
#### INTRODUCTION

The following report is the forty-sixth in a series of Juvenile Court Statistics and the 13th published under the auspices of the Division of Youth Services as mandated by Missouri Statute RSMo section 219.016.3. This report presents the summary statistics of the Juvenile Court System for calendar year 1990 in Missouri.

In 1990, 53,500 children were referred to one of the 44 juvenile courts in Missouri. These 53,500 children had a total of 77,800 referrals to court. The same child may be referred more than one time during the reporting year. Circuits are requested to maintain a separate identification number for each juvenile and use this same number each time the juvenile is referred.

Graph 1 shows the sex and race break down of all children referred. Males accounted for 65 percent of the youths referred; females for 35 percent. Whites were underrepresented in juvenile court by their proportion of the population. White youth accounted for 84 percent of Missouri's under 18 population, but only 68 percent of the juvenile court population. Likewise, blacks were overrepresented. Black youth accounted for only 13.6 percent of the state's juvenile population, but were nearly 30 percent of juvenile court youth.

Most analyses in this report are at the level of referral. The numbers represent not individual children, but separate referrals to the court. A referral has been defined for reporting circuits as "any action involving a juvenile which results in a determination, finding or outcome and a written record maintained in the juvenile's name. Multiple allegations reported at the time of, or discovered in the course of, a referral shall be reported as additional violations and not as additional referrals."

These referrals break down into four broad categories - Law Violations, Status Offenses, Abuse/Neglect/Custody, and Administrative. **Law Violations** are any breaking of the Missouri Criminal Code. **Status Offenses** are those offenses that are only violations if committed by a juvenile. This includes such things as truancy and running away from home. The category of **Abuse/Neglect/Custody** reports Missouri children who were victims of abuse or neglect and children involved in custody disputes, transfers or terminations. The **Administrative** category includes several types of referrals. Many are Permanency Planning cases, where a referral is generated for each meeting regarding placement of children in foster care. Administrative referrals other than Permanency Planning range from probation violations to courtesy supervision.

Table 1 shows the break down of all referrals into these four categories, with a historical overview of the past ten years. Law Violation referrals were by far the largest category of referrals in 1990, representing 50 percent of all referrals to the system. Total referrals to the system were up only six percent over 1989. The Law Violation category increased by five percent. The Status offense category decreased by 22 cases. Abuse/Neglect/Custody referrals increased by seven percent over 1989. The Administrative category shows a 14 percent increase, although all of this increase is due to more circuits reporting Permanency Planning cases this year than last. If Permanency Planning is not included, the category shows a three percent decrease.

Each reporting category will be examined in detail in a separate chapter of this report. Chapter One presents analysis of the Juvenile Court System as a whole. Law Violation referrals are covered in Chapter Two, Status Offense referrals in Chapter Three. Abuse/Neglect/Custody referrals are discussed in Chapter Four and Administrative referrals in Chapter Five.

#### CHAPTER ONE - JUVENILE COURT OVERVIEW

Referrals to the juvenile court can come from many sources. Most law violation referrals came from law enforcement. A large proportion of Abuse/Neglect referrals were initiated by the Division of Family Services. Table 2 shows the source of all referrals broken down by referral type.

Boys and girls show different patterns of referrals to the juvenile system. Tables 3 and 4 illustrate how boys were much more likely to be referred for law violations. For girls, the three non-Law categories accounted for 70 percent of all referrals. These three categories for boys were only 40 percent of all referrals.

Table 5 reflects the number of referrals per juvenile during this reporting year. The largest number of referrals for any one juvenile was 28. Most circuits were very near the average of 1.45 referrals per juvenile, although circuits 4, 33 and 41 were approaching two referrals for each juvenile reported.

The definition of a referral included the words "action resulting in a determination or outcome." The possible determinations or outcomes fall into two categories: those which were handled **formally** with petition to the court and those which were adjusted **informally**. The formal dispositions that can occur are:

**True Out-of-Home** The allegation is found true and the youth is placed out of home. Placement may range from a relative or foster home to commitment to Division of Youth Services.

**True In-home** The allegation is found true and the youth receives services in his/her own home.

**True No services** The allegation is found true, but no services are provided.

Not True The allegation is found not true.

