INTRODUCTION

The Maryland Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program is one of the measures that has been taken in the establishment of an effective Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) for the State. This particular phase of the CJIS focuses on the incidence of crime and law enforcement. By establishing a method to collect, evaluate and process uniform statistical data on crime statewide, the Maryland UCR Program provides the means to forward more valid data to the Federal Bureau of Investigation from a single agency and also to consolidate it into an annual report entitled "Crime in Maryland".

NATIONAL UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM

The counterpart of the Statewide UCR Program is the National UCR Program which is under the direction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The National Program resulted from a need for a uniform compilation of crime statistics nationwide. Uniform Crime Reports were first collected in 1930 after being developed by a committee of the International Association of Chiefs of Police.

The IACP continues to serve in an advisory capacity to the FBI in the current operation of the Program.

Crime statistics voluntarily submitted by individual law enforcement agencies from all fifty states are presented annually in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reports Publication entitled "Crime in the United States".

MARYLAND UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM

The FBI has actively assisted individual states in the development of State UCR Programs compatible with the National Program. Maryland took advantage of this assistance in 1972 and was able to develop its own program by 1975.

The responsibility and authority for the collection and dissemination of UCR data was given to the Maryland Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (State Police) under Article 88B, Sections 9 and 10, of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

The Maryland Uniform Crime Reporting Program became operational January 1, 1975. This program consists of the uniform classification, review, compilation and analysis of crime statistics reported by all law enforcement agencies of the state pursuant to the guidelines and regulations prescribed by law.

PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

In keeping with the recommendation of the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Justice, the Maryland UCR Program was planned for eventual growth into a complete and integrated offender based Criminal Justice Information System. Under this program, each offender arrested in Maryland will be tracked through the entire criminal justice system from time of arrest through the courts to the correctional system where his exit (Parole, expiration of sentence, etc.) will be recorded. In this manner, a complete "criminal history" on individual offenders will be available for use by the police, courts, and correctional agencies in Maryland. In addition, statistical data derived from the CJIS Program will provide assistance in determining the overall efficiency of the criminal justice system in Maryland and will make effective management studies possible.

The fundamental objectives of the Maryland UCR Program are:

1. Inform the governor, legislature, other governmental officials, and the public as to the nature of the crime problem in Maryland - its magnitude and its trends.
2. Provide law enforcement administrators with criminal statistics for administrative and operational use.
3. Determine who commits crimes by age, sex, race and other attributes in order to find the proper focus for crime prevention and enforcement.
4. Provide base data and statistics to measure the workload and effectiveness of Maryland's Criminal Justice System.
5. Provide base data and statistics to measure the effects of prevention and deterrence programs.
6. Provide base data and statistics for research to improve the efficiency, effectiveness and performance of criminal justice agencies.
7. Provide base data to assist in the assessment of social and other causes of crime for the development of theories of criminal behavior.
8. Provide the FBI with complete UCR data to be included in the national crime reports.

DEVELOPMENT

Effective September 1972, the first federal grant was awarded to the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (State Police) by the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration to provide money to initiate a Statewide Uniform Crime Reporting Program in Maryland. A committee for the implementation of this program was then established by State Police.

The committee made studies of the federal program, as well as several state UCR Programs, which were operational at that time. Forms, tally books, and the Maryland UCR Manual were developed, printed and distributed to all contributing agencies. Questionnaires concerning each law enforcement agency's record keeping system were distributed to determine their capability to fully participate in the State Program.

In September 1974, an additional grant was awarded to the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (State Police) by the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration for the purpose of hiring Field Records Representatives to serve as liaison officers between the State Program and the contributing law enforcement agencies. Also, additional clerical support for the State Program was provided in the grant.

During the developmental phase, several workshops were held in various parts of the State to present the UCR Program in detail to participating agencies. Since that time, supplemental workshops have been held as needed.

During 1975, the first year of operation, the UCR Staff concentrated its efforts in assisting requesting law enforcement agencies in devising or improving their record keeping system. The UCR Staff continued to keep the agencies trained in UCR and to provide assistance where needed. Agencies contributing to the UCR Program have increased from 102 agencies in 1975 to 129 in 1989.

The UCR Section collects crime information from these 129 agencies and publishes quarterly releases reflecting crime trends. In addition, this is the fifteenth annual report produced by the UCR Staff containing an in-depth analysis of all information collected in the UCR Program. It also includes for the first time the eleventh annual Maryland Battered Spouse Report.

REPORTING PROCEDURES

Under the Maryland UCR Program, law enforcement agencies are required to submit specified Uniform Crime Reports. The necessary information for each of the required reports is gathered from each agency's record of complaints, investigations and arrests.

Crime data and information is submitted by state, county, and municipal law enforcement agencies monthly on the number of offenses known to them in the following crime categories:

- (1) Criminal Homicide
- (2) Forcible Rape
- (3) Robbery
- (4) Assault
- (5) Breaking or Entering
- (6) Larceny
- (7) Motor Vehicle Theft
- (8) Arson*

The count of offenses is taken from the record of complaints received by law enforcement agencies from victims, witnesses, other sources, or discovered by them during their own operation. Complaints determined by subsequent investigation to be unfounded are eliminated from the count. The resulting number of "actual offenses known to law enforcement agencies" in these crime categories are reported without regard for whether anyone is arrested, stolen property is recovered, local prosecutive policy or any other consideration.

Reported offenses are recorded by the municipality and county in which they occur. Municipal law enforcement agencies report those crimes which occur within the cities and state or county agencies report those crimes which occur in the counties outside the cities.

A supplemental report is also submitted each month showing the value of stolen and recovered property, the type of property, and the type of offense within a crime category in which it was taken. This report also shows the number of stolen vehicles recovered locally and by other jurisdictions. In addition, each agency reports the number of all persons arrested by them or other agencies for crimes which they have reported occurred within their jurisdiction. This report also shows the age, sex and race of the arrestees and the disposition of the juvenile arrestees by the arresting agency. When applicable supplemental reports are also submitted regarding the persons, weapons and circumstances, etc., involved in homicides and spousal or officer assaults.

In addition, police employee data is collected on an annual basis.

VERIFICATION PROCESS

An obvious concern in the collection of crime statistics for law enforcement agencies throughout the state is the uniformity

and accuracy of data received. Program aides such as guides and instructions do not necessarily guarantee the accuracy and correctness of the reports submitted by the contributors. Therefore, additional controls are necessary.

Each report received by the UCR Section is recorded, examined and verified for mathematical accuracy, and possibly more important, for reasonableness. The verification process includes numerous checks to ensure the validity of information. The elimination of duplication of reporting by individual contributors receives particular attention. Minor errors are corrected by telephone contact with the contributors. Substantial variations and errors are adjusted through personal contacts. The personal contacts are invaluable to the accuracy and quality of reporting. Field Representatives are engaged in a constant educational effort, and as such, provide a vital link between the UCR Program and the contributor.

POPULATION DATA

The computation of crime rates as they appear in this report by municipality, county and state are based on the latest available population estimates for the year as provided by the Federal Bureau of Investigation through the cooperation and assistance of the United States Bureau of Census.

LIMITATIONS OF A UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM

Information currently collected by the Maryland Program is generally the same as that gathered by the National system, and the methods of classifying and scoring offenses and arrests are the same. This readily enables comparisons with other states and with the nation, as a whole. However, there are limitations to the information collected which should be clearly understood before any conclusions are drawn from the UCR data presented in this report.

The main goal of the UCR Program is to furnish police administrators with a measure of their activities and operational problems as indicated by the number of reported offenses, arrests, clearances, and the like.

A first step in the control of crime is to ascertain the true dimensions of the problem. However, present statistics as gathered by the UCR Program measure neither the real incidence of crime nor the full amount of economic loss to victims. Information regarding number of offenses and clearances is collected only for the eight Part I crimes. Value and type of property stolen and recovered data is requested only for property stolen in Part I offenses. For Part II offenses (except non-aggravated assault), the only information submitted is the number of arrests for these crimes according to the age,

sex, and race of the subject. Consequently, there is no record of the actual number of these offenses occurring, nor is there a calculation made for property loss, as in cases of Part II theft offenses and vandalism.

