

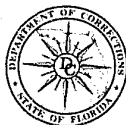

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Florida Department of Corrections (DC) serves as the regulatory authority for the operation of county and municipal detention facilities [CH 951.23, FS] and collects pertinent statistical data on the inmate population incarcerated in such facilities [CH 951.23(2) FS]. Although the legal authority to collect the data began on October 1, 1985, all 67 counties did not begin reporting until January 1986. The enabling legislation requires certain data as a minimum to be collected and analyzed. The Florida Department of Corrections has expanded the collection effort which is the result of compromises between user requests, programming changes at DC, and ease of collection and training of staff at the reporting detention facilities.

The data presented in this report are for the three year period from January 1, 1990 to December 31, 1992. The data collected are from the 67 county jail systems operating 108 facilities throughout the period --ending December 31, 1992. The information reveals that inmate populations in county jails have continued to increase into 1992.

- * The county jail average daily inmate population increased from 33,628 in 1990 to 35,330 ending 1992, a 5.1% increase.
- * Authorized DC rated capacity increased by 5,703 beds or 17.1% during the period from 1990 (33,413) to the end of 1992 (39,116).
- * Eighteen jails (26.9%) are cited in federal lawsuits, 13 jails (19.4) are named in state action that have not been dismissed as of December 1992.

The purpose of this annual report is to present a summary of three years of jail data reported to the Florida Department of Corrections by the 67 Florida counties. The data presented in this report are annual averages for the inmate classifications that are collected on a monthly basis by the Florida Department of Corrections. The annual average daily population (ADP) figures include totals for each county as well as individual facilities within those counties.

This report is separated into two parts. The first section features annual percentages for the year 1992, and descriptive jail information for each of the three years (1990-1991-1992) in which DC collected data on Florida's county jails. The second part examines trends in county jail inmate populations on a statewide basis. The following is a short description of the type of information that will be provided in this report:

- * A jail data summary review for the year 1992 (to include average daily populations, incarceration rate, and capacity percentages).
- * Average daily populations of inmate categories for 1990, 1991, and 1992.
- * County incarceration rates per 1,000 population.
- * Authorized DC rated capacity in comparison to the average daily populations reported for 1990, 1991, and 1992.
- * 3 year trend study, and pending litigation.

The Inspector General's Office of the Florida Department of Corrections is currently responsible for publishing on a monthly basis, The County

Detention Facilities Daily Inmate Populaton Data Report. Selected data from this monthly report is used in the Annual Report in order to enhance the data routinely collected and published by this office.

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JAIL DATA SUMMARY 1992

The inmate categories reported are unchanged from those in 1991. The data contained within this section are annual averages for 1992. The data for selected categories are presented in Table 1 and can be summarized as follows:

- * The average annual ADP for 1992 was 35,330. Of that number, 87.2% (30,805) were adult males, 10.3% (3,659) adult females, and 2.4% (849) were male juveniles. The 17 female juveniles were 0.1% of the total.
- * Pretrial detainees were 57.1% (20,160) of the annual average ADP.
- * Of the 30,805 adult males 57.1% (14,831 felons - 2,760 misdemeanor) were pretrial inmates.
- * There were 52.3% (1,912) of the adult female population held in pretrial status (1,397 felons - 515 misdemeanor).
- * The juvenile population is dominated by the 744 males in the awaiting trial/sentencing (729 felons - 15 misdemeanors). That 744 is 87.6% of the male juveniles and 85.9% of the total juvenile population (849 male - 17 female).

The incarceration rate per 1,000 population ranges from a low of 0.9 in Holmes County to 7.4 in Hamilton County. See Table 2 and figure 1. The incarceration rate computation includes all inmate categories. Some of the counties reflect higher incarceration rates due to housing of federal inmates. The average rated capacity versus average ADP is shown in Table 3 and Figure 2, and can be summarized as follows:

- * Statewide capacity was 39,116 and ADP was 35,330 or 9.7 under the statewide rated capacity.
- * The over/under capacity range was 93.5% over in Dade County Jail Women's facility, and 76.2% under capacity in the Collier County Stockade.
- * One hundred and seven facilities were operated by the 67 counties throughout 1992. Several counties operated multiple facilities: Alachua (2); Bay (2); Broward (3); Citrus (2); Collier (2); Dade (7); Duval (3); Escambia (3); Hillsborough (3); Lee (2); Manatee (3); Monroe (3); Orange (8); Palm Beach (4); Pasco (2); Pinellas (4); Polk (2); St. Lucie (2); and Volusia (2).

