INMATE PROFILE SUMMARY
JULY - 1988

ABSTRACT

The County Detention Facilities Summary provides a monthly profile of Florida's detention facilities inmate population. Average daily population figures for July 1988 are collapsed into male and female categories for both adult and juvenile inmates. These population figures are also categorized into felony, misdemeanor and "other" subcategories in order to facilitate interpretation. Within both felony and misdemeanor subcategories the number of inmates held for trial or sentencing and those detained or sentenced for violation of probation will be presented for the month of July, 1988. The "other" subcategory documents the number of parole violators, state inmates, undocumented aliens, holdings for other jurisdictions and individuals detained under the Baker (mental health) and Myers (alcoholism) Acts. In addition, the average daily population figures and incarceration rates for each county in the State of Florida and the number of overcrowded county detention facilities for July, 1988 are included in this report. County detention facilities with amended capacities since the previous report are indicated on table 3.

JULY - 1988

Average Daily Population

On the average, there were 29,217 inmates in Florida's county detention facilities during the month of July, 1988. This figure represents the highest daily average recorded since the Florida Department of Corrections began collecting data on inmates held in county detention facilities. The statewide average daily population (ADP) totals for the month of July, 1988 include 25,707 adult males (88%), 2,901 adult females (9.9%), and 609 juvenile offenders (2.1%). The overall distribution of male and female inmates has remained fairly constant in county detention facilities for the past three years. The following provides an analysis of the inmate population for July, 1988.

- * 76.6% of the inmate population were incarcerated for felony offenses, while only 18.8 percent were detained for misdemeanor crimes.
- * Offenders held for trial represented 62.8% of the inmate population and 22.1 percent were sentenced on either felony or misdemeanor crimes.
- * Inmates detained for violation of probation represented 7.7% of the inmate population.
- * The distribution of male and female inmates is fairly constant among the pretrial, sentenced, and violation of probation categories.

Incarceration Rates.

In July of 1988, the statewide county detention facility incarceration rate was 2.3 per 1,000 county residents based on the population estimate for 1988. Incarceration rates range from a low of 0.4 in Liberty County to a high of 10.1 per 1,000 population in Hamilton County. Hamilton County's extremely high incarceration rate is the direct result of holding a large proportion of their inmate population for the U.S. Marshals Service. Several other counties may also be experiencing exceedingly high incarceration rates due to the contracting of bed space.

Overcrowding: Capacity Versus Population

In July, 1988, 42 percent (28) of the counties in the State of Florida had average daily inmate populations which exceeded their Department of Corrections (DC) rated capacity. Twenty seven percent (18) of Florida's counties had average daily inmate populations that were between 1 and 25 percent over their DC rated capacity, 10.5 percent (7) had inmate daily averages that were between 26 and 50 percent over capacity, and 4.5 percent (3) of the counties had average daily inmate populations which exceeded the rated capacity by more than 50 percent.





