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#### SUMMARY

This study compares a sample of individuals arrested for offenses related to crack cocaine with a sample of individuals arrested for offenses related to powdered cocaine. Crack defendants were arrested immediately following a period of intensive street-level enforcement by the New York City Police Department while cocaine defendants were arrested immediately following a similar period of intensive street-level enforcement and prior to the evergence of crack. Researchers focused on differences in the law enforcement and court response to the two drugs in New York City: specifically, differences in the characteristics of arrestees and in how the two groups are handled by the criminal justice system.

Samples of crack and cocaine defendants were drawn from the New York Police Department computerized online booking system, which contains arrest and defendant information and identifies all arrests that are crack or cocaine related. The crack sample included all arrests that occurred between August 1, 1986 and October 31, 1986 and that were verified as crack related. The sample of powdered cocaine defendants was drawn from the booking system covering the period from 1983 to 1984. The arrests were then matched to a supplementary database, from which additional variables were extracted. The final sample contained 3,403 individuals in the crack cohort, and 3,424 individuals in the powdered cocaine cohort, for a total of 6,827 cases in the study.

#### **Purpose of the Study**

In the mid 1980's a new form of cocaine, known as "crack," became widely available. This form produces an intense high and can be purchased in small amounts at relatively low costs per dose. As a consequence, crack cocaine use is believed to have become widespread, extending to populations that did not previously use cocaine or that used it at very low rates. The impact of crack use has already been felt by the criminal justice system, and may have resulted in the development of new drug distribution systems.

This data set is one of two parts of a study designed to look at the characteristics of crack users and sellers, how large numbers of crack related offenders are having an impact upon the criminal justice system, and how they are having an impact upon drug treatment and community programs. This part examines crack cocaine and powdered cocaine defendants in New York City. The other part examines residents in two Manhattan, New York, neighborhoods characterized by high levels of crack use and selling. (For a complete description of the second part of the study, see the User's Guide, *Changing Patterns of Drug Abuse and Criminality Among Crack Cocaine Users: Personal Interviews.*) The following are some of the questions specifically addressed by the data:

- 1. How are defendants charged with crack-related offenses different from defendants charged with offenses related to powdered cocaine?
- 2. Is there a difference between the ways the criminal justice system handles crack offenders and powdered-cocaine offenders: in pretrial detention, charges filed, case dispositions, and sentencing?
- 3. How do the criminal careers of crack offenders compare with the criminal careers of cocaine powder offenders especially in terms of total arrest rates, frequencies of nondrug crimes, and frequencies of violent crimes?

4. Is violence more strongly associated with crack dealing than with cocaine powder dealing?

5. How does the developmental history of cocaine powder sales and possession compare with

#### the history of crack sales and possession?

#### Methods

#### Study Design

This study analyzes the official arrest, conviction, and incarceration histories of powdered-cocaine and crack defendants through an analysis of official arrest records and supplementary data bases.

#### Sources of Information

This research used two main sources of information. Cases were drawn from the New York City Police Department Booking system. This system contains information on arrests and characteristics of defendants. Once cases had been selected from the booking system, additional information was obtained from a database compiled by the New York City Criminal Justice Agency, Inc. This agency provides pretrial services for New York City and is able to collect data during pre-arraignment interviews with defendants. (The goal of the interview is to determine by assessing the defendant's community ties whether the defendant is likely to be returned to court after being released.) The database also includes outcome data gathered from court calendars. Criminal history data were extracted from the fingerpring-based criminal records system maintained by the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services.

#### Sample

This study employed a matched cohort research design where a sample of crack defendants was drawn from the New York Police Department booking system and compared with a similarly drawn matched sample of powdered cocaine defendants. Beginning in 1986, booking records identified whether the arrest involved crack sales or possession. A total of 4,321 arrests were identified involving crack sales or possession during a period from August, 1986, through October, 1986. Researchers were able to locate case outcome data for 4,145 of those cases. Since this sample was differentiated from the matched sample by the sale or possession of *crack*, arrest reports included one or more of the following conditions: arrest for drug possession, drug sale, or possession of drug paraphernalia; mention of crack in the report; confiscation of drugs or drug paraphernalia; and/or arrest for loitering for the purpose of using drugs (crack). Cases in the final sample of 3,403 met these criteria.

Beginning in 1983, booking records identified arrests that involved powdered cocaine sales or possession. A total of 10,746 arrests were identified involving cocaine sales or possession during a period from 1983 through 1984. Researchers were able to locate case records for 9,975 of those cases. Following the same verification procedures as those used for crack, researchers examined arrest reports to ensure the presence of *powdered* cocaine as a factor in the arrest. Cocaine arrests were then matched with crack arrests on arrest charge type. In categories where the powdered cocaine sample was larger than the crack sample, a random sample was drawn to make the samples comparable in size. The final sample size in the powdered cocaine sales or possession cohort totaled 3,424.

It was not always possible to fully match the two cohorts based on charge type. The powdered-cocaine cohort had a higher percentage of possession arrests while the crack cohort had a higher percentage of felony sales arrests. Additionally, 2.6% of the crack cases and 2.5% of the powdered cocaine cases were not charged with specific drug offenses at the time of arrest, so they were included in the "misdemeanor/other" category.

#### **Response** Rates

Information was collected for 3,403 individuals in the crack cohort and 3,424 individuals in the powdered cocaine cohort. Because the individuals were selected for inclusion in the study based on the availability of recorded information, the response rate is 100%.

#### Dates of Data Collection

Data were collected on the cohort of crack cases for arrests made between August 1, 1986, through October 31, 1986 to reflect a period immediately following vigorous anticrack enforcement efforts within New York City.

Data were collected on the cohort of powdered cocaine cases for the arrests made between January 1, 1983, and December 31, 1984. This period coincided with intensive street-level enforcement by the New York Police Department of powdered cocaine sales and use.

#### **Summary of Contents**

#### Description of Variables

Variables contained in this data set include demographic information such as gender and race; arrest, conviction, and incarceration histories; and residence, prior criminal record, community ties, and court outcomes of the arrests.

#### Presence of Common Scales

None.

### Unit of Observation

The unit of observation is individuals arrested by the New York City Police Department for crack related offenses (August through October, 1986) or powdered cocaine related offenses (1983-1984).

#### **Geographic Coverage**

New York City.

#### Evaluation

#### Data Quality

Checks of missing data, and out-of-range values show that these data are of generally good quality. Only two variables have cases with out-of- ange values. About one-third of the variables had over 5% of cases with missing values. This proportion may overstate the true proportion of missing data, however, because "missing" and "not applicable" are combined in the same value in many variables and can not be separated. These statements are a summary of the Data Completeness Report, at page 9, and the user should refer to this section for further details.
