FOREWORD

The Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center (HCJDC), of the Department of the Attorney General, coordinates the collection of criminal justice-related data for the State of Hawaii and provides this information to state and local criminal justice agencies. It also responds to requests for information from other governmental and private agencies and produces special reports on criminal justice and juvenile justice issues of concern to the community.

This report is the second of a series on juveniles arrested in the City and County of Honolulu in 1985 for non-status offenses. It presents charge history data in addition to demographic and social data on juveniles arrested for the selected non-status offenses.

The first report presented demographic, social, and charge history data on juveniles arrested for the offenses of negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, and other sex offenses. (Other sex offenses included prostitution, promoting prostitution, open lewdness, and indecent exposure.) A third report will focus on the relationships between offense type and variables, such as age at study arrest, school, place of birth, and residence.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report, on the study of juveniles arrested for selected offenses in the City and County of Honolulu in 1985, presents information on demographics, arrest history, and socioeconomic status. The nature of the incidents, in terms of their being group or individual activities, is addressed. Also of concern is the suspected use of drugs or alcohol by the juveniles during incidents or at the time of arrest.

Records of 636 juveniles arrested in 606 distinct incidents of selected offenses were studied. Shoplifting was the most common charge for which arrests were made. The distribution of arrests seemed to be uniform through the first three quarters of the year but decreased by more than 50 percent in the last quarter.

The average age of the 636 arrestees was 15 years, where the majority (76.7 percent) were between 14 and 17 years of age. More than three-fourths (78.5 percent) of the arrestees were males, and more than a third (46.4 percent) were of mixed ancestry.

The majority (64.0 percent) of the arrestees had been born in the State of Hawaii, and the most commonly reported areas of residence were Waianae, Kalihi, Kaneohe, Nuuanu, Kailua, Waipahu, Wahiawa, Salt Lake, and Kaimuki. More than three-fourths (79.7 percent) of the arrestees attended public schools.

The records show that the parents of over three-quarters (79.1 percent) of the arrestees were married. More than half (57.2 percent) of the fathers were reportedly employed, and more than a third (45.8 percent) of the mothers were employed.

Records of 4.7 percent of the juveniles indicated a history of abuse or neglect.

The records of half (50.9 percent) of the 636 arrestees indicated at least 1 other arrest in 1985, but the majority (57.4 percent) showed no history of arrest prior to 1985. Of the 636 arrests studied, 333 (52.4 percent) were for repeat offenses. Larceny-theft was the first offense most frequently reported as preceding these repeat arrests.

The majority (52.4 percent) of the offenses were classified as group activities. With respect to suspected drug or alcohol influence of the arrestee, 11.6 percent of the reports indicated these suspicions.

I. INTRODUCTION

The causes of juvenile delinquency and the measures needed to curb this community problem are of growing concern to everyone. The study of juveniles arrested in Honolulu in 1985 was conducted to identify common factors in the backgrounds of juvenile arrestees in terms of demographics, socioeconomic status, and arrest history. Although most of these factors cannot be changed, the information will help the juvenile justice professional to better understand the circumstances surrounding delinquency and to take a more focused approach to the problems.

The purpose of the study was also to determine whether the juvenile's alleged involvement, in the incident for which he was arrested, was as part of a group or on an individual basis. Another purpose of the study was to determine the extent of suspected drug or alcohol use among the juveniles during incidents or at the time of arrest.

Selected offenses were studied separately from serious offenses because we believe that offender characteristics for the two categories may differ. Differences between characteristics of offenders arrested for serious offenses and those of offenders arrested for selected offenses will be addressed in a forthcoming report.

Juvenile Justice System

The juvenile justice system provides services specifically to assist and protect the rights and well-being of children and their families.

Family Court in the State of Hawaii strives to:

- 1. Promote reconciliation between distressed juveniles and their families,
- Foster the rehabilitation of juveniles in difficulty,
- 3. Appropriately punish offenders, and
- 4. Reduce juvenile delinquency.²

In Honolulu, the Family Court works with the Honolulu Police Department which identifies and arrests juveniles charged with either status offenses or offenses which would merit arrest when committed by an adult. (In Hawaii, a juvenile is an individual who has not yet attained his eighteenth birthday.) The Honolulu Police Department's Juvenile Crime Prevention Division pays particular attention to the situations of these troubled youth while protecting the rights and well-being of victimized children.

(For details on the juvenile arrest process, see Juveniles Arrested in 1985 in the City and County of Honolulu for Serious Offenses.)³

Information on the arrestee and incident characteristics studied may be used as a basis for delineating target

populations for new or modified programs for children and their families. It may also be helpful in restructuring or redirecting approaches where necessary.

II. METHODOLOGY

Records of 636 juveniles arrested for selected offenses in Honolulu in 1985 were selected for review. (In this study, selected offenses are non-status offenses excluding homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, prostitution, promoting prostitution, open lewdness, indecent exposure, and other sex offenses.) The arrests were made in 606 different incidents. The juveniles' records were reviewed for information on demographics, arrest history, socioeconomics, offenses as group or individual activities, and suspected use of drugs or alcohol by the individual.

