#### SEX OFFENDER COMMITMENTS TO STATE PRISON

#### SUMMARY

- 1. The total number of individuals committed for all sex offenses increased from 630 in 1987 to 685 in 1990 (see Table 1.1, p.3).
- 2. Approximately 46% of sex offenders committed to DOCS during 1987-1990, were convicted of rape, 26% for sodomy and 28% for sexual abuse (see Figure 1, p.4).
- 3. Of all sex offenders committed in 1990, 72.4% were first felons, 25.8% were sentenced as second felony offenders and 1.8% were persistent felons (see Table 1.2, p.7).
- 4. When controlling for felony offender status and felony class category, the average minimum sentence for sex offenders has been subject to minor fluctuation across the last four admission years (see Grand Total in Table 1.3, p.9).
- 5. Generally, for the years examined in this report (1987 1990), sex offenders received longer minimum terms of incarceration than did other violent felony offenders. For example, in 1990, the average minimum sentence for a first felony, class B sex offender was 57.8 months but for all other violent, class B first felons, it was 47.7 months (see Table 1.3, p.9 and Appendix B, p.31).
- 6. The average age at admission for all sex offenders in 1990 was 33.2 years. Sodomy offenders were the oldest (average age, 36.5), followed by sexual abuse offenders (33.2 years) and then rape commitments (31.6 years) (see Table 1.4, p.11).
- 7. About one quarter (25.4%) of sex offenders committed to DOCS from 1987 through 1990 had no known prior arrest history, while over half (60.4%) had been arrested for a crime other than a sex offense. Only 14.1% of sex offenders had an arrest for an earlier sex related offense (see Table 1.5, p.14).
- 8. Time Served data for sex offenders first released to parole in 1990 indicates that, on average, rape offenders served more time (58.1 months) than those imprisoned for sodomy (51.3 months) or sexual abuse (33.5 months) (see Table 3.1, P.18).

- 9. Time served data for sex offenders first released to parole in 1990 was also calculated on the basis of the felony crime class of the commitment offense. On average, class B sex offenders served 73.9 months, class C offenders, 47.6 months, and class D and E felons served 36.0 and 28.1 months, respectively (see Table 3.2, p.19).
- 10. Looking across the four years of this report, the greatest variation in time served occurred among class B offenders, where the average time incarcerated increased 7.9 months, from 66.0 months in 1987 to 73.9 months in 1990 (see Table 3.3, p.21).
- 11. The overall growth in the average time served by class B sex offenders is driven by the second felony offenders in this group. In 1987, class B, second felony sex offenders served, on average, 87.8 months but by 1990, they served 113.1 months (see Table 3.4, p.24).
- 12. Second felony sex offenders released in 1990, served in some instances, almost two more years than a comparable group of other second violent felony offenders. On average, class B, second felony sex offenders served 113.1 months, while other class B, violent second felons served an average of 88.5 months (see Table 3.4, p.24 and Appendix C, p.32).

#### INTRODUCTION

The public and members of the legislature have been concerned for some time about the sentencing and treatment of sex offenders in New York State. Legislative proposals designed to address these concerns include limitations on plea bargaining in sex offense cases, raising the felony class category of certain sex offenses and mandating ongoing treatment and supervision for convicted sex offenders.

This report provides a legal profile of sex offenders committed to the New York State Department of Correctional Services (DOCS). The report examines three different populations: (1) sex offenders admitted to DOCS as new court commitments during the last four years; (2) sex offenders undercustody on December 31, 1990; and (3) sex offenders released to parole from 1987 through 1990.

#### SECTION ONE - NEW COURT COMMITMENTS 1987-1990

# Commitment Offense By Year

The number of sex offenders committed to DOCS remained stable over the past several years. However, sex offenders as a proportion of total commitments, decreased from 4.0% in 1987 to 3.0% in 1990. This percentage decline is the result of the vast number of individuals committed for drug offenses during this same time period.


In Table 1.1, as with most of the tables in this report, the sex offender population is broken into three general categories: those committed for rape, sodomy, or sexual abuse offenses (see also Figure 1). Each category lists specific sex crimes by degree and attempt status. First degree offenses are more serious than second degree offenses, which in turn are more serious than third degree offenses. An attempted crime falls into the next lower felony class category. A YO designation before a crime indicates an individual granted Youthful Offender status at sentencing. Youthful Offenders must be between 16 and 21 at the time the offense was committed and must have no prior felony convictions.

The total number of individuals committed for all sex offenses increased from 630 in 1987 to 685 in 1990 (see Grand Total in Table 1.1). Increased commitments for Sex Abuse 1st in 1990 were in large part responsible for the growth of sex offenders in that year. In 1990, as in earlier years, rape offenses accounted for almost half of all sex related crimes. Commitments for sodomy offenses declined to 22.5% in 1990, while those for sexual abuse increased to 26.7 percent. It can further be seen in Table 1.1, that most offenders are committed for the top charge in each of the three respective offense-categories.

