EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Florida Department of Corrections (DC) serves as the regulatory authority for the operation of county and municipal detention facilities [CH 951.23(5).(6)FS] and collects pertinent statistical data on the inmate population incarcerated in such facilities [CH 951.23(2) FS]. Although the legal authority to collect the data began on October 1, 1985, all 67 counties did not begin reporting until January 1986. The enabling legislation requires certain data as a minimum to be collected and analyzed. The Florida Department of Corrections has expanded the collection effort which is the result of compromises between user requests, programming changes at DC, and ease of collection and training of staff at the reporting detention facilities.

The data presented in this report are for the three year period from January 1, 1988 to December 31, 1990. The data collected are from the 67 county jail systems operating 110 facilities throughout the period--ending December 31, 1990. The information reveals that inmate populations in county jails have continued to increase into 1990.

- * The county jail average daily inmate population increased from 25,970 in January 1988 to 32,488 by December 1990, a 25.1% increase.
- * Authorized DC rated capacity increased by 9,948 beds or 40.9% during the period from January 1988 (24,305) to December 1990 (34,253).
- * Eighteen jails (26.9%) are cited in federal lawsuits, 19 jails (28.3%) are named in state action that have not been dismissed as of December 1990.

The purpose of this annual report is to present a summary of three years of jail data reported to the Florida Department of Corrections by the 67 Florida counties. There is no intent to offer editorial comment in regard to the causes of, nor to recommend solutions for, the jail overcrowding currently confronting the state of Florida. The data presented in this report are annual averages for the inmate classifications that are collected on a monthly basis by the Florida Department of Corrections. Readers are cautioned that the annual average daily population figure (ADP) totals for some counties differ in quantity from the ADP totals reported for the individual facilities within those counties. This difference is the direct result of averaging the total system wide inmate ADP for a county on a 12 month basis whereas the facility populations are averages computed on the basis of actual time of occupancy.

This report is separated into two parts. The first section features annual percentages for the year 1990, and descriptive jail information for each of the three years (1988-1989-1990) in which DC collected data on Florida's county jails. The second part affords the reader an opportunity to view trends in county jail inmate populations on a statewide basis. The following is a short description of the type of information that will be provided in this report:

- * A jail data summary review for the year 1990 (to include average daily populations, incarceration rate, and capacity percentages).
- * Average daily populations of inmate categories for 1988, 1989, and 1990.
- * County incarceration rates per 1,000 population.
- * Authorized DC rated capacity in comparison to the average daily populations reported for 1988, 1989, and 1990.
- * 3 year trend study, and pending litigation

The Inspector General's Office of the Florida Department of Corrections is currently responsible for publishing on a monthly basis "The County Detention Facilities Daily Inmate Population Data Report." Selected data from this monthly report is utilized in the Annual Report in order to enhance the data routinely collected and published by this office.

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JAIL DATA SUMMARY 1990

The inmate categories reported are unchanged from those in 1989. The data contained within this section are annual averages for 1990. The data for selected categories are presented in Table 1 and can be summarized as follows:

- * The average annual ADP for 1990 was 33,628. Of that number 87.2% (29,328) were adult males, 10.4% (3,488) adult females and 2.3% (790) were male juveniles. The 22 female juveniles were 0.1% of the total.
- * Pretrial detainees were 61.2% (20,588) of the annual average ADP.
- * Of the 29,328 adult males 61.4% (15,534 felons - 2,485 misdemeanor) were pretrial inmates.
- * There were 53.7% (1,874) of the adult female population held in pretrial status (1,463 felons - 411 misdemeanor).
- * The juvenile population is dominated by the 677 males in the awaiting trial/sentencing (655 felons - 22 misdemeanors). That 677 is 85.7% of the male juveniles and 83.4% of the total juvenile population (790 male - 22 female).

The incarceration rates per 1,000 population range from a low of 0.9 in Charlotte County to 8.6 in Hamilton County. See Table 2 and figure 1. The incarceration rate computation includes all inmate categories. The average rated capacity versus average ADP is shown in Table 3 and Figure 2 and can be summarized as follows:

- * Statewide capacity was 33,413 and ADP was 34,614 or 3.6 over the statewide rated capacity.
- * Facility ADP's differ from county wide ADP data because of differing means of computation.
- * The over/under capacity range was 124.4% over in Dade County Jail Women's facility, and 70.9% under capacity in the Collier County Stockade.
- * One hundred and ten facilities were operated by the 67 counties throughout 1990. Several counties operated multiple facilities: Alachua (2); Bay (2); Broward (3); Citrus (2); Dade (7); Duval (5); Escambia (3); Hillsborough (7); Lake (2); Lee (2); Manatee (3); Martin (3); Monroe (2); Orange (4); Palm Beach (3); Pasco (2); Pinellas (4); Polk (2); St. Lucie (2); and Volusia (2).
- * Facilities that Opened were: Franklin (2/90, Cap: 64); Gadsden (4/90, Cap: 154); Hillsborough/Central (6,8,&10/90, Cap: 1554); Hillsborough/Work Release (9/90, Cap: 54); Martin (3/90, Cap: 456) Monroe/Plantation Key (3/90, Cap: 49)

- * Facilities Closed: Franklin, Old Jail (2/90, Beds: 12); Gadsden, Old Jail (4/90, Beds: 71); Hillsborough/Clark Street (Old West) (9/90, Beds: 740); Hillsborough/East (7/90, Beds: 158); Hillsborough/Work Release East (7/90, Beds: 149); Hillsborough/Work Release (9/90, Beds: 46)

