

SUMMARY

1988

- * Crime Index Offenses decreased 1.2% (120,716 in 1987 to 119,280 in 1988).
- * Violent Crime increased 1.2% (8,817 in 1987 to 8,918 in 1988).

Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter decreased 14.6% (110 in 1987 to 94 in 1988).

Rape decreased 3.3% (788 in 1987 to 762 in 1988).

Robbery increased 4.6% (2,022 in 1987 to 2,115 in 1988).

Aggravated Assault/Battery increased 0.9% (5,897 in 1987 to 5,947 in 1988).

Simple Assault/Battery increased 13.9% (21,286 in 1987 to 24,351 in 1988).

* Property crimes decreased 1.4% (111,899 in 1987 to 110,362 in 1988).

Burglary increased 5.1% (37,656 in 1987 to 39,574 in 1988).

Theft decreased 4.9% (68,260 in 1987 to 64,925 in 1988).

Motor Vehicle Theft decreased 2.0% (5,983 in 1987 to 5,863 in 1988).

Criminal Damage to Property, reported through the Incident Based Reporting System, totalled \$6,955,181 in 1988; damage done to vehicles accounted for 41.1% of the total.

- * Statistics for 1988 indicate Violent Crime affected 3.6 persons per thousand population while Property Crimes affected 44.4 persons per thousand.
- * The State Fire Marshal's Office reported Incendiary/Suspicious Fires increased 40.1% (1,651 in 1987 to 2,139 in 1988).
- * The reported value of **Property Stolen** increased 3.5% (\$69,737,068) with Motor Vehicle Theft accounting for 40.2% of the total.

- * The reported value of Property Recovered decreased 8.7% to \$22,520,824.
- * The Kansas Incident Base Reporting System received reports on 163,424 incidents that involved violations of state statutes.
- * Total arrests increased 0.5% (97,355 in 1987 to 97,864 in 1988). Juveniles were arrested most frequently for theft; Adults for DUI.
- * Assaults on Law Enforcement Officers decreased 6.8% (922 in 1987 to 863 in 1988).

IN MEMORIAM

<u>Crime in Kansas 1988</u> is dedicated to Detective Terry W. McNett, Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office, who was killed while serving search warrants from a drug investigation on February 2, 1988.

Detective McNett, 36, started his law enforcement career as a patrolman with the Haysville Police Department on January 1, 1973. He joined the Sedgwick County Marshal's Office April 6, 1977, and from there became a deputy for the Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office on June 18, 1979. He was promoted to Narcotics Investigator in May, 1981, and at the time of his death was involved with the Sedgwick County Drug Task Force.

Detective McNett was highly respected and admired by his fellow officers. He had a unique ability in dealing with informants and suspects. After buying drugs and arresting one particular individual, he subsequently bought drugs and arrested the individual two more times, each time convincing the individual that he was no longer a law enforcement officer!

Detective McNett was a tragic loss of a professional and dedicated law enforcement officer. Our most sincere condolences to Detective McNett's family and friends.

INTRODUCTION

The Kansas Bureau of Investigation is the Central Repository of criminal justice related data for the state. K.S.A. 21-2501(a) and K.S.A. 21-2504 require the submission of reports from all local police and sheriff departments to the KBI. Recently, state agencies with law enforcement responsibilities have begun to report information as well. There were over 350 state and local reporting entities during calendar 1988 upon which this publication is based.

The state has participated in the national Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program, maintained by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, since 1969. Prior to the development of a state-level program in the late 1970's, most reporting by local agencies was done directly to the FBI. The establishment of the state program ensured better coordination between the state and the national program, a higher level of data quality, and more complete reporting.

The UCR program collects offense data on murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault/battery, burglary, theft and motor vehicle theft. offenses are referred to as Part I crimes-so designated by the National Sheriff's Association and the International Association of Chiefs of Police in the 1930's due to their severity, frequency of occurrence and likelihood of being reported. These crimes are the basis for the Crime Index - the barometer by which crime trends have been measured for over 50 years. Arson was added to this list in the 1980's but is not included in calculations of the Crime Index. Part I crimes are divided into two categories: violent crime, which includes murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault/battery; and, property crime, including burglary, theft and motor vehicle theft. Additionally, arrest statistics are collected on these crimes as well as other so-called Part II crimes. Data on law enforcement personnel, including assaults, are also collected as part of the program. Program principles include using the "hierarchy rule" (counting only the most serious crime in a multiple offense situation), counting only arrests made for crimes committed in an agency's jurisdiction and being a monthly summary reporting system.