Only those inmates whose controlling offense was a sex crime were included in this study. Determination as to controlling offense is arrived at through a formula that incorporates both sentence length and the seriousness of the offense. Consequently, not all those convicted of a sex crime are included in this report.

# Felony Offender Status<sup>2</sup>


The 1990 new court commitment population was divided into five offense type categories: Drug Offenses, Other Violent Felonies, Sex Offenses, Other Coercive Felonies, and Property and Other Remaining Offenses. These offense type categories are further divided by first and second felony offender status. As indicated in Figure 2, sex offenders as a group had proportionately fewer second and persistent felons (28.6%) than any other offense type group. In the offense type group most comparable to that of Sex Offenses, Other Violent Felony Offenses, 43.9% were second or persistent felons.

Looking only at sex offenders committed in 1990, 72.4% were first felons while 25.8% were sentenced as second felony offenders (see Table 1.2). The remaining 1.8% were sentenced as persistent felony offenders. Slightly fewer sodomy offenders are second felons (20.8%) in comparison to rape offenders (26.2%) and sexual abuse offenders (28.9%). It should be noted that while the instant offense is for a sex crime, the previous offense need not have been so.

Throughout this report, unless stated otherwise, persistent felony of fenders have been grouped with second felony of fenders.

#### Minimum Sentence

Table 1.3 presents the average and median minimum sentence by crime class and felony offender status for 1987 through 1990 sex offense commitments. The minimum sentence indicates the time an offender must serve before parole eligibility. The length of the minimum sentence is dependent upon the crime class of the offense, as well as the felony status of the offender. (See Appendix A for allowable minimum sentences according to crime class and felony offender status.)


As would be expected, the average minimum sentence decreases with crime class. Among first felony offenders in 1990, those convicted of class B offenses received an average sentence of 57.8 months, class C offenders received 26.8 months, class D offenders received 21.3 months and class E offenders, 15.6 months (see Table 1.3). Second felony offenders receive longer minimum sentences than do first felons. For example in 1990, the average minimum term for first felons convicted of Rape 1st was 59.5 months, but for second felons it was 138.5 months.

While there is fluctuation across the four year period in average minimum sentence length for specific crimes, there is no evidence of a general pattern of increasing or decreasing minimum sentences. Offenders sentenced for Rape 1st as first felons, for example, received an average minimum sentence of 58.3 months in 1987 and 57.9 months in 1988. The minimum sentence decreased slightly in 1989 to 54.8 months, but increased again in 1990 to 59.5 months.

When comparing the average minimum sentences of sex offenders with those of other violent felony offenders, offenders receive longer sentences (see Figure 3). displays the average minimum sentence for all other felony offenders (excluding sex offenders) committed to DOCS from 1987 through 1990. As an example, the average minimum term of incarceration for a first felony offender convicted of a class B sex offense and committed to DOCS in 1990 was 57.8 months (see Table 1.3). For the same year, first felons convicted of other class B violent felonies received an average minimum term of 47.7 months (see Appendix B). Looking at class B offenders again, sex offenders committed as second felons in 1990 received 135.0 months (see Table 1.3), compared with, 100.0 months for other class B, violent second felony offenders (see Appendix B). Using 1990 as a reference again, a similar disparity in average minimum sentence exists between first felony, class D sex offenders (21.3 months) and all other class D first felons (15.5 months).

#### Age At Commitment

The average age at admission for all sex offenders in 1990 was 33.2 years (see Table 1.4). Those committed for sodomy offenses were older than other sex offenders (36.5 years). Next oldest, were those admitted for sexual abuse (33.3 years), with rape offenders being the youngest, with an average age of 31.6 years.

The greatest variation in the three sex offense categories occurred in the under 21 age groups. Those under 21 accounted for 16.9% of all rape offenders, whereas only 3.2% of sodomy offenders fell into these age distributions. Approximately 8% of sexual abuse offenders were under 21. In the age category 21 - 24 years old, the percentage of rape and sexual abuse offenders was about the same at roughly 17%, in contrast to the proportion of sodomy offenders (9.1%).

## Prior Adult Record

This section deals with the prior adult criminal history of sex offenders committed to DOCS from 1987 through 1990. The current commitment offense is not included and all categories are mutually exclusive. The stub variable prior arrest, appearing in each table in this section, is derived from a Departmental variable, most serious prior crime. The Department uses the most serious prior crime variable for security classification purposes.

