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GLOSSARY AND ABBREVIATIONS

ADMISSIONS

- First Admission: a felon convicted in Washington State Superior Court and entering prison for the first time in this state.
- New Conviction From Parole: a felon sentenced for a new crime and whose parole for one or more previous crimes has been revoked.
- Parole Revocations: a felony offender whose parole for a previous crime has been revoked for violating conditions of parole.
- CCI Return: a community custody inmate who has been returned to prison or work/pre-release to serve violation time or whose community custody has been terminated for violating the conditions of placement.
- Readmission: a felony offender with a previous history of incarceration in Washington State, whose parole has not been revoked or whose parole has expired, who is re-entering prison.

AGENCY

The term "agency" includes all Department of Corrections prisons, pre-release facilities, and work release facilities. Work release facilities accommodate inmates, parolees, probationers, and SRA offenders.

Agency abbreviations used in this report are: WCC RECEPTION--Washington Corrections Center-Reception, Shelton; WCC INSTITUTION--Washington Corrections Center-Training Center, Shelton; WCC WOMEN--Washington Corrections Center for Women, Gig Harbor; WASH PENITENTIARY--Washington State Penitentiary, Walla Walla; WASH REFORMATORY--Washington State Reformatory, Monroe; MCNEIL ISLAND--McNeil Island Corrections Center, Steilacoom; MICC WEC--Work Ethic Camp at McNeil Island Corrections Center; SPECIAL OFFENDERS--Special Offender Center, Monroe; TWIN RIVERS--Twin Rivers Corrections Center, Monroe; CLALLAM BAY--Clallam Bay Corrections Center, Clallam Bay; LARCH--Larch Corrections Center, Yacolt; INDIAN RIDGE--Indian Ridge Corrections Center, Arlington; CEDAR CREEK--Cedar Creek Corrections Center, Littlerock; OLYMPIC--Olympic Corrections Center, Forks; COYOTE RIDGE--Coyote Ridge Corrections Center, Connell; AIRWAY HEIGHTS--Airway Heights Corrections Center, Spokane; PRERELEASE--Pre-Release facilities; WORK RELEASE--Work Release facilities, several sites.

COMMUNITY CUSTODY INMATE (CCI)

Person serving a portion of their prison sentence in the community in lieu of early release time, where controls are placed on their movements and activities by the Department of Corrections.

CCI VIOLATOR

Community Custody Inmate who does not comply with terms of community sentence and receives a violation resulting in a return to department confinement.

COUNTY OF CONVICTION

The county of conviction/admission is the county from which a felon is sentenced. In the case of multiple crimes, the county of the most serious crime is given.

OFFENSE TYPE

The offense type is the crime for which a felon is incarcerated. In cases of multiple convictions, the most serious crime is presented. The offenses, as presented, are divided into two main categories: violent crimes and nonviolent crimes as defined in RCW 9.94A.

RATED CAPACITY

The rated capacity is the bed capacity of a facility. It is based on desirable standards of square feet per bed, at the end of the reporting month.

RELEASE

The parole, discharge, community placement, or death of felons formerly held in custody by the Department of Corrections.

VIOLENT OFFENDER

A felon found guilty of a violent crime as defined in the Sentencing Reform Act (Chapter 9.94A RCW). Included are all Class A felonies and some Class B felonies, such as manslaughter 1 and 2, indecent liberties with forcible compulsion, rape 2 (committed before July 1, 1990), child molestation 1 (committed before July 1, 1990), kidnapping 2, arson 2, assault 2, robbery 2, extortion 1, vehicular homicide, vehicular assault, and certain drug dealing crimes.

PRE-RELEASE

Total confinement in a community setting. Pre-release programs provide job application and survival skills training.

WORK ETHIC CAMP

A camp with a work ethic focus where offenders, after judicial recommendation, are continually engaged in meaningful activities and where unstructured time is kept to a minimum.

WORK RELEASE

A supervisory program imposed on an offender who has been conditionally released from total confinement in an institution or is imposed on a parolee or probationer in need of increased supervision. Certain felons convicted after implementation of the Sentencing Reform Act may serve their term of partial confinement in a Department of Corrections work release facility. The program allows residents to work or attend educational programs during the day and be confined in the work release facility at night.

COMMUNITY PLACEMENT

Includes persons serving a portion of their prison sentence in the community in lieu of early release time (Community Custody Inmates), where controls are placed on their movements and activities by the Department of Corrections, and persons serving Post Release Supervision, where violations of sentence conditions are reported to the sentencing court.



FISCAL YEAR 1994




