#### INTRODUCTION

This resource directory was developed by the EMT Group Inc., under its Prevention Services Technical Assistance contract with the California State Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs (ADP). The directory was created in recognition of the existence of a variety of **no-cost** technical assistance (T.A.) and training services that are available to communities involved in reducing alcohol and other drug abuse (AODA).

The purpose of the directory is to assist agencies, organizations, and individuals in identifying and utilizing services and information sources available in California as well as those available nationally. The information for the directory was obtained from the following sources:

- Technical Assistance and Training Providers (state and national)
- California State Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs (ADP)
- The Circle, Inc. (for services at the national level)

This directory consists of three matrices and two general sections. The matrices present the T.A. service categories for each California and Federal agency, as well as specific populations served (California ADP contractors only). The first section of the directory, *Technical Assistance, Training and Information Available Within California* includes descriptions of the AODA-related services available through contractors with the California State ADP. The second section, *Technical Assistance, Training and Information Assistance, Training and Information Available Nationally*, contains AODA (and some criminal justice) related services available through Federal contractors (e.g., Office for Substance Abuse Prevention).

Each entry for California ADP funded T.A. and training includes: the agency's name (i.e., the ADP contractor), address, telephone number, contact person, ADP project monitor, services offered, target population, application procedure, funding source, and time limit on contract. Descriptions of federal T.A. and training services also include the above information (whenever available), as well as other pertinent information, whenever identified.

This resource directory focuses primarily on free T.A. and training services available through traditional AODA systems. It is our intent to expand this directory to include AODA related T.A. and training services that are available through other systems, such as education, criminal justice, social services, as well low-cost services provided by private, non-profit organizations. To this end, we welcome any information on additional resources for T.A. and training, at the state or national level.
