CRIME AND JUSTICE TRENDS IN NEW YORK STATE: 1988 - 1992

bulletin presents a five year summary of crime, arrest, indictment, conviction, and sentence data describing the amental activities of the criminal justice system in New York State. The Division of Criminal Justice Services produces riety of information on crime and criminal justice processing in New York State. OVERVIEW

EPORTED CRIMES

The number of serious crimes reported to the police decreased 6.0 percent between 1988 and 1992. The decline was riven by a 7.6 percent drop in property crimes. Violent crimes were at a level 2.0 percent higher in 1992 than in 1988, but were down 5.6 percent from the peak level reached in 1990. There were fewer reports of rape, assault, burglary, and larceny in 1992 than in 1988, while reports of murders, robberies and motor vehicle thefts increased.

ARRESTS

Adult arrests in 1992 were 4.4 percent below the level reported in 1988 and 7.4 percent below the record number of arrests in 1989. The rate of decline in arrests for misdemeanor offenses during the five year period exceeded the decrease in felony offenses, largely due to a drop of almost 40 percent in arrests for low level drug offenses.


The proportion of felony arrests that reached the upper court for prosecution as felonies rose steadily during the last five years to 37 percent in 1992. The number of felony indictments and Superior Court Informations (SCIs) peaked in 1990 and recorded a cumulative growth of 13.8 percent during the five-year period. Violent felony indictments/SCIs rose each of the past five years except for 1992, while drug indictments/SCIs declined 16.5 percent since peaking in 1989.

Convictions

Almost two-thirds of all dispositions were convictions during the last five years. A slightly higher proportion of convictions were at the felony level in 1992 compared to 1988, contributing to a 27.7 percent increase in the number of sentences to State prison. However, sentences to local jail facilities have dropped since peaking in 1989, resulting in an overall growth in alternative sentences.



CRIME AND JUSTICE TRENDS IN NEW YORK STATE: 1988 - 1992

Data for this bulletin were derived from the Uniform Crime Reporting system, the Computerized Criminal History/Offender-Based Transaction Statistics system, and the Indictment Statistical System maintained by the Division of Criminal Justice Services.

Please note the following:

- * data may differ from previously published figures due to the ongoing submission of information to the data systems;
- * crime, arrest, and indictment data are based on the year of reported crime, arrest, or indictment; conviction/sentence data are based on the year of sentencing;
- arrest and conviction data pertain to actions against adults (age 16 or older); indictment and superior court information (SCI) data include actions against both adults and juvenile offenders;
- » upper court prosecutions shown for misdemeanor arrests are most often due to post-arrest identification of repeat drunk driving and weapons offenders who are ultimately prosecuted as felons;
- » sentence data are based on an event unit of count; sentences to prison and jail are not comparable to actual admissions;
- » incarcerative sentences include prison, jail, and split sentences of jail plus probation.