RECORD SELECTION

Juvenile records of bookings from January 1, 1985 through December 31, 1985 at the Honolulu Police Department were reviewed. Of the estimated 6,700 bookings for selected, non-status offenses, 640 were chosen randomly on the condition that the records be for unique individuals. Of these 640 bookings, four were removed because they were for adults arrested for offenses allegedly committed as juveniles, resulting in a final sample size of 636. A list of primary report numbers and booking numbers for each of the following offenses was compiled:

- 1. Burglary
- 2. Motor Vehicle Theft
- 3. Vandalism
- 4. Shoplifting
- 5. Larceny-theft (Non-Shoplifting)
- 6. Simple Assault
- 7. Carrying/Possessing Weapon
- 8. Driving Under the Influence (DUI)
- 9. Liquor Law Violations
- 10. Disorderly Conduct
- 11. Gambling
- 12. Drug Use
- 13. Drug Possession
- 14. Drug Sale/Manufacture
- 15. Forgery
- 16. Fraud
- 17. All Other Selected Offenses

The original violation usually remains the formal charge brought against the juvenile, although it is sometimes downgraded by the police or the prosecutor.

The category of motor vehicle theft includes the charge of unauthorized control of propelled vehicle (UCPV). Vandalism includes criminal property damage (CPD) and defacement of serial numbers. Air gun violations and possession of a pellet gun are included in the category of

Carrying/Possessing Weapon. Drug Sale/Manufacture includes the sale of imitation controlled substances, and Liquor Law Violations include the charges of prohibition involving minors, open container, drinking in public, and minor in possession. (A juvenile possessing liquor may be arrested for prohibition involving minors even if he does not consume the liquor.) The charge of affray is classified as disorderly conduct. "All other selected offenses" include terroristic threatening, harassment, and escape. Although status offenses, warrants, and traffic offenses were not among the charges studied, they were counted in tabulating the number of pre-1985 charges and the number of other 1985 charges in the section on charge history.

The two data sources used were the index card with a history of police contact and the Juvenile Information Report (JIR). The index cards are records on individuals and are filed by name. JIRs are descriptions of circumstances surrounding an apprehension with respect to the arrestee and are filed by report number. The sources were cross-linked by report number, booking number, month of arrest, and offense.

The data collected from the index cards were:

- 1. Charge history,
- 2. Police disposition,
- 3. Birth date,
- 4. Place of birth,
- 5. Sex,

- 6. Race,
- 7. Number of siblings, and
- 8. Number of victimization detentions.

The data collected from the JIRs and related narratives were:

- 1. Information on suspected drug or alcohol use,
- 2. The residence of the juvenile,
- 3. The school attended by the juvenile,
- 4. Marital status of the juvenile's parents,
- 5. Employment status of the parents,
- 6. Death of parent(s),
- 7. Non-parent guardianship, and
- 8. Whether the offense was a group action or an individual action.

For details on methods of data collection from index cards and juvenile information reports (JIRs) and descriptions of the data elements collected, see <u>Juveniles Arrested in 1985</u> in the City and County of Honolulu for Serious Offenses.⁴

III. FINDINGS

Many of the charges selected for study were offenses against property. The most frequent charges were shoplifting, which comprised 30.2 percent of the charges, and larceny-theft (non-shoplifting) which made up 12.1 percent of the charges.

The breakdown of the 636 study charges is as follows:

The distribution of arrests seemed to be uniform through the first three quarters of the year, decreasing by more than 50 percent in the last quarter. The breakdown is as follows:

January through March	183	(28.8 percent)
April through June	182	(28.6 percent)

Juvenile charge history was examined generally. Since the characteristics of first arrests may differ from those of repeat arrests, juvenile charge history was then broken down by arrest order of the study charge (i.e. first arrest or repeat arrest). The next three sections present information on general charge history, charge history of arrests for first offenses, and charge history of repeat arrests, respectively.

CHARGE HISTORY - General

Age at First Arrest

The average age at first arrest of the juveniles in this study was 14 years. The majority of the juveniles were 9 to 14 years of age when they were first arrested. None of the juveniles were younger than 7 years. Eighteen (2.8 percent) were 7 to 8 years old at the time of first arrest. There were 102 juveniles (16.0 percent) who ranged in age from 9 to 11 years when they were first arrested, and 73 (11.5 percent)

were 12 years old when they were first arrested. There were 101 (15.9 percent) who were 13 years old at first arrest and 113 (17.8 percent) who were 14 years old. Ninety-four (14.8 percent) were 15 years old, 74 (11.6 percent) were 16 years old, and 61 (9.6 percent) were 17 years old at first arrest.

Number of Pre-1985 Charges

The average number of pre-1985 charges was 1.8. The majority of the 636 juveniles arrested, 365 (57.4 percent), did not have arrest records prior to 1985. (See Tables 3A and 3B.) There were 104 (16.4 percent) with single charges before 1985, while 45 (7.1 percent) had two charges prior to 1985.

Seventy-five juveniles (11.8 percent) had 3 to 6 charges before 1985. Twenty (3.1 percent) had 7 to 10 charges before 1985, and 27 (4.2 percent) had more than 10 charges before 1985.

