREST

During 1987, there were nineteen homicides resulting in arrest in which family or household members were victims. Seventeen offenders were arrested.


47% of family violence homicides resulting in arrest involved parents, children or other relatives. One-quarter of murder-suicides involved parents, children or other relatives.

Most arrested homicide offenders were between the ages of twenty-one and thirty-five (59%).

Twenty-four percent of the offenders arrested for family violence homicides were female. This is markedly higher than the proportion of all non-negligent homicides in which the known offender was female (7% for 1987 Connecticut Uniform Crime Reporting Program data).


Fifty-nine percent of all arrested offenders used a knife to commit the homicide and twenty-four percent used guns, which is significantly lower than the percentage of offenders who used guns in murder-suicide (eighty-six percent).

## WEAPON INVOLVED 1987 FAMILY VIOLENCE HOMICIDE



When males were arrested for family violence homicide, they used knives 54% of the time and guns 31% of the time. None of the female offenders used guns; three of the four offenders used knives.
