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## INTRODUCTION

This Crime and Delinquency in California, 1987, Advance Release is published by the Bureau of Criminal Statistics in order to furnish important criminal justice data at the earliest possible time. The more extensive and detailed report, Crime and Delinquency in California, 1987, will be published later this year.

The four sections of this publication present information on crimes, arrests, the juvenile justice system, and adult felony arrest dispositions. This information is based on the total number of records reported to the Bureau of Criminal Statistics for the calendar year.

The California Crime Index (CCI) comprises willful homicide, forcible rape, robbery, augravated assault, burglary, and motor vehicle theft.

#### From 1982 to 1987:

California Crime Index offenses decreased6.6 percent in rate per 100,000 population.

#### From 1986 to 1987:


☐ The California Crime Index decreased 3.3 percent in rate.

Of 904,014 California Crime Index offenses reported:


- ☑ Violent crimes accounted for 28.1 percent (254.137).
- Property crimes accounted for 71.9 percent (649,877).

## CALIFORNIA CRIME INDEX, 1982-1987 Rate per 100,000 Population




The 10.5 percent drop in the burglary rate is the major factor contributing to the 1987 decline in the CCI rate (down 3.3 percent).


## CALIFORNIA CRIME INDEX, 1987 By Category




#### VIOLENT AND PROPERTY CRIMES, 1982-1987 Rate per 100,000 Population

## CRIMES

The offenses which make up the California Crime Index are grouped into violent and property crime categories.

Violent crimes comprise willful homicide, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault. Property crimes comprise burglary and motor vehicle theft.

#### From 1982 to 1987:

- ☐ Violent crimes reported increased 12.8 percent in rate.
- Property crimes reported decreased 12.5 percent in rate.

#### From 1986 to 1987:

- ☐ The violent crime rate decreased .2 percent.
- ☐ The property crime rate decreased 4.4 percent.

#### In 1987,

Of the 254,137 violent crimes reported:

- ☐ Willful homicide accounted for 1.2 percent (2,929).
- Forcible rape accounted for 4.8 percent (12,114).
- Robbery accounted for 32.8 percent (83,373).
- Aggravated assault accounted for 61.3 percent (155,721).

#### Of the 649,877 property crimes reported:

- Burglary accounted for 64.7 percent (420,182).
- Motor vehicle theft accounted for 35.3 percent (229,695).

The violent crime rate decreased in 1987, despite the 8.0 percent increase in aggravated assault.

## ARRESTS

#### From 1982 to 1987:

- For total arrests, there was a 5.6 percent increase in rate per 100,000 population at risk.
- There was a 7.6 percent increase in the rate of adult arrests and a 6.2 percent decrease in the rate of juvenile arrests.

#### From 1986 to 1987:

- There was a 2.0 percent rate increase in total arrests.
- There was a 3.1 percent increase in the rate of adult arrests and a 5.7 percent decrease in the rate of juvenile arrests.

#### In 1987.

#### Of 1,859,342 arrests reported:

- Adult arrests accounted for 88.0 percent (1,635,731).
- Juvenile arrests accounted for 12.0 percent (223,611).


#### And,

- Felony arrests accounted for 26.7 percent (496,246).
- Misdemeanor arrests accounted for 71.9 percent (1,337,766).
- Status offense arrests accounted for 1.4 percent (25,330).


The juvenile arrest rate showed a substantial decrease in 1987 (down 5.7 percent), while the adult rate continued to rise (up 3.1 percent).

#### ARRESTS IN CALIFORNIA, 1982-1987 Total, Adult, and Juvenile


Rate per 100,000 Population at Risk




## TOTAL ARRESTS, 1987 By Type of Arrest





### ARRESTS

#### From 1982 to 1987:

- ☐ There was an 18.1 percent increase in the rate of felony arrests.
- ☐ Violent crime arrests increased 21.9 percent in rate.
- Property crime arrests decreased 7.3 percent in rate.
- Drug law violation arrests increased 96.8 percent in rate.
- All other felony arrests decreased 1.3 percent in rate.

#### From 1986 to 1987:

- ☐ There was a 3.9 percent increase in the rate of felony arrests.
- ☐ Violent crime arrests increased 5.1 percent in rate.
- Property crime arrests decreased 2.3 percent in rate.
- Drug law violation arrests increased 9.6 percent in rate.
- All other felony arrests increased 10.1 percent in rate.

#### In 1987,

Of 496,246 felony arrests reported:

- ☐ Violent crimes accounted for 21.8 percent (108,034).
- Property crimes accounted for 37.5 percent (186,285).
- Drug law violations accounted for 29.5 percent (146,588).
- All other felony offenses accounted for 11.2 percent (55,339).

In 1987, the violent crime and drug law violation arrest rates continued to climb (up 5.1 and 9.6 percent, respectively), while the property crime arrest rate decreased (down 2.3 percent).

## JUVENILE JUSTICE SYSTEM

#### From 1982 to 1987:

New referrals to probation departments increased .6 percent in rate per 100,000 population at risk.

#### From 1986 to 1987:

New referrals decreased .9 percent in rate.

#### In 1987,

Of 124,385 new referrals disposed of by the probation departments:

- Closed or transferred dispositions accounted for 53.1 percent (66,064).
- Placements on informal probation accounted for 13.9 percent (17,238).
- Petitions filed with the juvenile court accounted for 33.0 percent (41,083).




RATE PER 100,000 POPULATION AT RISK

## JUVENILE JUSTICE SYSTEM





#### From 1982 to 1987:

New petitions in juvenile court decreased 2.9 percent in rate per 100,000 population at risk.

#### From 1986 to 1987:


☐ New petitions decreased 2.3 percent in rate.

#### In 1987,

Of 41,083 juvenile court dispositions of new petitions:

- Dismissed, transferred, and remanded to adult court accounted for 24.3 percent (9,976).
- Non-ward probation accounted for 4.8 percent (1,980).
- Formal probation accounted for 69.5 percent (28,540).
- Commitments to the California Youth
   Authority accounted for 1.4 percent (587).

The rate of new petitions has remained relatively stable over the past five years.


# ADULT FELONY ARREST DISPOSITIONS

When the proportion of convictions is based on the total number of reported adult felony arrest dispositions as well as on the total number of reported complaints filed, it can be seen that from 1982 to 1987:


- ☑ The proportion of convictions to total dispositions rose slightly (54.7 to 56.8 percent).
- □ Likewise, the proportion of convictions to complaints filed increased 1.6 percentage points (76.4 to 78.0 percent).

Over three out of four complaints filed resulted in a conviction (78.0 percent).



## ADULT FELONY ARREST CONVICTIONS, 1982-1987 By Type of Sentence




From 1982 to 1987, of the total adult felony arrestees convicted:

- The largest increase was for sentences to probation with jail (up 10.8 percentage points).
- ☐ The largest decrease was for straight probation sentences (down 10.5 percentage points).
- State institution and jail sentence proportions remained relatively stable.

In 1987, of the total adult felony arrestees convicted:

- 86.5 percent received incarcerative sentences.
- Over half received probation with jail sentences (61.8 percent).