The Crime Index does not explicitly take into account the varying degrees of seriousness of its seven components. Each crime receives the same weight as it is added to the Index. Consequently, as auto theft is counted the same as a murder, and an aggravated assault is weighed equally with an attempted breaking or entering. Any review of crime must consider the volume, rate and trend of each offense that comprises the Index and the relationship between these seven crimes*.


The Maryland and National Uniform Crime Reporting Programs are designed to measure offenses committed and persons arrested, and difficulties can arise if this distinction is not kept clearly in mind. Crimes relate to events, but arrests relate to persons. Unlike traffic violations where there is usually one event with one violation and one offender, a single criminal act can involve several crimes, several offenders and several victims. Relating specific crimes to the criminal, or specific offenses to characteristics of those arrested, is generally beyond the scope of the present Uniform Crime Reporting system.

Juvenile crime and arrest statistics, because of their nature, are another area of misunderstanding. Many juvenile offenders are handled informally and, as a consequence, inaccurate or incomplete recording of the event or action may result. Procedures for handling juveniles vary between departments more so than the handling of adult offenders. Furthermore, the degree of juvenile involvement in solved offenses is probably seriously misunderstood, because juvenile participation in clearances is recorded only when juveniles are exclusively involved. When both adults and juveniles are subjects in a clearance, the juvenile participation is not reported.

The preceding comments should not be viewed as an indictment of the Uniform Crime Reporting Program which, admittedly, is designed for the operational requirements of law enforcement agencies. While current methods of gathering and reporting crime and arrest data provide a less than complete picture of criminality in our society, there is at present no other information system in general use that will more adequately perform this task.

CLASSIFICATION OF OFFENSES

Uniformity in reporting is based upon the proper classification of offenses.

The adoption of the Federal System of UCR included the utilization of the offense classifications of that system. Law enforcement agencies of this State have made accurate application of those classifications in the reports submitted to the Maryland UCR System.

OFFENSES IN UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING

Offenses in UCR are divided into two groupings designated as Part I and Part II offenses. Offense and arrest information is reported for the Part I offenses whereas only arrest information is reported for Part II offenses.

The Part I offenses are as follows:

1. CRIMINAL HOMICIDE

The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one person by another.

Includes murder and all nonnegligent manslaughter (except traffic fatalities) including cases involving possible legal justification or excuse, etc. for the killing such as self defense or insanity, etc. the willful killing of one person by another is being reported, not the liability, guilt or innocence, etc. The only justifiable or excusable homicide specifically identified in UCR is limited to the killing of a felon by a peace officer in the line of duty or during the commission of a felony by a private citizen.

Excludes attempts/assaults to murder/kill (see aggravated assault), accidental deaths (see manslaughter by negligence), suicides and traffic fatalities.

2. RAPE

Sexual intercourse with a female forcibly and against her will and attempts to commit same. Includes:

- a) Rape achieved by the use of a weapon, physical force, threat or placing the victim in fear, and
- b) Attempt/assault to rape.

Excludes statutory offenses (i.e. victim under the age of consent) unless against her will and a weapon, force, threat, fear or intimidation was involved; and other sex offenses, e.g. sodomy, indecent exposure or touching only, etc.

3. ROBBERY

The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person(s) by the use of a weapon, physical force, threat or placing the victim in fear.

Includes holdup/stickup achieved by:

- a) Firearm
- b) Knife or other stabbing/cutting instrument
- c) Other dangerous weapon, and
- d) Strongarm-mugging/yolking by physical force, attack or threat.

Excludes pocket-picking, purse snatching and shoplifting, etc., in which the use of force or threat by the assailant and resistance, awareness or fear by the victim is absent (see larceny).

4. AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Unlawful assault with a weapon or other means having the potential to cause death or serious injury and attempts to commit same, or without a weapon which results in serious injury.

Includes attempts/assaults to murder/kill or seriously injure/maim such as the use or threatened use of dangerous/deadly weapons:

- a) Firearm
- b) Knife or other stabbing/cutting instrument and
- c) Other dangerous weapon including, but not limited to objects/instruments to club, beat, strike, choke or burn, and caustic, poisonous or explosive substances.
- d) Assaults with hands, fists, teeth, feet, etc. which result in serious injury, e.g. broken bones, unconsciousness, laceration requiring stitches, internal injuries, etc.

Excludes assaults with hands, fists, feet, etc. which result in minor injuries only, e.g. contusions, abrasions, small lacerations, etc., and with a weapon which lacks the potential to injure and no injury has resulted, e.g. pillow, water, magazine, empty container, toy, etc. (see other assaults-simple).

5. BURGLARY

The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft.

Includes:

- a) Forcible entry including the use of lock picks, plastic card, master key, unauthorized use of a key, etc.
- b) Unlawful entry-no force (trespass) through open or unlocked door, window, doorway, entrance, or into an area of restricted access, etc., and
- c) Attempted forcible entry.

Excludes unlawful entry where no theft, felony or attempt was involved, e.g. by a vandal, homeless person, etc.; unlawful entry of a place which is not considered a structure for UCR purposes, e.g. boat, recreational vehicle, housetrailer, tent, carport, pavilion, etc.; and lawful entry of a place of open access (see larceny from building and definition of a structure in UCR Handbook).

6. LARCENY

The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person(s) without their consent or knowledge.

Includes:

- a) Pocket-picking
- b) Purse snatching
- c) Shoplifting
- d) From motor vehicle
- e) Of motor vehicle parts and accessories

- f) Bicycles
- g) From buildings (without trespass)
- h) From coin operated device, and
- i) All other larceny not within above categories e.g. thefts from a boat, housetrailer, tent, construction site, fenced enclosure, etc.; and of a boat, animal, construction/farm/garden equipment or tools, lawn furniture, obtaining gas from a self service gas station without paying etc.

Excludes thefts by means of embezzlement, forgery, counterfeiting, con games, false pretenses, bad checks, unauthorized use of credit and automatic teller machine cards, obtaining gas at a full service gas station without paying, failure to pay bills, etc. in which the thief is given, entrusted with or permitted to obtain their money or property by the victim.

7. MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

Includes the taking of a:

- a) Car, automobile, taxi, etc.
- b) Truck, bus, van, recreational vehicle, motor home, etc., and
- c) Other vehicle, e.g. motorcycle, snow mobile, golf cart, go cart, etc. by a person not having lawful access to it.

Excludes the unauthorized use or failure to return a vehicle by a person having lawful access to it, e.g. family members, friends, employee, vehicle leasee, etc. Also excludes taking machinery which is not a motor vehicle for UCR purposes, e.g. boats, airplanes, farm/construction/roadbuilding equipment, etc. (see larceny and definition of a motor vehicle in UCR Handbook).

8. ARSON

Any willful and/or malicious burning or attempt to burn a house, building, fence, vehicle, boat, aircraft, personal property, goods, lumber, timber, trees, crops, field, etc.

Includes only fires, burnings and attempts which have been determined through qualified investigation to have been willfully and/or maliciously started by a person(s).

Excludes fires, burnings and/or attempts which are of a suspicious nature, but as yet unknown or undetermined origin.

THE PART II OFFENSES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

9. OTHER ASSAULTS-SIMPLE

Assaults or attempts which do not involve the use of a potentially harmful weapon and/or in which the victim does not sustain a serious injury.

10. FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

In this class are placed all offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering or possessing, with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.

Includes making, altering, forging, or counterfeiting bills, notes, drafts, tickets, checks, credit cards, coins, etc. Possessing or uttering forged or counterfeited instruments. Signing the name of another or fictitious person with intent to defraud. Using forged labels. Selling goods with altered, forged or counterfeited trade-marks, etc. All attempts to commit the above.

