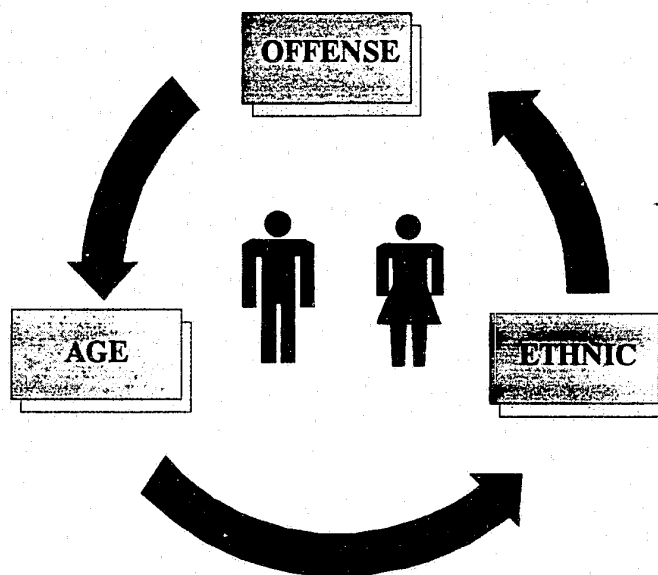

Summary

This report presents selected characteristics of the 87,297 inmates who were in Department of Corrections' institutions on December 31, 1989. The contents of this report are as follows:

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The characteristics contained in the Tables are based on the entire institution population which includes felons, civil narcotic addicts and others. The other category includes county diagnostic cases, Youth Authority, federal and other state prisoners and safekeepers.

Cases with incomplete or missing data are included in the tables, but are excluded from the total in order to compute a more accurate percentage.

