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

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## MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

This report, *Trends in Felony Drug Offense Processing: 1983-1987*, graphically illustrates the response of New York State's criminal justice system to the growing threat posed by drugs to the safety and well-being of our families and communities.

Between 1983 and 1987, increased anti-drug efforts by New York State's law enforcement agencies have resulted in a 118 percent increase in the annual number of felony drug arrests. Drug offenses now constitute the single largest category of felony arrests.

These police efforts have been reinforced by the State's District Attorneys and Special Prosecutors whose increasingly vigorous prosecution policies have resulted in a tripling of both the number of felony drug indictments (+207 percent) and felony drug convictions (+210 percent). In 1987, only homicide arrests were more likely to result in a felony prosecution.

As a result of the responsiveness of police and prosecutors to the drug problem, state prison sentences for drug convictions also tripled (+220 percent) during the past five years.

Other data contained in this report further support our understanding of recent changes in the nature of the drug abuse problem in the State. Specifically, the ranks of narcotic drug sellers has swelled (felony drug sale arrests increased twice as fast as drug possession arrests) as relatively inexpensive "crack" cocaine has flooded many of our cities and towns. The increased ease of entry into drug dealing combined with the potential for making money is increasingly attracting first time offenders and persons with prior contact with the criminal justice system. There is growing evidence of a link between drug use and the commission of other crimes. Recent DCJS research confirms that persons arrested for drugs have extensive non-drug arrest histories. Effective street level enforcement is netting a substantial number of such persons.

The police and prosecutorial achievements outlined above have been aided by a whole series of local, state, and federally supported initiatives including: the creation of regional drug task forces, increases in police and prosecutorial resources, the creation of special court processes, and expansion of the State's prison system. Additional tools to more effectively combat the drug problem, such as the new "crack law," have recently been enacted and will be on-line shortly. Clearly, the system has managed to meet the increasing demands placed upon it by the proliferation of drugs, but the burdens are growing and new initiatives will be necessary to continue to effectively address the problem.

The State recognizes that effective law enforcement is an important and necessary component of a "cohesive and coherent effort" to combat the drug problem. Sound programs of education, prevention, and treatment must complement law enforcement efforts if we are to make our State forever safe from the scourge of drugs.

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## INTRODUCTION

This report presents descriptive information on the processing of felony drug offenses during the five-year period of 1983 through 1987. Misdemeanor arrest data are selectively included to more fully illustrate the impact of drugs on the criminal justice system. Data systems maintained by DCJS were the source for all of the information contained in the report.


The focus of the report is on basic quantitative and qualitative indicators that reflect the changing nature and volume of felony drug arrests and the outcomes of these arrests at critical stages in the criminal justice process. This focus, combined with the report's concise and graphic form of presentation, is designed to address many of the basic questions held by the large and diverse audience concerned about the criminal justice system's response to the drug problem.

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
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## ARRESTS

## FELONY DRUG ARRESTS DOUBLED OVER THE FIVE YEAR PERIOD




- Between 1983 and 1987 in New York State, the total number of felony and misdemeanor drug arrests doubled (+98%), rising from 53,769 to 106,658. Arrests for non-drug offenses increased at a much smaller pace (13%) during the same period.
- Felony drug arrests rose by 118 percent to 43,161 and misdemeanor drug arrests increased by 87 percent to 63,497 during the five year period.
- Drug felonies accounted for almost two-thirds (63%) of the total increase in all felony arrests reported in New York State between 1983 and 1987.




• In 1987, felony drug charges accounted for almost one-quarter (24%) of all felony arrests and constituted the single largest felony charge category. In contrast, drug charges totalled only 14 percent of the 1983 felony arrests and ranked behind larceny, robbery and burglary as a proportion of felony arrests. For example, in 1983 there were 15 percent more burglary arrests than drug arrests, but in 1987 there were twice as many drug arrests as burglary arrests.

## THE NUMBER OF FELONY DRUG SALE ARRESTS INCREASED TWICE AS FAST AS FELONY DRUG POSSESSION ARRESTS



- Between 1983 and 1987, felony drug sale arrests climbed 152 percent to 27,917 with over 80 percent of the growth occurring in the later two years of 1986 and 1987.
- Felony drug possession arrests rose by 75 percent to 15,167 over the five year period. Possession arrests increased by only five percent in 1987 following the more substantial growth experienced in 1985 and 1986.





