

This is the thirteenth Crime and Justice Annual Report prepared by the Division of Criminal Justice Services pursuant to Sections 837, 837-a, and 837-b of the Executive Law.

### ANNUAL REPORT

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## STATUTORY AUTHORITY

The collection, analysis and dissemination of criminal justice data in New York State is authorized by Sections 837, 837-a and 837-b of the Executive Law, to wit:

### "§ 837. Functions, powers and duties of division

The division shall have the following functions, powers and duties:

... 4. In cooperation with the state administrator of the unified court system as well as any other public or private agency,

... (c) collect and analyze statistical and other information and data with respect to the number of crimes reported or known to police or peace officers, the number of persons arrested for the commission of offense, the offense for which the person was arrested, the county within which the arrest was made and the accusatory instrument filed, the disposition of the accusatory instrument including, but not limited to, as the case may be, dismissal, acquittal, the offense to which the defendant pled guilty, the offense the defendant was convicted of after trial, and the sentence."

### "§ 837-a. Additional functions, powers and duties of the division

In addition to the functions, powers and duties otherwise provided by this article, the division shall:


1. Collect and analyze statistical and other information and data with respect to the number of persons charged with the commission of a felony by indictment or the filing of a superior court information, the felony with which the person was charged therein, the county within which the indictment or superior court information was filed, the disposition thereof including, but not limited to, as the case may be, dismissal, acquittal, the offense to which the defendant pleaded guilty, the offense the defendant was convicted of after trial, and the sentence."

### "§ 837-b. Duties of courts and peace officers

1. It is hereby made the duty of the state administrator of the unified court system; and of every sheriff, county or city commissioner of correction and head of every police department, state, county or local, and also railroad, steamship, park, aqueduct and tunnel police and town constables, of every district attorney, of every probation agency; and of head of every institution or department, state, county, and local, dealing with criminals and of every other officer, person or agency, dealing with crimes or criminals or with delinquency or delinquents, to transmit to the commissioner not later than the fifteenth day of each calendar month, or at such times as provided in the rules and regulations adopted by the commissioner, such information as may be necessary to enable him to comply with subdivision four of section eight hundred thirty-seven. Such reports shall be made upon forms which shall be supplied by the commissioner.


2. Such officers and agencies shall install and maintain records needed for reporting data required by the commissioner and shall give him or his accredited agents access to records for the purpose of inspection.

3. For every neglect to comply with the requirements of this section, the commissioner may apply to the supreme court for an order directed to such persons responsible requiring compliance. Upon such application the court may issue such order as may be just, and a failure to comply with the order of the court shall be a contempt of court and punishable as such."

## INTRODUCTION

The New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services was assigned the responsibility for the collection of data concerning crimes and arrests in New York State, effective January 1975, pursuant to Sections 837, 837-a and 837-b of the Executive Law. In assuming that responsibility, the Division was also committed to providing relevant data to the National Uniform Crime Reporting Program administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and to disseminating this information to the New York State criminal justice community.

This publication is the thirteenth annual report produced in discharge of that responsibility.

Uniform Crime Reports submitted monthly by police agencies in New York State are the basis for much of the material contained in this report. These reports include information on Part I Offenses, Part II Offenses, location and time of the Offense, value of property stolen, Part I Arrests, Part II Arrests, Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted and Number of Law Enforcement Employees.

- In 1987, all 586 enforcement agencies participated in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program and agencies with multi-county jurisdictions reported separately of each county within their jurisdiction.
- Police agencies also submit supplementary reports on homicide and arson offenses. These detailed reports allow for a more in-depth analysis of these serious crimes.

In addition to Uniform Crime Reporting data contained in this report, we have provided data on felony arrests, felony drug arrests, and felony indictments and dispositions.

- The arrest material is derived from the Computerized Criminal History (CCH), which is based on the arrest fingerprint cards submitted to the Division of Criminal Justice Services in compliance with Section 160.20 of the Criminal Procedure Law. Adult felony and misdemeanor arrests are presented for each county from 1982 through 1987.

The felony indictment and disposition material is reported by District Attorneys and Special Prosecutors throughout the State pursuant to Section 837-a of the Executive Law. This material includes data on felony indictments, felony drug indictments, felony dispositions and median time from indictment through disposition.

- Information from other criminal justice agencies is included in this report to present, in one volume, as much information as possible about the criminal justice system.

For many reasons, not all offenses come to the attention of the police. Victims may feel too embarrassed to report a crime or that the loss sustained was too small to report or believe that there is nothing the police can do. Victimization studies have confirmed that many offenses are never reported.

When an offense is cleared, it is usually done by one or more arrests. However, there are exceptional circumstances when an offense may be cleared without an arrest. Exceptional clearances result when the police know who and where the offender is and have enough evidence to support an arrest, but are prevented from doing so because of some reason outside of their control.

The UCR data included in this report are divided into seven main segments:

## AGE SEX, RACE AND ETHNIC ORIGINS OF PERSONS ARRESTED

- Note: The FBI/UCR Program treats persons under 18 as juveniles, and requires that they be so reported. This report, however, is compiled in accordance with New York State Law which classifies juveniles as those persons under 16 and adults as those 16 and over.

## LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED

Statistics are provided on the number of New York State Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted. A description of the conditions under which the officers were assaulted is also provided.

## HOMICIDE ANALYSIS

- Detail on homicides committed in New York State, including characteristics of victims and circumstances under which such homicides occurred, are provided.

## ARSON ANALYSIS

- This report provides additional detail concerning arson. The analysis describes the types of structures involved, distribution of activity and clearance rates.

## DOMESTIC VIOLENCE


- Statistics are presented relating to the incidence of Domestic Violence by geographic locations in New York State, New York City and Upstate Counties.

To combat crime effectively, it must be known when and where crime is occurring. The county, as a crime location, is not sufficiently definitive. Therefore, we have instituted direct reporting to the State program from every Police Chief and Sheriff in New York State in accordance with State Law.

It is important to note that without the collaboration of the Law Enforcement Agencies and cooperation of the criminal justice agencies, this Report would not be possible.

## POPULATION DATA SOURCE

Population data used for calculating crime rates for the 1987 Crime And Justice Annual Report are based on 1980 census data and updates provided by the United States Department of Commerce - Bureau of Census and the New York State Department of Commerce.

## OFFENSES

For over 50 years criminal offenses have been used as a crime index to assess the level of criminal activity within an area. The index offenses were selected because of their seriousness or frequency of occurrence.

The index offenses are murder & non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft.

Comparisons of crime rates between police agencies or counties should be made with extreme caution. The crime rates published in this report are based solely on offenses reported or known to the police and the size of the resident population. Additional factors which may influence crime rates are density of population, geographic location, social attitudes, economic conditions, number of law enforcement officers, seasonal and transient populations, and rural or urban environments.

### INDEX OFFENSES

Index offenses increased 3.6 percent in New York State from 1986 to 1987.

### VIOLENT OFFENSES

Violent offenses (murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault) showed an increase of 2.6 percent from 1986 to 1987.

Violent offenses accounted for 17.0 percent of the index total.

### MURDER

Murder and non-negligent manslaughter increased 5.1 percent from 1,909 in 1986 to 2,007 in 1987.

New York City reported 83.3 percent of the murder offenses in New York State.

### FORCIBLE RAPE

Forcible rape offenses went from 5,403 in 1986 to 5,525 in 1987, an increase of 2.3 percent.

New York City reported 63.7 percent of the forcible rape offenses.

### ROBBERY

Robbery offenses decreased 2.0 percent from 91,376 offenses in 1986 to 89,576 in 1987.

New York City reported 88.2 percent of the robberies in New York State.

### **AGGRAVATED ASSAULT**

Aggravated assault offenses increased 8.0 percent from 1986 to 1987.

New York City reported 78.2 percent of the aggravated assaults in New York State.

### **NON-VIOLENT OFFENSES**

Non-violent offenses (burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft) increased 3.8 percent from 1986 to 1987.

Non-violent offenses constituted 83.0 percent of the index total.

### **BURGLARY**

Burglary offenses rose less than 0.1 percent from 1986 to 1987.

