

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FISCAL YEAR SUMMARY REPORT  
OF POPULATION MOVEMENT - 1992

This publication is designed to provide summary information about the volume and movements of offenders placed under the jurisdiction of Wisconsin's Department of Corrections during fiscal year 1992. The Department is responsible for the operation of state correctional institutions for adult offenders and for the supervision of offenders on probation or parole status in the community.

HIGHLIGHTS - ADULT INSTITUTION POPULATION

- \* The adult institution population includes men and women confined in Wisconsin correctional institutions as well as those serving Wisconsin sentences in federal facilities, institutions operated by other states, and in Wisconsin county jails. Information about men transferred from Department of Corrections facilities to the Wisconsin Resource Center, an institution operated by the Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Care and Treatment Facilities, has been excluded from this bulletin.
- \* On June 30, 1992 a total of 7,726 were confined in correctional facilities for adult offenders; an increase of 5.9 percent over the 7,296 offenders in residence on July 1, 1991. (See Table 1.)
- \* The population of men confined in correctional institutions rose from 6,693 at the start to 7,389 at the end of fiscal year 1992; an increase of 6.1 percent. The population in institutions for women remained relatively stable rising 1.2 percent from 333 on July 1, 1991 to 337 on June 30, 1992. (See Table 1.)
- \* The average daily population of institutionalized offenders rose steadily from 5,781 in fiscal year 1988 to 7,533 in fiscal year 1992; an increase of 30.3 percent during the five-year period. The largest increase, 9.5 percent, took place between fiscal years 1990 and 1991. (See Chart A.)

## HIGHLIGHTS - PROBATION AND PAROLE POPULATION

- \* The population of offenders supervised in the community under the terms and conditions of probation and parole increased 14.8 percent from 36,558 at the start to 41,959 at the end of fiscal year 1992. These figures include Wisconsin cases supervised in other states as well as cases from other states supervised in Wisconsin under the terms of the Interstate Compact.

- \* A total of 4,315 probation and parole cases were on absconder status on June 30, 1992; an increase of 11.3 percent over the 3,878 reported at the beginning of the fiscal year.

- \* The average daily population reported for probation and parole and community supervision and institution cases rose from 41,538 in fiscal year 1991 to 46,973 in fiscal year 1992; an increase of 13.1 percent.  
(See Chart A.)
- \* The average daily population of offenders under probation and parole supervision in fiscal year 1988 was 25,948. This average reached a high 39,440 in fiscal year 1992; an increase of 52.0 percent during the five-year period. These figures include cases supervised in and outside Wisconsin under terms of the Interstate Compact.

- \* Probation supervision average daily populations increased 53.8 percent from 22,333 in fiscal year 1988 to 34,352 in fiscal year 1992. The largest increase, 16.7 percent, took place between fiscal years 1990-1991; the smallest, 2.9 percent, between fiscal years 1988-1989. Probationers supervised under terms of the Interstate Compact, both in and outside Wisconsin are included in these figures.

- \* The average daily population of offenders under parole supervision, including Interstate Compact cases, increased 40.8 percent from 3,615 in fiscal year 1988 to 5,088 in fiscal year 1992. The largest increase during the five-year period (18.9 percent) took place between fiscal years 1991-1992; the smallest (1.9 percent) between fiscal years 1988-1989.