Classification staff utilize a scale to assess the level of violence in an inmate's prior criminal history. The goal of this scale is to identify the most violent prior criminal event perpetrated by the inmate. In pursuit of this goal, the staff may examine prior criminal convictions or arrests, providing the arrests have no current dispositions. Hence, the prior arrest variable created for this report, may be indicative of an undisposed arrest or an arrest resulting in a conviction.

The most serious prior crime variable does have some limitations. First, it reflects only one offense where there may be multiple felony or misdemeanor arrests and convictions. Also where there is more than one violent offense in the prior criminal history, a prior sex offense may not always take precedence over another violent felony offense. Despite these limitations, this data element is the only variable available on DOCS computer files that provides an actual penal law reference to a prior offense.

The information represented by the prior arrest variable has been collapsed into three categories: no arrest prior to the instant offense, an earlier arrest for a sex offense, and an arrest for any other crime.

About one quarter (25.4%) of sex offenders have no known arrest history, while over half (60.4%) were arrested for a crime in the Other Offense category (see Table 1.5 and Figure 4). Only 14.1% of sex offenders committed during this four year time period had an arrest for an earlier sex offense. Note in Table 1.5, a higher proportion of sodomy offenders (32.5%) had no previous arrests as compared with either rape offenders (23.8%) or sexual abuse offenders (21.7%). Regardless of the offender's current offense, earlier sex related arrests tended to be for sexual abuse offenses.


The remaining three tables in this section display the offender's prior adult criminal history by prior arrest history. Separate tables are provided for rape, sodomy, and sexual abuse offenders. Table 1.6A deals only with those committed for rape offenses. The majority of rape offenders who had earlier arrests

for rape or sodomy, were imprisoned for these offenses in either state or federal prisons (63.3% and 50.0%, respectively). However, among those with known arrests for sexual abuse, far more offenders had been sentenced to jail (43.5%) than to prison (24.2%). This disparity is most likely the result of the class D felony status of Sexual Abuse 1st.

The prior record of sodomy offenders appears in Table 1.6B. Once again, if an offender currently incarcerated for sodomy had an earlier sex related arrest, they were more likely to have previously been sentenced to prison (42.9%) than to have received a jail sentence (24.2%) or some other alternative sentence (23.1%). Unlike in Table 1.6A, a higher percentage of offenders with records of conviction for sexual abuse served time in prison (37.5%) than in jail (31.3%).

Similar patterns of imprisonment for sex related priors exist in Table 1.6C, where 55.9% and 82.4% of current sexual abuse offenders served a prison sentence for previous rape or sodomy arrests. Among sexual abuse offenders whose prior was also for sexual abuse, only 15.7% had been sentenced to prison as opposed to 38.6% to jail. An additional 38.6% of these offenders also received some type of alternative sentence.

#### SECTION TWO - UNDERCUSTODY POPULATION ON DECEMBER 31, 1990

Table 2.1 displays the felony offender status for all sex offenders in the Department's custody on December 31, 1990. Overall 64.1% of these offenders were sentenced as first felons, 33.1% as second felons and 2.8% as persistent felons.

Referring back to Table 1.2, it appears that there is a shift towards a higher percentage of first felons among sex offenders admitted as new court commitments in 1990. The greater proportion of second and persistent felons in the undercustody population, as opposed to the new court commitment population, reflects the longer sentences these offenders must serve before parole eligibility. Similar to Table 1.2, offenders undercustody for sodomy offenses were more likely to be first felons (69.0%) than those undercustody for sexual abuse (65.5%) or rape (61.4%).

#### SECTION THREE - FIRST RELEASES TO PAROLE 1987-1990

The length of time sex offenders serve before first release to parole supervision is discussed in this section. Two types of time served data are presented here. First, the length of time an offender is incarcerated in state prison (state time served) and second, the total time an offender is incarcerated for the instant offense, which includes both state time and any time spent in jail prior to trial or sentencing (total time served).

#### 1990 First Releases to Parole<sup>3</sup>


Time served data for sex offenders first released to parole supervision in 1990 appears in Table 3.1 and Figure 5. Looking at total time served figures for this population of sex offenders, note that those incarcerated for rape offenses served more time (on average, 58.1 months) than those imprisoned for sodomy (on average, 51.3 months). Offenders committed for sexual abuse crimes served the least amount of time, on average, 33.5 months. Overall, the average total time served for all offenders in this table was 47.9 months.

Table 3.2 displays time served data for 1990 first releases to parole supervision. Here, the offenses have been grouped according to felony class status. Notable in Table 3.2 is the length of total time served by class B sex offenders. Class B sex felons served 73.9 months on average, with Rape 1st offenders serving 78.1 months. In contrast, class C offenders served only 47.6 months on average, while class D and E felons served 36.0 and 28.1 months, respectively. These differences in time served by felony class category are expected since the seriousness of offenses declines as one moves from class A to class E felonies.

