MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

This report for calendar year 1990 was prepared in accordance with Title 28 U.S.C. Section 604(a)(2), which requires that the Director of the Administrative Office transmit statistics on the business of the Federal courts to the chief judges of the circuits semi-annually. The data contained in this report provide current national and local trends in the caseload of the courts.


The prosecutions of drug-related crime, which had fueled the workload growth in the U.S. district courts in the '80s, declined in 1990. Drug filings, which increased 53 percent from 1986 to 1989, decreased 5 percent in 1990. Although the decline was primarily due to a drop in filings in one district, combined drug filings in all other districts rose only 1 percent. The net effect of the drop in drug filings was a reduction in the rate of growth in criminal filings at the district level to 1 percent. In contrast, the U.S. courts of appeals saw an increase of 15 percent in criminal drug appeals.

Civil filings in U.S. district courts continued to decline as they have since 1985, dropping 6 percent to 211,626 after falling 7 percent in 1989. Once again, there were substantial decreases in suits filed by the U.S. government to recover overpayments of veterans' benefits and defaulted student loans, as well as a 23 percent drop in suits filed against the U.S. for benefits denied by the Social Security Administration. The increase in the jurisdictional minimum for diversity from \$10,000 to \$50,000 was in effect for the first full calendar year in 1990 and resulted in a 14 percent decrease in diversity cases.

In 1990, for the first time, the U.S. bankruptcy courts recorded over 1 million pending bankruptcy cases. Although the number of cases terminated in 1990 rose 11 percent, terminations could not keep up with the growth in filings which increased to 782,960 cases. The growth occurred in all chapters of the Bankruptcy Code except Chapter 12, with Chapter 13 filings showing the largest increase at 19 percent. The total number of business filings increased 3 percent from 1989 to 1990, while non-business filings grew 16 percent during the same period.

A brief summary of key workload indicators for the Federal courts appears on the next page. A more detailed explanation of the factors affecting each area is contained in the pages which follow.

FEDERAL JUDICIAL WORKLOAD STATISTICS

DECEMBER 1990

The Federal Judicial Workload Statistics Report contains a summary of the workload of the Federal courts for calendar year 1990. It was prepared in accordance with Title 28, U.S.C. Section 604(a)(2), which requires that the Director of the Administrative Office transmit semi-annually statistical data on the business of the courts to the chief judges of the circuits.

U.S. COURTS OF APPEALS

During 1990, the number of appeals filed in the 12 regional courts of appeals increased 2 percent to 40,982. Because the number of authorized judgeships in the appellate courts increased late in 1990, filings per authorized three-judge panel decreased slightly from 774 in 1989 to 732. Although none of the newly created judgeship positions were filled in 1990, the courts of appeals still managed to increase their disposition rate. In 1990, the courts disposed of 39,825 appeals, an increase of 6 percent over the 37,591 reported last year. Even with this increase, filings exceeded terminations and as a result, the pending caseload rose 4 percent to 32,736. Table 1 provides a summary of the activity in the U.S. courts of appeals for 1980, and 1986 through 1990.

The increase in appeals filings nationwide can be attributed to an increase in criminal appeals which rose 11 percent to 9,700 appeals. This rate was considerably lower than the 27 percent growth in criminal appeals last year. Much of the growth in recent years has come from the increased drug caseload of the district courts and the resulting appeals of both Sentencing Guideline cases and pre-Guideline cases. Of the criminal appeals filed this year, 81 percent involved cases to which Guidelines applied. Approximately 14 percent of all appeals involved drug offenses this year. By comparison, in 1980 only 6 percent of all appeals involved drug offenses. (See Chart 1.)

In contrast to prior years, the only other types of appeals which increased this year were prisoner petitions and bankruptcy appeals. Appeals of state and Federal prisoner petitions rose nearly 5 percent in 1990, while bankruptcy appeals were up 4 percent. All other appeals (U.S. and private civil, administrative appeals and original proceedings) declined compared to a year ago.



During 1990, terminations in the 12 regional courts of appeals reached a new high of 39,825 appeals. Appeals terminated on the merits increased 6 percent to 21,612 and represented 54 percent of all dispositions. The number of appeals terminated after submission on briefs rose to 11,921 (up 10 percent), while the number of terminations after oral hearing increased by only 47 appeals. Cases closed procedurally remained stable this year at 14,278 appeals.