New York City reported 57.2 percent of the burglary offenses in New York State.

### **LARCENY**

Larceny offenses increased 3.9 percent from 1986 to 1987.

The 536,536 larceny offenses included larcenies of any amount, and accounted for 50.7 percent of the index offenses.

### **MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT**

Motor vehicle theft increased 10.9 percent from 1986 to 1987.

New York City reported 76.4 percent of the motor vehicle thefts in New York State.

### **PART II OFFENSES**

A total of 1,667,783 Part II Offenses were reported in 1987, an 1.5 percent increase over 1986.

Part II Offenses comprise all offenses not included in Part I Offenses and range in seriousness from kidnaping to disorderly conduct.

### **PROPERTY STOLEN**

In New York State, the value of property stolen during the commission of index offenses was \$1,312,529,336 in 1987, a 4.7 percent increase from the 1986 total of \$1,253,563,537.

Stolen vehicles accounted for 49.1 percent of the value of property stolen in 1987.

Summary

- There were 2,003 homicide victims in New York State in 1987, a 3.5 percent increase over the 1,936 victims in 1986.
- The month of January had the fewest homicides (134) and December had the most (211), a range of 77.
- The first quarter of 1987 had the fewest homicides (21.7 percent) and the last quarter had the most (28.9 percent).
- New York City reported 83.3 percent of the homicides in the state, the remaining 16.3 percent being reported by counties outside of the city.

Offender Characteristics

- In those cases where the age of the offender was known (Effective N = 1,126), 46.6 percent of the offenders were in the age groups of 16-24.
- Offenders were predominately male. In those cases where the sex of the offender was known (Effective N = 1,294), 93.7 percent of the offenders were male.
- In those cases where offender race was known (Effective N = 1,289), 42.8 percent of the offenders were white and 54.8 percent were black.

Victim Characteristics

- When the age of the victim was known (Effective N = 1,979), 65.6 percent of the victims were in the age group of 20-39.
- In those cases where the victim sex was known (Effective N = 1,995), 80.2 percent of the victims were male.
- For those cases where victim race was known (Effective N = 1,994), 44.5 percent of the victims were white and 52.9 percent were black.

### Victim-Offender Relationship

- Victims tend to be slightly older than the offenders. A victim is most likely to be in the 25-29 age range, while an offender is most likely to be in the 20-24 age range.
- Males are more likely to be killed in situations outside the family setting, usually involving a stranger or a casual acquaintance. This occurs in 88.1 percent of the cases where the relationship is known (Effective N = 750).
- Females are more likely to be killed by a family member or in a romantic dispute. This occurs in 52.1 percent of the cases where the relationship is known (Effective N = 217).

### Circumstances

- The circumstances surrounding a homicide was unknown in 49.1 percent of the cases.
- For those cases where the circumstances were known (Effective N = 1,019), 34.7 percent were felony connected.
- In those cases when the location was known (Effective N = 1,981), 45.6 percent of the victims were killed indoors and 54.4 percent outdoors.

### Weapons

- In the 1,948 cases where the type of weapon was known, 62.4 percent were killed by firearms and 37.6 percent were killed by all other means.
- Among the firearm victims, 92.6 percent were killed by handguns and 7.4 percent by rifles, shotguns, etc.
- The most frequently occurring homicide was a shooting with a handgun of a victim 25-29 years old by a 20-24 year old offender.






## ARSON

This is the ninth analysis of arsons in New York State to be presented in the Crime and Justice Annual Report. The data for these analyses are derived from a supplementary arson data collection program begun in 1979 under the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) System.

- Arson is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting Program as a "willful or malicious burning, or attempted burning, of a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle, aircraft, or personal property of another." Only fires determined through investigation to have been willfully or maliciously set are classified as arsons.

- A "cleared"<sup>1</sup> arson incident is defined as an offense for which a perpetrator has been taken into custody or is otherwise known by police to have committed the crime, but for reasons outside police control cannot be taken into custody.

Arsons reported under Part II of the UCR program and shown elsewhere in this volume are reported under the "hierarchy rule," whereby an offense is counted only if it is the most serious in an incident. Under this program, an arson offense is reported regardless of whether it occurred in conjunction with a more serious offense. This analysis, therefore, shows more arson offenses than are shown for arson offenses in the UCR Part II offense presentations.

Type of property is divided into three categories:

- structural (residential, commercial, public/community, and other);
- mobile (motor vehicle and other);
- other property.

The definitions of property type are as follows:

### **SINGLE OCCUPANCY RESIDENTIAL**

includes houses, townhouses and duplexes.

### **OTHER RESIDENTIAL**

includes apartments, tenements, flats, hotels, motels, inns, dormitories and boarding houses.

### **STORAGE**

includes warehouses, garages and barns.

### **INDUSTRIAL/MANUFACTURING**

includes factories and all other manufacturing facilities.

**OTHER COMMERCIAL**

includes stores, restaurants and offices.

**PUBLIC/COMMUNITY**

includes churches, jails, schools, colleges and hospitals.

**ALL OTHER STRUCTURES**

includes out-buildings, monuments and structures under construction.

**MOTOR VEHICLES**

includes automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, motor scooters, and snowmobiles.

**OTHER MOBILE**

includes airplanes, boats, trailers, and recreational vehicles.

**OTHER PROPERTY**

includes crops, timber, fences, and signs.


Estimated values of property damaged are included in the report. They are included in order to provide an estimate of the absolute minimum dollar value. Because many police departments have little or no access to dollar amounts for arson, the monetary values for many arson cases are not reported.

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
<sup>1</sup> The clearance rate is the ratio of clearances to the net number of arsons reported, expressed as a percent. Because a 1987 clearance does not necessarily reflect clearance of an offense reported in 1987, the clearance rate should be considered only as a general indicator of processing efficiency.

NEW YORK STATE



**ARSONS REPORTED**

There were 11,301 arson incidents reported in New York State in 1987, a 1.0% decrease from 1986.

**Structural Arsons**

- Arsons of structures accounted for 65.4% of all New York State arsons. Of these 47.0% were residential arsons. Consistent with data from previous years, residential structural arsons remained the most common type of structural arson throughout the State.
- Commercial structure arsons accounted for 12.7% of all arsons in New York State. "Other Commercial" arsons, the most frequent form of commercial arson in New York State, accounted for 8.2% of the arsons statewide.
- The 731 arsons that occurred in abandoned structures accounted for 6.5% of all arsons in New York State. Residential structures were the most common form of abandoned structures to be targets for arson.

**Mobile Arsons**

- In this category, the 3,556 "motor vehicle" arsons reported in New York State accounted for 31.5% of all New York State arsons, while "other mobile" accounted for 1.1% of these arsons.

**ARSONS CLEARED**

- In 1987, 1401 arson incidents were cleared in New York State. Of these, 77.9% were structure arsons, of which 54.8% were residential and 13.7% were commercial.
- Four hundred thirty-three of the arson clearances involved persons under age 18. Persons in this age group accounted for 30.9% of the arson clearances in the state; this represents a slight decrease from 1986 when they accounted for 32.1%.

**ARSON CLEARANCE RATES**

- The 1987 clearance rate for all arsons in New York State was 12.4%. This relatively low clearance rate inclusive of the low clearance rates of New York City and Upstate, seems to reflect the extreme difficulty in solving a crime in which most of the physical evidence is destroyed.
- Arson clearance rates also vary by the type of property involved. In 1987 statewide clearance rates for the "public community" and "other mobile property" structural category had the highest clearance rates (21.8%), while "motor vehicle arson" had the lowest clearance rates (6.6%).

There were 6,810 arson incidents reported in New York City in 1987, 60.3% of the total New York State arsons.

**Structural Arsons**

- Structural arsons in New York City accounted for 68.6% of all New York City arsons reported.
- Of all "other residential" arsons, 84.1% took place in New York City.
- Only 9.8% of the arsons in New York City were commercial structural arsons - less than the Upstate percentage.
- In New York City, 3.2% of all arsons involved abandoned structures.

**Mobile Arsons**

- Almost 55% of the motor vehicle arsons occurred in New York City.

