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## Crime and Arrests in Wisconsin - 1990

### Introduction

This report, prepared by the Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance, Statistical Analysis Center (SAC), presents data on crime and arrests in Wisconsin during 1990. From 1970 through 1981 the state Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program, operated by the Crime Information Bureau of the Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ), collected, compiled, and reported crime and arrest data for Wisconsin. Beginning in 1971, DOJ also provided data to the national UCR system, a program of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Effective December 31, 1981, the state program operated by DOJ was discontinued. The 1981 data collected by DOJ were transmitted directly to the FBI, and the 1981 Wisconsin Crime and Arrests report, prepared by SAC, was based for the most part on information provided to SAC by the FBI. In 1982 and again in 1983 Wisconsin law enforcement agencies transmitted their UCR data directly to the FBI, but in addition, provided copies of the principal offense and arrest forms to the Statistical Analysis Center. As of 1984, Wisconsin resumed its status as part of the national UCR system. Since 1984, Wisconsin law enforcement agencies have provided complete UCR data to SAC, which in turn, has transmitted the data to the FBI via computer tape.

### The National UCR Program

The national Uniform Crime Reporting Program was initiated in 1930 by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). After soliciting input from law enforcement agencies throughout the country, an IACP committee developed uniform crime definitions and reporting procedures which could be used by law enforcement agencies in every state. The FBI was designated as the national clearinghouse for UCR data. The Committee on Uniform Crime Records of the IACP continues to serve the national program in an advisory capacity. In 1956, the National Sheriff's Association also established a Committee on Uniform Crime Reports to act as an advisory body to the program. The FBI regularly receives data on reported crime and arrests from law enforcement agencies throughout the country. The data are provided either by individual law enforcement agencies or by state UCR programs which collect and compile data for their states and convey the data to the FBI. From these data the FBI publishes its annual report, Crime in the United States.

### The Wisconsin UCR Program

The FBI recognized the Wisconsin Council on Criminal Justice (WCCJ) as the administrator of the Wisconsin State Uniform Crime Reporting Program effective January 1, 1984. It should be noted that the WCCJ was changed to the Office of Justice Assistance as of October 1, 1987. As indicated above, the original Wisconsin UCR program, operated by DOJ, was discontinued in 1981. The program operated by DOJ from 1970 through 1981 required that all law enforcement agencies submit UCR data either directly or through the county sheriff's office. It also required that DOJ submit the prescribed data to the FBI. DOJ expanded the national UCR program's classifications to collect more detailed and appropriate data on Wisconsin crime and arrests. From the statewide UCR data, DOJ published its annual report Wisconsin Crime and Arrests, as well as quarterly, semi-annual, and other summary reports.

In November 1981, the WCCJ received a grant from the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Statistics, to develop Wisconsin's Statistical Analysis Center. The SAC was mandated by executive order to collect and analyze criminal justice data, produce statistical reports on crime and the justice system, and promote development of criminal justice information systems. From 1981 through 1983, SAC assumed a substantial number of the functions of the state UCR program to meet the information needs of state and local criminal justice decision-makers, elected officials and interested citizens. Since January 1984, Wisconsin has been recognized officially by the FBI as having a State UCR Program and is again part of the national system of state UCR programs.

## Incident - Based Reporting (IBR)

For nearly sixty years the UCR Program remained virtually unchanged in terms of the amount and type of data collected and disseminated. By the 1980s it had become obvious that the nature of modern law enforcement record keeping had diminished the utility of the existing UCR system. As a result, the FBI initiated a thorough evaluation of the existing UCR system with the purpose of formulating a phased-in redesign effort to enable the UCR Program to meet the needs of law enforcement into the 21st century.

Based upon the recommendations of the redesign study, the FBI proceeded to develop a significantly revamped UCR system which includes the following elements:

- the addition of significant new offenses
- increased information of victims, offenders, arrestees, and characteristics of the offense
- improved quality control
- expanded user services

The major point of the revision is a change from a summary-based reporting program to an incident-based system in which information of each offense, offender, victim, and arrestee is linked by a common incident number.

Based upon the success of a pilot project in South Carolina, the FBI released the final data elements and offense specifications in July, 1988. At that time Wisconsin and other state programs began a careful implementation of the enhanced program. Several Wisconsin agencies began data submissions under the incident-based reporting format during the last quarter of 1990.

Due to the increased reporting requirements of the new program, both the FBI and the Wisconsin UCR Program are encouraging a phased-in transition where law enforcement agencies will be able to adopt the new program as they acquire the necessary data processing capabilities. It is anticipated that Wisconsin will be operating a dual collection program for the next decade, with some departments reporting under summary-based guidelines, while others with automated records systems will make the transition to an IBR system.

## Issues in Comparison of this Report with Earlier Reports


Care should be exercised in making comparisons of the data in this report with the data contained in previous annual reports. Adjustments may be required for the following reasons:

- Shifting of a law enforcement agency from one population category to another based on annual re-estimation of the jurisdiction's population.
- On occasion, the Federal Government designates an additional Wisconsin county as being included in a Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area. This would shift a Sheriff's Office from the Rural Areas category to the Suburban Sheriffs' group. (See footnote 5 on page 15 for a listing of Suburban Sheriffs' Offices.)
- Populations are estimated for non-census years. Rates for 1990 are calculated using 1990 census data with estimates published by the UCR Section of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- County totals shown in Tables 1-9 of this report are estimates which compensate for instances of missing data when appropriate. In the 1981 Wisconsin Crime and Arrests report, these totals were actual totals of data reported, even when data were missing. Thus, caution should be exercised in comparing county totals of 1981 with subsequent years.

## 1990 Crime and Arrest Facts at a Glance

- On the average, one Index Crime was reported every 2 minutes, 26 seconds in Wisconsin during 1990. (page 4)
- There were 216,424 serious crimes (Index Offenses) reported in 1990, an increase of 6.1 percent from the 1989 total. (page 6)
- The 1990 crime rate for Wisconsin was 4,424 serious crimes for each 100,000 residents. This figure is 24 percent lower than the national crime rate of 5,790 reported for 1989. (page 14)
- Overall, 23.4 percent of the Index crimes were cleared. (page 13)
- A total of 367,614 arrests were made in 1990. (page 9) Total adult arrests increased by 2.4 percent and juvenile arrests grew by 6.5 percent. (pages 7 & 8)
- Violent Index Crime increased by 19.8 percent in 1990 and has increased by 51.6 percent from 1980 to 1990. (pages 6 & 19)
- Over \$154,000,000 in property was stolen during 1990, a 21.6 percent increase from the more than \$124,000,000 in property stolen in 1989. (page 29)
- The 227 murders in 1990 represent the largest number reported since UCR figures have been compiled. (page 31)
- Over three-fourths of sexual assault victims were juveniles. (page 42)
- The number of robberies increased by 50.6 percent in 1990. Over 90 percent of this increase was reported from the City of Milwaukee. (page 50)
- The number of reported burglaries has decreased by 27.2 percent from 1980 to 1990. (pages 60 & 91)
- The average value stolen in thefts was \$303, a seven percent increase over the \$282 average value in 1989. (page 68)
- There were an estimated 20,378 motor vehicle thefts reported in 1990, a 26.2 percent increase from 1989. (page 72)
- The average loss in 1990 arsons was \$8,209, nearly a seventeen percent increase from the \$7,035 average in 1989. (page 80)
- There were major increases in certain Part II arrests including fraud (17 percent), curfew laws (14 percent), and vandalism (8 percent). (pages 82 to 85)
- Persons between 18 and 20 years of age accounted for nearly 57 percent of the 42,660 arrests for liquor law violations. (page 84)
- Three Wisconsin law enforcement officers were killed feloniously while in the performance of their duty. (page 95)
- There were 922 reported assaults on law enforcement officers; 97.4 percent of these were cleared by arrest. (page 95)

<sup>1</sup> The crime clock should be viewed with caution. Since it is the most aggregate representation of UCR data, it is designed to convey the annual reported crime experience by showing the relative frequency of Index Offense occurrence. This method of display does not imply a regularity in the commission of Index Offenses; rather it shows the ratios of crimes to fixed periods of time.