• Because of the differing growth rates, sale arrests have been accounting for an increasing share of felony drug arrests, rising from 56 percent of the felony drug arrests in 1983 to 65 percent in 1987.




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# CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE ARRESTS, IN PARTICULAR NARCOTIC DRUG ARRESTS, ACCOUNTED FOR AN INCREASING PROPORTION OF FELONY DRUG ARRESTS







- The number of controlled substance sale (+161%) and possession (+112%) arrests climbed steadily during the five year period.
- Alternatively, felony arrests for the sale of marihuana (-25%) and the possession of marihuana (-42%) have declined steadily since 1984.



• The proportion of felony drug arrests accounted for by narcotic drugs (cocaine, heroin, etc.) rose from 63 percent in 1983 to 83 percent in 1987. Correspondingly, the percentage relating to other controlled substances fell from 24 percent to 13 percent. The proportion relating to marihuana fell from 13 percent to four percent.

# AS MEASURED BY FELONY CLASS, THE SERIOUSNESS OF FELONY DRUG ARRESTS HAS INCREASED





1987

- The percentage of felony drug arrests accounted for by Class B felony arrests increased from 52 percent in 1983 to 75 percent in 1987. The proportion of less serious felony classes (C, D, and E) declined markedly.
- The increase in Class B drug arrests is a direct result of the increase in drug sale arrests, specifically sale arrests involving narcotic drugs. A drug sale transaction involving any quantity of a narcotic drug (heroin, cocaine, etc.) is classified minimally at the Class B Felony level.



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
## NEW YORK CITY ACCOUNTED FOR THE VAST MAJORITY OF THE STATE'S FELONY DRUG ARRESTS DURING THE FIVE YEAR PERIOD

### **REGIONAL FELONY DRUG ARRESTS**




- Between 1983 and 1987, felony drug arrests increased significantly in each region of the State: New York City arrests rose by 122 percent, Suburban New York City arrests rose by 138 percent, and the Upstate area arrests increased by 67 percent.
- In New York City, the five year growth rate for sale arrests (+171%) was almost three times greater than for possession arrests (+62%). This resulted in more than twice as many sale arrests than possession arrests in 1987.
- In the Suburban New York City and Upstate counties, the five year trend was reversed, with possession arrests growing at a faster rate than sale arrests. In 1987, there were more possession than sale arrests Upstate and virtually the same number of each. In Suburban New York City.

## FELONY DRUG SALE ARRESTS (1987)




## FELONY DRUG POSSESSION ARRESTS (1987)



• In 1987, New York City accounted for 89 percent of the felony sale arrests and 78 percent of the felony possession arrests in the State.

# THE NEW YORK CITY COUNTIES HAD THE HIGHEST ADULT FELONY DRUG ARREST RATES IN THE STATE






- Among the counties in 1987, Bronx County had the highest adult felony drug arrest rate per 100,000 adult population (1,213) in the State, followed by New York County (1,062). These rates were two times greater than the third ranking county of Kings with a rate of 529.
- Westchester County had the highest felony drug arrest rate (188) for any county outside of New York City.
- Among the Upstate counties, Orange (163), Sullivan (146), and Albany (97) had the highest 1987 felony drug arrest rates.




WHILE DRUG ARRESTEES WERE YOUNGER THAN THE GENERAL POPULATION, THEY WERE SLIGHTLY OLDER THAN THE ARRESTEES FOR NON-DRUG FELONIES.

- Proportionally, drug arrestees were much younger than the State's adult population. In 1987, persons under 25 years of age accounted for 44 percent of the felony drug arrests, but were only 18 percent of the adult population.
- Two-thirds of the felony drug arrests involved persons under 30, as opposed to comprising only 30 percent of the adult population.
- Fifty-one percent of the felony drug arrestees were between 20 and 30 years old.

• Arrests for non-drug felonies more frequently involved teenage adults under 20 (23%), than did felony drug arrests (16%).