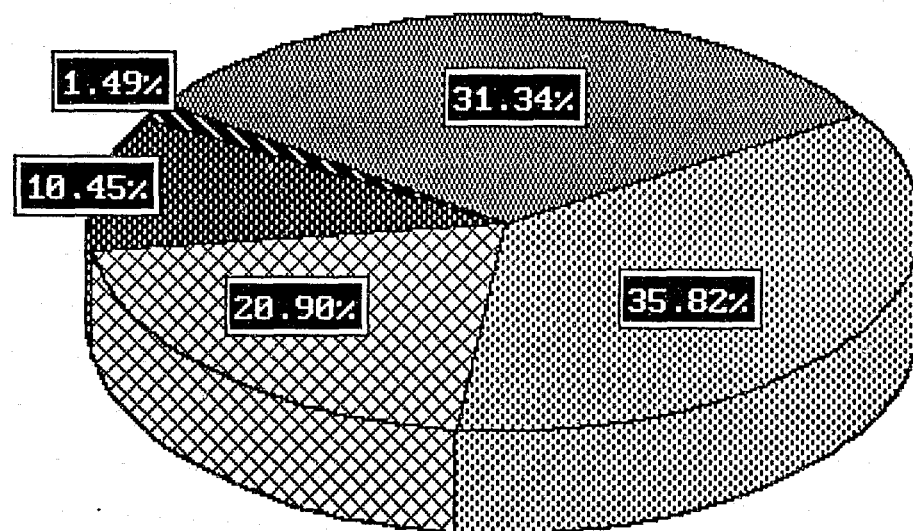

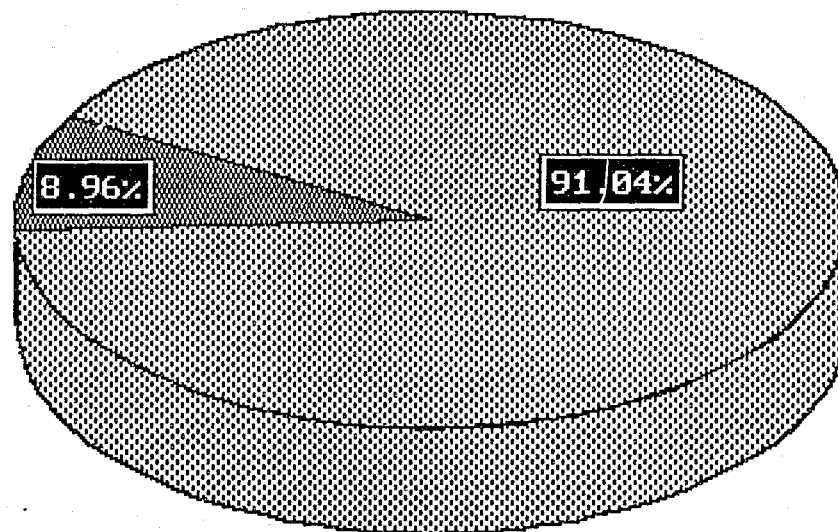

1992



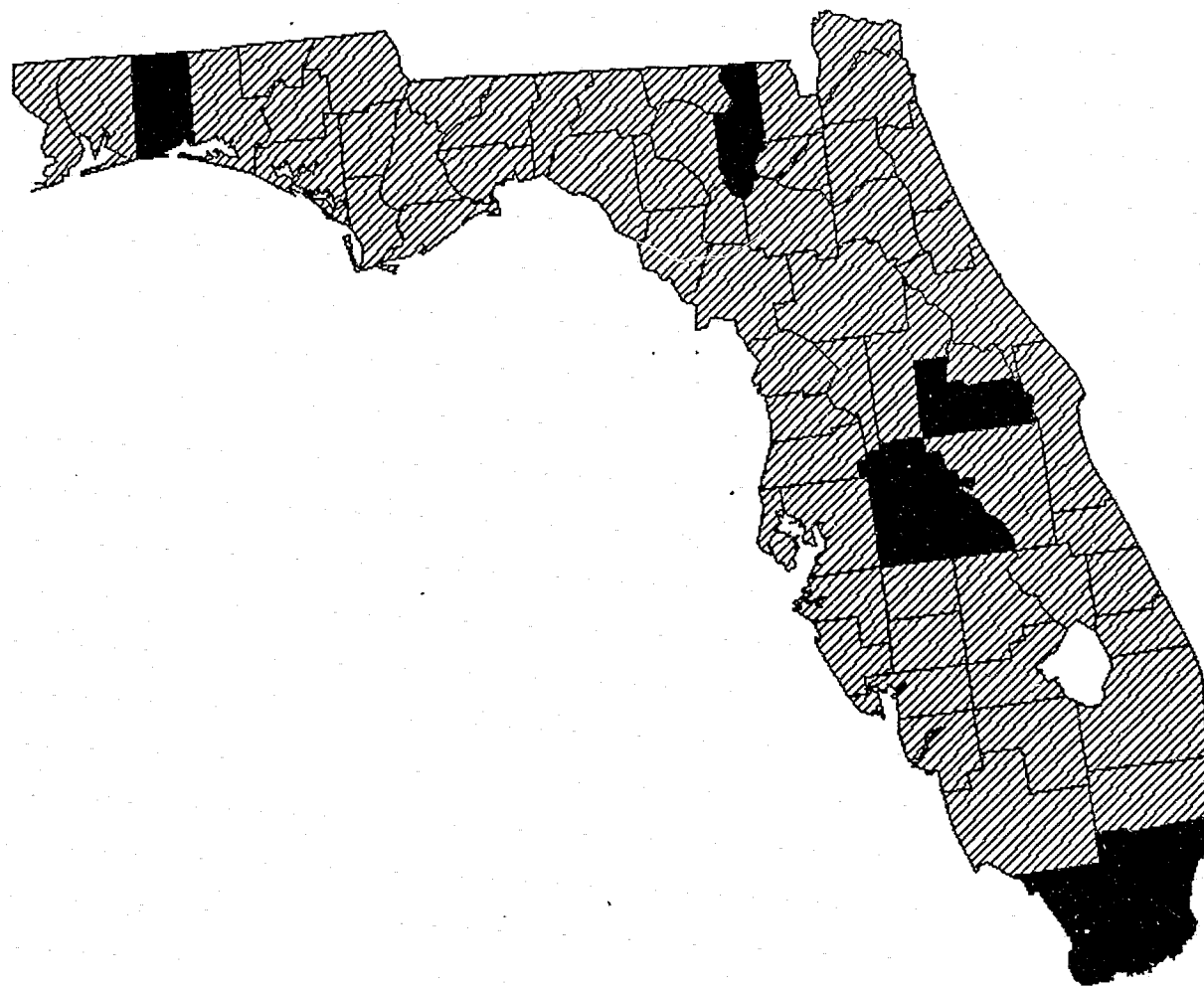

DESCRIPTIVE DATA

JAIL DATA SUMMARY 1990 - 1992

During the three year period covered by this report the annual average daily population of adult males increased by 5.0% (29,328 to 30,805), while the adult female population increased 4.9% (3,488 to 3,659). The juvenile male population increased 7.5% (790 to 849), and the juvenile female population reflected an decrease of 22.7 percent (22 to 17) in the three year period. See Table 4.

Adult Male Felons

Of the four adult male felony categories tracked, those sentenced to 364 days or less showed the highest rate of increase (21.9%) during the 90-92 time frame. A 4.2% decrease was reported for the felony awaiting trial category which comprises about 75% of the total adult male felony population. During the three year period under observation the ratio of pretrial detainees decreased from 76% of the total male felony population in 1990 to 73% by 1992. The pretrial category of male felons dominates the current jail population in absolute numbers. In 1990 male adult felons represented 60.9% of the total jail population while in 1992 the ratio was 57.7% .

Adult Male Misdemeanants

The total adult male misdemeanor category increased by 14.7% (5,060 to 5,806) over the past three years. The sentenced misdemeanor category represented the single largest increase at 20.5 percent. Of the the male misdemeanor population in 1990, 48.9% were sentenced. By 1992, that ratio increased to 51.3% .