## An Overview of 1989 and 1990 Crime and Arrests in Wisconsin

The following tables and maps present an overview of 1989 and 1990 crime and arrests in Wisconsin. Table 1 shows that reported Index Offenses have increased by 6.1 percent from 1989. While reported violent offenses have increased by 19.8 percent from 1989, property offenses have increased by 5.3 percent. The overall increase in violent offenses is due to increases in each of the four violent offenses. Murder increased by 28.2 percent, from 177 to 227. Forcible rape increased by 2.5 percent, from 989 to 1,014. Robbery increased by 50.6 percent, from 3,660 to 5,514. Aggravated assault increased by 3.5 percent, from 5,987 to 6,197. It should be noted that the dramatic increases in reported murder and robbery were largely due to increases in the City of Milwaukee. Also, violent offenses constituted only 6 percent of Index Offenses for Wisconsin during 1990.

Property crimes comprise the balance of the Crime Index. The overall increase in reported property crimes from 1989 to 1990 was due to increases in each of the four property offenses except arson. Burglary increased by 3.0 percent, from 35,690 to 36,766. Theft increased by 3.6 percent, from 140,019 to 145,040. The most dramatic increase was for motor vehicle theft which increased by 26.2 percent, from 16,151 to 20,378. However, arson decreased by 4.2 percent, from 1,345 to 1,288.

The next three tables present a comparison of statewide arrests in 1989 and 1990. Adult arrests for total Index Offenses decreased by 2.0 percent, while juvenile arrests for total Index Offenses increased by 4.6 percent. Total arrests for Index Offenses, combining both adults and juveniles, increased by 0.7 percent. Juvenile arrests constituted 45.4 percent of all arrests for Index Offenses in 1989, compared to 43.7 percent in 1989. Total adult arrests rose by 2.4 percent, from 261,655 to 267,987, while total juvenile arrests increased by 6.5 percent, from 93,516 to 99,627. Total arrests for adults and juveniles combined increased by 3.5 percent from 355,172 in 1989 to 367,614 in 1990.

While juvenile arrests comprised 27.1 percent of all arrests for 1990, they comprised 45.4 percent of arrests for Index Offenses. Among the Index Offenses, juvenile arrests comprised 22.2 percent of all arrests for violent offenses and 48.5 percent of all arrests for property offenses.

Following the set of four tables are two maps showing rates of violent and property crime in each Wisconsin county for 1990. On each map, counties are ranked in four groups according to number of offenses per 100,000 population. The statewide rate, shown on each map, is based on the statewide number of offenses and population. This rate is within the fourth quartile for both maps because most of the highest crime rates are in those counties with largest populations.

An analysis of total Index Offenses, violent offenses, property offenses, and each separate offense appears in the following section of this report. The next section contains more detailed information on arrests for all UCR crime categories. Ten-year trends in offenses, offense rates, clearances, and arrest ratios are then presented, followed by data on law enforcement officers killed and assaulted. The final half of the book consists of a series of tables with individual agency data presented alphabetically by county. Tables include Index offenses, offense rates, clearance rates, property loss, arrests (both adult and juvenile), and law enforcement employees.




# VIOLENT CRIME IN WISCONSIN - 1990

## CRIME INDEX OFFENSES

Definition:<sup>1</sup> Crime Index Offenses are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Attempts are included (an attempted murder is classified as an aggravated assault).

### 1990 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 216,424 Crime Index Offenses reported during 1990, a 6.1 percent increase from 1989.
- One Index Offense was reported approximately every two minutes, 26 seconds during 1990.
- The most frequent months for Crime Index Offenses were July (20,833) and August (20,054), the least frequent was February (12,798). These high and low months were the same as in 1989.
- The Crime Index Offense rate per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was 4,424.2 in 1990, an increase of 5.4 percent from the 1989 rate of 4,195.2 per 100,000.
- The 1990 Crime Index Offense rate of 4,424.2 per 100,000 is 24 percent less than the 1989 rate of 5,789.7 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- In terms of the population groupings of Wisconsin jurisdictions, the larger the population category, the higher the rate of Index Offenses.
- Total offense rates increased for each population grouping of Wisconsin jurisdictions in 1990.
- Total Index Offenses have decreased by 4.4 percent between 1980 and 1990.
- An estimated total of 63,205 persons were arrested for Index Offenses in 1990, an increase of 0.7 percent. Of these, 54.6 percent were adults.
- Overall, 23.4 percent of Index Offenses were cleared in 1990. Clearance rates varied widely, however, from over 79 percent for murder to 15.6 percent for burglary. The overall 1990 clearance rate of 23.4 percent was somewhat less than the 1989 rate of 24.3 percent.





TOTAL INDEX OFFENSES - BY MONTH



### TOTAL CRIME RATES





## VIOLENT OFFENSES

Definition: Four Crime Index Offenses involve face-to-face confrontation between victim and perpetrator, and are referred to as violent offenses. These are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault.


### 1990 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 12,952 violent offenses reported during 1990, a 19.8 percent increase from 1989.
- Violent Index Offenses accounted for 6 percent of the total Crime Index in 1990.
- Approximately one violent offense was reported every 41 minutes during 1990.
- The most frequent month for violent crimes was July (1,367), the least frequent month was February (834). These high and low months were the same in 1989.
- The Violent Offense rate per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was 264.8 in 1990, an increase of 19.1 percent from the 1989 rate of 222.3 per 100,000.
- The 1990 Violent Offense rate of 264.8 per 100,000 is approximately 60 percent less than the 1989 rate of 663.1 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- Violent offense rates increased in all jurisdiction categories except cities with less than 10,000 residents and rural Sheriffs' Offices.
- Violent Index Offenses have increased 51.6 percent between 1980 and 1990.
- An estimated total of 7,593 persons were arrested for violent offenses in 1990. Nearly 78 percent of the 1990 arrests were adults.
- Overall, 52.8 percent of violent offenses were cleared in 1990, considerably less than the 59.9 percent clearance rate in 1989.



### VIOLENT OFFENSES - BY YEAR







## PROPERTY OFFENSES

Definition: Four Crime Index Offenses do not involve face-to-face confrontation between victim and perpetrator, and are referred to as property offenses. These offenses are burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson.


### 1990 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 203,472 property offenses reported in 1990, a 5.3 percent increase from 1989.
- Property Index Offenses accounted for 94 percent of the total Crime Index in 1990.
- Approximately one property offense was reported every two minutes, 35 seconds in Wisconsin during 1990.
- The most frequent months for property offenses were July (20,833) and August (20,914) while the least frequent month was February (12,111). These high and low months were the same as in 1989.
- The Property Offense rate per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was 4,159.5 in 1990, an increase of 4.7 percent from the 1989 rate of 3,972.8 per 100,000.
- The 1990 Property Offense rate of 4,159.5 per 100,000 is approximately 19 percent less than the 1989 rate of 5,126.6 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- Property offense rates increased in all jurisdictions except police agencies serving communities with between 50,000 and 250,000 residents.
- Property Index Offenses have decreased 6.6 percent between 1980 and 1990.
- An estimated total of 55,612 arrests were made for property offenses in 1990. Over 48 percent of those arrested were juveniles and nearly 74 percent of those arrested were White.
- Overall, 21.5 percent of property offenses were cleared in 1990, compared to a 22.3 percent clearance rate in 1989.
- During 1990 forty-two percent of property stolen was recovered. This figure is higher than the forty percent recovery rate in 1989.