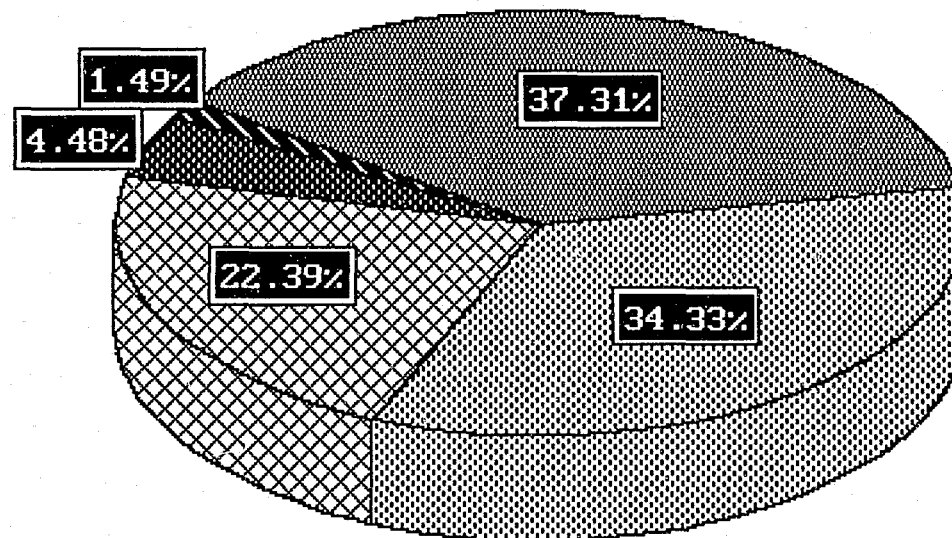

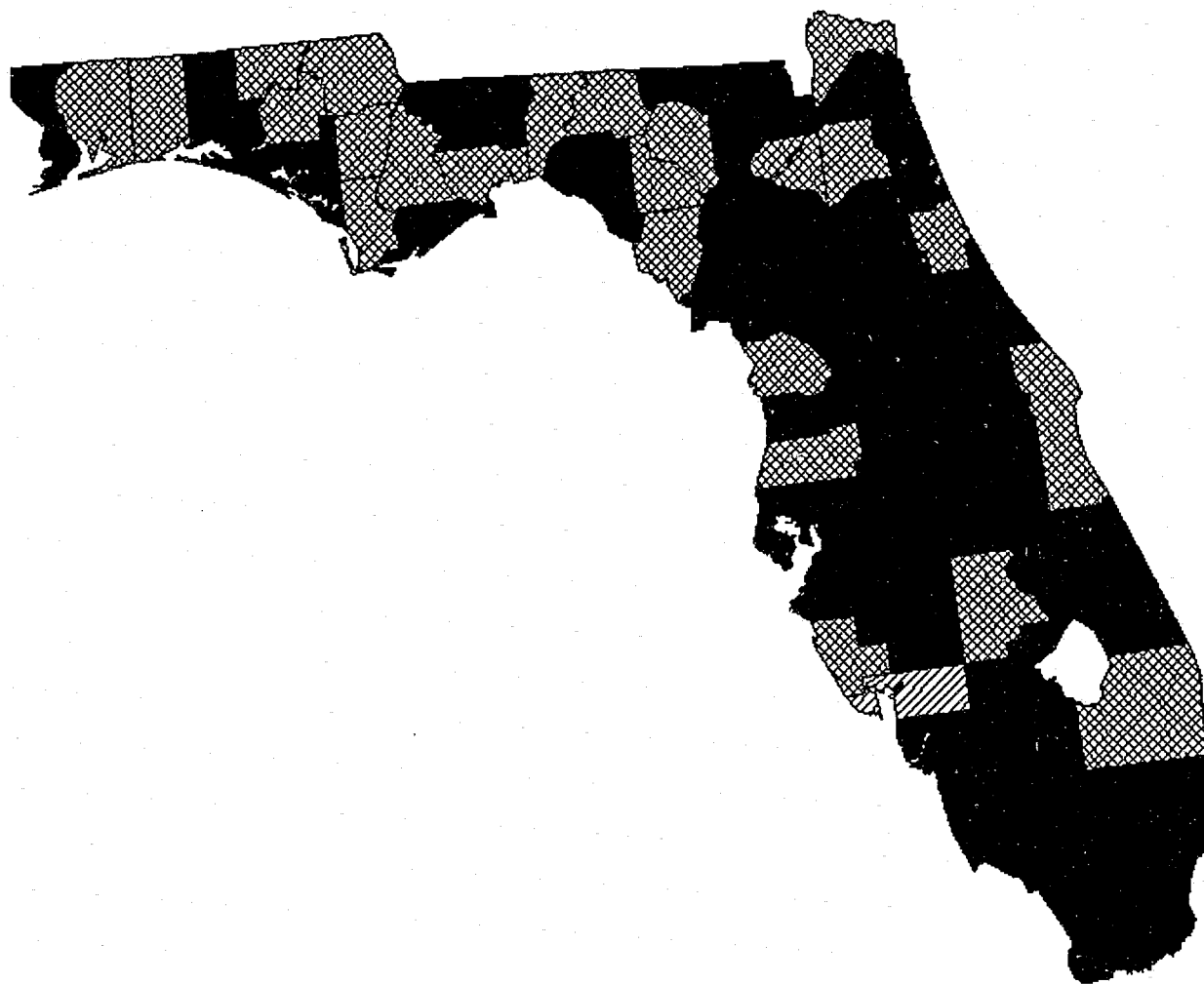

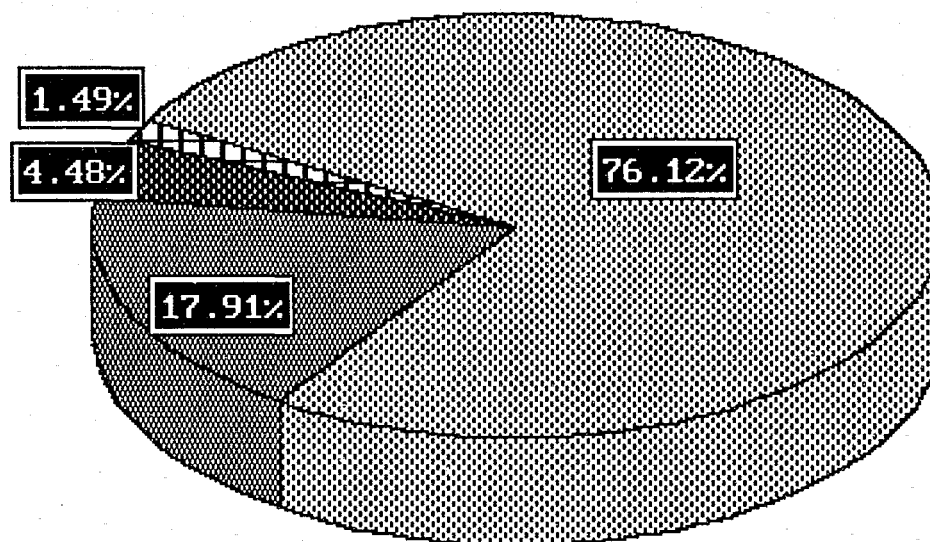

1990



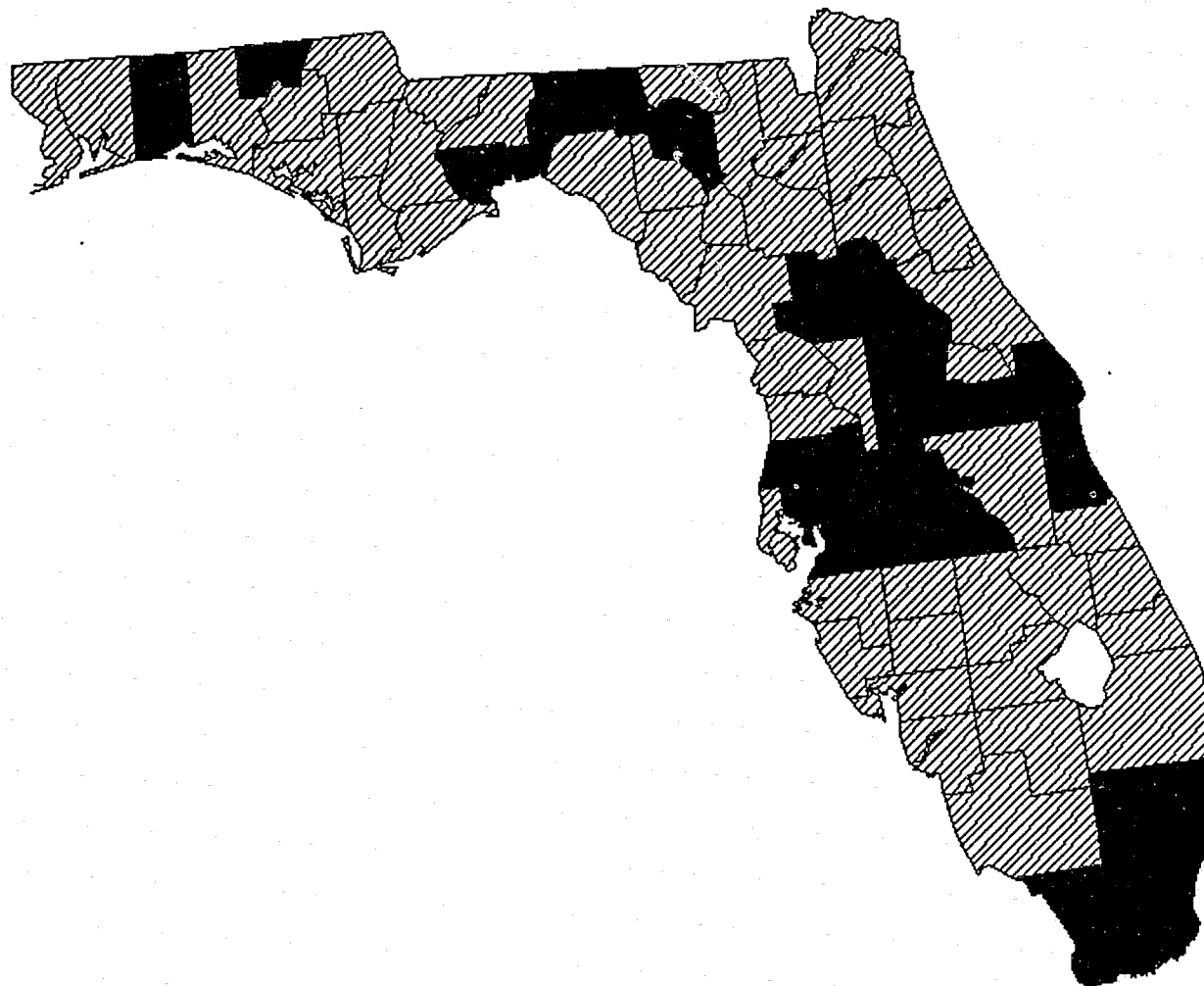

DESCRIPTIVE DATA

JAIL DATA SUMMARY 1988 - 1990

During the three year period covered by this report the annual average daily population of adult males increased by 14.9% (25,518 to 29,328), while the adult female population increased 21.9% (2,860 to 3,488). The juvenile male population increased 35.3% (584 to 790), and the juvenile female population reflected an increase of 46.7 percent (15 to 22) in the three year period. See Table 4.

Adult Male Felons

Of the four adult male felony categories tracked, those sentenced to 365 days or more showed the highest rate of increase (30.7%) during the 88-90 time frame. A 10.4% increase was reported for the felony awaiting trial category which comprises about 75% of the total adult male felony population. During the three year period under observation the ratio of pretrial detainees decreased from 77% of the total male felony population in 1988 to 75% by 1990. The pretrial category of male felons dominates the current jail population in absolute numbers. In 1988 male adult felons represented 63.1% of the total jail population while in 1990 the ratio was 60.9% .

Adult Male Misdemeanants

The total adult male misdemeanor category increased by 22.3% (4,137 to 5,060) over the past three years. The misdemeanor awaiting sentencing category represented the single largest increase at 26.3 percent.

Of the total male misdemeanor population in 1988, 48.9% were sentenced and the ratio remained at 48.9% in 1990.

The awaiting trial misdemeanor category in 1988 was 49.1%, and that population also remained the same at the rate of 49.1% in 1990. The ratio of adult male misdemeanants to the total male population was 16.2% in 1988 and 17.3 in 1990.

Adult Male - "Other" Category

Probation violators represented the largest number of the adult male population in the "other" category. This category increased by 18.9% during the 1988 - 1990 period. Adult males held for other jurisdictions increased by 234 or 36.1 percent during the three year period. Such an increase is caused by the number of federal inmates contracted for between the jails and the Federal Marshal's Service. The "other" category represented 3,111 or 12.2% of the 1988 adult male population. By 1990 that number had increased to 3,784 (12.9%) of the daily average.

The adult male average daily population figures for the 1988-1990 period can be summarized as follows:

- * In 1988, 71.6% (18,270) were adult male felons. 16.2% were misdemeanants and 12.2% were included in the "other" category.
- * By 1990, 69.8% (20,484) were adult male felons, 17.3% (5,060) were adult male misdemeanants and 12.9% (3,784) comprised the "other" category.
- * The adult felony male awaiting trial category in 1988 represented 55.1% of the total adult male population. In 1990 that ratio had decreased to 53.0 percent.

Adult Female Felons

The adult female felony population continues to increase and at a ratio greater than that for adult male felons. Adult female felons sentenced to 365 days or more significantly increased 47.0% between 1988-1990. During this same time period those sentenced to 364 days or less increased by 36.0%, those awaiting trial by 10.7%, and females

awaiting sentencing increased by 10.0 percent. Similar to the adult males, adult female felons who are awaiting trial represent the largest segment of the adult female felon average daily population. In 1988 the ratio of adult female felons awaiting trial was 73.1% (1,321) and in 1990 the ratio was 68.9% (1,463). The total adult female felony average daily population increased from 1,807 to 2,122 (17.4%) during the three year period.

Adult Female Misdemeanants

The total adult female misdemeanor category increased by 29.9% (609 to 791) over the past three years. Sentenced misdemeanants increased by 40.5%, awaiting trial by 22.7%, and awaiting sentencing reflected no increase or decrease. The ratio of female misdemeanants to the entire adult female jail population was 21.3% in 1988 and 22.7% in 1990.

Adult Female - "Other" Category

When comparing similar categories with the male inmate ADP, probation violators also represented the largest group of adult females in the "other" category. From 1988 to 1990, there was an increase of 47.0% to (100 to 147). The "other" category of adult female inmates increased 29.5 in the 1988 - 1990 time period.

The following summary of the adult female jail population during the period 1988 to 1990 is made:

- * The total number of adult female felons increased by 17.4% (1,807 to 2,122).
- * Distribution of the ADP in 1988 was 63.2% (1,807) felons, 21.3% (609) misdemeanants and 15.5% (444) "others".
- * In 1990 the distribution of the female ADP was 60.8% (2,122) felons, 22.7% (791) misdemeanants and 16.5% "other".
- * The felony awaiting trial category dominates the adult female ADP categories standing at 46.2% (1,321) in 1988 and falling to 41.9% (1,463) of the total of the female categories tracked in 1990.

