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**CALENDAR YEAR SUMMARY REPORT
OF POPULATION MOVEMENT
1991**

The Department of Corrections is responsible for the operation of Wisconsin's correctional institutions for adult offenders and for the supervision of offenders on probation and parole status in the community. This publication is designed to provide the reader with summary information about the volume and movement of offenders under Department of Corrections jurisdiction during calendar year 1991.

HIGHLIGHTS - ADULT INSTITUTION POPULATION

- * The adult institution population includes offenders serving sentences in facilities operated by the Department of Corrections, those serving sentences in institutions operated by the federal government and other states, and in Wisconsin county jails. Information about men confined at the Wisconsin Resource Center, a facility operated by the Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Care and Treatment Facilities has been excluded from this publication.
- * The number of adult offenders incarcerated in Wisconsin's facilities rose from 7,085 on January 1 to 7,532 on December 31, 1991; an increase of 6.3 percent.
(See Table 1.)
- * The population of men confined in correctional facilities increased 6.6 percent from 6,746 at the start to 7,193 at the end of calendar year 1991. Three hundred thirty-nine women were in residence at the start as well as the end of the calendar year.

- * The average daily population of institutionalized offenders grew steadily from 5,660 in calendar year 1987 to 7,282 in calendar year 1991; an increase of 28.7 percent during the five-year period. The largest increase, 8.4 percent, occurred between calendar years 1990 and 1991.

HIGHLIGHTS - COMMUNITY SUPERVISION POPULATION

- * Community supervision cases, offenders supervised in the community under the terms and conditions of probation and parole, rose from 34,094 at the start to 39,531 at the end of calendar year 1991; an increase of 15.9 percent.

- * The number of community services cases on absconder status increased 6.2 percent from 3,843 at the start to 4,080 at the end of calendar year 1991.

- * The average daily population reported for community services and institution cases rose from 39,160 in calendar year 1990 to 44,133 in calendar year 1991; an increase of 12.7 percent.
(See Chart A.)
- * During calendar year 1987 the average daily population of offenders under community supervision was 25,542. This average reached a high of 36,851 in calendar year 1991; an increase of 44.3 percent during the five-year period.
(See Chart A.)
- * Probation supervision average daily populations increased 46.3 percent from 22,008 in calendar year 1987 to 32,199 in calendar year 1992. The smallest increase, 2.5 percent, occurred between calendar years 1987 and 1988; the largest, 16.5 percent, between calendar years 1989 and 1990.

- * Adult parole supervision average daily populations rose from 3,302 in 1987 to 4,377 in 1991; an increase of 32.6 percent. The largest increase during the five-year period (13.1 percent) took place between calendar years 1989-1990; the smallest (1.6 percent) between calendar years 1988-1989. These figures do not include adults under supervision in Wisconsin under the terms of the Interstate Compact.