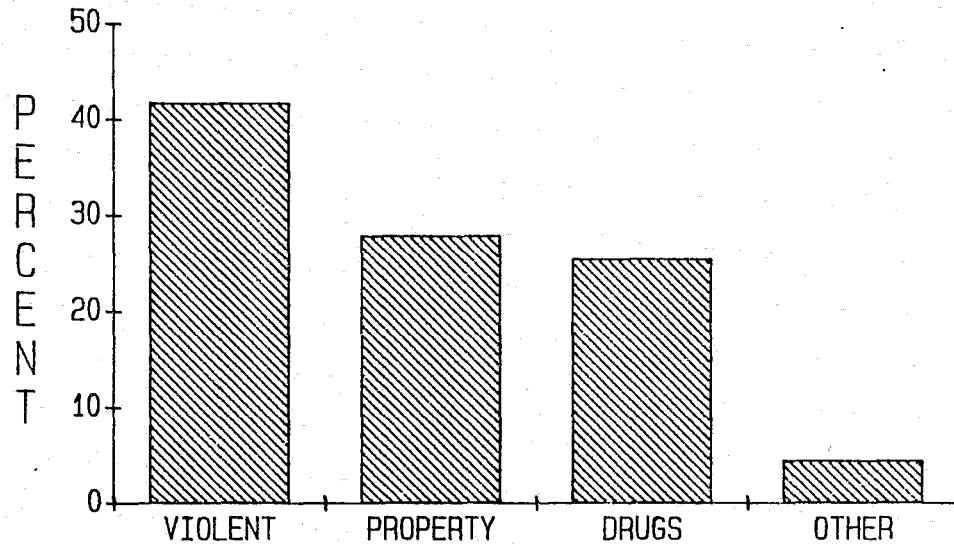

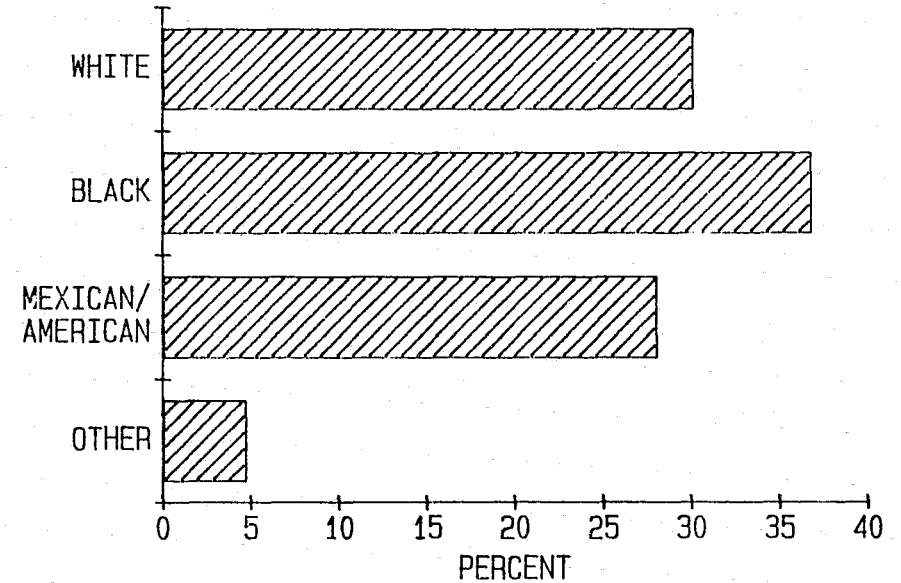

CHARACTERISTICS OF POPULATION IN CALIFORNIA STATE PRISON DECEMBER 31, 1989

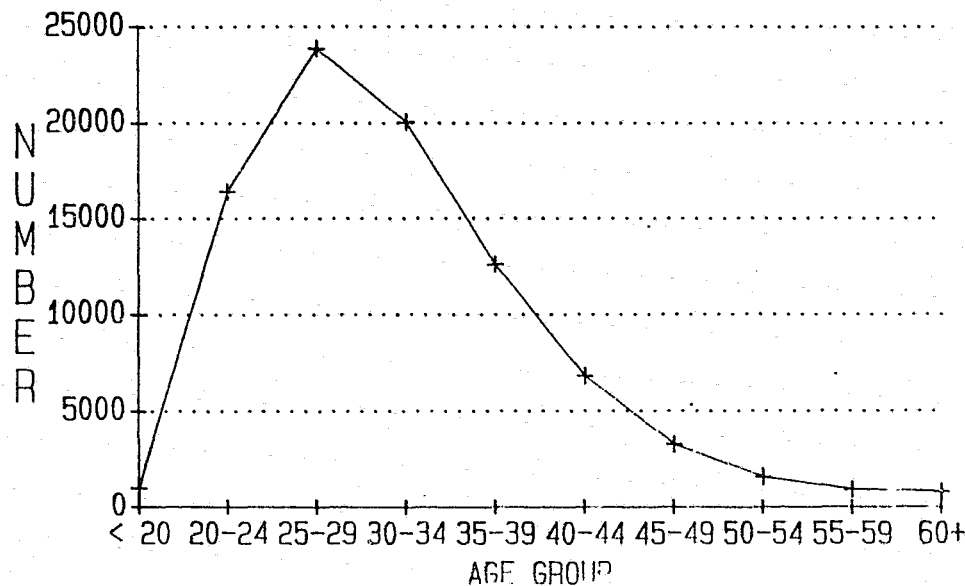
TYPE OF OFFENSE



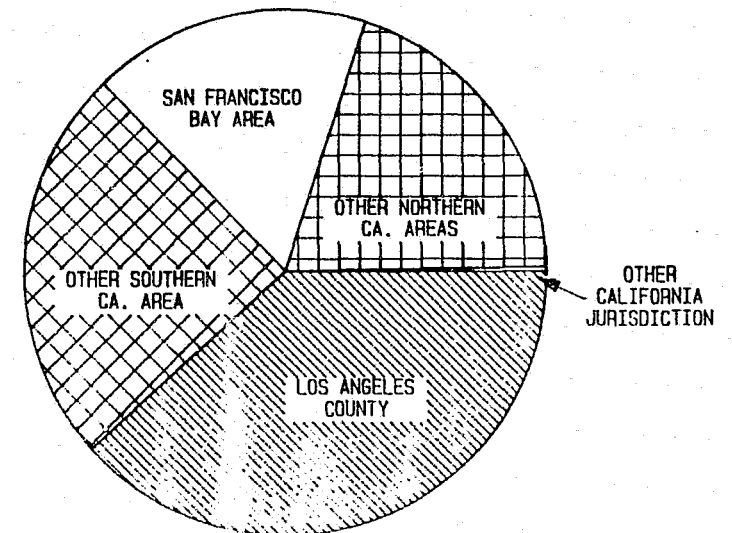
ETHNIC STATUS