**Motion to Dismiss** The court sustains a motion to dismiss and the case is closed.

**Dismiss for Certification** The court sustains a motion to dismiss, and the case is transferred to adult court.

The informal dispositions that can occur are:

**Adjust without Supervision** Involves no more than one face-to-face contact with the juvenile and results in the giving of advice, counsel or a verbal warning.

**Adjust with Supervision** Involves supervision by either verbal or written agreement and/or restitution or community service.

**Adjust - No action** No action is taken by the juvenile office other than the collection of information.


**Transfer to Other Juvenile Court** Jurisdiction over the youth is transferred to another juvenile court.

**Transfer to Other Agency** The youth's case (records, files, etc.) is turned over to another agency.


Referral Rejected No reason is found to sustain the referral.

Findings for 1990 referrals are shown in Graph 2. All referrals are included except for Permanency Planning cases, which do not have an outcome. More than three-quarters (75.8%) of referrals were informally disposed. The largest single category of outcomes was informal adjustment without supervision, accounting for over one-fourth of total referrals. Only 24.2 percent of all referrals were formally adjudicated by a court. A formal adjudication is necessary to place a child out-of-home or to transfer a youth to adult court.

Outcomes of All Referrals




A total of 5,270 referrals received out-of-home placements in 1990. Abuse/Neglect/Custody referrals accounted for nearly half of out-of-home placements. Almost half of out-of-home placements were to Division of Family Services. Another 20 percent of the placements were to Division of Youth Services. The other 30 percent of the placements were divided among other public and private agencies, court residential care and placement with a relative. Graph 3 details where children were placed.



In-home services were provided for 17,336 referrals. More than one provider of services can be listed on each referral, and a total of 19,322 service providers were reported. In-home services can be either ordered by the court or provided informally by court personnel. A break down of in-home service providers is outlined in Graph 4. Nearly three-fourths (74 %) of in-home services were provided directly by the Juvenile Court System. Another 12 percent of services were provided by the Division of Family Services.

There were 240 referrals dismissed to allow certification to Adult Court. Because of the way referrals are processed, these 240 referrals represent only 165 individuals. Juveniles certified to adult court were overwhelmingly male. Only two females were certified in 1990. Table 6 shows the 165 juveniles by age and race.


At the time of a referral, a juvenile may be held awaiting a determination. Two types of facilities are used for such placement; secure and non-secure. In 1990, 13,189 cases or 17 percent of all referrals were held prior to hearing. Of those held, 57 percent were held in secure detention, 44 percent in non-secure placement. These numbers add to more than 100 percent because 148 juveniles were held in both secure and non-secure placement before a hearing. Those held in secure detention were most likely male law violators. Those held in non-secure facilities were most likely Abuse/Neglect victims; about evenly divided between males and females. A break down by category of referral and sex is provided in Table 7.



For those held in non-secure facilities, there are several types of facilities in which they may be held. The largest number of children (67%) were held in Foster Homes while awaiting a hearing or determination of outcome. Graph 5 shows how many juveniles were held in each type of facility. Graph 6 shows who operated these facilities.

Non-Secure Placements




#### CHAPTER TWO LAW VIOLATION REFERRALS

Law violation referrals comprised over 50 percent of all referrals to the juvenile court system. The ratio of males to females in this category was heavily skewed toward males, who accounted for fully 80 percent of all the law violation referrals. Males were the majority of offenders in every category of violation. Law violation referrals represent a single delinquent act even though several offenses may have been committed at the same time by the child referred. The most serious violation which resulted in a determination is recorded as the reason for referral. For example, if a youth stole a car while running away from home, the major allegation would be auto theft, not the status offense of running away from home.

Graph 7 presents the outcomes of all law referrals. Only 15 percent were found true formally. By comparison, 18 percent were rejected. Most cases were informally disposed, either with or without supervision provided by the court.

Most law offenders (56 %) were 15 years old or more. The very youngest offenders, those in the 0 to 8 age group, were most likely referred for property damage or stealing. Property damage, stealing and assault were the most common referral offenses for the 9 to 14 year age groups. Table 8 shows specific allegations by age.