11. FRAUD

Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. Includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

12. EMBEZZLEMENT

Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to ones care, custody, or control.

13. STOLEN PROPERTY - BUYING, RECEIVING, POSSESSING

Include in this class all offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

14. VANDALISM

Vandalism consists of the willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law. This offense covers a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property, such as; cutting auto tires, drawing obscene pictures on public restroom walls, smashing windows, destroying school records, tipping over gravestones, defacing library books, etc. Count all arrests for the above, including attempts.

15. WEAPONS - CARRYING, POSSESSING, ETC.

This class deals with weapon offenses, regulatory in nature, such as:

Manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons.

Carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly.

Using, manufacturing, etc., silencers.

Furnishing deadly weapons to minors.

Aliens possessing deadly weapons.

All attempts to commit any of the above.

16. PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE

Include in this class the sex offenses of a commercialized nature, such as:

Prostitution.

Keeping bawdy house, disorderly house, or house of ill fame.

Pandering, procuring, transporting, or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc.

All attempts to commit any of the above.

17. SEX OFFENSES

Except forcible rape, prostitution and commercialized vice.

Include offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like, such as:

Adultery and fornication

Incest

Indecent exposure, indecent liberties, etc.

Intercourse with an insane, epileptic, or venerally diseased person.

Sodomy, buggery or crime against nature.

Statutory rape (no force) and seduction, etc.

All attempts to commit any of the above.

18. DRUG ABUSE LAWS

Drug abuse law arrests are requested on the basis of the narcotics used. Make the following subdivisions of drug abuse law arrests:

Include all arrests for violations of state and local laws, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and making of narcotic drugs:

- a) Opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroine, codeine).
- b) Marijuana
- c) Synthetic narcotics--manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (demerol, methadones).
- d) Dangerous nonnarcotic drugs (barbiturates, benzedrine).

19. GAMBLING

All charges which relate to promoting, permitting, or engaging in gambling are included in this category. To provide a more refined collection of gambling

arrests, the following breakdown of gambling arrests should be furnished:

- a) Bookmaking (horse and sport book).
- b) Numbers and lottery.
- c) All other.

20. OFFENSES AGAINST THE FAMILY AND CHILDREN

Include here all charges of nonsupport and neglect or abuse of family and children, such as:

Desertion, abandonment, nonsupport of wife or child or nonpayment of alimony.

Neglect or abuse of child. (If injury is serious, score as aggravated assault).

All attempts to commit any of the above.

21. DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

This class is limited to the driving or operating of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics. Include:

Operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated.

Operating an engine, train, streetcar, boat, etc., while intoxicated.

22. LIQUOR LAWS

With the exception of "drunkenness" (Offense #23), and "driving under the influence" (Offense #21), liquor law violations, state or local are placed in this class. Include:

Manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing, etc., intoxicating liquor.

Maintaining unlawful drinking places.

Advertising and soliciting orders for intoxicating liquor.

Furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person.

Using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor.

Drinking on train or public conveyance.

All attempts to commit any of the above.

23. DRUNKENNESS

Not reported in Maryland.

24. DISORDERLY CONDUCT

In this class are placed all charges of committing a breach of the public peace, safety or order, etc., such as:

Disturbing the peace and disorderly conduct, etc.

Disturbing meetings, religious services, hearings, etc.

Disorderly conduct on buses, trains, planes, public conveyances, etc.

Unlawful assembly, inciting to riot, riot, rout, etc.

Profanity, obscene language, blasphemy, etc.

All attempts to commit any of the above.

25. VAGRANCY

Include:

a) Vagrancy

b) Begging

c) Loitering (persons 18 and over)

26. ALL OTHER OFFENSES

Include in this class every other state or local offense (except traffic violations) not included in offenses 1 to 25, such as:

Admitting minors to improper place.

Abduction.

Blackmail and extortion

Bribery

Contempt of court.

Discrimination

Kidnapping

Marriage within prohibited degree.

Offenses contributing to juvenile delinquency (except as provided for in offenses 1 to 28 inclusive), such as employment of children in immoral vocations or practices, admitting minors to improper place, etc.

Perjury and subornation of perjury.

Possession, repair, manufacture, etc., of burglar's tools.

Possession or sale of obscene literature, pictures, etc.

Public nuisances.

Trespass

Unlawfully bringing weapons into prisons or hospitals.

Unlawfully bringing drugs or liquor into state prisons, hospitals, etc.; furnishing to convicts.

Unlawful disinterment of the dead and violation of sepulture.

Unlawful use, possession, etc., of explosives.

Violation of state regulatory laws and municipal ordinances (this does not include those offenses or regulations which belong in the above classes).

Violation of quarantine.

All offenses not otherwise classified.

All attempts to commit any of the above.

27. SUSPICION

While "suspicion" is not an offense, it is the grounds for many arrests in those jurisdictions where the law permits. After examination by law enforcement officers, the prisoner is either formally charged or released. Those formally charged are entered in one of the Part I or II offense classes. This class is limited to "suspicion" arrests where persons arrested are released by the police.

28. CURFEW AND LOITERING LAWS - JUVENILES

Count all arrests made by your department for violation of local curfew or loitering ordinances where such laws exist.

29. RUN-AWAY - JUVENILES

For the purpose of the Uniform Crime Reporting Program, report in this category apprehensions for protective custody as defined by your local statute. Count arrests made by other jurisdictions of run-aways from your jurisdiction. Do not include protective custody actions with respect to run-aways taken for other jurisdictions.

CRIME FACTORS

Statistics compiled under the Uniform Crime Reporting Program from data submitted by the law enforcement agencies of Maryland projects a statewide view of crime. Awareness of the presence of certain crime factors which may influence the resulting volume and type of statistics presented is necessary if fair and equitable conclusions are to be drawn. These crime influencing factors are present to some degree in every community, and their presence affects in varying degrees the crime experience of that community. Attempts at comparison of crime figures between communities should not be made without first considering the individual factors present in each community.

Crime, as an outgrowth of society, remains a social problem of grave concern, and the police are limited in their role to its suppression and detection. As stated by the President's Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of Criminal Justice in their report "The Challenge of Crime in a Free Society" (1967 - Page 92):

"But the fact that the police deal daily with crime does not mean that they have unlimited power to prevent it, or reduce it, or deter it. The police did not create and cannot resolve the social conditions that stimulate crime. They did not start and cannot stop the convulsive social changes that are taking place in America. They do not enact the laws that they are required to enforce, nor do they dispose of the criminals they arrest. The police are only one part of the criminal justice system; the criminal justice system is only one part of the government; and the government is only one part of society. Insofar as crime is a social phenomenon, crime prevention is the responsibility of every part of society. The criminal process is limited to case by case operations, one criminal or one crime at a time".

Set forth below are some of the conditions which affect the type and volume of crime that occurs from place to place:

Density and size of the community population and the metropolitan area of which it is a part.

Composition of the population with particular reference to age, sex and race.

Economic status of the population.

Relative stability of the population including number and ratio of seasonal visitors/residents, commuters and other transients.

Climate and seasonal weather conditions.

Educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.

Standards governing appointments to the police force.

Policies of the prosecuting officials and the courts.

Attitude of the public toward law enforcement problems.

The administrative and investigative efficiency of the local law enforcement agency, including the degree of adherence to crime reporting standards.

Organization and cooperation of adjoining and overlapping police jurisdictions.

CRIME INDEX

The tabulations presented in the tables, graphs, and charts in this publication indicate the volume and distribution of crime in Maryland on the basis of a Crime Index. The crime figures are broken down by agency, county, regional, and state totals.