Number of Other Charges in 1985

The average number of other charges in 1985 was 1.6. Almost half of the juveniles arrested, 312 (49.1 percent), did not have other charges in 1985. (See Tables 4A and 4B.) There were 128 (20.1 percent) who had one other charge in 1985, while 59 (9.3 percent) had 2 other charges in 1985. Forty-three (6.8 percent) had 3 other charges in 1985. Fifty-eight (9.1 percent) had 4 to 6 other charges in 1985, and 28 (4.4 percent) had 7 to 10 other charges in 1985. Eight

juveniles (1.3 percent) had more than 10 other charges in 1985.

Offense of First Arrest (See Tables 2A and 2B.)

Of the 636 arrests, 303 (47.6 percent) were for first offenses. Of these 303 first arrests, 149 were for shoplifting and 21 were for liquor law violations.

There were 160 arrests (25.2 percent) that had been preceded by first offenses of larceny-theft (including shoplifting) and 65 (10.2 percent) that had been preceded by first offenses that were status offenses. Twenty-four (3.8 percent) had been preceded by first offenses of burglary, 17 (2.7 percent) had been preceded by first offenses that were drug violations, and 13 (2.0 percent) had been preceded by first offenses that were first offenses of vandalism.

Ten arrests (1.6 percent) had been preceded by first offenses of simple assault, and 8 (1.3 percent) had been preceded by first offenses of motor vehicle theft. The first offenses of robbery, aggravated assault (Assault 1 & 2), gambling, liquor law violations, and disorderly conduct each preceded no more than 6 (0.9 percent) of the arrests. Twentyone of the arrests (3.3 percent) were preceded by first offenses classified as "all other selected offenses".

Age at First Arrest

The average age of the 303 juveniles arrested for the first time was 14 years. The average age of the juveniles arrested for shoplifting or burglary was 13, and the average age of those arrested for vandalism was 14. (See Table 21.) The average age of the juveniles arrested for simple assault, motor vehicle theft, carrying/possessing weapons, or disorderly conduct was 15 years. Other offenses, for which the average age of those arrested was 15 years, were larcenytheft (non-shoplifting), drug possession, and drug sale.

Juveniles arrested for liquor law violations or drug use were 16 years old, on the average. The average age of those arrested for DUI, gambling, or forgery was 17. The average age of those arrested for "all other selected offenses" was 15 years.

Shoplifting was the offense for which the youngest arrestee, a 7-year-old, was recorded, followed by burglary where the youngest was 8 years old, vandalism where the youngest was 10 years old, and drug possession and other theft where the youngest arrestees were 11 years old. (See Table 22.) The youngest age of those arrested for disorderly conduct was 12 years, and the youngest age of those arrested for motor vehicle theft or simple assault was 13 years. Fourteen years was the youngest age recorded for those

arrested for liquor law violations, drug use, or drug sale. Fifteen was the youngest age of those arrested for carrying/possessing weapons, and 17 was the youngest age of those arrested for DUI, gambling, or forgery.

The lowest of the highest ages recorded was 15 years for those arrested for drug sale. The next lowest of the highest ages, for those arrested for carrying/possessing weapons, was 16 years. The highest age for those arrested for the other categories of selected offenses was 17 years.⁵

Number of Other Charges in 1985

The average number of other charges in 1985 was 0.4. The highest average crime-specific number of other charges in 1985 was 2.3 faced by those arrested for motor vehicle theft. (See Table 21.) At the other extreme, those arrested for carrying/possessing weapons, gambling, or forgery faced no other charges in 1985.

The average number of other charges in 1985 was 0.1 for those arrested for vandalism or shoplifting. The average was 0.2 for those arrested for drug use and 0.3 for those arrested for simple assault.

There was an average of 0.4 other charges in 1985 for those arrested for liquor law violations and 0.5 other charges for those arrested for drug possession or drug sale. Arrestees for disorderly conduct or larceny-theft (non-shoplifting) averaged 0.7 and 0.9 other charges in 1985,

respectively. The average number of other charges for those arrested for DUI was 1.0, and where the arrest was for burglary, the average was 1.2.

The average number of other charges in 1985 for those arrested for "all other selected offenses" was 0.8.

CHARGE HISTORY - Repeat Arrests

Age at First Arrest

The average age at first arrest for those who had prior arrests was 13 years. The average age at first arrest was 12 years for those arrested for gambling; 14 years for those arrested for DUI, liquor law violations, drug sale, or forgery; and 13 years for those arrested for any of the other study charge categories, including "all other selected offenses". (See Table 21.)

The age at first arrest ranged from 7 years to 17 years for those arrested for simple assault and from 8 years to 17 burglary, larceny-theft, years for those arrested for carrying/possessing weapons, drug use, or "all other selected offenses". (See Table 22.) Where the study charge was gambling, the age range was 8 years to 14 years. The range was 9 years to 16 years for those arrested for vandalism and 9 years to 17 years for those arrested for shoplifting, liquor law violations, or drug possession.