PROPERTY OFFENSES - BY YEAR




PROPERTY OFFENSES - BY MONTH



## MURDER

Definition: Murder and nonnegligent manslaughter are the willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another. The classification of this offense, as for all other Crime Index Offenses, is based on police investigation as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury, or other judicial body. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide, or accident; justifiable homicides, which are the killings of felons by law enforcement officers in the line of duty or by private citizens during commission of the felony; and attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are classified as aggravated assaults.


### 1990 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 227 murders reported in 1990, a 22 percent increase from 1989. The 227 murders is the largest number reported since UCR figures were compiled.
- Murder accounted for 0.1 percent of the total Crime Index and 1.8 percent of all Violent Index Offenses.
- Approximately one murder was reported every 1 day and 15 hours during 1990.
- The most frequent months for murder were August, September, and October (26 each), the least frequent months were January, April, and May (13 each).
- The 1990 murder rate was 4.6 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents compared to 3.6 per 100,000 in 1989.
- The 1990 murder rate of 4.6 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 47 percent less than the 1989 rate of 8.7 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The murder rate increased in all law enforcement agency categories except for cities between 10,000 and 24,999 and suburban Sheriff's Offices.
- The volume of Wisconsin murders has increased by nearly 67 percent from 1980 to 1990.
- Firearms were involved in nearly 62 percent of 1990 murders, an increase from the 58 percent firearm involvement in 1988 murders.
- In those cases where the relationship of victim and offender was determined, the parties were known to each other in nearly 78 percent of 1990 murders.
- The average age of murder victims was 30.6 years, while the average age of known offenders was 26.6 years. The average offender age of 26.6 years in 1990 was considerably less than the average age of 29.3 years in 1989.
- An estimated 372 persons were arrested for murder in 1990 compared to 330 persons in 1989, an increase of 12.7 percent. Over ninety percent of those arrested in 1990 were adults and 70 percent were Black.
- When circumstances of the murder were known, 55 percent involved an argument.
- A minimum of nineteen percent of 1990 murders directly involved drugs or alcohol.
- The murder clearance rate was 79.3 percent in 1990. This figure is slightly less than the 81.8 percent clearance rate in 1989.



MURDER - BY YEAR




MURDER - BY MONTH



#### MURDER RATES







### MURDER - TYPE OF WEAPON, 1990




### MURDER - KNOWN RELATIONSHIP OF VICTIM TO OFFENDER, 1990


## SEXUAL ASSAULT AND FORCIBLE RAPE

Definition: Sexual assault is sexual contact or sexual intercourse with another person without consent of that person. Sexual assault is proscribed under Wisconsin statutes, but is not part of the Federal Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program. Forcible rape is part of the Crime Index and as such is reported as part of the Federal UCR Program. It is the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are excluded.



#### Sexual Assault - 1990 Summary Analysis

Information on sexual assault is vital to an understanding of crime trends in Wisconsin. Rape is no a legally meaningful category in this state. However, rape is part of the Crime Index and information on rape is vital to the national UCR program. Furthermore, many years of information on rape are available for Wisconsin, and current information on rape is valuable for purposes of comparison. Jurisdiction-by-jurisdiction listings for rape appear in many of the tables in this publication. This listing of rapes will continue in future years as long as rape continues to be part of the Crime Index.

Following are some highlights of the sexual assault figures presented on the following five pages.

- There were 6,366 sexual assaults reported during 1990, a 9.3 percent increase from the estimated 1989 total of 5,823.
- Approximately 16 percent of all sexual assaults were rapes. For victims over 16, the proportion of rapes was much higher, 34 percent.
- Nearly 75 percent of all sexual assault victims were juveniles. Almost 65 percent of the victims were 15 years old or less.
- Victim sex was 88 percent female, while offender sex was 96 percent male.
- Seventy-three percent of all sexual assaults were committed by family members or friends and acquaintances, while 12 percent were committed by strangers. For those sexual assaults that were rapes, over 56 percent were committed by family members or friends and acquaintances, and 23 percent by strangers.

## SEXUAL ASSAULT

Summary data on sexual assaults are presented in the following tables and graphs. In the tables below, sexual assaults are shown by degree for all victims, victims 15 and under, and for victims 16 and over. This is because the two most severe degrees of assault, first and second, may be so classified either by the nature of the assault or the age of the victim. Looking only at assaults of victims age 16 and over shows the distribution of assaults by degree based solely on the nature of the assault, not victim age. Most sexual assaults, even first and second degree assaults, are not rapes according to the Uniform Crime Reporting definition, and this also is shown in the table below.

Graphs showing the age and sex of victims and offenders, and relationship between victim and offender, are presented on subsequent pages. Data are also presented on arrests, victim injury, and weapons used in the commission of sexual assaults.



### AGE OF SEXUAL ASSAULT VICTIMS AND OFFENDERS, 1990








Victim Injury by Use of Weapon, 1990


Relationship of Assailant to Victim, 1990

## **ROBBERY**

Definition: Robbery is the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or putting the victim in fear.


### **1990 Summary Analysis**

- There were an estimated 5,514 robberies reported in 1990, a 50.6 percent increase since 1989. However, over 90 percent of this increase was reported from the City of Milwaukee.
- Robbery accounted for 2.5 percent of the total Crime Index and 42.6 percent of all Violent Index Offenses.
- Approximately one robbery was reported every one hour, 35 minutes in 1990.
- The most frequent month for robbery was December (625), the least frequent was March (289). The number of robberies was much higher in the second half of 1990.
- The 1990 robbery rate was 112.7 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, an increase of 49.7 percent from the 1989 rate of 75.3 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1990 robbery rate of 112.7 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was 52 percent less than the 1989 rate of 233 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The 1990 robbery rates were much greater for those agencies serving larger populations. Also, robbery rates increased sharply in most categories of law enforcement agencies in 1990.
- The number of estimated robberies has increased 66.5 percent from 1980 to 1990.
- Robberies carried out with firearms increased from 41 percent in 1989 to nearly 51 percent in 1990.
- While highway robberies accounted for nearly 60 percent of all 1990 Wisconsin robberies, they made up 51 percent of the total value stolen in all robberies.
- The total dollar value stolen in 1990 robberies was \$2,685,793; this represents a twenty percent increase over the \$2,246,288 in property stolen in 1989.
- The average amount stolen in a 1990 robbery was \$481. This figure is nearly 22 percent less than the average value of \$614 in 1989.
- An estimated total of 1,928 persons were arrested for robbery in 1990. Nearly 75 percent of those arrested were Black. In addition, nearly 67 percent were adults.
- The robbery clearance rate was 27.1 percent in 1990, a decrease from the 1989 clearance rate of 32.8 percent.



ROBBERY - BY YEAR




ROBBERY - MONTH



ROBBERY - TYPE OF WEAPON, 1990



## **AGGRAVATED ASSAULT**

**Definition:** Aggravated assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Attempts are included, since it is not necessary that an injury results when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed.