The numbers of alleged prior violations vary greatly depending on the specific major allegation for the current referral. In general, the juveniles referred for the more serious allegations were likely to have a higher number of prior alleged violations. For example, those referred for homicide had an average of 4.4 prior law allegations, while those referred for traffic violations had an average of less than one prior. Table 12 shows the average number of prior law allegations for all types of law violations.


#### CHAPTER THREE STATUS OFFENSE REFERRALS

Status offense referrals represent 18 percent of all the referrals to the juvenile system. These are referrals for offenses which would not be considered a law violation if committed by an adult. The category encompasses 5 broad categories:

Truancy
Beyond Parental Control
Habitually Absent from Home
Behavior Injurious to Self or Others
Other Status Offenses


The largest category was for absent from home (31%), followed closely by truancy, which accounted for another 26 percent. Graph 8 depicts the referrals by offense category for boys and girls. Boys were a larger proportion than girls in each offense category except habitually absent from home.

Most status offense referrals were handled informally. Fully 30 percent of status offense referrals had an outcome of informal adjustment without supervision. Only 15 percent of status offense referrals were petitioned to court. Those that were handled formally usually received an outcome of in-home services provided by juvenile court personnel. Graph 9 shows all status offense referral outcomes.

Over 600 juveniles (4.4% of total status referrals) were placed out of home. Table 13 shows where juveniles were placed for which types of status offenses. Most were either transferred to Division of Family Services (33.7%) or were directly served in Court Residential Care (31.7%) by the individual circuit.

The rate of pre-hearing placement is quite low for status offense referrals. Only 11 percent were held in pre-hearing placement. Of those who were held, 920 (62%) were held in secure detention. Runaways were the status offenders most likely to have been held in pre-hearing placement. Table 14 shows which offenders were detained by category of offense.

#### CHAPTER FOUR ABUSE/NEGLECT/CUSTODY REFERRALS


The abuse/neglect/custody category encompasses a wide range of referrals. Children are referred as victims of abuse or neglect or when involved in custody disputes, transfers or terminations of parental rights. Over one-half (53.6%) of all referrals in this category were for the various types of neglect. The remaining referrals were about evenly divided between abuse cases and custody cases. A break down of all the allegations is found in Graph 10. More children were referred as victims of improper care or supervision than any other allegation.

Abuse/Neglect/Custody referrals were the most likely to be handled formally by the court. Petition was made to court in 43 percent of referrals. Another 18 percent were transferred directly to Division of Family Services or another agency without petition. By contrast, less than 20 percent of law violation referrals and only 15 percent of status offense referrals were handled formally. Graph 11 shows the distribution of outcomes for this category.

Of the 2,602 cases with an of out-of-home placement outcome, 75 percent were placed to Division of Family Services. Of those with an outcome of transfer to other agency, 95 percent were transferred to DFS. This amounts to a total of 4,259 cases, or 33 percent of all referrals in this category being referred to DFS at some point.

The types of referrals vary greatly by age. Younger children were more likely to be referred for all types of allegations. Almost one-third of abuse cases and nearly one-half of neglect and custody cases were for children in the very youngest age group (0-5 years). Table 15 shows types of referrals by age group of the victim.



#### CHAPTER FIVE ADMINISTRATIVE REFERRALS

The administrative category of referrals consists largely of Permanency Planning Dispositional Review hearings and Review Team meetings. These are meetings conducted by Division of Family Services regarding placement of children in foster care, adoption placements, and reviews of the appropriateness of a child remaining in long-term care or returning home. Permanency Planning cases accounted for 73 percent of all administrative referrals. There were 4,522 review hearings reported and 4,391 review team meetings reported for 1990. Permanency Planning cases increased by 23 percent from 1989 to 1990, but all of the increase is likely because more counties reported them in 1990. In 1990, 95 counties reported and in 1989, 86 counties reported.


Graph 12 shows all referrals other than Permanency Planning. The catch-all category of Administrative-Other was by far the largest category, with 70 percent of referrals. Violations of Probation accounted for another 20 percent.

Nearly 70 percent of Administrative referrals received an informal disposition. Almost half (46%) of the total were informally adjusted without supervision. Graph 13 shows the distribution of outcomes for this category.

Almost 20 percent of Administrative referrals received pre-hearing placement. Most of these (77%) were held in secure detention. Table 16 shows pre-hearing placements by sex.