Where the study charge was motor vehicle theft, the range in age at first arrest was 10 years to 17 years, and where the study charge was disorderly conduct, the range was 11 years to 15 years. For those arrested for DUI, the range in age at first arrest was 11 years to 16 years.

The age at first arrest ranged from 12 years to 15 years for those arrested for drug sale. No ranges are given where the study charges were forgery or fraud, since the numbers of juveniles arrested for these charges were 2 and 1, respectively.

Number of Pre-1985 Charges

The average number of pre-1985 charges was 3.4. Juveniles arrested for disorderly conduct had the highest average number of pre-1985 charges, 10.0. The second highest average, 6.0, was recorded for those arrested for simple assault or fraud.

Other average numbers of pre-1985 charges were 5.0 where the charge was drug sale, 3.8 where the charge was liquor law violation, and 3.7 where the charge was motor vehicle theft. Where the juvenile had been arrested for burglary or drug possession, the average number of pre-1985 charges was 3.5, and where the arrest was for gambling or forgery, the average number of pre-1985 charges was 3.0.

Juveniles arrested for drug use had an average of 2.8 pre-1985 charges, and those arrested for vandalism had an

average of 2.7 charges. There was an average of 2.4 pre-1985 charges recorded for those arrested for DUI and 2.1 charges for those arrested for larceny-theft.

The average number of charges for those arrested for shoplifting was 1.6, and the average for those arrested for carrying/possessing weapons was 1.0. The average number for juveniles arrested for "all other selected offenses" was 5.9.

Where the study charge was forgery, one offender had 6 pre-1985 charges, while the juvenile arrested for fraud had 3 pre-1985 charges.

The minimum number of pre-1985 charges was 9 where the study charge was disorderly conduct, 6 for fraud, 3 for forgery, and 1 where the study charge was gambling. The minimum number for all other study charge categories was 0.

The maximum number of pre-1985 charges was 26 where the study charge was simple assault, 25 where the study charge was liquor law violations, and 22 where the study charge was drug possession. For juveniles arrested for burglary, the maximum number of pre-1985 charges was 17, and where the arrests were for larceny-theft, the maximum number was 15. The maximum number of pre-1985 charges for those arrested for vandalism was 14, and where the study charge was drug use or motor vehicle theft, the maximum number was 13. Where the study charge was disorderly conduct or drug sale, the maximum number was 11.

For juveniles arrested for gambling, the maximum number of pre-1985 charges was 9, and where the arrests were for DUI, the maximum number was 7. The maximum number was 5 where the study charge was shoplifting and 2 where the study charge was carrying/possessing weapons. For juveniles arrested for "all other selected offenses", the maximum number of pre-1985 charges was 31.

Number of Other Charges in 1985

The average number of other charges in 1985 was 2.6. The highest average crime-specific number of other charges in 1985 was 4.5 faced by those arrested for burglary. The average number of other charges in 1985 was 3.8 for those arrested for motor vehicle theft, 3.3 for those arrested for simple assault, and 3.0 for those arrested for forgery or fraud. The average number was 2.8 for those arrested for vandalism or larceny-theft, 2.4 for those arrested for liquor law violations, and 2.0 for those arrested for drug sale.

Where the study charge was carrying/possessing weapons, the average number of other charges in 1985 was 1.8. For those arrested for shoplifting, the average number was 1.6; for those arrested for drug possession, the average was 1.5; and for those arrested for DUI, the average was 1.2. Where the study charge was gambling, the average number of other charges in 1985 was 1.0, and where the study charge was drug use, the average was 0.9. The average number of other charges

in 1985 for those arrested for disorderly conduct was 0.5, and for those arrested for "all other selected offenses", the average was 2.5.

The minimum number of other charges in 1985 was 3 for juveniles arrested for forgery or fraud. In each of the other offense categories, including "all other selected offenses", at least 1 arrestee did not have any other charges in 1985.

The maximum number of other charges in 1985 was 25 for juveniles arrested for burglary. Other highest numbers were 13 for those arrested for vandalism, 12 for those arrested for larceny-theft or simple assault, and 10 for those arrested for motor vehicle theft. The highest number of other charges were 9 for those arrested for shoplifting, 8 for those arrested for violations, 6 liguor for those arrested for law carrying/possessing weapons, and 5 for those arrested for drug possession.

The maximum number of other charges in 1985 was 4 for juveniles arrested for drug sale; 3 for juveniles arrested for DUI, gambling, drug use, forgery, or fraud; and 1 for those arrested for disorderly conduct. For juveniles arrested for "all other selected offenses", the maximum number of other charges in 1985 was 12.

CHARGE HISTORY - Discussion

Study results indicate that juveniles who are arrested for the first time at a younger age are at a higher risk of

being arrested again as a juvenile than are those arrested for the first time at a later age. Although the most common first offense for both first offenders and repeat arrestees was larceny-theft (including shop-lifting), the average number of other charges in 1985 on the records of repeat arrestees was almost 7 times the average number on the records of first offenders. The implication is that most juvenile offenders are initiated into delinquency through similar offending avenues, but that, depending on age and other factors, some progress in the extent of offenses committed and become repeat arrestees.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE OFFENSES STUDIED

Group or Individual Activity (See Tables 8A and 8B.)

