#### **FOREWORD**

The Texas Juvenile Probation Commission's (TJPC) eleventh annual statistical report provides information regarding the magnitude and nature of juvenile activity and the juvenile probation system's response. This information is offered to help direct the state's effort to improve the juvenile justice system and reduce juvenile crime in Texas.

During calendar year 1991, police agencies in Texas arrested 131,201 juveniles between the ages of 10 and 17. Of this number 34,299 were warned and released, handled in magistrate courts or diverted, and 96,902 were referred to juvenile probation departments. In addition to police agency referrals, an additional 8,763 juveniles were referred by social agencies, parents, schools, the Texas Youth Commission (TYC), and others, for a total of 105,665. This is a 7,621 (8%) increase in referrals from the previous year. This increase resulted from a drastic increase in serious criminal activity of 8,521 delinquent conduct referrals (up 13%); and would have been even greater had there not been a change in the juvenile law which gave jurisdiction to most class C misdemeanors to magistrate courts.


A total of 1,276 juvenile probation officers in 160 departments covered all of Texas' 254 counties. In addition, 482 certified and 651 part-time or on-call detention staff assisted by supervising juveniles held in the state's 52 secure juvenile detention facilities.

In 1991, 32,287 juveniles were detained prior to adjudication hearings. A total of 31,399 were held in secure juvenile detention centers and 888 juveniles were held in non-secure alternate placement facilities such as foster homes and emergency shelters. An additional 1,829 could have been held in non-secure facilities if such facilities had been available. Approximately 45 percent of all juveniles were released in less than one day.

Juvenile probation departments disposed of 53,237 referrals by counseling and releasing, diverting to other agencies for treatment, or dismissing the complaints, and initiated 36,815 voluntary or other temporary supervisions under guidelines of their juvenile boards.

Juvenile courts entered 11,651 probation orders, bringing to 48,466 the number of cases added to supervision. Juvenile courts also committed 2,230 juveniles to the Texas Youth Commission, certified 208 juveniles to stand trial as adults, and refused prosecution, dismissed, consolidated, or otherwise disposed of another 17,106 cases.

# TEXAS JUVENILE PROBATION SYSTEM 1991

#### INTRODUCTION

During calendar year 1991 TJPC collected statistical data regarding juveniles referred to the juvenile justice system from the 160 departments which cover all Texas counties. TJPC also surveyed the departments to obtain supplemental information. The statistical activity reports and the 1991 survey are the primary sources of this report.

Caution should be used in drawing general conclusions from juvenile probation statistics. The following data portray neither everything juvenile probation departments or courts do, nor how much time they spend on activities not represented by the statistics. There is no reliable way to ascertain the time spent by juvenile probation officers or juvenile judges in counseling, study, and research.

At least three factors are not represented in the juvenile probation activity statistics, and should be considered when evaluating them:

- 1. Juvenile probation officers in multi-county departments spend more time traveling than do officers in single-county jurisdictions;
- 2. A number of the juvenile probation officers serve both adult and juvenile capacities due to limited resources, and often operate under widely varying authorities and policies;
- 3. The juvenile justice system operates under the rules and authority of Title 3 of the Texas Family Code. Emphasis is placed on the rehabilitation of the juvenile through guidance, counseling, diversion, and treatment. Many of the cases statistically reported as being disposed as "counseled and released" or "dismissed or otherwise disposed," in fact occasion extensive rehabilitative efforts on the part of the juvenile probation system.

The following definitions of terms apply to the statistical activity reported.

- 1. <u>Referral</u> means any occasion when a child is brought to the department's attention for alleged delinquent conduct or conduct indicating a need for supervision (CINS) and some contact by visit or interview occurs between the department and the juvenile or parents.
- 2. <u>Child</u> means a person who is 10 years of age or older, and under 17 years of age; or 17 years of age and under 18 years of age who is alleged or found to have engaged in delinquent conduct or CINS as a result of acts committed before becoming 17 years of age.

- 3. <u>Delinquent Conduct</u> means violation of any law punishable by incarceration, except traffic laws, and violation of juvenile court orders entered under section 54.04 or 54.05 of the Family Code, except by truancy, running away, or fineable offenses.
- 4. <u>Conduct Indicating a Need for Supervision (CINS)</u> means driving while intoxicated (first and second offense), inhalant abuse, running away, truancy, and violation of certain laws punishable by fine.
- 5. <u>Status Offense</u> means offenses that are not criminal when committed by adults; e.g., running away or truancy.

The 72nd Legislature changed the definitions of conduct indicating a need for supervision effective September 1, 1991. CINS conduct was changed to exclude the first offense of running away and to make parental consent a defense to truancy. In addition, a juvenile must be twice convicted of fineable offenses in criminal court, unless waived, before he might be charged with the third and subsequent offenses in juvenile court.

#### **JUVENILE BOARDS**

State law creates a juvenile board in every county. It is responsible for designating juvenile judges, appointing the chief juvenile probation officer, and setting the policy and budget for the juvenile probation department. Texas has 190 juvenile boards, 78 multi-county boards and 112 single county boards.

