#### Study Description

The Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) sponsored the Survey of Youths in Custody, 1987: [United States], as part of the National Prisoner Statistics Program. The survey provides a profile of the drug and alcohol use patterns and the criminal and demographic characteristics of youth housed in long-term, State-operated, institutional facilities nationwide. Data collected include current offenses, prior criminal record, history of drug and alcohol use, age, sex, race, victim characteristics for delinquents incarcerated for violent crimes, peer group, and family background.

Fifteen minute interviews were conducted by the U.S. Bureau of the Census during December, 1987 and January, February and March of 1988. Census interviewers selected a predetermined sample from a roster of youth at each of 50 institutions in 26 states for the nationally representative sample. Interviews were conducted with 2,621 youth. Participation in the survey was voluntary, and the response rate was 89%.

The Children in Custody (CIC) census, which is conducted every two years provided the universe for the survey. These data are released by the ICPSR under the Juvenile Detention and Correctional Facility Census. The CIC census enumerates detention centers, shelters, reception and diagnostic centers, training schools, ranches, forestry camps or farms and halfway houses or group homes.

In the Survey of Youths in Custody, only long-term, state-operated, institutional facilities were included in the sampling frame. The majority of these institutions were training schools, which

are long-term facilities for adjudicated juvenile offenders who are typically under strict physical and staff controls. The juveniles in training schools are in general the most serious offenders and have the longest criminal records in the juvenile justice system.

Based on the 1985 CIC census, (released by the ICPSR as study number 8973) there were i,040 publicly operated juvenile detention, correctional and shelter facilities in the United States, housing 51,402 residents (Table 1). Approximately 19% of these public juvenile facilities were long-term, State-operated institutions, and they housed almost half of all the residents in public juvenile facilities. These facilities have the highest percentage of residents committed by the courts and the lowest percentage confined for juvenile status offenses, such as truancy.

#### Sample Selection

#### 1. Facilities

A facility was used as a primary sampling unit (PSU). Facilities with 360 or more children were designated as self-representing (SR) and were in sample with certainty. There were 11 such facilities.

The remaining 195 facilities were designated as non-self-representing (NSR) PSUs and were grouped into five strata. Stratum boundaries were determined using a frequency distribution of facilities by total residents housed in the facility, y. Given f(y), the cumulative of f(y) was computed and five equal intervals on the cum f(y) scale were chosen. Table 2 illustrates the formation of these strata.

Initially, we planned to select seven facilities from each NSR stratum. However, we found that this number would not yield all the sample allocated to stratum one even if we interviewed all the youth housed in the selected facilities. Hence, a decision was made to select 13 facilities from stratum one. This resulted in selecting 41 PSUs from the NSR strata. Consequently, the 1987 design contains 52 PSUs (see Table 3).

Facilities were selected systematically from each NSR stratum.  $\dot{}$ 

#### 2. Youth

In order to have an integer take-every, we found that a sample size of 2,960 youth would be more appropriate.

Expected sample was allocated to strata in the following manner (see Table 3):

a. For stratum 1, a sample of 385 youth was allocated. This is equivalent to interviewing all the children housed in the 13 sample facilities.

b. The remainder of the sample (2,575 = 2,960 - 385) was allocated to the remaining 15 strata using the following formula:

$$S_{i} = \frac{2,575 \times R}{2}$$

where R = total residents, and subscript i indicates the stratum number.

Within each stratum, the sample was allocated to each facility using a procedure similar to the one described above. Within each sample facility youth would be selected systematically for interviewing.

We wanted five strata. Since the total of CUM  $\sqrt{f(y)}$  is 30.56, the division points were 6.112, 12.224, 18.336, and 24.448. The nearest available points on the CUM  $\sqrt{f(y)}$  scale 9.95, 16.19, 21.67 and 28.11. Hence, stratum boundaries were:

- (a) Two facilities selected in stratum I were short-term and not in scope; as a result, there were 50 facilities in the final sample.
- (b) All residents were selected in sample facilities in stratum 1. Selections in other NSR strata were drawn proportional to the stratum size. One in every 8 residents in the remaining strata were designated for selection; however, due to unanticipated growth in strata 14 and 16, the selection rates were changed to 1 of 11 and 1 of 12, respectively.
- (c) Nonresponse was highest in strata 1 and 2 due to the large number of selected facilities requiring parental consent: 8 of 11 selected facilities requiring consent in stratum 1, and 2 of 7 in stratum 2.
- (d) Weights were adjusted for nonresponse by race and region.