JUVENILES

The juvenile population in Florida's county jails is dominantly male. Of the 599 total ADP in 1988, 97.5% (584) were males and in 1990 the ratio was 97.3% (790) of the total of 812 juveniles. Unlike the adult population categories, juvenile "pretrial" and "awaiting sentencing" are combined. But very much like the adult population most are unsentenced and were 90.3% (528 males and 13 females) of the ADP in 1988 and 85.6% (677 males and 18 females) in 1990.

A reduced ADP in "Beyond Staff Control (HRS)" category was evidenced, reflecting from 4 males (no females) in 1988 to 2 males (no females) in 1990, a reduction of 50% .

COUNTY ADP AND INCARCERATION RATES

ADP's increased in all counties, except for the following: Collier, Desoto, Dixie, Gulf, Hamilton, Hardee, Holmes, Lafayette, Leon, Madison, Palm Beach, Sarasota, Taylor, Union, and Volusia. See Table 5. The range was a -39.41% in Hardee to 196.5% in Levy. In Dade County the average daily population increased by 934 inmates from 1988 to 1990. Incarceration rate changes for 1988-90 varied from a 43.5% decrease in Hardee County to a 175.0% increase in Levy County. See Table 6.

LEGAL STATUS OF COUNTY JAILS

County jails in Florida are subject to civil action in the various federal district courts and state circuit courts. Table 7 depicts those counties that have a record of court action ending 1990, most of which are under court order, settlement, or consent decrees. The suits contain no record of dismissal and, therefore, include active cases.

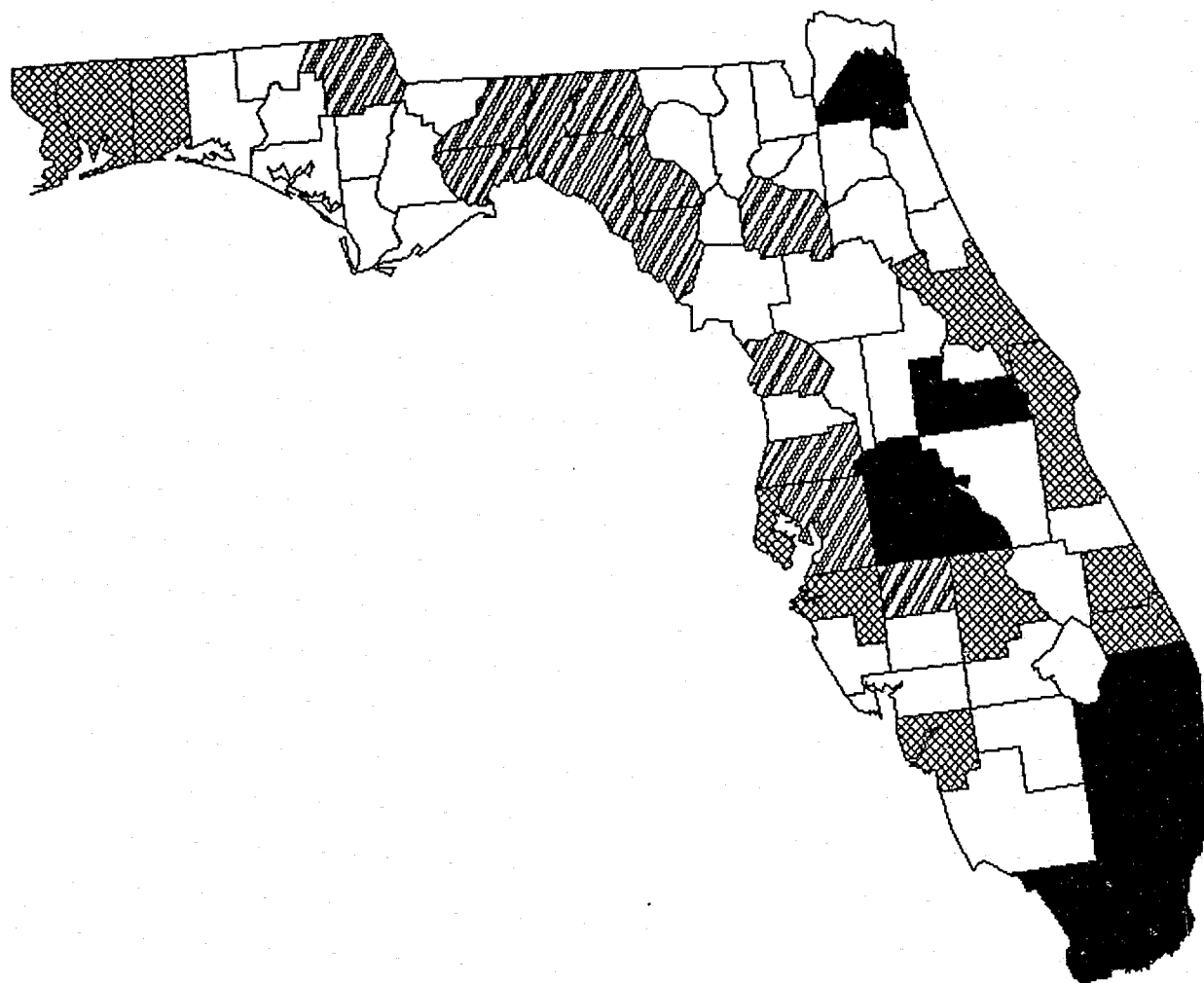
An analysis reveals that of the 67 counties 18 (26.9%) are under federal action, 19 (28.3%) are under state action and 7 (10.4%) have both federal and state action pending. Federal actions are generally inmate initiated class action suits arising out of conditions of confinement. State action is initiated by DC most often citing overcrowding, fire safety violations, and staffing problems. The corrective action most often required is a significant renovation of existing facilities, temporary additions and/or construction of new jails.

TRENDS

TRENDS SUMMARY

The county jail inmate data collected demonstrates the jail population will continue to increase into the future. No one single element of the criminal justice process is responsible for nor can any one single function reverse the trends of the past three years.

This report identifies the symptoms and not the cause of the over-population in the jail system of Florida.

The longitudinal data identified in this section provides basic information on inmate population and capacity trends. The data cited are annual averages. The following discussion is based on Table 8 and Figures 3 through 10.

The facility daily average of all inmates increased by 18.8% during the period 1988 - 1990. The capacity of all facilities increased by 23.8%. The population was 2,145 inmates (7.9%) over capacity in 1988. The ratio of inmates over capacity was 9.1% (2,779) in 1989, and dropped to 3.6% (1,201) over capacity in 1990. A greater rate in capacity increase and lesser rate in ADP resulted in the lower percentage beyond capacity in 1990. In 1988, 24 of 67 counties operated 39 of 107 facilities with inmate population beyond their DC rated capacity. In 1989, 29 counties operated 48 of 107 facilities beyond capacity and 1990, 31 of 110 facilities were above their rated capacity in 16 of the 67 counties.