The total number of criminal acts that occur is unknown, but those that are reported to law enforcement provide the first means of a count. Not all crimes are of sufficient importance to be significant in an index; and not all important crimes occur with enough regularity to be meaningful in an index. With these considerations in mind, the following crimes were selected to comprise the Crime Index as they are significant either by nature or frequency of occurrence:

1. Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter
2. Forcible Rape
3. Robbery
4. Aggravated Assault
5. Breaking or Entering
6. Larceny-Theft
7. Motor Vehicle Theft
8. Arson*

CALCULATION OF RATES AND TRENDS

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program provides data for police executives to measure local problems. To facilitate this function, it is sometimes necessary to convert the data into rates, percentages or trends. The following guidelines are presented to demonstrate the methods involved in making these calculations and conversions.

CRIME RATES

One of the most meaningful crime statistics is the Crime Rate. This rate is the number of offenses per 100,000 inhabitants. This rate can be calculated regardless of the number of inhabitants in your city or county. To compute rates, divide your city's population by 100,000 and divide the number of offenses in each class by that answer. The answer is the number of offenses in each class per 100,000 and is your Crime Rate for that offense. An example of this calculation is:

- | | |

| a) Population for your jurisdiction | 75,000 |
| b) Number of burglaries for your jurisdiction for a year | 215 |

*Arson statistics are not included in the Crime Index in this report.

Divide: 75,000 by 100,000 = .75

Divide: 215 by .75 = 286.7

Your burglary rate: 286.7 per 100,000 inhabitants

The number of .75 can now be divided into your totals in any offense class to produce a Crime Rate for that offense.

This same computation can be used to give you arrest rates per 100,000 inhabitants.

CLEARANCE RATES

The percentage of crimes cleared by arrest is obtained by dividing the number of offenses cleared by the number of actual offenses. This answer is then multiplied by 100. An example of this calculation is:

a) Number of clearances in robbery 38

b) Number of actual robberies 72

Divide: 38 by 72 = .528

Multiply: .528 x 100 = 52.8

Your percentage of clearance in robbery is 52.8%.

PERCENTAGE OF CHANGE

The method most commonly used to compare crime statistics for the current year with any prior year is the Percent of Change. This percent is calculated by subtracting the prior year's data from the current year's data and dividing the resulting figure by the prior year's data. The answer is then multiplied by 100. An example of this calculation is:

a) Current year's murders 399

b) Prior year's murders 350

Subtract: 350 from 399 = 49

Divide: 49 by 350 = .140

Multiply: .140 X 100 = 14.0

Your Percent of Change in murder is 14.0% increase.

OFFENSE DATA**

CRIME INDEX OFFENSES

The crime counts set forth in this publication are actual offenses established by police investigation. When police receive a complaint of a crime and the follow-up investigation discloses no crime occurred, it is "unfounded".

In 1989, police investigations "unfounded" 4 percent of the complaints concerning Index Offenses, ranging from 1 percent in the Aggravated Assault category to 19 percent in the Rape category as compared to 1988, when there was 1 percent "unfounded" in the Aggravated Assault category and 16 percent in the Rape category.

A total of 260,903 actual Index Offenses were reported to law enforcement agencies in Maryland during the Calendar Year 1989. This represents a decrease of 1.5 percent when compared to the 1988 data which was comprised of a total of 264,764 Crime Index Offenses.

An analysis of Index Offenses by month in 1989 shows that May had the highest frequency of occurrence and February had the lowest. In 1988, August had the highest frequency of occurrence and February had the lowest.

The Crime Index Offenses represent the most common problem to law enforcement. They are serious crimes by their nature, volume, or frequency of occurrence. They are categorized as Violent Crime, which includes Murder, Forcible Rape, Robbery and Aggravated Assault, or as Property Crimes which includes Breaking or Entering, Larceny, and Motor Vehicle Theft.

VIOLENT CRIME

Violent Crimes involve the element of personal confrontation between the perpetrator and the victim. Because of their very nature Violent Crimes are considered more serious than Property Crimes. These offenses accounted for 15 percent of the total Crime Index for 1989. In 1988, Violent Crimes accounted for 14 percent of the total Crime Index.

Analyzing the Violent Crimes by month reveals September had the greatest frequency of occurrence, while February had the lowest. In 1988, August had the highest frequency of occurrence and February had the lowest.

PROPERTY CRIME

The number of Property Crimes reported during 1989, was more than 5 times greater than the number of Violent Crimes reported. As a group, Property Crimes made up 85 percent of the total Crime Index. In 1988, Property Crimes made up 86 percent of the total Crime Index.

A monthly analysis showed August had the highest frequency of occurrence and February had the lowest in both 1989 and 1988.

RATES

Crime Rates relate the incidence of crime to the resident population. Many other factors which may contribute to the volume and type of crime in a given jurisdiction are not incorporated here, but are shown in the section entitled "Crime Factors".

In 1989, the Crime Rate for Maryland was 5,558.2 victims for every 100,000 population. This represents a 2.5 percent decrease in the Crime Rate when compared to 1988, with 5,701.2 victims per 100,000 population.

The 1989, Crime Rate for the Violent Crime group was 854.6 victims per 100,000 inhabitants, a 6 percent increase compared with the 1988 rate of 806.5. The Property Crime group had a rate of 4,703.7 per 100,000 inhabitants, a 4 percent decrease when compared to the 1988 rate of 4,894.7.

CLEARANCES

For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, a crime is cleared when police have identified the offender, have evidence to charge him and actually take him into custody. Solutions of crimes are also recorded in exceptional instances where some element beyond police control precludes formal charges against the offender, such as the victim's refusal to prosecute or local prosecution is declined because the subject is being prosecuted elsewhere for a crime committed in another jurisdiction. The arrest of one person can clear several crimes or several persons may be arrested in the process of solving one crime.

Maryland law enforcement agencies cleared 23 percent of all Index Offenses reported to them in 1989 and 1988.

The Violent Crimes recorded 49 percent clearance rate in 1989, as compared to 1988, with a 51 percent clearance rate. The Property Crime group experienced a 19 percent clearance rate in 1989, compared to 18 percent in 1988.

Considered individually the 1989 Violent Crime clearance rate was determined to be 71 percent of the Murders, 59 percent of the Rapes, 25 percent of the Robberies and 64 percent of the Aggravated Assaults. The Property Crime clearance rates were 18 percent for Breaking or Entering, 20 percent for Larceny and 17 percent for Motor Vehicle Theft.

The relatively high clearance rate for Violent Crimes as compared to Non-Violent Property Crimes is in part attributable to the volume difference between the two. Property Crime volume is much greater than that of Violent Crime and police investigation of Violent Crime is usually more intense. While the element of direct contact between the victim and perpetrator, as well as witness identification also contributes to this higher rate of solution for Violent Crime, stealth is involved to a greater degree in the Property Crimes.

JUVENILE CLEARANCES

A Juvenile clearance is the clearance of an offense in which all of the offenders involved were under the age of 18. If even one of the offenders was over 17 years of age, the clearance of that offense is not considered a Juvenile clearance.

In 1989, such Juvenile clearances represented 18 percent of all clearances. Juvenile clearances were 19 percent of the total cases cleared in 1988.

Juvenile clearances in the Violent Crime category represented 11 percent of the total cleared in 1989 with 5 percent of all clearances in Homicide cases, 12 percent of those in Rape cases, 10 percent in Robbery cases and 12 percent in Aggravated Assault cases.

In 1988, Juvenile clearances were also 11 percent of all clearances in the Violent Crime category.

In the Property Crime category, clearances involving juvenile offenders only represented 21 percent of the total cases cleared in 1989, with 17 percent of all clearances in Burglary cases, 20 percent of those in Larceny cases and 33 percent in Motor Vehicle Theft cases. Juvenile clearances were 22 percent of all clearances in the Property Crime category in 1988.

STOLEN PROPERTY VALUE


The total value of Property Stolen during 1989 was \$313,747,228 which represents a 2 percent decrease from 1988. Recovered Property amounted to \$155,668,406 which is 50 percent of the total stolen, resulting in a \$158,078,822 property loss to victims in the State of Maryland during 1989. This property loss represents a 5 percent decrease when compared to the property loss in 1988.