### **1990 Summary Analysis**

- There were an estimated 6,197 aggravated assaults reported in 1990, a 3.5 percent increase from 1989.
- Aggravated assault accounted for 2.9 percent of the total Crime Index and 47.8 percent of all violent Index Offenses.
- Approximately one aggravated assault was reported every hour and 25 minutes during 1990.
- The most frequent month for aggravated assault was July (689), the least frequent was February (390).
- The 1990 aggravated assault rate was 126.7 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents. This figure represents an increase of 2.9 percent from the 1989 rate of 123.1 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1990 aggravated assault rate of 126.7 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 64 percent less than the 1989 rate of 383.4 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The 1990 aggravated assault rate increased in all categories of jurisdictions except cities with less than 10,000 residents and suburban Sheriffs' Offices.
- The number of estimated aggravated assaults has increased 40.7 percent from 1980 to 1990. (Note: The volume of reported aggravated assault has changed dramatically since 1984, as shown in the graph on the following page. Many law enforcement agencies in Wisconsin have changed their policies regarding domestic violence in recent years; these changes have affected the level of reported aggravated assault. Also, major changes in Wisconsin statutes governing domestic violence likely affected aggravated assault figures in 1989.)
- The proportion of aggravated assaults involving the use of a firearm has remained fairly stable during the past five years.
- An estimated total of 4,657 persons were arrested for aggravated assaults in 1990; over 85 percent of those arrested were adults.
- The 1990 total clearance rate for aggravated assault was 71.9 percent, a slight decrease from the 1989 clearance rate of 74.6 percent.
- There were 36,342 "Other Assualts, - Simple, Not Aggravated" reported in 1990; this figure is 5.3 percent greater than the 34,507 simple assaults reported in 1989.
- The clearance rate for simple assault was 79 percent in 1990, higher than the 74.9 percent clearance rate in 1989.



#### AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - BY YEAR




#### AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - BY MONTH

#### AGGRAVATED ASSAULT RATES





## BURGLARY

Definition: Burglary is defined as the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required to classify an offense as burglary. Burglary in this program is categorized into three subclassifications: forcible entry, unlawful entry where no force is used, and attempted forcible entry.


### 1990 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 36,766 burglaries reported in 1990, a 3 percent increase from 1989.
- Burglary accounted for 17.5 percent of the total Crime Index and 18.1 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- Approximately one burglary was reported every 14 minutes, 18 seconds during 1990.
- The most frequent month for burglary was August (3,592), while the least frequent month was February (2,446). These high and low months were identical to those in 1989.
- The 1990 burglary rate was 751.6 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents. This figure is 2.4 percent greater than the 1989 rate of 733.9 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1990 burglary rate of 751.6 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 41 percent less than the 1989 rate of 1,276.3 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The 1990 burglary rates increased for all population groupings except for police agencies serving cities with more than 50,000 residents and those with between 5,000 and 9,999 residents.
- The number of estimated burglaries has decreased 27.2 percent from 1980 to 1990.
- The proportions showing type of entry in burglaries remained virtually unchanged from 1989 to 1990.
- As in previous years, residential burglaries made up nearly two-thirds of all burglaries, both in terms of volume and value of property stolen.
- The average value of property stolen in a 1990 burglary was \$801. This figure is 12.3 percent greater than the 1989 average figure of \$713.
- An estimated total of 6,567 persons were arrested for burglary in 1990. Nearly 80 percent of those arrested were White and slightly over half were juveniles.
- The burglary clearance rate was 15.6 percent in 1990, a figure virtually identical to the 1989 clearance rate of 15.7 percent.



### BURGLARY - BY YEAR







## THEFT

Definition: Theft is the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. It includes crimes such as shoplifting, pocket-picking, purse-snatching, thefts from motor vehicles, thefts of motor vehicle parts and accessories, bicycle thefts, etc., in which no use of force, violence, or fraud occurs. In the Uniform Crime Reporting program, this crime category does not include embezzlement, "con" games, forgery, and worthless checks. Motor vehicle theft is also excluded from this category for crime reporting purposes inasmuch as it is a separate Crime Index Offense.


### 1990 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 145,040 thefts reported in 1990, a 3.6 percent increase from 1989.
- Theft accounted for 67 percent of the total Crime Index and 71.3 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- One theft was reported approximately every three minutes, 37 seconds during 1990.
- The most frequent month for theft was August (14,104), while the least frequent month was February (9,358). The high and low volume months were identical in 1989.
- The 1990 theft rate was 2,965 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, an increase of 3.6 percent from the 1989 rate of 2,879.2 per 100,000.
- The 1990 theft rate of 2,965 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 6 percent less than the 1989 rate of 3,171.3 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- Theft rates increased in all jurisdictions except those agencies serving cities with more than 250,000 residents.
- The number of estimated thefts has decreased 5.8 percent from 1980 to 1990.
- The average value stolen per theft during 1990 was \$303, a figure over seven percent higher than the \$282 average in 1989.
- The total value stolen in 1990 thefts was \$43,982,579. This figure is 11.4 percent greater than the \$39,481,189 stolen in 1989 thefts.
- An estimated total of 43,633 persons were arrested for theft in 1990; over thirty percent of those arrested were female.
- The theft clearance rate was 23.3 percent in 1990, virtually identical to the 1989 figure of 23.5.



**THEFT - BY YEAR**




**THEFT - BY MONTH**



## **MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT**

**Definition:** Motor vehicle theft is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. This definition excludes the taking of a motor vehicle for temporary use by those persons having lawful access.


### **1990 Summary Analysis**

- There were an estimated 20,378 motor vehicle thefts reported in 1990, a 26.2 percent increase from 1989.
- Motor vehicle thefts accounted for 9.4 percent of the total Crime Index and 10 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- One motor vehicle theft was reported approximately every 25 minutes, 48 seconds in 1990.
- The most frequent month for motor vehicle theft was October (2,125), the least frequent month was February (1,209).
- The 1990 motor vehicle theft rate was 416.6 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, a 25.4 percent increase from the 1989 rate of 332.1 per 100,000.
- The 1990 motor vehicle theft rate of 416.6 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 34 percent less than the 1989 rate of 630.4 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The motor vehicle theft rate in 1990 increased in all population categories, except for those police departments serving cities with between 50,000 and 250,000 residents and those with between 5,000 and 9,999 residents.
- The number of estimated motor vehicle thefts has increased 77.5 percent from 1980 to 1990.
- The proportion of motor vehicle thefts involving an auto increased from 83.6 percent in 1989 to 85.5 percent in 1990.
- Over 68 percent of the value of stolen motor vehicles was recovered during 1990, somewhat less than the 70.8 percent recovery rate in 1989.
- Nearly sixty-three percent of those arrested for motor vehicle theft in 1990 were juveniles.
- An estimated total of 4,902 persons were arrested for motor vehicle theft during 1990; this figure is about one percent less than the number arrested in 1989.
- The motor vehicle theft clearance rate was 18.9 percent in 1990, considerably less than the 25.8 percent clearance rate in 1989.



**MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT - BY YEAR**




**MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT - BY MONTH**

#### MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT RATES



## ARSON

Definition: Arson is defined as any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc. Only fires determined through investigation to have been willfully or maliciously set are classified as arsons. Fires of suspicious or unknown origins are excluded.


### 1990 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 1,288 arsons reported in 1990, a 4.2 percent increase from 1989.
- Arson accounted for 0.6 percent of the total Crime Index and 0.6 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- One arson was reported approximately every 6 hours and 48 minutes during 1990.
- The 1990 arson rate was 26.3 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, a 5 percent decrease from the 1989 rate of 27.7 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1990 arson rate of 26.3 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 46 percent less than the 1989 rate of 48.7 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The arson rate decreased for all population categories except for those police agencies serving cities with between 50,000 and 250,00 residents and in both suburban and rural Sheriffs' Offices.
- The total estimated loss from arson was \$10,573,107 in 1990 with an average loss figure of \$8,209. Both figures were somewhat greater than those in 1989.
- The number of estimated arsons has declined 32.4 percent from 1980 to 1990.
- An estimated total of 480 persons were arrested for arson in 1990. Over sixty-four percent of those arrested were juveniles and over 80 percent were White.
- The arson clearance rate was 25.3 percent in 1989, considerably less than the 30.6 percent clearance rate in 1989.



ARSON - BY YEAR




ARSON - BY MONTH

## Arrest Summary for Selected Non-Index Offenses

### Simple Assault

Definition: Simple assault is an assault or an attempted assault where no weapon is used and which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

- There were an estimated 26,346 simple assault arrests in 1990, representing a 4 percent increase when compared to 1989.
- Of the total, 83 percent were adults and 17 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 83 percent and females 17 percent of those arrested for simple assault.