Despite increased terminations, the number of appeals pending increased a modest 4 percent to 32,736. The largest increase was in pending criminal appeals, which rose 16 percent to 9,154. Within this category, pending drug appeals rose 22 percent and now represent 60 percent of the pending criminal appeals caseload. More detailed data on the U.S. courts of appeals are provided in *Appendix Tables B, B-1, and B-5*.

U.S. COURT OF APPEALS FOR THE FEDERAL CIRCUIT

During 1990, the number of filings in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit increased a modest 5 percent from 1,407 in 1989 to 1,474. The largest increase was in appeals from the Merit Systems Protection Board, up 22 percent from 572 in 1989 to 696 in 1990. Appeals from the U.S. Claims Court increased 15 percent from 138 to 159 during the same period. In addition, there were two new sources of appeals to the Federal Circuit this year, the Court of Veterans Appeals and the Department of Veterans Affairs. The Federal Circuit reviewed 21 and 31 appeals, respectively, from these organizations in 1990. The Court of Veterans Appeals, created in 1988 as an Article I Court, reviews cases involving veterans' benefits; decisions of this court can be appealed to the Federal Circuit. The Federal

Circuit was authorized, also in 1988, to hear challenges to regulations issued by the Department of Veterans Affairs.

The number of appeals terminated during the year remained steady at 1,418. While total terminations by judges increased by 20 cases to 870, other terminations decreased by 21 appeals to 548. The largest increase in terminations was in appeals from the U.S. Claims Court which rose from 100 in 1989 to 149 in 1990.


Since filings outnumbered terminations, the pending caseload increased 9 percent from 631 to 687 in 1990. *Appendix Table A* provides summary data on the activity of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit.

U.S. DISTRICT COURTS

Filings in U.S. District Courts

A total of 258,961 civil and criminal cases were filed in U.S. district courts during 1990, approximately 55,000 more cases than were filed 10 years ago. Filings have declined in the past two years, however. The total in 1990 was 5 percent lower than the number filed in 1989, and nearly 9 percent below the 1988 figure, as shown in *Chart 2*. Civil cases dropped 6 percent in 1990 to 211,626 while criminal cases continued to increase, reaching 47,335. The increase in criminal filings was only 1 percent this year following a 7 percent increase during 1989. *Table 2* presents civil

and criminal filings for the past five years and for 1980, for the types of cases that have shown the greatest changes.

The number of filings per authorized judgeship dropped to 399 in 1990 from 473 last year, primarily as a result of the 74 additional judgeship positions authorized in December. Criminal filings per authorized judgeship fell from 81 in 1989 to 73 this year, while civil filings per authorized judgeship declined to 326 from 392 last year.

Civil Workload

Civil filings in the U.S. district courts declined substantially during 1990, falling 6 percent to 211,626 after a decline of 7 percent in 1989. This continued a trend in civil filings which started in 1986; filings have dropped 24 percent since the 1985 high of 278,778 cases. In 1990, filings involving the U.S. government were down 10 percent to 53,055, while private cases dropped 3 percent

to 158,571. As shown in Table 3, the recent pattern of substantial decreases in suits filed by the U.S. government to recover overpayments of veterans' benefits and defaulted student loans continued in 1990. Veterans Administration recovery cases fell 34 percent to 4,043 and student loan cases fell 47 percent to 3,518. Recovery cases accounted for 22 percent of all civil filings in 1985. Since that time, they have fallen by 51,850 cases and now account for less than 4 percent of 1990 filings.

Suits filed against the U.S. for benefits denied by the Social Security Administration also continued to decline this year, down 23 percent to 6,725 cases. (See Chart 3.) The greatest decline was in suits involving disability insurance claims, which fell from 6,265 in 1989 to 4,613 this year. The number of social security claims of all kinds filed in U.S. district courts has declined 63 percent since 1985.

Exclusive of recovery and social security cases, civil filings increased nearly every year


until 1988, then decreased 3 percent in 1989, and another 3 percent in 1990 to 196,702 cases. One reason for this decline was legislation passed in May 1989 which increased the amount for establishing Federal jurisdiction in diversity cases from \$10,000 to \$50,000. As a result, diversity filings decreased 11 percent in 1989, and 14 percent in 1990 to 53,643 cases. Another important factor in the decline in diversity filings in 1990 was a 15 percent decrease in asbestos filings (nearly 1,700 cases), which reversed a trend of increases over the last few years. The cause of this decrease was a drop of 2,775 cases filed in the Northern District of Ohio (OH, N.) during 1990. The increase in asbestos filings during 1988 and 1989 were also primarily due to dramatic changes in cases filed in OH, N. During 1988, asbestos filings increased in OH, N. due to the reopening of more than 1,500

cases and during 1989 as a result of an abnormally high number of cases (1,730) removed from state to Federal court.