In order to better address requests for crime statistics and to provide a more complete view of the complexion of crime in Kansas, a

pilot program on Incident Based Reporting was begun in 1984 with participation by ten local law enforcement agencies. This program detailed crime reporting based upon incidents of reported crime wherein numerous points of information could be gathered and studied. Prior to implementation of this program, summary reports were prepared by the local agencies, forwarded to the KBI, tallied by the state and sent to the FBI. In 1988, all but four law enforcement agencies reported on the Incident Based Reporting System and this publication reflects presentations on this expanded data base.

The goals of the Incident Based Reporting System are: 1) the standardization of reporting methods and data elements; 2) the collection and reporting of data based on Kansas law, rather than national standards; 3) the maintenance of a state-level stolen property file; 4) to maintain a broad data-base allowing for the analysis of crimes, victims, suspects, etc.; 5) better feedback to local agencies. Long range goals include the ability to: 1) link arrests with offenses; 2) count arrests made for another agency; and 3) track offenders through the justice system.

Nationally, the Uniform Crime Reporting program is also transitioning into the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). After an exhaustive period of study, 53 data elements have been identified as core to this program and the Kansas system will be modified to ensure incorporation of the few data elements currently not in the IBR data base. With this incorporation, the three previously identified long range goals will be accomplished. Coupled with a renewed interest in the issue of data quality, the future is bright for crime reporting programs both nationally and within the state of Kansas.

OBJECTIVES OF CRIME IN KANSAS 1988:

- To provide justice system administrators with crime statistics for administrative and operational use;
- o To inform the Executive, Legislative and Judicial branches of government, and the public, as to the nature of the crime problem in Kansas -- its magnitude and its trend;

- o To provide information to those charged with the responsibility of formulating public safety policy;
- To determine who commits crimes by age, sex, race, and other attributes in order to find the proper focus for prevention and intervention programs;
- o To provide Kansas citizens with the most complete information on the nature and extent of crime;
- To include comprehensive data for researchers and planners;
- o To provide base data and statistics to assist in the assessment of social and other causes for the development of theories of criminal behavior, to assist in the assessment of the efficiency, effectiveness and performance of criminal justice agencies, and to measure the effects of prevention and deterrence programs; and,
- o To provide the FBI with complete data to be included in the national crime report.

CRIME FACTORS:

It is important to remember that crime is a social problem and, therefore, a concern of the entire population of Kansas.

The most important and vital influences on the occurrence of crime include:

- o Density and size of the community population and its surrounding area;
- o Composition of the population with reference particularly to age, sex, race, and ethnic origin;
- o Economic status and mores of the population;
- o Stability of the population with respect to transient factors;
- o Climate, which includes seasonal weather conditions;
- o Cultural conditions; i.e., educational, recreational and religious characteristics;
- o Effective strength of the law enforcement agencies;

- Standards governing appointments to law enforcement agencies;
- o Policies and/or attitudes of criminal justice system, practitioners including prosecution, courts, corrections and social services agencies;
- o Relationship and attitudes of the public toward law enforcement problems;
- o Administrative and investigative efficiency of law enforcement, including the degree of adherence of crime reporting and crime description standards; and,
- o Organization and cooperation of adjoining and overlapping police jurisdictions.

DATA COMPARISONS/LIMITATIONS:

This program was developed for Kansas law enforcement agencies by the Kansas Bureau of Investigation to furnish information for use primarily by contributing agencies. The tendency with a publication of this nature is to attempt to make comparisons of data between jurisdictions, whether between agencies, counties, or regions. Caution is urged in attempting to make comparisons between agencies; the reasons for this will become apparent as the reader reviews the publication. Data presented herein are carefully planned to present the truest and most accurate picture possible of crime in Kansas.

It is not always appropriate to compare single agencies because of the great variety of factors which affect the extent and fluctuation of crime and which are not taken into consideration in either raw data or crime rates. For example, one occurrence of theft is weighed equally with one occurrence of murder, even though the two crimes are obviously at opposite spectrums on a scale of seriousness. For the purpose of this publication, all crimes are weighted equally in computing crime rates.

The Incident Based Reporting program in Kansas is the best information presently available for reflecting crime as reported to law enforcement. It does not claim to represent all crime occurring in Kansas because it is dependent upon the willingness of the victim to

report the crime to law enforcement and the willingness of law enforcement to report the crime to the Kansas Bureau of Investigation.