### Vandalism

Definition: Vandalism is defined as the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or person having custody or control.

- There were an estimated 12,292 vandalism arrests in 1990, representing an 8 percent increase when compared to 1989.
- Of the total, 55 percent were adults and 45 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 88 percent and females 12 percent of those arrested for vandalism.

### Weapons Violations

Definition: These offenses include all the violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, and attempts.

- There were an estimated 6,233 arrests reported for weapons violations in 1990, representing a 5 percent decrease when compared to 1989.
- Of the total, 75 percent were adults and 25 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 90 percent and females 10 percent of those arrested for weapons violations.

### Drug Abuse Violations

Definition: Drug abuse violations are defined as the unlawful sale/manufacture, possession/use of the narcotics and drugs listed below.

- a. Opium or Cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine).
- b. Marijuana, hashish, etc.
- c. Synthetic narcotics -- manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (demerol, methadones).
- d. Other -- dangerous non-narcotic drugs (amphetamines, barbituates, hallucinogens).
- There were an estimated 9,444 arrests reported for drug abuse violations in 1990, a 7 percent decrease compared to 1989.
- Adults accounted for 90 percent and juveniles 10 percent of the arrests for drug law violations.
- Males accounted for 85 percent of the arrests and females accounted for the remaining 15 percent.
- Arrests for possession/use of drugs accounted 67 percent of the arrests while the remaining 33 percent were for the sale/manufacture of drugs.
- Arrests for opium/cocaine accounted for 29 percent of all drug arrests, marijuana arrests accounted for 64 percent of all drug arrests, arrests for synthetic narcotics accounted for 3 percent of all drug arrests, and other dangerous non-narcotic drugs made up 4 percent of all drug arrests.

### Fraud

Definition: Included in this category are fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. This category includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- There were an estimated 8,614 arrests reported for fraud in 1990, representing a 17 percent increase when compared to 1989.
- Of the total, 97 percent were adults and 3 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 50 percent and females 50 percent of those arrested for fraud.

### Driving Under the Influence

Definition: The offense of driving under the influence is defined as the driving or operating of any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of alcohol or narcotics.

- There were an estimated 35,826 arrests reported for driving under the influence in 1990, representing a 5 percent increase when compared to 1989.
- Of the total, 98 percent were adults and 2 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 85 percent and females 15 percent of those arrested for driving under the influence.

### Disorderly Conduct

Definition: In this category are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace (disorderly person).

- There were an estimated 52,200 arrests reported for disorderly conduct in 1990, representing a 3 percent increase when compared to 1989.
- Adults accounted for 75 percent of the arrests for disorderly conduct, while juveniles accounted for the remaining 25 percent.
- Males accounted for 81 percent and females 19 percent of those arrested for disorderly conduct.

### Liquor Law Violations

Definition: Included in this category are state or local liquor law violations, with the exception of "driving under the influence".

- There were an estimated 42,660 arrests reported for liquor law violations in 1990, representing a 1 percent increase when compared to 1989.
- Of the total, 70 percent were adults and 30 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 72 percent and females 28 percent of those arrested for liquor law violations.
- Persons between 18 and 20 years of age accounted for nearly 57 percent of all persons arrested for liquor law violations.

### Curfew Violations

Definition: In this category are juvenile arrests made for violations of local curfew ordinances.

- There were an estimated 6,124 arrests reported for curfew violations in 1990, representing a 14 percent increase when compared to 1989.
- Males accounted for 75 percent and females 25 percent of those arrested for curfew violations.

### Runaways

Definition: This category is limited to juveniles taken into protective custody, under provision of local statutes, as runaways.

- There were an estimated 10,411 runaway arrests reported in 1990, representing a 6 percent increase when compared to 1989.
- Males accounted for 46 percent and females 54 percent of those arrested for runaway violations.

## Statewide Arrests - 1990

The next three tables present statewide figures for each arrest category. As with other state and county level data presented in this report, these tables present estimated data. Note that the state totals in these listings may differ slightly from the corresponding totals shown in Tables 5 through 8. This is because of small differences in the procedure used to make estimates of missing data in the two types of tables. The various offenses chosen to show the highest percentage of gender or racial categories were selected according to two criteria - the highest percentage shown and the total number of arrests for that offense

### Statewide Adult Arrests - by Gender

This table shows adults arrested for each offense category by the gender of those arrested. For total adult arrests, 80.5 percent were male and 19.5 percent were female. Arrest categories which had the highest male percentage included Sex Offenses (96%), Burglary (94%), Robbery (94%), Weapons Laws (90%), Vandalism (87%), and Aggravated Assault (86%). Arrest categories which had the highest female percentage included Prostitution (71%), Fraud (50%), Forgery (40%), Theft (33%), and Liquor Laws (25%), Family Offenses (23%).

### Statewide Juvenile Arrests - by Gender

This table shows juveniles arrested for each offense category by the gender of those arrested. For total juvenile arrests, 73.6 percent were male and 26.4 percent were female. Arrest categories which had the highest male percentage included Robbery (92%), Burglary (91%), Vandalism (90%), Weapons Laws (89%), Motor Vehicle Theft (87%), and Drug Law Violations (86%). Arrest categories which had the highest female percentage included Runaways (54%), Fraud (41%), Liquor Laws (36%), and Forgery (31%).

### Statewide Arrests - by Race

This table shows persons arrested for each offense category by the race of those arrested. For total arrests, 78.9 percent were White, 18.9 percent were Black, 1.8 percent were American Indian, and 0.3 percent were Asian. Arrest categories which had the highest White percentage included Liquor Laws (95%), Driving Under the Influence (92%), Runaway Violations (91%), and Fraud (83%). Arrest categories which had the highest Black percentage included Robbery (75%), Prostitution (62%), Motor Vehicle Theft (42%), and Weapons Laws (39%).

## Summary of Offense and Arrest Trends: 1980 - 1990

The following four tables present statewide data on: (1) the number of Index Offenses, (2) offense rates for Index Offenses, (3) clearance rates for Index Offenses, and (4) the ratio of arrests to offenses for Index Offenses for each year from 1980 through 1990. Each table shows the percent change from 1980 to 1990.

The total number of known Index Offenses in Wisconsin increased slightly in 1981, declined through 1985, rose in 1986 and 1987, decreased in 1988, and increased in both 1989 and 1990 (see graph, page 14). The number of Index Offenses decreased by 4.4 percent for the decade, from 226,505 in 1980 to 216,424 in 1990. The 8.8 percent decrease in offense rates for the decade is greater than the decrease in number of offenses, because the population of the state increased during this period.

The number of violent offenses increased by 51.6 percent for the decade, from 8,546 in 1980 to 12,952 in 1990. However, the number of property offenses decreased by 6.6 percent for the decade, from 217,959 to 203,472. The contrasting patterns in property and violent crime are made clear in the graphs on pages 20 and 26.

Overall, arrest ratios have increased by over 29 percent over the past decade, indicating that during this time arrests have increased more rapidly than offenses. However, in terms of specific offenses, this is not true of robbery, burglary, and motor vehicle theft. For these three offenses, arrests have increased less rapidly than offenses during the decade.

The clearance rate for total Index Offenses has increased by over 15 percent since 1980. While, clearance rates for total violent crimes decreased, clearance rates for total property crimes have increased. Among the violent crimes, clearance rates increased during the decade for forcible rape and aggravated assault. However, clearance rates for murder and robbery have decreased. Among the property offenses, clearance rates have increased for theft while they have decreased for burglary, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

### Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted


The following tables present statewide information on law enforcement officers killed or assaulted during 1990. During 1990, three Wisconsin law enforcement officers were killed feloniously while in the performance of their duty.