While total civil filings have declined in recent years, much of the decrease has occurred in less complex areas of litigation such as recovery and Social Security filings. At the same time, filings of complex cases continue to rise. For example, civil rights filings increased by more than 350 cases in 1990, and labor suits rose by over 600, primarily in the area of Employee Retirement Income Security Act filings.

In addition, civil cases filed by the U.S. attorney's offices to seize assets in criminal drug cases increased 180 percent. Authorization for the seizure of assets in cases prosecuted against drug offenders was clarified and extended by the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1986. Since that time, Food and Drug forfei-

ture filings have increased from 606 to 2,803 in 1990 of which drug forfeitures numbered 2,132, or 76 percent of the total.

In conjunction with the decline in civil filings, fewer civil cases were terminated during 1990, down 6 percent to 212,497. Even with this decrease, terminations exceeded filings. As a result, the pending caseload at year's end continued a two year decline (although it dropped less than 1 percent). Despite the decline in total pending, the number of cases pending three years or more in the U.S. district courts climbed 8 percent from 25,222 last year to 27,204. While there was a large increase in asbestos cases terminated this year, pending asbestos cases still accounted for 30 percent of all three-year-old cases. *Appendix Tables C, C-1, C-2, and C-3* provide additional data on civil cases filed, terminated and pending in U.S. district courts during 1990.

Criminal Workload

Criminal filings in the U.S. district courts continued to increase during 1990, although at a much slower rate than in previous years. Criminal filings rose only 1 percent to 48,250 cases (including transfers). Criminal cases terminated increased in 1990, up 2 percent to 44,756. This increase follows a 7 percent increase in terminations in 1989 and a 5 percent decrease in 1988. Since filings once again outnumbered terminations by a wide margin, the pending caseload rose 11 percent from 33,392 to 36,886. The number of pending cases has increased 46 percent since 1986, when 25,271 criminal cases were pending in the U.S. district courts. **Table 4** summarizes the number of criminal cases filed, terminated, and pending for 1980 and 1986 through 1990. *Appendix Tables D, D-1, D-2, and D-3* contain more detailed data by district on the criminal workload.


Between 1986 and 1989, drug filings increased 53 percent from 8,370 to 12,810, at a

rate of at least 13 percent each year. In 1990, however, drug filings decreased 5 percent to 12,221, indicating that the dramatic rise in drug filings since 1986 may have ended. Much of this decrease is due to a decline in drug filings in the Southern District of Texas (TX, S). Although TX, S. still had the largest number of drug cases filed in the country, drug filings in 1990 declined 43 percent to 945. This district had previously reported sizeable increases between 1984 and 1989, when drug filings increased from 343 to 1,662. The U.S. attorney's office in TX, S. is redirecting enforcement efforts toward cases involving only very large amounts of drugs or large drug networks.

When drug filings in TX, S. are excluded, drug filings in all other districts increased slightly by 1 percent (128 cases). As law enforcement agencies close open air drug markets, they must turn to more sophisticated enforcement strategies such as sting operations and wiretaps. Another option available to enforcement officers is to charge known drug offenders under related offenses, such as possession of firearms, which may be easier to prosecute. Consequently, drug filings are likely to decrease slightly or stabilize near the current level.

Although the number of drug filings decreased in 1990 by 589 cases, these cases are still a significant portion of the total criminal workload, as shown in Chart 4. Drug cases made up 26 percent of all criminal filings in 1990. In addition, drug enforcement efforts have had an impact on other areas of the criminal workload. The Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, which designated

drug offenses as "crimes of violence", enabled the U.S. to use weapons and immigration laws to help in the fight against drugs. As a result, immigration and weapons and firearms cases have increased dramatically in recent years. In 1990, immigration filings rose just over 15 percent (319 cases) to 2,434. Weapons and firearms cases showed an even greater increase, rising over 20 percent (482 cases) to 2,870.

Fraud cases also increased in 1990, rising 5 percent to 7,551 cases filed, more than ever reported before. Fraud offenses involving false claims and statements increased 5 percent, and cases involving lending institutions rose 20 percent to 1,249, primarily as a result of the savings and loan scandal. However, drunk driving and traffic offenses decreased for the first time since 1986, falling 4 percent to 8,005 cases filed during the year. Over 6,500 of these cases were prosecuted on military bases or Federal parks in 6 districts.