More than half of the 636 offenses studied, 333 (52.4 percent), were group actions, and 300 (47.2 percent) were individual actions.

Forty-six burglaries (79.3 percent) and 23 motor vehicle thefts (79.3 percent) were classified as group actions. Also classified as group actions were 29 liquor law violations (76.3 percent) and 16 offenses of drug use (72.7 percent). In each of the categories of disorderly conduct and drug sale, there were 3 offenses (60.0 percent) classified as group actions, and in the category of larceny-theft, there were 46 offenses (59.7 percent) classified as group actions.

Eleven offenses of carrying/possessing weapons (84.6 percent), 24 offenses of drug possession (68.6 percent), and 23 simple assaults (67.6 percent) were classified as individual actions. There were 116 shoplifting offenses (60.4 percent) and 20 vandalisms (52.6 percent) also classified as individual actions. All offenses of DUI, forgery, and fraud were determined to be individual actions.

Suspected Alcohol/Drug Influence at the Time of Offense or Arrest (See Tables 7A and 7B.)

Seventy-four of the 636 reports on the offenses studied (11.6 percent) indicated suspected alcohol or drug influence at the time of the offense or arrest. Of these 74 reports, 22 (29.7 percent) involved drug use offenses, while 6 (8.1 percent) involved DUI offenses. Eighteen (24.3 percent) of the reports indicating suspected alcohol or drug influence at the time of the offense or arrest described liquor law violations.

Seven of the reports indicating suspected alcohol or drug influence (9.5 percent) described burglaries, and 4 (5.4 percent) described vandalisms. Motor vehicle theft, shoplifting, and drug possession were each described as involving suspected alcohol or drug influence in 2 reports (2.7 percent), and larceny-theft and disorderly conduct were each described as involving suspected alcohol or drug influence in 1 report (1.4 percent).

There were 4 reports indicating suspected alcohol or drug influence (5.4 percent) that described offenses in the category of "all other selected offenses"; however, in the categories of carrying/possessing weapons, gambling, drug sale, forgery, and fraud, none of the reports indicated suspected alcohol or drug influence.

Overall, the majority of the reports, 559 (87.9 percent), did not indicate suspected alcohol or drug influence.

Police Disposition of the Arrest (See Tables 6A and 6B.)

Juveniles were counseled and released for 286 (45.0 percent) of the 636 charges. This figure included 149 (77.6 percent) of the 192 shoplifting charges, 23 (60.5 percent) of the 38 liquor law violations, and 3 (60.0 percent) of the 5 charges of disorderly conduct. Also included were 4 (66.7 percent) of the 6 gambling charges, 13 (59.1 percent) of the 22 drug use charges, and 1 (50.0 percent) of the 2 forgery charges.

Juvenile arrests were referred to Family Court for 258 (40.6 percent) of the 636 charges. This figure included 37 (63.8 percent) of the 58 burglary charges, 20 (52.6 percent) of the 38 vandalism charges, 18 (52.9 percent) of the 34 simple assault charges, 20 (57.1 percent) of the 35 drug possession charges, 3 (60.0 percent) of the 5 drug sale charges, and 1 (50.0 percent) of the 2 forgery charges.

Eighty-four (13.2 percent) of the cases were discharged, including 17 (58.6 percent) of the 29 motor vehicle theft cases.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE OFFENSES - Discussion

Some offenses, such as burglary, motor vehicle theft, and liquor law violations, are more likely to be committed in groups, while other offenses, such as carrying/possessing weapons, drug possession, simple assault, and shoplifting are more likely to be committed individually. Overall, slightly more than half of the offenses studied were group efforts. This demonstrates that peer influence does affect juvenile offending behavior and is an important factor in the commission of delinquent actions.

The suspected use of alcohol or drugs was mentioned in slightly more than 10 percent of the reports. Although this demonstrates the risk to the juvenile population posed by substance abuse, it is not a major determinant of offending behavior.

With respect to police disposition of the arrest, the fact that the majority of the juveniles were either referred to Family Court or counseled and released reflects the approach of our juvenile justice system to the commission of the selected offenses studied.

Age at the Time of the Study Arrest

The age of the juvenile at the time of the study arrest was determined as of the 15th day of the month of arrest. This day was selected because it occurs midmonth and because the actual day of birth was not part of the data collected for the study. A spotcheck revealed that two arrestees (less than 1 percent) classified as 18-year-olds by this rule of measure were both still juveniles on the actual days of arrest. (See Tables 9A and 9B.)

The majority of the other arrestees were 14 to 17 years old. There were 108 (17.0 percent) who were 14 years old, 140 (22.0 percent) who were 15 years old, 119 (18.7 percent) who were 16 years old, and 121 (19.0 percent) who were 17 years of age.

Sixty-seven (10.5 percent) of the juveniles were 13 years old, 33 (5.2 percent) were 12 years old, 42 (6.6 percent) ranged in age from 9 to 11 years, and 4 (0.6 percent) were 7 to 8 years old. None of the arrestees were younger than 7 years.

