

INTRODUCTION

This bibliography is divided into 6 sections.

Section A - General books and articles on drugs in the workplace.

Section D - Federal Register announcements establishing rules and regulations for drug testing not only of federal employees, but the testing of employees such as railroad and airline employees for which the Federal Government establishes rules.