**ARSONS CLEARED**

- In New York City, clearances of residential arsons accounted for 71.1% of the total arsons cleared.
- In New York City, 11.7% of the clearances involved persons "under 18".

There were 4,491 arson incidents reported in the counties in Upstate New York in 1987, 39.7% of the total New York State arsons.

**Structural Arsons**

- Upstate structural arsons reported equaled 24.1% of the total New York State arsons.
- Of the "single occupancy" arsons 78.0% took place upstate and constituted approximately 21.8% of the total arsons upstate.
- Upstate had a higher proportion of commercial structural arsons 17.1% than New York City.
- Upstate, 11.4% of all arsons occurred in abandoned structures.

**Mobile Arsons**

- Of the motor vehicle arsons, 45.1% occurred upstate.

**ARSONS CLEARED**

- The Upstate clearance rate<sup>1</sup> was 20.6%.
- Clearances of residential arsons accounted for 46.4% of arsons cleared upstate.
- Upstate 40.8% of the clearances involved persons "under 18".


The Governor's Task Force on Domestic Violence was established by Executive Order #90 on May 17, 1979, to study "the traumatic effects of domestic violence and how our social and legal systems can better deal with such violence and its causes."

The Uniform Crime Reporting System (UCR) is utilized by DCJS as the data collection instrument for obtaining domestic violence data from the local law enforcement agencies. The domestic violence data reflected in this report are based on those offenses which have come to the attention of law enforcement officers, regardless of whether a formal complaint was filed or an arrest made.

For New York City, the 51,796 offenses reported in 1987 is a 35.2 percent increase over 38,315 reported in 1986, while the Upstate counties decreased 8.5 percent.

Statewide, domestic violence offenses reported increased. A total of 73,645 offenses were reported in 1987 as opposed to 62,191 reported in 1986, an increase of 18.4 percent. As in prior years, this increase is largely due to improved reporting by the law enforcement agencies across the State.

## ARRESTS

Arrests in New York State during 1987 totaled 1,229,674, a 0.8 percent increase from the 1,219,704 arrests in 1986. Males accounted for 85.0 percent of those arrested and females, 15.0 percent.

Arrests for index offenses -- murder, non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft -- increased from 182,703 in 1986 to 194,119, up 6.2 percent. In 1987, arrests for index offenses accounted for 15.8 percent of the New York State arrest total.

### ADULT ARRESTS <sup>1</sup>

- A total of 1,150,535 adult arrests were reported in New York State in 1987.
- Adults sixteen through twenty-nine accounted for 65.1 percent of the adult arrest total and adults twenty-one and under made up 28.4 percent of the arrest total.

### JUVENILE ARRESTS

- New York State reported a total of 79,139 juvenile arrests in 1987, 0.9 percent below the 79,838 reported in 1986.
- Males represented 81.1 percent of the juveniles arrested and females, 18.9 percent.
- Arrests for fifteen year olds accounted for 36.6 percent of the juveniles arrested and fourteen year olds represented an additional 26.2 percent.

### NEW YORK CITY

- New York City reported 70.0 percent of all the arrests in New York State for 1987.
- The 47,480 juvenile arrests reported by New York City accounted for 60.0 percent of the state total.

### DRUG ARRESTS

- Combined adult and juvenile drug arrests increased from 101,566 in 1986 to 114,363 in 1987, an increase of 12.6 percent.
- Arrests for marijuana accounted for 30.8 percent of the New York State drug arrests.
- Arrests for opium, cocaine and derivatives represented 63.0 percent of the drug arrests and showed a 32.2 percent increase from 1986 to 1987.

**RACE AND ETHNIC ORIGIN**


- Data on race and ethnic origin were estimated for nearly 600,00 summonses reported from New York City. Existing forms do not provide for the reporting of racial and ethnic data for New York City summonses. Arrest categories that include these estimates are: marijuana use, criminal mischief, other gambling, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, loitering and "all other offenses" category.

**ADULT FELONY AND MISDEMEANOR ARRESTS**

- A total of 178,719 felony adult arrests were reported in New York State in 1987, 3.7 percent above the 172,267 reported in 1986.
- New York City reported 72.6 percent of the total adult felony arrests in 1987 compared to 71.5 percent in 1986.
- New York State reported 302,556 adult misdemeanor arrests in 1987, a 6.5 percent increase over the 284,179 reported in 1986.
- New York City showed a 5.0 percent increase in adult misdemeanor arrests from 1986 to 1987 and represented 47.4 percent of the state total in 1987.







## INDICTMENTS AND DISPOSITIONS

The following tables present data on felony indictments<sup>1</sup> and dispositions for 1987 and 1986. This information is obtained from a statistical reporting system based on individual reports of each indictment and each disposition submitted by district attorneys and special prosecutors throughout the State. The unit count in this reporting system is the defendant/indictment; that is:

- When several defendants are named in one proceeding or indictment, each defendant is counted separately; and
- When one defendant is named in multiple proceedings or indictments, each indictment is counted separately.

The use of offender-based statistics and the tracking of each defendant from time of indictment until final disposition makes possible the measuring of elapsed time between various stages in processing. The median time is obtained by ranking all the values in a specific category (for example, time from indictment to disposition) and choosing the middle number - that is, the number with an equal amount of values above and below it. As a result, the median values are not influenced by very large or very small numbers which can affect averages.

It should be noted that the disposition data reported in these tables pertain to cases handled during the specified year by the superior courts. These dispositions may be for indictments in the same or previous years.

### DEFENDANT-INDICTMENTS

- A total of 62,858 felony indictments were reported in New York State in 1987 an 11.7 percent increase from 1986.
- New York State drug indictments increased from 15,697 in 1986 to 22,730 in 1987, a gain of 44.8 percent.
- Indictments for Class A drug offenses rose 12.2 percent statewide.
- Indictments for non-drug offenses registered a drop of 1.1 percent.
- Drug indictments in New York State accounted for 36.2 percent of the indictment total in 1987 compared to 27.9 percent in 1986.
- In 1987, New York City reported 67.6 percent of the State indictment total and 82.7 percent to the drug indictment total.
- Drug indictments in New York City constituted 44.2 percent of the indictment total in 1987 versus 36.0 percent in 1986.
- In New York City, felony indictments rose 17.5 percent from 1986 to 1987 and drug indictments increased 44.4 percent.
- Although New York City reported a 6.0 percent increase in Class A drug indictments, its share of the State total dropped from 72.3 percent in 1986 to 68.3 percent in 1987.
- In the Suburban Area of New York City (Nassau, Rockland, Suffolk and Westchester Counties) felony indictments increased 3.3 percent while drug indictments rose 53.8 percent.

- Drug indictments accounted for 25.3 percent of the indictment total in the Suburban Area in 1987 compared to 17.0 percent in 1986.
- In the Upstate Area, felony indictments increased less than 1.0 percent while felony drug indictments increased 41.0 percent.
- In 1987, felony drug indictments made up 15.8 percent of the Upstate indictment total compared to 11.3 percent in 1986.

## DISPOSITIONS

- Dispositions include felony indictments for which the judicial proceedings were completed by dismissal, acquittal, other court action or by conviction and sentence.
- In 1987, 56,216 dispositions were reported in New York State, 10.6 percent above the 50,843 reported in 1986.
- Dispositions for drug indictments in New York State increased from 10,438 in 1986 to 18,275 in 1987, a rise of 75.1 percent.
- Statewide, drug dispositions accounted for 32.5 percent of the disposition total in 1987 compared to 20.5 percent in 1986.
- In 1987, state prison sentences in New York State totaled 19,795 up 11.9 percent from the 17,695 reported in 1986. State prison sentences resulting from drug indictments increased 69.3 percent and accounted for 32.6 percent of the state prison sentence in 1987 compared to 21.5 percent in 1986.
- In 1987, New York City reported 66.3 percent of the total dispositions in New York State and 83.0 percent of the drug dispositions.
- Dispositions of drug indictments accounted for 40.7 percent of the total dispositions in New York City in 1987 compared to 26.2 percent in 1986.
- In 1987, in New York City, sentences to state prison for drug indictments accounted for 36.1 percent of the total New York City prison sentences versus 23.8 percent in 1986.
- In the Suburban Area of New York City total dispositions dropped 1.1 percent while drug dispositions rose 62.2 percent.
- State prison sentences increased 5.1 percent in the Suburban Area and state prison sentences for drug offenses were up 57.7 percent.
- Dispositions for all offenses were up less than 1.0 percent Upstate while dispositions for drug offenses increased 36.5 percent.
- In the Upstate Area, state prison sentences rose 5.0 percent and state prison sentences for drug offenses increased 41.3 percent.


FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW




FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

1986




FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW




FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW



1987




FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

1987




FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW


FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

1986




FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW



1987




FELONY DEFENDANT PROCESSING FLOW

## SENTENCES FOR SELECTED FELONY OFFENSES

New York State convictions and sentences for murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary and larceny<sup>1/</sup> are compared for 1987 and 1986 on the following tables.

### CONVICTION CHARGE

- These tables include the type of sentence and the length of maximum sentence to state prison.
- Convictions for these offenses dropped from 20,250 in 1986 to 18,859 in 1987, a decrease of 8.2 percent.
- Convictions for the more serious offenses (Class A, B, and C made up 33.2 percent of the conviction total in 1987 but accounted for 52.1 percent of the state prison sentences.
- Convictions for robbery 1st degree and robbery 2nd degree and attempts at these crimes dropped from 6,777 in 1986 to 5,879 in 1987, a decline of 13.3 percent.

### SENTENCE

- State prison sentences dropped 4.6 percent, although they constituted 54.2 percent of the conviction total in 1987 compared to 52.2 percent in 1986.
- In 1987, there were 450 sentences to life imprisonment; 335 for murder or attempted murder and 115 sentences for persistent felony offenders.

## **PROCESSING TRENDS FOR FELONY OFFENSES AND FELONY DRUG OFFENSES**

Data shown for these offenses were obtained from several sources. The felony arrest data were obtained from fingerprint cards submitted to the Division in accordance with Section 160.20 of the Criminal Procedure Law. Data on indictment through sentence were provided on individual reports by District Attorneys and Special Prosecutors in New York State.

Indictments, convictions and sentences to state prison may result from felony arrests in the same year or previous years. Convictions may be for indictments in the same or previous years and are included in the year in which the defendant was sentenced.

### **FELONY OFFENSES**

In New York State felony arrests rose 3.7 percent from 1986 to 1987 and increased 26.5 percent from 1983 to 1987. From 1986 to 1987 felony indictments increased 11.7 percent, convictions 12.1 percent and state prison sentences 11.9 percent.


### **FELONY DRUG OFFENSES**

Felony drug arrests rose 118.1 percent from 1983 to 1987 and were up 22.5 percent from 1986 to 1987.


Felony drug indictments followed a similar pattern, increasing each year from 1983 to 1987, for a five year increase of 207.1 percent.

Convictions resulting from felony drug indictments rose 207.8 percent from 1983 to 1987 with a corresponding increase in state prison sentences which rose 224.0 percent from 1983 to 1987 and were up 69.3 percent from 1986 to 1987.

 1983 - 1987





### WEAPON

● Physical force, as in prior years, was the most common method of assault; 78.8% of the officers were assaulted in this manner.


● Other dangerous weapons were the next most frequently used weapons in assaults (10.8%) followed by handguns at 5.8%, knives at 3.4% and lastly, other firearms at 1.2%.

### ACTIVITY

● As in previous years, assaults occurred most frequently when officers were attempting arrests, accounting for 30.2% of the assaults.

● The next highest number of assaults took place during disturbance calls, accounting for 17.6% of the assaults.

● The fewest number of assaults, 0.3%, occurred during ambushes.

# KILLED OR ASSAULTED - 1987

During 1987, nine law enforcement officers were feloniously slain in the line of duty in New York State.

Four other officers, including one Federal officer, accidentally lost their lives while performing law enforcement duties.


There were 7147 officers assaulted while performing law enforcement functions, an increase of 3.8% from the 6,888 officers assaulted in 1986.

In 1987, 90% of the assaults resulted in personal injury to the officer.

## ASSIGNMENT

• Officers assigned to two-man vehicles experienced the most assaults, 49.1%. These assaults increased 1.7% over 1986.

• In contrast, only 8.8% of the assaults were experienced by officers assigned to one-man vehicles. The 628 cases represent a 2.3% increase from the previous year.


• The likelihood that a law enforcement officer would be assaulted was greatest between 10:00 pm and 12:00 pm, the hours when 1019 of the assaults took place.

• An assault was least likely to occur between 6:00 am and 8:00 am, the hours when only 192 of the assaults took place.

• Almost half of all assaults (49.6%) occurred between 4:00 pm and midnight, the hours when police are usually their busiest.

• The hours of midnight to 8:00 am recorded the lowest percentage of assaults, 24.4%.

## LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

### EMPLOYEES

- A total of 75,429 persons were employed by law enforcement agencies in New York State in 1987.<sup>1</sup> This figure includes both sworn and civilian personnel and those working full or part-time as well.
- The 1987 figure represents an increase of 1.9 percent over the figure reported in 1986.
- The largest department was the New York City Police Department with 34,764 employees.
- The next largest departments, in order of size, were the New York State Police with 4,861, the New York City Transit Authority with 4,195, Nassau County Police with 3,909 and the Suffolk County Police with 3,097 employees.
- Statewide, 81.9 percent of the employees were sworn personnel.
- The number of sworn personnel increased 0.6 percent between 1986 and 1987.
- Ninety-seven percent (96.5 percent) of the sworn personnel were employed full time.
- Females accounted for 7.7 percent of the sworn personnel; the number of females employed rose 5.7 percent over the number employed in 1986.
- Municipal police agencies employed 75.1 percent of the sworn personnel in New York State; special or multiple jurisdiction agencies (parks, railroads, university campuses, etc.) employed 9.8 percent and sheriffs employed the remaining 5.1 percent.

### EXPENDITURES

- The State's law enforcement agencies estimates of operating expenditures for FY 1987 amounted to \$3,220,668,323, an increase of 9.1 percent over FY 1986 operating expenditures. The 1987 expenditures were distributed across law enforcement jurisdictions as follows:

HAZARDOUS WASTE AND WASTE DISPOSAL VIOLATIONS  
IN NEW YORK STATE

Legislative enactment (Chapter 631 of the 1987 Laws of New York) requires the Division of Criminal Justice Services to collect and analyze statistical and all other information and data with respect to the number of environmental crimes and offenses violating Articles 27, 37, 40 and Titles 27 and 37 of Article 71 of Environmental Conservation Law regarding hazardous waste and waste disposal. The following is presented in satisfaction of that mandate for the year 1987.

BACKGROUND

Over the past several years the State of New York has increasingly recognized the latent danger and inherent damage that even a few violations to laws governing hazardous waste and waste disposal can entail. Several facts have surfaced as a result of identifying the problem.

- The actual number of offenses reported and offenders apprehended is small in comparison to other crimes yet the number of victims and potential victims is much greater. The Summer of 1988, with the closing of many Long Island beaches due to hazardous medical waste being washed on-shore, has demonstrated just how serious and widespread the outcome of such violations can be, affecting not only the quality of the environment but jeopardizing the health and well-being of large numbers of New Yorkers.
- The most common mode of moving hazardous materials is by highway. Improper movement can endanger citizens over an extensive path.
- There has been evidence to indicate that organized crime has become involved in the highly profitable hazardous waste and waste disposal business and with that the increased likelihood of more violations of regulations.

In an effort to protect its citizens and to curtail violations, the New York State Legislature and the Governor has enacted a number of bills.

- Ch. 612 of the Laws of 1983 resulted in an increase in penalties for violations of laws and regulations involving pesticides.

