## CHARACTERISTICS OF FELON NEW ADMISSIONS

### HIGHLIGHTS

*The number of felon new admissions from court increased 91.2% from 20,543 in 1985 to 39,272 in 1990.*

*The number of Mexican-American felon new admissions more than doubled from 6,011 in 1985 to 14,208 in 1990.*


*More than half (54.7%) of felon new admissions were under the age of 30 in 1990.*

*Of the total felon new admissions to CDC, Los Angeles accounted for 39.8% in 1985 and 42.3% in 1990.*

*The number of felon new admissions for drug offenses reached an all time high of 13,741. This represented a 280.7% increase over 1985.*

Calendar Years 1970 through 1990




### During Calendar Year 1990:

#### NEW ADMISSIONS

*There were 39,272 felon new admissions from court.*

- This represents an increase of 14.7% (5,046) from Calendar Year 1989.
- This is an increase of 91.2% (18,729) from Calendar Year 1985.
- The number of male felon new admissions was 35,669, while the number of female felon new admissions was 3,603.

#### OFFENSE CATEGORIES

*Total CDC felon new admissions increased 91.2% from 20,543 in 1985 to 39,272 in 1990.*


- Violent offenders accounted for 26.1% (10,262) of felon new admissions.
- Property offenders accounted for 28.0% (10,990) of felon new admissions.
- Drug offenders accounted for 35.0% (13,741) of felon new admissions.
- Offenders who committed other offenses made up the remaining 10.8% (4,250) of felon new admissions.

## CHARACTERISTICS OF FELON NEW ADMISSIONS

During Calendar Year 1990:

### RACIAL/ETHNIC GROUPS

- The number of felon new admissions who were Black increased by 79.8% from 6,498 in 1985 to 11,683 in 1990.
- The number of felon new admissions who were Mexican/American increased by 136.4% from 6,011 in 1985 to 14,208 in 1990.
- The number of felon new admissions who were White increased by 68.8% from 6,859 in 1985 to 11,580 in 1990.




### AGE GROUPS

Almost half (49.6%) of the felon new admissions were 20-29 years of age.


- The largest age group of felon new admissions was 20-24 years of age and accounted for 25.4% (9,993).
- The second largest age group was the 25-29 years of age, accounting for 24.2% (9,516).
- The smallest age group was the under 18 which represented 0.1% (30) of the felon new admissions.

Calendar Year 1990




During Calendar Year 1990:

### AREA OF COMMITMENT

- 26,667 (67.9%) felon new admissions were admitted from Southern California.
- 5,770 (14.7%) felon new admissions were admitted from the San Francisco Bay Area.
- 6,835 (17.4%) felon new admissions were admitted from Northern and Central California.

### ALCOHOL USE

- 58.0% of felon new admissions reported no abuse. This group either did not use alcohol or used it only on social occasions.
- 13.7% of felon new admissions were under the influence of alcohol at the time they committed their offense.
- 23.9% of felon new admissions had either past or current alcohol abuse before entering CDC.

## CHARACTERISTICS OF FELON NEW ADMISSIONS


During Calendar Year 1990:

### DRUG HISTORY

*Seven out of ten felon new admissions had a reported drug use history.*

- The largest group of drug users of the felon new admissions (30.4%) had a history of cocaine use.
- The second largest group of felon new admissions (20.7%) had no reported drug use.
- The third largest group of felon new admissions (16.2%) have used heroin.
- 14.1% of felon new admissions had a history of marijuana use.
- 7.1% of felon new admissions had a history of methamphetamine or amphetamine use.
- 3.3% of felon new admissions had a history of PCP/PCP Analog use.

## CHARACTERISTICS OF PAROLE VIOLATORS RETURNED WITH A NEW COMMITMENT (PV-WNT)

### HIGHLIGHTS

*The number of PV-WNTs increased 179.1% from 5,042 in 1985 to 14,070 in 1990.*

*During the last five years, the percentage of White PV-WNTs has decreased while the remaining ethnic groups have all increased.*

*Almost half (48.5%) of the PV-WNTs were under the age of 30 in 1990.*


*Of the total PV-WNTs to CDC, Los Angeles accounted for 36.3% (1,821) in 1985 and 45.1% (6,346) in 1990.*

*The number of drug offender PV-WNTs has increased 575.2% from 666 in 1985 to 4,497 in 1990.*


*The percentage of violent offender PV-WNTs has decreased from 23.6% in 1985 to 16.1% in 1990.*

### During Calendar Year 1990:

#### PV-WNTs

During Calendar Year 1990 there were 14,070 PV-WNTs returned to prison.

- This represents an increase of 27.4% (3,030) from Calendar Year 1989.
- This is an increase of 179.1% (9,028) from Calendar Year 1985.
- The number of male PV-WNTs was 13,194, while the number of female PV-WNTs was 876.

### OFFENSE CATEGORIES

- Violent offenders accounted for 16.1% (2,267) of the PV-WNTs.
- Property offenders accounted for 45.1% (6,345) of the PV-WNTs.
- Drug offenders accounted for 32.0% (4,497) of the PV-WNTs.
- Offenders who committed other offenses made up the remaining 6.8% (961) of the PV-WNTs.

During Calendar Year 1990:


### RACIAL/ETHNIC GROUPS

- The number of PV-WNTs who were Black increased by 189.3% from 2,108 in 1985 to 6,098 in 1990.
- The number of PV-WNTs who were Mexican/American increased by 196.2% from 1,353 in 1985 to 4,008 in 1990.
- The number of PV-WNTs who were White increased by 141.1% from 1,449 in 1985 to 3,494 in 1990.


### AREA OF COMMITMENT

- 9,613 (68.3%) PV-WNTs were admitted from Southern California.

Calendar Year 1990




## CHARACTERISTICS OF PAROLE VIOLATORS RETURNED WITH A NEW COMMITMENT (PV-WNT)

### AGE GROUPS

- Over half (55.6%) of the PV-WNTs were 25-34 years of age.
- The largest age group of PV-WNTs returned was the 25-29 years of age and accounted for 31.3% (4,405).
- The second largest age group was the 30-34 year olds, accounting for 24.3% (3,424).
- The 18-19 year olds accounted for 0.2% (22) of the population.
- There were no PV-WNTs under the age of 18.
- The age group 55 and over accounted for 0.7% (98) of this population.