Juvenile boards met an average of 4.3 times during 1991. TJPC provides funding and technical assistance to juvenile boards.

#### JUVENILE PROBATION DEPARTMENTS


Structure and Staffing. Juvenile probation departments carry out the policies of juvenile boards and deliver services to juveniles referred to juvenile courts. There are 112 single county departments and 48 multi-county departments. Multi-county departments range from two to six counties. Fifty-two departments had only one staff member; 39 had no clerical support.

The workload of juvenile probation was managed by 2,509 salaried employees: 1,758 probation and detention personnel and 751 clerical or other support staff. Also included were 651 hourly detention child care workers. Volunteers were used in 95 departments. Twenty-eight departments served both adult and juvenile probationers. Most of the departments have separate juvenile probation officers.

Juvenile probation salaries averaged \$23,590 annually for certified juvenile probation officers, \$35,818 for chief juvenile probation officers and \$18,364 for certified detention child care workers.

<u>Funding</u>. Figure 1 shows funding available for juvenile probation services. Funding was increased approximately 9 percent from 1990. Funds for residential placement of juveniles on probation were available in 122 departments. Ninety-six departments used TJPC funds, 66 used federal funds administered by the Criminal Justice Division of the Governor's Office, and 91 used funds from the counties or other sources. Counties without residential placement funds must find free placements in the private sector for, or commit to TYC, juveniles who need to be removed from their homes.

A total of 4,204 juveniles were placed in residential facilities, including foster homes and emergency shelters. This is a decrease of 8 percent from 1990, due entirely to the increased cost of community-based placements. Survey results detailing 3,534 placements were extrapolated to provide the statewide placement data shown in Figure 2. In 1991, 28 percent of probation funds were used to purchase placement services.

<u>Services</u>. All departments provide the most basic services to some degree. Figure 3 shows the extent of services available.

Probation departments also worked closely with independent school districts. In 1991, 736 of the 1,041 school districts had appointed the school liaison officers required by the Texas Education Code.

In addition to working with local school districts, probation departments also work closely with state child protective services. In 1991, of the 105,665 referrals (72,182 juveniles), 4,073 showed symptoms of sexual abuse, 4,775 physical abuse, and 16,759 emotional abuse, all increases over 1990.


As required by the 70th Legislature, probation departments now assess court and probation fees against adjudicated juveniles. Probation fees are also permissible in informal adjustment cases. In 1991, departments collected \$71,758 in court fees in 4,187 cases; \$301,628 in probation fees in 5,866 cases; and \$134,400 in informal adjustment fees in 4,451 cases.

Education, Training, and Certification. By the end of 1991, TJPC had certified 2,409 juvenile probation officers and 792 detention child care workers. During 1991, 158 departments provided 90,646 hours of training to 2,410 staff for an average of 38 hours of training per staff member to meet TJPC standards. Fifty-one percent of the training was provided in-house and the remainder was provided outside. The Texas Juvenile Probation Commission, through 16 regional, 9 on-site and 6 statewide training sessions, conducted 417 hours of training for 1,409 participants for a total of 3,038 contact hours. This comprised 7 percent of outside training provided.

Gangs and Substance Abuse. Beginning in early 1989, major metropolitan areas in Texas began to show appreciable increases in juvenile referrals for felony class offenses. Preliminary analysis reported that these increases were directly related to two major factors - extensive growth in gang related crimes and increased involvement in substance abuse and its impact on both violent as well as property crimes. By the end of 1990, this trend had spread statewide to all but the most rural counties in Texas.

The 1991 statewide resource survey resulted in 48 percent of the departments being able to clearly identify a total of 1,450 juvenile gangs in their combined jurisdictions. The impact of these gangs is evident (see Figure 4). While gang members are not a large part of total activity, their involvement is in the more serious felony crimes resulting in probation.



In 1991, local probation departments handled more juveniles involved in some form of substance abuse than ever before. Of the 105,665 referrals (72,182 juveniles), 3,943 showed symptoms of inhalant abuse, 20,269 drug abuse and 21,829 alcohol abuse. Local probation departments provided extended services to 9,731 juveniles, placed 4,902 in various residential and non-residential community based programs and spent \$3,032,729 treating substance abuse problems. The true cost

of juvenile involvement in substance abuse can be measured more completely by the number of referrals whose involvement in such abuse is the direct cause of their criminal behavior. In 1991, 18 percent of all referrals came from homes with some substance abuse problems, 24 percent of all felony referrals, 18 percent of all other delinquent conduct referrals and 14 percent of all CINS referrals were directly attributed to the juvenile being a substance abuser (See Figure 5).


# STATEWIDE JUVENILE ACTIVITY 1991

Statewide data on referrals, detentions, dispositional activities, and supervision workloads follow. Prior year comparisons are provided where possible. An abbreviated county-by-county summary of each of the four parts is appended.