CRIME INDEX OFFENSES

VOLUME BY MONTH




VIOLENT CRIME

MURDER



MURDER

Murder is defined as the willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another. As a general rule, any death due to a fight, argument, quarrel, assault, a commission of a crime is counted as a Murder. This offense is scored on the basis of police investigation without regard to the findings of a court or jury or the decision of a prosecutor. Assaults to Murder and Attempted Murders are counted as Aggravated Assaults. Suicide, accidental deaths and justifiable homicides are also excluded.

VOLUME

In 1989, a total of 540 Murders were reported to law enforcement agencies in Maryland. This compares to *452 Murders in 1988 and represents an increase of 19 percent. Murder accounted for 1 percent of the total Violent Crime Category and .2 percent of the total Crime Index.

RATE

In 1989, there were 11.5 victims of Murder for every 100,000 residents in Maryland. This was a 19 percent increase over 1988, when the rate was 9.7 victims per 100,000 population.

NATURE

In 1989, firearms predominated as the weapon most often used in the commission of Murder in Maryland, representing 62 percent of the total. This compares to 63 percent of the total during 1988. 52 percent of the total Murders were committed with handguns, while 17 percent were committed with a knife or cutting instrument, 6 percent with a shotgun, 8 percent with personal weapons and 13 percent with other dangerous weapons. In 1988, 54 percent of the total Murders were committed with a handgun, 19 percent were committed with a knife or cutting instrument, 7 percent with a shotgun, 5 percent with personal weapons and 16 percent with other dangerous weapons.

Murders, as a result of Robberies, accounted for 11 percent of the total Murders, narcotic related Murders represented 30 percent. In 34 percent of the Murders, the circumstances were not determined at the time of the reports. In 1988, Murders, as a result of Robberies, accounted for 9 percent of the total Murders, while narcotic related Murders represented 26 percent. In 44 percent of the Murders, the circumstances were not determined at the time of the report.

*Total Murders reported during 1988, were adjusted from 450 (Crime in Maryland 1988) to 452. All references, percentages, comparisons, averages, etc., shown in this book have been adjusted accordingly.

The largest number of Murders (107) occurred in the 20-24 age group, which represented 20 percent of the total. In 1988, the largest number of Murders (87) occurred in the 25-29 age group, which represented 19 percent of the total.

CLEARANCES

In 1989, 71 percent of all Murders were cleared with 5 percent of the total solved involving only juveniles. This compares to 1988 with a 71 percent clearance rate and 8 percent of the total cleared involving only juveniles.


PERSONS ARRESTED

A total of 471 persons were arrested in Maryland for Murder during 1989. In 1988, 393 persons were arrested for Murder.

Of this total, 89 percent were males and 11 percent females. 80 percent of the total were black while 20 percent were white. 89 percent were adults and 11 percent were juveniles.

RAPE

Rape is the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. In Uniform Crime Reporting, Rape is divided into two categories: (1) Rape by Force, (2) Attempt to commit Forcible Rape. Statutory Rape or the carnal knowledge of a female with no force used and where the victim is under the legal age of consent, as well as other sex offenses, are not included in this category.

VOLUME

During 1989, 1,783 Forcible Rapes were reported to Maryland law enforcement agencies. This compares to 1,721 Rapes during 1988 and results in a 4 percent increase.

Rape accounted for 4 percent of the Violent Crimes and .7 percent of the total Crime Index.

The month of June showed the highest frequency of Rapes, while January showed the lowest. In 1988, August had the highest frequency and January showed the lowest.

RATE

A Crime Rate, in its proper perspective, is a victim risk rate since it equates the number of crimes per unit of population. In 1989, 76.0 out of every 100,000 females in Maryland were reported Rape Victims, as compared to 1988, when 74.1 per 100,000 female population were reported victims. This results in a 3 percent increase in the rate of Forcible Rapes.

NATURE

During 1989, 80 percent of all Rapes were actual Rapes by Force while 20 percent were attempts or assaults to commit Forcible Rape. In 1988, 79 percent of all Rapes were actual Rapes by Force while 21 percent were attempts or assaults to commit Forcible Rape.

CLEARANCES

In Calendar Year 1989, 59 percent of the total number of Rapes were cleared with 12 percent of the total solved involving only juveniles. In 1988, 58 percent of the total Rapes were cleared and 14 percent of the total cleared involved only juveniles.


PERSONS ARRESTED

In 1989, there were 869 persons arrested for Rape in Maryland. In 1988, 836 persons were arrested for Rape.

81 percent of the total number were 18 years of age or older, while the remaining 19 percent were juveniles. 67 percent of the total were black and 33 percent white.

ROBBERY



ROBBERY

Robbery is defined as the taking, or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or putting the victim in fear. The element of personal confrontation is always present in this crime. Under the Uniform Crime Reporting Program, all attempts to commit Robbery are included. Robberies are reported in four general categories -- firearms; knife or cutting instrument; other dangerous weapons; and hands, fists, feet, etc. As a general rule, Robbery differs from larceny in that it is aggravated by the element of force or threat of force.

Robbery, as a crime of Violence, has a serious impact on the victim. In many instances serious injury results. Many times, with or without physical injury, the victim suffers mental anguish. Such damage is immeasurable.

VOLUME

During 1989, there were 15,584 actual Robbery offenses reported to Maryland law enforcement agencies. In 1988, there were 13,991 robberies, which results in an increase of 11 percent.

Robbery accounted for 39 percent of the Violent Crime category and 7 percent of the total Crime Index.

A monthly comparison reveals that December had the highest frequency of Robberies while April had the lowest frequency. In 1988, December had the highest frequency and April had the lowest.

RATE

In 1989, Robbery Rate was 332.0 per 100,000 inhabitants. This compares to a rate of 301.3 per 100,000 population in 1988 and results in a 10 percent increase in the Robbery Rate.

NATURE

During 1989, 58 percent of the Robberies were committed on the street, while only 1 percent were Bank Robberies. In 1988, 61 percent of the Robberies were committed on the street while 1 percent were Bank Robberies.

Bank Robberies accounted for the highest average value loss, \$3,755 in 1989. The average value loss for total Robberies were \$702.

Armed perpetrators were responsible for 59 percent of the Robbery offenses while 41 percent were muggings or strong-arm Robberies. This compares to 1988, when 58 percent involved Armed Robberies and 42 percent were strong-arm.

An analysis of Armed Robbery by type of weapon indicates that the use of firearms was predominate, accounting for 74 percent of all Armed Robberies. Knives or cutting instruments made up 14 percent while other dangerous weapons accounted for 12 percent of all Armed Robberies. In 1988, 71 percent of the total Armed Robberies were committed with firearms, 16 percent with knives or cutting instruments and 13 percent with other dangerous weapons.

CLEARANCES

In 1989, 25 percent of the total number of Robberies were cleared with 10 percent of the total solved involving only juveniles. In 1988, 25 percent of the Robberies were cleared and 12 percent involved only juveniles.

24 percent of the Armed Robberies were cleared with 6 percent of the total solved involving only juveniles. 28 percent of the strong-arm Robberies were cleared and 15 percent involved only juveniles.

PERSONS ARRESTED


3,709 persons were arrested for Robbery in Maryland during 1989. In 1988, 3,518 persons were arrested for Robbery.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Aggravated Assault, as defined under the Maryland Uniform Crime Reporting Program, is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or serious bodily harm. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that any injury result when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed. Also included in this category are all attempted Murders.

Any assault in which hands, fists and feet are used with no serious injury to the victim results, is classified as a simple assault which falls into the Part II category, and is not included as a Crime Index Offense.

VOLUME

During 1989, a total of 22,206 Aggravated Assaults were reported to Maryland law enforcement agencies. In comparison, there were 21,290 Aggravated Assaults in 1988, resulting in a 4 percent increase.