- Ch. 646 of the Laws of 1983 amended the Criminal Procedure Law to permit electronic eavesdropping in investigations relating to unlawful disposal of hazardous waste. This is perhaps the first official indicator of the State's recognition of organized crime involvement in hazardous waste and waste disposal.
- Ch. 862 of the Laws of 1984 provided funding for Enforcement Training Programs.
- Ch. 937 of the Laws of 1984 set up a reward program for information leading to the detection, arrest, and conviction of persons violating laws or regulations pertaining to the illegal handling or disposal of hazardous waste.
- Ch. 38 and 471 of the Laws of 1985 established a "Superfund" for the clean-up of hazardous waste sites.
- Ch. 511 and 512 of the Laws of 1986 presented the Environmental Quality Bond Act in which \$1.2 billion could be additionally allocated for the clean-up of hazardous waste sites.
- Ch. 671 of the Laws of 1986 amended the Environmental Conservation Law in relation to substances acutely hazardous to public health, safety, or the environment; amended the Penal Law in relation to criminal liability of a corporation; amended the Criminal Procedure Law in relation to eavesdropping warrants and the statute of limitations. It increased the severity and level of the crimes related to hazardous waste disposal to a range from class B misdemeanor to class C felony. In addition, it expanded the definition of hazardous waste allowing the prosecution of criminal conduct which causes or contributes to the release to the environment of hazardous substances, not just waste.
- Ch. 672 of the Laws of 1986 included the regulation of bulk storage of not only petroleum but also of other chemicals and provided penalties for violations.
- Ch. 682 of the Laws of 1986 extended the statute of limitations for toxic torts suits by private citizens.

Legislative concern has continued in 1987.

- Ch. 489 of the Laws of 1987 established the New York State Center for Hazardous Waste Management.
- Ch. 631 of the Laws of 1987 required the Division of Criminal Justice Services to collect and analyze data related to hazardous waste and waste disposal offenses.

- Ch. 536 of the Laws of 1987 amended the Environmental Conservation Law, the Navigation Law and the Public Health Law in relation to inactive hazardous waste disposal sites, petroleum spills, and hazardous waste spills remediation.
- Ch. 827 of the Laws of 1987 provided for the planning and coordination of fire service response in advance of emergencies involving hazardous materials at which the assistance of fire departments may be required.
- Ch. 618 of the Laws of 1987 amended the Environmental Conservation Law (Article 27), in relation to establishing a policy of preferred statewide hazardous waste management practice hierarchy and a statewide hazardous waste facility siting plan.
- Ch. 504 of the Laws of 1987 authorized police officers who stop vehicles suspected of transporting hazardous materials or hazardous waste to require such vehicles to be driven to a place for inspection within five miles.
- Ch. 431 of the Laws of 1987 amended the Environmental Conservation Law and the Transportation Law in relation to the storage, treatment, disposal, and transportation of infectious waste.

#### ACTIVE EFFORTS TO MONITOR HAZARDOUS WASTE AND WASTE DISPOSAL VIOLATIONS.

In addition to legislative initiatives to attack the problems of hazardous waste and waste disposal, a variety of State agencies have become increasingly active in monitoring hazardous waste and waste disposal violations.

The State Police Hazardous Materials Unit - Comprised of sixteen uniformed State Troopers, this unit has in the past targeted all vehicles placarded as carrying hazardous materials. As of May 1987, it was given the authority to inspect any vehicle suspected of carrying hazardous materials. Specializing in inspection of highway transport of hazardous materials, the following was reported to the Division of Criminal Justice Services as 1987 activity:

- 15,691 vehicles stopped and cargoes ascertained.
- 4,482 vehicles found to be carrying hazardous materials and were inspected to determine compliance with hazardous materials and Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (28.6%).
- 2,166 (48.3%) of those vehicles inspected were in violation of those regulations and were issued tickets for hazardous materials violations (fourteen-f of the Transportation Law referred to in ECL 27-0305).
- 602 of the 4,482 vehicles inspected were ticketed for non-hazardous materials violations.

It should be noted that the category "hazardous materials" includes the subcategory "hazardous waste." Tickets issued by the State Police were primarily for violations of New York State Transportation Law which regulates the transport of hazardous materials. Some of those tickets issued included violations related to the transport of hazardous waste.

The State Police Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program Unit further monitors the transport of hazardous materials. This unit also consists of sixteen uniformed State Troopers and, in conjunction with the Department of Transportation, has the authority to stop any truck to check for safety and transportation violations. Such inspections can include a check for hazardous materials. For the period June through December 1987 this unit submitted the following information to the Division of Criminal Justice Services:

- 2,974 Trucks inspected.
- 1,598 Safety violations found of such a seriousness to result in the vehicle being removed from service.
- 506 Tickets issued for hazardous materials violations (15.2% of the total number of tickets issued). These were for violation of fourteen-f of the transportation law referred to in ECL 27-0305).
- 2,827 Tickets issued for other violations.

Tickets issued for hazardous materials violations are primarily for violations of the Transportation Law. Those tickets may include violations related to hazardous waste and waste disposal. Reliable data are not available prior to June 1987 because of a change in the reporting system.

The Environmental Protection Bureau's Environmental Crime Unit of the New York State Department of Law reported to the Division of Criminal Justice Services a total of nine hazardous waste and waste disposal cases processed in 1987. Forty-three arrest charges were levied in these nine events; 25 felony, 7 misdemeanor and 11 unknown. The number of individuals charged was 10 (58.8% of those charged) and the number of other entities (corporations, businesses, etc.) charged was 7 (41.2%).

Dispositions of these cases resulted in 3 dismissals and 11 convictions including 1 plea to ECL 71-2703, 1 conviction to ECL-2712; 1 conviction to ECL 71-2707 (corporation); 6 convictions to ECL-0914 (individual); one conviction to ECL 27-0913; and one plea to PL 175.30. Additionally, monies collected for clean-up, penalty, and fines totaled \$261,250. One intermittent jail sentence was imposed consisting of weekends for one year.

The Division of Law Enforcement's Bureau of Environmental Conservation Investigations at the Department of Environmental Conservation reported the following activity for 1987 concerning hazardous waste and waste disposal violations:

There were a total of 105 different hazardous waste/waste disposal events. Twenty-one events resulted in at least one felony charge; 84 events resulted in at least one misdemeanor charge. In all, there were a total of 40 felony charges, 132 misdemeanor charges, 6 violations and 21 unknown for a total of 199 charges.

Of the total 110 violators, four were individuals (3.6%), 95 were businesses/corporations/other entities (86.4%), and 11 were unknown (10%).

The following is a breakdown by county of 1987 violators reported to Division of Criminal Justice Services by the Bureau of Environmental Conservation Investigations.

Note: The number of violators listed for Albany County includes five out-of-state entities as Albany is the location headquarters where the offenses were prosecuted.

From the arrest charges disposed \$598,740.29 was collected in fines, penalties, and consent orders. (Fines indicate a criminal disposition, penalties indicate a civil disposition, and consent orders indicate an administrative disposition.) Fifty-two percent (\$310,185.00) of the monies collected were from criminal convictions and 48.2% (\$288,555.29) were collected from penalties

and consent orders (civil and administrative dispositions). (Note: Consent orders are an administrative action on the part of Environmental Conservation. An amount is determined in accordance with the degree of harm caused by the offense. The offender agrees to pay the amount and signs a document to that effect. Monies collected via consent orders are placed in a remedial fund which is used in the cleanup of hazardous waste.)

Overall, the Bureau of Environmental Crime Investigations reported 105 events involving 199 separate charges against 110 individuals/corporations/other entities.

The Department of Environmental Conservation's (EnCon) Division of Environmental Enforcement works closely with the EnCon Investigations unit. When Environmental Conservation receives notice of a suspected violation, the Environmental Enforcement Unit may initially respond and then subsequently call for a probe utilizing the Investigative Unit to further pursue the case. The Environmental Enforcement Unit's activities concerned with hazardous waste and waste disposal therefore would be included in the information reported by the Investigative Unit. For this reason it is not included in this report.

Division of Criminal Justice Services - The Computerized Criminal History/Offender-Based Transaction Statistics (CCH/OBTS) data system utilized by the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) is a compilation of data from police, courts, and correctional agencies and is used to track individual offenders through the criminal justice system. The total number of violations reported from the information contained in this file is considerably lower than the total number reported by EnCon Investigations (currently considered the most complete data source on the subject). The reasons are several. In order to be included in the DCJS data base, the charge must have been for a fingerprintable offense as designated by State law. Not all EnCon Hazardous Waste/waste disposal violations are fingerprintable. Secondly, the charge must have been levied against a person as opposed to a corporation or other entity. In a review of the hazardous waste violations data submitted by the EnCon Investigations Unit it was determined that only 4.0% of the known violators charged were individuals. Lastly, the CCH/OBTS data system requires that the fingerprintable EnCon hazardous waste/waste disposal charge must be the most serious charge levied ('top-charge') in an arrest or disposition event in order to be included in a DCJS count.