The awaiting trial misdemeanant category in 1990 was 49.1%, and that population dropped at the rate of 47.5% in 1992. The ratio of adult male misdemeanants to the total adult male population was 17.3% in 1990 and 18.8 in 1992.

Adult Male - "Other" Category

Probation violators represented the largest number of the adult male population in the "Other" category. This category increased by 10.7% during the 1990 - 1992 period. The parole violator population increased by 90 or 391.3% during the three year period, while the state inmate numbers increased by 17.9 percent (from 464 to 547). The "Other" category represented 3,784 or 12.9 of the 1990 adult male population. By 1992 that number had increased to 4,613 (15.0%) of the daily average.

The adult male average daily population figures for the 1990-1992 period can be summarized as follows:

- * In 1990, 69.8% (20,484) were adult male felons. 17.3% (5,060) were misdemeanants, and 12.9% were included in the "Other" category.
- * By 1992, 66.2% (20,385) were adult male felons, 18.8% (5,806) were adult male misdemeanants and 15.0% (4,613) comprised the "Other" category.
- * The adult felony male awaiting trial category in 1990 represented 55.3% of the total adult male population. In 1992 that ratio had decreased to 48.1 percent.

Adult Female Felons

Of the four adult female felony categories those sentenced to 364 days or less reflected the highest rate of increase (7.0%) during 1990-92. During this same time period those sentenced to 365 days or more increased by 2.7%, those awaiting trial decreased by 4.5%, and females

awaiting sentencing decreased by 20.0 percent. Similar to the adult males, adult female felons who are awaiting trial represent the largest segment of the adult female felon average daily population. In 1990 the ratio of adult female felons awaiting trial was 68.9% (1,463) and in 1992 the ratio was 67.1% (1,397). The total adult female felony average daily population decreased from 2,122 to 2,081 (1.9%) during the three year period.

Adult Female Misdemeanants

The total adult female misdemeanor category increased by 17.8% (791 to 962) over the past three years. Sentenced misdemeanants increased by 18.5%, awaiting trial by 25.3%, and awaiting sentencing reflected a decrease of 8.3%. The ratio of female misdemeanants to the entire adult female jail population was 22.7% in 1990 and 26.3% in 1992.

Adult Female - "Other" Category

When comparing similar categories with the male inmate ADP, probation violators also represented the largest group of adult females in the "Other" category. From 1990 to 1992, there was an increase of 12.5% (327 to 368) in this category. The parole violator numbers jumped to an increase of 1,000% (1 to 11), while the state inmate category decreased by 26.4%. The "Other" category of adult females increased 7.1 for 1990-92. The following summary of the adult female jail population during the period 1990 to 1992 is made:

- * The total number of adult female felons increased by 0.7% (2,067 to 2,081).
- * Distribution of the ADP in 1990 was 60.8% (2,122) felons, 22.7% (791) misdemeanants and 16.5% (575) "Others".
- * In 1992 the distribution of the female ADP was 56.9% (2,081) felons, 26.3% (962) misdemeanants and 16.8% (616) "Other".
- * The felony awaiting trial category dominates the adult female ADP categories standing at 41.9% (1,463) in 1990 and falling to 38.2% (1,397) of the total of the female categories tracked in 1992.

JUVENILES

The juvenile population in Florida's county jails is dominantly male. Of the 812 total ADP in 1990, 97.3% (790) were males and in 1992 the ratio was 98.0% (849) of the total of 866 juveniles. Unlike the adult population categories, juvenile "pretrial" and "awaiting sentencing" are combined. But very much like the adult population most are unsentenced and were 82.6% (655 males and 16 females) of the ADP in 1990 and 85.8% (729 males and 14 females) in 1992.

COUNTY ADP AND INCARCERATION RATES

From 1990 to 1992, ADP's increased in 38 counties--except for the following 27 counties: Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Brevard, Broward, Calhoun, Clay, Collier, Dixie, Gadsden, Glades, Hamilton, Holmes, Jefferson, Levy, Liberty, Madison, Osceola, Pinellas, Polk, Putnam, St. Johns, Seminole, Sumter, Suwannee, Union, and Walton. See Table 5.

The range was a 40.0% decrease in Union County to 313.6% increase in Wakulla County. Incarceration rate changes for 1990-92 varied from a 29.4% decrease in Calhoun County to a 281.3% increase in Wakulla County. See Table 6. The high increase in Wakulla County's inmate population and incarceration rate, as well as some of the other counties, is the result of holding a large proportion of the inmate population for the U. S. Marshal and contracting of bedspace.

LEGAL STATUS OF COUNTY JAILS

County jails in Florida are subject to civil action in the various federal district courts and state circuit courts. Table 7 depicts the status of those counties that have a record of court action ending 1992, most of which are under court order, settlement, or consent decrees. The suits contain no record of dismissal and, therefore, include active cases. Two counties had state suits dismissed during 1992, one county went under settlement in both state and federal cases, and two new lawsuits were filed by the Department in 1992.

An analysis reveals that of the 67 counties, 18 (26.9%) are under federal action (active or inactive), 13 (19.4%) are under state action and 5 (7.5%) have both federal and state action pending. Federal actions are inmate initiated class action suits arising generally out of conditions of confinement. State action is initiated by DC most often from citations of overcrowding, fire safety violations, staffing problems, and totality of conditions. The corrective action required is significant renovation of existing facilities, temporary additions, and/or construction of new jails.