(e) Final weights were adjusted by race and region for deviations from counts obtained in the 1987 Census of suvenile facilities.

#### Weighting Information

A series of weights were assigned to each case representing the initial probability of selection, special adjustments for sampling problems and nonresponse, and a ratio adjustment to Census. The following procedures were adopted to assign weights to each record:

#### Basic Weight (BWT)

the inverse of the probability of selection, i.e., the inverse of the product of the PSU probability of selection and the within PSU take rate. The basic weight assigned to each record in self-representing (SR) facilities was 8.00000. The weight assigned to cases in non-self representing (NSR) facilities varied inversely with each facility's probability of selection and the preassigned take-every number for each facility. The basic weights ranged from 5.22538 to 15.67615 in NSR facilities.

#### 2. Special Adjustment Factor (SAF)

The basic weights for cases in two facilities required special adjustments. These facilities were facility 3203 and 3204 (identified by VAROO14 on the data set). As a result of unexpected growth in the number of residents in these facilities, the pre-assigned take-every numbers were changed from 8 to 11 and 12, respectively. Consequently, to assign proper weights, the basic weights, in facility 3202 were multiplied by 1.3750 (or 11/8) and those in facility 3203 by 1.5000 (or 12/8).

#### 3. Noninterview Adjustment Factor (NAF)

To adjust the weights for noninterviewed cases, a NAF was calculated separately by race and region. A special region was established for Florida, Missouri and New York, which required parental consent for interviews. This region was created so that the significantly higher refusal rates in these states would not affect the data from the rest of the sample. The 10 adjustment cells are shown below:

A NAF was computed separately for each noninterview adjustment cell in the race by region cross-classification using the following formula:

where the numerator is the sum of all the weighted cases, and the denominator is the sum of only the weighted cases with completed interviews.

The product of BWT x SAF x NAF for each case resulted in an initial weight (IWT) and was recorded on the final data set (VAR 0276). The initial weighted number of youth in each of the 16 strata are reported in Table 4.

#### 4. Ratio Adjustment Factor (RAF)

To improve the reliability of sample estimates, the sample survey population was brought as closely as possible into agreement with counts from the Juvenile Detention and Correctional Facility Census, 1986-1987. A ratio adjustment factor (RAF) was calculated separately for each adjustment cell (1 through 10) using the following formula:

The numerator is the census count of the number of inmates in each adjustment cell. The denominator is the sum of all weighted cases (BWT x SAF x NAF) in each adjustment cell.

Finally, every record in the data set was assigned a final weight (VAR 0277), which is the product of the initial weight times the ratio adjustment factor (IWT x RAF). The final weighted number of youth in each of the 16 sampling strata are reported in Table 4.

#### Random Groups Variance

In order to employ the random groups variance estimation technique, the following procedures should be divided into seven groups using the random group codes (as described in section 1, below). Each sample case should be reweighted so that each random group total agrees with the independent estimates of the overall population of youth in custody, by race and region (as described in section 2). Estimates in each group should be computed by adding up the weights of sample cases in the group for each item of interest. Finally, variances are estimated by computing the usual sum of squared differences between the random group estimates and their mean, by item and demographic characteristic (as described in section 3).

#### 1. Random Group Code

Each sample case was assigned a random group code (VAR 0274 in the data set). In non-self-representing facilities (NSR), every selected case was assigned the same random group code (RGC). These codes were assigned at random by the Statistical Methods Division of the Bureau of the Census. In selfrepresenting facilities (SR), only the first case selected in the facility was given a pre-assigned RGC. For each subsequent selected case, the preassigned RGC for that facility was incremented by one, cycling back to 1 after the RGC had reached 7. For example, if the pre-assigned RGC for an SR facility was 5, the first selected case in the facility was assigned a RGC of 5, the second case a RGC of 6, the third case a 7, the fourth case a 1, and so on. These numbers were assigned to all interviews and noninterviews. Once the RGC's were assigned, noninterview records were deleted from the file.

#### 2. Reweighting the Random Group Estimates

In calculating the variances, a random group factor Fg must be computed for each interviewed case on the file. This factor adjusts for sample imbalances among random groups and reduces the variance estimate.