The population trends for total ADP, adult male, adult female and juveniles for the 1988 - 1990, reporting period as shown in Figures 3, 4, 5, and 6 graphically demonstrate a relatively stable and constant

increase in all categories. There is a seasonal drop from November to December of each year in the inmate ADP which recovers in January and moves back to a "normal" rate of increase.

The annual average ADP has increased by 6.3% a year from 1988-90, while the capacity rate has increased at a somewhat higher rate of 7.9% which has and will continue to contribute to alleviate the overcrowding numbers in the jail population in Florida.

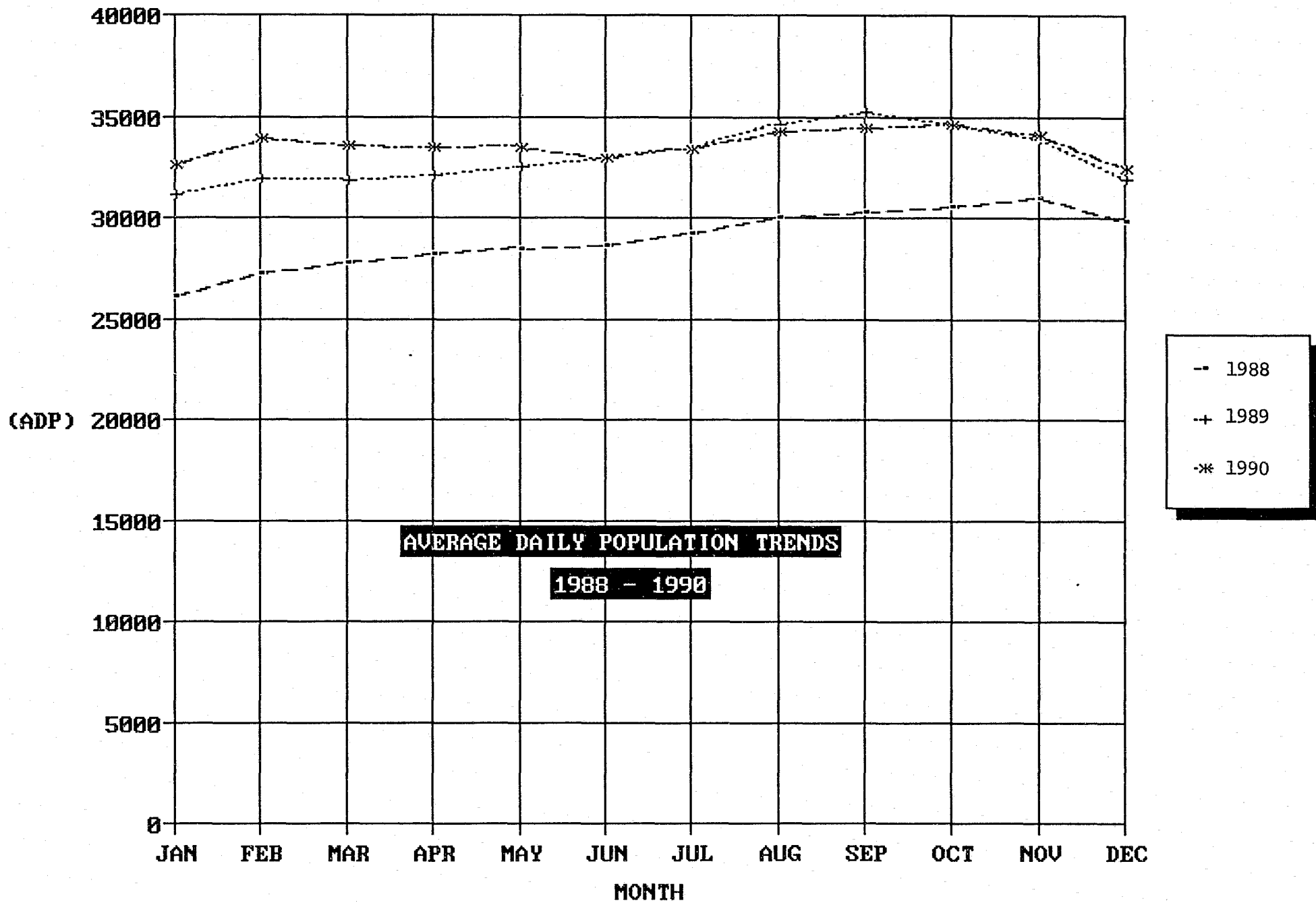

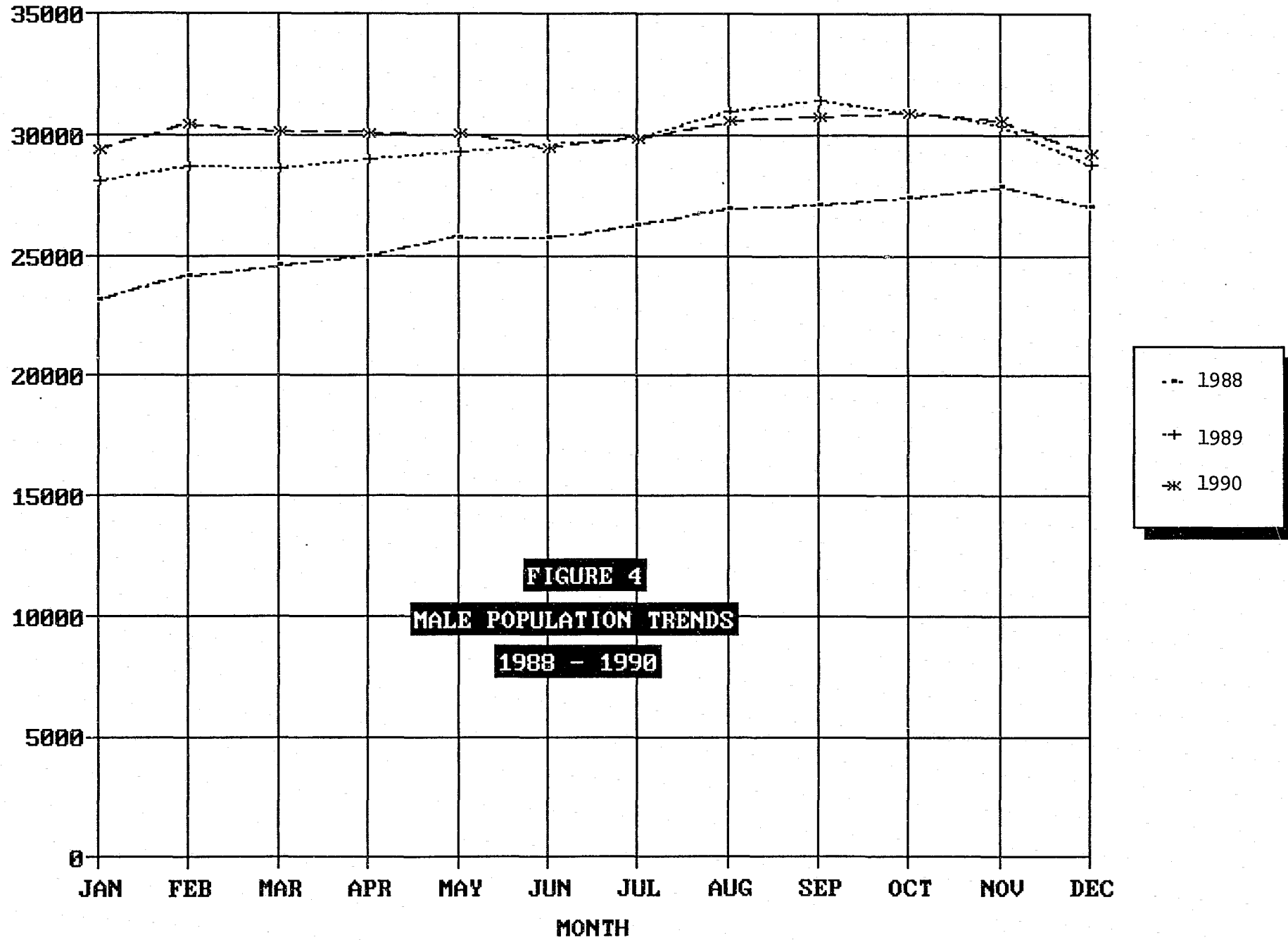

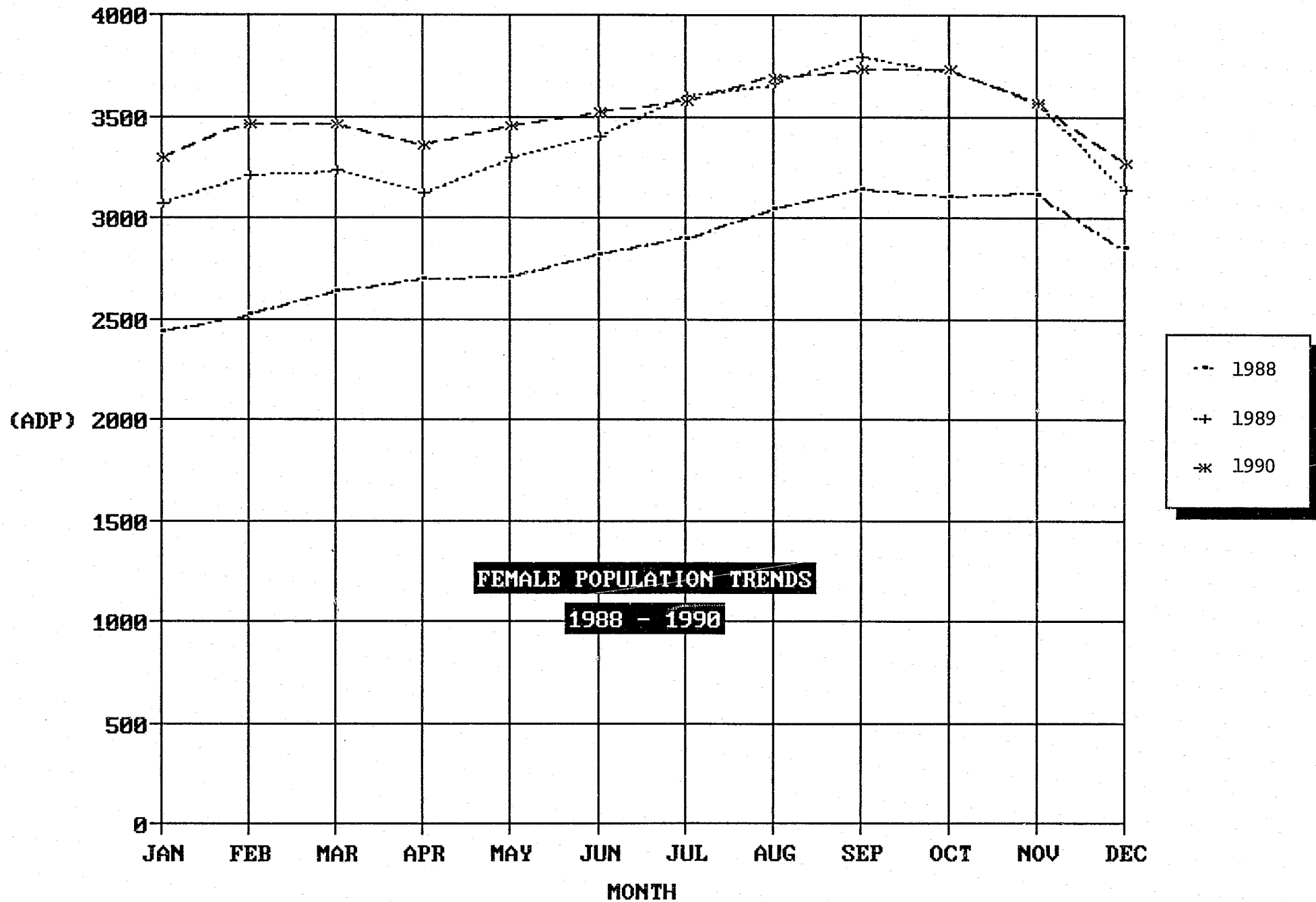
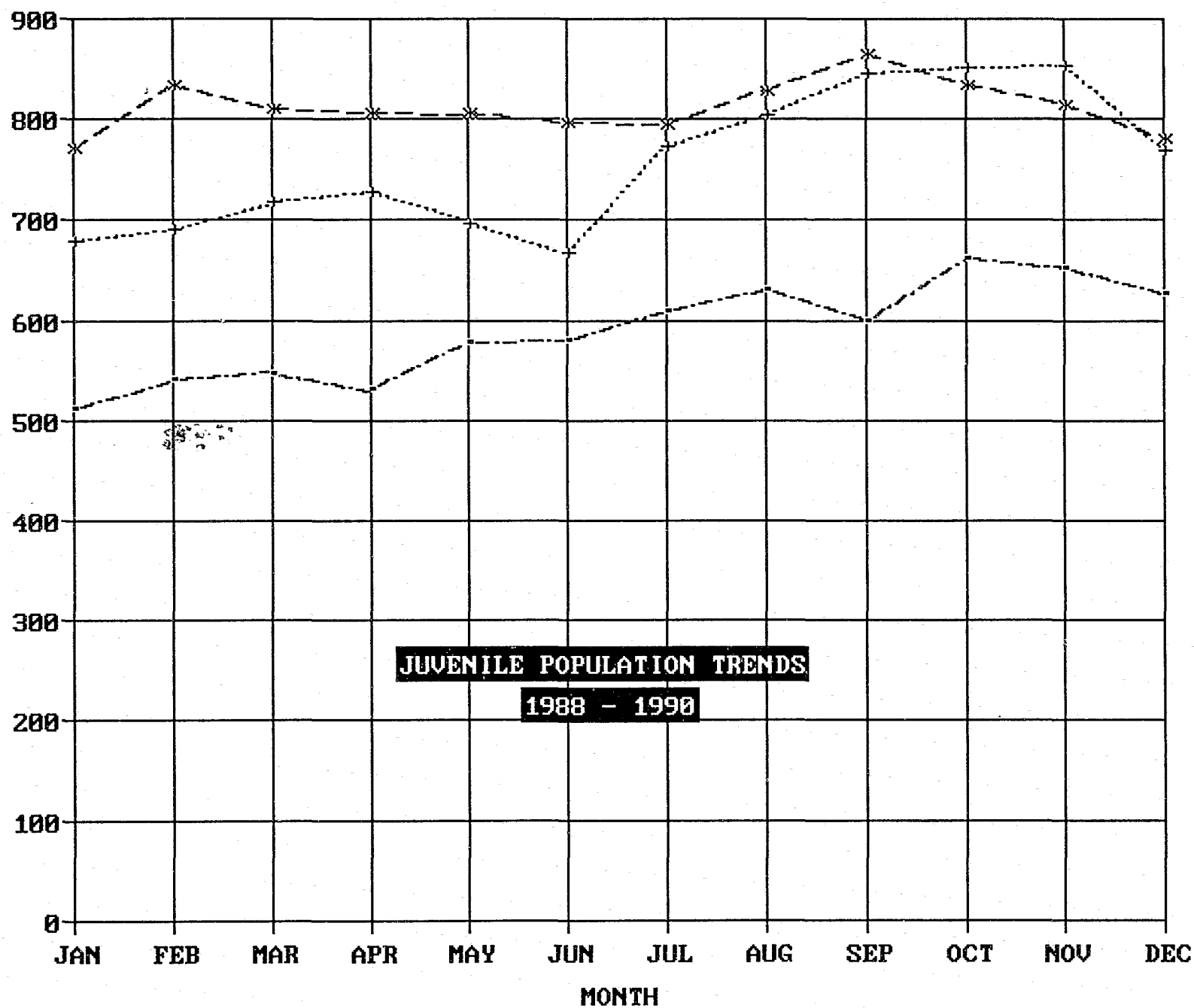