Total defendants charged in 1990 increased 4 percent to 67,188 (including transfers). Despite the decrease in drug filings, defendants charged with drug offenses actually increased more than 1 percent (323 defendants), and totalled over 36 percent of all defendants charged. Drug offenses typically involve broad criminal organizations and large numbers of participants. As a result, the average non-drug case involved only 1.2 defendants, compared with 1.9 defendants for a typical drug case.

Drug cases once again made up the largest portion of the pending criminal caseload in 1990, and increased 10 percent from 12,659 in 1989 to 13,873 in 1990. The pending drug caseload has more than doubled since 1985, and in that time, has risen from 29 percent of all criminal cases pending to 38 percent in 1990. Weapons and firearms and immigration cases pending also increased significantly in 1990. A total of 2,140 weapons cases were

pending on December 31, 1990, an increase of 22 percent over 1989. Immigration cases increased 12 percent from 1,643 to 1,833 cases pending. Other types of cases that increased significantly were fraud cases, up 10 percent to 5,466, and traffic offenses, which increased 12 percent to 1,981 cases pending on December 31, 1990.

Grand Juror Service

The activity of grand juries remained relatively stable in 1990, even though the number of grand juries rose slightly to 750 from 736 in 1989. While 10 more sessions were convened for a total of 10,358 in 1990, the number of hours in session for grand juries dropped slightly to 55,717. The number of grand jurors in session also remained at the 1989 level, as shown in Table 5.

Although grand jury activity remained stable in 1990, there has been a general decline in activity since 1985. In an effort to use grand juries as efficiently as possible, in 1986, the Department of Justice formalized a policy of empaneling fewer regular juries and established a standard of six hours for each session convened. As a result, the number of sessions convened has dropped more than 800 and the number of hours in session has fallen by 4,148. The number of jurors serving (counting each juror for each day of service) has fallen 7 percent since 1986 when jurors served nearly 220,000 days in grand jury sessions.

Several districts reported particularly large changes in the levels of grand jury activity during 1990. The Southern District of California convened 87 fewer sessions and had 1,734 fewer jurors serving (down 31 percent). The Northern District of Illinois convened 63 fewer sessions and 1,320 fewer jurors served. Ohio, Northern dropped 38 percent in both sessions convened (down from 154 in 1989 to 95 in 1990) and in grand jurors serving (down from 3,141 in 1989 to 1,933 in 1990). Sig-

nificant decreases in sessions and jurors serving were also reported in the Eastern District of New York, New Jersey, and the District of Columbia. In contrast, sessions convened in Massachusetts increased 24 percent from 378 in 1989 to 469 this year, while the number of jurors serving in Massachusetts climbed from 7,325 to 9,117. The Eastern District of Michigan convened 314 sessions, up from 235 last year, and had a 34 percent increase in jurors serving, up to 6,195 in 1990. Other significant increases were reported in the Southern and Middle Districts of Florida, and the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. *Appendix Table J-1* shows grand jury activity for 1990 by district.

Although the number of sessions convened remained relatively stable, the number of defendants indicted rose 9 percent to 43,484

during the past year. This was more than double the increase of last year, and continues the 1989 upswing. With the number of sessions remaining steady and defendants indicted rising, the average number of defendants indicted per session rose to a new high of 4.2. The increase this year indicates U.S. attorneys continued to make better use of grand jury time. The focus on drug activity during the past two years has also contributed to the rise in defendants indicted as drug cases generally involve more than one defendant. Total cases in which indictments were returned also increased (up 7 percent) during 1990 to 26,249.

Petit Juror Service

Petit juror service rose in 1990 with both trial days and jurors available up 3 percent. Jurors are counted for each day of their service

(including appearance at voir dire, traveling from home to distant court locations for trial, and hearing cases as a member of a jury). If a juror serves for 10 days, the juror is counted 10 times; no information is available on the number of individual citizens who served. So, while the data that are collected are actually days of service, it is discussed here for simplicity's sake in terms of the number of jurors who were selected or challenged.

While total jury trial days increased in 1990, criminal jury trial days accounted for the majority of the increase. The number of criminal trial days jumped 7 percent to surpass, for the first time, the number of civil trial days. Each year since 1987, criminal trial days have made up a growing proportion of total trial days; by 1990 they made up just over 50 percent of the total. Table 6 provides additional data on petit juror service in the U.S. district

courts from 1986 through 1990. Appendix Table J-2 shows petit juror service on days jurors were selected for trial for 1990.