Aggravated Assault made up 55 percent of the Violent Crime category and 9 percent of the total Crime Index. Aggravated Spousal Assaults accounted for 12.9 percent of the total Aggravated Assaults reported during 1989 and 13.3 percent in 1988.

The month of July had the highest frequency of Aggravated Assaults occurring, while February had the lowest.

RATE

For each 100,000 persons in Maryland during 1989, there were 473.1 victims of Aggravated Assault. During 1988, there were 440.3 Aggravated Assault victims per 100,000 population. A comparison of the two years results in a 7 percent increase.

NATURE

In 1989, 22 percent of the Aggravated Assaults were committed with the use of a firearm. A knife or cutting instrument was used in 20 percent of Assaults and 39 percent were committed with other dangerous weapons. The remaining 19 percent were committed with personal weapons, such as hands, fists, feet, etc. These figures compared to 1988, are 24 percent of Aggravated Assaults committed with a firearm, 22 percent with a knife or cutting instrument, 38 percent with other dangerous weapons, and 16 percent with personal weapons.

CLEARANCES

64 percent of the total number of Aggravated Assaults were cleared with 7 percent of the total clearances involving only juveniles. As compared to 1988, 67 percent of the total were cleared, and of those cleared, 10 percent involved only juveniles.


PERSONS ARRESTED

There were 6,831 arrests for Aggravated Assault in Maryland during 1989. In 1988, 6,965 persons were arrested.

81 percent of the total number of persons arrested for Aggravated Assault were adults, while 19 percent were juveniles. 53 percent of the total were black and 46 percent white. 84 percent of the total were males, while 16 percent were females.

BREAKING OR ENTERING

Breaking or Entering is defined as the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.

Data collection of this offense is further categorized as forcible entries, unlawful entries where no force is used and attempted forcible entries.

As with other property crimes, the motive of personal gain coupled with the element of opportunity results in the commission of this offense by both the amateur and the professional perpetrator. The absence of confrontation with and use of force against the person of the victim separates this crime from Robbery of the Violent Crime group.

The volume of this offense presents the police with a serious enforcement problem made more difficult in many areas by the lack of sufficient personnel to act as a deterrent and to provide successful solutions to these crimes.

VOLUME

In 1989, a total of 52,698 Breaking or Enterings were reported to Maryland law enforcement agencies. In comparison, there were 54,696 Breaking or Enterings in 1988 resulting in a 4 percent decrease.

Breaking or Enterings made up 24 percent of the Property Crime category and 20 percent of the total Crime Index.

A monthly analysis reveals that August had the highest frequency of occurrence while April had the lowest frequency.

RATE

The Breaking or Entering rate was 1,122.7 per 100,000 inhabitants of Maryland during 1989. In 1988, there were 1,177.8 Breaking or Entering Offenses per 100,000 population. In comparison, this results in a 5 percent decrease in the Breaking or Entering Rate.

NATURE

In both 1989 and 1988, 73 percent of the Breaking or Enterings involved forcible entry, 16 percent were unlawful entries without force and 11 percent were recorded as attempted forcible entries.

66 percent of all Breaking or Enterings were committed of a residential structure while 34 percent were committed of a nonresidential structure in both 1989 and 1988.

The average dollar value loss for Breaking or Entering was \$1,039. This compares to 1988 with \$950 and results in a 9 percent increase.

CLEARANCES

In 1989, law enforcement agencies in Maryland were successful in clearing 18 percent of the total Breaking or Entering Offenses of which 16 percent involved only juveniles. During 1988, police cleared 17 percent of the total Breaking or Enterings with 20 percent of that number involving only juveniles.



LARCENY



LARCENY

Larceny-Theft is defined as the unlawful taking, carrying, leading or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. It includes such crimes as pocket-picking, shoplifting, purse snatching, thefts from autos, thefts of auto parts and accessories, bicycle theft, etc. In the UCR Program, this category does not include embezzlement, fraud, forgery, and worthless checks. Motor Vehicle Theft, being a special problem, is a separate Crime Index Offense and is not reported in the Larceny-Theft category.

Clearance of Larceny Offenses by police arrest are dramatically affected by the nature of the crime. As with other Property Crimes, opportunity and stealth working in favor of the perpetrator and against police detection reduce clearances for this offense.

As with other Offenses Against Property, Larceny is primarily a crime of opportunity. Types of Larcenies will differ in volume depending upon the opportunity for theft offered in a given area.

The average dollar loss in this category was \$464 as compared to 1988 with an average loss of \$436 resulting in a 6 percent increase. Only a small amount of goods stolen are recovered and returned to victims due to the low clearance rate and lack of specific identification characteristics on the property. In addition, many offenses in this category, particularly where the value of goods stolen is small, never come to police attention.

VOLUME

In 1989, there were 136,929 Offenses of Larceny-Theft reported as compared to 1988 with 141,416 Offenses resulting in a 3 percent decrease. Larceny-Theft made up 52 percent of the Crime Index Total and 62 percent of the Property Crime Total.

August had the highest frequency of Larceny Offenses in a monthly analysis while January had the lowest.

RATE

The Larceny Crime Rate was 2,917.1 per 100,000 inhabitants of Maryland during 1989. In 1988, there were 3,045.1 Larcenies per 100,000 population resulting in a 4 percent decrease in the Larceny Rate.

NATURE

Larcenies from Autos recorded the highest percentage during both 1989 and 1988 with 21 percent of the total Larcenies reported in this category and Pocket-Picking had the lowest frequency with .6 percent of the total.

CLEARANCES

In 1989, law enforcement agencies cleared 20 percent of the total Larceny-Theft Offenses of which 20 percent of the total clearances involved only juveniles. In 1988, police cleared 19 percent of the total Larceny Offenses with 21 percent of that number involving only juveniles.

PERSONS ARRESTED


There were 27,971 persons arrested for Larceny in Maryland during 1989. In 1988, 26,960 persons were arrested for Larceny.

VOLUME BY MONTH



MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Motor Vehicle Theft is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. This definition excludes taking a motor vehicle for temporary use, such as a family situation or unauthorized use by others having lawful access to the vehicle, such as chauffeurs, etc.

The crime of Motor Vehicle Theft has been labeled primarily as a crime of opportunity. The youthful offender finds the motor vehicle easily accessible for transportation for any purpose. The remaining thefts are mainly for the purpose of resale, theft of parts and for use in committing other crimes.

VOLUME

In 1989, there were 31,163 Motor Vehicle Thefts reported to law enforcement agencies in the State of Maryland. This is a .1 percent decrease when compared to the 31,198 Motor Vehicle Thefts reported in 1988. Motor Vehicle Theft makes up 14 percent of the Property Offense category and 12 percent of the Index Offenses.

A monthly analysis for 1989 indicates that more motor vehicles were stolen during October than other months and February showed the fewest being stolen.

The 1989 Motor Vehicle Theft Rate of 663.9 per 100,000 inhabitants is 1 percent lower than the rate of 671.8 per 100,000 inhabitants for 1988.

NATURE

Automobiles accounted for 80 percent of the total number of vehicles stolen during 1989. Trucks and buses made up 14 percent and other motor vehicles comprised 6 percent of the total. In comparison, automobiles accounted for 81 percent, trucks and buses 12 percent and other motor vehicles 7 percent in 1988.

76 percent of the value of stolen vehicles was reported as recovered. This is a 1 percent increase when compared to 75 percent reported as recovered in 1988.



ARSON



ARSON

Arson is defined as any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc. Only fires determined through qualified investigation to have been willfully or maliciously set are classified as Arsons. Fires of suspicious or unknow origin are excluded.

According to UCR procedures in multiple offense situations, only one crime is reported on the basis of an established hierarchy. This is known as the Hierarchy Rule. Arson is an exception to this rule. Otherwise, if a Breaking or Entering and Arson occurred at the same time and place, only the Breaking or Entering would be reported. Therefore, when occurring in conjunction with another crime, an Arson is also reported in addition to the other crime.

VOLUME

In 1989, there were 2,581 Arsons reported. This is a 14 percent decrease when compared to the 3,007 Arsons reported in 1988.