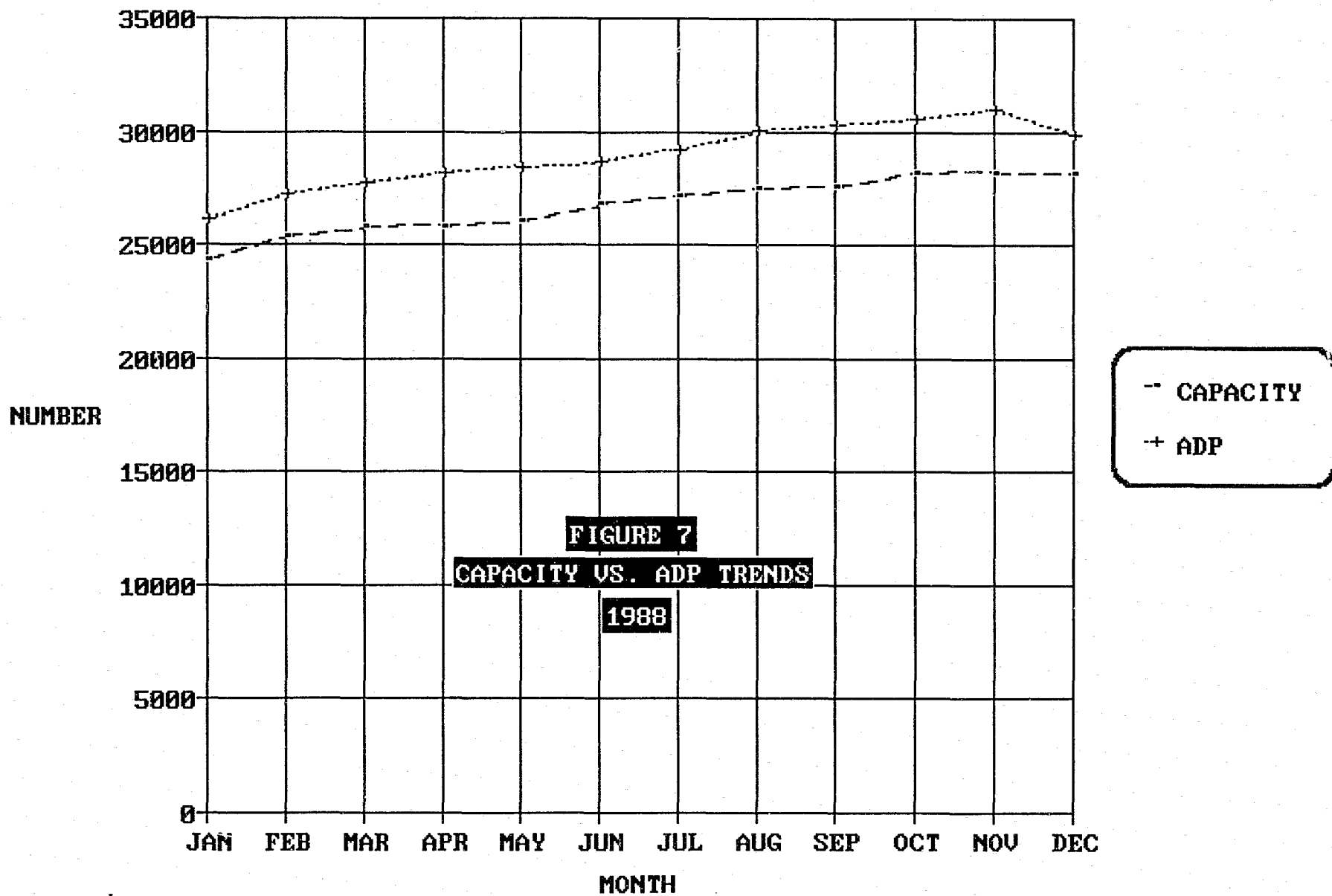

