# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

### **General Admissions**

Prison admissions have declined over the past three fiscal years, from a ten-year high of 44,488 in FY 89-90 to 30,530 in FY 92-93.

The percentage of admissions by race has changed markedly over the past ten years. In FY 82-83, the racial break down of admissions was 55.8% white, 43.4% black, and .7% other races. In FY 92-93, the inmate admissions were 41.5% white, 56.8% black and 1.7% other races. However, over the last four fiscal years, the percentage of black admissions had decreased from 60.7% in FY 89-90 to 56.8% in FY 92-93.

The majority of inmates admitted to Florida prisons during FY 92-93 were male (90.7%), black (56.8%) and non-Hispanic. Their average age was 29.3 years and most (51%) had been in the Florida prison system before. Most (94.8%) said they were U.S. citizens. Their average sentence length was 6.2 years. Broward, Hillsborough and Dade counties contributed more than one-third (34.9%) of the total admissions for FY 92-93.

Most were admitted for property crimes (42.7%), followed by drug (29.7%) and violent (27.6%) crimes. Over the past five years, admissions for violent crimes have increased from 23.5% in FY 88-89 to 27.6% in FY 92-93.

#### **Habitual Offender Admissions**

Habitual Offender admissions have increased dramatically over the past five years, from .9% in FY 88-89 to 9.3% in FY 92-93, partly because the law was changed in 1988.

Circuit 4 (Jacksonville area) admitted the most (13.7%) habitual offenders, followed by Circuit 9 (Orlando) with 10.1%, Circuit 13 (Tampa) with 9.8% and Circuit 6 (St. Petersburg) with 9.7%

Most habitual offenders are male (96.7%) and black (69.1%). They had on average two prior commitments to the Florida prison system.

Over the past five years, the number of black habitual offenders has decreased slightly (from 71.5% to 69.1%), and the number of white habitual offenders has increased (from 27.3% to 30.1%).

Most Habitual Offenders were admitted for property crimes (47.3 percent), followed by violent crimes (30.3 percent) and drug crimes (22.4 percent). Over the past five years, the number of habitual offenders convicted of property crimes has decreased, while the number convicted of drug and violent crimes has increased.

#### **Special Admissions**

**Young (17 and under) admissions** have increased slightly over the past five years, from 2.6% in FY 88-89 to 3.7% in FY 92-93. Most young admissions are age 17 (64.5%). Their average sentence length is 6.3 years. Most were admitted for violent crimes (46.4%), followed closely by property (42.7%) and drug crimes (10.8%).

The average age for Elderly (50+) admissions is 58.5 years. Their average sentence length has steadily increased from 6.2 years in FY 88-89 to 8.1 years in FY 92-93. Most were admitted for violent (39%) crimes, followed by property (35.4) and drug (25.6) crimes. Slightly over half (50.6%) had no prior Florida prison commitments.

**Female admissions** have increased slightly over the past five years, from 8.7% in FY 88-89 to 9.3% in FY 92-93. The average age for female admissions is 30.6 years. Their average sentence is 4.1 years. Most were admitted for drug (45%) crimes, followed by property (37.4%) and violent (17.5) crimes. Most had no (57.9%) prior Florida prison commitments.

**Drug admissions** have steadily declined over the past four years, from 36% in FY 89-90 to 29.7% in FY 92-93. The average age for drug admissions is 30.5 years. Their average sentence is 4.2 years. Most were admitted for selling drugs (46.8%), followed by possession (41.9%) and trafficking (11.2%). Most (53%) had at least one prior Florida prison conviction.