The number of jurors present for selection of juries has increased steadily over the past five years consistent with the increase in criminal trials. Even if a court is in a position to pool jurors, criminal trials require more prospective jurors for the additional challenges allowed by law and for the additional members of the jury (12-14 member criminal juries compared to 6-8 member civil juries). Almost 29 percent of the 406,311 jurors were selected for juries in 1990, virtually unchanged from the last 2 years. The percentage of jurors not selected or challenged, however, fell to 34 percent. During 1990, the courts reported more detailed information on jurors not selected or challenged. Preliminary information indicates that more than half of the not selected or chal-

lenged jurors participated in voir dire; the remaining jurors did not participate in voir dire due to late settlements or pleas.

To reduce the number of jurors not selected or challenged, over half of the districts have enacted local rules to assess juror costs when cases settle or pleas are entered after prospective jurors have reported to court. These rules discourage last minute settlements, pleas and continuances and result in fewer unused jury panels. During 1990, 36 districts assessed juror costs on at least one occasion. A total of \$129,894 covering the cost of 2,675 jurors was returned to the general revenue fund of the U.S. Treasury. The Southern District of Texas reported the largest amount of juror costs assessed with a total of \$20,737 for 399 jurors. The Northern District of Ohio, which reported a substantial decrease in jurors not selected or challenged from 58 percent in 1989 to 31 percent in 1990, assessed costs of \$1,575 for 35 jurors.

U.S. BANKRUPTCY COURTS

Cases filed in the U.S. bankruptcy courts continued to grow at an alarming rate in response to the current recession. During 1990, there were 782,960 cases filed, an increase of 15 percent over last year, or 103,499 more cases filed this year. The number of cases terminated in 1990 also rose, up 11 percent to 658,889 cases. As a result of the growth of new filings, the number of pending cases reached 1,033,230 as of December 31, 1990. The pending caseload increased 14 percent in 1990, compared to 10 percent in 1989 and 4 percent in 1988. Table 7 provides data on cases filed, terminated, and pending for 1980 and 1986 through 1990. Detailed data regarding the number of filings, terminations and pending bankruptcy cases by district are provided in Appendix Tables F and F-2.

Filings under all chapters of the Bankruptcy Code, except Chapter 12, in-

creased in 1990. Chapter 7 cases, which are predominately non-business filings, increased 14 percent to 543,334 filings. There were 20,783 Chapter 11 filings (predominately business bankruptcies), up 14 percent from last year. Chapter 13 filings, primarily filed by individuals, rose to 217,468, an increase of 19 percent. Filings under Chapter 12, enacted in 1986 to help family farmers reorganize their debts and keep their farms, decreased 7 percent to 1,346. Chart 5 shows filings, by chapter, during the past five years.


The total number of business filings increased 3 percent during 1990. The total number of non-business filings increased 16 percent during the same period. This unusually large increase in filings in 1990 may be partially explained by recent increases in the unemployment rate and the current recession. These can affect trends in bankruptcies (both business and non-business) since the unemployed often file for personal bankruptcy. In addition, a high unemployment rate translates into fewer consumer dollars for businesses;

those which are operating marginally can fail during periods of high unemployment and, thus, may file for bankruptcy. In 1990, the national unemployment rate increased from 5.3 to 6.1 percent.

Adversary proceedings, which are usually filed by creditors challenging the terms of the discharge of debts or the repayment plan, reached 57,231 in 1990, an increase of 5 percent over last year. There were 51,452 terminations of adversary proceedings during the same period, a decrease of 3 percent over 1989. There were 96,007 adversary proceedings pending as of December 31, 1990, an increase of 6 percent. Data on adversary proceedings by district are provided in *Appendix Table F-8*.

PRETRIAL SERVICES

Judicial officers in all U.S. district courts receive reports from pretrial service officers (PSO's) to help them decide whether to detain defendants or release them on bail. In 34 dis-

tricts, pretrial service agencies perform this function independently; in the remaining districts, probation officers conduct investigations and prepare these reports. Eventually, as staffing allows, all pretrial work will be conducted solely by pretrial service officers.