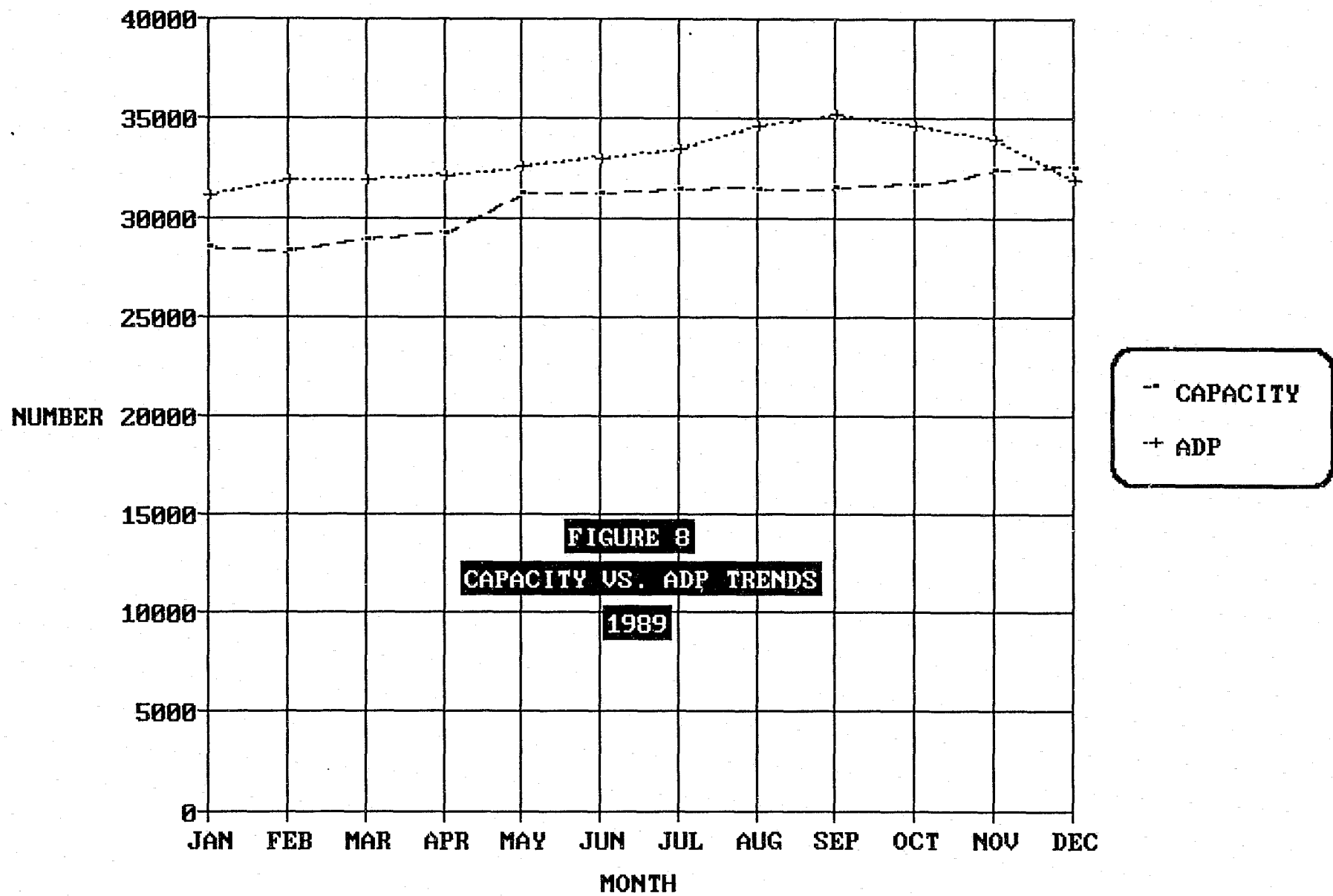

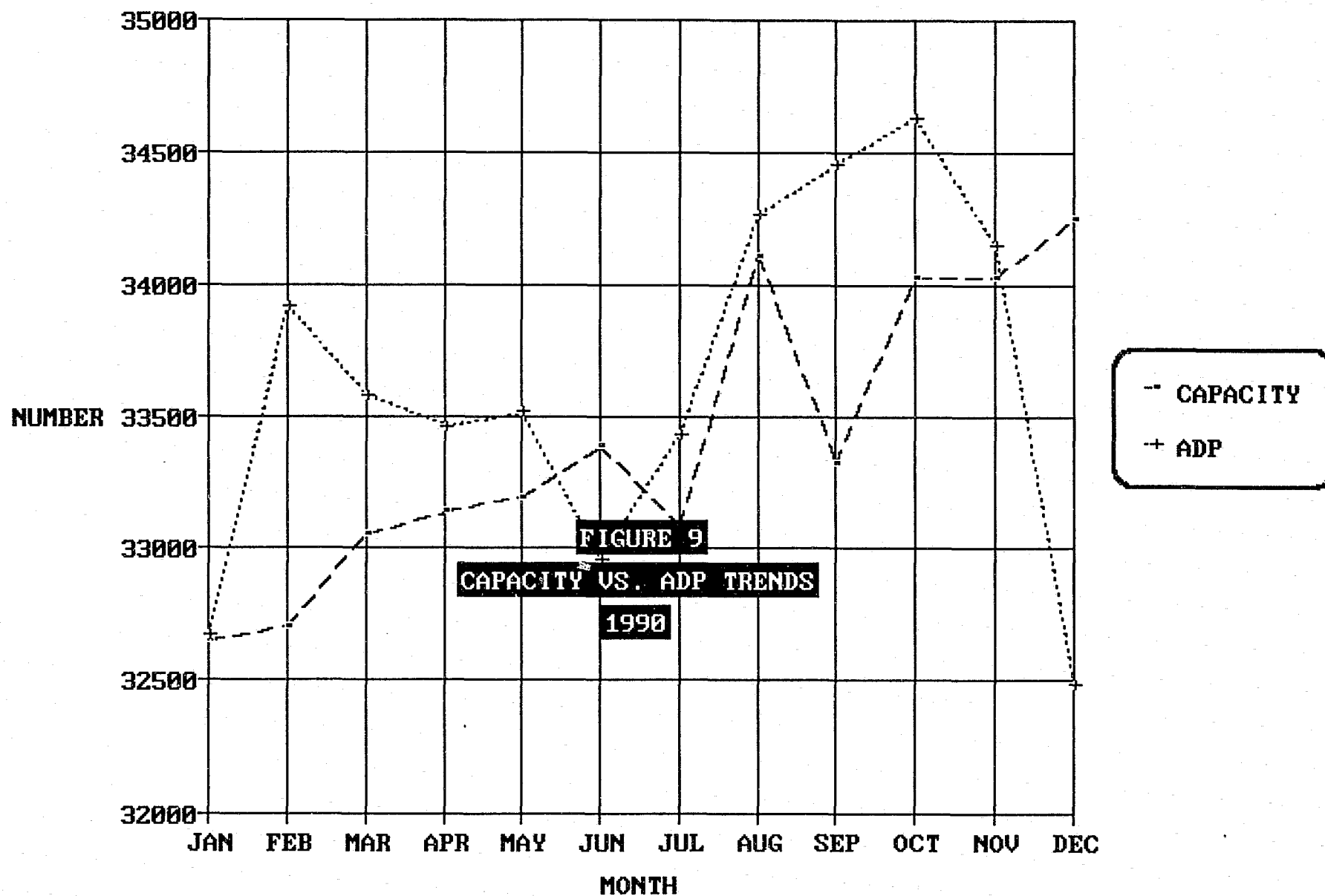