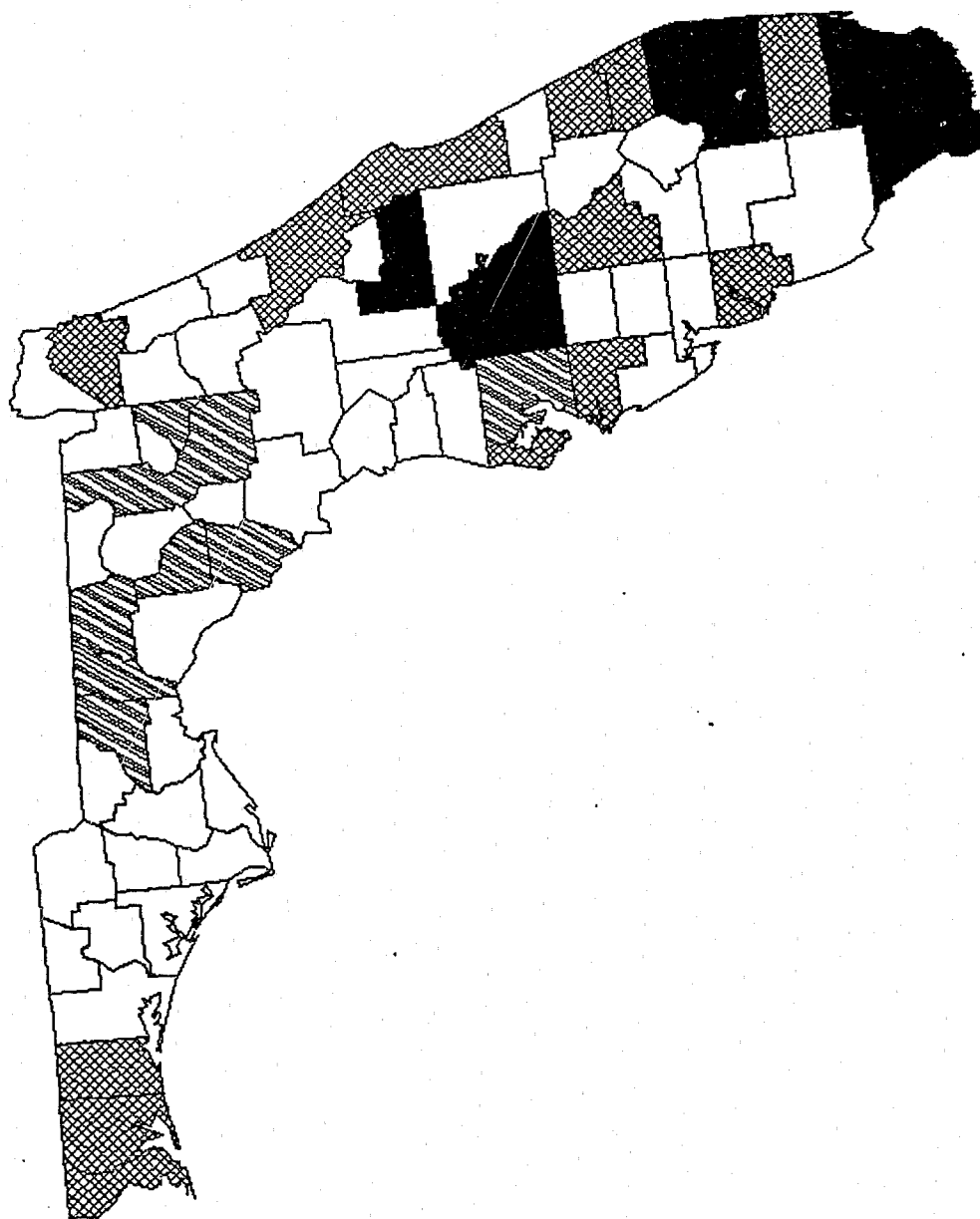

TRENDS

TRENDS SUMMARY

The county jail inmate data collected demonstrates the jail population will continue to increase into the future. No one single element of the criminal justice process is responsible for nor can any one single function reverse the trends of the past three years.

This report identifies the symptoms and not the cause of the population growth in the jail system of Florida.

The longitudinal data identified in this section provides basic information on inmate population and capacity trends. The data cited are annual averages. The following discussion is based on Table 8 and Figures 3 through 10.

The facility daily average of all inmates increased by 5.0% during the period 1990 - 1992. The capacity of all facilities increased by 17.1%. The population was 215 inmates (0.6%) over capacity in 1990. The inmate population was 4.5% (1,646), under capacity in 1991, and dropped to 9.7% (3,786) below capacity in 1992. In 1990, 16 of 67 counties operated 31 of 110 facilities with inmate populations beyond their DC rated capacity. In 1991, 11 counties operated 27 of 107 facilities beyond capacity, and in 1992, 19 of 108 facilities were above their rated capacity in 6 of the 67 counties.

The population trends for total ADP, adult male, adult female and juveniles for the 1989 - 1991, reporting period as shown in Figures 3, 4, 5, and 6 graphically demonstrate a relatively stable and constant

increase in all categories. There is a seasonal drop from November to December of each year in the inmate ADP which recovers in January and moves back to a "normal" rate of increase.

The annual average ADP has increased by 1.7% a year from 1990-92, while the capacity rate has increased at a significantly higher ratio of 5.7% which has and will continue to contribute to alleviate the overcrowding numbers in the jail population in Florida.