The information available from the Division's CCH/OBTS file includes a regional breakdown of the number of violations.

For all of New York State in 1987 there was a decrease in the number of arrests in which a hazardous waste violation was the most serious charge (38% overall). Of those arrested for a felony, 50% resulted in a conviction to some charge in both 1986 and in 1987. Convictions specifically for EnCon hazardous waste charges for disposition year 1987 include 1 felony conviction, 8 misdemeanor convictions and 5 convictions for lesser hazardous waste charges.

FUTURE DIRECTION

To further discourage offenders, monitor violations, encourage cleanup, and enhance enforcement of the Environmental Conservation Laws concerning hazardous waste and waste disposal in 1988, the following bills have been recently enacted.

- Ch. 301 of the Laws of 1988 amended the Environmental Conservation Law in relation to the utilization of stand-by contracts to clean-up actual or suspected spills of hazardous substances or wastes and for remediation activities of inactive hazardous waste sites.
- Ch. 428 of the Laws of 1988 amended the Environmental Conservation Law in relation to definitions of disposal and release in relation to the definition of "abandonment" to facilitate prosecution of persons responsible for polluting the environment.

In addition, several bills are on the floor waiting debate and approval.

## SUMMARY

No single data source reveals the complete picture of Environmental Conservation Law hazardous waste and waste disposal violations. The primary reason for this is that each individual agency focuses on particular aspects of the problem unique to that agency be it the transport of hazardous materials, the court processing of offenders, arrest processing or the clean-up, prevention or investigation of violations.

The present diverse information-gathering and reporting systems being implemented by these agencies along with the possibility of data overlap prohibit combining the reports in order to arrive at a single, accurate accounting of violations. Any attempt to link these disparate systems could result in misinterpretation of the data and the drawing of inaccurate conclusions. For this reason, such efforts have not been attempted here. It is recommended that each data source be reviewed independently of any other.

The information presented in this report does provide a general overview of the number of hazardous waste and waste disposal violations that were monitored by specific state agencies and that occurred in New York State during the year 1987.

2.1 INTRODUCTION

There were 3,607,383 filings in the trial courts of the Unified Court System in 1987.<sup>1,2</sup> These included 896,000 parking tickets;<sup>3</sup> of the 2,711,383 remaining cases, 41% (1,113,752) were filed in criminal courts, 38% (1,021,218) in civil courts, 16% (439,130) in the Family Courts, and 5% (121,197) in the Surrogates' Courts.

Dispositions in the trial courts during 1987 totaled 3,539,969. Excluding parking tickets, there were 2,643,969 dispositions as follows: criminal courts--41%, civil courts--36%, Family Courts--16%, Surrogates' Courts--7%.

Table 2 shows a breakdown of filings and dispositions in the trial courts by type of court.

## 2.2 CRIMINAL CASES

Criminal cases are processed in the trial courts as follows: Felony indictments and superior court informations are processed in the Criminal Term of the Supreme Court in New York City and in the County Courts outside of New York City. In several counties outside of New York City, a portion of the felony caseload is processed in the Supreme Court as well. The courts of limited jurisdiction--Criminal Court of the City of New York; District Courts of Nassau and Suffolk; and City, Town, and Village Courts outside of New York City--have original jurisdiction over felonies and complete jurisdiction over misdemeanors, violations, and infractions.

### 1. Criminal Term of Supreme and County Courts

Filings: Statewide, 62,940 felony cases were filed in Supreme and County Courts during 1987.<sup>4</sup> This level of filings was an increase of 12% over the 56,356 filings in 1986. Sixty-six percent (41,664) of the 1987 filings occurred in New York City.

Table 2-2 shows a breakdown of 1987 filings by judicial district.

Table 2-3 focuses on individual counties, ranking the seventeen counties with 400 or more felony-case filings. These seventeen counties accounted for 90% of all filings. New York County had the highest volume, with 13,485 filings. Kings, Bronx, and Queens followed.

Dispositions: Statewide, 62,630 cases reached disposition (guilty plea, trial verdict, dismissal, or other) in 1987, a thirteen percent increase from the 55,497 dispositions in 1986. Sixty-six percent (41,085) of the statewide dispositions were in New York City.

Table 2-2 shows 1987 dispositions by judicial district.

Table 2-3 shows that seventeen counties with over 400 dispositions accounted for 90% of all felony-case dispositions. Twelve counties which commenced over 40 trials accounted for 90% of felony trials commenced statewide in 1987. Of the total of 5,096 felony trials commenced, 4,230 (83%) were jury trials.

Figure 2-1 shows felony-case dispositions by type. There were 51,611 guilty pleas (82%), 5,328 dismissals (9%), 4,632 trial verdicts (7%), and 1,059 other dispositions (2%).



## 2. Criminal Courts of Limited Jurisdiction

Criminal Court of the City of New York: There were 324,597 arrest case dockets filed in the Criminal Court of the City of New York in 1987. There were 306,183 dispositions in this period. These figures were increases of 8% in filings and 11% in dispositions compared with 1986.

Of the dispositions, 46% were by guilty plea, 32% by dismissal, 15% by referral to grand jury or transfers to Supreme Court for waiver of indictment, four-tenths of one percent by verdict, and 7% other dispositions.

There were 102,183 summonses added to the calendar. (In addition, 170,258 summonses were filed to which defendants did not respond.) There were 99,916 dispositions.

City and District Courts outside New York City: Criminal case intake in the City Courts and the Nassau and Suffolk District Courts was 230,400 in 1987. The courts reported 214,858 dispositions. Of the dispositions, 56% were by guilty plea, 33% by dismissal, 6% by referral to grand jury, 2% by trial verdict, and 3% by other means.

There were 254,606 noncriminal (violations and infractions) Uniform Traffic Tickets disposed by judges in these courts. In addition, the clerks' offices disposed of 142,500 tickets. These consisted primarily of fines paid (by personal appearance and mail) and bail forfeitures. In cities without Parking Violations Bureaus, the City and District Courts process parking tickets. There were 896,000 dispositions.

Figure 2-2 shows criminal caseload activity in the criminal courts of limited jurisdiction.

The New York State Division of Probation and Correctional Alternatives collects data on probation service delivery from local probation departments on a monthly basis and compiles it for annual totals. The following statistics for adult supervision were derived from the Probation Registrant System and for all other services, from the monthly reports of criminal and family workload in probation departments. Services other than adult supervision include: intake for family court, investigations conducted for family and criminal court, and predisposition supervision.

INTAKE SERVICES (DPCA 30 Item 2b)

Cases opened for intake services decreased from 138,427 in 1986 to 130,830 in 1987. The 23,937 cases opened in New York City represents 18% of the state-wide total, compared to 20% in 1986. (Chart 1)

INVESTIGATIONS

Probation departments conducted 99,910 regular investigations (pre-sentence, pre-plea, JD, and PINS), and 61,828 other investigations. This 161,738 total is a 6% increase over the 152,095 investigations conducted in 1986. (Table 1)

PRE-DISPOSITION SERVICE

There were 18,653 cases received for supervision prior to court disposition. This is a 4% increase over the 17,965 received in 1986. (Chart 2)

PROBATION SUPERVISION

At the end of 1987 there were 119,835 cases under supervision, an increase of 4% over the 114,766 being supervised on 12/31/86. (Table 2, Chart 3)

During 1987, there were 48,522 probation supervision cases received. This is a 0% increase over 1986 when 48,188 cases were received. (Table 2, Chart 4)

## INTAKE CASES OPENED FOR SERVICE 1984-1987











Under Custody Population (Table 1 and Chart 1)

The number of inmates under custody declined from 12,525 at the end of calendar year 1971 to a low of 12,444 at the close of 1972. This decline began in 1964 and continued over a nine year period. Contributing to this decline was the Baxtrom decision which led to the release from Department custody of all criminally insane inmates held beyond their maximum expiration dates along with related decisions which ended the practice of holding under custody dangerously mentally incapacitated persons for long periods of time. These decisions, coupled with other factors including a revised Penal Law which became effective in September of 1967, changes in sentencing procedures, and the development of major institutional programs for drug addicts by the state's drug control agency, resulted in an annual net loss in the under custody population which continued through 1971. This situation was reversed in 1973 when admissions exceeded releases for the first time since 1963. This rise in the under custody population has continued every year through 1987, when the under custody population rose to 40,842, an increase of 228.2 percent or 28,398 over a sixteen year period. Reasons for this increase are discussed in the section on admissions.



