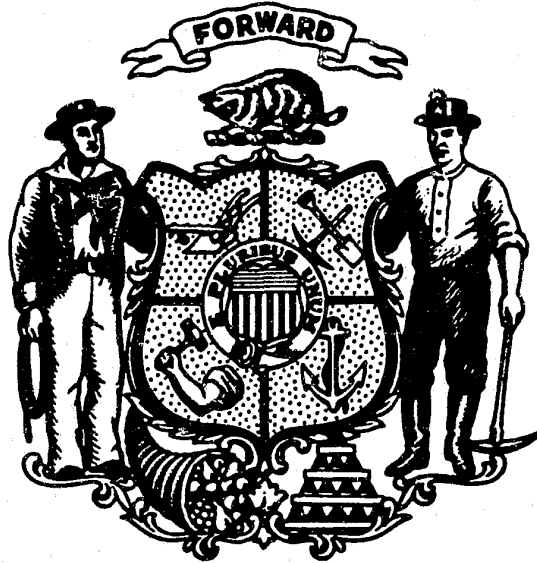

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CALENDAR YEAR SUMMARY REPORT
OF POPULATION MOVEMENT
1990

The aim of this publication is to present the reader with summary information about the volume and movement of offenders under the jurisdiction of Wisconsin's Department of Corrections during calendar year 1990. The Department of Corrections, which has the responsibility for the operation of correctional institutions for adult offenders and for the supervision of offenders on probation or parole in the community, came into being on January 1, 1990.

H I G H L I G H T S I N S T I T U T I O N P O P U L A T I O N S

- * Institution population data includes information about offenders serving Wisconsin sentences in Wisconsin, federal correctional facilities, institutions in other states, and Wisconsin county jails. It does not include males confined at the Wisconsin Resource Center, an institution operated by the Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Care and Treatment Facilities.

- * A total of 7,085 offenders were confined in Wisconsin's correctional facilities on December 31, 1990. This is an increase of 9.9 percent over the 6,445 offenders in residence on January 1, 1990.

- * The number of males confined in correctional institutions increased from 6,164 on January 1, 1990 to 6,746 at the end of the year; an increase of 9.4 percent. Female populations rose from 281 to 339, an increase of 20.6 percent during the same time period.

- * The average daily population of institutionalized offenders rose steadily from 5,184 in 1986 to 6,717 in 1990; an increase of 29.6 percent.

C O M M U N I T Y S E R V I C E C A S E S

- * Community supervision cases, those offenders supervised in the community under the conditions of probation or parole, rose from 30,155 at the start to 34,314 at the end of calendar year 1990; an increase of 13.8 percent.

- * Probation cases rose from 25,975 on January 1, to 29,958 on December 31, 1990; an increase of 15.3 percent. Parole cases increased 4.2 percent from 4,180 at the start to 4,356 at the end of the calendar year.

- * The number of community supervision cases on absconder status dropped from 4,639 on January 1, 1990 to 3,844 on December 31, 1990; a decrease of 17.1 percent.

- * Probation supervision average daily populations rose 34.6 percent from 20,956 in calendar year 1986 to 28,209 in calendar year 1990.
(See Table A.)
- * The average daily populations of offenders under parole supervision rose from 3,688 in calendar year 1986 to 4,438 in calendar year 1990; an increase of 20.3 percent.
(See Table A.)
- * During calendar year 1986 an average daily population of 30,339 offenders was under community supervision. This average rose steadily during the five-year period reaching a five-year high 39,364 in calendar year 1990; an increase of 29.7 percent.

- * The largest increase in parole supervision average daily population occurred between 1989 when the average daily population of parole cases was 3,945 and 1990 when an average daily population of 4,438 cases, an increase of 13.1 percent, was reported.

- * The average daily population of juvenile offenders for whom the Department of Corrections was providing aftercare services increased 20.8 percent from 169 in 1989 to 204 in calendar year 1990.