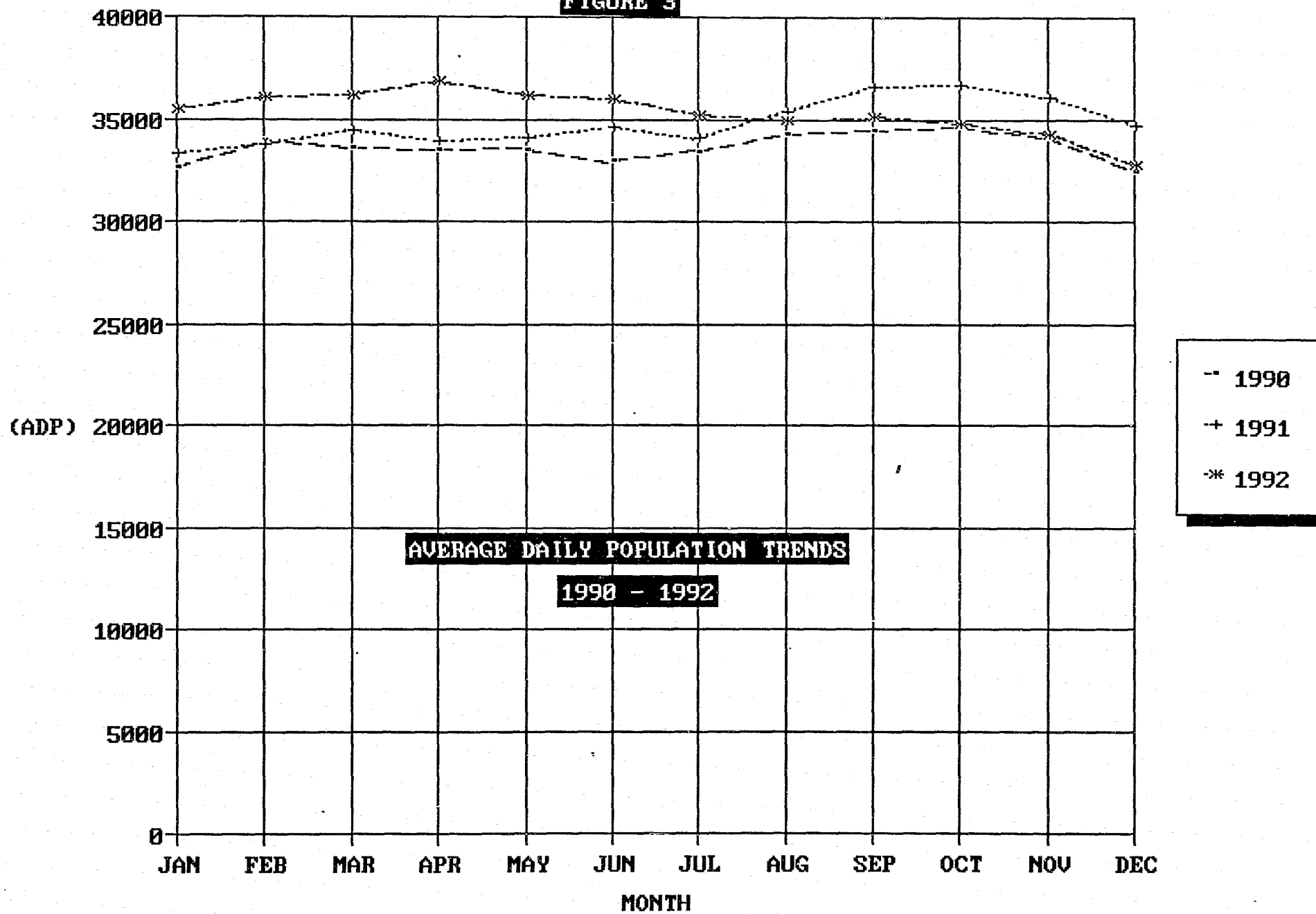

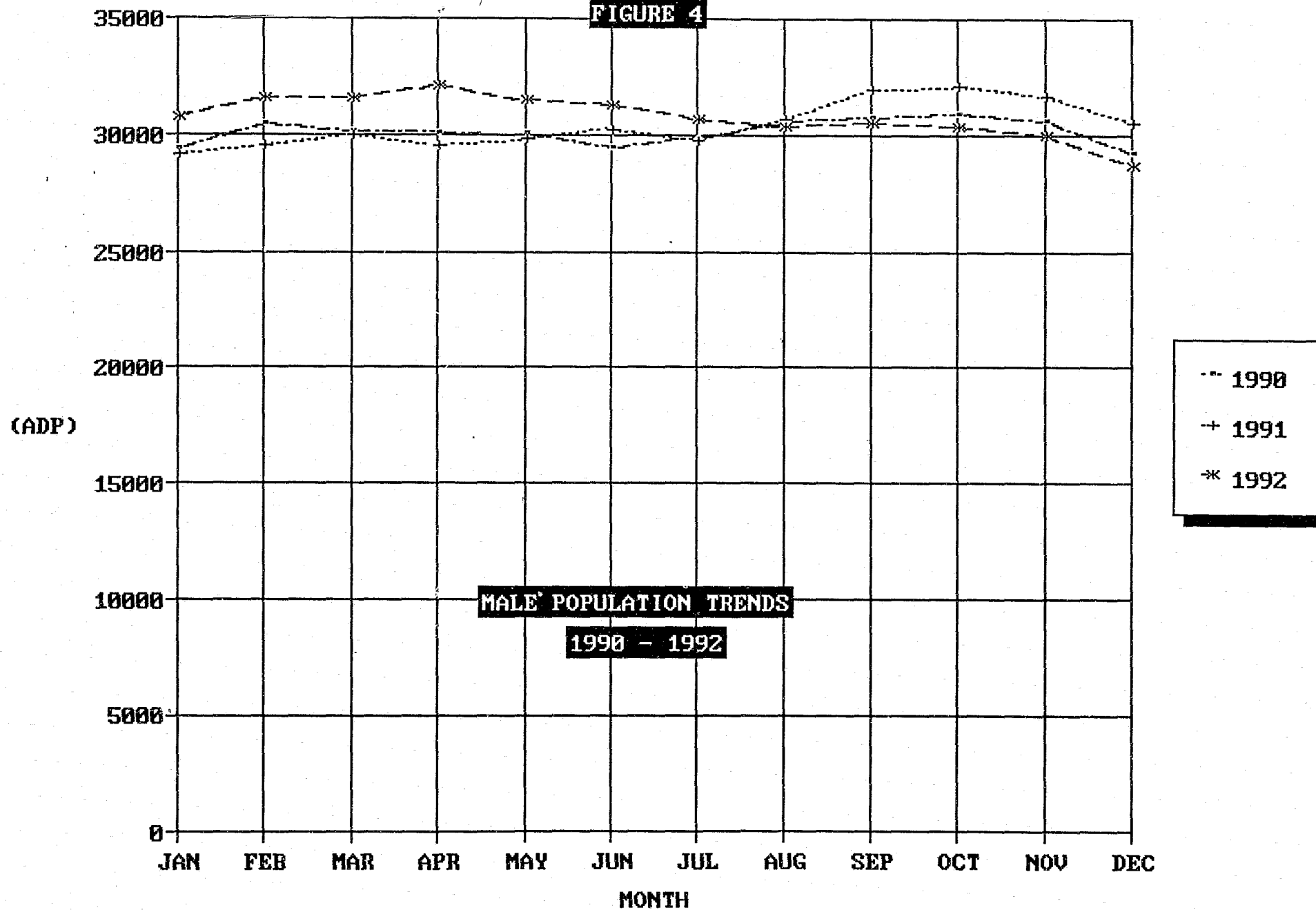