There were 922 reported assaults on police officers in 1990, a 1.1 percent decrease compared to the 932 reported assaults in 1989. Of the 922 reported assaults, 898 or 97.4 percent were cleared. Nearly two-thirds of assaults occurred during the nighttime hours from 8 p.m. through 4 a.m. Injuries resulted from 56 percent of 1990 assaults, an increase over the 50 percent of 1989 assaults which resulted in an injury. Over 92 percent of assaults involved personal weapons (hands, feet or fists) rather than firearms, knives or other dangerous weapons. In addition, this section shows both the type of assignment and type of activity when the assault occurred together with the number of assaults on law enforcement officers since 1984.

Personal Injury by Type of Weapon - 1990



ASSAULTS BY TYPE OF ASSIGNMENT



The percentage of officers assaulted while responding to a disturbance call decreased from 39.4 percent in 1989 to 34.5 percent in 1990.

The number of officers assaulted in Wisconsin has increased by 28.7 percent from 1984 (715 assaults) to 1990 (922 assaults). However, the number of officers assaulted has remained very stable since 1988.

## Index Offenses by County and Law Enforcement Agency - 1990

### Table 1. Number of Crime Index Offenses and Percent Change, 1989 - 1990

Table 1 shows Index Offenses for 1989 and 1990 and percent changes from 1989 to 1990 for each jurisdiction. The four violent Index Offenses are totaled to equal violent crimes, and the four property Index Offenses are totaled to equal property crimes. The Crime Index is the sum of all eight offenses.

In Table 1 the number of months of data reported for each jurisdiction is listed. This information is vital to the interpretation of the table, since the data presented are the reported data at the jurisdiction level, even when fewer than 12 months of data were available. Twelve months of data were reported by 288 of the 293 law enforcement agencies. Four jurisdictions which began reporting UCR data in 1990 reported between 3 and 8 months of figures, and one agency failed to report any data during 1990.

Data for a jurisdiction which reported for fewer than 12 months in 1990 cannot be directly compared with that jurisdiction's 1989 data or with data for other jurisdictions. Thus, no percent changes are shown for these jurisdictions. However, an approximate comparison can be made using an estimate of the 12 months total. This estimate can be calculated by multiplying the available data by a correction factor which is obtained by dividing 12 by the number of months reported. (For example if nine months of data are available for an agency, the data can be estimated for 12 months by multiplying the data by 12/9 or 1.33.) However, the accuracy of this approximation diminishes when only a few months of data are available. It should be applied with great caution when less than six months of data are available. This method should also be applied with caution when the number of offenses involved is small. For example, if jurisdiction A had 72 thefts in nine months and prorated them to 96 ( $12/9 \times 72 = 96$ ) thefts for the year, while jurisdiction B had three thefts in nine months and prorated them to four thefts for the year, the estimate for jurisdiction A would be more reliable because it had a higher number of offenses.

The percent change in the number of Index Offenses reported from 1989 to 1990 is shown in Table 1 for each jurisdiction for which it was possible to calculate the change. The percent change is calculated using the formula:

$$\frac{(\text{Offenses in 1990}) - (\text{Offenses in 1989})}{\text{Offenses in 1989}} \times 100 = \text{Percent Change}$$

If the number of offenses for 1989 was zero, no percent change was calculated since percent change cannot be calculated from a zero base. In addition, as stated above, no percent change was calculated for a jurisdiction unless 12 months of data were available for both 1989 and 1990.

Table 1 shows county totals for each offense and percent change from 1989 to 1990. For those counties in which not every jurisdiction reported 12 months of data for 1989 or 1990, the county totals shown are estimates. The estimated county totals were obtained by summing the estimated annual totals for each jurisdiction within the county. These estimated annual totals were obtained as described above, by multiplying the available data by a correction factor for jurisdictions with four months or more of 1990 data. When less than three months of data were present, a different method of estimation was used. For these jurisdictions, the estimate used was the latest year of complete data. When estimates are used for county totals, the totals are so labeled in Table 1 (e.g., the notation "(EST)" follows the total for Dane County).

In addition, there were five new UCR reporters during 1990. These are Pulaski PD (Brown County), Cross Plains PD (Dane County), UW - Platteville PD (Grant County), Hurley PD (Iron County), and Arcadia PD (Trempealeau County). Each of these county headings is marked by an asterisk in Table 1. Also, for each of these agencies, only 1990 data are printed since comparable 1989 figures were not available.

At the end of Table 1, statewide totals of reported offenses in each category and estimates of the actual statewide totals are shown. The statewide estimates were obtained by summing the estimated offenses for each jurisdiction.

**Table 2. Offense Rates per 100,000 Population for Index Offenses, 1990**

Table 2 presents offense rates per 100,000 population for Index Offenses for each jurisdiction. The populations shown in this table are estimates published by the UCR Section of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The population shown for each county Sheriff's Office is the total population of the county minus the populations of any municipalities in the county for which UCR data were reported separately. The rates shown in Table 2 are derived by taking the number of reported offenses, shown in Table 1, dividing by the population of the jurisdiction, shown in Table 2, and multiplying by 100,000. These rates permit comparisons among jurisdictions of different sizes. Offense rates for agencies with 0 permanent residents (e.g., UW Campus agencies, State Patrol or DNR) are not calculated.

As discussed in connection with Table 1, 12 months of data were available for over 98 percent of jurisdictions. Since offense rates based on less than 12 months of data would be misleading, Table 2 presents rates only for those jurisdictions which reported 12 months of data. The countywide and statewide rates shown in Table 2 are based on estimated numbers of offenses when necessary, as described in connection with Table 1.

It should be noted that offenses per 100,000 presented in Table 2 do not represent a projection of crime levels in various locales. Rather, offense rates are used to enable one to compare jurisdictions of varying size. However, two points should be kept in mind when analyzing the offense rates in Table 2. First, offense rates for jurisdictions with large numbers of temporary residents (i.e., tourists), such as the Police Departments of Lake Delton, Minocqua, and Wisconsin Dells, are misleading since only permanent residents are included in offense rate calculations. Second, jurisdictions with a large proportion of non-residential crime targets such as the Town of Madison often show inflated crime rates.

Each year when Crime in Wisconsin is published many entities including news media, tourism agencies, and others with an interest in crime compile rankings of cities and counties based on their Crime Index numbers. This simplistic and incomplete analysis often creates improper perceptions which adversely affect cities and counties along with their residents. Assessing criminality and law enforcement's response from jurisdiction to jurisdiction must encompass many elements other than the number or rate of Index Crimes. The transience of the population, its racial and ethnic makeup, its age and sex structure, education levels, and prevalent family structure are all key factors in assessing and better understanding the crime issue. Attitudes of the citizens toward crime and their crime reporting practices, especially concerning more minor offenses, also have an impact on the volume of crimes known to the police. This report provides a statewide view of crime contributed by state and local law enforcement agencies. Population size is the only correlate of crime utilized in this publication. While the other factors noted above are of equal concern, no attempt is made to relate them to the crime data presented. The reader is, therefore, cautioned against comparing statistical data of individual reporting units from cities, counties, or colleges and universities solely on the basis of their population coverage.

### Table 3. Total Clearance Rates for Index Offenses, 1990

Table 3 presents total clearance rates by offense and jurisdiction. In Table 3, the various clearance rates are the number of clearances, divided by the number of offenses and multiplied by 100. That is, clearances are presented as a percentage of reported offenses. Note that no clearance rate can be calculated for an offense category if there are no 1990 offenses reported, even though clearances may be reported from prior years. When no offenses have been reported, a blank appears in Table 3. When a clearance rate of zero is shown it means that at least one offense occurred, but that there were no clearances. Clearance rates greater than 100.0 percent are possible (e.g., the aggravated assault clearance rate of 200.0 percent for Waterloo) when there are clearances of offenses reported in earlier years.