### Admissions to Department Custody (Table 1 and Chart 2)

Admissions registered a steady rise from an annual total of 7,242 in 1971 to 10,272 in 1977. The number of admissions fell to 8,837 in 1978 but resumed an upward trend in 1979 reaching an all time high of 20,319 in 1987. A surge in the number of 1976 and 1977 admissions reflected efforts by the Office of Court Administration to reduce a large backlog of felony cases pending before the Supreme Court which resulted in a temporary acceleration of the already high and rising rate of court commitments. Similar efforts in subsequent years have contributed to a continued rise in commitments which reached an all time high of 15,705 in 1987. Court commitments account for eight of ten admissions and trends in this category largely shape the flow of offenders into State prisons. Court commitments declined to a low of 4,250 in 1970. From this 1970 low, commitments have risen to the high of 1987, an increase of 11,455 or 270 percent. Beginning in 1971, felony commitments rose rapidly, offsetting declines in other types of commitments. Contributing to this trend has been a rise in felony arrests, indictments and court dispositions and an increasing tendency of the courts to commit convicted felons to state correctional facilities. Several more stringent laws enacted in 1973 and subsequent years have added to this increase in commitments. These include the Second Felony Offender Law, which has imposed mandatory indeterminate sentences on such offenders; a drug law which has imposed harsher penalties on drug offenders; and the law imposing mandatory indeterminate terms for all Class B felonies and for certain Class C and D felonies. The trend toward a high level of court commitments has continued through 1986 reflecting also the impact of the violent felony offender legislation which became effective in September 1978.

Releases from Department Custody (Table 1 and Chart 2)

Releases from DOCS custody remained relatively stable during the five year period, 1971-1975, averaging 7,285 annually. In 1976 a sharp rise in releases is observed, up 10% over the previous year. This substantial rise reflected a growth in the pool of parole eligible inmates in the burgeoning inmate population who were subsequently released to parole supervision. The year 1978 saw a temporary drop in releases which reflected longer minimum periods of incarceration being set by the Board of Parole and a modest shift toward longer sentences on the part of the courts, both of which lessened the number of paroles. Releases for 1979 and 1980 resumed an upward trend, including high volumes of parole and conditional releases. A decline in 1981 releases reflected both sentencing changes under the Violent Felony Offender Law as well as a change in the manner in which the minimum period of incarceration was determined for a considerable portion of the inmate population. Releases resumed their upward trend in 1982 and 1983, leveling off in 1984, and reaching an all time high of 17,926 in 1987.

Reason for Commitment (See Table 2)

Of 15,705 offenders committed during 1987 to custody of the Department of Correctional Services, 7,109 or 45.3% were sentenced as second felony offenders while 142 or 0.9% were sentenced as persistent felony offenders. A small portion of the commitments, 251 or 1.6% were sentenced as Youthful Offenders.

The majority (6,939 or 44.2%) of the 1987 commitments had been convicted of crimes designated in the penal law as Violent Felony Offenses (VFO). Of these VFO commitments, 2,687 (38.7%) had been sentenced as second felony offenders. An additional 126 (1.8%) of these VFO commitments had been sentenced as persistent offenders. Commitments for robbery led the VFO group followed by crimes of burglary, homicide, dangerous weapons, sex crimes, and assault.

There were 847 offenders committed for other felonies involving violence or coercion. Commitments for robbery led this group also followed by crimes of homicide, assault and sex crimes. Over half (54.8%) of this group had been sentenced as second felony offenders with an additional 0.2% (2) sentenced as persistent felons.


The remaining 7,668 offenders had been committed for various property, drug and other crimes. Drug felonies was the largest category in this group with 5,106 commitments (32.5% of all commitments). The proportion of second felony offenders among drug commitments was 45.2% (2,306) while the proportion of second felony offenders among the property/other crimes was 64.4% (1,651). Next to drugs, burglary was the largest crime in this group followed by grand larceny, stolen property, and forgery.


INMATES IN DOCS FACILITIES BY


**INMATES IN DOCS FACILITIES BY


**INMATES IN DOCS FACILITIES BY

MAXIMUM SENTENCE DECEMBER 31, 1987**








**INMATES IN DOCS FACILITIES BY

STATE COMMISSION OF CORRECTION

The State Commission of Correction oversees all correctional facilities in New York State. Its goals are: to ensure humane treatment of inmates; to improve operations and programs in correctional facilities; and to improve its own functions as a corrections overseer. In light of these goals, the Commission investigates problems and issues in correctional practices, establishing and enforcing standards for safe, sanitary and orderly settings for both staff and inmates in the State of New York (State, counties, towns, villages, New York City, and all other cities). It offers technical assistance to administrators and training services for personnel. The Commission approves and, when appropriate, assists in the development of new construction. It also serves as a central repository for information on the correctional system in New York State.

Three Commissioners head the agency: A Chairperson and two others who chair the Citizens' Policy and Complaint Review Council and the Medical Review Board, respectively. The Citizens' Council monitors grievances in county facilities and provides an avenue for citizen participation in development of Commission policies and programs. The Medical Review board monitors medical and psychiatric services in correctional facilities and investigates circumstances surrounding inmate deaths.

The correctional system in New York State is comprised of three major correctional jurisdictions including the Department of Correctional Services, the New York City Department of Correction, and county jails/penitentiaries. The Department of Correctional Services (DOGS) operates all state correctional facilities. The New York City Department of Correction (NYCDOC) operates all county correctional facilities within the City of New York; and thirdly, county jails and penitentiaries are operated by individual county sheriffs/corrections departments.

In addition, the Commission of Correction monitors and serves as a central repository of data for the New York City Police Department (operating New York City Precinct Lockups) and all other City, Town and Village Police Department Lockups outside the City of New York.

## INMATE POPULATIONS

The Commission began collecting inmate population data by conducting semi-annual telephone surveys to county jails and penitentiaries in 1981. Currently, county correctional facilities report inmate populations via the on-line Jails Daily Population Reporting System on a daily basis.

Inmate population counts for both the New York City Department of Correction and the State Department of Correctional Services are obtained from Daily Population Reports produced by both departments.

Table I presents the inmate population across the three major correctional jurisdictions from 1981-1987.

County jail and penitentiary admission data are derived from the Statewide Compilation of Data from Sheriffs' Annual Reports for the years 1977-1986. The Commission of Correction compiles this annual report from individual Sheriff and Penitentiary reports submitted by all county correctional facilities. The 1987 compilation is not yet finalized, therefore only preliminary data are presented for county jails.

The following tables (Tables II-VII) represent total admissions reported by county correctional facilities. Total admissions include all sentenced and unsentenced admissions. Chart I illustrates total admissions by the most serious reason for commitment (felony, misdemeanor, etc.) Tables VIII-X represent sentenced admission data.





NEW YORK STATE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT  
DIVISION FOR YOUTH

During 1987, 2,360 individuals were admitted to residential facilities operated by the New York State Division for Youth. Of these, 1,890 were first admissions having had no prior contact with Division programs; 307 were readmissions from aftercare; and 163 had experienced previous placements with the Division (Table VI).

For those youths adjudicated Juvenile Delinquents, Restrictive Juvenile Delinquents or Juvenile Offenders, the offenses of burglary, robbery, larceny and other thefts accounted for 62.4% of the admissions. Assaults and homicides were responsible for an additional 13.3% of the admissions for this group (Table I).