This publication of <u>Crime In Kansas</u>, 1988 is the result of the efforts of 350 local and state law enforcement agencies submitting required information to the state program maintained by the Kansas Bureau of Investigation. The effort by the numerous individuals responsible for this process is greatly appreciated.

CRIME INDEX OVERVIEW

Crime Index Offenses (murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault/battery, burglary, theft and motor vehicle theft) totaled 119,280 in 1988, a decrease of 1.2% over 1987. The ten year trend of Crime Index Offenses shows an increase of 6% in crimes reported in 1988 as compared to 1979 figures. This increase is due, in part, to better reporting methods and the participation of more agencies.


Crime Index Offenses are divided into two sub-categories: 1) Violent Crime; and, 2) Property Crime. In the Violent Crime category aggravated assault/battery continues to be the most frequently reported crime and constitutes 66.7% of all violent crime reported. Theft is the most often reported Property Crime; 58.8% of reported property crime and slightly over fifty-four percent of the entire Crime Index are thefts.

The Crime Clock suggests that, on an average, one Crime Index Offense occurred every four minutes in 1988, while the individual categories of Violent Crime and Property Crime show an occurrence rate of 58 minutes, 56 seconds and 4 minutes, 45 seconds, respectively. August ranks as the month with the most Crime Index offenses reported.

There are thirty-five cities in Kansas with populations of over 10,000. Those cities account for 80.2% of all Crime Index Offenses that occurred in 1988. Kansas City experienced the greatest number of violent crimes; Wichita had the largest number of property crimes.


CRIME INDEX OFFENSE TREND 1979 - 1988

CRIME CLOCK 1988





Being the most aggregate representation of crime data, it is designed to convey the annual reported crime experience by showing the relative frequency of occurrence of the Index Offenses. This mode of display should not be taken to imply a regularity in the commission of the Part I Offenses; rather, it represents the annual ratio of crime to fixed time intervals.




VIOLENT CRIME

In 1988 a violent crime of murder, rape, robbery or aggravated assault/battery occurred on an average of every 59 minutes in Kansas. Statistics for 1988 indicate that 3.6 persons per thousand population experienced some type of violent crime.

Violent crime accounted for 7.5% of the total crime index offenses reported in 1988. This crime category totaled 8,918 in 1988 compared to 8,817 in 1987, a increase of 1.2%.

Information on simple assault/battery has been included even though it is considered a Part II offense under UCR guidelines. However, due to the frequency that this crime against persons is reported, the information is valuable to law enforcement.

VIOLENT CRIME TREND 1979 - 1988



MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER

Kansas Statutes define murder and non-negligent manslaughter as follows:

"Murder in the first degree is the killing of a human being committed maliciously, willfully, deliberately and with premeditation or committed in the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate any felony," (K.S.A. 21-3401).


"Murder in the second degree is the malicious killing of a human being, committed without deliberation or premeditation and not in the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate a felony," (K.S.A. 21-3402).

"Voluntary manslaughter is the unlawful killing of a human being, without malice, which is done intentionally upon a sudden quarrel or in the heat of passion," (K.S.A. 21-3403).

The national program defines murder as "the willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another," (<u>Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook</u>, 1984, page 6).

In 1988, Kansas reported 94 homicides, a decrease of 14.6% compared to the 110 homicides reported in 1987. Slightly over half (53.2%) of these crimes were committed with a firearm of some type. Of the 94 homicides reported, 22.3% involved family members and an additional 3.2% involved girlfriend/boyfriend relationships. Characteristics show the victim was most often a black male between the ages of 22 to 30. While, in contrast, the perpetrator was most likely a white male between the ages of 22 and 30. The largest number of homicides were reported in December.



RAPE

K.S.A. 21-3502 defines rape as:


"...sexual intercourse with a person who does not consent to the sexual intercourse..."

The national UCR program does not include male sexual assaults under the rape definition; those are considered "other sex offenses" and fall within the Part II crimes category. However, under Kansas Statutes, male sexual assault is considered rape in some incidents and counted as such.

There were 762 reported rapes in 1988, a decrease of 3.3% compared to 788 reported in 1987. Most of these rapes (81.4%) occurred in cities with populations of 10,000 or greater. The highest number of rapes were reported in the month of July. Over half of these rapes (57.4%) occurred between 10:00 p.m. and 4:00 a.m. and happened in residences and apartments (59.7%).