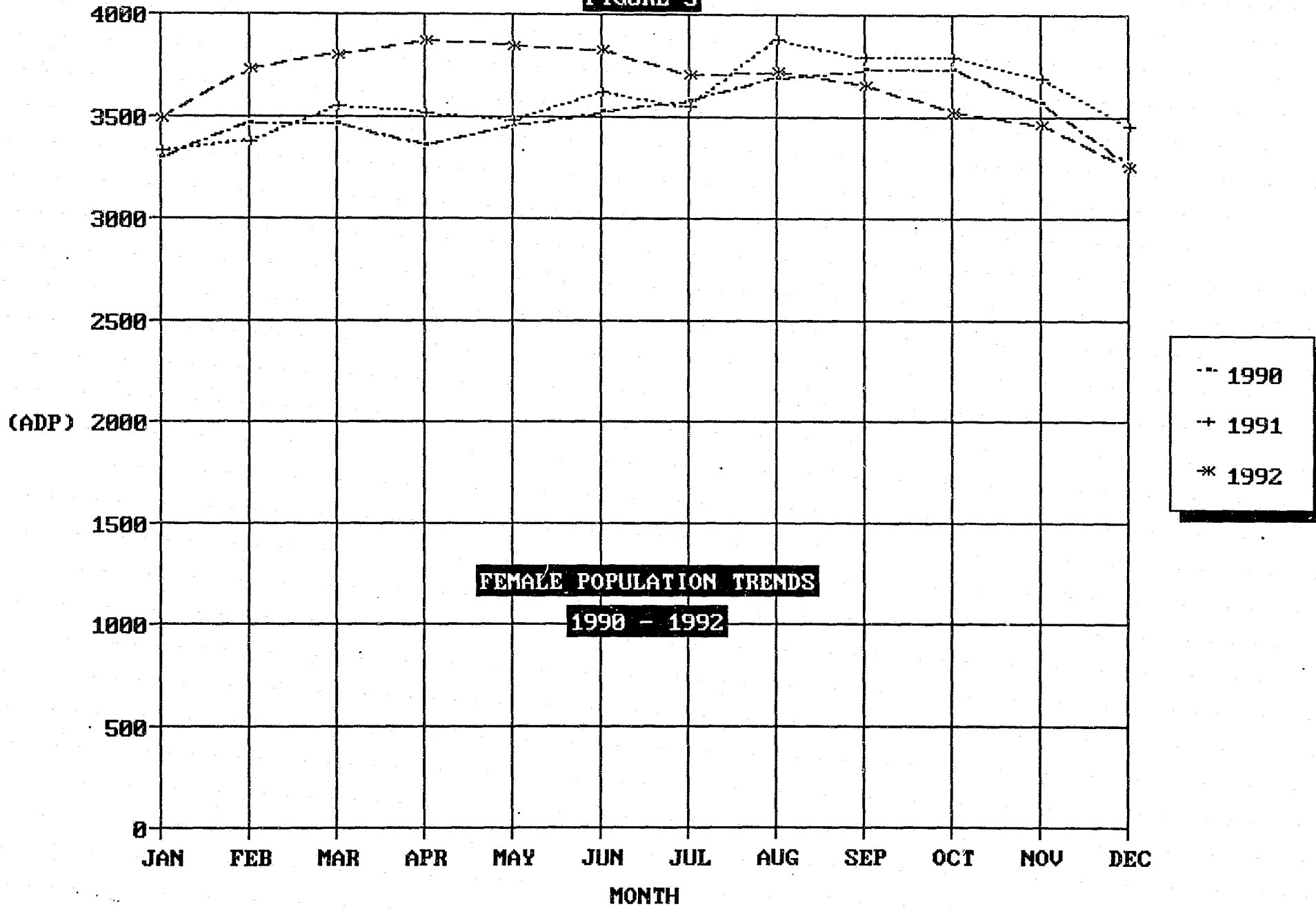
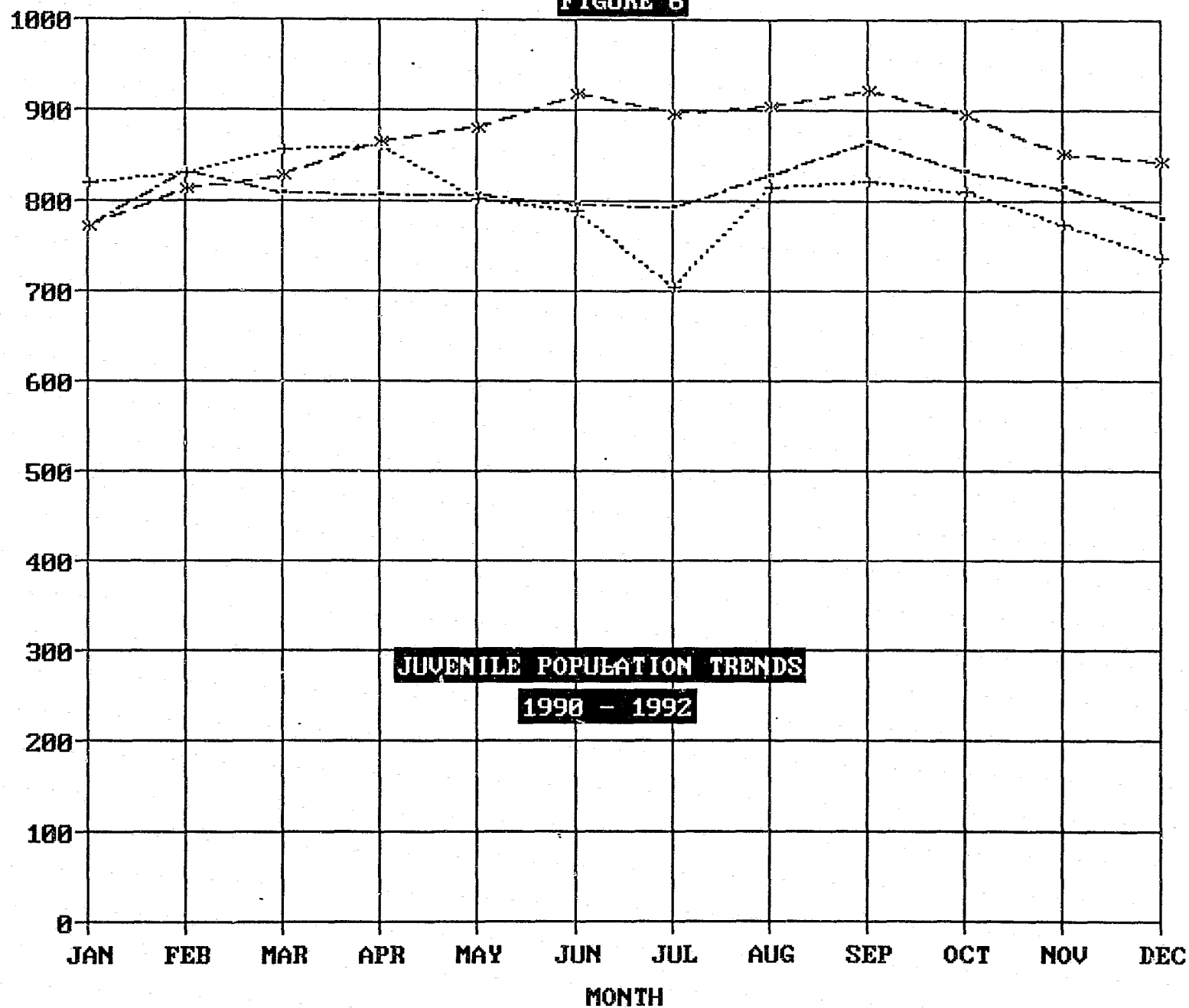

