Some have a specific focus on a particular aspect of substance abuse or related subjects. They may have resource catalogues and brochures describing their services and constituency (Federal agencies identified by *asterisk.).

National organizations, councils, and agencies can provide various kinds of assistance and information to individuals and groups. Services differ in scope and focus, but all provide one or more of these: publications and media resources, information on alcoholism and other drug services in local areas, technical assistance in developing new programs, and referrals to other groups. Many have special divisions working on specific issues, e.g. women, ethnic populations, young people, etc.