Among the 2,360 admissions, 8.2% were placed in secure facilities and an additional 25.2% in limited secure facilities. The largest category among admissions was cooperative/voluntary which accounted for 29.1% of the admissions (Table II).

Juvenile Delinquent adjudications accounted for 74.8% of the admissions and Juvenile Offender adjudications an additional 7.2%. Persons In Need of Supervision were responsible for 15.1% of the 1987 admissions (Table III).

Males made up 82.0% of the admissions and females the remaining 18.0% (Table IV). Table V which lists admissions by ethnicity, shows Blacks accounting for 47.3% of the admissions, followed by Whites at 36.0%, and Hispanics at 16.0%.

DIVISION OF PAROLE 1985-1987

THE BOARD OF PAROLE

During the 1985-86 and 1986-87 fiscal years, the Parole Board conducted approximately 39,000 interviews and/or hearings in State correctional facilities to determine parole eligibility dates for certain inmates, the release readiness of eligible inmates to parole supervision and the re-release of parole violators, as well as other types of administrative hearings.

The number of release interviews conducted by the Parole Board increased from 19,149 in 1985-1986 to 19,873 in 1986-1987, a 4% increase.

The Parole Board granted release to 22,599 inmates during the last two fiscal years with an increase of 6% in 1986-87. Release decisions were granted to 11,398 initial applicants during the two year period (inmates who became eligible for parole release after serving their minimum sentence from April 1, 1985 through March 31, 1987). Reappearance interviews resulted in 8,339 release decisions for inmates who were previously eligible for parole release, but were denied release and became eligible again. Re-release interviews for violators resulted in 2,847 inmates released to the community. Other release interviews resulted in 15 inmates being granted parole. The decisions rendered at the various release interviews are summarized in Table 1 below.

The community protection efforts of the Parole Board are reflected in a comparison of some of the characteristics of inmates granted and denied release at initial interviews. The comparison reveals that inmates who were denied release were more likely to have committed crimes involving the use of a weapon or the occurrence of an injury. Further, those who were denied release had more extensive prior records than inmates granted release. The effectiveness of the Parole Board's screening is demonstrated in greater detail in the table to follow:

## PAROLE OPERATIONS

### Institutional Parole

The Parole Officer assigned to an institution plays a critical role in the inmate's transition from institutional to community life. The IPC serves in a bridging capacity between the inmate and the community, the inmate and the field parole officer, and the inmate and the Parole Board.

The role of the Parole Officer with an institutional assignment includes an assessment of the needs of each inmate and encourages their participation in programming, during incarceration, which meets these needs. These Parole Officers conduct inmate group counseling sessions and Parole orientation classes for inmates. Additionally, they interview inmates, in advance of their Board release interviews, to gather information which is presented to the Board in summary reports together with recommendations as regards the granting or denial of parole release and the possible conditions of release.

After a parolee has been granted release, the Parole Officer continues to participate in Parole Board release planning through the Community Preparation Program. The Parole Officer provides the link between the institution and the community both through pre-release interviews conducted with inmates and through ongoing communication with the Field Area Office to which the parolee is to be released. These services are provided to both inmates who are released by decision of the Parole Board and to those conditionally released.

Finally, institutionally assigned Parole Officers continue to participate on correctional temporary release committees which grant temporary work release, furloughs and other leaves of absence for good cause to inmates. The Institutional staff is involved in committees within the state's correctional facilities that give support and advice to drug and alcohol programs.

### Community Supervision of Parolees

Community supervision is at the heart of the Division's community protection mission. The Parole Officer with a field assignment is located in the community supervising offenders released from state correctional facilities. Community protection requires that Parole Officers adhere to strict supervision standards. Additionally, it is essential to ensure that parolees comply with the terms and conditions of release. When the conditions of release are violated, the Parole Officer must take appropriate action.

Presence in the community allows the Parole Officer to become familiar with the services and resources which the neighborhood contains. Through their familiarity with the surrounding community, the officer can expedite the reintegration of the offender by linking offenders with particular needs to relevant services.

Beginning in FY 85-86, the Division implemented Differential Supervision which was a unique approach to community supervision caseload management. The concept targets resources on parolees with the highest levels of need for surveillance and social services in an attempt to meet the agency's goals of community protection and parolee reintegration. Allocation of these resources is based on a model of risk management under which newly released parolees are placed on Intensive caseloads which require extensive contact standards and reduced caseload size. After 15 months parolees are moved to larger, Regular caseloads when their potential threat to the community and level of service needs have been reduced.

There were 34,519 individuals under community parole supervision during fiscal year 1986-87, as reflected in Table 3. This represented an increase of 5% over the previous year's figure of 32,822. Parole Board releases from state correctional facilities increased from 10,032 during fiscal 1985-86 to 11,445 during fiscal 1986-87. Parole Board release practices, as reflected by the median time-served statistics, have remained very consistent over the years.

### Outcome of Parole Supervision:

The primary goals of the Division of Parole are to assist offenders released from correctional institutions to adjust to community life, and to provide community protection by preventing these individuals from re-engaging in criminal behaviors.

Parole Officers carry out these goals by supervising parolees in the community, coordinating the delivery of available social services, and helping to motivate and guide the parolees towards a more positive lifestyle. However, one must realize that not all persons will abide by their conditions of release. The Division must, therefore, fulfill the goal of community protection by returning a violator to prison.

A violation of parole occurs when an individual under supervision violates the conditions of parole in an important respect. These conditions are agreed to in writing by an inmate upon release from prison to community parole supervision. They stipulate, for example, that if the releasee absconds from supervision or re-engages in criminal activity, his/her parole is subject to revocation. The individual may consequently be returned to prison following a series of due process hearings.

In the 1986-87 period, 13% of all parolees under supervision during the year were returned to prison by the courts for committing new crimes or by the Parole Board for violating the rules of parole (e.g., absconding, or illegal use of drugs). Table 4 provides a more detailed analysis of the parole success rate.

In view of the data in Table 4, the parole success rate can be measured in several different ways.

In terms of total number of parolees not returned to prison, the success rate was 87% in 1985-86 and 1986-87. This result is an indication of the Division's overall performance in deterring parolee crime and reincarceration.

From the point of view of enforcing the rules of parole, parolees returned to prison for rule violations cannot really be considered "failures" in the same sense as those who were returned for new criminal convictions. For example, absconding from supervision is less serious than committing a violent offense. But, more importantly, a prison return based on a rule violation decreases the chances of a parolee being a threat to community safety. Given this, the success rate was actually 96% for fiscal year 1985-86 and 1986-87.

Using the most rigorous definition of success, those parolees in an active reporting status, the success for 1985-86 was 74%; in 1986-87 it was 73%. This measure excludes parolees in either an incarcerative or absconder status. It is important to note that not all of these incarcerated or absconder parolees will have their parole revoked or even enter the violation process.

**CRIME VICTIMS BOARD**

The Crime Victims Board (CVB) was established August 1, 1966 to provide monetary compensation to eligible crime victims. Since 1966 numerous legislative enactments have expanded eligibility and award criteria which have enabled the CVB to provide a wide array of assistance to crime victims and witnesses.

By statute the CVB is mandated as a "payer of last resort". Compensation able to be provided to crime victims, not necessarily physically injured, includes but is not limited to awards: unlimited reimbursed medical expenses including necessary counseling expenses for victims and appropriate family members; unreimbursed loss of earnings/support up to a weekly maximum of \$400 until an aggregate of \$30,000 is reached; unreimbursed funeral expenses to a maximum of \$2,500; the cost to repair or replace items of essential personal property up to \$500; unreimbursed occupational or vocational rehabilitative needs; the cost of residing at and utilizing services of a domestic violence shelter; and lastly, the payment of reasonable attorney's fees up to \$1,000.

In fiscal year 1986-87 the CVB witnessed a dramatic increase in claims filed by crime victims attributable to two main factors: 1) the enactment of Chapter 688, Laws of 1985 which made significant enhancements to eligibility and award criteria; and, 2) a New York City-wide police notification program which provided information on the existence of and benefits available from the CVB. In fiscal year 1987-88, the increase in claims filed by crime victims was at a rate consistent with other increases experienced before Chapter 688 became effective.