The following formula should be used:

for total sample in cell

Fg = ----

for group g in cell

for each ratio adjustment cell, where denotes the summation over all records in random group g. The numerator is the sum of the initial weights (IWT), previously described in the weighting section, for the total sample in each cell. The denominator is the sum of the IWT for only those cases in each cell in the designated random group. In other words, the Fg must be computed separately for each of the seven random groups g. Each record will have only one Fg whose value depends on which random group the record is in.

The product of the final weight (FWT), previously described in the weighting section, and Fg for each record (FWT x Fg) will result in a new weight for each record, the random group weight (RGWT).

#### 3. Variance Estimation

Using the random group weights (RGWT), calculate the random group estimate Wigd of item i, in random group g, for each demographic characteristic d. For example, to estimate the number of white (=d) youth in random group 5 (=g) who were convicted of burglary (=i), you would add the random group weights RGWT of those cases in group 5 who were white and convicted of burglary.

After each random group estimate has been obtained for a variance item i, the mean of the seven random group estimates should be calculated. The following formula should be used:

The random group variance estimate for each item i and characteristic d is calculated with the formula

$$Var (Wid) = (7/6) \underset{g=1}{\cancel{2}} (Wigd - \overline{Wid})$$

The standard error of the item is equal to the square root of Var (Wid), and the coefficient of variation is the standard error of the item divided by its full sample estimate (using FWT for each record).

#### FILE STRUCTURE

The Survey of Youths in Custody, 1987: [United States] is available from the ICPSR in two formats: card image and OSIRIS. The card image file contains several decks per case in a format based on 80 column punched cards. The data are sorted by case with all decks for a case together in ascending order.

The OSIRIS dictionary gives the format and other information for each variable in the OSIRIS data file. The dictionary or dictionary-codebook file is used in conjunction with the OSIRIS software package. The OSIRIS data file is constructed with a single logical record for each case. There are 277 variables on 2,621 cases.

The OSIRIS data file can be accessed directly through software packages or programs which do not use the OSIRIS dictionary by specifying the tape locations of the desired variables. These tape locations are given in the OSIRIS dictionary-codebook.

#### CODEBOOK INFORMATION

The example below is a reproduction of information appearing in the machine-readable codebook for a typical variable. The numbers in brackets do not appear but are references to the descriptions which follow this example.

- [1] Indicates the variable and reference numbers.

  A variable number and reference number are assigned to each variable in the data collection. In the present codebook, which documents the archived data collection these numbers are identical. Should the data be subset or rearranged by an OSIRIS program (e.g., MMP to intersperse data from another source, or TCOT to produce an analysis deck), the variable numbers would change to reflect the order of the new data collection, while the reference number would remain unchanged to reflect the variable number in the codebook describing the archived data collection.
- [2] Indicates the abbreviated (24 character maximum) variable name used within OSIRIS to identify each variable for the user. An expanded version can be found in the variable description list.
- Indicates the designation of missing data. In this example, code values equal to 97 or greater than or equal to 99 are missing data (MD=97 OR GE 99). Alternative statements for other variables are "MD=0", "MD GE 9", or "NO MISSING DATA CODES". Some analysis software packages (including the ICPSR-supported package) require that certain types of data which the user desires to be excluded from analysis be designated as "MISSING DATA," e.g., inappropriate, unascertained, unascertainable, or ambiguous data categories. Although this value is defined as within the missing data category, this does not mean that users should not or cannot use this code value in a substantive role if they so desire.
- [4] Indicates the starting location and width of this variable within the record when the data are stored on magnetic tape. In this example the variable named "IST ADMITTED-YEAR" is 2 columns wide and located in the 78th column within the record.

- [5] Indicates the full text (question) of the variable description supplied by the original collector of the data. The question text and the numbers and letters that may appear at the beginning reflect the original wording of the questionnaire item.
- [6] Indicates an additional comment or explanation appended to the variable description.
- [7] Indicates the code values occurring in the data for this variable.
- [8] Indicates the textual definitions of the codes.

  Abbreviations commonly used in the code definitions are "DK" (DO NOT KNOW), "NA" (NOT ASCERTAINED), and "!NAP" (INAPPROPRIATE).

#### ICPSR PROCESSING INFORMATION

The study was processed according to the standard ICPSR processing procedures. The data were checked for illegal or inconsistent code values which; when found, were recoded to OSIRIS missing data values. No consistency checks were performed.