A monthly analysis indicates April had the highest frequency of occurrence, while June had the lowest.

NATURE

The most frequent type of property subject to Arson in 1989 were structures comprising 51 percent of the total reported incidents. Mobile (motor vehicles, trailers, airplanes, boats, etc.) and other property (crops, timber, fences, signs, etc.) accounted for the remaining offenses with 26 and 23 percent respectively.

Residences comprised 58 percent of the structures at which Arsons were directed. 21 percent of all targeted structural property was uninhabited or abandoned at the time the Arson occurred.

The estimated value of property damaged as a result of reported Arsons during 1989, was over 26 million dollars with an average loss per incident of \$10,080.

CLEARANCE

21 percent of all reported Arsons were cleared by arrest or exceptional means in 1989. In 1988, 18 percent of Arsons were cleared.

37 Percent of the total clearances of Arson involved only juveniles during both 1989 and 1988.



BATTERED SPOUSE

INTRODUCTION

The Maryland Battered Spouse Program was established through House Joint Resolution 32 which was introduced by Delegate Pauline Menes, requesting the Maryland State Police to maintain certain information on complaints of domestic assaults. The statistics in this report were collected from January 1, 1989 through December 31, 1989.

DEFINITION

A Battered Spouse in the Maryland Uniform Crime Report (UCR) Program is considered to be:

1. A married person living with their spouse upon whom an aggravated or non-aggravated assault was committed by their mate.
2. A married person estranged from their spouse upon whom an aggravated or non-aggravated assault was committed by their mate.
3. A male and female not married to each other and who are living together or had lived together at some time, upon whom an aggravated or non-aggravated assault was committed by their mate.

REPORTING PROCEDURES

The Battered Spouse Report is part of the Uniform Crime Reports which are submitted monthly to Maryland State Police by 129 police agencies.

Under the Maryland Battered Spouse Program, law enforcement agencies are required to submit a specified Battered Spouse Report. The necessary information for this report is gathered monthly from each agency's record of complaints, investigations, and arrests. The UCR Field Representative provide assistance and training to law enforcement agencies in the completion of this report.

CLASSIFICATION

Aggravated Assault, as defined under the Maryland Uniform Crime Reporting Program, is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that an injury result when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which would result in serious personal injury if the crimes were successfully completed. An assault in which hands, fists and feet are used, and severe personal injury to the victim results, is also classified as an aggravated assault.

Any assault in which hands, fists, and feet are used and no serious injury to the victim results, is classified as a non-aggravated assault.

LIMITATIONS OF A BATTERED SPOUSE REPORTING PROGRAM

The main goal of the Maryland Battered Spouse Program is to furnish legislature with statistics on Battered Spouses. However, there are limitations to the information collected which should be clearly understood before any conclusions are drawn from the data presented in this report.

Domestic Assaults of a non-aggravated nature are many times handled informally and, as a consequence, incomplete or inaccurate recording of the event may result. Procedures for handling non-aggravated domestic assaults vary between departments.

Non-aggravated domestic assaults in some instances are taken directly to the court system and are not reported to a police department. This varies depending upon the county in which the assault occurs.

While the current method of collecting Battered Spouse information for this report provides less than a complete picture, there is at present, no other informational system in general use gathering these statistics from police agencies that will more accurately perform this task.

DAY OF WEEK

50% of the Spousal Assaults reported in 1989 occurred on Friday, Saturday and Sunday with 14% occurring on Friday, 17% on Saturday and 19% on Sunday.

Analysis: Over 55% of all spousal assaults have consistently occurred between the hours of 6:00 P.M. and 3:00 A.M. in the last five years. When combined with the prior day of the trend, this would indicate that most spousal assaults are likely to occur between 6:00 P.M. and 3:00 A.M. on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

AGGRAVATED/NON-AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

2,854 of the spousal assaults reported during 1989 were of an aggravated nature. This was a 1% increase over the 2,824 aggravated spousal assaults reported in 1988, and aggravated assaults were 19% of the total spousal assaults both years.

WEAPON USE IN SPOUSAL ASSAULTS

Firearms were 9.0 percent of the total aggravated assaults and 1.7 percent of the total assaults. In 1988, firearms were 10.3 percent of the total aggravated assaults and 2.0 percent of the total assaults.

Knife or cutting instruments were 22.8 percent of the total aggravated assaults and 4.4 percent of the total assaults. In 1988, knife or cutting instruments were 26.9 percent of the total aggravated assaults and 5.2 percent of the total assaults.

Other dangerous weapons were 35.7 percent of the total aggravated assaults and 6.9 percent of the total assaults. In 1988, other dangerous weapons were 36.9 percent of the total aggravated assaults and 7.2 percent of the total assaults.

Aggravated assaults by physical force were 32.4 percent of the aggravated assaults and 6.3 percent of the total assaults. In 1988, aggravated assaults by physical force were 25.9 percent of the total aggravated assaults and 5.0 percent of the total assaults.

Non-aggravated simple assaults accounted for 80.7 percent of all spousal assaults. In 1988, non-aggravated simple assaults were 80.6 percent of all spousal assaults.

VICTIM

In 1989, spousal assault victims were female in 84.7 percent of all cases as compared to 84.8 percent in 1988, a .1 percent decrease in the female victim ratio.

56.1 percent of the victims were white, while 43.0 percent were black and .9 percent were of other races. In 1988, 55.6 percent were white, 43.3 percent were black, and 1.1 percent were of other races.

CLEARANCES

There are two ways of clearing a case. One is by making an arrest and charging the person(s) with the offense. The second is known as an exceptional clearance whereby the police know the identity and location of the person(s) who committed the offense, and have enough information to arrest them but there is some reason beyond their control that prevent them from making the arrest. The most frequent reason is the victims neglect or refusal to prosecute.

85.0 percent of all spousal assault cases reported in 1989 were cleared; 22.0 percent by arrest and 63.0 percent exceptionally. In 15.0 percent of the incidents the dispositions of the cases were unknown. In 1988, 88.3 percent of all spousal assault cases were cleared; 21.4 percent by arrest and 66.9 percent exceptionally. In 11.7 percent of the cases, the dispositions were unknown.

The following chart reflects the ratio of Spousal Assaults as compared with the total of all (Spousal and Non-Spousal) Assaults. It also reflects the percentage of Aggravated Spousal Assaults as compared with the Non-Aggravated Spousal Assaults. These comparisons are made on a State and County level.

INDEX OFFENSE DATA (CONT'D)

Each heading contained in this section is defined as follows:

- Population: Estimated populations for the State, Regions and Counties as provided by the Federal Bureau of Investigation on a yearly basis.
- Total Offenses: The sum total of the Index Offenses.
- Total Cleared: The sum total of the Index Offenses cleared.
- Percent Cleared: The percentage of Index Offenses cleared by arrest or exceptional means. The mathematical formula may be expressed as follows:

$$\text{Percent Cleared} = \frac{\text{Index Offenses Cleared}}{\text{Index Offenses} \times 100}$$

- Crime Rate: This rate is the number of Index Offenses per 100,000 population. To compute a crime rate, divide the population by 100,000 and divide the number of offenses by the quotient.

Example: Population for Region X = 312,010

Number of Index Offenses for Region X this year. = 13,092

$$\frac{312,010}{100,000} = 3.120$$

$$\frac{13,092}{3.120} = 4,196.2$$

Crime Rate for Region X = 4,196.2

Crime Rates for the individual agencies are not calculated in the following table because of overlapping jurisdictions in many cities of municipal, county and state law enforcement agencies. This table contains the offenses as reported by the individual agencies with crime rates for the county and region totals. ARREST DATA

The Maryland Uniform Crime Reporting Program requires the submission of monthly reports of persons arrested in the state. A record of arrest activity for both Part I and Part II crimes is received from state, county and municipal law enforcement agencies showing the age, sex and race of persons arrested. Traffic arrests, except Driving While Intoxicated, are not reported. A total of 266,125 arrest for Part I and Part II criminal offenses were reported during 1989. In 1988 there were 246,516 arrests which represents an 8 percent increase. Based on 1989 population estimates, there were 5,669.5 arrests per 100,000 population in Maryland. The arrest rate for 1988 was 5,308.3 representing a 7 percent increase in the arrest rate.