The most frequent rape victim is a white female, between 15-19 years of age, while the most common offender is a white male, age 20-24. In 53.5% of reported rapes the offender was known by the victim. Six males were victims of rape, while 7 females were offenders in 1988.




BY TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND

ROBBERY

Under the national UCR program and Kansas law, robbery is:


"...the taking of property from the person or presence of another by threat of bodily harm to his person or the person of another or by force."

Robberies reported increased 4.6% in 1988 compared to 1987, this slight increase reflects a trend that has been appearing since 1984 when the lowest number of robberies were reported in a ten year span. The majority of robberies (94.0%) occurred in cities with populations of 10,000 or greater and the largest number (928) occurred in business establishments where \$287,521 of property was reported stolen.

The highest number of robberies (256) were reported in December. Robberies most frequently occurred on Tuesday and Saturday between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 12:00 p.m.

The majority of the offenders (52.2%) were a stranger to the victim and used a personal weapon (hands, fists, feet, etc.) to commit the offense.



ROBBERY BY TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND 1988



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AGGRAVATED ASSAULT/BATTERY

Aggravated assault is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3410 as:

- "(a) Unlawfully assaulting or striking at another with a deadly weapon; or
- (b) Committing assault by threatening or menacing another while disguised in any manner designed to conceal identity; or
- (c) Willfully and intentionally assaulting another with intent to commit any felony."

Aggravated battery is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3414 as:

- "(a) Inflicts great bodily harm upon him; or
- (b) Causes any disfigurement or dismemberment to or of his person; or
- (c) Is done with a deadly weapon, or in any manner whereby great bodily harm, disfigurement, or death can be inflicted."


Aggravated assault is defined for the Uniform Crime Report as:

"An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1984, page 16).

Aggravated assault/battery continued to be the most frequently reported violent crime representing 66.7% of this category. Aggravated assault/battery increased nine-tenths of one percent in 1988, as compared to 1987.

The largest percentage of aggravated assault/battery reports (79.2%) occurred in cities with populations of 10,000 or above. Victims were most often between the age of 20-25 (1,264) and were related to (18.3%) or acquainted with (40.7%) the offender. Nearly half (44.1%) of reported assault/battery occurred in a residence on Saturday between the hours of 10:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.



AGGRAVATED ASSAULT/BATTERY TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND 1988





SIMPLE ASSAULT/BATTERY

Assault is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3408 as:

"An assault is an intentional threat or attempt to do bodily harm to another coupled with apparent ability and resulting in immediate apprehension of bodily harm. No bodily contact is necessary."


Battery is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3412 as:

"Battery is the unlawful, intentional touching or application of force to the person of another, when done in a rude, insolent or angry manner."

Simple assault/battery (no weapon and no injury involved) is a Part II crime. In 1988, this crime totaled 24,351 reflecting a 13.9% increase from 1987. The trend shows a continuous pattern of simple assault/battery increasing since 1979, with the smallest increase occurring in 1987.

Most simple assault/battery is committed by a family member (27.1%) or an acquaintance (25.7%) of the victim; the majority of the victims, 4,161, are between the ages of 20 and 25. These offenses most often occurred on weekends (51.0%) during the summer months with 7,097 reported incidents and 42.1% happen between 8:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m.



SIMPLE ASSAULT/BATTERY TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND 1988





SIMPLE ASSAULT/BATTERY BY MONTH OF OCCURRENCE 1988




PROPERTY CRIME

Part I property crime, which includes burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft, decreased 1.4% in 1988 and totaled 110,362 reported offenses. These three offenses represent 92.5% of the total crime index and are responsible for 99% of all reported stolen property.

Also included is data on the eighth Part I offense of arson and criminal damage to property, which is considered a Part II offense. Arson statistics are currently being collected and reported by the State Fire Marshall's Office. Criminal damage can only be ascertained from those agencies reporting on the Incident Base Reporting System.

PROPERTY CRIME TREND 1979 - 1988



BURGLARY

Burglary in Kansas is defined under K.S.A. 21-3715 as:


"...knowingly and without authority entering or remaining within any building, mobile home, tent or other structure, or any motor vehicle, aircraft, watercraft, railroad car or other means of conveyance of persons or property, with intent to commit a felony or theft therein."

The national UCR program does not recognize a vehicle as a structure, therefore, for UCR reporting purposes, breaking into a vehicle has traditionally been counted as a theft. However, under Kansas state statute these offenses are classified as burglaries.

