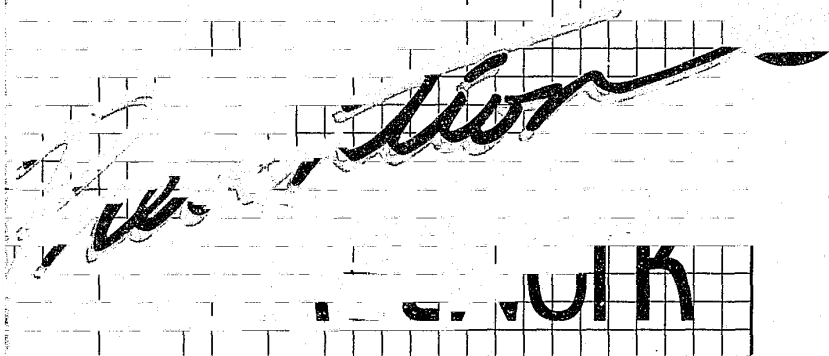

What is Prevention Network

Prevention Network is a Statewide coalition of volunteer and professional groups whose common mission is to provide support to and enhance volunteer-based alcohol, tobacco and other drug abuse prevention efforts.

Prevention Network recognizes the autonomy and diversity of individual groups. It is comprehensive in its make-up, embracing a variety of points of view and methods for preventing alcohol, tobacco, and other drug problems. It provides a structure through which their effectiveness is increased and common goals can be identified and achieved.

Prevention Network serves and includes representation from various organizations: community groups, parent groups, older adult groups, religious groups, drinking & driving prevention groups, professional groups, neighborhood/tenant groups, recreation groups, multicultural groups, schools, and others.

Prevention Network provides:

- A support system** for volunteer community prevention groups and the professionals who are a resource to them.
- A communication network**, newsletters and a statewide toll-free phone line.
- Technical assistance and training** for community organizing, resource identification, and program development.
- A minigrant program** to support primary prevention projects sponsored by volunteer community organizations.
- Networking links** with other community groups.
- Advocacy** for agreed upon goals in policy development, legislation, prevention, methodology, and resources.
- Alliance with other organizations** working to prevent problems correlated with substance abuse.

Some have a specific focus on a particular aspect of substance abuse or related subjects. They may have resource catalogues and brochures describing their services and constituency (Federal agencies identified by *asterisk.).

National organizations, councils, and agencies can provide various kinds of assistance and information to individuals and groups. Services differ in scope and focus, but all provide one or more of these: publications and media resources, information on alcoholism and other drug services in local areas, technical assistance in developing new programs, and referrals to other groups. Many have special divisions working on specific issues, e.g. women, ethnic populations, young people, etc.