## RACE/ETHNICITY



• In 1987, 47 percent of the drug arrestees were identified as Hispanic, 42 percent as black, and 10 percent as white. In contrast, whites comprised 29 percent and blacks 49 percent of the non-drug felony arrests, while Hispanics made up 21 percent.

SEX




GENERALLY, DRUG ARRESTEES WERE MALES WHO HAD PRIOR CONTACT WITH THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM.

- In 1987, males accounted for 86 percent of the statewide felony drug arrests, and females accounted for the remaining 14 percent.
- However, between 1983 and 1987, the number of female felony drug arrests grew at a faster rate (+176%) than did male felony drug arrests (112%).

## PRIOR OFFENDING HISTORY


% OF OFFENDERS WITH ...



- Almost 72 percent of the felony drug arrestees in 1987 had been previously arrested for a fingerprintable crime, and 63 percent had a prior felony arrest on their record at the time of the drug arrest.
- Almost one-half (46%) had a prior conviction to a crime on their record with 25 percent possessing at least one prior felony conviction at the time.


## FELONY PROSECUTIONS

## FELONY DRUG INDICTMENTS INCREASED AT A FASTER RATE THAN FELONY DRUG ARRESTS




- The number of felony drug indictments more than tripled (+207%) between 1983 and 1987, rising from 7,406 to 22,696. During the same period, the number of non-drug indictments remained essentially unchanged.
- More than one-third (36%) of all indictments filed in 1987 involved a drug charge, up from 16 percent in 1983. Forty-three percent of New York City's indictments filed in 1987 charged a felony drug offense.

## FELONY DRUG INDICTMENTS BY REGION




- Felony drug indictments rose by 243 percent in New York City, while they doubled in the Suburban New York City (+106%) and Upstate (+99%) areas.
- In 1987, New York City accounted for 83 percent of the statewide drug indictments, up from 74% in 1983.

## HE PERCENTAGE OF FELONY DRUG ARRESTS RESULTING IN FELONY ROSECUTIONS IN THE UPPER COURT HAS INCREASED SIGNIFICANTLY



• Between 1983 and 1987, the proportion of felony drug arrests prosecuted as felonies in the upper court (felony prosecution rate) rose from approximately one-third (35%) to slightly more than one-half (51%). Concurrently, the felony prosecution rate for non-drug felonies remained essentially unchanged.

#### FELONY PROSECUTION RATES FOR SELECTED OFFENSES-1987




Of the major offense groups in 1987, only homicide arrests were more likely to result in felony prosecutions than drug arrests. This represents a significant change from 1983, when the felony prosecution rate for drugs was exceeded by robbery, weapon, and burglary offenses, as well as homicide.

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
# CONSISTENTLY OVER THE FIVE YEAR PERIOD, DRUG SALE ARRESTS WERE TWICE AS LIKELY TO RESULT IN FELONY PROSECUTIONS AS DRUG POSSESSION ARRESTS





- The felony prosecution rate rose for both drug sale and possession arrests between 1983 and 1987. The felony prosecution rate for drug sale arrests increased from 46 percent to 61 percent and the rate for drug possession arrests rose from 22 percent to 32 percent.
- Generally, for any given year during the five year period, the felony prosecution rate for drug sale arrests was double that of drug possession arrests.

#### **FELONY PROSECUTION RATE**




- The felony prosecution rate increased in all regions of the State.
- During the five year period, Suburban New York City had the highest felony prosecution rate (66% in 1987) followed by Upstate (57% in 1987) and New York City (49% in 1987).
- New York City exhibited the largest increase in the felony prosecution rate among the regions, rising from 32 percent in 1983 to 49 percent in 1987.


# ILE THE PERCENTAGE OF FELONY DRUG ARRESTS RESULTING IN A NVICTION TO ANY CHARGE REMAINED CONSTANT, THE PROPORTION NVICTED AT THE FELONY LEVEL INCREASED BY 50 PERCENT

#### **CONVICTION RATE**



- The total conviction rate on felony drug arrests remained essentially unchanged between 1983 and 1987 at 70 percent.
- Simultaneously, the conviction rate on non-drug felony arrests declined steadily from 67 percent to 60 percent. During the five year period, felony drug arrests were increasingly more likely to result in conviction than non-drug felonies.
- The number of convictions resulting from drug felony arrests rose by 104 percent between 1983 and 1987, from 12,211 to 24,903.