A person is counted on the monthly arrest report each time they are arrested. This means that a person may be arrested several times during a given month and would be counted each time. However, a person is counted only once each time regardless of the number of crimes or charges involved. A juvenile is counted as "arrested" when the circumstances are such that, if the juvenile were an adult, an arrest would have been counted or when police or other official action is taken beyond a mere interview, warning or admonishment.

Arrest figures do not indicate the number of individuals arrested or summonsed since, as stated above, one person may be arrested several times during the month. However, arrest information is useful in measuring the extent of law enforcement activities in a given geographic area as well as providing an index for measuring the involvement in criminal acts by the age, sex and race of perpetrators.

21 percent of all reported arrests during both 1989 and 1988 were for Crime Index Offenses (Murder, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Breaking or Entering, Larceny-Theft, and Motor Vehicle Theft). Analysis of Crime Index Arrest Data indicates that Larceny comprised the highest percentage of all arrests for Crime Index crimes, with 50 percent of the total. The same trend for Larceny occurred in 1988 with 48 percent of the total. The Drug Abuse, Other Assaults, Driving Under the Influence, Disorderly Conduct, and All Other Offense categories continue to record the highest percentage of arrests for Part II Offenses. These offenses accounted for 83 percent of the total arrests for Part II Offenses in 1989 and 1988.

VIOLENT CRIME ARRESTS

Arrests for crimes of violence (Murder, Forcible Rape, Robbery and Aggravated Assault) accounted for 21 percent of the total arrests for Crime Index Offenses and 5 percent of the total arrests in 1989 the same as in 1988.

A further evaluation indicates that arrests for Robbery and Aggravated Assault represented the highest percentage of the total arrests for Violent Crimes with 31 and 58 percent, respectively.

PROPERTY CRIME ARRESTS

Property Crime arrests (Breaking or Entering, Larceny-Theft and Motor Vehicle Theft) represented 79 percent of all arrests for Crime Index Offenses and 17 percent of the total arrest in 1989, as compared to 79 percent of all arrests for Crime Index Offenses and 18 percent of the total arrests in 1988.

The highest percentage of Property Crime arrests, 61 percent occurred in the Larceny category in 1989 the same as in 1988.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATION ARRESTS

Information pertaining to Drug Abuse Violation arrests is collected according to specific drug categories and whether the arrest was for Sale or Manufacture or Possession of a specific drug. During 1989, a total of 36,170 arrests for Drug Abuse Law Violations were reported compared to 1988 with 30,263 arrests, resulting in a 20 percent increase.

Evaluation of the reported data discloses that 2 percent of all persons arrested for Drug Abuse Violations were under 21 years of age compared to 29 percent in 1988, and 11 percent were under 18 years of age in 1989 compared to 12 percent in 1988.

Analysis of individual categories showed that the highest percentage of arrests, which involved Opium or Cocaine and derivatives, increased to 63 percent in 1989 from 54 percent in 1988. Marijuana involvement decreased to 29 percent in 1989 from 33 percent of the Drug Abuse Arrests in 1988. 67 percent of total Drug Abuse Arrests were for possession while 33 percent were for sale or manufacture in 1989 the same as in 1988.

Possession of Marijuana represented 22 percent of the total Drug Abuse Arrests in 1989 compared to 1988 with 28 percent. Possession of Opium or Cocaine and derivatives increased from 31 percent in 1988 to 33 percent of the total Drug Abuse Arrests in 1989.

GAMBLING ARRESTS

A total of 264 Gambling arrests were reported during 1989. In 1988, 400 persons were arrested for Gambling violations resulting in a 33 percent decrease.

Arrests for Gambling offenses amounted to .1 percent of all reported Part I and Part II arrests in 1989 compared to .2 percent in 1988. Persons under the age of 18 made up 11 percent of all Gambling arrests compared to 3 percent in 1988.





LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED

One law enforcement officer was killed in the line of duty in Maryland during 1989. The following summary is based on information provided by his Department and the Federal Bureau of Investigation who conduct in-depth investigations of these tragic incidents in which law enforcement officers have made the supreme sacrifice in the performance of their duties.

OCTOBER 10, 1989

A Baltimore City Police Officer died at 7:50 A.M. on October 10, 1989 as the result of gunshot wounds sustained at approximately 3:25 A.M. that morning upon responding to a call for Narcotics being sold in an apartment building. At about 3:25 A.M. on October 10, 1989 the Officer, age 38 responded to a call for Narcotics being sold in the hallway of the apartment building. Upon arrival the Officer, a ten year veteran of the Department, entered the building and proceeded up the stairs to a landing where he encountered a 20 year old subject who without warning shot him twice in the head and once in the left shoulder. The subject attempted to flee the scene and encountered another Officer whereupon they exchanged gunfire. During the exchange the second Officer was struck in the left hand and right chest, but was protected from serious injury by his soft body armor vest. The subject also sustained a wound to the abdomen from which he later recovered and was arrested at the scene.

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ASSAULTED

The following information is based on a detailed monthly collection of data in the Uniform Crime Reporting System regarding the problem of assaults on local, county and state law enforcement officers. The large number of reported assaults on sworn officers is in part due to a prevalent attitude of disrespect for law enforcement in certain elements of our society.

A total of 5,332 law enforcement officers in Maryland were victims of assault in the line of duty during 1989 compared to 5,020 assaults during 1988 resulting in a 6 percent increase.

The rate of assaults on law enforcement officers for the state was 42 assaults for every 100 sworn officers in 1989 compared to 41 assaults per 100 sworn officers in 1988.

Physical force was used in 88 percent of all assaults on police officers.

The greatest number of assaults 1,965 (37 percent) occurred while officers were responding to disturbance calls (family disputes, man with a gun, etc.). 33 percent of assaults on police officers occurred between 10:01 P.M. and 2:00 A.M.

A total of 5,274 assaults on law enforcement officers were cleared during 1989 amounting to a 99 percent clearance rate.

POLICE EMPLOYEE DATA

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program in Maryland incorporates the collection of pertinent data relating to the police of the State. Information regarding police employee strength is discussed in this section.

This information is submitted by county, municipal, and state law enforcement agencies and compiled on an annual basis. Specific information concerning the number of law enforcement employees reflects the status as of October 31, 1989.

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE RATES

In 1989, the average number of full-time law enforcement employees (county, municipal and state) including civilian employees, amounted to 3.4 for each 1,000 inhabitants of the State. The rate based on sworn personnel only (excluding civilians), amounted to 2.7 per 1,000 population. In 1988, the average number of full-time law enforcement employees amounted to the same 3.4 for each 1,000 inhabitants and 2.7 sworn personnel per 1,000 inhabitants of the State.

The ratio of law enforcement employees per 1,000 population in any given area or municipality is influenced by a number of factors, much the same as the crime rate. The determination of law enforcement strength for a given county or municipality is based on factors such as population density, size and character of the community, geographic location, proximity to metropolitan areas, and other conditions which exist in the area generating the need for law enforcement services. Employee rates also differ among agencies since, in particular, there is a wide variation of the responsibilities and level of activity within various law enforcement agencies. The information in this section relates to reported police employee strength and should not be interpreted as recommended strength for any area.

CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES

The personnel of each law enforcement agency differ as to the demands and responsibilities placed before them. Many police officers are fully occupied with clerical tasks and are not free to perform active police duties. Some police administrators use civilians in this capacity, thus freeing the sworn personnel for actual police related services.

As of October 31, 1989, 3,534 or 22 percent of the total number of police employees in Maryland were civilians.