Since the clearance rate is the ratio of clearances to reported offenses, it is not particularly sensitive to the problems of missing data described above for Tables 1 and 2. It is reasonable to assume that this ratio would be fairly constant as long as the number of months of data available was reasonably large. Thus, clearance rates have been presented in Table 3 for all jurisdictions for which six months or more of clearance data were present. There were three jurisdictions reporting fewer than six months of data which were excluded from the table. An asterisk (\*) is printed next to the name of each of these jurisdictions. Countywide and statewide rates shown in Table 3 are based on estimated clearances and offenses, calculated as described above in connection with Table 1.

### Table 4. Property Stolen, Recovered and Damaged by Arson, 1990

Table 4 shows the value of property stolen, recovered and damaged by arson for each county and law enforcement agency reporting UCR data. All values shown in Table 4 are reported data; no estimates are performed on partial or missing figures. The property figures include property stolen or recovered during 1990. In some instances, property recovered during 1990 was stolen in a previous year.

Prior to the 1988 Annual Crime and Arrests Report, Table 4 presented the percentage of total clearances involving only juveniles. However, both because this measure minimized juvenile involvement in clearances and a relative lack of interest in these data, this table was replaced in the 1988 UCR report. However, juvenile clearance figures for individual agencies are available upon request.

## Arrests by County and Law Enforcement Agency - 1990

Tables 5 through 8 present data on adults and juveniles arrested by Wisconsin law enforcement agencies during 1990. The tables present the total number of arrests, the total number of Part I and Part II arrests, and the number of arrests for each Part I and Part II offense separately, for each reporting agency. Information on adults is presented in Tables 5 and 7, information on juveniles in Tables 6 and 8.

As indicated in the introduction to this report, data are not available for all 12 months of 1990 for every reporting agency. In the following tables, as in Tables 1 through 4, the number of months of data available for each reporting agency is listed. Although only the known data are presented for each jurisdiction, an estimated yearly total can be calculated for any jurisdiction with less than 12 months of data reported. The estimated totals can be calculated by multiplying the number in the table by a correction factor which can be obtained by dividing 12 by the number of months of data reported. (Thus, if 11 months of data are presented for an agency, for example, the agency's figures should be multiplied by 12/11, or 1.09). As is the case in other tables, the more months of data reported, the more accurate will be the yearly estimates. Estimates based on a small number of months of reported data should be interpreted cautiously. This estimation procedure should also be applied with caution when the number of arrests is small.

The following tables show, for each county, county total arrests for each offense. For those counties in which not every jurisdiction reported 12 months of data for 1990, the county totals shown are estimates. These estimates were obtained as in Table 1, by calculating and summing the estimated annual total for each jurisdiction within the county. As in the previous table, when estimates are used for county totals, the notation "(EST)" follows the "County Total" label.

At the end of each table there are statewide totals of the reported arrests in each category and estimates of the actual statewide totals. The estimated totals were obtained by calculating the estimated yearly totals, as described above, for each reporting agency with less than 12 months of data and summing the estimates for these agencies and the reported figures for the other agencies.

These tables also contain population figures for each jurisdiction. Tables 5 and 7 contain adult population figures. Tables 6 and 8 contain juvenile population figures. These adult and juvenile figures were derived from estimates published by the UCR Section of the Federal Bureau of Investigation using adult and juvenile population proportions provided in the 1990 census by the Department of Administration. The population figures presented for county sheriffs' offices are the county populations minus the populations of any municipalities in the county for which UCR data are reported separately. These figures can be used to calculate arrest rates for any of the jurisdictions in the State. Arrest rates are calculated by dividing the number of arrests by the relevant population and multiplying the result by 100,000. This rate per 100,000 is comparable across jurisdictions of varying sizes.

## Appendix I

### Glossary

ADULT: A person 18 years of age or older.

ARREST: Taking into physical or other legal custody for commission of an offense in the local reporting jurisdiction. An arrest has occurred when a law enforcement officer detains a person with the intention of seeking charges against them for a specific offense and a record is made of the detention (see p. 60, Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook). Arrests for all criminal offenses are scored. Arrests for ordinance violations are included. Arrests for traffic offenses, with the exception of driving under the influence of intoxicants, are not scored. Included are those persons released without having been formally charged. (See Juvenile Arrest.)

ARREST RATE: The number of arrests for a particular offense, or group of offenses, per 100,000 population. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Arrests} \times 100,000}{\text{Population}}$$

Arrest rates per population unit are employed to remove the effects of differing sizes of law enforcement service areas, permitting the examination of arrest on an equalized population basis. "Per 100,000 population" is generally utilized to preclude rates for infrequently occurring arrests from being expressed as unmeaningfully small numbers.

CLEARANCE: An offense is cleared, or solved for crime reporting purposes, when at least one person is arrested, charged with commission of the offense and turned over to the court for prosecution. Provision is also made for clearance in certain "exceptional" situations (see p. 42, Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook).

CLEARANCE RATE (TOTAL): The number of clearances divided by the total number of offenses, expressed as a percent. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Clearances} \times 100\%}{\text{Number of Offenses}}$$

Offenses are reported as they become known to law enforcement agencies. Clearances are scored as they are made. Therefore, it is possible for the clearance rate to exceed 100 percent for a time period. Both clearances by arrest and exceptional clearances are included.

CRIME FACTORS: Historically, the causes and origins of crime have been the subjects of investigation by many disciplines. No definitive conclusions have yet been reached; many factors affect the volume and type of crime that occurs from place to place. Caution should, therefore, be exercised in comparing statistical data of individual communities or counties solely on the basis of their populations.

More appropriate use can be made of the statistics by relating the experience of a particular area to group averages, or by employing a ranking procedure, and encompassing both crime and other socio-economic information.

**CRIME INDEX:** The total of eight serious offenses used as an indicator of crime. Crime Index offenses are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft and arson. The first four of these are referred to as violent crimes, and the latter four as property crimes. Definitions of each of these offenses are given in the section "Statewide Index Offenses and Arrests."

**JUVENILE:** A person 17 years of age or younger.

**JUVENILE ARREST:** For purposes of Uniform Crime Reporting, a juvenile should be counted as "arrested" when the circumstances are such that if he or she were an adult, an arrest would be tallied (see Uniform Crime Reporting Manual, p. 60). All violations by juveniles where some police or other official action is taken beyond a mere admonishment, including status offenses, are included. Law enforcement contacts with juveniles where no offense has been committed are not scored as arrests. Juveniles taken into custody for their own protection, such as in neglect cases, are not scored as being arrested if they have not committed an offense. (See Arrest)

**JUVENILE CRIME:** The only measure of juvenile crime available through Uniform Crime Reporting is the number of juvenile arrests (number, rate, and percentage of total arrests).

**OFFENSE RATE:** The number of known offenses per 100,000 population. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Offenses}}{\text{Population}} \times 100,000$$

Offense rates per population unit are employed to remove the effect of differing sizes of law enforcement service areas, permitting the examination of reported crime on an equalized population basis. "Per 100,000 population" is generally utilized to preclude the rates for infrequently occurring offenses from being expressed as unmeaningfully small numbers.

More specific crime or victimization rate measures may also be utilized, such as residential burglaries per 100,000 residences, motor vehicle thefts per 100,000 registered vehicles, or forcible rapes per 100,000 females in typically victimized age groups.

**PART I OFFENSES:** The eight index crimes in addition to manslaughter by negligence.

**PART II OFFENSES:** All crime categories not already designated as Part I, excluding all traffic violations except Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated.

**PERCENT CHANGE:** The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Value in Current Period} - \text{Value in Base Period}}{\text{Value in Base Period}} \times 100\%$$

**POPULATION:** Totals as well as juvenile and adult subtotals are based on Official Population Estimates for 1990, Federal Bureau of Investigation.