## PERCENT OF CONVICTIONS TO FELONIES




- The percent of convictions at the felony level that resulted from felony drug arrests rose from 42 percent in 1983 to 63 percent in 1987. For convictions resulting from non-drug felony arrests, the proportion of felony convictions edged up slightly to 38 percent from 35 percent.
- During the five year period, convictions from felony drug arrests were increasingly more likely to result in a felony conviction than were non-drug arrests.
- The number of felony convictions resulting from felony drug arrests tripled (+210%) between 1983 and 1987, increasing from 5,091 to 15,764.



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
# THE PROPORTION OF CONVICTIONS AT THE FELONY LEVEL ROSE IN ALL REGIONS OF THE STATE, BUT MOST DRAMATICALLY IN NEW YORK CITY





- Between 1983 and 1987, the conviction rate on felony drug arrests rose slightly in the Suburban New York City (from 82% to 86%) and the Upstate (from 74% to 75%) areas, while it remained unchanged in New York City at 69 percent.
- Throughout the five year period, felony drug arrests were more likely to result in a conviction in Suburban New York City, than in the Upstate counties or New York City.


## PERCENT OF CONVICTIONS TO FELONIES



- While the percentage of convictions at the felony level increased in each area of the State, regional differences narrowed considerably between 1983 and 1987. The percent of convictions from drug felony arrests occurring at the felony level increased significantly in New York City (from 39% to 63%) and Upstate (from 50% to 64%). The already high Suburban New York City rate rose modestly from 62 percent to 68 percent.
- The number of felony convictions from felony drug arrests jumped by 240 percent in New York City to 13,505, rose by 129 percent in Suburban New York City to 1,301, and increased by 76 percent in the Upstate counties to 958.

# THE NUMBER OF INCARCERATIVE SENTENCES (PRISON, JAIL, AND JAIL PLUS PROBATION) RESULTING FROM BOTH FELONY AND MISDEMEANOR DRUG ARRESTS INCREASED TWICE AS FAST AS CONVICTIONS


## SENTENCES FOR CONVICTIONS FROM FELONY AND MISDEMEANOR DRUG ARRESTS



- Between 1983 and 1987, convictions from felony and misdemeanor drug arrests rose by 78 percent, from 33,462 to 59,605.
- Resulting incarcerations from these convictions increased twice the rate, rising by 170 percent from 14,107 in 1983 to 38,908 in 1987.


Note: Sentences to prison and jail are based on an event unit of count and are not equivalent to actual admissions.

### INCARCERATION RATE FOR CONVICTIONS FROM FELONY ARRESTS



Seventy percent of the convictions from felony drug arrests resulted in an incarcerative sentence in 1987 (the incarceration rate). This reflects a steady increase from the 50 percent incarceration rate in 1983. The rate for non-drug felonies fell slightly during the same period.

## INCARCERATION RATE FOR CONVICTIONS FROM FELONY DRUG ARRESTS




The incarceration rate for convictions from felony drug arrests increased significantly in all regions of the State during the five year period. In 1987, Suburban New York City had an incarceration rate of 75 percent (up from 56%); New York City's rate was 71 percent (up from 50%), followed by the Upstate counties at 58 percent (up from 45%).





## INCARCERATIVE SENTENCES FOR CONVICTIONS FROM FELONY DRUG ARRESTS



- The number of incarcerative sentences resulting from felony drug arrests increased by 186 percent between 1983 and 1987, rising from 6,120 to 17,505.
- Prison sentences accounted for a slightly increasing proportion of the incarcerative sentences imposed for convictions from felony drug arrests (from 32 percent in 1983 to 36 percent in 1987).




- The number of state prison sentences for drug conviction charges increased by 220 percent, rising from 1,979 in 1983 to 6,323 in 1987.
- Prison sentences for non-drug charges in 1987 were four percent below the 1983 figure. Drug charges accounted for all of the total increase in the number of prison sentences imposed between 1983 and 1987.
- In 1987, the median\* minimum term of imprisonment on drug charges was 24 months, and the median maximum term was 48 months.