In 1988 burglaries rose from 37,656, reported in 1987, to 39,574 an increase of 5.1%. Burglary had the lowest clearance rate of Part I offenses reported in 1988 at 9.4%. Of the total burglaries reported 53.8% were non-residence and 45.5% occurred at night.

Of the \$23,857,782 of stolen property reported for this offense, 54.9% was taken in residence burglaries. There was an increase of 9.2% for total property stolen in burglaries as compared to 1987.



BURGLARY TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND 1988





THEFT

Kansas Statute K.S.A. 21-3701 defines theft as:

"...any of the following acts done with intent to deprive the owner permanently of the possession, use, or benefit of the owner's property:


- (a) Obtaining or exerting unauthorized control over property; or
- (b) Obtaining by deception, control over property; or
- (c) Obtaining by threat, control over property; or
- (d) Obtaining control over stolen property knowing the property to have been stolen by another."

A decrease of 4.9% in theft was reflected from 1987. Theft (which also includes attempts) was the most frequently reported Part I crime at 54.4% of the total index.

Theft of auto accessories accounted for 17.1% of total thefts reported and amounted to \$1,967,783. The tables show that a theft offense is most apt to occur between 4 p.m. - 6 p.m. on Friday from a commercial building.

Under Kansas law, theft is listed under several different statutes but is counted as theft for FBI purposes. A list of these statutes with a breakdown of ten specific categories of occurrence is included.







MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

The national UCR program separates stolen motor vehicles from the general theft category to allow for more accurate accounting of vehicles stolen. Motor vehicle theft reflects a 2.0% decline from 1987; however, motor vehicle theft had the highest value of stolen property for Part I crimes at \$26,887,965.

It should be noted that a discrepancy in dollar value of stolen vehicles exists in some tables. When a vehicle is taken in the commission of a more serious crime (rape, burglary, etc.) a motor vehicle theft is not tallied, but the vehicle will be counted as property taken during the offense.



MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT TREND TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND 1988





CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Criminal damage to property is defined in K.S.A. 21-3720 as:

- "...by means other than by fire or explosive:
- (a) Willfully injuring, damaging, mutilating, defacing, destroying, or substantially impairing the use of any property in which another has an interest without the consent of such other person; or
- (b) Injuring, damaging, mutilating, defacing, destroying, or substantially impairing the use of any property with intent to injure or defraud an insurer or leinholder."

The figures provided in this section are based on statistics from the Incident Base Reporting System and do not include those agencies that are UCR participants only.

There were 40,421 incidents reported in 1988, listing Criminal Damage as one of the violations. There were 27,101 violations where Criminal Damage was the primary offense. Included with the Criminal Damage violations were 9,929 burglary-related violations and 9,377 theft-related violations. Another 3,737 miscellaneous offenses were also indicated.

Criminal damage loss reported totaled \$6,955,181 in 1988 which reflects an increase of 20.8% from 1987. The table shows vehicles are the primary target for Criminal Damage (41.1%) and constitute 31.9% of the total dollar loss.

Criminal Damage most frequently occurred on Friday or Saturday (37.8%), between the hours of 8:00 - 12:00 p.m.



CRIMINAL DAMAGE TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND 1988




Arson is defined in K.S.A. 21-3718 as:

- "...knowingly, by means of fire or explosive
- (a) Damaging any building or property in which another person has any interest without the consent of such person; or
- (b) Damaging any building or property with intent to injure or defraud an insurer or lienholder."

Arson statistics for 1988 are based on information provided by the State Fire Marshal's Office as reported under the Kansas Fire Incident Reporting System (KFIRS).

The trend graph depicts yearly total fires as reported to KFIRS and the number of incendiary/suspicious fires. The data shows a substantial (40.1%) increase in fires as compared to 1987. The pie chart shows that grass/refuse fires are a primary problem to local firefighters.

INCENDIARY/SUSPICOUS FIRES TREND 1980 - 1988









INCENDIARY AND SUSPICIOUS FIRES BY TWENTY-FOUR HOUR TREND 1988





STOLEN AND RECOVERED PROPERTY


In 1988, property reported stolen equalled \$69,737,068 which is a 3.5% increase from 1987. Agencies recovered \$22,520,824 of property that had been reported stolen either in, or prior to, 1988 (an increase of 8.7% from 1987).