In 1990, a total of 50,600 pretrial services cases were activated, an increase of 17 percent over 1989. Some of this increase was due to the increased number of immigration cases handled this year. Other increases were noted in the number of petty offenses and misdemeanors that now require pretrial attention. Reports prepared before bail was posted also rose 17 percent in 1990 to 43,632 cases. Officials in Pretrial Services attribute this increase to earlier intervention by their staff in cases, one of their operational goals. Despite this increase, reports on some defendants were not completed prior to the bail hearing. During 1990, PSO's prepared reports after bail was posted in 4,174 pretrial cases activated, an increase of 11 percent over 1989. PSO's

prepared 761 other investigative reports during the year and filed no reports in 2,033 cases. In some cases, where no bail report was filed, the judicial officer may have released the defendant on pretrial diversion and did not conduct a bail hearing as a result. In other cases, the judicial officer conducted the bail hearing and the defendant fulfilled bail requirements before the PSO completed the bail report. Although the number of cases without bail reports increased in 1990, these cases were only 4 percent of all pretrial cases activated, the same proportion as in 1989. Table 8 provides a summary of PSA and Diversion cases activated for 1989 and 1990.

The information in bail reports is based partly on interviews conducted with defendants. PSO's interviewed 44,104 defendants in pretrial cases activated last year, an increase of

15 percent over the level in 1989. Although PSO's conducted interviews with defendants in 87 percent of the cases activated, defendants can refuse to be interviewed or may not be available for interview; some defendants may also be missed by the system. In some of the cases without defendant interviews, however, PSO's prepare bail reports based on other sources, such as the arrest record, court documents, or information from the arresting agent. In 1990, defendants refused to be interviewed in 2,646 of the cases (5 percent of total cases activated), an increase of 13 percent over 1989. This may be due in part to the increased use of counsel by defendants and recommendations made to defendants by public defenders regarding the Privacy Act. PSO's did not conduct interviews with defendants in 3,850 cases (8 percent of the total cases activated), an increase of 57 percent since last year. The high number of missing interviews probably reflects the transition of new Pretrial Service staff into large districts formerly covered by probation officers. As pretrial staffing is augmented, better interview rates should result.

PSO's also prepare reports to determine if defendants are candidates for pretrial diversion supervision. The defendant and the U.S. attorney agree on conditions of this supervision prior to or at the defendant's initial hearing in U.S. district court; charges against the defendants are usually dropped as part of these agreements. There were 2,396 pretrial diversion cases activated in 1990, a decrease of 92 cases from 1989. Pretrial diversion cases by district and other statistics associated with pretrial services are provided in *Appendix Tables H-1 and H-2*.

U.S. COURT OF INTERNATIONAL TRADE

The number of case filings in 1990 for the U.S. Court of International Trade remained virtually the same at 783 compared to 791 in

1989. The 1,802 cases terminated in 1990, however, far outnumbered the cases filed, resulting in a significant 25 percent decline in cases pending at the end of the year. A similar drop occurred in 1989, when terminations so far outpaced filings that the pending caseload was reduced 23 percent. The pending caseload now stands at 4,255 cases. Over 60 percent of the cases disposed of in 1990 were closed after decision by the court, primarily after submission on agreed statements of facts. The remaining cases were dismissed; more than half were voluntary dismissals.

U.S. CLAIMS COURT

During the year ended December 31, 1990, there were 785 complaints filed with the U.S. Claims Court, an 11 percent increase above the 706 cases filed in 1989. The court disposed of 749 complaints during 1990, a nominal 2 percent increase over 1989. Since filings were slightly higher than terminations, the pending caseload also rose, up 2 percent in 1990 to 1,946 cases.

The Claims Court is also responsible for cases arising from the National Vaccine Injury

Compensation Program. In 1990, these cases increased by twenty-five times over 1989. This remarkable increase was a result of the substantial rise in the number of vaccine compensation cases filed under the National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act (P.L. 99-660, 100 STAT. 3755 as amended by P.L. 100-203, 101 STAT. 1330-221). The Act originally had a sunset date of September 30, 1990; however, the Act was extended in late September to January 31, 1991 to accommodate all of the claimant filings. Although there were 3,260 vaccine cases filed under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program in 1990, compared to only 125 a year ago, 96 percent were filed in the last 6 months of the year. The sharp escalation in these cases is also due to amendments to the Program which gave the Office of Special Masters more decisionmaking authority in vaccine cases, with appeal to the Claims Court. The court disposed of only 150 vaccine cases in 1990, although this was a 134 percent increase over 1989. Pending cases, therefore, also increased astronomically, from 140 cases in 1989 to 3,250 in 1990.
