Calendar Year Summary Report of Population Movement 1988

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Wisconsin's Division of Corrections is responsible for the operation of correctional institutions for adult and juvenile offenders and for the supervision of offenders residing in the community under probation, parole, mandatory release, special action early release, and juvenile aftercare supervision. This publication, which is a compilation of data originally published on a monthly basis in Statistical Bulletin C-59, <u>Report of Wisconsin Corrections Population</u>, provides the reader with summary information about the volume and movements of offenders under Division of Corrections supervision during calendar year 1988.

Information about average daily populations and movement into and out of correctional institutions for adult offenders is presented in Table 1. Offenders serving Wisconsin sentences under contractual arrangements in facilities operated by the federal government or in Wisconsin county jails are included in this table in the columns labeled "contr.fac". Table 1 does not include offenders serving their sentences at the Wisconsin Resource Center, an institution operated by the Division of Care and Treatment Facilities. Calendar year movement and average daily population information for Ethan Allen and Lincoln Hills Schools, Wisconsin's institutions for juvenile offenders, may be found in Table 2 while data about the youth aids program appears in Table 2-A. Data about the movements of offenders under field supervision in the community is included in Table 3 and data relating to absconders from field supervision during calendar year 1988 can be found in Table 4. Average daily populations of of community supervision and institution cases for calendar years 1984-1988 can be found in Table A.

A total of 37,849 offenders were under the supervision of Wisconsin's Division of Corrections on December 31, 1988; an increase of 3.0 percent over the 36,732 offenders under supervision on January 1, 1988. Adult institutions resident populations increased 3.6 percent from 5,805 at the beginning to 6,014 at the end of the calendar year. The number of residents in institutions for juvenile offenders decreased slightly (1.9 percent) from 540 at the start to 530 at the end of 1988. Adults and juveniles reported in footnote a, Tables 1 and 2, as being absent with leave are not included in these population counts. The number of offenders under supervision in the community increased 1.7 percent from 26,576 on January 1 to 27,033 on December 31, 1988 while the number of community supervision cases placed on abscender status increased 12.1 percent from 3,811 to 4,272 during the same time period.

During calendar year 1988 the average daily population of offenders under Division of Corrections supervision was 32,754; an increase of 2.7 percent over the previous year when an average daily population of 31,893 was reported. Calendar year average daily populations have risen steadily from 28,442 in 1984 to 32,754 in 1988; an overall increase during the fiveyear period of 15.2 percent. (See Table A.) Throughout the five-year period community supervision cases made up four-fifths, approximately 80.0 percent of the average daily population of offenders under supervision.

The average daily population of offenders under some type of community supervision increased 13.4 percent from 23,280 in 1984 to 26,389 in calendar year 1988. Probation supervision average daily populations rose from 19,755 in 1984 to 22,548 in 1988; an increase of 14.1 percent while that of offenders under some type of parole supervision remained relatively stable between 1984 and 1985 but increased 9.2 percent from 3,516 in 1985 to 3,841 in 1988. The average daily population of adult offenders under parole supervision increased 4.7 percent from 3,302 in 1987 to a five-year high of 3,456 in calendar year 1988. Juvenile aftercare average daily populations, which stood at a five-year high of 190 in calendar year 1986 decreased 14.2 percent to 163 in calendar year 1988. The almost total lack of youthful offender and juvenile probation populations is due to (1) the repeal of the Youthful Statute effective on July 1, 1978 and (2) Department of Health and Social Services policy decision to discontinue provision of juvenile probation services on the state level.

Correctional institution average daily populations rose steadily from 5,162 in 1984 to 6,365 in 1988; an increase of 23.3 percent. The increase was largely confined to facilities for adult offenders where average daily populations increased 24.9 percent from 4,683 in 1984 to 5,849 in 1988. Juvenile institution average daily populations, which were at a low of 479 in calendar year 1984, increased 10.9 percent to a high of 531 in 1985, decreased (3.8 percent) to 511 in 1986, and have remained relatively stable since that time, standing at 516 in calendar year 1988.