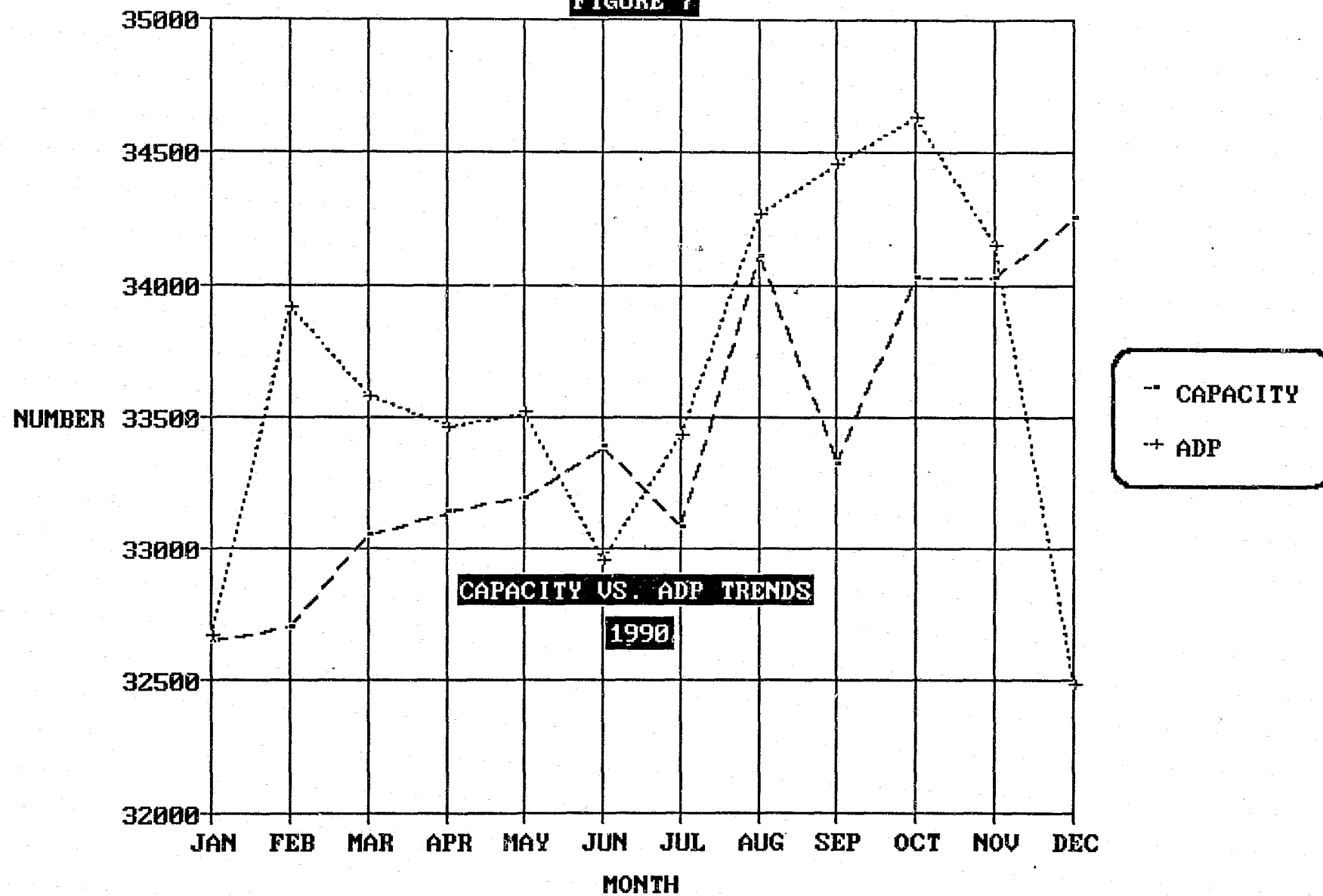