<sup>\*</sup>The median describes the midpoint of a distribution, (i.e., half of the minimum prison sentences were shorter than 24 months and half were longer).


MENT IN THE EFFECTIVE-**NESS OF PROCESSING** 

- For every 100 felony drug arrests that were disposed of in 1987 statewide, 50 felony court prosecutions resulted, an increase of 43 percent from the 35 that resulted from similar arrests in 1983. The 49 incarcerations per 100 arrests, including 18 state prison sentences, represent increases of 40 percent and 64 percent respectively, from the 1983 figures.
- An examination of *felony* drug sale arrest processing reveals 33 percent increases in both the proportion prosecuted in felony court (from 46 to 61 per 100 arrests), and in the number of resulting incarcerations (from 42 to 56). State prison sentences rose by 38 percent to 22 per 100 arrests.
- The processing of *felony drug* possession arrests in 1987 resulted in 32 felony court prosecutions, up 39 percent from 1983, and 36 incarcerations, an increase of 38 percent. Resulting state prison sentences increased by 50 percent, from six to nine.

## OVERVIEW OF FELONY DRUG PROCESSING

(continued)



- All regions demonstrated significant increases. Felony court prosecutions per 100 felony drug arrests increased by 56 percent in New York City, 14 percent Upstate and 12 percent in Suburban New York City. Incarcerations per 100 felony drug arrests rose by 37 percent in New York City, 39 percent in Suburban New York City, and by 33 percent Upstate. State prison sentences per 100 felony drug arrests jumped by 55 percent in New York City, 28 percent in Suburban New York City, and 73 percent Upstate.
- A comparison of the 1987 processing by region reveals that felony drug arrests were most likely to result in felony prosecutions, incarcerations, and state prison sentences in the Suburban New York City counties. However, regional differences narrowed considerably during the five year period.

## DATA SOURCES

Arrest and disposition data were obtained from the Computerized Criminal History/Offender-Based Transaction Statistics system maintained by DCJS. The unit of count is the arrest event, and not individual offenders. An individual offender can be associated with multiple arrest events. Because of this, counts such as sentences to prison or jail are not equivalent to actual admissions.

All arrest events occurring between 1983 and 1987 which involved adults (individuals 16 years of age and older) charged with at least one felony drug offense were included in this report. Drug offenses include those specified in the New York State Penal Law under Articles 220 (Controlled Substances) and 221 (Marihuana). In events where more than one drug offense was charged, only the most serious charge was counted. The selection of the most serious charge was based on the felony class of offense; if the classes were equal, a sale offense was ranked above a possession offense. Note also that possession of a controlled substance with intent to sell it was counted as a possession offense.

Arrest figures are based on the year in which the arrest occurred. System processing and sentencing figures are based on the year in which the most serious disposition occurred, regardless of the year in which the arrest occurred. All arrests and dispositions reported to DCJS as of March 22, 1988 were included in this report. Note that because of the ongoing submission of data to the system, all figures are subject to change as disposition reporting becomes more complete. This applies particularly to the figures for the more recent years and the Upstate counties where disposition reporting is less complete.

Indictment information was obtained from the Indictment Statistical System. The unit of count is the defendant-indictment. Superior court informations are included in the count of indictments. Non-drug indictments include juvenile offenders.

## **DEFINITIONS**

Arrest and processing data are provided statewide and for three major geographic regions of the State:

New York City: including Bronx, Kings, New York, Queens and Richmond counties,

Suburban New York City: including Nassau, Rockland, Suffolk and Westchester counties, and

Upstate Counties: including the remaining 53 counties of the State not included in New York City or Suburban New York City.

The rates used in this report were computed as follows:

Felony Drug Arrest Rate: based on the number of felony drug arrests recorded during 1987 per 100,000 adult resident population in the county (individuals 16 years of age and older).

Felony Prosecution Rate: the percentage of felony drug arrests that were prosecuted in the upper courts.

Conviction Rate: the percentage of total dispositions that were convictions obtained in both the lower and upper courts.

Percent of Convictions to Felonies: the percentage of total convictions obtained that were for felony offenses. Incarceration Rate: the percentage of total convictions that resulted in a sentence to either state prison, a local jail facility, or a split sentence of probation and jail.