The average age of all 636 arrestees was 15 years. The average age of the 303 juveniles arrested for the first time was 14 years, and the average age of the 333 juveniles with a history of arrest was 15 years.

For juveniles with an arrest history, the average age of those arrested for DUI, disorderly conduct, or forgery was 17. (See Table 21.) The average age of those arrested for motor vehicle theft, simple assault, liquor law violations, drug use, drug possession, or charges in the category of "all other selected offenses" was 16. The average age of those arrested for any of the other study charges was 15 years.

Of the juveniles with an arrest history, the youngest was a nine-year-old arrested in the study for shoplifting. The youngest age at study arrest in 1985 for vandalism or for larceny-theft was 10 years. Where the study charge was burglary, the youngest age was 11 years, and where the study charge was simple assault, carrying/possessing weapons, gambling or drug possession, the youngest age was 13 years. Fourteen years was the youngest age of those arrested for motor vehicle theft or drug use; 15 years was the youngest age where the study charge was DUI, liquor law violations, drug sale, or fraud; and 17 years was the youngest age where the study charge was disorderly conduct.

For juveniles arrested for "all other selected offenses", 12 years was the youngest age at study arrest in 1985.

The highest age at study arrest in 1985 for fraud was 15 years, and for vandalism, it was 16 years. For all the other study charge categories, the highest age was 17 years.

Sex of the Arrestees (See Tables 10A and 10B.)

The majority of the arrestees, 499 (78.5 percent), were males. Males accounted for more than 60.0 percent of every study charge category except forgery, where both juveniles were female.

Of the 137 females included in the study, 70 (51.1 percent) had been arrested for shoplifting. Ten (7.3 percent) of the females had been arrested for larceny-theft, another 10 had been arrested for simple assault, and another 10 had been arrested for liquor law violations.

Race (See Tables 11A and 11B.)

The percentages of arrestees who were Caucasian, Japanese, Chinese, Black, or Korean were lower than their respective percentages of the general population of Honolulu in 1985 who made up these groups. Of the general population, 26.9 percent were Caucasian, 23.7 percent were Japanese, 5.6 percent were Chinese, 3.1 percent were Black, and 1.8 percent were Korean. Of the arrestees, 110 (17.3 percent) were Caucasian, 38 (6.0 percent) were Japanese, 6 (0.9 percent) were Chinese, 7 (1.1 percent) were Black, and 11 (1.7 percent) were Korean.

The reader is hereby cautioned that data from two different sources are compared in this section. Data on the study population (juveniles) are compared with data on the general population (both juveniles and adults). In addition,

the race data collected on juveniles in this study were based on self-determination, while the race data on the general population originated in the Health Surveillance Survey and were based not on self-determination but on the subject's report of his parentage. 7

The percentages of arrestees who made up other race groups were greater than the percentages of the general population. Of the general population, 0.6 percent were Hawaiian, 0.7 percent were Samoan, 9.7 percent were Filipino, 1.7 percent were of "other single races", 11.2 percent were of mixed ancestry (non-Hawaiian), and 15.1 percent were Part-Hawaiian. Of the 636 juveniles in the study, 18 (2.8 percent) were Hawaiian, 53 (8.3 percent) were Samoan, 83 (13.1 percent) were Filipino, 14 (2.2 percent) were of "other single races", 107 (16.8 percent) were of mixed ancestry (non-Hawaiian), and 188 (29.6 percent) were Part-Hawaiian.

The greatest proportion of juveniles facing the charge of carrying/possessing weapons as well as one juvenile arrested for fraud were of mixed ancestry (non-Hawaiian). Filipino and Part-Hawaiian arrestees accounted for two-thirds of DUI arrests. The greatest proportions of juveniles arrested for drug use or liquor law violations were Caucasian, and the greatest proportions arrested for disorderly conduct, drug sale, or forgery were Part-Hawaiian or of mixed ancestry (non-Hawaiian). The greatest proportions of juveniles arrested for the other categories of crime were Part-Hawaiian.

DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS - Discussion

As is frequently shown in juvenile justice studies, the majority of the arrestees were males. It is not unusual that the average age in 1985 of the juveniles with a history of arrest was greater than the average age of those arrested for the first time. It is outside the scope of this report, however, to determine the risk that the younger, first time offenders will continue to build arrest histories.

The race distribution of the general population differs from that of the arrestees studied. The general population is composed of juveniles and adults, a combination of offenders and non-offenders, while the study population consists of only juvenile arrestees. It is unclear whether the differences are due to differences in age composition or differences in arrest history. Race, however, may be considered a cultural and socioeconomic indicator, and it is important to note that the greatest proportion of arrestees, nearly 30 percent, were Part-Hawaiian.

LIFE CHARACTERISTICS OF THE ARRESTEES

Place of Birth (See Tables 13A and 13B.)

Of the 636 juveniles in the study, the majority had been born in the State of Hawaii. The percentages of arrestees who had been born in Hawaii or in U.S. territories or foreign countries were higher than similar percentages of the general

population of the state in 1985. Of the general population, 60.4 percent had been born in Hawaii, and 13.8 percent had been born either in U.S. territories or in foreign countries. Of the 636 juveniles in the study, 407 (64.0 percent) had been born in Hawaii, while 114 (17.9 percent) had been born either in U.S. territories or in foreign countries. Of the 114 juveniles not born in a state, 16 had been born in a U.S. territory, 81 had been born in a foreign country, and 17 had been born in Samoa (where the distinction between American Samoa, a U.S. territory, and Western Samoa, a foreign country, could not be made).