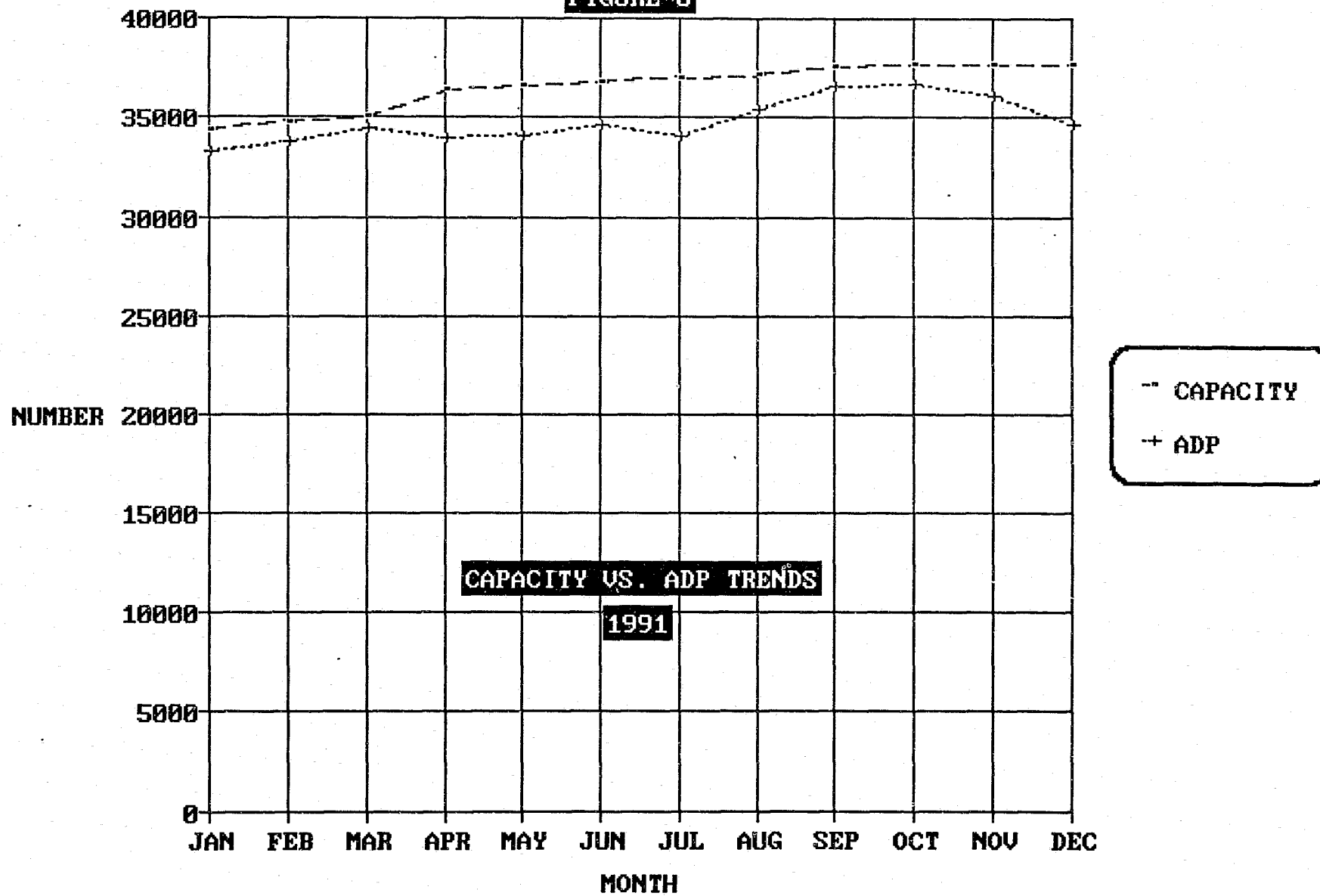

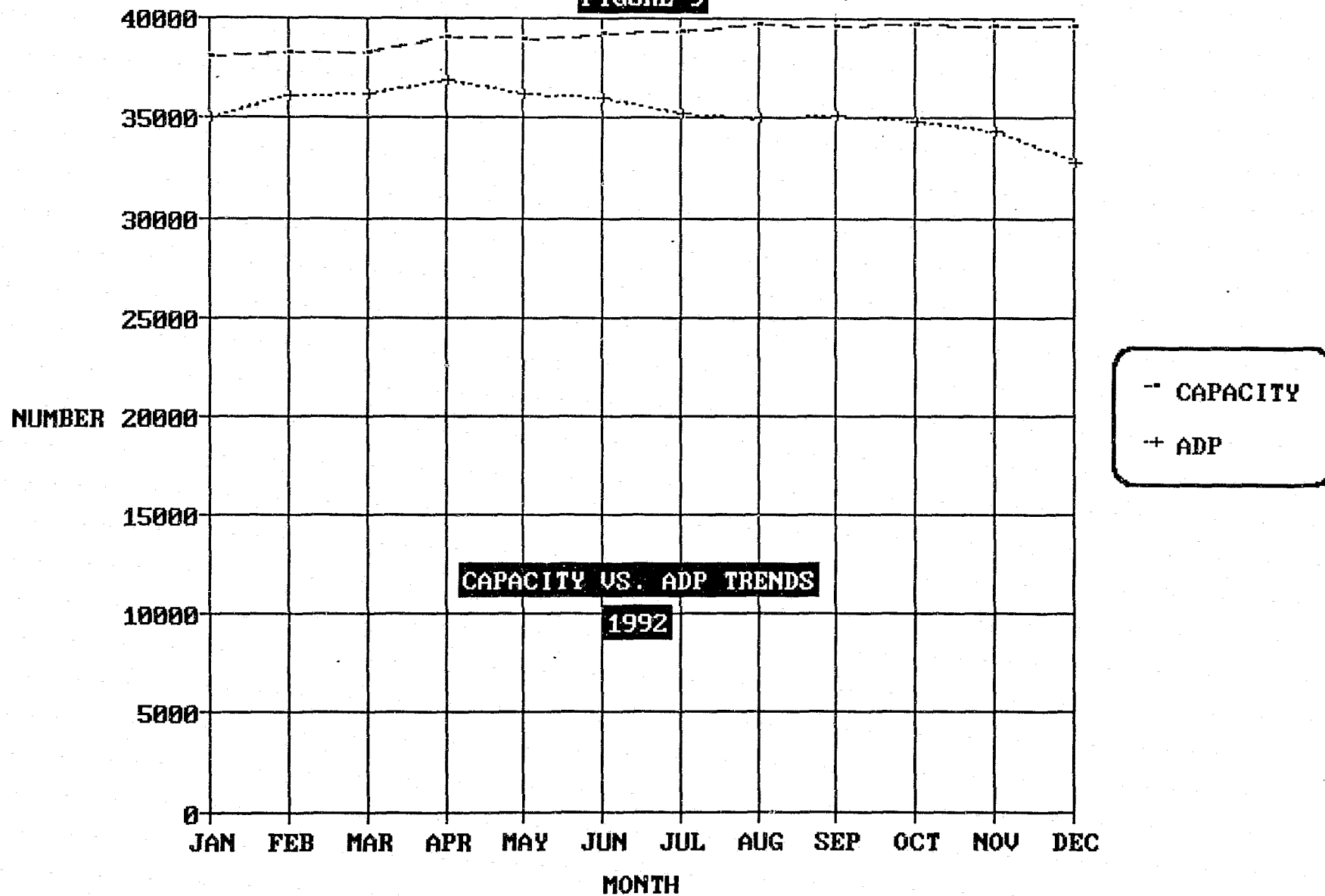