A first release indicates an inmate released to parole supervision by the Board of Parole, after the inmate served his minimum period of incarceration, but before the inmate reached his conditional release date.

### First Releases to Parole by Year

Examined below is the time served experience of sex offenders across the last four release years. Tables 3.3 and 3.4 are based on 1987 through 1990 first releases to parole supervision and are further broken down by the felony class of the individual sex offense. Only total time served data is presented in the remaining tables.

The average time served for all sex offenders varied only slightly over time, from a low of 47.7 months in 1987 to a high of 49.0 months in 1988 (see Grand Total in Table 3.3; see also Figure 6). The greatest variation in time served occurred among class B sex felons, where the average time incarcerated increased 7.9 months, from 66.0 months in 1987 to 73.9 months in 1990. Within this felony class category, Rape 1st offenders first released to parole in 1990 served 5.8 months longer (78.1 months) than Rape 1st offenders released in 1987 (72.3 months), while 1990 Sodomy 1st offenders served an additional 12.5 months (66.2 months) more than their 1987 counterparts (53.7 months).

This growth in time served is not reflected in the Grand Total because the number of Rape 1st and Sodomy 1st offenders released to parole decreased during the four years under examination. In 1987, 127 Rape 1st and 62 Sodomy 1st offenders were released, but in 1990, only 68 Rape 1st and 36 Sodomy 1st offenders were paroled.




Table 3.4 is much the same as Table 3.3, only it distinguishes between first and second felony offenders. This table indicates that the increased time served by class B sex offenders observed above, was not as great among first felony offenders as it was for those sentenced as second felons. For example, total time served by first felony offenders committed for Rape 1st remained fairly constant from 1987 through 1990 (at approximately 66 months), while there was modest growth in time served by first felons committed for Sodomy 1st (approximately eight months, from 50.1 to 58.5).

Among class B second felons, however, there was dramatic growth in the amount of time offenders served before being first released to parole supervision. Of these felons, Rape 1st offenders served, on average, 89.0 months before being released in 1987. By 1990, members of this group served, on average, 116.1 months, or 27.1 months more than in 1987. Similarly, Sodomy 1st offenders served an additional 22.4 months in 1990 (on average, 104.6 months) compared with offenders released in 1987 (on average, 82.2 months). Note that in 1990, these second felony offenders represented respectively, about 25% and 17% of all Rape 1st and Sodomy 1st offenders.


In the discussion on minimum sentence in Section One above, it was observed that when controlling for felony crime class and offender status, the average minimum sentence for many sex offenders, particularly class B sex offenders, was higher than that for a comparable group of other violent felony offenders (see Figure 3). By controlling for felony crime class and offender status among 1990 first releases to parole supervision, it can be seen that variations in total time served between sex offenders and other violent felons are even more accentuated and consistent than were the minimum sentence variations for new court commitments (see Figure 7).

For instance among offenders released in 1990 (see Table 3.4), first felony, class B sex offenders served an average of 63.1 months, which was 12.4 months higher than the average time served by other first felony, class B violent offenders (on average, 50.7 months). (See Appendix C for time served data for all other felony offenders first released to parole in 1990.) Regardless of crime class, first felony sex offenders consistently served more time than did other violent first felony offenders.

Among second felony offenders released in 1990, the discrepancy in time served between sex offenders and other violent felons was even greater, particularly among class B and C offenders. Many of these class B sex offenders were imprisoned two years more than their violent class B counterparts. On average, class B, second felony sex offenders served 113.1 months (see Table 3.4, 1990 figures), while other class B, violent second felons served an average of 88.5 months (see Appendix C). second felony sex offenders, the average time served was 69.8 months, 14.9 months more the average time served by other violent, class C second felony offenders.

#### Time Served Distribution for 1990 First Releases

In addition to the display of time served data based on averages or medians, Table 3.5 presents time served data in a frequency distribution for offenders paroled in 1990. Among all class B sex offenders, about one third (31.1%), served between 72 and 119 months. In contrast, over one third (36.4%) of class C sex offenders served between 30 and 35 months. For the remaining felony class categories, and for Youthful Offenders, the category containing the single largest group of offenders was the one indicating that the offender served between 18 and 23 months before release to parole. Twenty-nine percent of class D offenders fell here, as did 48.9% of class E felons, and 50.0% of Youthful Offenders.

#### CONCLUSION

This report on sex offenders committed to DOCS has concentrated on the legal history of these felons. There exists a general tendency among sex offenders to receive minimum terms of incarceration which, on average, are longer than those received by a comparable group of other violent felony offenders. In particular, class B and C sex felons serve many months more than other class B and C violent felons.

Further research regarding sex offenders is needed to present a balanced portrait of this type of offender. Additional reports might focus on the demographic characteristics of these offenders or provide a description of the various treatment programs available to sex offenders while incarcerated in state prison.