**STATUS OFFENSES:** Offenses which are only offenses when they are committed by a juvenile. For purposes of the Wisconsin UCR Program, status offenses consist of curfew violations, runaways, and liquor law violations.

## Appendix II

### The Use of UCR Statistics by Local Agencies

#### A. INTRODUCTION

The graphs and tables which follow illustrate some of the potential uses of the UCR report. The examples in this report are drawn from special reports done for individual agencies during the past year. These special reports usually summarize UCR data for two to five years and are generally used for budgetary purposes or are included in the annual report of a law enforcement agency.

The various tables in the second half of the annual report contain various crime/arrest figures for all reporting jurisdictions together with statewide figures. In addition, offense rate figures for violent crime (page 21 of the 1990 Annual UCR Report) and property crime (page 27) allow law enforcement agencies to compare their crime rates with agencies of similar size throughout Wisconsin.

Several points should be noted with regard to the use of UCR figures --

1 - Crime and arrest figures from past years can be obtained from earlier UCR reports or by contacting Tom Eversen at the Wisconsin UCR Program in Madison (608) 266-7644. These figures are available as far back as 1969. However, specific crime and arrest details may not be consistent for each year.

2 - Numbers and percentage changes can vary widely over time either due to the relatively small numbers involved (e.g., murder or arson) or changes in state statutes (e.g., increase in the legal drinking age).

3 - **Care should be taken when comparing the figures of one agency to those of another.** For example, a large number of tourists (Lake Delton or Wisconsin Dells) can inflate the crime rate. Also, individual agency policies or increased enforcement of certain local ordinances (e.g., curfew laws) may affect the number of arrests.

Note: The jurisdiction tables from the Annual UCR Report are capitalized in bold (e.g., **TABLE 1**).

#### B. OFFENSES REPORTED

**TABLE 1** in the 1990 Annual Report (pages 102 to 117) can be used to obtain two years of crime figures. Numbers from earlier years can be obtained from previous UCR reports.

##### Example 1 - Crime Totals (2 years)

Table A compares the number of Part I crimes reported to the Milton Police Department during 1989 and 1990.

Total crime increased by 4.5 percent during 1990 in Milton, largely due to an increase in the number of reported thefts. The decrease in reported motor vehicle theft also should be noted.

Example 2 - Crime Totals (5 years)

Table B shows the number of Index offenses (also known as Part I crimes) reported to the University of Wisconsin - Whitewater Police from 1986 through 1990. Again, figures for years prior to 1990 can be obtained either from earlier editions of the Annual Crime and Arrest Report or by contacting the Wisconsin UCR Program.


While reported Index crime increased by 6.3% during the five year period, virtually all of the increase was due to increases in reported burglary and theft.

## C. OFFENSE RATES

TABLE 2 in the 1990 Annual Report (pages 118 to 125) is used to obtain the offense rate per 100,000 residents for an agency. Crime rates per 100,000 are used to permit the comparison of jurisdictions with different population levels. Figures for categories of jurisdictions of similar size can be seen on pages 21 (Violent Crime) and page 27 (Property Crime) of the 1990 Annual Report.

### Example 1 - Offense Rates (Violent Crime)

Graph 1 presents information on violent offense rates per 100,000 residents for the Tomah Police Department and compares these rates to the average rate for all Police Departments in Wisconsin serving populations of between 5,000 and 9,999 residents. The figures include the five years from 1986 through 1990




During the past three years the Violent offense rates in Tomah have been considerably less than the combined rates for other Wisconsin cities of similar size.

### Example 2 - Offense Rates (Property Crime)

Graph 2 presents similar information on property crime offense rates for the Sheboygan Police Department. Again, the property offense rates are shown for the past five years and include the average rates for cities of comparable size.

Graph 2: Property Offense Rates



The Property crime offense rates in Sheboygan have been somewhat greater than those of other Wisconsin cities of similar size during each of the past four years.

#### D. CLEARANCES

TABLE 3 (pages 126 to 133) in the 1990 Annual Report shows clearance rates for individual jurisdictions. It should be noted that clearance rates are usually lower in Sheriff's Offices than in Police Departments because of the relative isolation of many of the crime targets in more rural areas.

##### Example 1 - Clearance Rates

Information in Table C shows the clearance rates for the North Fond du Lac Police Department for Total Index, Violent Index, and Property Index crimes for the past five years. Statewide clearance rates for 1990 are included for purposes of comparison.

The various clearance rates for the North Fond du Lac Police Department have remained fairly consistent and have been somewhat greater than the Statewide clearance rates.

## E. PROPERTY LOST AND RECOVERED

**TABLE 4** (pages 134 to 141) in the 1990 Annual Report shows the total value of property stolen and recovered for each jurisdiction together with the total value of property lost in arson cases. More detailed information on the various types of property can be obtained from the State UCR Program. The percentage of property recovered often depends upon the type of property stolen. For example, certain property such as motor vehicles are much more likely to be recovered than either jewelry or currency.

### Example 1 - Property Stolen and Recovered

Table D shows the value of property stolen and recovered in Weston during 1990. As noted above, this more detailed property information can be obtained from the State UCR Program.

The 1990 overall property recovery rate of 43.3 percent in Weston was greater than both the estimated Statewide recovery rate of 42 percent during all of 1990 and the Weston PD recovery rate of 37.2 percent in 1989. Also, the \$188,438 in property stolen in 1990 was nearly 51 percent greater than the \$124,900 in property stolen during 1989.


## F. ARRESTS

Adult arrests are shown in **TABLE 5** (pages 144 to 151) and **TABLE 7** (pages 160 to 175) of the 1990 Annual Report. Juvenile arrest figures are shown in **TABLE 6** (pages 152 to 159) and **TABLE 8** (pages 176 to 191) of the 1990 Annual Report. **TABLES 5** and **6** present arrest totals for all Part I Crimes (eight Index crimes plus negligent manslaughter) in addition to the number of total arrests and Part II arrests. **TABLES 7** and **8** present arrest totals for each Part II offense together with more detailed totals on drug-related arrests.

### Example 1 - Adult Arrests (5 years)

Graph 3 shows the total number of adult arrests made by the New Berlin Police Department from 1986 through 1990.

Graph 3: Adult Arrests




The total number of adult arrests increased by over fifty-four percent from 1986 to 1990. Major reasons for the increase include an increased number of adults arrested for liquor law violations (17 to 211), disorderly conduct (32 to 61), family offenses (0 to 48), and drug law violations (29 to 39).

#### Example 2 - Juvenile Arrests (1 year)

Graph 4 shows the most common juvenile arrests made by the Douglas County Sheriff's Office in 1990.

Graph 4: Juvenile Arrests - 1990



Total juvenile arrests decreased by 9.8% from 153 in 1989 to 138 during 1990. There were decreases in arrests of juveniles for burglary (19 to 13) and disorderly conduct (7 to 1). However, arrests for liquor law violations increased from 7 to 16. The three juvenile drug arrests included one for sale of marijuana and two for possession - 1 marijuana and 1 other dangerous drug.

## G. SUMMARY

These pages have presented examples of how figures from the Annual UCR Report can be used by individual agencies. Additional possibilities for analysis include more detailed breakdowns of burglary and theft targets, weapon usage in violent crime, drug arrest details (see TABLES 7 and 8), and law enforcement strength (see TABLE 9 of the 1990 Annual Report). In addition, arrest rates (both adult and juvenile) can be obtained in the same way that offense rates are calculated in TABLE 2. Instructions for obtaining arrest and offense rates are presented in Appendix I (Glossary) of this report.

Also, the State UCR Program can provide graphical presentation of crime and arrest figures if an individual agency lacks the capability. In addition, various crime figures can be presented on either a county-wide or regional basis.