The percentage of those born in other states was lower among arrestees than in the general population. While 25.3 percent of the general population had been born in other states, 114 (17.9 percent) of the arrestees reported other states as their place of birth.

School (See Tables 12A and 12B and Figure on page 32.)

The majority of the juveniles arrested, 507 (79.7 percent), attended public schools. This percentage was higher than the percentages of public school enrollees on Oahu (79.0 percent) but lower than the statewide percentage (81.7 percent) as of September 12, 1985.

There were 178 arrestees (28.0 percent) who attended public schools in Honolulu, 124 (19.5 percent) who attended public schools in Leeward Oahu, 119 (18.7 percent) who were

students at public schools in Central Oahu, and 86 arrestees (13.5 percent) who attended public schools in Windward Oahu. With respect to specific schools, the highest concentrations of arrestees were 39 at Waianae High School and 29 at McKinley High School.

Forty-eight arrestees (7.5 percent) attended private schools in Honolulu, and 11 (1.7 percent) attended schools out-of-state. Another 11 were students at special education schools, and 10 (1.6 percent) attended alternative learning centers. Twenty-seven juveniles (4.2 percent) had either graduated or were not attending school.

of the 636 juveniles arrested, 66 juveniles (10.4 percent) lived in Waianae, and 61 (9.6 percent) lived in Kalihi. (See Tables 14A and 14B.) Forty-six juveniles (7.2 percent) lived in Kaneohe, and another 46 lived in Nuuanu. Forty-three arrestees (6.8 percent) lived in Kailua, 40 (6.3 percent) lived in Waipahu, 33 (5.2 percent) lived in Wahiawa, and 32 (5.0 percent) lived in Salt Lake. Thirty juveniles (4.7 percent) lived in Kaimuki.

Death of Arrestees' Parents (See Tables 16A and 16B.)

Eight juveniles (1.3 percent) reported that only their mothers were deceased, and 17 (2.7 percent) reported that only their fathers were deceased. One juvenile (0.2 percent) reported that both his parents were deceased.

<u>Marital Status of Arrestees' Parents</u> (See Tables 17A and 17B.)

When both parents were named by the juvenile, regardless of differences in surnames and with no special information on marital status recorded, they were assumed to be married. When no father was listed or the father's identity was reported as unknown, the parents were assumed to be unmarried. When 1 parent was reported to be deceased and only the surviving parent was listed, the parent's marital status was classified as "widowed".

Based on these assumptions, the parents of the majority of the juveniles, 503 (79.1 percent), were married, the parents of 67 (10.5 percent) were divorced, and the parents of 24 (3.8 percent) were widowed. The parents of 21 juveniles (3.3 percent) were unmarried, and the parents of 12 (1.9 percent) were separated.

Employment Status of Parents (See Tables 18A and 18B.)

In general, 364 (57.2 percent) of the 636 juveniles reported that their fathers were employed, and 291 (45.8 percent) reported that their mothers were employed.

The parental employment situations common to the greatest number of juveniles among those arrested for disorderly conduct were "both parents employed" for 2 arrestees (40.0 percent) and "father retired and mother employed" for another 2 arrestees. No situation was cited more than once by anyone arrested for drug sale or forgery, and 1 juvenile arrested for fraud reported his parental employment situation as "mother employed and father of unknown employment status". The parental employment situation most common to juveniles arrested for the other categories of charges was "both parents employed".

Non-parent Guardianship of Arrestee (See Tables 19A and 19B.)

Twelve (1.9 percent) of the 636 arrestees reported being under the guardianship of someone other than a parent. They

included 3 (1.6 percent) of those arrested for shoplifting, 2 (3.4 percent) of those arrested for burglary, and 2 (2.7 percent) of those arrested for the category of "all other selected offenses".

Sibling Count (See Tables 15A and 15B.)

Forty (6.3 percent) of the 636 juveniles reported having no siblings. They included 16 (8.3 percent) of those arrested for shoplifting and 5 (13.2 percent) of those arrested for vandalism. Burglary, larceny-theft, and drug possession were each bases of arrest of 3 juveniles without siblings, at 5.2 percent, 3.9 percent, and 8.6 percent, respectively.

However, the majority of the juveniles arrested, 595 (93.6 percent), each reported having at least 1 sibling.

Prior Victim Detentions (See Tables 20A and 20B.)

The records of 30 arrestees (4.7 percent) revealed a history of detention as a victim, including 3 juveniles with 2 or 3 detentions. (Victim detentions are efforts to protect the juvenile from child abuse, child neglect, or educational neglect.) The records included 9 (4.7 percent) of those arrested for shoplifting, 5 (6.5 percent) of those arrested for larceny-theft, 5 (14.7 percent) of those arrested for simple assault, and 4 (5.3 percent) of those arrested for the category of "all other selected offenses". The records of the

other 606 juveniles showed no history of detention as a victim.