Motor vehicles accounted for 40.2% of property reported stolen and were the most frequently recovered property (83.4%).

Nearly seventy-eight percent of reported stolen property was in cities with a population of over 10,000; recovered property totaled \$17,640,258 in these same cities.

A list of property reported stolen through the Incident Base Reporting System is included; this information is used to create the Kansas Stolen Property File. The file is used as a resource for law enforcement agencies to search for recovered property that may have been reported stolen by Kansas agencies. Unlike the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) the Kansas System is unique in that only a property description is required for a search of the file.

PROPERTY LOSS AND RECOVERED TREND 1979 - 1988






ARRESTS

The total arrests for 1988 increased slightly (0.5%) as compared to 1987. However, this is a continuation of a five year trend which has seen arrests increase 23.5% from 1984 to 1988. The largest increase was Part II adult arrests with 62,843 reported in 1987 and 63,678 in 1988.

Juveniles seventeen years of age were the most often arrested accounting for 25.3% of all juvenile arrests. While the most frequently arrested adults were 25-29 amounting to 21.5% of total adult arrests.

The greatest number of juveniles arrested (5,447) were for the Part I crime of theft. The largest number of adults (14,143) for the Part II offense of DUI.



The arrest clock should be viewed with care. Being the most aggregate representation of crime data, it is designed to convey the annual reported crime experience by showing the relative frequency of occurrence of the Index Offenses. This mode of display should not be taken to imply a regularity in the commission of Part I Offenses; rather, it represents the annual ratio of crime to fixed time intervals.


LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED

Kansas had the misfortune of losing a sheriff's deputy in the line of duty in 1988.

The deputy with the Sedgwick County Sheriff's Office was killed during a drug raid.

Assaults on law enforcement officers decreased 6.8%, from 922 in 1987 to 863 in 1988. Of these total assaults, 81% were without serious injury; 699 of these offenses, or 89.7% were committed by hands, fists, or feet. The highest incident of assault occurred while responding to some type of disturbance, with this category accounting for 50.1% of assaults. Approximately 37.7% of all assaults on law enforcement officers occurred between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m. ninety-two percent, or 796, of all assaults were cleared.



LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES

The number of full-time sworn and civilian law enforcement employees for 1988 increased 5.9% as compared to 1987. There were 4,634 sworn employees and 1,603 civilian employees for a total of 6,237.

Over 69% of the civilian employees were female, and females represented 8.4% of the sworn employees. Most employees (1,201) had served 6-10 years in law enforcement and the majority 22% had been with the same agency that long. Nearly 57% of the law enforcement employees have attended college, and 1,504 have degrees.

Also included in this section is a summary of employees by agency.

APPENDIX GLOSSARY

GLOSSARY

- ACTUAL OFFENSE: An offense which law enforcement personnel confirm to have happened.
- ALL OTHER OFFENSES: State and local offenses not otherwise specified.
- ARREST: The act of taking a person into custody by authority of law, to charge him or her with a criminal offense or to initiate juvenile proceedings.
- ARSON: Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud.
- ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED: An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.
- ASSAULT, SIMPLE: An unlawful attack or attempted attack by one person upon another in which no weapon was used and which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.
- BATTERY, AGGRAVATED: The unlawful touching or application of force by one person upon another with intent of causing great bodily harm. This type of battery usually involves a deadly weapon or causes disfigurement, dismemberment, or death.
- BATTERY, SIMPLE: The unlawful, intentional touching or application of force to the person of another, when done in a rude, insolent or angry manner.
- BURGLARY: The unlawful entry of or concealment within a structure to commit a felony or theft.
- CLASS I: Classification of offenses including the Crime Index and negligent manslaughter.
- CLASS II: Classification of offenses encompassing all crimes not included in Class I. However, for purposes of this publication negligent manslaughter is included with the Class II offenses.
- CLEARANCE: An offense that is "solved" where at least one person is arrested, charged, and turned over to the court for prosecution; or by "exceptional means" where extenuating circumstances prohibit the police officer from doing the above. Such reasons might include death of the offender, confession by an offender for another offense under different jurisdiction, denial of extradition, refusal of victim to cooperate, prosecution of offender for a lesser charge, and policy regarding handling of juveniles, etc.

- CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, and aggravated assault/battery.
- CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses robbery, burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft.
- CRIME INDEX: Classification of seven offenses selected for their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, and likelihood of being reported. Includes murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault/battery, burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft, all of which share the feature of criminal intent.
- CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO PROPERTY: The willfully injuring, damaging, mutilating, defacing, destroying, or substantially impairing the use of any property by means other than fire or explosives.
- CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS: Transgressions of curfew or loitering ordinances pertaining to juveniles.
- DISORDERLY CONDUCT: Committing or attempting to commit a breach of the peace. Includes affray; unlawful assembly; disturbing the peace; disturbing meetings; disorderly conduct in state institutions; prize fights; blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language; desecrating the flag; and refusing to assist an officer.
- DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE: The driving or operating of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.
- DRUG ABUSE VIOLATION: Transgression of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.
- DRUNKENNESS: All offenses of drunkenness or intoxication except driving while intoxicated. Includes drunkenness, drunk and disorder? 7, common or habitual drunkard, and intoxication.
- EMBEZZLEMENT: Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.
- FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING: All offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.
- FRAUD: Converting and obtaining money or property by false pretenses other than forgery or counterfeiting.
- GAMBLING: Promoting, permitting, or engaging in games of chance.
- INCENDIARY: Involving a deliberate burning of property.

- INCIDENT: A situation where offenses, (violations of local, state, or federal laws) occurs, more than one offense can be reported in one incident.
- INCIDENT-BASED REPORTING: A system where criminal offense reports are submitted to a central repository on an individual basis for statistical and analysis purposes.
- JUVENILE: Person under the age of eighteen.
- KANSAS PROPERTY FILE: A list of property stolen or recovered by Kansas Law Enforcement agencies, which can be utilized as a data base for property searches.
- LIQUOR LAW VIOLATION: Transgression of any state or local liquor law except drunkenness and driving while intoxicated.
- MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT: The theft or attempted theft of a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails.
- MULTIPLE OFFENSE SITUATION: An incident where more than one offense is committed.
- MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER: The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.
- OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN: All charges of nonsupport and neglect of abuse of family or children.
- PREMISE: The location where an offense occurred.
- PROPERTY CRIMES: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft.
- PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE: Committing or attempting to commit sex offenses of a commercialized nature.
- RAPE: The carnal knowledge of a person forcibly and against their will.
- REPORTED OFFENSE: An act which comes to the attention of law enforcement authorities as a possible offense.
- ROBBERY: The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.
- RUNAWAY: Protective custody of juveniles under local statute.
- SEX OFFENSES: Offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like, other than forcible rape or prostitution and commercialized vice.
- STOLEN PROPERTY, BUYING, RECEIVING, AND POSSESSING: Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property or the attempt to commit any such offense.

- SUSPICION: Arrests for examination by police, after which persons arrested are released.
- THEFT: The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another or the attempt to do so.
- UNFOUNDED OFFENSE: An act reported to law enforcement authorities which, upon investigation, proves to be not an offense.
- VAGRANCY: Offenses of vagrancy, begging, loitering (adults), vagabondage, and being a "suspicious character or person, etc."
- VANDALISM: The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacing of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.
- VIOLENT CRIMES: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault/battery.
- WEAPONS OFFENSES: Offenses and attempted offenses against weapons regulations. Includes manufacture, sale, possession, or carrying open or concealed deadly weapons or silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; possession of deadly weapons by aliens.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

Maintenance of records felony offenses and certain misdemeanors by law enforcement agencies; reports to bureau investigation; form. (a) A11 enforcement agencies having responsibility enforcement in any political subdivision of this state shall maintain, on forms approved by the attorney general, a permanent record of all felony offenses reported or known to have been committed within their respective jurisdictions, and of all misdemeanors or other offenses which the violation of the controlled substances act.

(b) All law enforcement agencies having the responsibility of maintaining a permanent record of offenses shall file with the bureau of investigation, on a form approved by the attorney general, a report on each offense for which a permanent record is required within seventy-two (72) hours after such offense is reported or known to have been committed.

21-2504. Attorney general may call upon designated officers for information; forms. (a) For the purpose of controlling and obtaining reliable statistics crime and criminals, the attorney general may call upon and obtain from the clerks of district courts, sheriffs, police departments and county attornevs information that said attorney general may deem necessary in ascertaining the true condition of the crime situation; and it shall be the duty of the above-mentioned officers to furnish the information requested by the attorney general.

(b) The attorney general shall provide, upon request, forms for fingerprint impressions, for the permanent record of offenses, and for the reports of offenses required by K.S.A. 21-2501 and 21-2501a.