#### **JUVENILE REFERRAL ACTIVITY**


There were 105,665 referrals to juvenile probation authorities in Texas, an increase of almost 8 percent over 1990 (see Figure 6). The number of juveniles referred in 1991 increased to 72,182 compared to 68,608 juveniles in 1990. This increase, which would have been even greater were it not for the change in class C misdemeanor jurisdiction, was entirely due to the increased involvement in felony and other delinquent conduct offenses. The percentage of referred juveniles with prior referrals was up slightly to 49 percent. Most juveniles referred were in-county residents (94 percent), and in-school (90 percent). The proportion of dropouts referred declined. Police agencies made 9 out of 10 referrals. The number of referred juveniles who had previously been committed to TYC was unchanged.

The increase in referrals in 1991 can be attributed entirely to an increase in felony and other delinquent referrals (see Figure 7). Delinquent conduct, in general, rose almost 13 percent, while felony offenses were up over 15 percent; the highest increase ever reported.

The distribution of referrals by age, sex, and race showed some change in 1991 (Figures 8 and 9). While the overall age distribution of referrals was unchanged, the number of young juveniles, ages 10 to 13, involved in delinquent conduct declined. There was a very slight increase in referrals of males compared to females.

Age Distribution of Referrals




#### **JUVENILE DETENTION ACTIVITY**

Of the 105,665 juveniles referred, 73,378 were immediately released to their parents or other responsible adults. The remaining 32,287 were detained; 31,399 were held in the 52 secure detention facilities; and 888 were placed in non-secure detention.

Referrals increased 8 percent from 1990, and the incidence of secure detention increased by 13 percent (see Figure 11). This increase is due entirely to the reported increase in felony class offenses. The use of non-secure alternatives declined greatly from the preceding year. Forty-five percent of all juveniles detained were released in less than one day compared to 41 percent in 1990. While this shows the need for a low cost alternative to secure detention, it also represents an increased degree of serious criminal involvement of juveniles in 1991. Six percent, or 1,829, of the juveniles securely detained could have been placed in alternative non-secure settings had they been available.

Figure 10 Juvenile Detention Centers 1991




#### JUVENILE DISPOSITION ACTIVITY

Dispositions were made in 98,565 juvenile cases (see Figure 12). Juvenile probation departments disposed of 67,151 of these cases, with 53,237 cases counseled and released, diverted, or dismissed and 13,914 cases placed on informal adjustment.

The remaining 31,414 cases were resolved by the juvenile court or prosecutor. Of these, the court placed 11,870 juveniles on adjudicated probation; certified and transferred to adult court 208 cases; refused, consolidated, dismissed or otherwise disposed 17,106 cases; and adjudicated and committed to TYC 2,230 cases.


Although the number of serious referrals increased, the actual rate at which juvenile courts committed juveniles to TYC declined. Several factors affect this.

- 398 juveniles were placed on probation in long-term, local secure detention facility programs;
- 385 juveniles were placed on at-home confinement probation;
- 1,504 juveniles were informally adjusted or placed on probation in available non-secure alternative placements;

- 343 of the 2,230 commitments to TYC were due to lack of suitable alternative placement resources available at the time of disposition;
- 1,737 juveniles were diverted using TJPC's expanded Intensive Supervision Program;
- 408 juveniles were placed on community-based probation using electronic monitoring devices; and
- the Border Children Justice Projects, which serve juvenile Mexican citizens charged with criminal offenses in Texas, diverted 235 juveniles from commitment to TYC.



#### SUPERVISION WORKLOAD ACTIVITY

On January 1, 1991, 22,136 juveniles were receiving active supervision from juvenile probation departments. During the year, 11,651 court ordered probations and 36,815 informal adjustments and temporary supervisions were added for a total of 48,466 (see Figure 13).

During 1991, 1,218 (12 percent) of the 10,263 court ordered probations failed and resulted in either TYC commitment or adult criminal trial. On December 31, 1991, 24,487 juveniles were under active supervision. Juvenile probation departments accepted 105,665 referrals and supervised 70,602 juveniles, for a total of 176,267 juveniles served during the year.

#### SUMMARY


Although total referrals increased by almost 8 percent in 1991, it was juvenile involvement in serious crime increasing 15 percent that resulted in the largest single year increase ever noted.

Examination of 1991 statistics as well as discussions with numerous juvenile judges and chief juvenile probation officers have indicated the major cause of this increase to be juvenile involvement with drugs and gangs, as was reported in 1989 and 1990.


The demands of the more serious juvenile offender, and an increase in the cost of out of home treatment or placement services, continued to tax local community resources to the limit and cause the number of juveniles being committed to state operated facilities to remain relatively high.

However, while the actual number of juveniles committed to TYC stayed constant, the rate of juveniles referred for delinquent conduct compared to juveniles actually committed declined. This success, in light of the sudden increasing strain on the juvenile justice system can be attributed to the 72nd Legislature's increased funding for community corrections. Were it not for these increased state funds, local departments would not have been able to handle locally the increased number of serious offenders. In fact, without increased state funds, approximately 788 more juveniles would have been committed to TYC in 1991.

#### DELINQUENT REFERRALS 1985-1991




### TYC COMMITMENTS 1985-1991