LIFE CHARACTERISTICS - Discussion

Having been born in Hawaii and attending public schools were two characteristics common to the majority of the well as to the majority of the arrestees as population. Slightly more than 10 percent of the arrestees, the greatest proportion, lived in Waianae. More than half of the fathers and more than a third of the mothers were While the parents of the majority were married, employed. slightly more than 4 percent reported at least 1 parent as deceased, and almost 2 percent reported that they were under the guardianship of someone other than a parent. A little more than 6 percent reported having no siblings, and almost 5 percent of the records showed a history of detention as a victim.

While many of the characteristics studied were common to a minority of the arrestees or were not very different from characteristics of the general population, they may interact to provide a useful sketch of the juvenile arrestee population. For instance, the nearly 5 percent of the arrestees who had a history of detention as a victim surpasses, by more than 4 times, the estimated 1.1 percent of children in the U.S. who are abused or neglected. (The estimate is from a 1980 study by the U.S. Department of Health

and Human Services.)¹⁰ In addition, results of a study conducted in Illinois on arrests for crimes between 1984 and 1986 indicated that most people are arrested for crimes near their area of residence.¹¹ This is in accord with the fact that the majority of the juvenile arrestees in our Honolulu study were from Hawaii, and it states an important reason for attention to be paid to the distribution of residential districts of the juveniles arrested.

IV. CONCLUSION

Of the juveniles arrested in 1985 in the City and County of Honolulu, 636 were selected for the study sample. Twentynine percent of the arrests were made in each of the first three quarters of the year, but only 13 percent were made from October through December. The greatest proportion (30.2 percent) of the arrests was for shoplifting.

In this study, 303 arrests (47.6 percent) were for first offenses, of which 149 (49.2 percent) were for shoplifting. The average age of these juveniles without a history of prior arrest was 14 years.

The average age of the juveniles with an arrest history was 15 years. However, the average age at first arrest of the repeat arrestees was lower than the average age of the juveniles in the study arrested for the first time. In addition, the majority of the first offenses of the repeat arrestees were either status offenses or larceny-theft.

Of the 636 offenses, 52.4 percent were group actions, and 11.6 percent of the reports on study charges indicated suspected alcohol or drug influence of the arrestee at the time of offense or arrest. These results demonstrate the importance of peer influence; however, while the influence of alcohol and drugs encourages delinquent behavior, the study results suggest that substance abuse is not a major determinant in the commission of the offenses studied. With

respect to police disposition, most of the cases were either referred to Family Court (40.6 percent) or counseled and released (45.0 percent).

The average age of all 636 arrestees at the time of the study arrest was 15 years, where the majority of the juveniles were 14 to 17 years of age. Males made up 78.5 percent of the arrestees, and 46.4 percent of all the arrestees were of mixed ancestry.

Hawaii was reported as the birth place of 64.0 percent of the arrestees, and almost 80 percent of all the arrestees attended public schools. The most frequently reported areas of residence were Waianae, Kalihi, Kaneohe, Nuuanu, Kailua, Waipahu, Wahiawa, Salt Lake, and Kaimuki.

Only 4.1 percent of the arrestees reported any of their parents as deceased. The records also indicated that the parents of 79.1 percent of the arrestees were married. With respect to the employment status of the arrestees' parents, 57.2 percent of the juveniles arrested reported that their fathers were employed, and 45.8 percent reported that their mothers were employed.

Almost 2 percent of the arrestees reported being under the guardianship of someone other than a parent, and 6.3 percent reported having no siblings. In addition, 4.7 percent of the juveniles had a history of victimization.

Overall, juveniles at higher risk of arrest for selected offenses were more likely to:

- 1. Be 14 to 17 years old,
- 2. Have been 9 to 14 years old at first arrest,
- 3. Be males,
- 4. Be of Hawaiian, Samoan, Filipino, or mixed ancestry,
- 5. Have been born in Hawaii,
- 6. Be attending public schools,
- 7. Have at least 1 sibling,
- 8. Have had no more than 1 arrest charge before 1985, and
- 9. Have had no more than 1 other charge in 1985.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

1.	Aggravated assault:	The equivalent of assault I or assault II.
2.	Booking numbers:	Numbers assigned to individual charges on police records.
3.	First offense:	The first offense for which the juvenile was ever arrested.
4.	Offense:	Charge, e.g. robbery, rape.
5.	Original violation:	Charges are sometimes downgraded after arrest. The original violation is the first charge for which the arrest was made.
6.	Primary report number:	The main report number assigned to the key offense in an incident.
7.	Repeat arrest:	An arrest of a juvenile, preceded by at least 1 other arrest of the same juvenile, regardless of the type of offense.
8.	Status offense:	An action declared by statute to be an offense only when committed by a juvenile, which can be adjudicated only by a juvenile court. 12
9.	Study arrest:	An arrest of which a related charge was randomly selected for study.
10.	Study charges:	A juvenile may be arrested for more than 1 charge at the same time, but not all the charges may be selected for study. The charges selected for study are referred to in this report as study charges.
